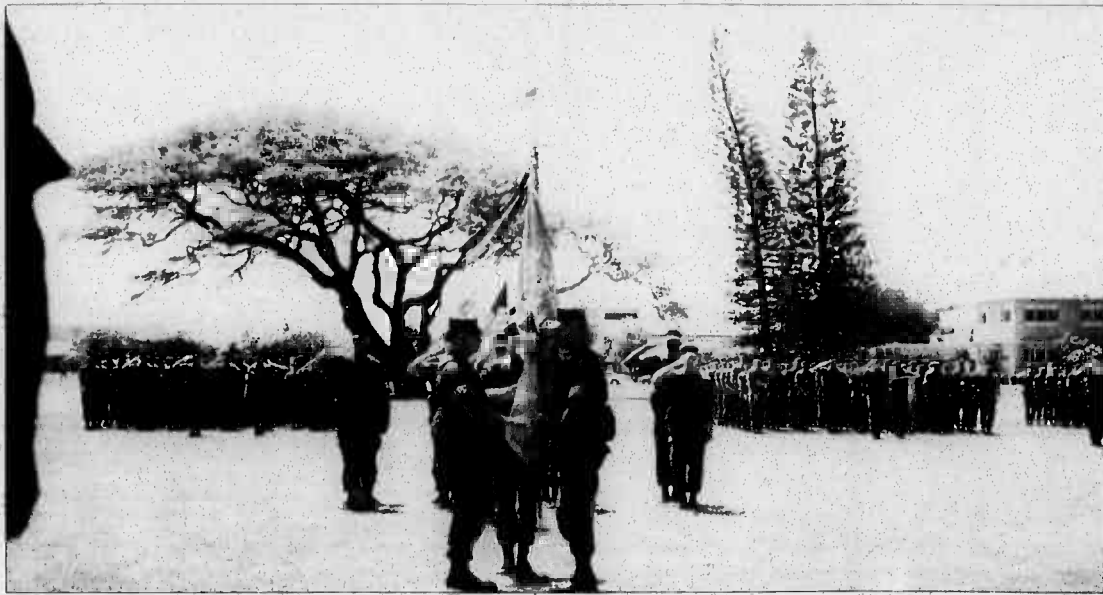

1st MEB changes command

Taking command shortly after Operation Desert Storm, the first thing on Brigadier General C.D. Kuhn Jr.'s agenda was the reconstitution of the First Marine Expeditionary Brigade, now, two years later that goal and many others have been met. As he relinquished his command to Brigadier General R.F. Vercauteren Friday, BGen. Kuhn looks back into two years full of growing and improving. Although the road to a fully reconstituted MEB looked long and rough, the experience and knowledge of BGen. Kuhn made this haul a smoother transition. This experience was gained

through his 26 years of dedication and duty, since the day he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the Marine Corps. After going through flight training at the Naval Air Training Command, Pensacola Fla., he was designated a Naval Aviator. BGen. Kuhn was ordered to duty with Provisional Marine Aircraft Group 39 in the Republic of Vietnam during June 1968. Beginning his career in a combat environment set the pace for his successful career as a Marine officer. BGen. Kuhn continued his path through the Marine Corps in every clime and place, from the jungles of Vietnam to the deserts of Arizona. Serving the units he was ordered to as operations officer

in most instances or as their commanding officer. BGen. Kuhn has been prepared and devoted to the Marine Corps in every way he has been needed. As commanding general of the MEB, he not only brought it back to life after operation Desert Storm, but many other improvements were accomplished. "Operations such as command post exercises, various training exercises or deployments have brought back the MEB to being a utility infilder. They are prepared to play any position needed," BGen. Kuhn said. The MEB has continually been prepared to serve any purpose in which they have been needed. It was this readiness that enabled them to immediately deploy and

help the island of Kauai during Hurricane Iniki's recovery. Marines from the MEB were sent to Cambodia with the Joint Task Force Full Accounting to aid in the search of servicemembers' remains. In addition to meeting his goal of outstanding readiness and efficiency, other goals were set and met. "I wanted to improve the quality of life of my Marines and sailors," he said. This he says, has mainly been accomplished by increasing the amount of concern each individual Marine has for those who work under them. "It is more important to find out why people have problems, why

Secretary of the Navy named

Headquarters Marine Corps

WASHINGTON, D.C. — John H. Dalton was sworn in July 22 as the 70th Secretary of the Navy after being unanimously confirmed by the Senate July 21. Dalton graduated with distinction from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1964, having served as deputy brigade commander, the academy's number-two ranking position. During his service in

the Navy, he graduated from two naval nuclear power schools, served aboard two submarines and attained the rank of lieutenant while on active duty. He was promoted to lieutenant commander in the U.S. Naval Reserve. "Those past years of service left an indelible impression on me that remains the cornerstone of my feelings toward the people who wear the uniform today — an admiration for our sailors, Marines and civil servants who sacrifice

every day for their country, an admiration for their dedication to teamwork and their purpose in mission and commitment to honesty and integrity," Dalton said. Dalton, the President's nominee for Secretary of the Navy, was strongly supported by the Senate Armed Services Committee. In his confirmation hearing before the committee, Dalton told the bipartisan panel that his commitment to quality forces in

the Navy and Marine Corps includes a "renewal of ethics and values." The 51-year-old San Antonio, Texas, banker also promised to use his considerable experience in business and government to help meet the challenges of running the Navy Department. "I view the taxpayer as our customer, and my goal is to provide the highest quality, most cost-effective naval service he can get for his tax dollar," Dalton said.

During the June NQLB meeting, there was a relatively large and vocal audience at the meeting. The NQLB chairman, MSGT. Joseph Giardino, said the issues brought up at the last meeting are currently being worked on. The biggest problem addressed at the June meeting was the painting of the houses on Cochran Street. The problem had already been identified by the station staff and the housing office. Extra money has been funded to remove the current paint on the houses and repaint them. Another major issue at the last meeting involved the 802 housing area. Several families complained about the basketball court in the area and wanted to get a fence put up around the basketball court. Giardino said they are still looking into the problem since any changes in that area have to be addressed through the company which owns those houses. Besides the issues brought up at the meetings, the board is currently wrapping up its bus survey and will be publishing the results soon. With the survey complete, and a new bus route identified, the station will try to sell the company which operates TheBus system on increased service to the air station community.

Brigade names Sailor of the Year

Although Petty Officer Charles Williams joined the Navy, for everyone's all-time favorite, "to see the world", he received much more than he bargained for. Because his love and devotion to his country has showed in every action he has made, Williams received 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade's 1992 Sailor of the Year Award. Originally from the Bronx, New York, Williams enlisted in the Navy in 1982. He says that he looked around and saw the difficult times surrounding him. Wanting to make a better life for himself, while at the same time doing

something he really enjoyed, he joined the Navy as a field corpsman. "I have served two tours here in Hawaii because I really enjoy deploying with different units," Williams said. Williams explains that he thinks every sailor should serve some time as a field corpsman. "It is important for them to be prepared in case of a war, because not everybody goes to a ship," he said. Williams is presently attached to Marine Air Group-24 headquarters. In the past he has deployed with Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-364 to Okinawa. It was during this deployment

that Williams was able to use his knowledge and assisted in the worst emergency he had ever seen. "A Marine fell through the roof window of a hangar. Although we later found that he was not seriously injured, I had to perform emergency medical procedures," Williams said. Williams continues to apply his knowledge by teaching others what he knows. He is a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation instructor and also an HIV/AIDS instructor. "It is not only important to know the information but I make it my business to get out and pass this knowledge to someone else," he explained. Not only does Williams utilize

his knowledge while he is wearing a Navy uniform, but he also uses it to help others who are in need. Williams is a volunteer at Castle Medical Center, where he serves as a patient liaison. In general, he feels that knowing the information is only part of being a good corpsman, but the most important, he agrees, is passing his knowledge on to others. It has been his dedication to his job and the Navy that have earned Williams the honor of being called the 1992 Sailor of the Year. "His dedication, motivation and conscientious attitude are what make Petty Officer Williams the best sailor in the MAG," said Chief Brian Elliott, leading chief at the MAG-24 Aid Station.

Hot, dry weather increases fire hazards

Longer days and clear skies provide hours of summer fun for mostly all. Children are playing, enjoying their summer vacation of games and eventful experiences. Unfortunately, some families and neighbors have already seen their summer come to an abrupt ending due to fire. Hot and dry weather increases the odds of fires occurring. Fans,

air conditioners that run daily and continue into the night are susceptible to electrical fires. Brush dies and turns brown, waiting for a carelessly discarded heat source. You as parents are urged to take these extra precautions before personal tragedy strikes.

- 1) Check and clean all smoke detectors. If it is battery operated, change it if older than one year old.
- 2) Fans and air conditioners

that are run for long periods of time should be shut down periodically to avoid over heating or malfunctioning.

- 3) Inspect all electrical flexible cords. Ensure cords are of approved type and is not kinked, run under rugs or pinched behind furnishings.
- 4) Turn off all electrical equipment when not in use, especially when leaving the house.
- 5) Keep matches and lighters

out of reach of children. Relocate your secret hiding place every so often. Surprisingly, most children know where matches and lighters are hidden.

- 6) Maintain yard cleaning standards. This will minimize vegetation growth around your house. An unattended yard can rapidly develop into a raging brush fire.
- 7) Educate your loved one to the fire reporting telephone number

and reporting procedures on base. 8) Teach your family to report any life threatening practices or sightings to a responsible adult.

Keeping the environment safe can make your summer time enjoyable.

Military retirement pay to be consolidated

A new pay system for military retirees and individuals who receive annuities promises better service for customers, said Defense Finance and Accounting Service officials.

The Defense Retiree and Annuitant Pay System being phased in now should be completed by December 1994. This new system, said finance officials, replaces the eight current retiree and annuitant pay systems with one central, standard plan.

Under the program, the Cleveland finance center takes over all retiree pay accounts. The Denver center will handle all annuities, including survivor benefit payments.

Finance officials said the system switchover should not cause any problems or interrupt anyone's pay. Direct deposit information, including location of the individual's financial institution, will be automatically forwarded to either Cleveland or Denver. Payment will continue to be made on the first business day of each month, as required by law.

they drink. For example, Level III used to be regarded as a punishment, but it isn't," he explained.

Disposables can be deadly

Nowadays, many household products, such as detergents and bleach, come in plastic containers which seem too good to throw away when empty.

But these containers were not intended for reuse, and especially not for holding gasoline and other volatile liquids. Such use can be extremely dangerous.

Many plastic materials harden after contact with petroleum products, making them brittle and easily fractured.

Temperatures inside the trunk of a car may rise to 140 degrees Fahrenheit on a warm day. These make-do gas cans, if not quite full, can generate pressure from expanding vapors and may burst.

In dry weather, static electricity can be generated while pouring fuel from a plastic container—or through a plastic funnel—and a resulting spark has more than once set off fatal explosions.

Some plastic containers are held together by adhesives which dissolve under the chemical attack of petroleum products in as little as two weeks.

Using the special containers designed and designated for volatile liquids is the only safe bet.

Marine nuclear weapons units deactivated

MARINE CORPS AIR STATION, Yuma, Ariz. — Saturday marks the end of an era so secretive that most people, whose very lives may have depended on its existence, will be completely unaware of its demise.

With the deactivation of Marine Wing Weapons Unit-Lant at Cherry Point, N.C., and MWWU-Pac here, the Marine Corps will be officially out of the nuclear arms business as of Sunday.

For more than 40 years, Marines at these units have been in continuous training, ready at any time to provide the offensive, air-

delivered, nuclear and chemical weapons which they could completely assemble from stockpiles.

The units were established in the early 1950s and were called Marine Tactical Support Assembly Teams. At first their mission was to provide the Corps with a tactical nuclear weapons capability. Later they were given the additional responsibility of maintaining biological and chemical weapons capability.

The world may never know whether the units were successful in their role as a deterrent to the use of nuclear and chemical weapons during the Cold War. The units did not store the

weapons locally, but maintained the capability and equipment required to load Marine Corps aircraft. For many of the unit's Marines, one of the most difficult aspects of their mission was maintaining absolute secrecy, not only from friends and family, but other Marines as well.

"Nobody knew what we did here," said CWO-2 Mariano Hawk, operations officer. "Whenever we talked with other Marines, they would always ask, 'What do you guys do there, anyway?' But we signed a paper not to talk about it for 50 years. Now it's for life."

Many factors have contributed to the unit's deactivation. Some

of these factors include the end of the Cold War, the fall of communism, the signing of new weapons treaties, recent budget cuts in the military, and the discontinued use of the A-4 Skyhawk and A-6 Intruders, which were the units' only platforms for employing their weapons, Hawk said.

Hawk is one of only 10 Marines left in the unit here. At the peak of its existence, 1987-1991, the mission required a 78-man force, which made up two 39-man teams.

Acting officer-in-charge, CWO-2 Michael McGlynn, has been with MWWU-Pac since April, 1992. Before that he spent three years

with the Cherry Point unit. Like many other Marines, he's sorry to see the era pass.

"I wish we'd keep the field open," he said. "This was a good job field, with good people. It was definitely a high-profile job in the ordnance community."

McGlynn will soon take over as station weapons officer here. Hawk will become the aviation ordnance officer at Twentynine Palms. Others will go to "B" billets or revert to their original MOSs, primarily within the ordnance field.

"This was never a primary MOS," Hawk explained. He said

MWWU Marines are usually the cream of the crop from the ordnance field, sent to MWWU about 43 months at a time.

The Marines from MWWU-Pac are spending this week packing up their remaining gear and preparing for departure.

"On the first of August we'll come in for the last time and make our final unit diary entry," Hawk said. "It will say 'Deletion of MCC. Deactivation of unit.' And then we will be gone. It's too bad. I guess they just don't need us anymore. But we were the tip of the spear, and if the balloon ever went up, we would have been there."

December 1993, and Army, December 1994. Annuity dates are Marine Corps in December 1993 with the Army, December 1994. The Navy annuitant's pay program recently switched over to the Colorado center.

Look for better, faster customer service when the pay system is in place, said finance officials. Just a few of the program's advantages are improved service with toll-free telephone numbers, automatic call distribution systems and the availability of customer service at some military installations. Another plus finance officials see is expanded data communications support at field level. Officials said they will be able to perform the same amount of work with about 175 fewer employees.

Currently, each military service handles its own retirees and annuity pay programs at its own finance center, finance officials said. The Army pays Army retirees from its Indianapolis center. The Navy pays Navy retirees from Cleveland, and the Air Force pays its retirees from the Denver center.

Until the Defense Finance and Accounting Service notifies you that your pay account has been switched, continue to write or call the finance center that currently handles your account.



CFR, local firefighters familiarized with P-3

Being prepared for any type of situation is always on any Marine's mind. Looking into the future, the Marines from Crash, Fire and Rescue realize they must be familiar with the Navy P-3s, which may be coming to Kaneohe in the near future. Tuesday, a Barbers Point P-3 flew here and gave CFR and Kailua firefighters a checkout on the aircraft.

The checkout served as a two-way familiarization class for CFR and the local firefighters as to the different safety aspects and danger areas of the aircraft.

Firefighters from the local communities have been receiving different training sessions on different aircraft in the past months. This has been done in efforts to prepare them in case an aircraft would have a malfunction

in their communities.

"Because we never know what is going to happen, it is best for us to be prepared," said Firefighter 1, Joseph Nee, Kailua Station 18.

This training day prepares not only the local firefighters but, it also refreshes the needed information in the CFR Marine's mind.

"Although most of the Marines have seen the P-3 before, this type of checkout refreshes all the information in their mind," said Sgt. Michael Newberry, CFR training program non-commissioned officer-in-charge.

During the P-3 checkout, the Barbers Point V-P 17 Squadron pilots and crewmembers informed CFR and the local firefighters about the danger areas of the aircraft along with other safety tips.

"It is important for anybody attempting a rescue (involving P-3's) to be careful and know where

the danger areas are," Newberry said. "One very important thing they also informed us about was the different egress points and where the air crew would position themselves in case of an accident."

Newberry explained this would make it much easier in case the metal had to be cut in order to get the crew out.

Although it would not be expected for the firefighters to know everything about the aircraft, both parties agree that it would be much more helpful to be at least familiarized with the aircraft.

"This type of training not only educates us, but it also prepares us," Nee said.

In addition to familiarizing themselves with the different characteristics of the P-3, CFR also wanted to ensure the equipment they had would be sufficient.

One of the CFR P-19 fire trucks was parked next to the aircraft to

find out if it was high enough to be used as a platform to get to the top of the aircraft.

Also, in order to ensure the fire hose was long enough to go from one end of the P-3 to the other,

a P-19 parked next to the cockpit of the aircraft and the hose was inserted through the window. Positive results came from that test as the firehose was found to be longer than sufficient.

It is tests and informative training as this which makes Marine and civilian firefighters positively certain that they will be able to satisfactorily assist in the next fire or rescue situation.

MALS-46 reserve unit trains here

Marines from Marine Air Logistics Squadron-46 (MALS-46) arrived here July 17 for two weeks annual training duty (ATD).

The El Toro, Calif., based reserve unit came to train with MALS-24 because both squadrons are

composite squadrons. This fact allows them the opportunity to completely integrate with each other and experience what operations would be like in case they would have to merge during a conflict.

Additionally, it allows the reservists to gain the experience, skill and knowledge that is sometimes difficult to achieve during their weekend training

periods.

"Being here integrated with MALS-24 gives our Marines the opportunity to train in their MOS (military occupational skill) for an extended period," said LtCol. Weiss, commanding officer of MALS-46.

"This not only improves proficiency but it teaches our Marines how to work as a unit."

During their two-week stay here the MALS-46 Marines worked closely with other Marines in many different types of job-related skills.

They have integrated into a variety of shops, including ordnance, supply and maintenance.

"Working like this is what helps

us keep current," said Sgt. Jesse Avella, MALS-46.

"Much of the work our Marines have done here has been in direct support of the active duty Marines," Weiss said. "The active duty Marines we are working along side with have taken us directly into their workspaces and helped everyone."

Along with their MOS training, the Marines also took this chance to do basic warrior training.

Six of the El Toro-based Marines spent their first week here getting certified as combat water survival swimmers.

Prior to starting the course the Marines were first required to take

a screening test.

"In my opinion this was the hardest part of the course," said SSgt. Martin Morabe, MALS-46, in reference to the screening.

The second week of their stay here, the Marines who went through the course assisted as instructors during the remaining squadron's members swim qualifications.

The events that were accomplished during the annual training duty are the same as the squadron's weekend training. The prolonged period, however, gives them a better sense of what their

jobs would be like, should there be a conflict where they would have to integrate with active Marine units.

"Most of the training and retained experience is gained during this uninterrupted time. During this two-week training we get the most retention of knowledge of technical skills," said PFC Nathan Macias, MALS-46.

"Based on their performance during this training period, the reserve Marines of MALS-46 are ready, willing and able to assist the Marine Corps in its many world wide missions," Weiss said.

How much is too much?

The consumption of alcoholic beverages is a traditional part of socialization in many cultures, including our own. For most Americans, drinking moderate amounts of alcohol is a normal part of the cultural fabric which adds to the enjoyment of life.

For others, however, the consumption of alcohol leads to alcoholism, a primary disease in which the drinker becomes unable to predict and control his drinking. Alcoholism afflicts at least 18 million Americans; it is a major public health problem which requires specialized treatment. For alcoholics one drink is too many and a million is not enough.

Interestingly, many social drinkers find that it is not always easy to tell how much is enough for them. Many people who would not be diagnosed alcoholic are able to recall episodes when consumption of alcoholic was associated with accidents, embarrassing behavior, poor decisions or other negative consequences.

The question of "how much is too much" is answered in different ways by different groups. Cultural, racial, religious and biologic factors may all play an interactive role in determining the point at which social drinking becomes a problem.

As it turns out, "how much" may be less important than "what happens." Research tells us that the following questions may be

helpful in determining whether alcohol is a source of problems.

1) Can you stop drinking when you want to? Some people find they consume more alcohol than they had originally intended. They may also find it necessary to exert great efforts to consciously stop drinking after one or two.

2) Is your drinking associated with interpersonal problems? Alcohol's effects "disinhibit" normal social controls in the brain. For some, arguments, fights or relationship problems are a clue that alcohol is a problem.

3) Have you had health problems

related to alcohol consumption? Recreational sports injuries, weight change or other medical problems can all be important indicators that alcohol is a health risk. When your body talks to you, learn to listen.

The enjoyment of alcoholic beverages is a part of normal adult activity for many people. A majority of American adults enjoy alcohol in moderate amounts, but remember: Anything that causes a problem is a problem. You may not be an alcohol abuser; just make sure that alcohol is not abusing you.

- Powers of Attorney—8:30 a.m., Monday through Friday. Deploying units should schedule with Capt. Stewart at 257-0074/75/76.

- Notaries—9:30-10 a.m., Monday through Friday.

- Non Residents forms—Units can get NRFs at self-serve and the C.O. or Personnel Officer can sign. At Legal Assistance, NRFs are given out during walk-in hours only; 1-2:30 p.m. Monday and Tuesday; 8-9:30 a.m. Wednesday through Friday. You must have LES (to verify non-resident), ID card, and military member on registration; dependents also need power of attorney from military member.

- Wills—First Step: Will class; 7:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday, no appointment needed.

- Second Step: Will signing, 1:30 Thursday only.

- Third Step: Unit Will class; Schedule with Capt. Stewart at 257-0074/75/76.

- Taxes—Clients must first be assisted by their unit Voluntary Income Tax Assistant (VITA) representatives. Legal Assistance will handle complex cases referred by the VITA rep., dependents filing separately, dependents of deployed units and retirees. During tax season (January-April), schedule appointments through Legal

Assistance at 257-74/75/76; May-December, come during walk-in hours. Clients must have all paperwork and complete as much of their tax return as possible themselves.

- Guardianship Adoptions—Expanded Legal Assistance Program (ELAP)—Due to temporary personnel shortage, no new adoption or guardianship cases will be accepted for the summer. Uncontested/consensual cases only; E-4's and below, parent(s) come during walk-in hours and have at least seven months remaining on island on active duty. E-5's and above must first have approved waiver-pick up sample waiver package at Legal Assistance during working hours.

- Divorces and Separations—First step: Divorce and Separation class, 9 a.m. Thursday. No appointment needed. Class is mandatory to begin separation agreement and divorce. Both spouses may attend.

- Second Step: Separation Agreement. Come in during walk-in hours with a completed separation worksheet, signed by both spouses; only one spouse will be seen. This is NOT a "legal" separation.

- Third Step: Divorce - ELAP - E-4's and below, the spouse previously seen must bring notarized separation agreement to walk-in hours and have at least three months remaining

on island on active duty. E-5's and above, must first have approved waiver - pick up sample waiver package at Legal Assistance during working hours.

- Miscellaneous: Other advice on divorce, separation, child custody, spousal and child support, paternity when Legal Assistance is not doing separation agreement or divorce, come in during walk-in hours.

- Walk-in hours to see lawyer—1-2:30 p.m. Monday and Tuesday; 8-9 a.m. Wednesday through Friday. Only first five clients per day will see a lawyer due to summer personnel turnover/shortage and deployments requiring mass wills.

- Briefs—Pre-Deployment, Preventive Law, TAMP, Marriage Skills, Key Wives Training, Wills and Powers of Attorney for Deploying units should schedule with Capt. Stewart at 257-0074/75/76. Unit wills should be scheduled two months prior to deployment.


- Defense Counseling Services: NJP & Summary Court-Martial Counseling is Monday and Wednesday at 4 p.m. No appointment needed, but paperwork required.

- Administrative Discharge and Competency Review Boards Counseling is Monday and Wednesday at 3 p.m. No appointment needed, but paperwork is required.

Pless Hall exempts surcharge for certain billet holders

In an effort to encourage officers to eat an occasional meal in the messhall to ensure that their Marines and sailors are being well cared for, to determine if the quality and quantity of the food is sufficient for personnel under their charge, and to provide feedback to improve the messhall, the following billets are now surcharge exempt.

Commanding general, 1st MEB; commanding officer, Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay; chief of staff, 1st MEB; commanding officer, 3rd Marines; commanding officer, Marine Air Group-24; commanding officer, BSSG-1; assistant chief of staff G-4, 1st MEB; battalion commanding officers; squadron commanding officers; company commanding officers; executive officers; detachment commanders; platoon commanders; branch/department OIC; S-4/Logistic officers; Food Service officers; messhall officer and officer of the day (all).

These exemptions apply only to officers permanently stationed at Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay and may only be used aboard this station.

Personnel in receipt of the subsistence portion of Per Diem are required to pay the food cost and surcharge, regardless of billet.

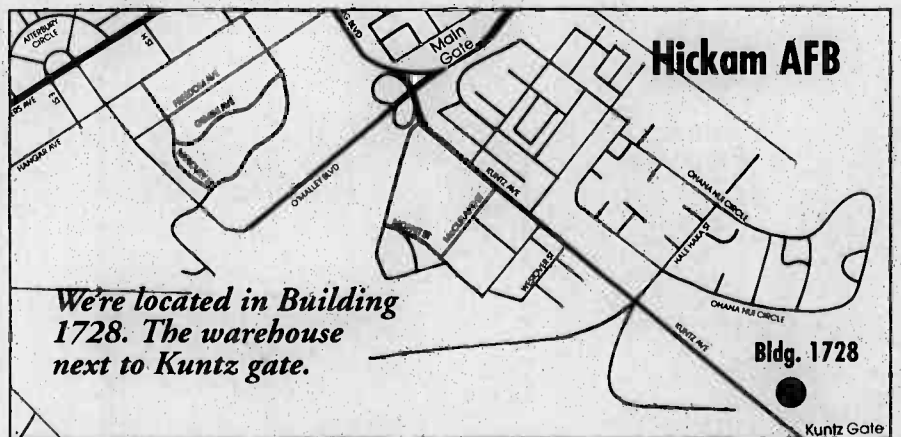

Fitness vital for divers

There is a typical, if not stereotypical, image of scuba divers — a tanned, lean diver emerging from the ocean on a sunny day, dripping wet and exuding physical fitness. While this image is not without merit, and no doubt pleasing to divers themselves, it can be somewhat misleading.

Although scuba diving is rightfully associated with physical fitness, unfortunately, the two do not always go together. Even

though nearly every diving manual in print emphasizes the need for physical fitness, it is perhaps one of the most overlooked aspects of fun, safe diving.

Two of the most common reasons for this lack of attention to diving fitness are a result of attitude. The first is the argument that diving is meant to be relaxing, so there is no need for rigorous exercise. The second reason is probably a more common attitude among many divers, especially beginners: "Diving is how I get (or stay) in shape."

There are several problems with these mentalities. The quick response to the first that in order for diving to remain fun, one must be in excellent physical condition. But, going further, the first attitude assumes that diving will always be relaxing; any experienced diver knows that this is simply not the case.

In fact, some dives are quite strenuous, particularly if surf, currents, or surges are encountered. The exertion required in these conditions can quickly bring upon

From the cheap seats: A sports commentary

□ Ryan Express is back on track

I played baseball from the age of five until the age of 22, then I moved on to softball. But during those 17 years I spent on the diamond I played a lot of ball and watched my favorite ball players on TV and even attended several professional games.

Of all the years I have spent playing or observing, perhaps the greatest moment I ever had was not the year my team won the state championship in high school; nor the day I went five-for-five and hit for the cycle. It was not even the day I accepted the Sophomore Player of the Year for Division II colleges. The day that lives strongest in my mind concerning baseball was when I watched a legend of the sport reach a major milestone in his career. The man was Nolan Ryan... the milestone was strikeout number 5,000.

I reflected on the great event as I watched Ryan pitch against Toronto on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball. Ryan was pounded for six runs

in his fifth appearance this year. The Ryan Express has been moving a little slower this year due to a surgery on his knee and then a hip injury which has made his pitching appearances few and far between.

I regard Ryan as perhaps the greatest pitcher to ever step up to the mound. The Express has three pitches in his bag of tricks, the curve, the change up and of course the fastball.

The fastball is the pitch that made Ryan feared and respected by everyone with a bat on their shoulder. The fastest pitch in a major league game was 100-plus miles per hour by Ryan. Consistently throughout his career he has thrown the little round ball in the high 90s and low 100s. Perhaps this is the reason he is the strikeout king.

Ryan, who is in his 27th season, is the oldest active player in the major leagues at 46. Though his body has taken a beating over the years the arm is still golden as he threw several pitches 95 mph or better during the game.

As of Sunday, Ryan had made 798 pitching appearances in his career, averaging almost 30 games per year. It is hard to believe after so many appearances he can still blow a fastball past younger players who were born years after he started his professional career.

The record books are full of Nolan Ryan records. Besides being the all-time strikeout king, he is also the only man to ever hurl seven

no-hitters.

Roberto Alomar was interviewed prior to the game and asked how he felt about facing the future hall-of-famer in the game. He said it was truly exciting to face Ryan. Alomar's first base hit in the majors was off Ryan. Now that's something to remember. Alomar was also the last batter to get an out in Ryan's final no-hitter, which was in 1991.

People can often times tell you where they were when some great event took place. For the old-timers (35 years-plus) most can remember exactly where they were when Kennedy was shot. For some of us younger folks, we remember where we were when the space shuttle disaster occurred. People tend to reflect only on the tragedies of life, but for me, I prefer to remember the night in Arlington, Texas when my hometown favorite Texas Rangers faced the Oakland A's.

The Ryan Express was in need of eight strikeouts that night. The sell-out crowd was on their feet with each and every pitch in anxious anticipation of the strikeout to put him over the 5,000 mark. I sat on the first base side four rows from the Ranger's dugout next to my father. My dad, who was a professional ball player for the Baltimore Orioles in the early 60s, sat through the game and barely said a word.

My father and I have always had a special bond that comes from having played baseball.

When we went to a game, whether it be pro, high school or little league, we would often sit and the only words we would say were analytical. My dad would say "watch his swing" or "see how he releases the ball" and on this night it was no different.

The adrenaline was high in the 40,000-plus fans waiting to see that one strikeout to break the incredible barrier. Rickey Henderson stepped to the plate and with each pitch the crowd went wild. Finally, the moment we had all been waiting for came and the stadium erupted into a thunderous ovation which lasted for more than ten minutes.

I looked over at my father who is now approaching 60 and I saw a tear coming out of the corner of his eye. Nothing moves my father the way baseball does. The only words he spoke till after the game was finished was "Ryan is the best there will ever be."

I remember that night for several reasons. The first is that it was the last time I will have seen the Ryan Express play because he has already announced his retirement following this season. The second reason is that it is highly unlikely that any man will ever match the mark that Ryan set on that night. The final reason I will always remember it is because the look of respect and admiration my father displayed towards the legendary Nolan Ryan.

fatigue.

Another consideration is a situation in which a rescue must be effected. Towing a tired or unconscious diver, removing a diver's gear, or searching for a missing diver requires an enormous amount of effort, strength, and stamina. Even a seemingly simple act such as carrying a full lobster bag underwater can have a diver wheezing through his regulator in no time. Every dive has the potential to become a situation in which excellent physical conditioning will be relied upon, and the ocean is no place to discover the lack of it.

Diving to get in shape puts the proverbial cart before the horse. Remember, diving is supposed to be fun. If, however, it becomes part of an exercise regimen, diving becomes work, not fun. Who wants to make every dive a workout? The object is to be in good shape before diving.

This mentality can also be argued against by using the first attitude against it. Diving is in fact a relaxing leisure activity. Thus, unless one does a great deal of diving — i.e., daily — the chance of increasing one's physical fitness level through diving alone is slight.

As stated above, fitness comes before diving, not vice versa. Open any Professional Association of Diving Instructors (PADI) dive manual, and several statements can be found stressing the need for fitness. Luckily most students are fit individuals. But, what

about those who aren't, and want to experience the thrill of diving? The most important thing to remember is that it is never too late to get in shape.

Anyone who is considering becoming scuba certified should have a solid exercise regimen or begin immediately, paying attention to the two key elements of diving fitness: strength and stamina.

Strength can be broken down into two categories, upper and lower body. Total body strength is important to the diver. The best way to develop this strength is through weight training. While the very thought of going to the "ironpile" is enough to keep some people away from the gym, the rewards are invaluable.

However, there are two things to remember about weight training, and all exercise programs: (1) see your physician first; and, (2) start small and gradually increase the intensity levels.

Also, weight training must be for the whole body, not just the biceps or legs. Leg strength is obviously important to the diver, but upper body strength is also necessary, especially at the Rescue Diver level and higher.

There are countless methods and programs for weight training; trainers at the local gym are an excellent source of advice on which program should be designed to improve overall strength. Outline your program, then stick with it.

If weight training is impractical (or undesirable), there are other forms of strength-building. The old-fashioned method of calisthenics is an excellent way to build upper body strength. A

regular program of push-ups, pull-ups, sit-ups and dips will develop a surprising level of strength.

Furthermore, a regimen such as this does not require a trip to the gym or a great deal of time; these exercises can be performed at home. For building leg strength, there are leg lifts and "flutter kicks" (also known as "scissors kicks").

The second element of diving fitness, stamina, can be more accurately called "cardiovascular fitness." Not only is this extremely beneficial to overall health, it is a necessary complement to strength. It serves no purpose to be strong if you can't last. Any aerobic activity will develop cardiovascular fitness, whether it is walking, running, biking, swimming or even martial arts. In addition to building stamina, many of these exercises develop strength, primarily in the legs.

Aerobic exercises can be fun and convenient. There are many aerobic videotapes available for use at home. Walking can be a great stress-reducer and can be as easy as stepping out of your home. As with strength training, the important thing is to outline a program, commit to it, and stay with it. Again, see your doctor first, and increase the intensity gradually.

As the novice diver gains experience, he may want to continue his education with advanced programs, where fitness takes on an even larger role. Diving should not lose its appeal because of poor fitness. Get fit to dive; don't dive to get fit. This will make you a much better diver, and you'll have much more fun in the water.

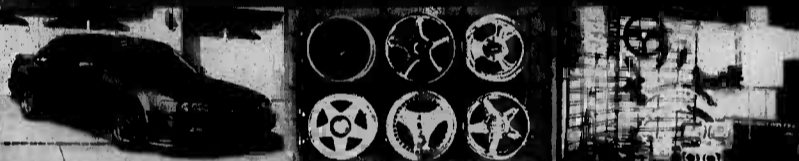

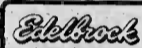
