## MPF going to PTA

The 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade began Exercise Ke A'O Koa Wednesday with the departure of a 70-man survey, liaison and reconnaissance party for the island of Hawaii and a 50-man off-load preparation party for the Motor Vessel Sgt. William Button anchored off Honolulu.

The Maritime Prepositioning Force (MPF) exercise, combined with the biannual training at Pohakuloa Training Area (PTA), will be the largest exercise for the brigade since it returned from Southwest Asia. More than 3,000 Marines and sailors will participate in the MPF and PTA exercise.

About 650 Marines and sailors from the brigade, 250 Seabees from Naval Beach Group-1 based at Coronado, Calif., a detachment of Marines from Camp Pendleton, Calif., and a ship from Maritime Prepositioning Squadron-3 homeported in Guam, will participate in

the MPF off-load.

Although the MEB will only be off-loading one of the four ships in the MPS-3, the exercise has drawn attention from around the Marine Corps. Virtually every large command in the Marine Corps is sending a representative to witness the exercise.

The main reason why so much attention is being focused on this exercise, explained LtCol. E.D. Fellman, brigade MPF officer, is because the brigade will be testing some new concepts during the exercise. The major concepts will be a wireless LAN system and a new command relationship.

It's hoped the new wireless LAN, coupled with new software, will help the brigade track and assign the equipment and supplies more efficiently.

The Marine Corps has had a problem with the scanners and modems when tracking materials coming off the ships. Instead of buying new scanners, the brigade will try to use existing equipment to transmit the data 10 miles using

a wireless LAN, which would be impossible with scanners, Fellman explained. The G-6 and Company B, 7th Communications Battalion have successfully tested the wireless LAN here.

The change of command relationship is another change the MPF planners hope will work well.

In the past, the MPF commander has been a Navy admiral who was in charge of the Naval Support Element, MPS squadron, and the Marine Air/Ground Task Force.

The new arrangement would make the commander of the MAGTF — in this case the commanding general of the MEB — and commander MPF equal. This way the general can speak directly with his higher headquarters without having to go through the MPF commander. The MPF commander would still have control of the other two elements.

Fellman explained that the current relationship is like having the Air Force in charge of Marines because they flew the Marines to the war zone. The new

## CCR combats abuse

Last year the Marine Corps reported the highest percentage of spouse abuse cases of the Armed Forces. This year the Marine Corps is attacking this problem head on. An intervention program is being established to prevent further cases of spouse abuse. MCAS Kaneohe Bay will be the first test site for the Coordinated Community Response (CCR) program.

Marine commanders on Oahu received a briefing by representatives of Headquarters Marine Corps Family Program Branch and Duluth Institute on the concepts and principles of a Coordinated Community Response.

The Duluth Institute is part of a program to help combat domestic violence. Duluth, Minn., is a city of 80,000 people which became famous for its way of fighting back against spouse abuse.

Realizing that domestic violence

is a problem within the Marine Corps, officials at Headquarters Marine Corps decided that the Duluth strategy could be successfully adapted to the Marine Corps Family Advocacy Program.

In February, Family Advocacy Committee members from MCAS Kaneohe Bay, the 1st MEB and the local community visited the city of Duluth for a one week training course.

"Their program is very effective," said Major Ken Stephens, director Family Service Center MCAS Kaneohe Bay. "Victim safety and offender accountability are the two key elements of the program."

The first step in implementing the CCR is training and awareness. Last month the majority of the officers, SNCOS and Marines from the 1st MEB, KMCAS and 1st Radio Battalion received training provided by representatives from Headquarters Marine Corps and the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project (DAIP) on concepts and principles of the CCR.

"We train not only married

Marines but also single Marines. Although they may be single they may have married Marines who work for them. It is important that they are aware of the programs available so that they can advise and help their Marines," Stephens said. "Also, although they may be single now, statistics show they will get married and it is important for them to know the rules of the game."

Training has been conducted through half day training sessions in which more than 4,500 Marines were informed about the CCR program and how it will affect them.

Overall, the purpose of intervention is to support the Marine Corps mission. This will be accomplished by enhancing unit readiness and personal professionalism. Many goals have been set in order to accomplish this.

Among the first goals is to deliver a strong message informing

## POW/MIA ceremony held at Camp Smith

A solemn wreath-laying ceremony took place at Bordelon Field, Camp Smith Friday morning with Marines, sailors, civilians and former prisoners of war in attendance.

The ceremony was part of POW/MIA Recognition Day as proclaimed by President Clinton. The proclamation declares that Sept. 10 shall be recognized as "a day of which to honor all Americans who are former POW's and servicepersons who are still unaccounted for."

The ceremony featured the patriotic sounds of the Marine Forces Pacific Band. In

attendance for the ceremony were several high ranking officers, including Admiral Charles Larsen, CINCPAC, LtGen. H.C. Stackpole III, Commander Marine Forces Pacific and several representatives of the four branches of the Armed Services. Also in attendance were members of Joint Task Force-Full Accounting (JTF-FA) and the Army Casualty Identification Laboratory, Hawaii who have worked towards the recovery and identification of MIA's from the Vietnam War. These two unite have been responsible for the location and identification of 280 Americans previously unaccounted for in Vietnam.

The keynote address was made by LtGen. Stackpole. After reading the presidential proclamation

declaring POW/MIA Recognition Day LtGen. Stackpole shared some of the accomplishments of the various organizations involved in the POW/MIA issues of today.

"By being here today we keep the memories alive and we keep the faith," LtGen. Stackpole said. "The faith with those who gave the ultimate sacrifice, in the name of freedom, cannot be forgotten. So this 24-hour tribute of our national colors represents the greatest experiment in the history of man, in something called democracy... and next to it, on a day which should never be forgotten, is the POW/MIA flag. We honor those today who we do not have a full accounting of and also to those, such as Gerald Coffee, who did return."

The honorary guest for the ceremony was Captain Gerald Coffee, a retired Navy pilot of 28 years and former prisoner of war. Coffee, who spent over one-quarter of his military career as a prisoner of war is the author of a book called "Beyond Survival." He is considered as one of America's top motivational speakers.

Coffee, flying off the USS Kittyhawk in February 1966, was shot down over the southern part of North Vietnam. After ejecting from his aircraft he and his crewman were taken captive. Despite a battle for their rescue involving other aircraft from the Kittyhawk, his crewman was killed and he was taken prisoner.

He was taken on a 12-day journey to Hanoi where he was

held for seven years and nine days.

"The communists looked at us as resources to be exploited for military information and propaganda," Coffee said. "Their policy toward us was one of inhumane treatment and torture as they deemed necessary to gain the information they wanted."

During his time in prison, he and others made every effort to establish cohesion and establish a team effort to maintain and obey the code of conduct.

This sometimes proved to be a difficult task. More than two and a half of the years in the Hanoi prison were spent in solitary confinement. He spent 14 months without seeing anyone.

He was released on Feb. 12,

1973 as a result of the Paris Peace Agreement.

When released from his Vietnamese prison he returned to home and served until 1985. He has since traveled around the country speaking to various groups concerning overcoming such hard times.

"There were times in prison when I seemed to lose hope," Coffee said. "But through prayer and coming to the realization that there was a reason I was there, I began to look at every day as a new day. I had to keep the faith everyday."

The Vietnamese position that POWs were released from Vietnam is considered by Coffee not to be true. The 2,248 members of the Armed Services which are declared

relationship will simplify the command relationships.  
Besides the new concepts, the brigade Marines are generally looking to increase expertise in MPF operations.

"The exercise will validate our standard operating procedures and test the automated data systems designed by Headquarters Marine Corps to support MPF operations," explained Maj. Lowell Brueland, brigade MPF plans officer.

To add to the challenge of the exercise, the ship will not be off-loaded at a pier. Over five days, about 377 pieces of rolling stock and 177 containers will be off-loaded from the ship in-stream.

Once the equipment has been distributed to the four elements of the brigade, the Marines will conduct a five-day field exercise. Upon completion of the field exercise the equipment and supplies will be loaded back on the ship.

The brigade is hoping the Big Island will prove to be a valuable place to conduct MPF exercises.

"Maybe in the future we can do a Freedom Banner-type exercise there instead of in Korea," Fellman said. "In Korea we can't do throughput operations because of the densely populated coast. On the Big Island the impact is very minimal, and we are getting very valuable training out of it."

The MPF concept the Marines and sailors will be using, is for the ship to bring in supplies and

equipment and Marines fly-in and marry up with their equipment. The four ships of MPRON-3 carry enough equipment and supplies to outfit the 1st MEB and sustain it for 30 days of combat. There are three squadrons afloat and ready to respond to a crisis anywhere in the world.

For Exercise Ke A'O Koa, the off-load will take place near Kawaihae port and Marines will fly into Waimea Airport. "The ideal setup doesn't exist, but this one offers far less artificiality than other Freedom Banner exercises," Brueland explained. "This is one of the few places where we can have an airport and port close enough to do arrival and assembly operations and go right into MEB field exercise operations."

By the end of the exercise, the Marines in the brigade's MPF section want to have everyone well trained in MPF operations.

"We want to be the foremost MPF outfit in the Marine Corps," Fellman said. "If an MPF operation is needed, we want to be thought of first."

The importance of MPF operations was proven during Operation Desert Shield, when all 13 ships were off-loaded in Saudi Arabia very early in the crisis. The arrival of the ships represented the first real combat power to the region. Their utility was amplified in the recent Somalia operation. The MPF squadrons have become a national asset.

"If the Marine Corps had to go to war tomorrow, two MEBs could get there by amphibious shipping while three MEBs would get there by MPF. That's how important MPF has become to the Marine Corps," Fellman explained.

Marines that spouse abuse is a crime. It will not be tolerated in the Marine Corps and offenders will be held accountable. As LtGen. H.C. Stackpole III, Commander Marine Forces Pacific emphasized to his commanders, "Courage, honor and commitment are Marine Corps virtues that must be practiced 24 hours a day on duty and at home."

During the training sessions, Maj. Gary Hall, 1st MEB Inspector, conveyed what his thoughts were on spouse abuse before attending the training.

"Prior to attending training on spouse abuse prevention in Duluth Minn., when spouse abuse was mentioned, I only thought of physical abuse. However, one of the charts used in Duluth showed the myriad of other types of abuse, which normally precede physical violence. It was called the Power and Control Wheel, and I was very chagrined to see that I had been guilty of some things like emotional abuse," he said.

"The positive side of being able to internalize what I saw was, until I knew something was broke, I had no desire to fix it. That's one of the big things stressed in the classes that were taught here, we have to stop thinking of abuse as someone else's problem, especially men," he continued. If spouse abuse is known by others, it is their obligation to intervene. Failure to do so is equivalent to condoning and encouraging domestic violence.

Bystanders should realize that by letting domestic violence continue, they are not helping those involved; they are hurting them. Getting help will not only

stop the hurt but it may save their marriage, Stephens explained during a half-day training session for sergeants and below. "Violence poisons the marriage," Stephens said. "Although it is great if the family stays together, that is not our goal."  
The goal of CCR is to keep the victim safe and make the offender accountable for his actions. Victims will be protected not only from violent acts, but also from threats of physical, sexual, and emotional abuse. Another way to protect the victim is by keeping them informed on resources available and making them aware of their options.

According to domestic violence experts, many times the victims stay because they do not know

where else to turn. Therefore, another principle of the CCR program is to inform victims of their options and help them make decisions on their lives. In the past, many victims were afraid of making a decision to leave their abusive spouses because they were threatened. As part of the CCR, the offender will be punished. This will send the message that domestic violence is a crime that will be prosecuted under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).

"As with any other crime, offenders who violate USMC policy or the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) as well as federal, state, or local laws regarding spouse abuse must be held accountable," states the CCR

intervention manual. Holding offenders accountable is the only way to ensure a possible change in the pattern of violence. The manual further states: "Accountability is achieved through rehabilitation programs that address the battering and any exacerbating conditions such as substance abuse, sanctions imposed by the offender's commanding officer, or a combination of the two, and case tracking to ensure the offender complies with recommended programs, services and sanctions." Case tracking here will commence Oct 1 and will be monitored on an automated system. Each case will contain the type and level of violence and what was done about it.

# This week around the world

## Historic agreement signed

Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin and Palestinian Liberation Organization chief Yasser Arafat signed a historic agreement at the White House Monday.

The two leaders, who were bitter enemies for many years, signed a declaration of principles between Israel and the PLO. The agreement will lead to limited self rule by Palestinians in the Israeli occupied Gaza Strip and West Bank town of Jericho. Palestinians and Israelis have been fighting for a century for the land and did not even recognize the others right to exist.

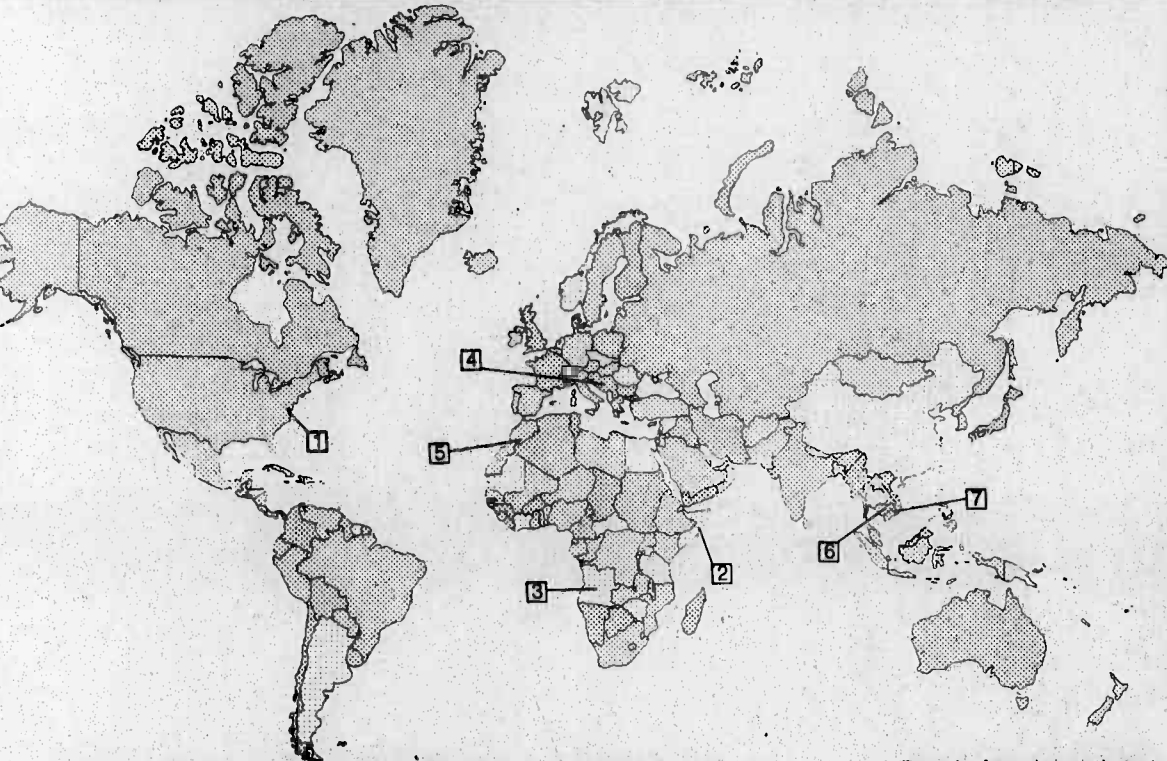
Although the agreement is a big step forward for each side, it leaves many problems unanswered. Two of the biggest problems remaining is the fate of Jerusalem and Jewish settlements in the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

## Americans wounded in Somalia

American soldiers came under fire again in Somalia Monday, leaving infantrymen injured. The attack, believed to have been ordered by the fugitive warlord Mohamed Farah Aideed, came as 200 United States infantrymen were completing a dawn sweep through buildings near the United Nations headquarters in Somalia.

The Somalis hit the Americans with intense fire from AK-47 rifles and rocket propelled grenades. The attack centered around a hospital in which the Somalis had placed snipers and later took refuge in. The United Nations responded with small arms fire and attacks from Cobra gunships.

Recent attacks by Somali guerrillas have been much more intense than previous attacks. They have also changed their tactics from hit-and-run attacks to



more direct confrontations with United Nations forces.

The injuries to the three infantrymen were said to not be serious.

## Angolan Civil War Continues

The civil war in Angola is getting international attention after United Nations Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali reported to the U.N. Security Council that more than 1,000 people are killed each day.

Boutros-Ghali said the war is the worst conflict being fought today. More than 3 million people are suffering because of the war.

Angola became a Cold War battleground after it gained independence from Portugal in 1975. The communist government was backed by the former Soviet Union and the rebel UNITA was backed by the United States.

The secretary-general recommended the United States send humanitarian aid and be prepared to increase the United Nation's presence there, if a cease-fire can be achieved.

## U.S. considers joining peacekeeping in Bosnia

The United States is considering providing as many as 25,000 military personnel for a NATO peacekeeping force in Bosnia-Herzegovina.

NATO is planning to deploy a force of 50,000 to the country after the Croats, Serbs and Muslims reach a peace agreement.

Peace in the region continues to be a distant hope as fighting continues in Bosnia and Croatia. Fighting between the Muslim and Croatian forces has continued in Mostar and Serbs and Croats have been fighting over Zagreb.

If a peace agreement is reached, a commitment of United States troops for the peacekeeping force would be dependent upon approval from Congress.

## Israel seeks peace with Arabs

Following the historic

agreement between Israel and the PLO in Washington, Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin flew to Morocco to meet with King Hassan. The meeting was expected to lead to diplomatic relations between Israel and Morocco.

Morocco has always been far more moderate toward Israel than other Arab countries but, like other Arab countries, the Palestinian issue kept the two countries from having closer ties.

While Rabin was in Morocco, representatives from Israel and Jordan were signing an agreement in Washington which is a first step toward resolving the problems between those two countries.

## Khmer Rouge wants representation

The Khmer Rouge is seeking to have some say in the national government of Cambodia after it failed to receive any support during the spring elections.

The Khmer Rouge wants a 15 percent share of the government's top positions and 20 percent control of the army in exchange for giving up the 20 percent of the country it controls and its 10,000-man army.

If the conditions are met, the Khmer Rouge will end its opposition to the elected government. The Khmer Rouge currently holds no seats in the national assembly.

## U.S. relaxes trade ban in Vietnam

The United States relaxed the trade ban with Vietnam slightly, but relations are still very chilly between the two countries.

The change of policy would allow United States businesses to bid on projects financed by international agencies.

# Marines conduct Exercise Tafakula '93 with French and Tongans

**TONGATAPU, KINGDOM OF TONGA**—The opportunity to integrate combat skills with members of the Tongan and French military proved to be an interesting experience for several members of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade.

The Marines and sailors involved with Exercise Tafakula '93 spent almost a month in Tonga working with members of the Tongan Defense Services and the French Paratrooper Marines from New Caledonia.

The exercise provided the opportunity to learn about the methods of combat, particularly amphibious doctrine. Marines spent two weeks working with the other military members. They shared the principles of combat

skills, then took those skills to the field.

The first objective was to secure three areas on the island group of Ha'apia. The Marines and Tongans launched from the Tank Landing Ship (LST) USS Bristol County-1198 while the French launched from their LST. The pre-dawn launch included 14 zodiacs and four Tongan Lubs. The launch was conducted as the ship continued to move approximately six miles from the landing site.

Utilizing the OTH (over-the-horizon) principle, the zodiacs regrouped and then in staggered formation moved toward the objective in hopes of conducting a clandestine amphibious landing.

Approximately a mile from shore a single boat moved stealthily toward the land and dropped two scout swimmers off more than 500

yards from the beach.

The scout swimmers swam in to ensure the area was secure, then signaled the remaining boats. The landing was a success as the operation had gone unnoticed by the enemy aggressor on the island. The company-sized group then set out on patrol to find the aggressors hidden somewhere in the dense jungle.

A confrontation with the enemy resulted in the capture of prisoners and the securing of the first objective. Some Marines, Tongans and French launched out for the second objective while a platoon of Marines conducted a security patrol across the island.

Having secured the island, the Marines awaited the coxswains, who would pick them up to rejoin the company. By the time the sun had set, all three objectives had been secured and it was time

to establish camp for the night. This was just one of the several days of amphibious and field training.

The techniques of combat operations for the Tongan, U.S. and French forces differ slightly. The problems of communications were difficult in the early stages of operations. Many of the Tongans speak English, but the French had only four who could speak broken English. The communications problem was solved when French-speaking Sgt. Marc Robson stepped in to serve as an interpreter.

"I served as the radioman for the French," Robson said. "I had learned French in high school and then spent some time working with a lady who spoke French so this was kinda neat to do."

Amphibious operations were new and difficult for some. Tongans have received training on amphibious operations, but the French were not accustomed to water. Working on amphibious landings was new and intriguing to the French.

"I really liked working with the boats," said Cpl. Dominique Gruet, of the French Paratrooper Marines. "We seemed to move a lot and it was interesting to see the methods of operation of the Marines, and I learned how their amphibious doctrines work. The only thing I didn't like was that I was always getting wet."

This was the first year for the French to participate in Tafakula '93. The French are based out of New Caledonia and primarily serve as paratroopers so the operation was somewhat different for them.

The Tongans and U.S. Marines

 first Tongan to ever complete The Basic School in Quantico, Va. "The Marines are top-of-the-line in demonstrating amphibious operations and are examples to the Tongans here of true combat experts."  
 Battling rainy conditions during the operations, each service gained both a highly educational and sometimes entertaining look at each other's systems.  
 One example involved the efforts to communicate. Marines were interested in the French Rations and often traded meals with them. The French later stated the Americans #5 MRE (Spaghetti) was their favorite. Another entertaining sight was the Tongans method of moving zodiacs to the shore. The Tongans would lift the boats above their heads and carry them to higher ground often making a game of it.  
 The reinforced Marine component was comprised of Recon Marines with members of TOW

platoon, engineers and communicators in support.  
 "I thought that it was really good the way we (Marines) came together to form this platoon and then to further integrate with other services," said Sgt. Kristen Duenzl, squad leader and member of TOW Platoon. "I was able to use a lot of the skills which I normally wouldn't use in TOW Platoon, like fire plan sketches."  
 The exercise also provided for some interesting viewing for the Tongan people. Many times the local residents would congregate some distance away and view the exercise. For many residents it was fun and exciting.  
 Prior to going out on the field exercise the Marines had the opportunity to compete against the Tongans and French in some friendly marksmanship competition. Firing the M16A2, the Israeli made Galil (Tongan weapon) and the FAMAS (French) proved to be no problem for the Marines.  
 "The Marines beat everyone," Taumoefolua said. "They displayed their marksmanship skills on all three weapons and no one could come close to them."

The exercise provided both an opportunity to brush up on combat and amphibious skills and also in joint services operations.  
 "I get all this and a paycheck too," said SSgt. Donald A. Mylenek, platoon sergeant for recon. "I can't believe they pay me to have this much fun."  
 The exercise was considered a success by the officers overseeing the exercise.  
 "I think things have gone well and we didn't have too many problems," said Marine Capt. Steve McNaulty.  
 "This was very good to integrate the three services," said Capt. Jamin Jean-Luc of the French Paratroopers. "We overcame the communication problems which we had early in the operation and everything stabilized. It all worked well for a good training exercise."  
 The exercise was to be concluded with a parade through main city of Nuku'alofa, however, rainy conditions prevented the parade from taking place. The members of the three services were treated to a Tongan feast to close out the exercise.  
 The Marines will be traveling

from Tonga to Western Samoa, Fiji, Suva, the Line Islands and are scheduled to return to Hawaii Oct. 4.

For many Marines and sailors, the exercise will be a learning experience which will not be soon forgotten.

# 1st MEB Marines get used to their sea legs

Marines from the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade took to the sea on the USS Ft. Fisher for an intense two weeks of amphibious operations Aug. 30- Sept. 10. During the first week of operations Marines and sailors

from 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, teamed up with the Assault Amphibian Detachment for exercises at Bellows Air Force Station.

Meanwhile, Marines from Brigade Service Support Group-1 worked with the Navy's Assault Craft Unit-5, which landed two landing craft, air cushioned (LCAC), at Hale Koa Beach to

familiarize Marines with loading and unloading the craft. Helicopter crews from Marine Aircraft Group-24 even utilized the rare opportunity to operate from an amphibious ship.

Once brigade Marines and sailors were used to operating from the ship and familiar with LCAC operations, a small Marine Air/ Ground Task Force was assembled and embarked. After steaming to the Big Island and rehearsing a landing, the task force arrived off the coast of Oahu Sept. 10 for a simulated surface and helicopter assault at Bellows. To support the assault, LCACs landed Battery C, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines at Hale Koa Beach to set up a position to provide artillery support for the amphibious landing at Bellows.

For the 3/3 Marines, the exercise with the ship gave them the opportunity to get all of the companies on the ship for 24-hours and conduct a landing at Bellows in AAVs. The 3/3 Marines also provided the command element for the final assault.

The commanding officer of 3/3, LtCol. Lee Freund, said the opportunity to work with the ships, and LCACs as a MAGTF was very valuable since the Marines here don't get to work with amphibious ships very often.

# Coxswains are the real captains of the sea

The well deck of the Tank Landing Ship (LST) USS Bristol County-1198 opened. As sea water passed along the sides, six Marines lifted a zodiac boat out on to the stern gate. In a matter of seconds the Marines found themselves in the ocean and their lives in the hands of a new captain... known as a coxswain.

Coxswains played a vital role in Exercise Tafakula '93 in transporting members of the Tongan Defense Services, U.S. Marines and French Paratrooper Marines for the amphibious operations conducted in August. The exercise took place throughout the three island groups of Tongatapu, Ha'apia and Vava'u in the Kingdom of Tonga.

Coxswains are Marines who are responsible for the operation of zodiacs. Inclusive of their mission, they are responsible for the zodiacs, personnel, equipment, amount of fuel, navigation and utilization of amphibious tactics to make a successful operation. They are the "captains" of their ship.

Those who might not fully understand the mission might perceive them to be the guys who hold the throttle and make the zodiac move. Nothing could be further from the truth.

To become a coxswain requires a tremendous amount of skill in

knowing the boat, the tides, and navigation through the use of longitude and latitude. A strong understanding of compasses and charts are another vital element of operations.

Coxswains must also be able to understand and operate under the Over-the-Horizon (OTH) theory.

"The OTH principle involves departing from the ship which is invisible from land mass," said Sgt. Clyde Sage. "The zodiacs must travel across the water to the land site."

This principle will keep the naval vessel, from which the zodiacs were launched, from being visually exposed to anyone at the proposed landing sites.

Another main objective is to transport the members of the unit to the landing site in a quick, proficient and stealthy manner. A coxswain will be responsible for four to six people per zodiac. The operations can involve any number of people from a recon team of four to a company level-launch.

The zodiacs, can be either single or dual engine. All engines for a zodiac are 35 horse power engines. The dual engines are considered to be more difficult to operate and thereby are usually controlled by a senior or more experienced coxswain. Dual engine capabilities are much greater because it has twice the power and distance capabilities than a single engine zodiac.

Coxswains are given the

opportunity to learn about the engines and their equipment at the Outboard Marine Corps School (OMC). This school educates the Marines concerning the boats and special equipment and the troubleshooting of the engines.

One of the senior coxswains on the exercise was Sgt. Brian Booth. He has attended the school and is perhaps the most knowledgeable coxswain on the exercise. He had several opportunities to display his skills.

As the units were preparing for a launch off the LST USS Bristol County-1198 a Tongan boat, called a Lub, took on excess water as it prepared to launch and began to sink. After successfully draining the boat, the engine would not start. Booth quickly dismantled the engine casing, corrected the problem and the operation was able to continue with minimal delay.

Knowing the engines is just one part a coxswain's knowledge of the boats. The air inflation level of the zodiac must be closely monitored. Particularly on the exercise, if the boats are not in the proper condition, it could be very costly. The vast amounts of coral around the Tongan islands posed a serious damage threat to the zodiacs.

"If you are not careful, the coral here could tear a zodiac to shreds," Booth said. "That is where the assistant coxswain comes into play."

The assistant coxswain serves as the eyes and ears of coxswains. His responsibilities are to look for things such as coral in the shallow water, making the coxswains aware of tide changes and swells which could affect the operation of the zodiac.

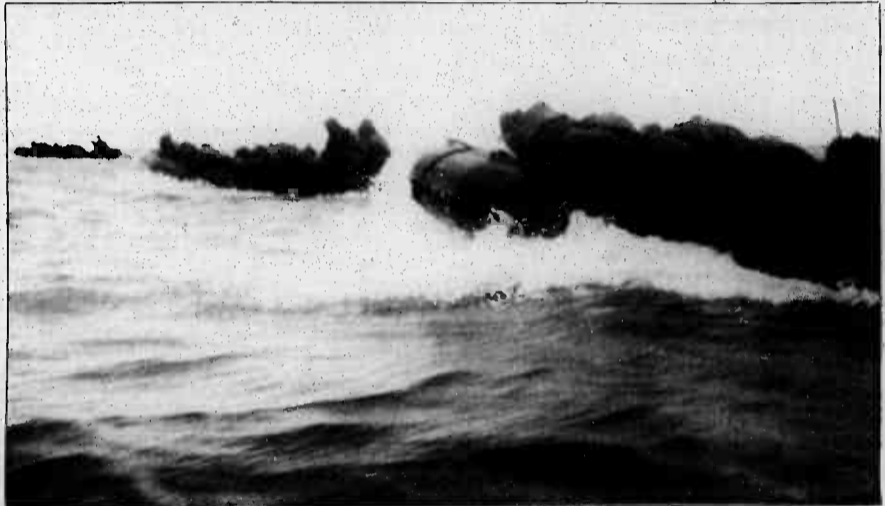
"One of the most difficult tasks was working around the coral reef," said Cpl. Vernon Stubbs. Knowing the tides and when they

are going in and coming out is important.

If more than one boat is going out on a landing, the boats will travel in a stagger column or a V-formation. These formations are for safety reasons. If someone were to fall out of the boat, these formations will allow for time to maneuver, thereby preventing a possible tragic accident.

During Exercise Tafakula '93 the experience of the coxswains resulted in a successful incident-free deployment.

"This exercise provided lot of good training for the less experienced coxswains to get some good hands-on training," Booth said. "The boats experienced only minor damage, but overall everything went really well."

# MedCAP team lends a hand to Tongan medical

**VAVA'U, KINGDOM OF TONGA**—Sailors from the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii have been busy caring for the medical and dental needs of the people of Tonga.

The sailors are part of Exercise Tafakula '93, which took place during the month of August and took the corpsmen and officers to the islands of Ha'apai and Vava'u, two of the four main island groups in the Kingdom of Tonga.

Twelve corpsmen, a medical officer and dental officer made up the medical civil action program (MedCAP) team. The three weeks of assistance the sailors provided was a much needed relief to the members of the medical profession in each of the two island groups.

The island of Ha'apai has only two doctors to care for the sick in that area.

"The two doctors in Ha'apai spend half of their time caring for the sick," said Lt. David McLaren, medical officer. "With us being here it provided them with a chance to relax a little bit."

Dental care was also a welcome sight for the Tongans. During the three weeks, Lt. Kris Johnson, dental officer, saw more than 500 patients. This was a tremendous help to resident dentist Dr. John Gilbert here.

"We usually see 15 to 17 people a day, but with the MedCAP team here, we can see more than 30 people a day," Gilbert said.

The experience was also a unique opportunity for the corpsmen to

brush up on their medical and dental skills as well.

"This is really great training for us and allows us to utilize our skills to a greater extent," said DT3 Steve Quick, 21st Dental Company. "Extracting teeth and stuff has been a lot of fun."

The first stop for the team was on Ha'apai. When the word got out the sailors were treating people, the response was overwhelming. It took a little time for the word to get out so the sailors did some painting and worked on different things at the health center.

"The Tongans were very happy to see us," said HMCM Greg Dalin, team leader and planner for the MedCAP. "This was our (a MedCAP team) first time in Ha'apai and once the word got out the patients started coming in. The weather was bad a couple of days and this kept some of the people from coming in. The overall response was tremendous."

Most of the cases handled by the medical team involved chronic skin problems, upper respiratory infections and suturing lacerations. For some, this was a different type of medical treatment than the normal military health care they give.

"I learned what medical care is like in a third world country," McLaren said. "But I see a lot of the same medical problems as in other areas. Many patients just want a different perspective, or a reassurance that they are getting good treatment. I believe that we brought much needed help and supplies. I would definitely want to come back."

Some of the supplies included

medication which the Tongans would not normally have available. Antifungal cremes and drugs were an important part of the medical supplies.

The pharmacy was run by two corpsmen, HM3 Jeff Rayborn and HM3 Jason Foree. While in Ha'apai, they averaged more than 30 prescriptions a day, while in Vava'u the average was around 130 prescriptions.

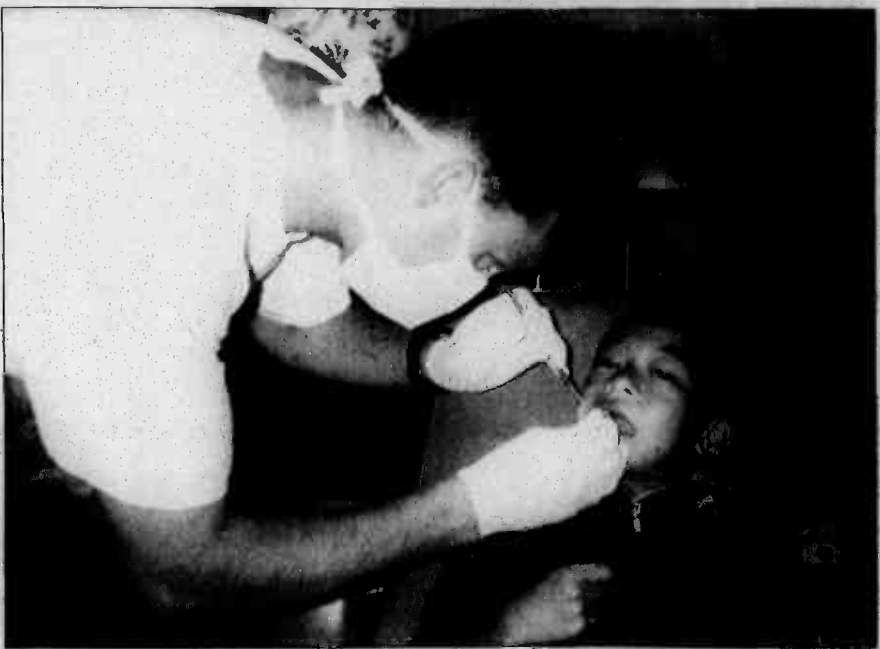
"We have stayed very busy giving out the medications," Rayborn said. "When we leave Vava'u all the medical supplies will be left here for them to use. Many of the medicines are new to the doctors here, so we had to explain what they are for and how to use them."

This is the MedCAP's third year on this island. The response was very high, which was expected, based on the previous years' turnout.

"The response was very high here because the people remember us from last year," Dalin said. "We hope that next year the people of Ha'apai will respond in this manner. That area is a definite target area for next year. They were in need of a lot of medical care and also repairs to their medical equipment."

Another sailor who kept things running was HM2 Fred Gallegos, biomedical equipment technician. Gallegos had his hands full in Ha'apai with repairs on equipment.

"The equipment here (Vava'u) was in a lot better shape than the medical equipment in Ha'apai," Gallegos said. "There was a lot of equipment which needed parts that I didn't have available to me."

I have made a list and hopefully we can get some of these parts to them to repair the equipment."

Providing the medical and dental care, bringing supplies and repairing the equipment are all good things, but it is also difficult for some, like Master Chief Dalin, to leave the Kingdom of Tonga.

"We have treated new borns to 85-year-old people here and it has been very rewarding," Dalin said.

"The learning has been beneficial and necessary. It is rewarding that so many simple things make a difference to the people. I regret the fact that there is no follow-up care which we can provide for

them. We see the patient once and that is probably the last time we will see them until next year."

Though the MedCAP team could not solve all the problems, it was a definite chance to extend a helping hand to Tonga. Many members of the team hope to return for Tafakula '94 if possible.

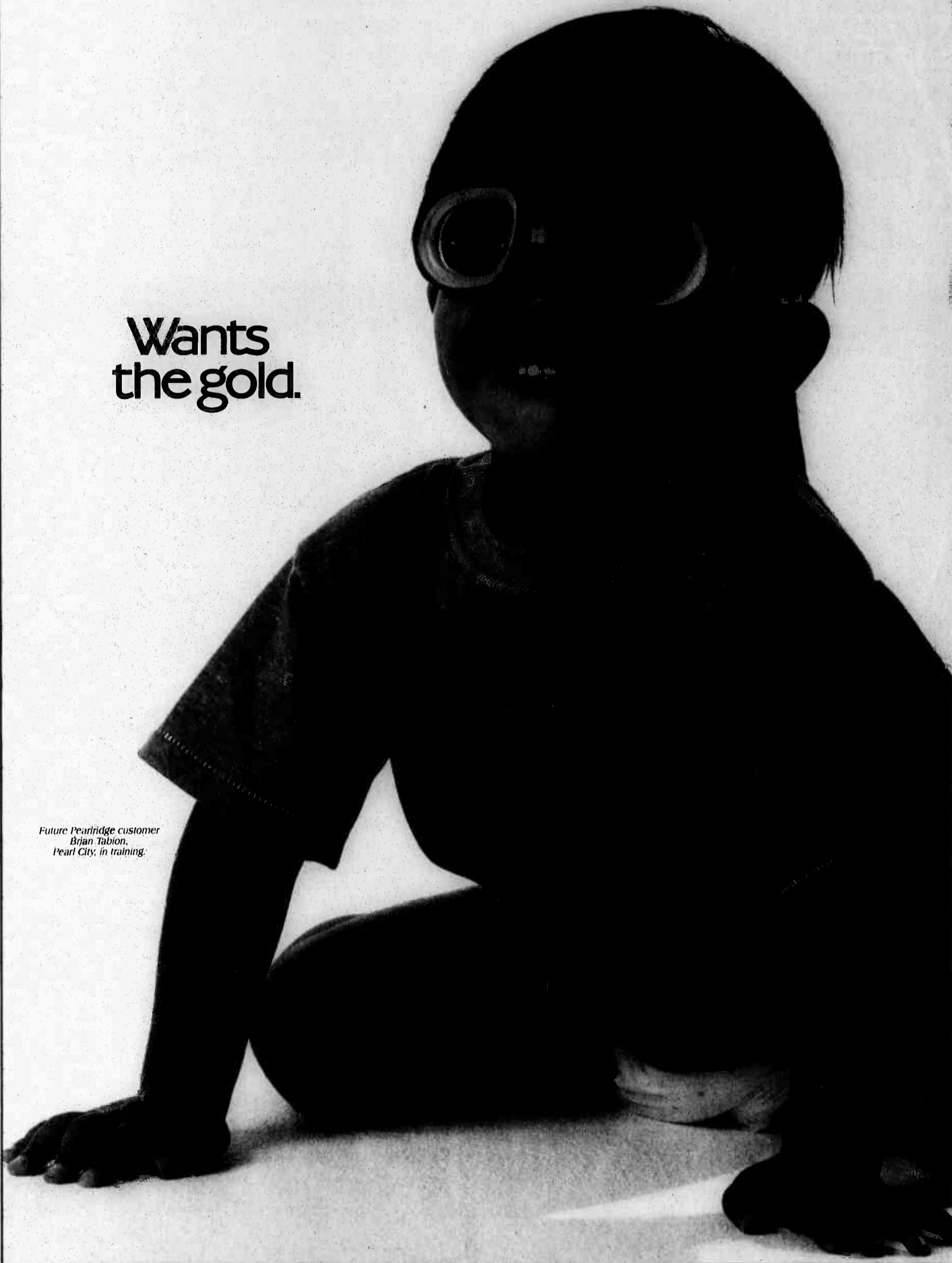

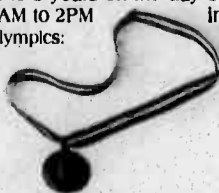

## Marine bodybuilders place

"Winning second place only made me want to go into the gym the next day and work even harder. It also made up my mind about competing in the Paradise Cup Bodybuilding competition in November," she said.

Training along with her for the Paradise Cup Bodybuilding Competition will be A.D. Williams, a first timer, who placed second in the novice division middle weight class.

"I had been told by several people that I couldn't make it because I was too old," said 38 year old Williams.

But he didn't let this get his spirits down and continued to train longer and harder than before. After three months of training, Williams had not only lost six inches from his waist but was ready for the the competition.

Placing second in his class served not only as a confidence booster but also as a stepping stone for the next competition.

"Now I plan to continue bodybuilding and my next competition will be the Paradise

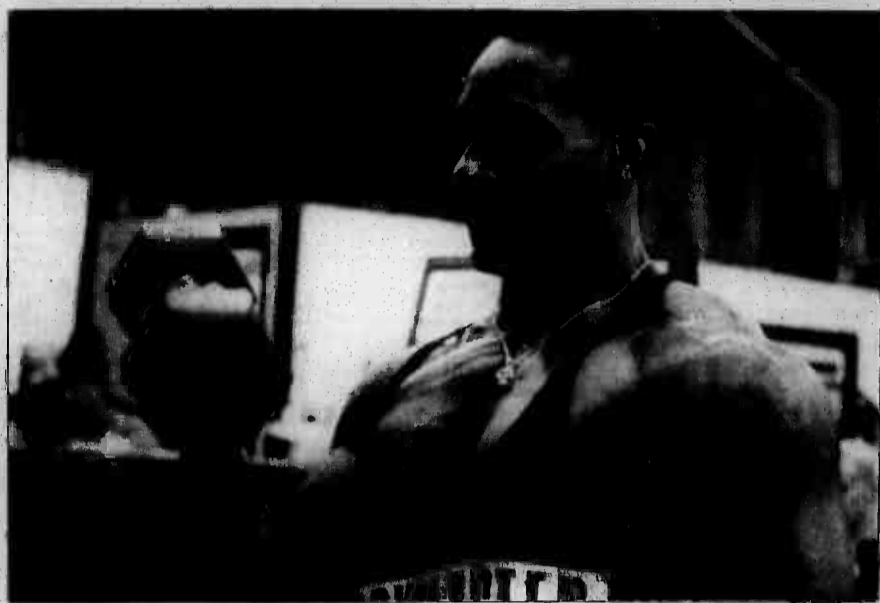
Cup Bodybuilding Competition. I couldn't have done any of this without Cordes. He taught me all his knowledge about nutrition and training. I can honestly tell you that there was nobody in the gym who was training harder than we were," Williams said.

Although winning the competition came as no surprise to veteran bodybuilder Cordes, he says winning this competition put him one step closer to his goal of being a professional bodybuilder.

## Cops bust Vikings, move into first place

The PMO Raiders moved into a tie for first place in the Camp Smith Flag Football League Friday night by knocking off the MARFORPAC Vikings, 20-12, at Bordelon Field. Both teams now stand at 7-2.

The CINCPAC Cowboys also posted a victory against the Supply Steelers in Friday's first game.

The Steelers scored first on a 38-yard rush by QB Michael Blackston in the second quarter. CINCPAC tied the score on the first play following the Steeler kickoff. Quarterback R.C. Jeffcoat connected with receiver Brennan Ford for a 39-yard pass/run play to even the score at 6.

The Cowboy offense gained momentum in the second half as Jeffcoat put his team in the lead with a 10-yard TD run. On a drive set up by CINCPAC's Rob Collins' fourth interception of the year, Jeffcoat hit Ford on a 20-yard touchdown pass to bring the score to 18-6. Jeffcoat scored his second rushing TD of the game late in the fourth quarter when he dashed into the end zone from the Supply 21. Bob Ludwig caught the Jeffcoat pass for the extra points to give CINCPAC the 26-6 victory and a 2-7 record. The Steelers, suffering through a four-game losing streak, are also 2-7.

In Game Two, the PMO Raiders avenged their loss to the MARFORPAC Vikings earlier this season. Solid Raider defense, led by Mike Brady, hampered the Vikings all night.

After a scoreless first quarter, MARFORPAC scored on a 6-yard run by QB Kenneth Hodges. The 6-0 lead was short-lived, however, as PMO roared backed on their next possession. QB Mike Tillis threw a 36-yard touchdown pass to HB Nathan Hicks, followed by a 2-point conversion pass to Darren

Bullock, to take an 8-6 lead. good, 14-12.

MARFORPAC regained the lead in the second half on its first possession, capped by a 3-yard pass from Hodges to James McWhorter. After a failed PAT, the Vikings led, 12-8.

In the fourth quarter, PMO got a break when Tillis, playing defense, intercepted a Hodges pass on the Viking 18. Four plays later, the Raiders were faced with a fourth and goal at the 2. Bullock sneaked into the end zone, where Tillis delivered his second TD pass to put the Raiders in the lead for

The Vikings took the kickoff with 1:30 remaining in the game. They drove quickly to the PMO 33-yard line, but were halted by Tillis' second interception at the Raider 16. Tillis brought the ball back to the Viking 30, where the Raider offense took over.

On the last play of the game, Tillis completed a 14-yard TD pass to Bullock, his second of the night. With the 20-12 victory and a 7-2 record, the Raiders moved into a tie for first place with the Vikings.

## From the cheap seats: A sports commentary

The argument of whether or not college athletes should get paid for what they do is still blowing. Both sides of the argument appear to have valid points, yet the NCAA seems to be holding a hard line against the concept.

Most collegiate athletes feel that their performance for their school brings in revenue for that institution. Usually the two big revenue generators for colleges are football and men's basketball. Most of the other athletic programs don't bring in any money. The athletes say that they take the same punishment in college sports that they would in professional sports and that they train just as hard. Therefore, the athletes feel that there is no difference between what they do in college and what they could do on a professional level. The athletes feel that the school uses them to make money, and after four years they are gone.

During a student athlete's four or five years in school, there are many restrictions put on them that are not put on others students. For example, an athlete on scholarship cannot work for the university to make extra money. Any other student on scholarship can work at the dormitory cafeteria. Why can't an athlete on scholarship? I understand that the NCAA doesn't want student athletes to work because they are over burdened with studies and practice, and a job would only

cut into one or the other. And, if a student athlete cannot study, they can't get good grades, and can't play. Or, if a student athlete cannot practice, their game performance may suffer. Either way, the university may lose money because the student athlete isn't living up to expectations and may have wasted a scholarship.

Another restriction put out by the NCAA is that student athletes cannot accept nominal "gifts" from coaches like a meal, or a ride home from practice. I guess the NCAA feels that buying a kid a Big Mac and fries influenced that kid's choice of school. Sure, wouldn't we all commit to a college because the coach said he would take us to McDonald's every once in a while?

If a coach sees a student walking down the street in pouring rain, the coach can't stop and offer a ride. All of us, at one time or another have probably done this just because it is a nice, friendly gesture. Somehow the NCAA has figured that this can be misconstrued as a payoff or some impropriety.

Of course, there are other, larger restrictions the NCAA has implemented. We all know about the cars and the cash from the millionaire alumni, etc. These restrictions are practical because they mirror most of society. Most companies do have some form of a code of ethics. And for the most part, this will revolve around a member of that organization not being able to accept large, expensive gifts in return for favorable treatment. Well, the same goes for universities and scholarship

athletes. Ideally, restrictions on student athletes are supposed to be for the individual's and the university's well being. But the ideals have gotten jumbled up over the years to the point of being ridiculous. The NCAA institutions, however, see it differently.

Many college administrators do not feel that a student athlete should get benefits or be paid. They say student athletes get one giant benefit, a college education. And, depending on where you go to school, that could be anywhere from \$15,000 to \$60,000 over four years. That's pretty significant cash in any language. The flip side is that the university may make ten times that much in tournaments, bowl games and T.V. revenues. The quality of their scholarship athletes will impact the money the school makes.

So now you might say that if a college gives a great athlete-student a scholarship, and this athlete-student leads them to the promised land, and the school generates the big bucks; why not give the athlete-student a cut of the money? Well, the NCAA institutions will ask, "Which athletes get the cut of the money?" Just the football player who leads them to a bowl victory? Or the star hoopster who takes them down the road to the final four and a NCAA championship? What about the wrestler on scholarship who wins the NCAA title? He wasn't on T.V., generating television revenue, but he was representing the institution in exchange for an

education. Is his NCAA title worth less than a basketball championship? Did he work any less to achieve that accomplishment? No. So, how does a university determine which scholarship student athletes to pay and which ones not to pay? All of them can't be paid because there won't be enough money to go around.

Most colleges put money generated from athletics into the school's big pot of money. They don't specifically designate it to sports only. If a university pays its scholarship student athletes, what becomes of the scholarship students? The money for those scholarships won't be there. It probably won't be there for the little things like books in the school library. This means the money from football T.V. revenues goes to help pay professors and buy books which are the necessities of any school.

So, the college institutions feel the student athletes do get paid; via free education. The athletes feel they are exploited by the schools, so the school can make money. They are both right!

I don't think student athletes should get paid. It would bankrupt many small schools and diminish the quality of education at bigger schools. At the same time, NCAA institutions need to get rid of many of the ridiculous restrictions imposed upon student athletes.

Cordes' accomplishments in bodybuilding continue to occur because he is constantly trying to improve.

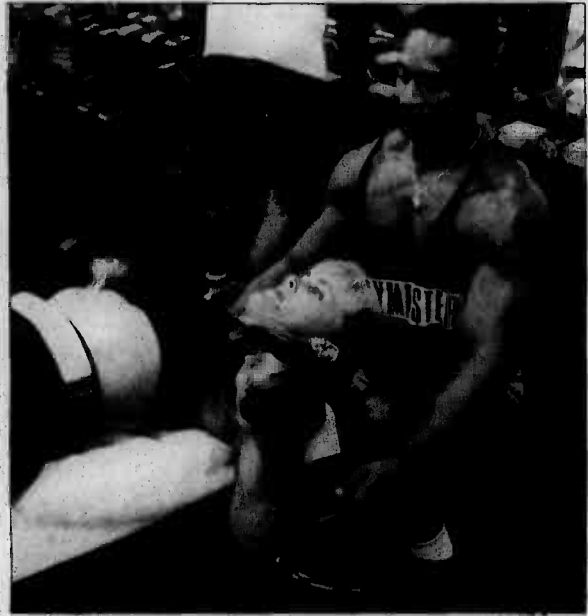
"Although during competitions many people reassure me that I am going to win, I am my own competition. I am always trying to improve myself," Cordes said.

I hear your frustration. When

you live on base, you tend to have a kinder outlook on your fellow man. It's more like a small town where everyone and people are actually honest. Unfortunately, that isn't always the case in either a small town or on base. There are always people who don't care about rights of others, and we have to guard against them.

One of the best things you can do to protect your property is to engrave your social security number on anything of value. The military police have engraving kits you can borrow. That makes identification of your property much easier if it is recovered. Another thing you can do is register your son's bike with the base police. They will give you a sticker for the bike and contact you if it's found. A strong bike lock wouldn't hurt either. It is also a good idea to keep your house locked when you are gone. A number of break-ins have occurred recently in the housing area. Also, lock your car at night and never leave the keys in it — not even for a moment.

Whenever property is stolen on base, people tend to blame "locals." That isn't always true. Recently,

three dependents were found to be involved in thefts. They were declared "persona non grata" and barred from the base. That means that they can't live here or use any of the base facilities. Their parents will have to send them to relatives or move off base themselves. Perhaps that will send a message to other dependents who might decide to break base regulations.
