The increases are 35 cents and 70 cents respectively.

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MATCS-18 forty-year history comes to an end

Another chapter in the history of Marine Corps Base Hawaii came to an end July 1, as Marine Air Traffic Control Squadron-18, Detachment Bravo, deactivated.

The detachment was first activated as Marine Air Traffic Control Unit 70 in 1954. As a "MATCU", it deployed to Quang Tri Province, republic of Vietnam.

In 1977, MATCU-70 deactivated and MATCS-18 Detachment Bravo was activated.

The detachment has since participated in many training exercises and major operations in which the Marine Corps has been involved.

While deployed to Saudi Arabia for Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm, MATCS-18 established a Tower/Tacan detachment at Ras Al Ghar. It also provided a forward arming and refueling point (FARP) at Manifa Bay, Saudi Arabia.

The detachment experienced a major change in July 1991 when it was directed to stand detached from Marine Air Control Squadron-2 and operate as a separate unit under Marine Aircraft Group-24.

It then proceeded to diligently reform and rebuild the program areas and section required for operation, as if the unit had just been commissioned.

Although MATCS-18 personnel were tasked with the overwhelming duty of rebuilding the detachment, they continued to maintain and

operate a Marine Air Traffic Control Automatic Landing System.

In June of 1992, only a year after being detached from its parent command, the squadron received outstanding results from a Commanding General's inspection.

In addition to being an outstanding asset to the Marine Corps during combat, the Marines of MATCS-18 proved their capabilities could be used during peacetime. In August 1992, a Tacan was deployed to Naval Air Station Agana, Guam, on extremely short notice for Typhoon Omar relief. The next month the squadron again proved their peacetime capabilities and provided air traffic controllers to Barking Sands on the island of Kauai for Hurricane Iniki relief.

Having only a year left as a detachment, it continued to participate in different training exercises, such as Team Spirit '93, WTI 2-93 and Exercise Roving Sands.

The Air Station Tacan required their assistance on several occasions and MATCS-18 eagerly assisted. In January 1994, MATCS-18 replaced the Air Station Tacan, when the Station antenna was removed, so that a new tower could be built for it.

On three separate occasions during the spring of 1994 the detachment took over all radar operations for Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay. It provided this service while expeditionary field maintenance was being performed

NQLB discusses Neighborhood Watch program

The main subject at the June 30 Neighborhood Quality of Life Board was basketball.

Wendy Graefe brought her complaint to the board, that juveniles and Marines are continually playing basketball on a court adjacent to her 802 quarters, after 9 p.m. In addition to the noise they make at night, there is graffiti and litter at one of the playgrounds nearby.

"These problems are not being caused by [local] children, but by migrant children. They come from other housing areas," Graefe said. Somebody recommended calling

the base military police department.

"I don't want to burden the MPs, my request is to put up a sign that says, 'court is off-limits after certain hours,'" Graefe stated.

Although the majority present agreed the sign would help, they also said it would help if Graefe had some type of authority.

She explained some people in her neighborhood had mentioned Neighborhood Watch.

"I encourage Neighborhood Watch. If you help yourself and we in turn help you, it turns out great," said Maj. Terrence Hess, Base Provost Marshal.

The NQLB attendants were very receptive to the idea of having a

Neighborhood Watch. Hess explained to them, that in the past,

others had attempted to start the program, but had failed, due to the lack of interest.

Graefe's interest was peaked, and she said she really thought a Neighborhood Watch would help.

"When we used to have [military police on] foot patrol, the problems were not as bad," she said.

Hess explained that in the near future there would be military police on bicycle patrol, to canvass

housing areas.

This knowledge further intrigued Graefe.

She said that the Neighborhood Watch and the bike patrol could have meetings and talk about what was happening in the neighborhood.

Lynda Napier, NQLB acting chairperson, said she would be more than happy to help in a Neighborhood Watch started.

"I think Neighborhood Watch

Post signs only on board

Summer has arrived and many families are clearing out the old to make room for the new. While some of this stuff is finding its way to the curb on trash day, a lot more is being recycled through yard sales.

To have a successful yard sale there is a need to advertise.

On Marine Corps Base Hawaii, residents need to keep in mind the regulations for advertising sales.

Base regulation P5500.6D states that active duty military personnel and their dependents may sell personal property, not offered by any commercial organization, either by item or "yard sale." Such sales may be advertised in the base newspaper, or on designated bulletin boards. Each single-family quarters may conduct one, two-day sale per month. Not more than three signs may be posted, and must be removed no later than sunset of the day on which the sale is concluded.

"The signs are to be posted on designated bulletin boards only," said LtCol. Tim Sukow, chief of staff

and acting deputy commander, MCB Hawaii. "Trees, posts and fences are not bulletin boards. Not only are the signs trashing up the base, but the nails and staples being used to secure them are killing the trees."

There are two bulletin boards specifically for the advertisement of yard/garage sales and the signs should be of reasonable size and worded tastefully. MWR has provided these two boards to meet the needs of personnel. One is located in front of the gas station, and the other is on the corner in front of the 7-day Store.

Advertising a yard sale is a privilege, not a right. "Repeated abuse and violation of the order will result in administrative action," explained LtCol. Kenneth E. Gregory, base operations officer/inspector. "This action can include, but is not limited to, a warning letter and a magistrate hearing to resolve the problem."

Continued violations may result in residents aboard the base facing more restrictions and heavier penalties if the order needs to be revised to resolve the situation.

Runners clinic to be held in preparing for Marathon

Participation in several off-base running events will also be encouraged in order to become familiar with the marathon course and provide pacing experience.

Every clime and place

Marine Corps opens MOSs, female deploys with squadron

In a Marine Corps first, 1stLt. Anita Nikolich, 1st Marine Division, deployed with the Amphibious Squadron 3 (PHIBRON 3) staff aboard the USS Tripoli on June 9, the first woman Marine to do so. (Also embarked with PHIBRON 3 is the 15th Marine Expeditionary Unit.) If the Marine Corps' recent recommendations are approved, Nikolich may not be alone for long, and may even one day be assigned to the MEU staff.

The Marine Corps recently forwarded to the Secretary of the Navy, several recommendations designed to enhance opportunities for women Marines to serve, including opening a significant number of MOSs and units to women, which would constitute an historic leap forward for the Marine Corps.

In essence, the Marine Corps' direction toward gender-neutral billets over the past several years under Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. Carl E. Mundy, Jr.'s,

leadership has been a major expansion in the opportunities available to women in the Marine Corps; it is a positive step for all Marines.

The recommendations, announced June 23 in ALMAR 192/94, were made in response to the Secretary of Defense's January 13 announcement of a new assignment rule for women and corresponding definition of direct ground combat. Secretary Perry also at that time asked the services to identify additional military occupations to which women could be assigned, consistent with the new guidance. If Secretary Perry approves the recommendations, the effect on career opportunities for women could be accurately described as revolutionary; women would be able to serve in 93 percent of all Military Occupational Specialties.

Recommendations forwarded to the Secretary of the Navy on May 1, include opening: 32 previously closed primary MOSs; MEUs deployed aboard amphibious ships, and aviation squadrons that participate in the Unit Deployment Program (UDP).

In order to ensure consistency, the Marine Corps worked closely with the Department of Defense and the other services throughout the review process. Once the proposed changes are approved by the Secretary of Defense (and forwarded to Congress 90 days prior to implementation), women will be eligible to serve in 93 percent of all MOSs in the Marine Corps.

Implementation of the proposed recommendations would continue a trend begun last year following the Secretary of Defense's April '93 revision of the policy on the assignment of women. As a result of those changes, one woman officer is now in flight training, and six others have been accepted into flight programs.

Following the '93 announcement, 24 MOSs were opened to women, as were communications companies in Marine divisions, and firing batteries and headquarters and service batteries in light anti-aircraft missile (LAAM) battalions.

With last year's additional momentous repeal of Title 10, U.S.C.,

Section 6015, restrictions keeping women from serving aboard combatant ships were also lifted. As a result, women Marines will soon be phased into seagoing deployments and exercises.

In essence, once the Marine Corps recommendations are approved and implemented, women Marines will indeed serve — in the words of the "Marines' Hymn" — in the air, on land and sea.

Revisions made to uniform directives

According to ALMAR 172/94, current directives in the 1020 and 10120 series, the requirement for Marines to possess one all-season polyester/wool gabardine service uniform by Oct. 1, has been revised. The mandatory possession date for the all-season service uniform has been eliminated.

Updated minimum requirements lists reflecting this policy change

will be incorporated in future revisions to applicable directives. In the interim, the following guidance is provided:

A. All Marines, officer and enlisted, are currently required to possess a service alpha uniform of either the phase-out polyester-wool tropical (summer weight) fabric or the new all-season polyester-wool gabardine fabric. This requirement will continue.

B. Those Marines using the phase out summer weight uniform to meet the requirements will replace it with an all-season uniform when it becomes unserviceable. However, service uniform items of either summer or winter weight phase-out fabrics will continue to be authorized for wear.

C. It will be the responsibility of the commander to monitor carefully local uniform sources to ensure that only service alpha uniforms of all-season fabric are sold/issued. The sale of individual replacement items of phase-out fabrics may continue until stocks are exhausted.

The new policy guidance also applies to the Marine Corps reserve.

1 Russia joins FBI to combat mobsters

Monday, FBI Director Louis Freeh spoke to 500 elite police officers of Russia's Interior Ministry about the possibilities of both forces jointly working to combat Russia's growing organized crime problem.

"We are proud to join in this battle with you," Freeh said to the assembled officers.

Freeh urged the Russian police to act decisively, but within the law, to stop Russia's mob from growing as powerful as the American Mafia of the 1920s and 30s.

In Freeh's 11-day visit to the Russian capital, he has netted agreements allowing his agents to gather records, interview witnesses and seek criminal evidence in former Soviet satellite nations.

2 Tutsi rebels in role of hero and villain

Tutsi rebels of the Rwandan Liberation Front seized several key positions within the Rwandan capital of Kigali and the key Rwandan city of Butare Monday.

This recent development freed an estimated 8,000 ethnic Tutsis from confinement by the Hutu-dominated government forces.

A spokesman with the U.N.'s small peacekeeping mission in Rwanda said that the Tutsis had overrun the Defense Ministry building, army headquarters, and Radio Rwanda, the source of ethnic hate messages which incited the massacres of Tutsis by Hutu civilian militiamen.

"They were jubilant," said spokesman Maj. Jean-Guy Plante in reference to the civilians who were rescued from the churches and single



hotel where they had been confined for the last few months.

An estimated 200,000 Rwandans, mostly Tutsi civilians, are believed to have been massacred since the death of the Hutu president in an April plane crash.

With the country's capital under the control of the Rwandan Liberation Front, the Tutsi forces should soon send its forces westward toward the Hutu enclave proclaimed by Rwanda's self-proclaimed interim government.

Rebel forces currently control two-thirds of the country and are advancing steadily against the remaining government-held areas to the west.

The French forces, who have been present in Rwanda since June 24 on a U.N.-authorized mission to end the massacres, have declared themselves neutral in the conflict.

But the French presence has outraged the rebels because Paris had supported the Hutu-led government against the rebels in the past.

The French have sworn to protect civilians in a safety zone in the west and southwest part of the country until a larger U.N. mission arrives.

Trying to avoid a confrontation with the advancing rebel forces, the French withdrew from Butare Sunday evening, but not before a brief skirmish erupted between the

French forces and the rebel army. Rebel spokesmen warned there would be further fighting if French troops insist on instituting a "safe zone" for refugees near Butare.

French authorities vowed Monday to stand and fight if the rebels attempted military action beyond Gikongoro, a town 15 miles west of Butare.

3 Haitian exodus surges to new highs

A surge of Haitian refugees has turned into a tsunami of epic proportions as more and more are

taking advantage of the Clinton administration's more liberal immigration policies to embark aboard motor boats and fishing trawlers to cross over to the U.S.

Coast Guard authorities state that a record 2,628 people in 67 boats were detained on Monday alone.

Another boat, packed with at least 200 refugees, capsized off Haiti's west coast early Monday morning. Survivors stated that the death toll could reach 150, though an accurate count of the passengers could not be determined.

With about 10,000 Haitians intercepted in the last 11 days, and more than 54,000 since the Haitian military's coup in September 1991, detention centers in Jamaica and at the U.S. Naval Base at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, are already close to maximum occupancy just a few weeks after the Clinton administration relaxed the Haitian refugee requirements.

Panama said Monday that it would help house the refugees but that it only had space for 10,000 more Haitians. But at the current pace, they will quickly reach maximum capacity.

Tuesday the Clinton administration, in an abrupt policy shift, announced that it would no longer be granting asylum to Haitians leaving their country by sea.

Additionally, 2,000 Marines from Camp Lejeune departed from Norfolk, Va., Wednesday in order "to protect American lives."

The Haitians are fleeing economic misery and military persecution. The Clinton administration, faced with waves of boat people, has not ruled out a military invasion to overthrow Haiti's despotic military leaders.

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Missiles away — History was made when the first TOW missile was fired downrange on Camp Fuji, Japan, recently, which set the stage for future live-fire exercises at the expanding camp. Marines from 1st MEB set the pace for future live-fire training in Japan

Marines from 3/3 participated in a historic live-fire exercise at Camp Fuji, Japan

CAMP FUJI, Japan — Marines from 3d Battalion, 3d Marine Regiment, witnessed their training evolution end with a bang, after enduring two months of cold-weather, rough-terrain, live-fire and counter-mechanized training packages.

Marines cheered as the first tube-launched, optically-tracked, wire command-link guided missile system (TOW) was fired for the first time on Camp Fuji, smacking the 4-by-8 steel target dead center. On hand to witness the display was BGen. Wayne Rollings, commanding general for Marine Corps Base, Camp Butler, Okinawa, Japan, Col. Arnold Fields, camp commander for Fuji and several Japanese dignitaries.

The TOW shoot not only showed the Japanese that the weapon could be fired safely, it also provided the groundwork necessary for other U.S. forces to train at East Fuji and culminated all of the training 3/3 and accompanying units received in the past two months, said Maj. Edward Larkin, operations officer for 3/3.

The battalion, on a six-month Unit Deployment Program from Hawaii, trained with engineers from 1st Platoon, Company D, 3d Combat Engineers Battalion, assault amphibians from 4th Platoon, Bravo Co., Combat Support Group and artillerymen from Charlie Battery C, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines. According to Larkin, the focus of the training was to conduct live-fire maneuver training, make use of Amtraks and conduct counter-

mechanized operations as part of a Battalion Landing Team built to enhance capabilities and flexibility of UDP and other deployed units.

"The UDP is alive and well," said LtCol. Lee Freund, 3/3 commanding officer. "We have to continue to train well while we're on the UDP, and the opportunity to get from Okinawa to Fuji for this two-month training package was ideal."

Freund further explained that the units training as a BLT enhanced the combat power and capabilities of his battalion.

The next question to be asked is, "Why Camp Fuji?" Answer: "We are uniquely located in the shadow of Mt. Fuji," described Col. Fields. "It's a gorgeous place in which to work, it gives us easy access to the Canto-plain area, and we can do a lot in terms of live fire, especially for the MEF and elements thereof."

"The biggest thing I enjoyed about this training was the rough-terrain package that we did," explained LCpl. Samuel Eads, of Headquarters and Service Company, 3/3. "We got to go out and do some rappelling, climbing and high-speed stuff which was good for morale and a nice change."

"This training provides us the opportunity to fire some of the bigger weapons; which is much needed for the Marines that haven't done it before."

For Cpl. Joaquim Perez, M-198 section chief for Charlie Battery, 1/12, the cold-weather training package was even more unique. "For me and my section, it was a good experience," said Perez. "I've never been in cold weather. I'm from California, and I've never seen snow."

The 3/3 Marines are back from Okinawa after their six-month deployment, and in retrospect, Maj. Larkin summed it up: "Fuji offers us some training advantages that we don't have available anymore in Okinawa, and we'd be foolish not to take advantage of it."

40 years after the war relations in the Korean peninsula remain tense

(Editor's Note: This article will help to explain how current history has shaped the Korean peninsula into what has been described as the "most dangerous flashpoint on earth.")

Veterans of the Korean War paid homage to their fallen comrades in a somber ceremony at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, June 25, exactly 44 years after the North Korean invasion of South Korea ignited the three-year war. More than 33,000 Americans were killed in the war, and 1,242 are buried at the cemetery. Among those in attendance at the memorial were family members of the buried heroes and both U.S. and Republic of Korea military personnel.

Although the war ended more than 40 years ago, U.S. political tensions with North Korea have remained. Many people don't realize why we should be concerned with and what the consequences may be if U.S./North Korea relations deteriorate even further. The official name of North Korea is the Democratic Peoples Republic of Korea. The government is a communist state, which follows a Marxist Leninist policy. The government of North Korea enforces its edicts with a style reminiscent of the late Soviet leader Joseph Stalin. In Stalin's repressive and dictatorial government, those who didn't agree with the government were subject to arrest, imprisonment without trial and even execution.

The political philosophy of the

North Korean government is called "chuche." Chuche is a Korean word that means self-reliance. This philosophy requires a near total commitment to North Korean political, economic, social and military policy. In other words, North Korea must be free from foreign influence or domination.

Following the Japanese surrender in Korea to the Russians at the end of World War II, the Soviets under Stalin began a program of reshaping the political views of the northern portion of the peninsula. The area under Soviet control was all Korean territory north of the 38th parallel, as agreed to by the Allied powers. The Soviets continued to control northern Korea up to the so-called "free" elections or as free as the Soviets would allow. The Soviets held the elections that brought current leader Kim II Sung to power in 1948.

Kim II Sung is a hard-line communist who fought in China with the Chinese communist guerrillas and the Northeast China Anti-Japanese Allied Army in the 1930s. He fought against the Japanese, who had stolen large sections of Manchuria, until his forces were nearly annihilated, which forced him to flee to the Soviet Union. It was with the Soviet army that Kim would return to Korea.

Following Kim's "election" as North Korean president, he proceeded to build up his military forces for his vision of a unified Korean peninsula. He immediately began border raids, guerilla attacks, sabotage and propaganda attacks to take

over the Republic of Korea, commonly referred to as South Korea. With the support and guidance of the Soviets and Chinese, who believed the United States didn't care about Korea, Kim invaded South Korea, June 25, 1950.

The North Koreans attacked the South with 90,000 men, hardened in battle with the Japanese, 150 medium tanks, 200 aircraft, and a large array of heavy mortars and long-range artillery. Working with the regular forces were hundreds of spies on the South, including assassins and saboteurs.

The Republic of Korea had no tanks, no heavy mortars, no combat aircraft, no spare parts for their transports, and only short-range 105mm howitzers. The ROK officer corps had been in existence for 11 months. The ROKs fought bravely, but mainly died in place.

The North Korean army may very well have succeeded in their attempt at a forced reunification had it not been for a Soviet diplomatic faux pas at the United Nations. On the day that the UN Security Council was voting on military involvement in the Korean crisis, the Soviet delegate wasn't present.

The Soviet Union was protesting the inclusion of Taiwan as the Chinese representative of China on the Security Council. Since the Soviets were a permanent member of the Security Council, they had veto power over any UN military actions. But the Soviets missed this critical session of the Council, so the United Nations voted to give the United States permission to send

in troops under the UN flag to restore the South Korean government.

The United States sent the majority of forces into Korea, but there were representative forces from around the world. This included Australians, Turks and British forces. All total, there were over 20 nations involved in the Korean War.

Although the United States had a UN mandate to repulse the invading forces, the Chinese sent in ground forces to support the North Koreans beginning in September 1950. The Soviets planned operations and fought in the war flying MIG fighter aircraft and manning anti-aircraft positions against the allied air forces.

The fighting on the Korean peninsula lasted until July 1953 when an armistice was signed. The agreement stipulated that the border be reestablished at the 38th parallel. The United States and South Korea signed a mutual defense treaty within two months of the armistice. It is this treaty that obligates the United States to come to the defense of the Republic of Korea.

Despite the armistice, North Korea continues its attempts to overthrow or destabilize the government of South Korea through various acts of terrorism. These attempts include the bombing of civilian aircraft, assassination attempts on the president of South Korea, the murder of cabinet officials, the killing of U.S. military personnel along the demilitarized zone (DMZ), and at-

tempts to tunnel under the DMZ. The United States almost went to war against North Korea over the USS Pueblo incident Jan. 23, 1968, when the North Koreans boarded a U.S. Navy ship in international waters and took the 83-man crew captive for 11 months.

Until recently, the North Korean government has had very limited diplomatic relations with the international community. It has concentrated on supporting revolutions and terrorism in the Third World. However, it is a signatory to most UN agreements, including the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Agreement. Until recently, it was a member of the International Atomic Energy Agency. It is the nuclear issue that has caused the recent diplomatic tensions.

Under the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Agreement, North Korea has a requirement to allow inspections of its nuclear facilities to ensure that the radioactive waste is properly disposed of and is not used to make nuclear weapons. The North Koreans have refused to fully comply with this requirement and cooperate with UN inspection teams. As a result, the United States and other UN members are pushing for North Korean compliance.

If the North Koreans continue to refuse to comply, they could face economic trade sanctions. The North Koreans have declared that they will treat the imposing of sanctions as an act of war, which the North says will lead to the destruction of not only South Korea but Japan as well.

In addition to its superior performance as an air traffic control squadron, MATCS-18 has also worked closely with the engineers at the Naval Inservice Engineering Center to find solution to problems with corrosion.

"The solutions pioneered by this detachment are now being used fleet-wide to reduce the effects of corrosion on all Marine Corps air traffic control equipment," said Capt. Mikel S. Cole, detachment commander.

On a regular basis, MATCS-18 receives correspondence from other air traffic control units requesting solutions to particular problems.

The detachment has reduced the amount of money spent on replacing or repairing equipment damaged by corrosion from \$18,000 a year to about \$4,000.

So although the squadron is now deactivated, the Marine Corps will continue to benefit from its achievements and the well trained Marines it produced.

The majority of the 72 Marines formerly attached to MATCS-18 received orders to the East Coast, explained Cole.

LINE training instructor is a hit and gets a kick out of his job

Marines are disciplined and enthusiastic. They revere integrity and leadership. That's because these qualities compliment their basic warfighting mission — that of a rifleman.

One Marine with the Brigade Tactics School is especially adept in this business.

Sgt. Synbert N. Reid, an instructor with Brigade Tactics School, is one of only ten instructors in the Marine Corps qualified to train Marines to become unit instructors in LINE close combat program.

For the Jamaica native, teaching Marines to be aggressive is how he is making his mark.

After leaving high school, Reid moved to Brooklyn, New York,

where he lived with friends and began working as a security guard.

"I was thinking about joining the service," said Reid, "so I went to the Army recruiter and joined the reserves."

After a year in the reserve, Reid decided it was time for a change.

"I was thinking about going on full active duty. I was getting bored in the reserves," said Reid.

"Then one of my friends suggested the Marine Corps," he said.

"So I went and talked to the recruiter. He made it sound more interesting than what the Army could offer," said the 30-year-old.

Reid enlisted, went to boot camp and then was sent to Huntsville, Ala., where he went to Ammunition Technician School.

From Alabama, Reid spent his first

year in the Marine Corps in loading and unloading MPS ships," he said.

"There was only one other ammo tech there, and one of us had to be there at all times," explained Reid.

Once Reid had completed his three years in Florida, he was sent to Kaneohe's Brigade Schools to be its ammo tech. Reid reenlisted for the second time and was given the opportunity to go to the five-week Close Combat Instructors Course in Virginia.

"He was all fired up," said GySgt. Lafe S. Draper, chief instructor, Regimental Tactics Section with Regimental Schools here.

"The class is designed to bring out the inner personal violence in a person," he said.

"I was in Saudi for eight months,

Reid when we did body sparring," said Draper.

"His aggression was evident as he ended up giving me a chest contusion. It was obvious he wanted to do well in the course."

Reid's motivation and dedication didn't stop once he finished school. Once the instructors had successfully completed the course they were allowed to return to their commands. Once Reid had passed his final test he stayed behind and devoted extra time helping the remaining instructors practice and pass their final test.

"He brought back a lot of knowledge with him, and he volunteers his own time to help me train Marines in my LINE classes," said Draper.

Reid enjoys what he does, "I will be in for the rest of my life."
