## Nu'upia Ponds facelift

Troublesome mangroves to be cleared out

The normally placid waters of the Nu'upia fish ponds are the focus of increased activity as workers with heavy equipment begin removal of the mangrove trees that have slowly been choking the ponds.

The work, funded by the Department of Defense Legacy Resource Management Program, is being coordinated by the Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay Environmental Department and will last about two months. Nu'upia ponds stretch from the H-3 gate of Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay to the ocean. This historic and wildlife management area is one of the most important bird nesting and breeding sanctuaries in the state.

"Mangrove is very invasive," said Scott Henderson, natural resources management specialist, MCB Hawaii. "It starts growing along the shoreline and keeps growing into the water. Eventually it can entirely fill the ponds."

"It is also damaging to the historic fish pond walls," he added.

The ponds are a 286-acre wildlife sanctuary that is sometimes used as a winter retreat for mainland birds. The ponds where built by Hawaiians possibly as long as 1000 years ago, using coral and silt for walls. However, the mangrove problem started much later. It was introduced to Hawaii in 1904 for erosion control around fishpond walls and has since grown into an island-wide problem. Mangrove overgrows mudflats that are important to shoreline birds, waterbirds and fish that depend on the mudflats for feeding and

breeding.

The mechanized removal of approximately 80 percent of the mangrove will cover about ten acres in the pond area. The first area to be cleared will be the north shoreline of the ponds.

"It is important that we concentrate on these areas first," Henderson said. "The endangered Hawaiian Stilts begin nesting in early March and we want to be done with the area along the northern shoreline so they won't be disturbed."

Some of the areas will need to be cleared by chainsaws. Areas that are archaeologically unique, such as the pond walls, cannot handle the mechanized equipment without being destroyed.

The short term effects will be evident right away, he said.

The most heavily infested area is along the western side and is visible from H-3.

"We will continue to monitor the progress of the ponds after mangrove removal," said Henderson. "The University of Hawaii and other researchers are also doing studies and preparing before and after reports."

"Leaves and rotting vegetation produced by the mangroves affect the quality of water and sediments in the ponds," he added.

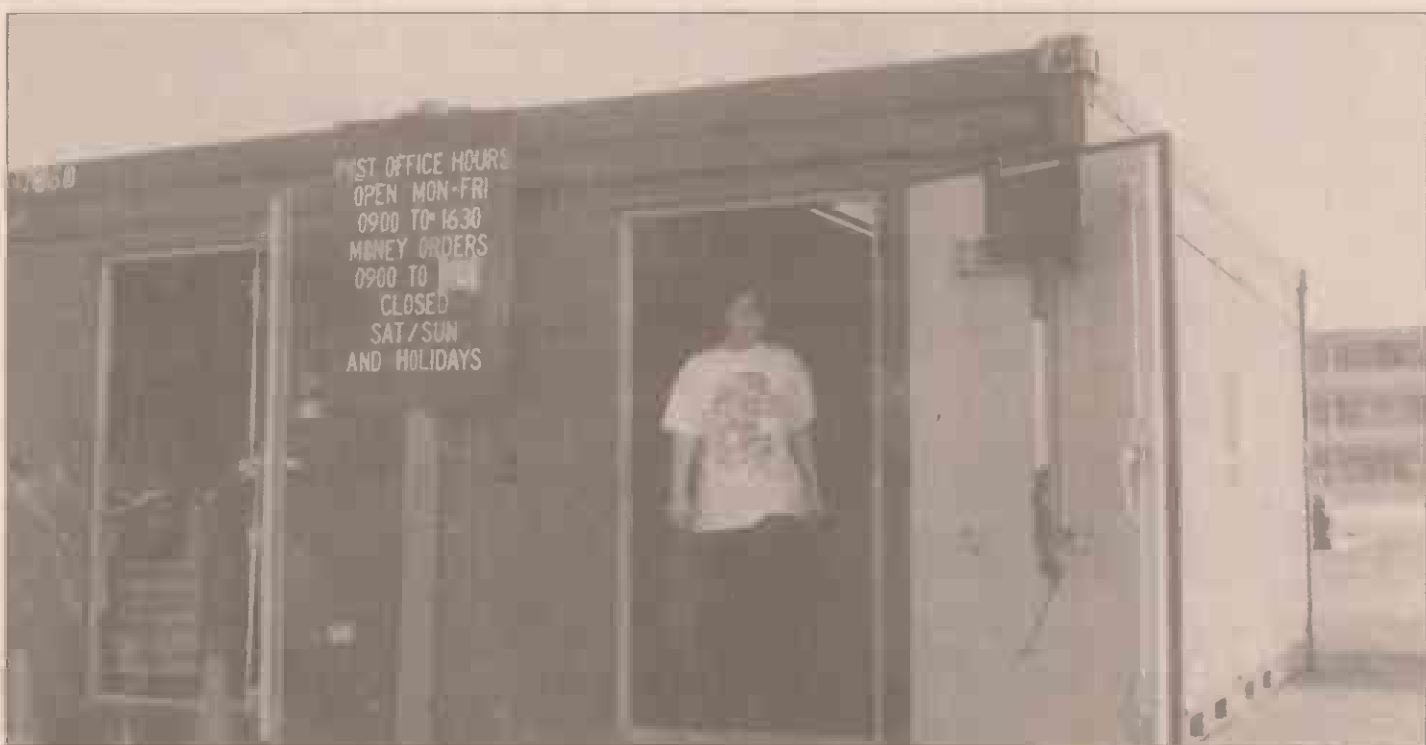
Most of the vegetation being removed will be chipped and placed back on the ground, said Henderson. This will cause most remaining mangrove seeds to be smothered.

"It takes a continuous program to control the mangroves," said Henderson. "There is always the potential of re-infestation."

"Possible future projects include the help of volunteers to hand pull seedlings," he added.

## Through rain, sleet or snow, even construction

A temporary post office was established from a Marine Corps Expeditionary Shelter System (MCESS) in the parking lot of building 835. The shelter was set up due to renovations to building 835. The Marines from CSSG-3 came up with the idea for the system in order to allow continued service to patrons while the building is upgraded to United States Postal Service requirements. "The patrons are a little surprised, but for the most part they are just happy that we're still here," said Cpl. Christopher Wade, CSSG-3.

## Marines Somalia bound to evacuate peacekeepers

Pacific Marines to provide security for final withdrawal of United Nations personnel in strife-torn nation

Nearly 2,600 I Marine Expeditionary Force and III MEF Marines are en route to Somalia to help ensure the safety of United Nations peacekeepers as they withdraw from the strife-torn land.

I MEF Commanding General LtGen. Tony Zinni will command the joint task force conducting the actual withdrawal operation. The Marines come from I MEF's 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit and from a Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force provided by III MEF on Okinawa.

The 13th MEU, commanded by Col. John Garrett, will be augmented by the III MEF SPMAGTF, commanded by Col. Carl M. Herdering.

In keeping with the "Forward...From

the Sea" doctrine, the MEU will wait off the Somalia coast aboard the Essex ARG. They will come ashore at the proper time to provide security for the last of the departing U.N. peacekeepers. After the U.N. forces have withdrawn, the Marines will re-embark themselves and any remaining U.S. and coalition-owned equipment aboard the Navy ships.

In addition to the usual complement of MAGTF air assets, the 13th MEU's air combat element is bolstered by AV-8B Harrier jet attack aircraft.

The Essex ARG is comprised of the USS Essex, USS Ogden and USS Fort Fisher. The ARG will be augmented by the USS Belleau Wood with the SPMAGTF embarked.

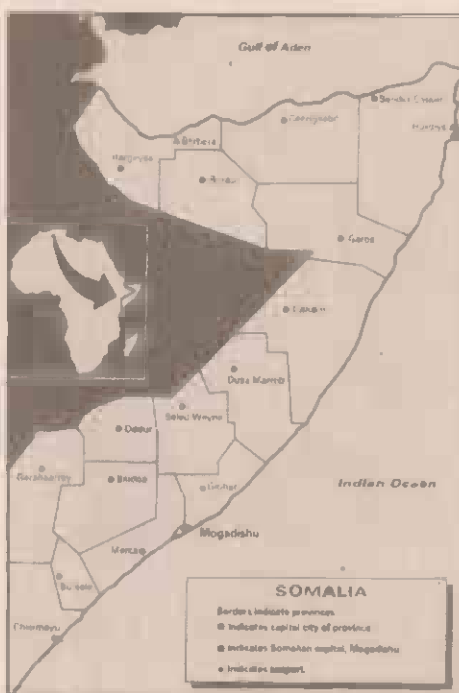
This deployment marks the third Marine deployment to Somalia in recent years. Marines conducted a noncombatant evacuation operation in

Mogadishu during Operation Desert Storm. I MEF Marines splashed ashore in December 1992 to provide security for U.N. relief convoys attempting to bring food and medical supplies to thousands of starving Somali famine victims.

The last 55 Marine-strong detachment providing security for the American Liaison Office departed Somalia on Sept. 15, 1994.

Once the 13th MEU completes this mission, it is expected to return to its normal deployment in Southwest Asia, preparing for the next unexpected crisis.

The overall commander for the operation is Army Gen. J.H. Binford Peay III, Commander in Chief, U.S. Central Command. The senior in-theater is Vice Admiral John Scott Redd, Commander, Naval Forces, United States Central Command.

## IRS Confirms Military Moving Allowances are Non-Taxable

Washington, D.C. — Temporary regulations published in the Dec. 21 Federal Register by the Internal Revenue Service confirm that certain military moving allowances are not taxable income.

Temporary Lodging Allowance, Temporary Lodging Expense, Dislocation Allowance and Move In Housing Allowance potentially were affected by new tax laws that went into effect on Jan. 1, 1994.

In May, however, the IRS clarified the tax law, and ruled that the allowances were not taxable income. The temporary regulation published in the Federal Register for public comment is the next step toward making the regulation final.

The allowances compensate service members for expenses they incur in connection with transfers to new permanent duty stations.

## Service Members in Debt Face Involuntary Allotments

Service members with delinquent bills may find another entry on their pay voucher — an involuntary allotment to pay private creditors.

Military personnel who owe debts, whether to private individuals or businesses, may be subject to involuntary debt collection. This comes after

Congress mandated a change in DoD regulations.

"We're not talking about every allegation of debt," said Navy Capt. Gerald Kirkpatrick. "We're talking about indebtedness adjudicated in civilian court when the court determines the service member owes money."

Kirkpatrick, DoD's legal policy director, said Congress ordered these changes along with Hatch Act amendments passed last fall. Before the changes, effective Jan. 1, only those seeking child or spouse support could get involuntary allotments.

To collect debts, Kirkpatrick said, creditors must gain a court judgment against the service member before requesting the allotment. If the court rules against the service member, creditors can file with the Defense Finance and Accounting Service to request payment.

However, before the deduction starts, the application must go through the service member's commander to the member for response. If it's found that the request is legitimate, involuntary payments from the service member begin.

"However, it (the allotment) is not an automatic process," said Kirkpatrick. "The service member has a meaningful opportunity to respond to it (the application for an involuntary allotment) and to raise objections."

Kirkpatrick said ensuring procedural safeguards for service members is important to DoD. He said the new regulations include provisions for extensions of response time. This is critical when service members deploy,

receive overseas assignments or have a classified duty where they can't respond to the application for involuntary allotment.

The regulations also protect service members from having too much taken from their "take home" pay. Only 25 percent of service members' pay, not including quarters and subsistence allowance, is subject to involuntary allotment.

"It's a matter of balance," said Kirkpatrick. "On the one hand the idea is to repay the debt in a reasonable amount of time. But on the other (it's) to make sure the service members have enough money left in their pay to meet the necessities of life."

Kirkpatrick added there may be more than one judgment creditor paid at a time, provided the total payments do not exceed 25 percent of take home pay.

In announcing the change Kirkpatrick said DoD is not trying to send a message to its forces, but rather implementing a law Congress passed. He said most service members have a good record of paying their bills on time and in full.

However, he said, there were perceptions that federal civil service workers and service members receive shielding from mandated debt collections. "That has not been the case for many workers outside the federal sector," said Kirkpatrick, "and the law corrected that imbalance."

To help prevent indebtedness and involuntary allotments, Kirkpatrick advises service members keep accurate financial records and seek help from their unit financial counselors or

legal assistance offices.

"Otherwise, if we as service members don't pay our just debts voluntarily, under this new law we may find the money comes out of our pay without our consent," he said. (American Forces Information Service).

## NVG training lab established in Okinawa

MCB, Camp Butler, Okinawa, Japan — Night Vision Goggles, a major asset in the effectiveness in night air ops, have been a concern as a possible cause of mishaps.

The Marine Corps established periodic NVG training to reduce accidents and improve effectiveness. This type of training was not available in WESTPAC and the cost of sending aviators to CONUS for this training was prohibitive.

The commanding officer of Marine Aircraft Group 36 chartered a team to study the potential customers of such a facility, their training needs, and the feasibility of bringing this capability to Okinawa. A team was formed to survey the potential market and the training needs for a NVG training lab.

The appropriate location was found and the approval for construction was granted. The lab was built using local assets at a cost of 1.5 percent of building a similar facility in the U.S., namely for about \$3,000 vs \$250,000.

Throughout the construction and testing of the facility, aviators from local commands were consulted and called in to evaluate training equipment and the building for

desired results.

The success of the facility is testament to the effectiveness of customer/end-user involvement. Four hundred air crews used the NVG Lab during the first year of operation. These crews included airmen from Iwakuni, Search and Rescue, the U.S. Air Force, U.S. Army and the Japanese Self Defense Force.

Customer input is constantly updated with user critiques and updated information of NVG operations.

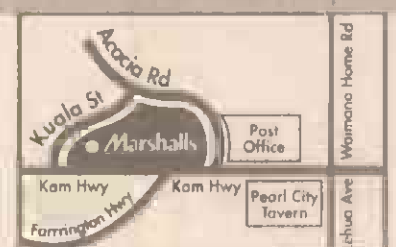

# HMM-165 Marines "Back in the Saddle" again

Marines and sailors from Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-165 recently endured the rigors of a two-day safety "standown." Titled "Back in the Saddle," the training focused on survival in the water, on land and familiarization with survival gear. Aviation water survival instructors from Naval Air Station Barbers Point provided instruction to the pilots, air crews and non air crew personnel. "We are taking non air crewmen, mechanics, typists and people that don't normally fly and introducing them to water survival and water safety that all basic air crews go through," said Capt. Mike D. Dahl, the squadron's director of safety and standardization.

"Before, it was necessary to make a trip to Barbers Point, NAS to get the same type of training, which meant that only required personnel such as pilots and air crews would be sent to training," he continued. "When the instructors from Barbers come here it is possible to train the whole squadron."

The first day of training was mostly classroom time in hanger 101. In the afternoon the aircrews went to the Officers Club Pool and had a chance to

test what they had learned earlier in the day on the proper usage of the Helicopter Emergency Egress Device and to get dunked during shallow water egress training.

The second day of training targeted refresher training for the aircrews and pilots and allowed other personnel the opportunity to experience water survival and safety training at seven different stations set up around hanger 101.

The Marines and sailors were split into seven groups of 10 and went from one station to the other spending approximately 25 minutes at each station.

Station one is where the Marines and sailors familiarized themselves with the Survival Vest-2. Following a thorough class on the vest, the Marines were blindfolded and then given scenarios and told to retrieve a piece of article on the vest.

From station one the group proceeded to station two where they were given instruction on how to successfully make their way out of a CH-46 in an emergency situation. Again, the Marines were blindfolded and given scenarios and then practiced egressing from the plane.

Following the completion of egress training, the groups then began preparing for station number three. At this station, the groups entered the

water for the first time.

Before entering the water the Marines and sailors were given a class and then had to demonstrate the proper wear of the Life Preserver Unit/Life Preserver Package. After they were complete with this stage, it was time to enter the water and demonstrate the proper usage of the vest on the way out to the raft and the second part of the station.

Working with the raft, the group demonstrated how to properly flip the raft right side up and get in. From the raft, the group received instruction on the safety procedures and its proper usage.

Upon completion of the raft safety class, five of the Marines from a group were taken further out into the bay for a dip in the salt water at station four. The Marines and sailors waited for the CH-46 to hover over head.

While hovering over head, the plane lowered a safety line and harness into the water where each Marine was hoisted up to a height of ten feet and then hoisted back down.

After being dunked into the water, the Marines would then move to the fifth station which was a dry off and changing area.

At station six the groups were given instruction on the usage of the pyrotechnics in the SV-2 and then had an opportunity to shoot off pin flares

and smoke and were given a sea dye marker demonstration before heading to the last station.

Station seven was a review on first aid techniques and a follow up with a some practical application.

"You can teach a lot in the classroom but unless you get hands on, it doesn't have the same effect," said Lt. Richard Jehue, the department head of the aviation survival training center from Barbers Point.

"Most people are lucky if they get to

do this kind of training once during their enlistment," said Cpl. Ted E. Darr, an avionics technician in the avionics section.

"Everyone gets a chance to fly on the planes," he explained. "They need to know what to do in case something happens. Hopefully it won't, but if it does they need to know what to do."

"Everybody needs to be trained to the same level," said Dahl. "We want to make safety interesting."

# Rescue Marine takes job of fighting fires seriously

To most people there's something soothing about a fire. When controlled, its warm glow pushes back the darkness and creates light in which to work and play. Its heat can embrace someone like a warm blanket. But when fire is out of control it can become an entity that's capable of destroying everything it touches. To battle this cunning beast requires courage and understanding of how it lives and breathes.

Cpl. Gary Plenert, senior aircraft rescue fire fighter, Marine Corps Air Facility aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, has what it takes to battle any fire, any time.

Born in Anchorage, Alaska, Plenert has lived throughout the United States and entered the Marine Corps in February 1991 while attending college at the University of Nevada at

Las Vegas.

"I enlisted in the Marine Corps because I wanted to learn a skill that I would be able to use in the future," said Plenert.

Knowing that he wanted to work in the aviation field, Plenert was given the Military Occupational Specialty of 7051 (aircraft rescue fire fighter) and after completing boot camp was sent to the 28-day fire fighting school at NAS Millington, Tenn.

"At the school we learn the basic skills such as rescue techniques, operating various pneumatic tools, and studying types of extinguishing agents," explained the 28-year-old.

After completing the school, this once Marine of the Base winner, has increased his fire fighting knowledge by receiving additional training in his field by qualifying to perform maintenance on such rescue equipment as self contained breathing apparatus (used to provide clean air to someone in

a smoke-filled environment) and becoming certified in basic lifesaving and CPR. He is also attending classes in fire science at Honolulu Community College.

"In the future I plan on joining the Federal Fire Department here on the island," said Plenert.

To be dressed and on scene of an emergency in three minutes after an alarm is given, Plenert takes his job seriously.

"There's no room for error in an emergency situation. We have to be ready, that's why at least once a month we light off a fire at our training area and practice day and night fire fighting," he said.

Plenert, who is always ready to assist his fellow Marines, is known throughout his unit to exemplify the phrase esprit de corps.

"Cpl. Plenert is not only a great asset to the Marine Corps but to anyone who is fortunate to know him," said Cpl. Nicholas George, a fellow fire fighter.

The gruff voices of Marines belting out an off-key version of "Frosty the Snowman" filtered through the tropical vegetation sending the natural wildlife into a panic but keeping the men motivated as they transported close to 100 tons of gravel along the Manoa Valley Cliff Trail.

For three days the members of India Company, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marines joined forces with the state Department of Land and Natural Resources Division of Forestry and Wildlife to create drainage ditches, lay gravel along the already trepped sections of the trail, and transport gravel further up the trail to be laid at a later date.

During the time they worked on the trail the Marines' day began at 3 a.m. with them loading up and leaving the base by 4:30 a.m., reaching the trail site by 5:30. After breakfast they set to their equipment and waited for the day to break. When it was light enough to see, the grueling task of moving 100 tons of gravel up the trail began.

They used a human chain of buckets and mule teams, two Marines pulling and another pushing a wheelbarrow to haul the gravel further up the trail. Also a rope pulley system, known as a hasty rope bridge that is often used in the field, was constructed to haul the gravel up one of the steep obstacles in their path.

"There's been some ups and downs but for the most part it has been an enjoyable experience," explained Cpl. Jason L. Green, automatic weapons team leader with Weapons Company. "I like being out here in the open. I don't care too much for staying in garrison. I like being out in the field or doing something ... anything outdoors."

"This has given us a chance to get out of the rut," said LCpl. Jason A. Soca, radio operator with 3rd Platoon. "We have been kept busy doing field day, cleaning gear, etcetera. Here, we feel and can see that we are accomplishing something. It's a good feeling."

This effort saved the state almost 3 months of work and at least 1,000 hours of supervisory labor on the weekends. In addition, if the gravel project is successful, the Marines will have saved the state nearly \$6,000 it would have cost to put in boardwalking along the trail.

"The Marines coming out here and volunteering their help have really saved us a lot of time," said Curt Cottrell, with the Department of Land and Natural Resources. "Many sections of the trail have become safety hazards because of the mud and swampy areas; also erosion of the trail has become a problem and the gravel the Marines transported should help slow down that process."

"They have contributed to the safety of the people who utilize the trail," Cottrell said, "and are helping to extend the life and operational use of the trail."

The Manoa Valley Cliff Trail is one of the oldest trails still in use on Oahu. The 90-year old trail was originally used as a way for the horses to transport the charcoal that was processed from the trees to the steamships in the harbor down below.

The Marines got involved in this project after their commanding officer spoke to Cottrell.

"I contacted the Department of Land and Natural Resources to get more information on their many trail complexes," explained Capt. Thomas W. Ward, commanding officer, India Company, 3/3. "Cottrell returned my call with the information. He also explained their volunteer program to me and asked if we would be interested."

"I considered it a worthwhile project," Ward said. "After receiving the OK from the proper channels we set up the time, place and particular project we would be working on with Cottrell and his team."

"We are the spearhead of the battalion," said 1stSgt. Christopher R. Gunn. "The first to go in and the last to pull out. That is our standard and we're proud of it. This was a good way for us to get involved in the community. We enjoyed helping to preserve this trail so that others can appreciate the beauty out here."

In addition to hauling and laying gravel, some of the Marines helped Cottrell and his team cut down Guava trees, an introduced vegetation in the area, to help fill in the swamp areas. Not only will the Guava trees help to make the trail safer, but by cutting some of them down the team gave the native trees — Koa and Ohia, more room to grow and a better chance at survival.

The Manoa Valley Cliff Trail is three miles long and provides hikers a fantastic panoramic view of Manoa Valley, Pauoa Valley, Pearl Harbor and the Ewa plains.

The trail will be open to hikers and trail runners, and will be used for environmental education tours with the Hawaii Nature Center. However, mountain bikes will soon be prohibited on this trail because they contribute to the erosion process and tend to break down the trail structure more quickly.

"We have adopted this trail," Ward explained. "It is now a part of us and we care what happens to it. We hope it will be safe to use and still bring enjoyment 90 years from now."

The Marines who participated in this project are now members of the Na Ala Hele trail crew, a state wide trail and access program. Na Ala Hele means Trails to Go On and these Marines will probably be going on many more.

# Lifeguard trainer grew up knowing Hawaii's waters

Ask any open water lifeguard anywhere about Hawaii's surf, and they will tell you it's like no other in the world. The waves can reach as high as 20 to 30 feet and break at almost any angle. Anyone swimming in this type of environment has to know what they're doing, and anyone who is a lifeguard in this type of environment has to be a trained professional.

Jeffrey Barbieto, lifeguard trainer for Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, is one of those trained professionals.

Influenced by his father, who was once a lifeguard himself in 1969, this 25-year-old native of Hawaii started lifeguarding at the age of 16 at Bellows' beach. Through his hard work and dedication, he was promoted to lifeguard supervisor at the age of 18.

After graduating from Saint Louis High School in Kaimuki, Barbieto took and passed the fireman's test and applied to the Honolulu Fire Department. One year later, at the age of 19, he was accepted by the fire department and was assigned to Olomana, Station 39.

It wasn't until Desert Storm that Barbieto started working as a lifeguard aboard MCB Hawaii. Looking for a second job on his days off from the fire station, Barbieto applied for the position of pool lifeguard.

"Due to increased personnel requirements during the war, Marines assigned as lifeguards were sent back to their parent units, making lifeguard positions available to civilians," explained Barbieto.

After Desert Storm, personnel were available for the Fleet Assistance Program and Marines were again assigned to the pool. The civilian lifeguards were slowly filtered out. Though Barbieto was one of the civilians who was laid-off he made an impact on his supervisors with his knowledge in the field of lifeguarding.

"About a year later, after being laid off, I received a call from Matt Colapinto, the base water safety manager. He said he needed someone to help train the Marine lifeguards. Thinking this would be a great opportunity to increase both mine and the Marines' skills, I gladly said yes," said Barbieto, who is also an avid surfer.

Since arriving at the base pool he says he has strived to constantly enhance the Marines' skills and implement new techniques in water rescue.

Being certified as a United States Lifeguard Association Instructor, Barbieto trains Marines in techniques such as scuba diver rescues, ocean awareness, resuscitation of a victim in a waterborne environment and CPR, to name a few.

"Ocean awareness is vital not only to the lifeguard but also to any person visiting our local beaches. Most accidents occur when the swimmer underestimates the environment he or she is entering and is overcome by hazards such as surges in the waves and riptides," explained Barbieto.

As a Hawaiian, Barbieto has strong roots in his native culture. And when he's not spending his off time with his wife Iris and his three sons Storm, Kainalupono and Lokahi, he is studying the Hawaiian language.

"I would like my sons to know about their heritage and learn about our oceans, so when they grow older they can appreciate all that Hawaii has to offer," said Barbieto.

Whether at the pool or at the beach, Jeffrey Barbieto is capable of performing the task at hand: training Marines to save lives.

## On the HomeFront

Your whites and your brights are lazily on the bottom of the washing machine waiting for the final rinse cycle to kick in when, without warning, water begins to spurt out of the hose leading to the washing machine.

It's 2 a.m. and you're dreaming of the mainland when the smoke detector begins to shriek. You leap from your bed, prepared to evacuate, but there's no apparent fire, smoke or any sign of danger. Meanwhile, the alarm continues to sound.

Your toilet overflows. As you're waiting for a repair crew you notice water dripping from the ceiling light fixture

in the room beneath the bathroom.

What can you do in these situations to minimize damage, inconvenience or danger while you wait for help?

"The most important thing anybody can know about their home is how to shut off the water and electricity," said Eddie Kerr, chief of facilities at Marine Corps Base Hawaii Family Housing Department.

When a washing machine hose bursts, it's usually a simple matter to trace the hose to the water source and then just turn the valve off. Even if a water pipe bursts, residents can take immediate corrective action, Kerr said.

"If pipe is leaking or broken under a sink, or if the toilet is overflowing and

the water continues to run, look for the nearby shut-off valve," Kerr said. "There should be one under every sink."

"If a main water pipe breaks in the house, it's a little more complicated, but every home has a main water cut-off valve. In the Capeheart area that valve is really obvious, but it may be harder to find in other areas," Kerr said.

"The next time your housing inspector is around, ask him to show you where the main water valve is, as well as where your main circuit breaker box is, if you don't already know," he added.

Any time there's a risk of electrical shock, immediately go to the main circuit box and shut off the circuit break-

er switch to the affected area, Kerr said. When in doubt about the affected area, shut off the whole house.

"If water is dripping from a light fixture, make sure you let the technician know after the water leak has been fixed," Kerr said. "Until someone's checked it out, turn off the light switch and don't use that fixture until it's been checked. Turn off the circuit breaker if you notice a short, or sparks coming from an electrical outlet or fixture. In that case, I'd turn off the whole house because you don't know how extensive the problem is," he said.

Other problems are less severe but still require immediate action. The shrieking fire alarm, for example.

Occasionally they will go off for no

reason, said Larry Glancy, MCB Hawaii's lead housing inspector.

"A gecko could run across a wire and set it off," Glancy said. "Knowing how to turn it off at the circuit breaker will come in handy in the middle of the night."

Naturally, if you see there's a real fire, or if you smell smoke, call the fire department. Having a fire extinguisher on hand and emergency phone numbers next to the phone can mean the difference between a minor fire and total loss.

## The first 1995 injustice

## Have you ever been told to "go fly a kite"?

Kites have come a long way since ancient China. Throughout history kites have been a source of fun and entertainment but these man-

made birds of the sky also have their practical side. As the kite developed in design it also grew in size and the Chinese found that when made large enough it could create enough lift to support an individual suspended from it. Taking advantage of this new

found technology, Chinese warlords would order a soldier be suspended from a kite so that he could survey and plot the most advantageous attacks on enemy castles.

During the civil war, artillery units would use kites to suspend soldiers so that they could plot and correct artillery fire.

Prior to World War I, kites carried radio antenna wires into the sky so that better radio reception was possible.

One of the more ingenious ways the kite has been employed was during World War II when the U.S. Navy used the Barrage Kite, developed by Harry C. Sauls, to protect ships at sea. A series of kites, all tied together with piano wire, were flown at an altitude of approximately 2,000 feet from naval vessels. They were used to form a protective shield that would entangle enemy aircraft during an attack, destroying their wings and motor.

Today's kites, though not used in such a patriotic fashion, have not stopped evolving in their uses. Parafoil kites (similar to a parachute) can produce hundreds of pounds of lift and are used as elevated sails to propel both land and water vehicles.

The single line kite that was once purchased at the local toy store has now become a tool used to advertise anything from commer-

cial products to events. These flying billboards can be as large as a basketball court.

The recreational kite which was once made of paper and wood has been replaced by more advanced materials such as rip-stop nylon and composite graphite. These new materials give the kite a sturdier design while maintaining its lightweight so that they can achieve high speeds. Sport kites can reach speeds of up to 120 mph.

"Kites made of these new materials can be expensive and if someone has never flown a kite before, they should test various models so they are sure to purchase one that they will enjoy," said Robert Loera, owner and proprietor of Kite Fantasy, located at the Kaimana Beach Hotel shopping arcade.

Competitions such as the Hawaii Challenge International Sportkite Championships have elevated the sport to a whole new level. The Challenge, which is held at Queen Kapiolani Park, Honolulu, attracts the top "pilots" from around the local area and around the world.

The pilots compete in events such as individual and team precision flying, ballet (which is performed to music) and precision kite racing.

"One of the great things about kites is you don't have to be a certain age and experienced to fly a

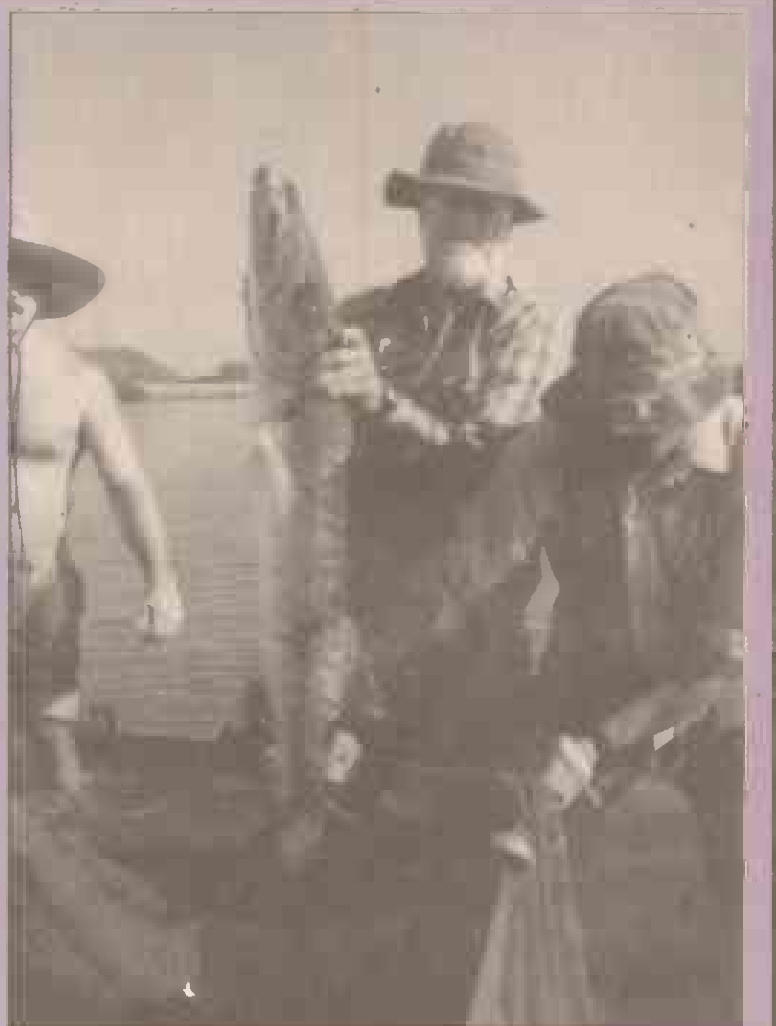

## Chaplain's Corner

In the past, January was known as one of the tunnel months. There is the annual let down from the joy of the Christmas season and the months of January and February seem to drag on after the quickness of December.

In mid December we were asked to give a series of lectures on Suicide Prevention. One of the conclusions we came to was that there are a whole series of resource persons available when a crisis arises. We said at that time, FSC was one; Medical, Military

Police and the Chaplain were also others that could be called.

If you are aware of those people you can count on in any crisis situation you will be able to handle any difficulty that might arise.

For 219 years the Navy Chaplain Corps have been the resource that people go to. In its long history names seem to be synonymous with help. During World War II the name that stands out is Joseph O'Callaghan, SJ. Joe O'Callaghan was the Chaplain on the USS Franklin CV-13 when it was hit by a kamikaze attack which left the ship dead in the water and drifting toward Japan. After fulfilling his reli-

gious duty to the dead and wounded he then helped off load live ammunition into the ocean so that the ship wouldn't explode. This is only one example of what resources the Chaplains can be in a crisis situation.

All our resource people (FSC, Military Police, Medical and the Chaplain) are care givers who are here to help. Some have been around longer than others but all have your interest at heart.



## Family Service Center



### Family Service Center

The unit has deployed and families feel an initial sense of relief that it is finally underway, despite the pain of saying goodbye. It is not unusual to also feel guilty about the feeling of that relief. Old routines have been disrupted and new ones are not yet established. Some women feel depressed, overwhelmed and perhaps disorganized as they face total responsibility for family and household. This is stage three of the Emotional Cycle of Deployment by Kathleen Logan, first described in Navy publication PROCEEDINGS 2/87.

Stage Four - Recovery and Stabilization. At some point, wives realize "Hey, I'm okay" as they establish new routines. The reorganization of roles and responsibilities becomes comfortable as they tend to necessary chores and cope with emergencies

when they arise. Each success builds self-confidence. Being alone also brings freedom to initiate new activities, accept responsibilities and stretch abilities. Despite the stress, most women have a new sense of independence and freedom and take pride in their ability to cope alone.

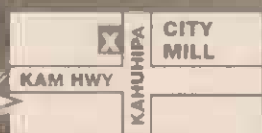

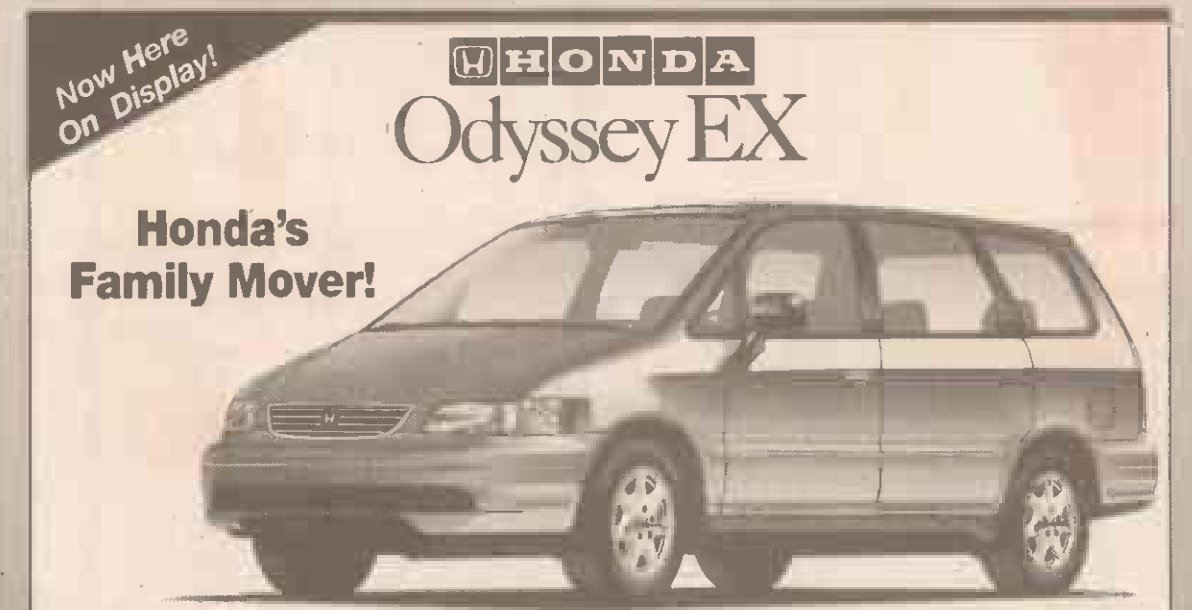

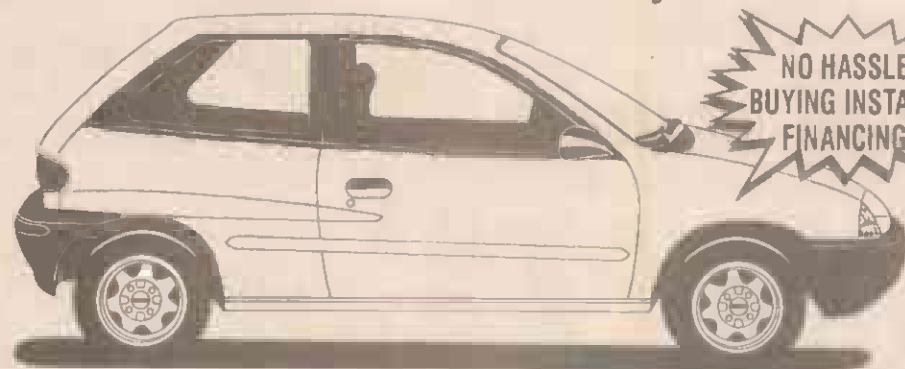
