Hail to the Chief!

President and Mrs. Clinton spend a three day vacation aboard MCB Hawaii, K-Bay

President Clinton and the First Lady arrived in Hawaii Wednesday, Nov. 16, to relax after an exhausting five-day trip to Asia. They were invited by LtGen. Charles C. Krulak, Commander Marine Forces Pacific, to stay at the VIP cottage aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay.

"It was a great honor that our base at Kaneohe Bay would be chosen as the R&R site for the Commander-in-Chief and the First Lady," LtGen. Krulak said.

"In conversations with the President and the First Lady, they both made a special point of expressing their appreciation to the Marines and sailors of Kaneohe Bay, and for the warm welcome they received and the kindnesses they were shown during their short stay," LtGen. Krulak explained.

Students from Mokapu Elementary School, Marines, sailors and others often lined the road and waved at the President as his motorcade arrived or left the base.

Thursday, Nov. 17, President Clinton spent much of his time relaxing with a round of golf at the Waialae Country Club, before returning to Kaneohe to change for dinner.

Later Thursday evening, President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Clinton sat down with top generals and admirals — from commands stretching from Alaska to Japan — and their wives at a dinner at Pearl Harbor Naval Base at the home of Adm. Richard Macke, Commander of all Pacific Forces.

"I was extremely impressed with the Commander-in-Chief's knowledge of

the strategic importance of the Pacific," LtGen. Krulak explained. "I was also impressed with his complete faith in the American service man and woman — his total appreciation for the sacrifices of these men and women — and his concern over their welfare."

"He certainly recognizes the sacrifices being made on a daily basis by our soldiers, sailors, airmen, Marines and Coast Guard, and is deeply appreciative," LtGen. Krulak said. "He made a special point to praise those who find themselves deployed, away from family and loved ones, in support of our national policy."

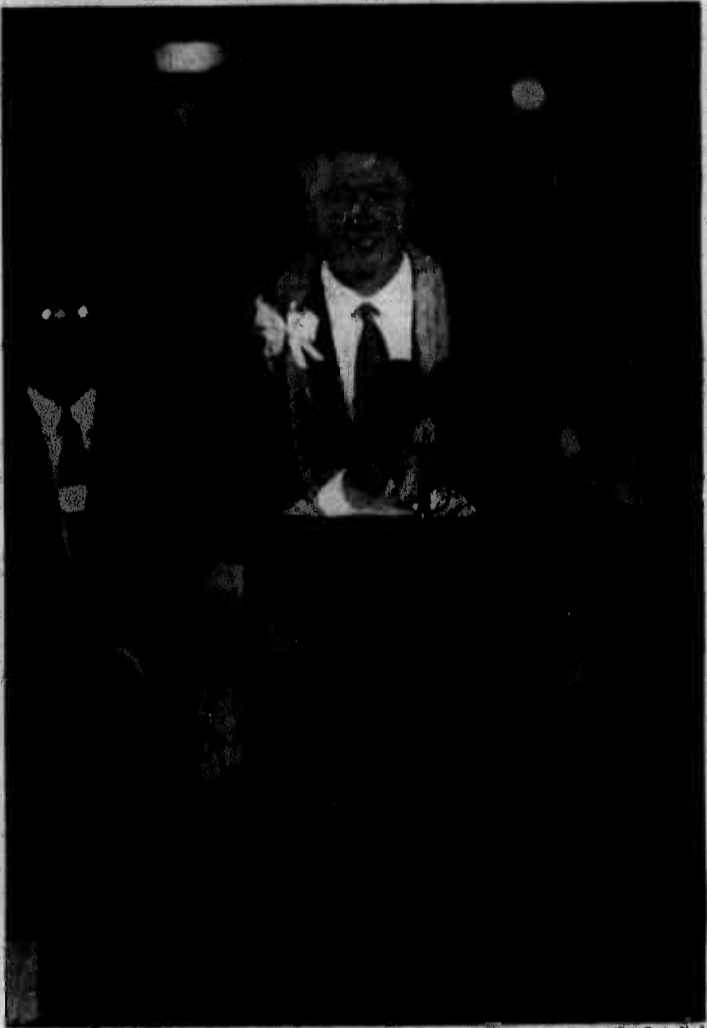
Friday, Nov. 18, the President played golf at the Mid-Pacific Golf and Country Club in Lanikai. Later that evening he attended a tribute at the Hilton Hawaiian Village in Waikiki, honoring outgoing Governor John Waihee.

The Clintons also surprised diners at a Kailua restaurant Friday night when they arrived unannounced at Buzz's Steakhouse for dinner after leaving the Waihee banquet.

Saturday was spent much different from his extended golf outings on Thursday and Friday. The President stayed indoors much of the day, but he did go for a stroll on the Windward shore with the First Lady.

As the Clintons walked along the MCB Hawaii beach where they had been staying, they again surprised local residents. The President walked up from the beach to watch a foursome on the Kaneohe Klipper golf course.

Four golfers at the Kaneohe Klipper Golf Course extended an impromptu invitation to the President to hit a few balls. The President graciously accepted. Afterwards, President Clinton autographed the players'

scorecards before rejoining his wife on the beach.

The President was originally slated to depart early Sunday morning. However, he boarded Air Force One to leave Hickam Air Force Base, Saturday evening, just after 9:30 p.m.

for the eight-hour flight back to Washington.

Before departing, the President shook hands with the crowd of about 200 people, including many of the drivers and police officers who provided security during his visit.

President praises military, stresses readiness

President Clinton arrived at Hickam Air Force Base at approximately 7:00 p.m., Nov. 16. The President was greeted by a crowd of about 3,000 military and civilian people who had waited for more than two hours in the rain to see him.

The President and Mrs. Clinton stopped in Hawaii for a three-and-a-half day vacation following a trip to Indonesia for the Asian-Pacific Economic Cooperation Conference.

Shortly after beginning his speech, President Clinton said a word of thanks to all branches of the military

in Hawaii, their spouses and families. He extended separate thanks to the Marine Forces Pacific Band for making him feel "so very at home," when he got off Air Force One.

During his 15-minute speech, the President said that the readiness of American troops plays a key role in U.S. diplomacy.

"I want all of you to know that while you're a long way from the mainland, you're never far from the hearts of every American who understands what you are doing here to keep our country safe and strong," he said.

President Clinton continued by saying that the skills of the fighting men and women of the U.S. have never been stronger, the capacity to carry

out missions has never been greater and the commitment to liberty has never been stronger.

"The world is more peaceful and secure because of you," he said.

The President recalled where the U.S. military is currently undertaking missions, e.g., in Haiti and in Southwest Asia.

"It is imperative that you remain the best fighting force in the world, and we are determined to do everything we can do to make sure that is exactly what happens," he said.

"What really makes us strong is strong families, good education, safe streets, good jobs and national security."

"You, as much as any group in

America today, embody all those, and all Americans are in your gratitude. Thank-you and God bless you all," he concluded.

Following his speech, President Clinton took the time to shake hands in the crowd. Just prior to his departure he stopped and personally thanked CWO-2 Tim Smith, the band officer, and the Marine Forces Pacific Band for a superb job.

Finally, with the wave of a hand to the crowd, President Clinton jumped into the Presidential limousine and his motorcade departed for the VIP cottage at Pyramid Rock onboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, where he planned to begin a low profile visit and play some golf.

President Clinton's visit to Mokapu Peninsula was not the first time a president vacationed at K-Bay

President Clinton's visit to Marine Corps Base Hawaii brings back fond memories of another presidential visit 35 years ago.

The news spotlight of the world was pinpointed on Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay, when President Dwight D. Eisenhower visited June 22, 1960.

It climaxed his 22,000 mile trip of the Far East.

"What he probably will do is take it easy, play golf and rest around in the sun," said James Hagerty, presidential press secretary at that time.

While here, President Eisenhower resided in the Station Commander's Hilltop quarters.

The president arrived at Honolulu's International Airport at 12:14 p.m., and in addition to being met by hundreds of military personnel who

formed honor and color guards, he received a tremendous Aloha from a crowd estimated in the neighborhood of 10,000 persons.

Following military honors and arrival speeches, the President greeted the welcoming throngs and "trooped the line" of an honor guard composed of men from all branches of the service. He then proceeded via motorcade through the streets of Honolulu where 200,000 spectators offered their own welcome with ticker tape, confetti and rice.

Thousands of Kaneohe Bay personnel and their family members joined the multitudes throughout Oahu to give President Dwight D. Eisenhower one of the warmest Alohas ever offered a visiting dignitary.

Once aboard MCAS Kaneohe Bay, an estimated 6,000 Marines and Navy personnel formed a Cordon of Honor, on both sides of Mokapu Road extending from the Main Gate to the Teen Club, to welcome the nation's chief

executive and his accompanying entourage.

At the Hilltop quarters where the President stayed during his visit, the Chief Executive met a host of Kaneohe Bay officials, including BGen. R.G. Weede, commanding general, 1st Marine Brigade; Col. M.M. Magruder, station commanding officer; and various other staff officers.

Prior to entering his quarters, President Eisenhower spent an estimated half-hour talking with various military families quartered at Hilltop who were to become his neighbors during the vacation. He also thanked his military and civilian police escorts for the important part they played throughout the 70-minute trip from the airport.

The University of Hawaii president, Dr. Lawrence H. Snyder, presented an honorary degree to the Chief Executive on behalf of the Board of Regents, June 24.

Governor and Mrs. Quinn then gave

the President a reception at the MCAS Kaneohe Bay Officers' Club.

Often the President would take a moment to give special attention to children, such as when he took four-year-old Ernie Clapsaddle for a ride in his golf cart. He also sent a personal thank-you note to the little Honolulu girl who told him of the school children's contribution to the East-West Cultural Center.

When he ended his stay here, June 25, the 1st Marine Brigade Band swung into "As the Caissons Go Rolling Along." President Eisenhower walked over to MSgt. William Tosh, the band leader, shook his hand and thanked him for the musical farewell.

With a two-fingered "V" for victory signal, he boarded the helicopter for his trip to Hickam and return to the Mainland.

When K-Bay's illustrious visitor departed the Station, what remained was a warm-hearted impression of his open-hearted friendliness.

Quality of Life Programs to receive more funding in FY96

HEADQUARTERS, U.S. MARINE CORPS, Washington, D.C. (Nov. 21)—Secretary of Defense Perry's pledge to add \$2.7 billion over six years for initiatives aimed at increasing the quality of life for members of America's armed forces and their families is welcome news to the Marine Corps.

Although a by-service breakdown of the additional funding is not yet available, Marine Corps officials in charge of programs such as housing, Morale, Welfare and Recreation, and Family Service Centers are optimistic that the amount will be substantial and allow meaningful,

speedier progress in upgrading services and amenities for all members of the Marine Corps Family.

The first increment of the additional funding — \$450 million, to be divided among the services — will be inserted in the FY96 defense budget, which will take effect Oct. 1, 1996. The money will fund increases in housing allowances, upgrades of single and family living quarters, and an upgraded community environment.

The additional funding is particularly good news for installations such as Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, where a shortage of adequate base housing forces many young Marines to live off-base in a high cost environment. While housing and barracks upgrades will take time, Marines who live off-base will get some immediate relief starting with their FY 1996 paychecks. The Secretary's plans call for a new cost of living allowance to aid members liv-

ing in communities identified as "high cost" areas (defined as over 109 percent of the national cost of living average). In addition to the COLA, Basic Allowance for Quarters will also be increased. The goal is to return to DoD's intent that members living off base absorb no more than 15 percent of their housing costs, with the remainder offset by BAQ and Variable Housing Allowances. Currently, members are defraying an average of 20 percent of those costs.

Quality of life has been a major focus of Gen. Carl E. Mundy Jr.'s tenure as Commandant. In his 1.34 vision statement, he said "Our families are a part of our Corps. They are participants, not observers."

While commanders throughout the Marine Corps have heeded the Commandant's call to do everything possible to improve conditions for their Marines

and families, funding has remained a critical challenge, many times forcing a decision between training and equipment or housing and social services such as counseling and child care.

Yet, despite these stringent budgetary constraints, the Marine Corps has forged ahead with notable quality of life initiatives — though not with the speed or availability of programs leaders would like to see. The Marine Corps New Parent Support Program is now available at 17 major installations, with MCRD San Diego soon to be included. Child development centers are being expanded to provide more openings for affordable on-base child care, and Family Service Centers are providing more services in the way of personal counseling, family advocacy, and lifestyle workshops.

Housing for single and married Marines continues to be one of the biggest quality of life challenges. More than 60 percent of the

Corps' family housing inventory is over 30 years old, with 8,288 of those homes requiring revitalization or replacement. On top of that, there is currently a shortage of 6,900 homes, predominantly in the high cost areas of Southern California.

The picture is just as disturbing for single Marines. Approximately 56 percent of the Corps' barracks are over 40 years old and many Marines are living in quarters that don't meet current standards.

Housing officials look toward the additional funding as a big boost in helping them meet the goals of two comprehensive initiatives unveiled earlier this year. The Marine Corps Family Housing and Bachelor Housing Campaign plans are already underway, and the extra resources will provide a quick infusion of funds to bring junior enlisted barracks up to minimum standards and reinvigorate family housing maintenance programs.

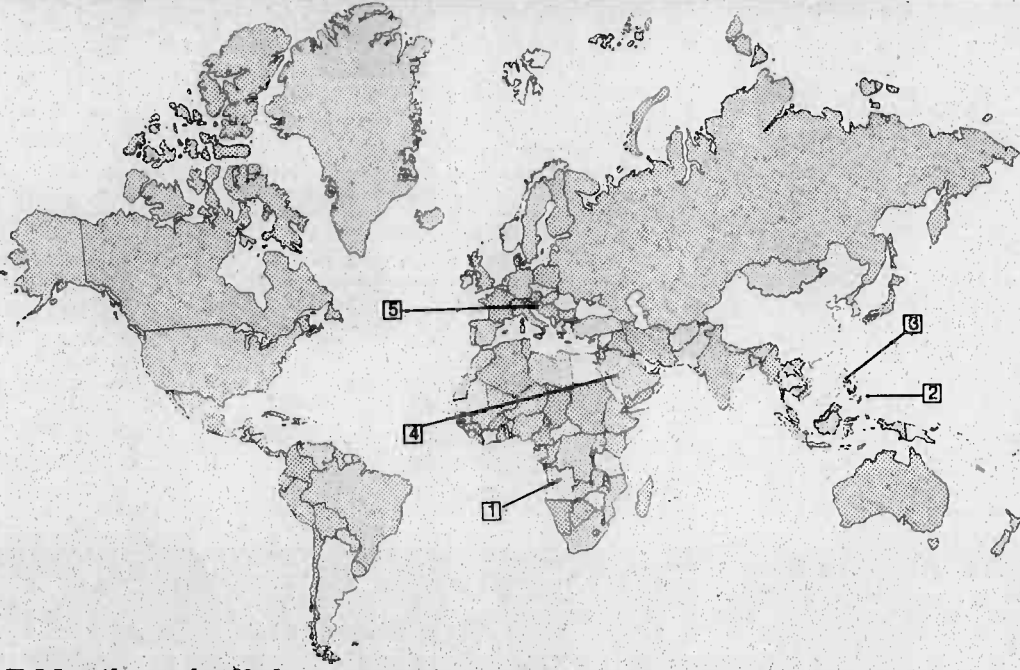

1 Rebels attack after peace pact

Two battle fronts in Luanda were attacked a day after both sides signed a peace accord, claimed Angola officials, but aid workers in one of the areas said there was no fighting.

Meanwhile, Southern African leaders considered sending troops to join a U.N. force to anchor the peace treaty. Angolan state radio and the UNITA rebel station Vorgan broadcast an appeal for peace and reconciliation, after 19 years of war.

Later that same day, government officials claimed, rebels under the command of UNITA Vice President Antonio Dembo attacked the northern city of Uige in violation of the peace accord.

The peace pact was signed Sunday by Foreign Minister Venancio de Moura and UNITA Secretary General, Gen. Eugenio Manuvakola, repeating a ritual that has failed twice to end the war.

2 Palau seeks United Nations membership

Palau, a newly independent state 500 miles southeast of the Philippines, has applied to join the United Nations as its 185th member.

The request was in a letter to Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali, and circulated Monday.

Palau was the last of 11 U.N. trust territories and had been administered since 1947 by the United States. It became self-governing Oct. 1 in a compact of free association with the United States.

3 Manila rebuffed a military agreement with the U.S.

The Philippines has rebuffed a draft military logistical agreement with the United States only a little more than a week after a visit by President Clinton.

The postponement Monday by the Philippine Senate because of "ambiguous and objectionable" provisions of what U.S. officials described as a routine agreement to facilitate

port calls by U.S. Navy ships reflected Philippine's sensitivities about anything that smacks of a return to an American military presence here.

4 OPEC agrees to extend for one year

A spokesman said Monday, oil ministers of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries have agreed to extend for one year the current limits on the amount of oil they produce through 1995.

Saudi Arabia convinced the other 11 OPEC members that a one-year pact,

would force crude oil prices up in late 1995.

"All ministers unanimously agreed on the 12-month roll-over of the ceiling on oil output," OPEC spokesman Yusufu Turundu said.

On the second day of the minister's meeting, Saudi Arabia's proposal to extend the current limit of 24.5 million barrels a day was accepted. The ceiling set in September 1993 was due to expire this year.

Negotiations focused on whether an extension should be for six or 12 months. Saudi Arabia's views usually

prevail in OPEC circles. It is the world's largest crude producer, pumping 8 million barrels a day, about a third of OPEC's total output.

5 NATO defied by Serbs' attacks in Bosnia

Serb forces burned villages and sent refugees fleeing in northwest Bosnia-Herzegovina, ignoring threats of new NATO retaliation, Tuesday.

The United States said new air strikes are possible against Bosnian Serbs to stop them from seizing the Muslim enclave of Bihac, a United Nations safe haven.

Serb leaders vowed to expand the fighting and threatened to retaliate against the United Nations and NATO.

"We'll determine the time and the targets doing our best to make it very painful for NATO nations," Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic said Tuesday.

According to State Department spokeswoman Christmas Shelly, "the whole range of options" are being examined by NATO to prevent the fall of Bihac.

Monday's NATO bombing, aimed at forcing Serbs to talk peace, does not seem to have worked. Serb military actions since then, she said, "don't suggest that that's the message they have received."

Defense Secretary William Perry warned Serbs: "If they go in tomorrow or the next day with another bombing attack, then we'll go back and blow up their airplanes."

Russian Foreign Minister Andrei Kozyrev, said air strikes against Serbs should not become routine.

The First Lady took some time from her four-day vacation with the President to visit the Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay Family Service Center Friday.

Mrs. Hillary Clinton was invited by Gail Vercauteren, wife of BGen. R. F. Vercauteren, commanding general, Marine Corps Base Hawaii, to a tour of the center and a brief on its programs.

While the President battled blustering winds at the Mid-Pacific Country Club, the First Lady spent an hour meeting with volunteers and staff of the various agencies at the center. She also toured the Armed Services YMCA and the Na Keiki Rainbow Child Care Center.

Mrs. Vercauteren said that the

impromptu invitation was an excellent opportunity to showcase the work of the volunteers and the dynamic support programs available to the Marines, sailors and family members of Marine Corps Base Hawaii.

Mrs. Vercauteren stressed that it was important that the First Lady get an accurate account of the working environment and tempo of operation. During the brief, Mrs. Clinton expressed interest in the home visit program of the volunteers and the New Parent Support Program.

"It was a real honor that she was interested enough in our programs to take time out from her vacation," said Maj. Esta Staples, director, MCBH Kaneohe Bay, Family Service Center.

"She seemed to realize how important the programs we offer are," said Mae Ooka, career resource specialist with the Training and Assistance Management Program. "She asked a lot of questions and took time to shake everyone's hand."

Following the tour, Mrs. Clinton returned to the beach cottage where she and the President had been staying. The only public appearance during their stay was at a dinner for Governor John Waihee Friday night. Most of their final day was spent indoors, however; the President and First Lady did take a stroll on a windy stretch of Pyramid Rock beach. He also surprised a few golfers at the Kaneohe Klipper Golf Course when he walked on to the course to hit a few balls after being invited by a foursome who saw him walking on the beach. The President and Mrs. Clinton departed Saturday evening.

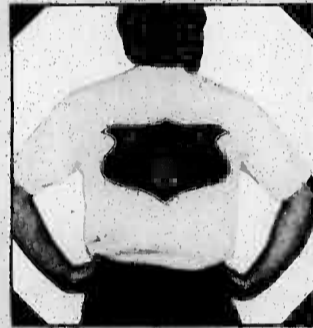

Front and center Marine proud of his Indian heritage

"I... do solemnly swear that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic..."

June 14, 1993, Lanny W. LaPlante Jr. was sworn into the United States Marine Corps. He is just one of the many Native Americans who pledged their lives in the defense of this country.

LaPlante is from Eagle Butte, South Dakota's Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe Reservation. After graduating from Takini High School, LaPlante cared for the livestock on the reservation.

It was during one of his rounds to check the cattle and fence that he

came across a man in uniform, a Marine recruiter.

"I was having a bad day," LaPlante said, "so I didn't pay him much attention."

"He stopped me and asked 'Where does this road lead?' and pointed back the way he came. I told him I didn't know. So he asked me 'Where does the road lead in that direction?' Once again I said that I didn't know. So he popped off and asked me 'Just what do you know?' so I replied, 'I know I'm not lost.'"

"Next thing I knew I was on a plane to San Diego," he said.

LaPlante is currently stationed with Company C, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, III Marine Expeditionary Force, Hawaii. He serves as a team leader

and has been selected for promotion to meritorious corporal.

In his community back home, LaPlante is very involved in the culture and religion.

"For the Sioux, the religion is a way of life," he explained. "Everything is close, especially our history, because we live and pass on all that the gods and the elders have taught us. It is all about nature and how it was created, and how we serve as protectors."

Native Americans were the first ecologists, long before the rest of the world realized the need. However, for a long time the various Indian cultures were in trouble of dying out.

"Many of my people knew nothing of their heritage," LaPlante explained.

"Many of them, like my father, were forced by prejudice to turn their back on their religion, to conform with other standards. But more and more of the young ones are interested in our heritage and they are returning to the

culture. "Before, I was lost — no identity. There were several episodes in my life that were more than coincidences, and dreams that led me back to our heritage." While at the Marty Indian boarding school, LaPlante met Orlando Joseph, who helped to set him on the path he walks now. "I could talk to him about anything,"

LaPlante said. "He helped me find out what was wrong in my life and showed me how to make it right." Once he showed an interest in his heritage, LaPlante was amazed at how many of his uncles were involved in the numerous prayers and ceremonies. He now has an identity and participates in many of the prayers, dances, fasting and sweat ceremonies. "It is a different way of life when

they know you are serious about learning," he said. "I've learned most of my lessons from the elders that I went to pray with. Now I try to get my friends and cousins involved. It is important to know who you are and where you come from. Our heritage and prayers are sacred, and it is important that they are passed on." Since joining the Marine Corps, LaPlante has had only one difficulty.

"It is spiritually hard being here because it is very difficult for me to pray," he explained. "Our prayers are part of the land, water, health and happiness. Here I'm a stranger in a strange land." LaPlante hopes to take leave this summer and participate in the prayers and ceremonies back home, and continue the proud traditions of the Sioux Tribe.

November is American Indian Heritage Month

Throughout American history Native Americans have served proudly in defense of our nation, and they continue to play a vital role in its development and defense. This year's theme for National American Indian Heritage Month is: "Values, courage and wisdom... Shaping the Future."

American Indians have fought bravely for our nation from its very beginning. On March 13, 1778, George Washington wrote from Valley Forge to the commissioners of Indian Affairs asking for 400 Indians. Wrote Washington, "I think they may be of excellent use, as scouts and light troops mixed with our own parties."

1763 to Operation Desert Storm, American Indians found just cause to battle for their beliefs, customs and life styles.

American Indians fought on both sides in the Civil War, and the U.S. Indian Scouts helped open the West by protecting railroad workers and settlers.

During World War I, the first major American involvement in a foreign war, some 25,000 Indians fought for their country. Of these, 17,313 registered for the war; 6,509 were drafted; 331 died; 262 were wounded; 64 were commissioned officers; 14 women were nurses; and one man was a surgeon. Many Indians who fought did not even have U.S. citizenship, although individuals were awarded citizenship for their valor in battle.

Whirlwind Soldier and Red Owl, both Sioux from South Dakota; Lone Wolf, a Kiowa from Oklahoma; and Plenty Coups, a Crow from Montana; all assisted in the ceremonies when the Unknown Soldier of World War I was buried.

As a result of the deep patriotism Indians throughout America displayed in the war, Congress passed a law in 1924 extending citizenship to all Indians born or living on U.S. soil.

Many Indians fought bravely in World War II. Stories of Indians whose bravery went unsung are numerous. Bataan Death March survivor Clarence Rogers of Cherokee, N.C., got credit from fellow prisoners for saving their lives because he selflessly shared his food and had words of encouragement for them.

One of war correspondent Ernie Pyle's last stories was about Indians with the 1st Marine Division on Okinawa. Before landing on Okinawa, Marines from the Navaho, Sioux, Comanche, Apache, Pima, Kiowa, Pueblo and Crow tribes did a ceremonial dance for a successful landing. They ended the ceremony by singing the Marines' Hymn in Navaho. The non-Indian Marines watched the ceremony with grave respect, wrote Pyle.

Also during World War II, the Navaho Indians used their language as a code that was instrumental in keeping our military's communications secret — a code the Japanese never deciphered.

According to 1990 census figures, there are nearly 2 million American

Indians in the United States today. They represent 307 tribes from Maine's Passamaquoddy nation to the Apache tribe of the American Southwest.

The Native Americans' tribal traditions remain a vital part of their lives. Nearly 10,000 American Indians wear this nation's military uniforms. More than 20 Native Americans have earned the Medal of Honor since Congress authorized it in 1861. Another 8,000 civilians with Native American ties serve the Department of Defense worldwide.

November has been set aside as the National American Indian Heritage Month to reflect and honor their accomplishments as they continue to shape our future with their values, courage and wisdom.

On the HomeFront

As a resident of base housing, perhaps you'd like to have some control over how your housing dollars are spent. Well now you do have a say. Although you probably won't be invited to participate in a budget meeting, every time you turn on a light, use an appliance or take a shower you decide how housing funds will be used.

Family housing operates on a fixed budget each year, a budget which includes utilities, maintenance and some improvements.

When utility companies raise their rates or housing residents use more energy than expected, housing doesn't get any more money to make up for it. That means money that could be going into making your home a little nicer is going toward paying the bills.

Fortunately, there's a lot you can do to help bring utility costs down. This is the first in a series of articles to help you make better decisions about how your housing dollars will be spent.

This week's article is about hot water usage, because the majority of the electricity you use goes down the drain in the form of hot water.

Most conventional water heaters use about 400 kilowatt-hours each month to heat enough water to meet the needs of a family of four. To get an idea of just how that adds up, compare it with the 50 to 100 kilowatt-hours your family probably uses on lights each month.

Water heaters are usually out-of-sight and out-of-mind. But because they account for such a large chunk of energy usage, if you consistently cut back on hot water, you can save a tremendous amount of energy over time. There are many painless ways to cut back on hot water usage.

To use less hot water:
Take shorter showers. According to Hawaii Electric, a three-minute shower uses nine to 13 gallons of hot water. That is almost three times less than the 42 gallons used in a 10-minute shower. If each family member cuts back shower times by even a few minutes, the energy savings will add up quickly.

Plug the drain before you shave or wash. If you let the water run while you shave or wash, you'll use almost 14 gallons of hot water, as opposed to less than one gallon if you fill the sink and turn the water off.

Rinse clothes and dishes in cold water. If you wash clothes on a warm/cold cycle you'll only use about nine gallons of hot water. Better yet, a cold/cold cycle uses no hot water. Compare that with a hot/warm cycle that uses 27 gallons of hot water.

Whether at the next assignment or sometime in the murky future, your family will eventually pay its own utility bills. Why not get into good habits now.

Commanding General's Book of the Month Program established

Many people wish they had the ability to look into the future before making an important decision. But since this is impossible, one can only do the next best thing and learn from the decisions others have made.

The general supports the Commandant's belief that reading should be incorporated into the Marine's primary military education. Therefore, BGen. Vercauteren has established a local reading program, called the Commanding General's Book of the Month program.

"Reading is vitally important to education and it is something that can be

done at your own pace," said the general. "It increases awareness by learning about other peoples' experiences and from their mistakes."

For example, the book, "We Were Soldiers Once and Young," by Army LtCol. Harold Moore, tells the story of two battalions in Vietnam. One did everything right and was very successful and one did everything wrong and was chopped to pieces, explained BGen. Vercauteren. This book helps Marines see how the decisions they make in combat determine the out-

come of their battles.

To help peak interest, each month the general will recommend a different book for Marines to read. The recommendations will consist of books the general has read.

The list will be posted at the Anderson Hall dining facility. As well, a small library of books from the Commandant's reading list will be available for review while the Marine is at the messhall.

Books may also be checked out from the base library.

"I challenge each Marine to read at least four books a year," BGen. Vercauteren said.

In the future, there will be a section in the Marine Corps Exchange that will also have books available from the Commandant's and the commanding general's reading list.

"Eventually we plan to have a separate bookstore in the exchange," BGen. Vercauteren said.

Once the books are available to Marines, it will be up to each Marine to take up the general's challenge.

U.S. Postal Service preparing for the holiday rush

Now is the time for holiday shoppers to begin mailing their Christmas packages to faraway-family and friends. The U. S. Postal Service Consumer Advocate, Ann McK. Robinson, suggests the following tips for speedy, sure delivery.

- To save money, send items to overseas locations by "surface mail." Just remember though, your mail travels on its slowest journey by boat transportation, and if you wanted your packages to meet a pre-Christmas delivery date, all those suggested mailing dates have passed.

- Use the International Express Mail Service to hasten gifts overseas, usually within one to three days. The service is available in more than 100 countries.

- Spread some cheer by way of the U.S. Postal Service and always use complete addresses.

- Do include such descriptive information as an apartment or suite number and directional information like "N" for north and "St." for street on all letters, cards and packages. Type or print all addresses in uppercase (i.e., capital) letters, maintain a uniform left margin and use two-letter abbreviations for states.

- Don't guess ZIP code numbers. If in doubt, buzz your local post office and get correct information.

- When mailing packages, secure them with only filament-reinforced tape — that's nylon-tape, not masking or cellophane tape — and do not tie them with twine or cords. Be sure the sturdy cardboard box or container is well padded with nothing rattling and secure enough for the item being mailed.

- Prevent damage by using shredded or rolled newspapers, polystyrene or "bubble" plastic to cushion the contents. And make sure no writing is on the outside of the parcel but the complete "to" and "from" addresses in indelible ink or on a typed-label easily readable from an arm's length. (If there is other writing on a recycled box, simply line it out to avoid confusion.) Plus be sure to include the complete "to" and "from" addresses on the inside of the package, just in case it should meet misfortune.

- When sending an oversized envelope, do indicate how you want it mailed, e.g., first class, priority or third class. If you self-mail your oversized envelope with no designation, it will probably get mailed third class, the slowest letter delivery.

- Remember that off-base post

offices sell packaging materials, including boxes, the proper tape and padding materials. The U.S. Postal Service provides Express and Priority Mail boxes and envelopes, plus tubes, as a freebie. Save yourself any guess work and shop at the post office.

- Make it easy on yourself and purchase stamps by phone. Order by calling 1-800-STAMP24 or call your local post office for an order form.

- If you've been good and you're expecting holiday packages, consider signing a waiver to have parcels left at your residence during your absence, i.e., those which don't require a signature. You must sign this waiver ahead of time with your mail carrier.

- For absolute procrastina-

tors, Express Mail provides guaranteed overnight service, even on holidays, 365 days a year.

- As a merry touch, ask your local post office if it participates in the postal Santa program. Some post offices have letter carriers who volunteer to dress up as Santa's helper on

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to deliver packages.

- Lastly, call the Postal Answer Line (PAL) for information on any of 87 topics including post office locations, hours of operation, postage rate information, mailing tips, etc. The Honolulu PAL number is 422-7070 and is accessi-

ble 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

This is the year you should get out and about and organized for the holiday season. Most off-base post offices will provide extended holiday hours. The Base Post Office, building 835, will be open from 9 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. If you do your part, the U.S. Postal Service assures it will do its best to help keep you on schedule.

Cards, letters and parcels should be mailed no later than Dec. 19 in order to reach the mainland in time for the holidays

Imagine stepping into space - nothingness - and the only way to go is down. Your body plummets, falling faster and faster, until it reaches terminal velocity, approximately 120 mph for a free-falling object.

The sound of air rushing by your ears is deafening. The earth stares up at you - unmoving, unforgiving.

When the canopy is deployed eight thousand feet later, your body starts to slow down and your heart is no longer trying to escape from your chest. You float by the clouds, suspended by nothing more than string and cloth, with the rolling Pacific Ocean passing beneath you.

As you approach the shoreline, the ground appears to be some vast patchwork quilt, with shades of green, gold and brown. Now your only companions are your thoughts and a peaceful silence.

As you gently touch down to earth and walk away, adrenalin races through your body and your eyes are still wide with amazement. And why not, you've never felt more alive and you know the answer to the riddle - man was meant to fly.

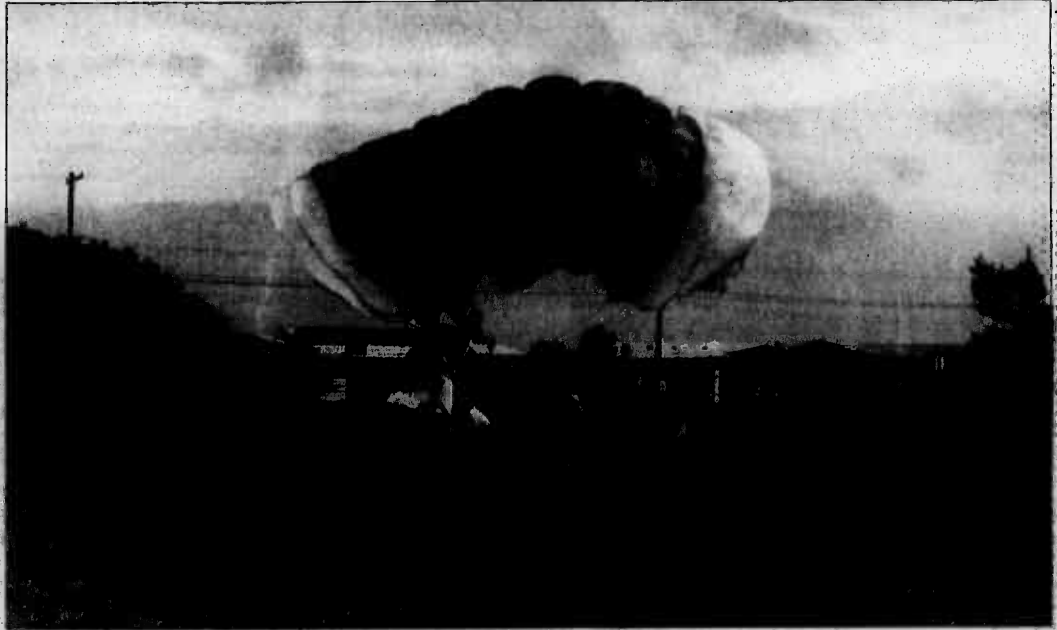
Skydiving, also called parachuting, is the use of a parachute for competition or recreation.

Though most people believe that skydiving is only a recent activity, it was first attempted in 1783 by Louis-Sebastien Lenormand of France. Lenormand, using two parasols, jumped from a tree.

Years later, in 1802, Andre-Jacques Garnerin made history when he parachuted 8,000 feet from a balloon in England.

With time, improvements were made to the design of the parachute. Lighter fabrics such as silk and nylon replaced the heavier canvas material. The original round chutes gave way to the more maneuverable square shaped parafoil.

Presently, skydiving has become a

popular sport for competitive thrill-seekers.

There are three categories in a skydiving competition: freestyle (a form of air ballet), accuracy (how close a diver can land to a specific target), and performing in teams (four or eight people completing various maneuvers while joined together).

As of right now, there are no competitions available in Hawaii, but organizations such as the Pacific International Skydiving Center located at Dillingham Airfield on the North Shore are lobbying to hold an international skydiving competition on the island within the next few years.

"Since we have a large portion of clientele in the military, we are currently organizing an inter-service sky-

diving competition," said Claire Foss, co-owner of Pacific International Skydiving Center.

The new rage in the sport of skydiving is skysurfing, which has been made popular by world champion Patrick de Gayardon. He has appeared in television commercials all over the world and is currently visiting the North Shore drop zone.

The first misconception about skydiving is that it attracts nothing but macho adrenalin junkies. Untrue. Today's parachutist comes from all walks of life: doctors, accountants, construction workers, etc.

The second misconception is that it is a dangerous sport wrought with fatalities. Again, untrue. The main problem that faces the sport is the negative publicity when an accident does occur.

One isolated incident can erase the tens of thousands of successful, mishap free jumps. With proper qualified instruction and by practicing the rules of safety, skydiving is said to be as safe as driving a car.

To even further increase the safety factor in skydiving, a state-of-the-art device has been developed called an AAD, Automatic Activation Device. If in an emergency and the diver is unable to deploy his or her chute, the device fires off at a pre-set altitude and deploys it for them.

For people who have wanted to experience the thrill of skydiving but do not wish to commit themselves to the sport by taking lessons, tandem jumping is an option. It allows a person to feel the exhilaration of free falling from 13,000 feet while attached to a qualified tandem instructor.

"It is the most incredible feeling I've ever felt before. I have been scuba diving for a number of years now and done some exciting things, but there is nothing that compares to this," said Sgt. Chuck Armentrout, 1st Radio Battalion.

Hawaii, having year-round good weather, is considered an ideal place to participate in this rapidly growing sport. Other locations are seasonal and limit the diver to practicing the sport during certain months of the year causing his or her skills to deteriorate during those off months.

For those adventurous types who wish to try this thrill of a lifetime, choosing a reputable facility to help you get started is very important.

"Ensure the instructors are experienced and, more importantly, qualified and licensed. Don't be afraid of asking if the instructors are licensed by the United States Parachute Association," explained Foss.

The cost of getting started in skydiving can vary in price range. Instructional prices usually depend on what is offered.

Most schools provide their own equipment to the student, and once completing the course, that equipment may still be rented from the facility. However, for those wanting their own equipment a good used parachute rig will cost around \$1,500.

Skydiving may not be for everyone, but some of the people participating in this exotic sport will agree that a familiar line from a known poem "Flight" comes to mind. "...I reached out my hand and touched the face of God."

Hawaii Marines dismember Kailua Crew 14-4

Navy/Marine Corps Relief offers financial assistance in time of need

An interest free loan is unheard of in today's society. But for active duty and retired sailors, Marines and their families, this and other services are made possible during a time of need by the Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society. The Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society is a non-profit organization which has been serving and aiding Marines and sailors since its founding in 1904.

Last year the society provided Marines, sailors and their families with more than \$53 million in loans and grants in more than 102,000

financial assistance cases worldwide. Besides financial assistance, NMCRS also aids families by providing budget counseling programs, visiting nurses, a thrift shop and a layette program.

"Help is here for those who need it. It is important for Marines and sailors to use us as one of their first resources, whether it be to avoid a problem or help them through it," said Ann Freund, chairman of volunteers, Marine Corps Base Hawaii NMCRS.

The society is sponsored by the Department of the Navy but receives no funding from the government. It is mainly supported by its annual fund drive.

Although the society disbursed more than \$53 million in 1993, it only received \$12.6 million in contributions. In Hawaii, more than \$1,890,702 was given out in loans and grants, but only \$562,000 was raised during last year's campaign.

However all donations are translated into direct assistance through NMCRS' worldwide network of auxiliaries, branches, shipboard and shore offices.

"Because all of the donations go back to those who donate, it is important for people to see us almost like a bank," Freund said. "Helping NMCRS is just like helping yourself because one never knows when an emergency

will strike." Although donations are one way to help NMCRS, another way to help is by volunteering.

"The Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society is a volunteer organization, 90 percent of all associated with Navy Marine Corps Relief Society are volunteers," said Paul Belanger, executive director, Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society Hawaiian Auxiliary.

"If it wasn't for our volunteers, we would not be able to provide the needed services," Freund said.

Volunteers receive training in military rank and pay structure, learning how to read a leave and earnings statement, survivor benefits, budget-

ing and computer training. In addition to this, workshops and seminars are offered throughout the year.

"Navy-Marine Corps Relief is your organization — think of us as a trust fund or an insurance plan. The monies you raise during fund drives are put in trust for future emergencies. It's your money, not ours," Belanger said.

The Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society is located at building 455 adjacent to the seven-day store. Hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., walk-ins are seen from 8-10 a.m. For additional information or assistance or to make an appointment call 254-1327.

The Young Marines program is a youth organization founded by the Marine Corps League. Youth ages 8 through 18 are eligible to join.

"The mission of the Young Marines is to promote respect, responsibility, discipline and education," said MSgt. Dwight L. Oakley, comptroller chief and commanding officer for Young

Marines, Aloha Detachment, Marine Corps League.

In 1993, the Young Marines became one of 12 programs partly financed by the Department of Defense aimed at keeping children in school, out of trouble and drug-free.

A Young Marines unit is starting right here at MCB Hawaii. Originally, a Young Marines boot camp had been scheduled to start in August, but due to low membership it had to be

postponed.

Young Marine recruits participate in a "boot camp" program conducted over a 13-week period. The group usually meets for two hours a week.

After the initial 13 weeks, the students continue to meet and receive instruction. But in addition to this, the members go on many fun excursions, such as camping and nature hikes.

"It's 75 percent work and 25

percent play," Oakley said.

In order to participate in the program, students must maintain at least a C average in school and have no disciplinary problems.

There is an expense of \$120 for uniforms and \$20 for accident insurance. Other expenses are either funded by other organizations or through fund raisers.

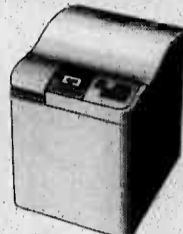

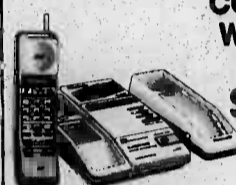

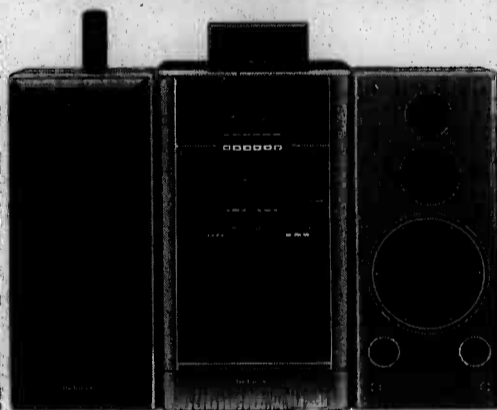

Jane and Dan considered themselves happily married for five years. He found his career in the Marine Corps to be very satisfying. She was busy but happy staying home raising their two sons Christopher and Michael. They had the usual ups and downs associated with Marine Corps life, with deployments and moves, but basically they had adjusted well to life here in Hawaii.

Everything then seemed to go wrong when Jane miscarried their third child during her fifth month of pregnancy. Afterwards, it seemed that they grew further apart and tensions grew until they were wondering if their marriage was really going to make it. It seemed to her that he was uncaring and insensitive. It seemed to him that she should have more control over her emotions and not let them bother her so much. These are very common dif-

ferences in the way men and women grieve.

Women say: I wonder if my partner feels badly about our baby. His grief doesn't seem as much as mine. No one understands me and I feel all alone and so empty. I'm so moody and I can't seem to keep from crying all the time. I keep wondering what I did to cause this. What did I do wrong? I think my partner has lots of feelings but why can't he talk to me about them. I feel guilty that I didn't want to be pregnant at first and maybe that's why my baby died. I feel like I want to get pregnant right away and maybe that would take away the pain. I can't seem to make the simplest decisions or remember anything. Am I going crazy?

Men say: I feel that I have to be strong and that my partner will feel worse if I show my emotions, so I keep them to myself. I don't feel as bad about this as my partner. She cries all the time and I feel I should be able to

make her happy. I'm tired of her being depressed. We don't have sex very often anymore. My partner seems to have withdrawn love from me. I wonder if I did anything to cause the baby to die. We seem to talk and talk but never get anything settled. I seem to be having trouble sleeping and am nervous all the time.

Partners can help each other to lessen the pain by understanding where the other is emotionally. Allow your partner to deal with his/her pain in her/his own way with as much time as she/he needs. The grief process goes through different stages, and chances are that in time the pain will lessen and you will be able to reestablish a changed but loving relationship again. Counseling is highly recommended. Talking to other people who have experienced the same losses can be very helpful.

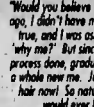
