Marine Corps to celebrate 218th Birthday

Marines world-wide will celebrate the 218th birthday of the Marine Corps Wednesday as part of an annual tradition.

It doesn't matter if Marines are off the coast of Somalia, in the Arabian Gulf, or some other area of the world; all Marines follow the Nov. 1, 1921, order by MGen. John A. Lejeune, the 13th Commandant of the Marine Corps, which directed that all Marines remember the honorable service of the Marine Corps on the birthday of the Corps.

Nov. 10 has been a time to remember the past accomplishments of the Corps, remember those who have fallen, and look to the future.

Like Marines everywhere, the Marines in Hawaii have several activities planned to mark the birth of the Corps.

Birthday observances in Hawaii will begin tonight at Marine Barracks Hawaii. The barracks Marines will be conducting the Marine Barracks Hawaii Sunset Parade at 5 p.m. in front of the barracks' headquarters building at Pearl Harbor.

Camp H.M. Smith will celebrate the birthday with a

cake cutting ceremony at 7:15 a.m. Wednesday at parking lot #1. The uniform will be Summer Service "C."

MCAS Kaneohe Bay and the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade will celebrate the birthday Wednesday at 10 a.m. during a joint cake cutting ceremony at the station headquarters building (building 215). The uniform for the ceremony is utilities. Dependents and friends of Marines are invited to the ceremony.

In addition to the cake cutting ceremony, Pless Hall will serve a Marine Corps Birthday meal from 10:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. Wednesday.

Dependents, retirees and civilians are welcome to enjoy the meal.

The menu will consist of French onion soup, shrimp seafood cocktail with seafood cocktail sauce, grilled loin strip steak sauteed onions and mushrooms, baked potatoes with sour cream and butter, buttered asparagus with lemon sauce, buttered corn, salad bar with assorted dressings, relish tray, dinner rolls with butter patties, birthday cake and assorted ice cream.

Dependents of E-4s and below are surcharge exempt for the meal. Meal prices are: meal rate, \$1.90; surcharge, \$4.55; and full rate, \$6.45.

Bonus programs held up in Congress

For Marines entitled fiscal year 1994 selective reenlistment bonuses, the word from headquarters is either wait, or reenlist now and just hope for the best.

The bonus programs are currently being held up in Congress. Marines in any of the 43 military occupational specialties that offer reenlistment cash won't be able to guarantee their money until the Department of Defense budget is passed for FY-94.

"It's like having money in the bank, but not being able to spend it," said Capt. Jim Burke, of the Enlisted Promotion and Incentives Office at Marine Headquarters in Washington D.C. "The money is there, but we can't get to it until the budget is passed."

According to ALMAR 267-93 released Sept. 21, "continuation of [bonus] programs is tied to congressional action on the FY-94 DoD Authorization bill." That bill has not been passed.

The ALMAR further states that bonus-eligible Marines reenlisting between Oct. 1, 1994 and the authorization bill's approval date could possibly lose their bonus. The only way those Marines reenlisting during the lapse period would receive their cash incentive would be if the bill includes a retroactive statement covering the lapse period.

Last year's bonus program endured a similar congressional delay, but there was a retroactive statement written into the bill to cover the lapse period. Incentives officials said that Marines choosing to reenlist during the lapse period would be taking a chance.

Career planners advise Marines now approved for reenlistment and eligible for a bonus to file month-to-month extensions instead of reenlisting during the lapse period. Extensions can be filed through their unit career planning office until the bill is approved.

"Marines who are granted

reenlistment authority during the first quarter of FY-94 may extend their enlistment into January 1994 or until bonus authority is restored," the ALMAR states.

Only Marines considered to be in "Zone A" are eligible for an FY-94 bonus. Zone A refers to Marines with less than six years of time-in-service.

A few Marines, however, are quickly approaching their six-year zone — the service limit and could miss their bonus opportunity. They are facing a tough choice ... the only choice if they're looking for cash.

They must reenlist before passing their six-year mark and hope for the authorization bill's retroactive clause. Should the clause fail to make it into the bill, Burke said Marines would be able to make an appeal to the Board for Corrections of Naval Records, but there would still be no guarantee.

"What it's coming down to," explained SSgt. Fernando G. Schiefelbein, career planner at the Joint Career Planners Office at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, "is Marines reenlisting to continue being Marines — no duty preference, no special school assignments, and limited or no bonus incentives.

"As of this fiscal year, duty preference is being handled separately from reenlistments. Before, we could offer Marines a choice of duty at the time of reenlistment, now they have to send in an AA [administrative action] form after reenlistment to request their choice.

Although the bonuses are being held up, it hasn't stopped Marines from reenlisting.

"There hasn't been any indication of the changes influencing the Marines' decision to reenlist... yet," Schiefelbein said. "Basically our hands will be tied. All we can do is offer a few more years, and a paycheck as a Marine."

Combined Federal Campaign extended

Gen. Robert L. Rutherford, commander, Pacific Air Forces and chair of the 1993 Hawaii-Pacific Area Combined Federal Campaign, has announced that the CFC will be extended to Nov. 12. The charity drive among federal military and civilian employees, which got underway Oct. 1, was originally scheduled to conclude Oct. 31.

Rutherford said he decided to extend the CFC for two reasons. "First we want to accommodate ships' crews and other military personnel temporarily deployed away from home. We intend to make a one-on-one appeal to every federal employee, to afford everyone the opportunity to help

others in the community.

"At the same time," Rutherford continued, "we're acutely aware that more than 1,000 local, national and international charities the Combined Federal Campaign supports need the dollars we can raise more than ever this year. The problem they face is that the sluggish economy has weakened other sources of funding at the same time the demand for the services these groups provide is rising.

"We want to do our part, so I'm taking this step to make sure CFC keyworkers have all the time they need to make a personal appeal to every federal employee. We're campaigning under the slogan, 'I Care!' this year, and everyone should have a chance to show that he or she really does care."

Rutherford compared the task of the CFC to that of Aloha United Way. "To a considerable degree, we face the same challenge," he noted. "The groups we help need us more than ever, yet the people we depend on for the success of our campaigns are concerned about their personal financial situations to a greater degree than usual this year. Government employees are affected by the economy like everyone else. The military — by far the largest segment of the federal community in Hawaii — is going through a major force reduction, and a lot of our people face the prospect of separation and early retirement. This makes it harder than ever to raise funds.

"I understand that AWW's approach is to be realistic and try to meet a goal that is no higher than last year's. And, from what I read in the newspapers, that is still a major challenge. At CFC we've raised our goal this year, but only slightly. We're doing everything we can to meet, and I hope, even exceed the target, but we'll need the support of all federal employees to get there.

"I hope people will really stop and think about how much is riding on their gifts to CFC this year, that they'll understand that charity is no abstract concept but assistance to people trying to overcome real problems, and that they'll give as generously as they possibly can."

At the end of week four, CFC keyworkers had individually contacted 72 percent of the area's roughly 79,000 federal military and

Smoking policy clouds NQLB meeting

Navy Capt. Ed Comier, commander of the Defense Commissary Agency (DECA), Pacific District, and Sgt. Mathew Becker of the Crime Prevention Unit at the MCAS Kaneohe Bay Provost Marshal's Office talked to a small, but concerned crowd at the Neighborhood Quality of Life Board meeting Oct. 28.

After the two speakers were through with their presentations, Capt. Chris Martin, NQLB chairman, opened the floor to other concerns. Perhaps the biggest concern came from a bowler who was upset about the way the station implemented the no smoking ban at K-Bay Lanes.

"I'm a very considerate smoker," said Lucy Woods. "I have read the order stating the smoking policy at the bowling alley and I'm convinced this will not change. I can't see where there was any courtesy towards us smokers. My

question is why was it the first I heard of no smoking when I walked into the bowling alley Saturday night?"

"I felt like a child, because they infringed on my rights the way it was handled. After spending all that money, \$40 on shoes and \$100 on a ball, and my husband spent twice that, they didn't even give us warning. I wasn't even afforded the right to choose whether or not to stay at K-Bay Lanes. If I had known I couldn't smoke, I might have decided not to join the league that just started two weeks ago," Woods said.

Morale, Welfare and Recreation Deputy Director Tim Hudson tried to provide answers to Wood's questions, but to no avail, the angry bowler wasn't satisfied.

Comier also fielded many questions from commissary patrons. He said keeping the stores stocked is one of the major problems he faces daily.

"I am told what I can put on the shelves from the regional office in Seattle," Comier said. "There

are six commissary stores in Hawaii which account for 22 percent of the total DECA sales, but they account for 49 percent of our costs."

He also talked about the profits made by each store and what each store has to face. "Before the new store here at Kaneohe, frankly, I was ashamed of it (K-Bay's old commissary). We couldn't keep it cleaned, and it was bringing in only \$1.2 million a month. Schofield brings in approximately \$4 million a month.

"K-Bay's new commissary brought \$1.7-\$1.8 million (per month) the first couple of months and has now tapered off to around \$1.4 (per month)," Comier said. Other Marines and dependents asked if it was possible to have the commissary here stay open later one night a week, because working mothers sometimes find it hard to make it to the store and do their shopping before the 7 p.m. closing time.

Comier said it is possible, but "we will have to take the extra hours it stays open one night away

from another night," Comier said. One person asked about bicycle racks at the commissary. Comier replied: "They don't have any? I can fix that."

While the bowling alley and commissary were hot topics, the presentation by the PMO representative was hot in a different way.

Becker was promoting maximum participation in the "Station Night Out" Nov. 15 from 5-10 p.m.

"This is to get to know your neighbors, not the ones you have barbecues with, but the ones you don't know. It will familiarize you with what kind of cars they have, what they look like and whose children belong to whom; therefore, you will know when there is someone in your neighborhood that doesn't belong," Becker said.

According to Becker, getting to know your neighbors helps put a stop to crime. Crime awareness presentations will be held at the Provost Marshal's Office Nov. 15 from 5-6 p.m.

Helpful number in time of need

The following is a list of phone numbers that provides help to you and your family:

Child Protective Services (CPS): 832-5300-CPS provides for the welfare of children who are victims of abuse.

Military Spouse Abuse Shelter: 533-7125-The military spouse abuse shelter provides shelter for victims of abuse who are active duty members, dependents or retired. This can include children. Additionally, counseling is provided to these individuals (group or individual) in this area of interest. This phone number is the 24-hour crisis line and transportation to and from the shelter is provided. Some child development activities are provided for the children.

Family Advocacy: 257-3655- Family Advocacy assesses the needs and treatments that a family or individual might need as a victim or a perpetrator in an abuse case.

Navy/Marine Corps Relief: 254-1327/8- Navy/Marine Corps Relief will help provide money for basic living expenses (rent, etc.) transportation, emergency leave, repair to vehicles which are the only means of transportation for work and some types of medical and dental care. Any monies provided through Navy/Marine Corps Relief will require a repayment plan. Budget counseling and baby layettes are also provided for free.

Red Cross: 257-3150- The Red Cross provides emergency communications between

servicemembers and their families. This includes the verification of emergencies and situations that would allow for emergency leave. In some cases the Red Cross may make interest free loans for transportation.

Armed Services YMCA: 254-4719- The Armed Service YMCA provides family counseling and educational classes.

Family Service Center: 257-3655- The Family Service Center provides family counseling and family oriented workshops.

Transition Assistance Management Office (TAMP): 257-3135- TAMP has many classes available to personnel leaving the active duty status. For more information contact James Gardner.

- Three Marines were apprehended for driving under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. Two Marines submitted to an intoxilyzer test which resulted in readings of .175 and .161 percent blood alcohol content. The other Marine submitted to a blood test with results pending. All three Marines were released to their unit representative.
- A suicide ideation was reported to Military Police when a Marine called his wife and stated that she would be receiving \$100 soon. Military Police contacted the Marine and he declined to make a statement. He was later released to his unit representative.
- There were four family disturbances reported to Military Police in the past week. In three

of the incidents there were no injuries.

- An auxiliary game warden observed four individuals illegally net fishing in Ekahi Pond. It was revealed the four individuals gained access by entering a drainage pipe. The individuals were detained and advised of their civilian rights and released to Honolulu Police Department.
- It was reported to the Military Police that an unknown person had broken the window of the screen door and gained access to quarters aboard the air station. The person stole a portable Kenwood CD player.
- A Marine reported he had detained two other Marines after he observed them tampering with a vehicle in the MCX parking lot. It was revealed they had forced

entry and damaged the sun visor. The two Marines were transported to the Military Police Department where they were advised of their rights. One made a written statement and the other declined to make a statement. Military Police detected a moderate odor of an alcohol beverage emitting from one of the Marine's breath and the Marine was under the legal age to consume alcohol. They were both released to their unit representative.

This week around the world

North Korea nukes controversy continues

The United Nations General Assembly refused to let North Korea get away with inspections of its nuclear facilities. The assembly passed a resolution which urged North Korea to allow inspections of its facilities.

If North Korea does not allow inspections of its nuclear facilities by the International Atomic Energy Agency, the Security Council may impose sanctions. The United States and South Korea are concerned that if sanctions are imposed, North Korea may prepare a quick and violent reaction.

In an effort to resolve the issue, Secretary of Defense Les Aspin said the United States will try to end the controversy through talks with Pyongyang.

The IAEA believes that North Korea is developing nuclear weapons at two of its atomic plants. The deadlock began in March when North Korea announced it was withdrawing from the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty.

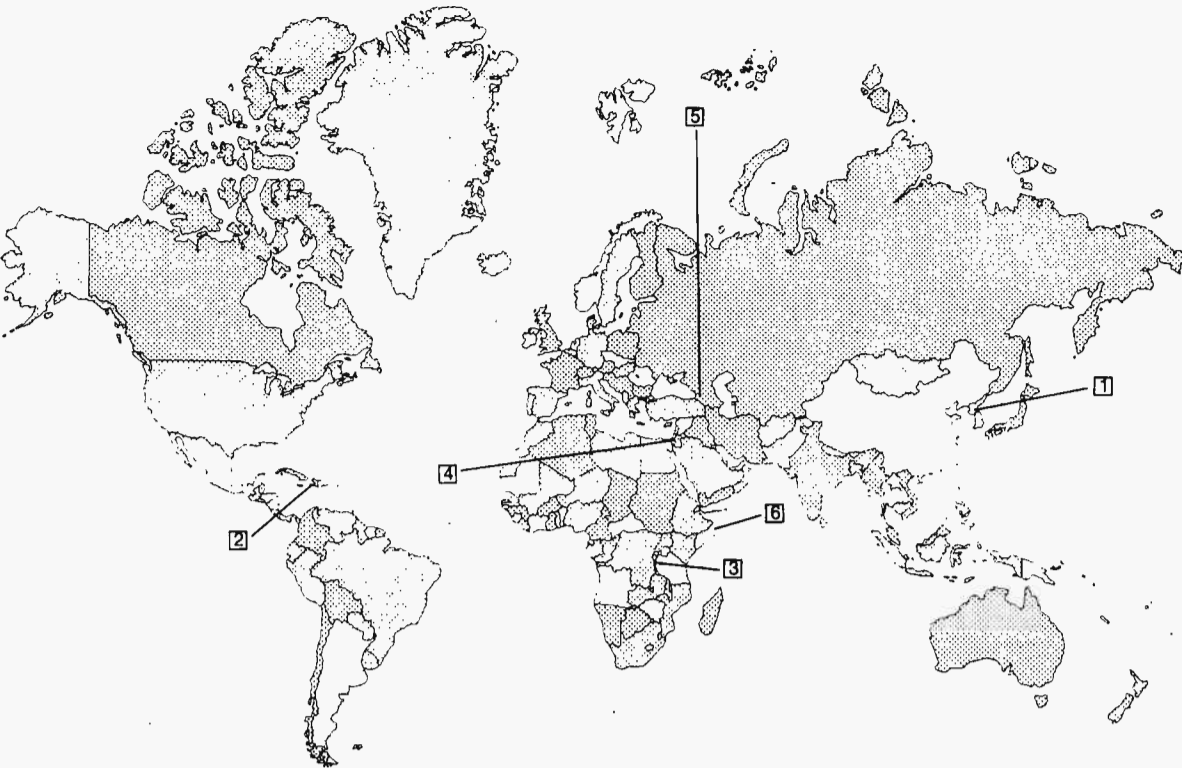
Japan and the United States have agreed to work closely to resolve the problem. They have also agreed to a theater missile defense system.

Marines increase presence near Haiti

The United States added 650 Marines aboard an amphibious assault ship to the naval blockade around Haiti. The move was in response to the Haitian military's refusal to step down and allow the return of exiled President Jean Bertrand Aristide.

Marines would be used to evacuate Americans in Haiti if their lives are endangered by the continued chaos in the country.

Aristide was supposed to have returned to Haiti Saturday from the United States, but the situation in Haiti did not allow him to return. With Aristide's arrival uncertain, opposition groups



pushed for his resignation and moved to replace him.

The exiled president was forced to leave Haiti after the military forced him out of office in September 1991.

An agreement by both sides, which was negotiated by the United Nations, was supposed to allow for Aristide's return to Haiti and his return to power, but the military rulers in Haiti changed their position and have not guaranteed a safe return for Aristide. In response, the United Nations imposed an oil embargo on the country Oct. 18.

Military officials stated the United Nations agreement is dead if Aristide didn't return by the specified day.

United Nations to send troops to Burundi

United Nations peacekeepers may be going to Burundi soon. About 100 troops are being requested to provide a security force.

This small African country has been tense after the government was overthrown by the army Oct. 21. The ousted prime minister, Sylvio Kinigi, wants the United Nations troops in her country to help protect key officials and key military installations.

Although the army has agreed to return power to the elected government, the coup lead to

renewed fighting between the Hutu and Tutsi tribes. The fighting has caused about 600,000 refugees to leave the country.

First problem in PLO/Israeli peace talks

Representatives from the Palestinian Liberation Organization ended negotiations with Israel Tuesday because of a dispute over Israel's refusal to withdraw its military quickly and completely from the occupied Gaza Strip and Jericho.

The two sides will return to the

negotiating table in Egypt in one week.

Although the talks had an unexpected break, the Israeli spokesman said progress was still being made. The dispute originated after the Israeli delegation's proposal for redeployment of forces outside Jericho and cities in Gaza. The Palestinians want a withdrawal of Israeli forces not a redeployment.

In addition to the Israeli proposal, the Palestinians presented a plan for a police force in Jericho and the Gaza strip which would fill the void left by the Israeli military.

Although there is an obstacle in the peace talks, it appears as if

the peace process will continue. Palestinian autonomy in the regions is scheduled to begin in less than six weeks.

Russian troops under fire in Georgia

Russian soldiers have been caught in the civil war in Georgia and have already killed several Georgian rebels during weekend attacks. Russian troops deployed last week to Georgia to protect key railway lines, but they have officially declared neutrality in the war.

The rebels began the week by recapturing some of the ground they lost earlier in the week after the introduction of Russian troops. The troops helped the government forces of President Eduard Shevardnadze momentarily regain much of the territory it had lost. After losing more ground during the weekend, government forces are now on the offensive again.

Russian soldiers were used to help the government forces after Shevardnadze joined the Commonwealth of Independent States. The government forces have been suffering heavy defeats for several weeks from the rebels loyal to ousted president Zviad Gamsakhurdia.

A total of 19,000 Russian troops were already stationed in Georgia. No new Russian forces have been deployed to the region.

After a meeting with 12 clan leaders, United Nations representatives said the clan leaders feel Mohamed Farah Aided has an unfair advantage because he did not disarm as the United Nations had requested.



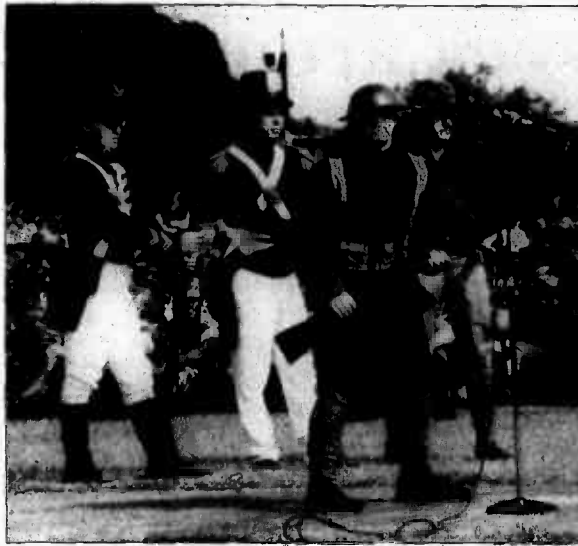

Drivers' course improves skills

The military requires a drivers license and, in some cases, a driver's improvement card in order to operate a motor vehicle on their installations.

All active duty military personnel who are under 26 years of age are required to complete the Drivers' Improvement Course. This age group wasn't chosen randomly, as some people may think.

"Studies show that most accidents involve drivers of that age group," explained Cpl. John Fritz, course instructor here.

The purpose of the course is to inform individuals of techniques to improve their driving skills and prevent an accident from happening.

The course is required by Department of Defense Instruction 6055.4, Marine Corps Order 5100.19C and by Air Station Order 5500.6C. It doesn't matter where you're stationed, if you are in that age group, you must complete the

course. Military personnel are required to complete the course within six months of checking into a duty station. Personnel who need to take the course should speak with their Training NCO.

The Drivers' Improvement Course held here lasts one day and uses films and slides, with questions throughout, to instruct the students on driving techniques, requirements, and safety. Materials are provided by the AAA (American Automobile Association) Traffic Safety Department.

While the films may be dated, the techniques taught are still important and will enhance the students' defensive driving skills.

The responsibility of the driver is stressed during the course. This includes the importance of not driving while drunk or letting a friend drive drunk. The films and slides depict the effects of alcohol on the reaction and judgement of a driver. They also give tips on how to drink responsibly and some ways to handle a friend who is

attempting to drive. In the afternoon the students participate in a demonstration known as "The Convincer." The machine demonstrates the importance of wearing seat (safety) belts. Students are "buckled" in a seat and then released to crash into rubber bumpers at the bottom. While the seat only achieves 10 mph, it proves the point. The impact is enough to jerk the student forcibly, and causes the student to think of what a faster collision could do.

"The Convincer is a new addition to the course," Fritz said. "I'm glad we added it to the instruction because it gives the students the feel of what a collision does. It is one thing to tell or show them what could happen, but the demonstration lets them judge for themselves."

At the end of the course instruction the students review the lessons and take a test.

K-Bay MP of the Year

Is it an ambition to succeed or a desire to achieve his every goal which makes this Marine excel above the rest?

Although Sgt. Rusty Smith admitted those are some of the reasons behind his success in the Marine Corps, he explained his biggest drive is the love for his work.

"I enjoy my job. I love handling dogs," he said as he petted one of the military police dogs.

This love and dedication to his work are noted not only in the way he portrays himself as the MCAS Kaneohe Bay Military Police Department's kennel master, but also in his total image as a Marine. His superior performance as the kennel master and as a Marine were what earned him the title as the 1993 Law Enforcement Officer of the Year for MCAS Kaneohe Bay.

Smith received a plaque for his accomplishment Oct. 21 at a banquet at the Prince Kuhio Hotel. The banquet was in honor of all the Oahu law enforcement officers who were selected by their departments to hold this title. The awards were given by Hawaii Security and Law Enforcement Coalition.

"As I held the plaque, I thought

about the Marines who really deserved it — the Marines who work for me. They earned this plaque. If it wasn't for the fact that I have such a good section, I wouldn't have received this award," Smith explained.

This way of thinking is among Smith's most admired qualities. In addition, his esprit de corps and constant willingness to lead sets an example for his subordinates, as well as those of higher rank.

"His leadership ability makes not only the Marines who work for him follow and respect him, but it also makes the dogs he trains have respect for him," said Lt. Christopher Romano, deputy provost marshal for operations.

The love and admiration the dogs have for him is mutual, Smith said.

He has been around dogs all his life. Raised in the country, Smith grew up around hunting dogs. In fact, one of his first work experiences with dogs was training his two dogs for hunting.

Smith explained that when he came into the Marine Corps he did not know he could be a dog handler. He enlisted as a regular military policeman. When he found out about the dog handler MOS (military occupational specialty), he became very interested.

"As soon as I found out about it, I knew that it was definitely

something I would like to do," Smith explained.

After going to the Military Police School at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas, Smith remained there for another 5 weeks to go through the Patrol Dog School.

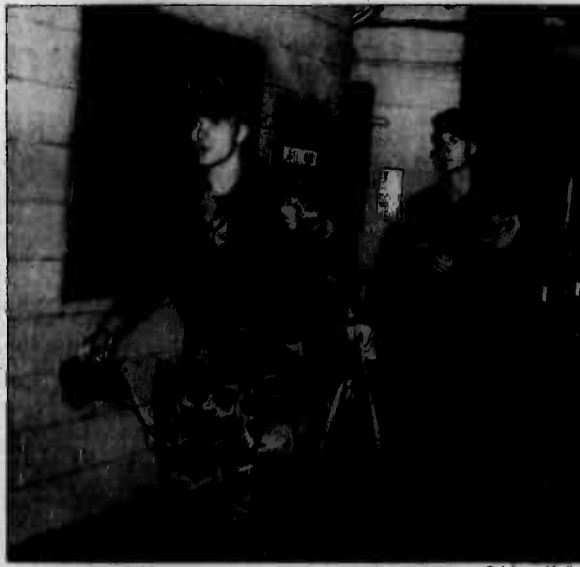
Upon completion of his training, Smith received orders to MCAS Beaufort, S.C., where he served as a dog handler for the military police department. It was from there that Smith was sent on temporary additional duty to New York to assist members of the U.S. Customs Service at John F. Kennedy (JFK) International Airport.

While at the airport, Smith helped seize more than 500 pounds of illegal narcotics and received a certificate of appreciation for his efforts there.

Prior to coming to MCAS Kaneohe Bay, Smith attended the Department of Defense Working Dog Agency Supervisors Course at Lackland AFB. Immediately upon arriving here he began training as the kennel master.

"Smith has constantly maintained a superior performance. He has served in three jobs; working as a dog handler, as a trainer and as the kennel master. They are not easy jobs, but he was able to do all three jobs superbly," Romano said.

"He is far and above the best I

Not only does Smith do a great job as the kennel master, he also uses his outstanding skills as a member of the Special Reaction Team. Smith has been a member of SRT since he completed the two-week school in Fort McClellan, Ala., a year ago.

Smith hopes to enhance his military and technical skills by becoming an instructor at Lackland AFB.

"I would like to gain experience teaching students and training dogs," Smith explained.

It is his hunger for improvement which pushes Smith to continually do well as a Marine. But, Smith disagrees that success has anything to do with wanting to get ahead.

He said, "I don't do things for awards or for recognition; I do it because I enjoy what I'm doing."

New ID cards evaluated NQLB

Marine Corps testing of the new machine-readable, tamper-resistant identification card began at Marine Corps Base Quantico Oct. 7. If the tests are successful, it is likely all Department of Defense personnel and their dependents will use the new card.

This phase two testing of the Real-Time Automated Personnel Identification System (RAPIDS) will continue through Jan. 1, 1994, according to Capt. Michael Villalva, military personnel officer for the Marine Corps Combat Development Command.

New, computer-generated cards will be issued only as required under normal circumstances. They will not be issued simply for the sake of replacement, according to MCCDC Bulletin 5512.

The wrap-around plastic lamination on the card gives an estimated life of four years, reducing the number of times a person might need to replace a worn-out card.

The lamination also helps to make the card virtually tamper proof. During testing the card

was boiled, washed, picked at and subjected to many other rigorous tests, according to Villalva. The credit card-sized ID withstood all the testing without separating like the current model often does.

Even if the lamination were to separate, tampering with information or the photograph on the card would still be difficult. The photograph is digitally printed directly onto the ID paper, unlike the current photos which are glued to the card.

Printed on the back of the new card are two bar codes. The smaller of the two contains all the ID information as well as the digitized photo. The second bar code allows for access to local or central data bases. The codes will save time because organizations can scan them to determine the card-holder's eligibility for access and benefits.

Also printed on the card will be a four-character security code linked to the individual's social security number. This code will be entered into a central data base. The card can be identified as a fake if the number is not in the data bank.

While tamper-resistant trait of

the card is important, the card is also a savings benefit. Since the new ID cards take less time to process and don't require controlled card stock, application forms, photographic paper and name boards, it is estimated that several hundred million dollars will be saved.

There is also a big benefit to the customer, according to Villalva.

"One of the reasons it is being done is to make it easier for the customer to get a new card. We've virtually cut out the middle man in most cases," Villalva said.

"When a Marine gets promoted all they need to do is bring the promotion warrant in and we do all the paperwork right here. When the Marine leaves he has his new ID card and a copy of the DD 1172. We send a copy of the DD 1172 to the reporting command as well," the captain said.

Cards for new dependents should still be started at the reporting unit personnel office to ensure all other administrative matters are taken care of, according to Villalva.

civilian employees. At the same point last year contact had been made with 80 percent of a workforce that then numbered about 81,000.

George Holland took first place 13 times in the Unclassified Masters Division, and also placed second in one

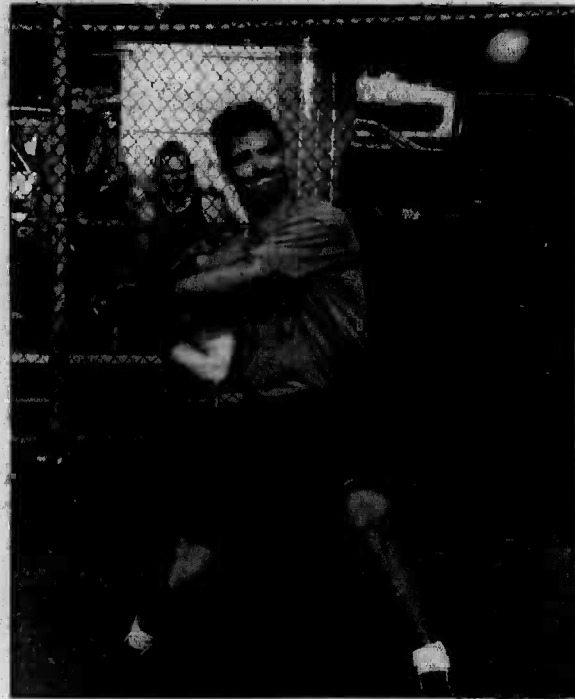
and third in two events.

Dear Maggie,

I know many in the military use WIC (Women, Infant and Children) coupons. That is why I think this story is important.

I used a WIC coupon before the date to use by mistake at the commissary. Two months later, an employee from the commissary called my husband at work and lied to him about why she needed to call me at home. He gave her our phone number. She called me and told me I needed to pay for the items on the WIC coupon I had misused.

I called WIC and an administrator told me the commissary is in violation of their contract by tracking down users of the program and making them pay for misused coupons. I went to the commissary and explained this to the manager, who proceeded to yell at me and try to intimidate me into paying. I did not pay, but I can only guess how many people this woman has intimidated into paying.

This is wrong and the manager at the commissary knows it! We all use the WIC program because we are financially strapped. Mistakes happen once in a while, but harassment by the employees and the manager is totally unacceptable and should not be tolerated. It is WIC's responsibility to penalize users of the program, not the commissary.

Mad at the Manager

Dear Mad:

Your letter raised an eyebrow or two at the commissary. I read it to Harlan Kirisau, the "head honcho" and he was very concerned. He had not heard of the practice, but immediately checked into it.

It turned out that the woman you spoke of was not a manager, but a clerk. The incident was verified. Apparently, she was attempting to get the commissary's money back. Once you contacted your WIC administrator, however, heads rolled. The woman was disciplined and the practice was stopped immediately. Mr. Kirisau wants you to know that he is

truly sorry that the incident occurred and that it will never happen again.

The use of the WIC coupons is an important "money stretcher" for many young families. The rules of their use are clearly stated on the back of the booklets and the "don't use before" date is stamped in the book. As anyone with young children knows, mistakes can happen. Because of that, the cashiers are supposed to check the WIC coupons before ringing them up. Sometimes they are so busy, though, that they forget, and that ends up compounding the problem. The WIC administrator has made it clear that if a store accepts the coupon, it's the store's problem - not WIC's and not the user's. In essence, the store has to take the loss of revenue. WIC users are not to be contacted by anyone but WIC administrators. However, habitual misusers can lose the right to use the program, so it's best to play it safe and always double check.

Thanks for letting us know about a very important problem. I hope that I've been able to help.

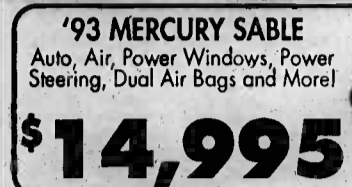

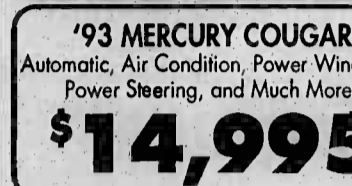
