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Immediate Response Team joins forces for simulation exercise

Two JP-5 fuel tankers collide into each other causing a fuel leakage which erupts into flames and spills aviation jet fuel onto the streets and down the storm drain system leading into Kaneohe Bay.

The Immediate Response Team was challenged with this situation during a mock scenario held at the corner of 6th and C Streets aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay Jan. 17 at 2:45 p.m.

The Immediate Response Team initiated action to close off the area, extinguish the "fire", care for "injuries" and to prevent the "fuel" and "hazardous waste" from reaching the navigable waters of Kaneohe Bay.

This exercise was planned by LtCol. K.E. Gregory, assistant chief of staff, G-3, MCB Hawaii, to help train and prepare the response team for similar emergency situations.

"We have a continual training program of various scenarios that we conduct, at a minimum, quarterly," Gregory explained. "These exercises are to improve the coordination and communication between all the base agencies involved."

"The simulation gives the agencies a chance to test their reaction time and their knowledge of what action should be taken," he said. "This way, the various agencies are prepared 'if and when' such an emergency occurs."

The members of the immediate response team are from the Military Police Department, Federal Fire Department, Medical, Environmental, Waterfront Operations, Facilities, and Crash Fire and Rescue.

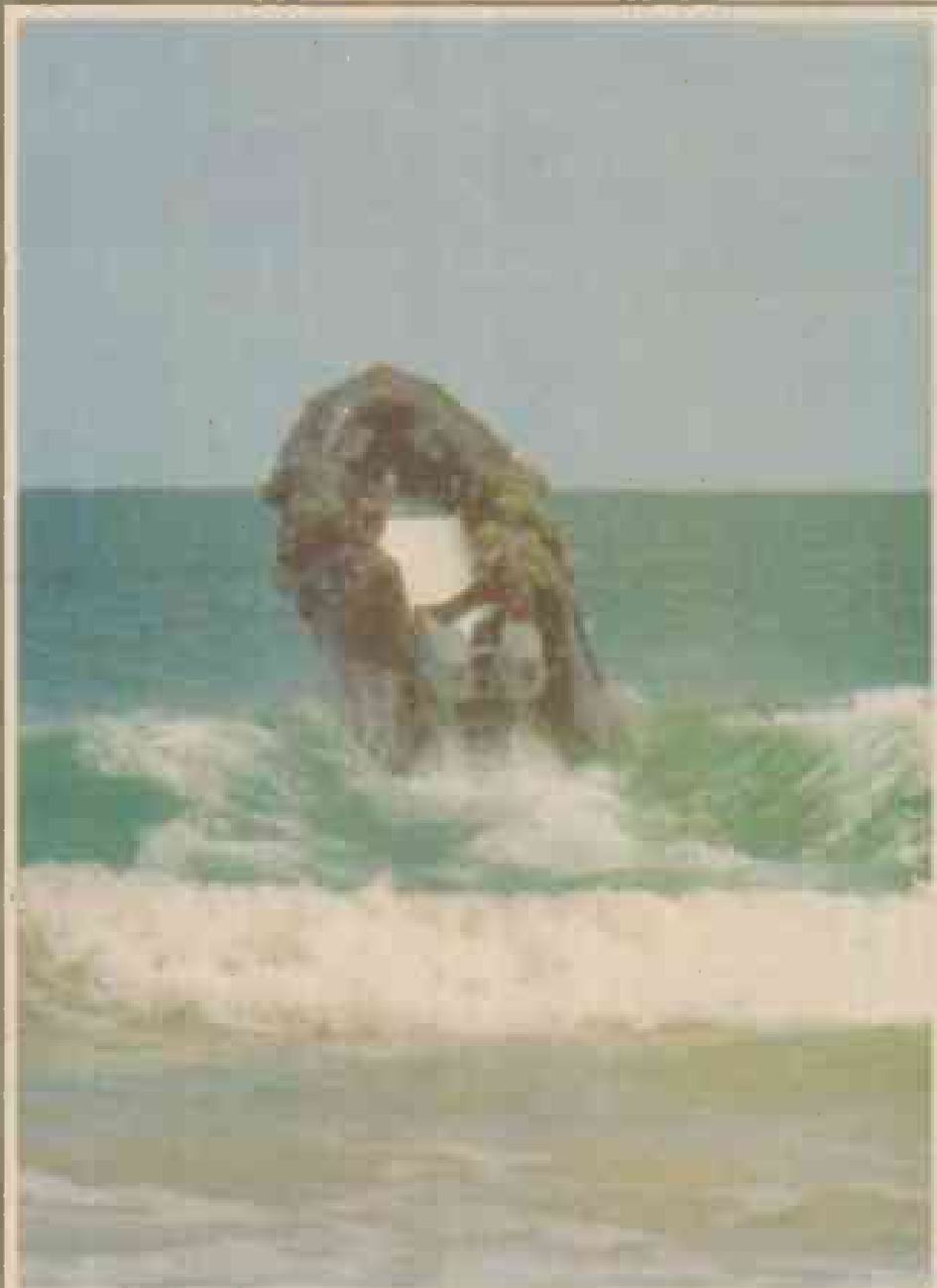
The response team was directed by LtCol. William Tourek, the designated base on-site commander. Tourek has received the training that is required by Federal law to handle hazardous waste spill response.

Since the simulation involved a "vehicle accident," the MPD was first on the scene to assess the damage and contact the remaining members of the response team. In addition, they re-routed the traffic around the scene and also identified and directed essential personnel to the scene and command area.

The Federal Fire Department arrived within minutes and extinguished the "fire" and began the coordinated spill response to contain the "hazardous waste."

The experts from the Base Fuel Division were contacted to determine whether or not the "fuel" was volatile and might explode. JP-5 fuel has a flashpoint of 140 degrees Fahrenheit so once the "gasoline fire" was extinguished the situation was not complicated.

Many homes receive new roofs

Approximately 150 Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay FY-63 housing units and 140 Capehart housing units are in the process of having their shingles replaced. The work began in August and is scheduled to be completed in May.

The new roofs are part of the housing scheduled maintenance, explained Eddie W. Kerr, the construction inspection supervisor with the Family Housing Department. The deterioration caused by the salt air to the cap sheeting and galvanized gravel stops makes it necessary for the roofs to be replaced on a regular basis, said Kerr. "The hot tar and cap sheeting work being done to the units is performed every 10 to 12 years."

"Some units in the Capehart area received roofing in

1988 but funding ran out," said Kerr. The more than \$1 million for this project is from appropriated Army money left over from Fiscal Year 1994, he said.

"The roofers are starting and completing units on the average of one per day," said Kerr. "This includes the removal of the old shingles, and replacing them with the new roofing materials."

"The biggest inconvenience to the residents is the presence of the tar trucks," he said. The contractors are aware of the inconvenience and are making a conscious effort to minimize the disruption.

The housing department inspectors and contractors from the Public Work Center at Pearl Harbor hold sight inspections to make sure the roofers from Certified Construction are adhering to the guidelines that have been established, he continued.

"The occupants of affected units will be notified prior to start of the work on their units," he concluded.

Base dump saves Marine Corps approximately \$1.6 million

A rusted old bucket, a broken mirror, a bundle of colorful clothes all lie in a pile at the Base Landfill. Each year approximately 2,400 tons of trash find their destiny in the landfill.

The Marine Corps Base Hawaii Landfill, an approximate five-acre area, has the capability of being piled more than 100 feet high.

Although it may seem like a large area to throw trash, after a study of the landfill was done in 1987, it was determined that the landfill would reach maximum capacity in 2003.

Previously, the landfill was the site of a motorcross area, rodeo arena and the base stables. The original landfill was located behind the Boondocker Theater but when it reached its limitations, a new location had to be found.

Unfortunately, a recreational area such as the motorcross and the stables had to be eliminated in order to maintain a landfill aboard the base.

It's unfortunate that a recreation area had to be used as a landfill, but

according to Mitchell Au, motor fleet manager, MCB Hawaii, the choices are limited. If the base landfill reaches its life expectancy, the only other choice is to transport the trash off-base.

Currently, it costs the base approximately \$900,000 to run the landfill per year. Disposing of trash in

a municipal landfill would cost about \$2.5 million dollars annually.

"Since we only have eight years left several steps must be taken in order to prolong the life expectancy of the landfill," explained George Lingle, MCB Hawaii, Environmental Compliance and Protection Department.

24th Color Sergeant of Marine Corps named

MARINE BARRACKS, Washington, D.C.—A new Color Sergeant of the Marine Corps was named in a ceremony Jan. 12 at Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., after seven sergeants nominated for the position from around the Corps underwent a rigorous week-long screening process. Sgt. Thomas W. Rollison, a food service specialist from the Marine Corps Air Facility Quantico, Va., was selected as the 24th Color Sergeant of the Marine Corps, replacing Sgt. Daniel

J. Charlier who will remain in Company A here and become the platoon sergeant for the Silent Drill Platoon. Colonel John B. Sollis, commanding officer here, made the announcement as the group of candidates anxiously awaited word on which one of them would land the coveted position. Marines of Company A, of which the Color Guard section is a part, were on hand for the ceremony. The Color Sergeant is one of three Marines to bear the title, "of the Marine Corps." The other title holders are the Commandant of the Marine Corps and the Sergeant Major of the

Marine Corps. Marine Barracks Washington, D.C., is entrusted with the official Battle Colors of the Marine Corps. The 49 streamers and silver bands that grace the Colors represent every battle, campaign and expedition the Corps has participated in since its founding. The Color Sergeant has the responsibility of carrying the National Colors during ceremonies and carries the Presidential Color for all White House State functions. By virtue of these billets, he is considered the "senior" sergeant in the Marine Corps. The process to select the new Color Sergeant included interviews with

Col. Sollis, Barracks Sergeant Major Larry J. Carson, Company A Commanding Officer Capt. Christopher S. Dowling and Company A First Sergeant Gerald A. Pedersen. The process also included a color guard drill evaluation, and a meeting with a leadership panel comprised of 8th & I senior enlisted Marines. Nominated for the position of Color Sergeant of the Marine Corps were: Sgt. John J. Bennett, an air traffic controller at Marine Corps Air Station El Toro, Calif.; Sgt. Timothy B. Brimhall, an infantry man from Headquarters, 6th Marine Regiment, 2d Marine Division, Camp Lejeune,

N.C.; Sgt. Randall R. Dunkin, a microwave equipment technician from Headquarters Battalion, Marine Corps Logistics Base, Barstow, Calif.; Sgt. John D. Harvey, an embarkation logistician from Headquarters Battalion, 2d Surveillance Reconnaissance and Intelligence Group, Camp Lejeune, N.C.; Sgt. Dwayne Hines, a communicator with the 3d Amphibious Assault Vehicle Battalion, Camp Pendleton, Calif.; and Sgt. David Maddox, a communicator with 9th Communications Battalion, 1st Surveillance Reconnaissance and Intelligence Group, Camp Pendleton, Calif. (SSgt. Stephen M. Williams, Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C.).

cated by any further spark hazards.

Crash, Fire and Rescue arrived next and worked together with the Federal Fire Department to contain the "fuel" and begin clean-up procedures.

For the simulation, both drivers were seriously injured and required treatment by the medical team. One of the drivers was unconscious and sustained burns over 60 percent of his body. The second driver had burns over 40 percent of his lower body and had an open fracture in one of his arms. The medical team assessed the injuries and stabilized the patients prior to transporting them from the scene. In an actual emergency, the

drivers would then have been evacuated to the appropriate medical facility for treatment.

The Base Environmental Department served as technical advisers for the spill response. They advised the on-scene commander of various State and Federal regulations that needed to be followed in the effort to contain and clean-up the "hazardous waste."

"Primarily, we look at the situation and assess what action needs to be taken to prevent any adverse environmental impacts," explained Maj. George Wheeler, Environmental director MCB Hawaii. "The big thing with any petroleum product is to prevent it from reaching navigable waters. If it does, we have then committed a violation of the Clean Water Act."

"Our main objective is to prevent a

spill from ever happening," Wheeler said. "However, if it should occur we want to make sure the spill is responded to promptly, properly contained and cleaned without harming the environment. Simulations like this one help us exercise our ability to assess and recommend the appropriate action."

For this exercise it was assumed that the "spill" reached the drainage system and also needed to be contained and cleaned up by Waterfront Operations at the drainage outlet that leads into Kaneohe Bay.

"We laid a boom around the outlet," explained Petty Officer 1st Class Robert Unverdorben, Leading Petty Officer for Waterfront Operations. "In some cases we would also have used sandbags in the drainage system to prevent the flow from reaching the Bay."

A boom is a containment system that is laid in 100 foot sections, 18 inches deep around the outlet and is anchored in place on either side. This system retains the spill substance so that it doesn't flow into the rest of the Bay. From that point a vacuum truck and rolls of absorbent cloth can be used to clean up the spill.

"This simulation was very beneficial for us," Unverdorben said. "Usually all we do is talk about how a situation would be handled. This way we have hands-on experience on how to set up the Boom and how long it takes to deploy, retrieve and clean the Boom. Because of this training our people are better prepared to react to emergency spill situations."

While the Immediate Response Team handled this "spill" situa-

tion with these containment and prevention methods there are many other options. Each emergency situation is assessed and the best possible system of containment and clean-up is used by the team.

"There will be many more drills, each involving a different situation and requiring a different response," Turek explained. "The simulations help us know how to react, what might go wrong and how to prevent it. It improves not only the reaction time but also the relationship between the response teams."

The Federal Fire Department will soon be forming their own response team that will be based at Pearl Harbor and will work closely with the military to provide back-up support in similar situations.

Crime Stoppers

On Tuesday, January 10, 1995 an unidentified male contacted a Central Oahu corporation and claimed to be Sgt. Clyde Thourp of the Honolulu Police Department, a Crime Stoppers Investigator. This male told the personnel director of this corporation that he was conducting an investigation for three sexual assaults and narcotics trafficking. The male suggested that the corporation fire the employee before the story of the investigation was known to the press, damaging the corporation's reputation.

No such investigation was being conducted of the employee. There is no Sgt. Clyde Thourp with the Honolulu Police Department. The only investigators assigned to the Crime Stoppers Program are Detective Margot Tang, who is currently on extended leave, and Detective Robert Naylor. If members of the public are unsure of the identity of any person claiming to be a police officer, they should contact the Honolulu Police Department and confirm the identity of that person. If approached by a person claiming to be a police officer, and they are unsure of that person's identity they should call 911 and a uniformed officer will be sent to confirm whether the person is in fact a police officer.

Crime Stoppers will pay a reward of up to \$1,000 for information leading to the identification, arrest and charging of the person who impersonated a police officer in this case. Crime Stoppers will pay similar rewards for information on other crimes. Callers do not have to give their names. Call Crime Stoppers at 955-8300.

Marine strives to continually learn about aviation

Ever since the Wright brothers first took flight at Kittyhawk the dream and reality of flying has inspired others to reach for the sky.

The joy of flying has led Cpl. Corey

M. Jensen to reach beyond the job and increase her knowledge on the idiosyncrasies of flight.

"When I joined the Marine Corps, the one thing I was looking for was a job that wasn't behind a desk," Jensen explained. "My recruiter went down the list, but most of the jobs available

were desk work. Then he mentioned the avionics field, which I was interested in. Ordnance was the only one available for me that was outdoors so I decided to give it a try."

Jensen's mother was very supportive of her daughter's decision to join the Marine Corps.

"She told me if I loved what I was doing I would succeed," Jensen explained. "However, she said that if I didn't like it I would probably fail, but regardless she would be behind me all the way."

Jensen arrived at boot camp in August 1992 and after graduation left for the Basic Aviation Ordnance School in Millington, Tenn.

"Actually, I was trained on ordnance for the F/A-18 Hornet," she said. "When I arrived here in March of 1993, I was supposed to be stationed with VMFA-212. However, they had already modified my orders to send me to HMH-463."

The ordnance for the Sea Stallion is much different than for the Hornet so Jensen had to study and work hard to learn about the new aircraft.

"Jensen is an outstanding Marine and a real team player," said CWO3 Don Davis, officer-in-charge of ordnance. "She really takes her job to heart and is focused on her goals. On several occasions she has served as the supervisor for the ordnance section and she also played a vital role in helping HMH-366 set up and maintain their ordnance workcenter."

The excitement she feels when flying has led her to ask questions and learn

more about the other aspects that make up the helicopter squadron. At the age of 20 Jensen is now training and learning about every function aboard the CH-53D Sea Stallion Helicopter in pursuit of her wings as an aerial observer/aerial gunner.

"She has a strong character and pushes the limits but she isn't here trying to break-down barriers," Davis explained. "Jensen does her job and does it well. I'm sure she will soon earn her wings and become an integral part of the aircrew."

Every work center at HMH-463 is given the opportunity to become part of the aircrew. It is completely voluntary for those who want to be trained as an aerial observer/gunner.

"I love to fly," Jensen said. "My father was a pilot in Fresno, Calif., and he used to fly us (five sisters and one brother) around. It is because of him that I grew interested in learning all that I can about flight, so when I was offered the opportunity to do more in the squadron I jumped at it."

"Right now I'm an aerial observer/aerial gunner under training," Jensen explained. "To become a part of the aircrew you have to undergo a lot of training."

The requirements for qualification as an aerial observer/gunner are listed in Marine Corps Order 3500.1. These requirements include an extensive swim qualification, flight physical, flight physiology (training on survival and basic gear in a pressure chamber set at 25,000 feet), and completion of

the necessary flight training.

"I've met the other qualifications and have almost completed the necessary flight training, but there is a lot more I need to know," Jensen explained. "There is so much to learn about this aircraft, I need to know more before I will consider myself as a qualified member of the aircrew. There is so much that goes on to keep helicopters flying. The absolute minimum in knowledge is not good enough."

Almost all of the training is handled by Marines who have been certified in their field. For example, Jensen is the only collateral duty inspector (CDI) for ordnance in her unit. This means she is qualified to train and certify other Marines for ordnance.

"The CDI is responsible for making sure the job is done right," Jensen explained. "All of us are responsible for the safety of the aircraft and the crew. If someone in the squadron is interested in learning about one of the other workcenters they can go right to the CDI for that job and ask them 'hey can you teach me this?'"

Training is essential for the Marines in the squadron. The more individuals that receive training and become qualified in the other sections the more it benefits the entire unit.

"We all work together in this squadron," Jensen said. "If even one area is lacking the whole unit can be jeopardized. The training we receive and the opportunities we are given ensures that we work together as a team. I'm happy to be a part of it."

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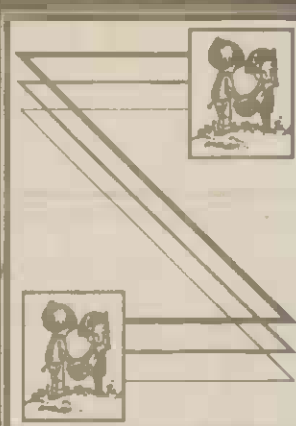
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Camp H.M. Smith has illustrious history of service to Pacific

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Despite surviving a revolution of change, Camp H.M. Smith, home of the Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Command and the Commander, Marine Forces Pacific, has undoubtedly stood the test of time. Camp Smith will celebrate its 39th anniversary as a Marine Corps facility, Jan. 31.

On that date in 1956, Camp Smith was dedicated as headquarters of the Fleet Marine Force Pacific (FMFPac), the largest single U. S. Marine Corps field command. The camp overlooks Pearl Harbor from an elevation of about 600 feet on Oahu's Halawa Heights, and offers a commanding view of the entire southern coast of Oahu.

The camp was named in honor of the late Gen. Holland McTyeire "Howlin' Mad" Smith. Gen. Smith, the first commanding general of FMFPac, was one of the most famous Marines of his time and known as the "father of modern amphibious warfare." His ferocious temper earned him the nickname "Howlin' Mad."

"These buildings and grounds are sacred to me for here many thousands of my men, wounded in the Pacific, received tender care by the medical corps of our great Navy..." said Gen. Smith at the camp's dedication ceremony in 1956. "Those men who made the supreme sacrifice left us a heritage which we must defend... this is our greatest strength."

Throughout World War II, the Aiea Heights Naval Hospital located on the site served as a stopping-off place for thousands of wounded Marines and sailors on their way home from the war in the Pacific. Originally a sugar cane field, the land was approved for purchase by an Act of Congress on March 17, 1941 for the buildings and grounds of a Navy hospital.

Work to construct the 1,650-bed facility began in July 1941, but moved rather slowly. Following the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, construction of the medical facility sped up rapidly as it was needed by more and more

casualties of war.

Commissioned on Nov. 11, 1942, the hospital later expanded to 5,500 beds. It reached its peak capacity during the battle for Iwo Jima in February and March 1945, when it cared for 5,676 patients at one time.

In 1949, the hospital was deactivated when Army and Navy medical facilities were consolidated at what is now the Tripler Army Medical Center. The Territory of Hawaii negotiated to obtain the Aiea facility for a tuberculosis sanitarium in 1950, but the four-story structure lay dormant until 1955, when the Marine Corps obtained possession.

The first Marines took up residence in October of that same year. Two weeks before its Jan. 31 dedication, the headquarters staff placed the camp in full operation.

Two years later, Camp Smith also became the headquarters for the Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Command (USCINCPAC), who moved his staff and headquarters from Makalapa, near Pearl Harbor. At Makalapa he shared the headquarters with the Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet.

Since 1957, USCINCPAC has shared the Camp Smith headquarters with

FMFPac, which was further designated in July 1992 as the component command, Marine Forces Pacific.

The U.S. Pacific Command covers more than 50 percent of the earth's surface, extending from the west coast of the United States to the east coast of Africa, from the Arctic to the Antarctic. During Vietnam, the joint service command was considered by many as the "Little Pentagon."

Other organizations currently located at Camp Smith include the Special Operations Command, Pacific; Joint Task Force-Full Accounting and the Defense Logistics Agency.

From hospital to Marine headquarters, to the most important command complex for the Pacific's military, Camp Smith has served its purpose when its country needed it most. And though the pain-filled voices of wounded troops have faded from its long hallways, the undying memory of those servicemen who fought in America's defense during WWII is reflected upon each year when Camp Smith commemorates its anniversary.

"These buildings and grounds are sacred to me for here many thousands of my men, wounded in the Pacific, received tender care by the medical corps of our great Navy. Those men who made the supreme sacrifice left us a heritage which we must defend... this is our greatest strength."

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On the Homefront

Planning on getting married? Family housing can help newlyweds

Are you planning to marry soon? Arranging even a simple wedding can be a daunting task, but to make it worse, just about the time things get really hectic you'll probably have to start looking for a place to live.

Although the Family Housing Department can't help you make decisions about invitations and reception halls, their trained counselors can help make the search for housing a little easier.

"We want couples to visit the housing office before they go out looking for a place to live," said assistant family housing director Melissa Cutter. "Not only will we tell them what they'll be entitled to once they're married, we can also provide them with assistance in finding a place, to live off-base if quarters aren't immediately available."

During your visit to the housing office, a counselor will give you up-to-date rental listings, local maps and information on the Hawaii landlord/tenant code. As a service

member, it's especially important that you know how to negotiate changes to a lease. The Marine Corps may require you to move sooner than expected or you might want to have the option to sublet your apartment if you're on a long deployment. A housing counselor can tell you how to protect your interests in these circumstances.

The Family Housing Department can even go one step further to help you get off to a good start. You may be eligible to borrow furnishings — including a couch, dining room table and

chairs, a bed, mattress, dresser, tables and lamps — for the first 90 days of your marriage. Clothes washers and dryers are also available for long-term loans, even to eligible families who live off base. If you plan to rent only until government housing is available, it's important that you report to the housing department no later than 30 days after your marriage, Cutter said.

"If the sponsor comes in within 30 days, the eligibility date for housing will be the date of the marriage. If they wait until after 30 days, they'll go on the housing list as of the day

they report," Cutter said.

In order to be placed on a waiting list for government housing, you must bring your marriage license and proof that you have obtained command sponsorship for your dependent(s) to the housing office.

The housing department, located in building 455 at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, is open Mondays through Fridays from 7:30 a.m. until 4 p.m., except Wednesdays, when they close at 12:30 p.m. No appointment is necessary, but plan to arrive at least a half-hour before closing time.

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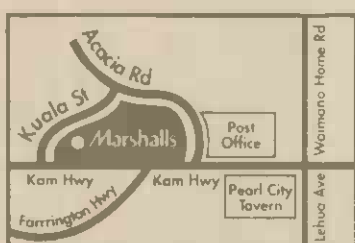

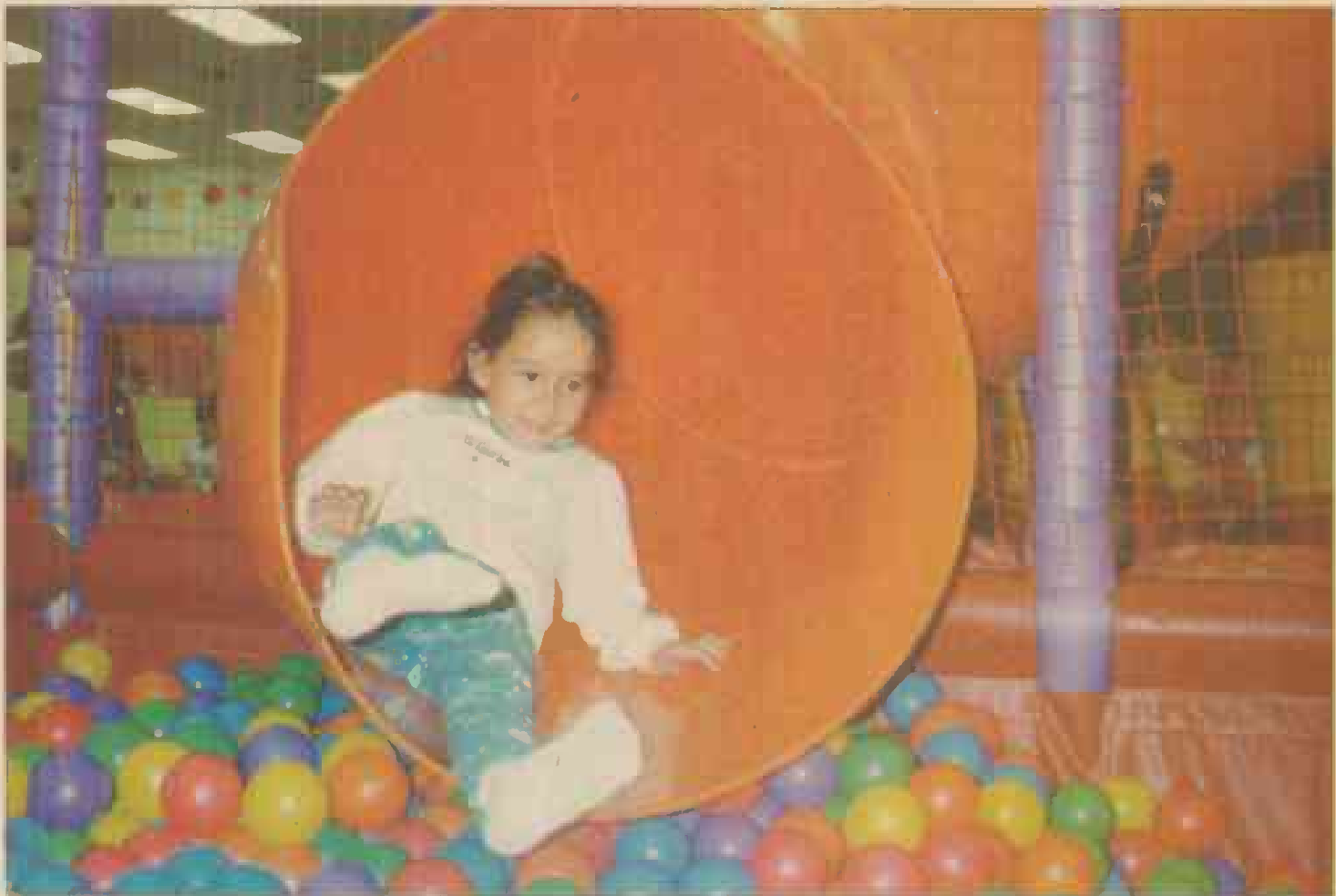

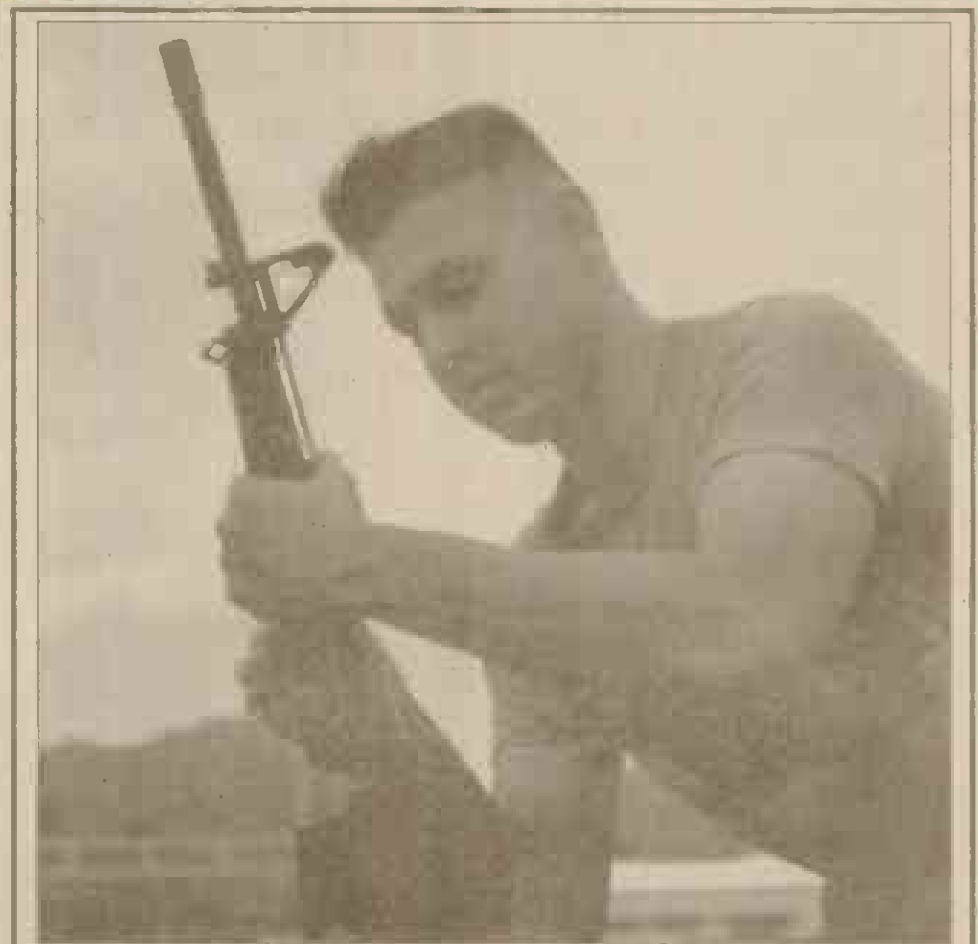
Picking up where they left off in the first inning, 2/3 continued their scoring by adding another six runs to the score in the first half of the second inning and in the second half again holding HQ

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Family Service Center

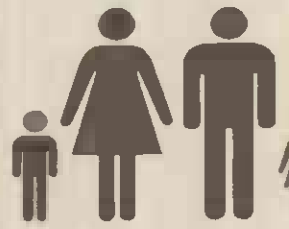

When a person joins the Marine Corps he or she agrees to keep fit, well trained, and ready to serve in case of national emergency. To remain ready to serve, service members must also ensure that their families are prepared, both financially and emotionally, for emergencies, deployment or periods of separation. They should develop a Family Care Plan that provides for guardianship and care of children or other dependents. They should keep their Emergency Data Form and SGLI beneficiary

information up to date. Most importantly, within the limits of security, they should ensure that family members understand their unit's mission and training requirements and the military benefits available to them.

The Marine Corps recognizes that service members perform their duties best when they are confident that their families are well cared for and that things will run smoothly while they are away. It is for this reason that the network of support

agencies such as the Family Service Center, the Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society, the Early Childhood Education Program and the Key Volunteer Network were established. By learning about the services provided by these and other base organizations and by taking advantage of the resources available, service members and their family members make a contribution to their unit's mission readiness. The Marine Corps has published a helpful handbook, What's Next: A Guide to Family Readiness, which is available at the Family Service Center. This handbook provides useful general information about benefits and entitlements such as military pay, medical and dental care, household goods shipments and space available travel. It also provides work sheets for organizing your personal, financial and legal affairs. 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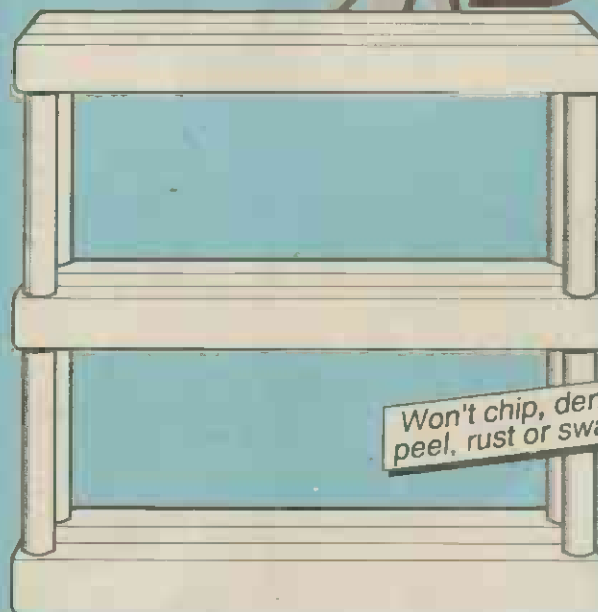
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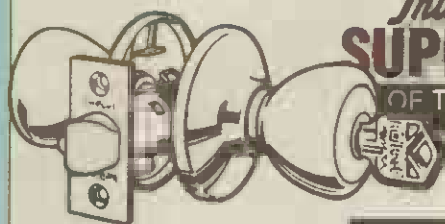


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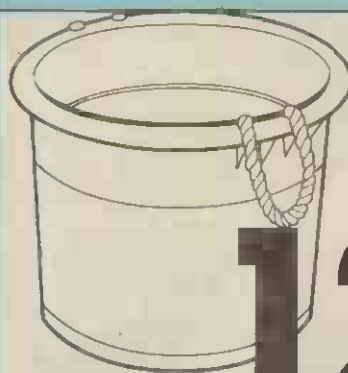
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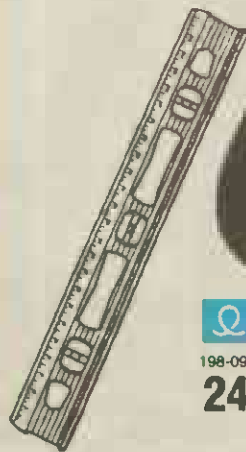
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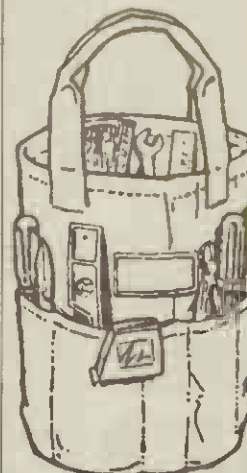


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Super Bowl needs help to make event a really super game

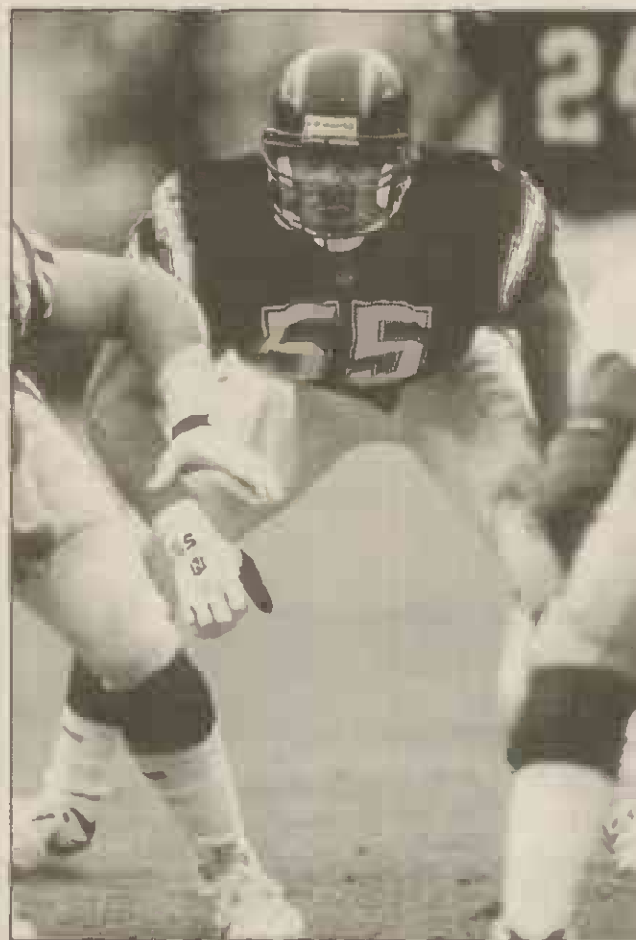
My, how things have changed.

Michael Jordan was always a fan favorite, but he never truly reached the NBA pinnacle until he made it to the Finals for the first time against the Los Angeles Lakers and Magic Johnson. Paul Molitor was one of baseball's premier players for 16 years, but he never really got his due until he was named MVP in his first World Series appearance in 1993.

Seau, who has been the NFL's best linebacker the past several seasons, will finally get his day in the sun in Super Bowl XXIX. Savor every moment of it.

3. PRIME TIME. Sure, Deion Sanders gets on a lot of people's nerves with his showboating antics. But if there's one athlete in pro sports who

can "walk the walk" as well as "talk the talk," it's Sanders. Some jealous sportswriters say Sanders does not live up to his hype, and then these same scribes will hype up the Super Bowl to the heavens even though there hasn't been an exciting one in four years. At the very least, Sanders deserves to be called an exciting player. More accurately, he is one of the best cornerbacks in the game's history and one of the few defensive players who can dominate a game.

This is prime time for PRIME TIME. Sit back and enjoy the show.

4. YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS. Although this will be Steve Young's third Super Bowl appearance, it must feel like his first. The 49ers quarterback sat out San Francisco's 20-16 win over Cincinnati in Super Bowl XXIII and played only a mop up role in Super Bowl XXIV, a 55-10 win over Denver.

Worse, Young's brilliant

career has somehow been blemished by the fact that he failed to lead the 'Niners to the Super Bowl, as his predecessor Joe Montana did four times. Now Young can finally erase that blemish and have his very own chance to be the hero. That alone will be worth watching.

5. WINNING UGLY. To most observers, San Diego's two playoff wins were not pretty. But to the Chargers' Super Bowl-hungry fans, they looked like a pair of photo shoots with Kathy Ireland and Claudia Schiffer.

San Diego has had flashier, and some will say better, teams in the past. To be sure, as far as entertainment value, the "Air Coryell" Chargers of the early 1980s were a rainbow-colored treat compared to this year's vanilla-flavored version.

But to true football fans, there is a certain charm attached to teams that win ugly. Hey, the name of the

game is winning, right? These guys may not be Picassos, but they have proven that they know how to paint W's. It's a perfect contrast to the high-flying 49ers, and it could make for a surprisingly interesting outcome.

6. POLYNESIAN PLEASURE. Seau is a Samoan from Oceanside, Calif. Chargers tight end Alfred Pupunu is Tongan. San Francisco guard Jesse Sapolu is a Samoan who was raised in Kalihi. Never before have three players of Polynesian descent played in the same Super Bowl. The South Pacific will be well represented in Miami.

7. THE GRASS IS ALWAYS GREENER. At least one thing about this year's Super Bowl will be better than last year's: the venue. In a game that has already become plasticized from overwhelming commercialization, the least that NFL executives can do is to make sure it's played on natural grass.

Call me a purist, but some-

how I believe something gets lost when a championship football game is played on synthetic turf under a steel dome. Joe Robbie Stadium is a football stadium with a football atmosphere, played on football sod. Let's get those uniforms dirty.

8. A REAL MEANS STREAK. The key to this game may be a 5-foot-10, 245-pound tank of

a man named Natrone Means. The California storms will be 3,000 miles away, but Means will bring ralling thunder to Miami. All he did in the Chargers' two playoff wins was rush for 200 yards on 45 carries and a touchdown, although it could also be argued that it was his presence that set up the big-play touchdown passes against

Pittsburgh that got San Diego into the Super Bowl.

The Chargers like to play a ball-control game centered around a huge line and Means, who can make his own holes with his punishing running style. That type of possession-type football may actually be just what it takes to keep San Francisco's explosive offense off the field. If Means

has another big day, the 49ers better be prepared for a close game.

9. HISTORY IN THE MAKING. Even if the game is a 49ers blowout, as many people predict, it may be worth watching just to observe one of the greatest teams of all time. Dallas won two straight Super Bowls and everyone said "Dynasty," but if San

between San Francisco and Dallas was "The REAL Super Bowl," as everybody said it was, then what does that make Sunday's game? A scrimmage?

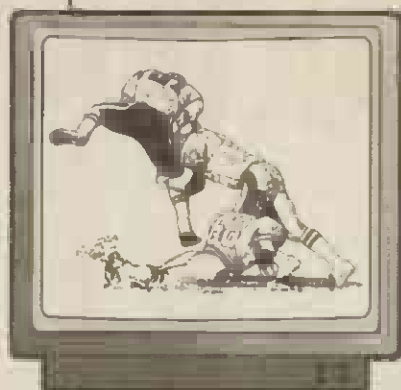

could make this one a yawner in no time flat.

San Diego's offense is primarily a ground game that sets up the pass, but if the Chargers fall behind early, they'll have to take to the air sooner. With San Francisco having a Pro Bowler at each cornerback position, that could be dangerous.

My parents went to Super Bowl XXV — the one with the Michael Jackson halftime — so I had experienced the big game vicariously through bio-

logical transference. But now I had the chance to personally witness history, to see the Cowboys defeat the 49ers for the third straight year before going on to roll over some hapless AFC team.

I KNEW that Dallas would win. What I didn't know until two days before the game was how I was going to get ahold of a ticket. Although I'm a part-time journalist, the odds seemed pretty low that I'd be able to get press credentials for this game as a community newspaper reporter — as a Sports Illus-

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

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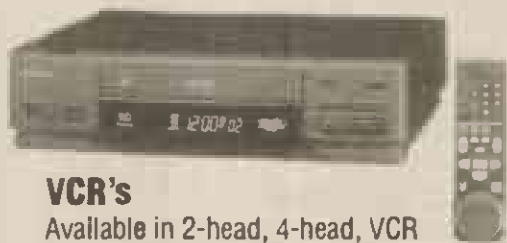

trated staffer, maybe, but not as a Sun Press sports writer.

I'm a resourceful person when I need to be, though, so I did the best thing I could think of at the time — I begged my fiancée's daughter in San Francisco to find tickets for me.

She told me tickets were selling for at least \$500 apiece. Considering the historical ramifications of the game, I told her that sounded like a reasonable price. She said she would try. I decided not to worry until later about minor details such as how to pay for a ticket.

Luckily, a co-worker overheard my incessant prayers for a ticket, told me she knew about an excursion to the game and gave me a number to call. I asked why she wasn't

going, and she mentioned something about moving into a new house that weekend.

How could anyone possibly think about moving at a time like that, I thought to myself. I calmly thanked her for the information, leaped over a 4-

foot-high partition next to her desk, ran over another co-worker who got in my way and dialed the number as fast as possible.

The man on the other end of the phone, Clarence Esposo of Aloha Island Odyssey, told me the price of the trip, which really was reasonable considering the cost of airfare, hotel room, game ticket and ground transportation. 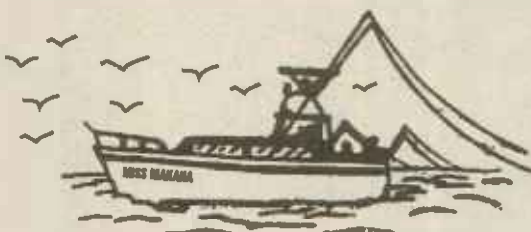

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Super plays highlight Super Bowl wins

SUPER BOWL I — Green Bay 35, Kansas City 10

Highlights: Packers receiver Max McGee, seldom used during the regular season, overcomes a hangover to catch two touchdown passes in Green Bay's rout. Packers quarterback Bart Starr completes 16 of 23 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns. Another touchdown, a 64-yard scoring toss to Carroll Dale, was called back due

to a penalty ... McGee stayed out late the night before, thinking he wouldn't see much playing time in the big game ... Chiefs defensive back Fred Williamson, the premier "trash talker" of his era, is blindsided in the third quarter and is carried off the field on a stretcher.

SUPER BOWL II — Green Bay 33, Oakland 14

Highlights: The Packers show their NFL dominance again, routing the AFL representative for the second straight year ... Green Bay quarterback Bart Starr earns his second straight Most Valuable Player Award, despite a

rather average performance (13 of 24, 202 yards) ... Green Bay led 13-0 in the second quarter and then coasted ... Legendary coach Vince Lombardi wins his fifth and last championship.

SUPER BOWL III — New York Jets 16, Baltimore 7

Highlights: Jets quarterback Joe Namath "guarantees" a New York victory — and delivers what still stands as the biggest upset in Super

Bowl history (the Jets were 18-point underdogs) ... The Jets' surprising victory gives the AFL instant credibility, leading to an eventual merger with the NFL shortly afterward and changing the face of professional football forever ... For the first time, the game bears the name, "Super Bowl."

SUPER BOWL IV — Kansas City 23, Minnesota 7

Highlights: The Vikings

and coach Bud Grant, though heavily favored, suffer the first of four Super Bowl defeats ... A quarterback (Kansas City's Len Dawson) is named Most Valuable Player for the fourth straight year. Dawson missed six regular season games due to a knee injury and also had to deal with the death of his father. To make matters worse, in the days leading up to the Super Bowl, Dawson's

name was linked to a federal gambling investigation in Detroit. He was later cleared of any wrongdoing ... Game marks the end of the AFL vs. NFL format.

SUPER BOWL V — Baltimore 16, Dallas 13

Highlights: Game was decided in the closing moments — the Colts won it when Jim O'Brien kicked a 32-yard field goal with five seconds remaining ... Dallas' Chuck Howley becomes the first defensive player to win the award and remains the only MVP from a losing Super Bowl team. The Colts won despite managing a meager 69 yards rushing on 31 attempts, and they were intercepted twice.

SUPER BOWL VI — Dallas 24, Miami 3

Highlights: Dallas took a 10-0 lead in the second quarter and never looked back, becoming the first NFC team other than Green Bay to win a Super Bowl ... The Cowboys' Roger Staubach is named Most Valuable Player, the fifth time in six years that a quarterback wins the

award. Staubach was named MVP after filling the airwaves for all of 119 yards ... Miami plays in its first of three straight Super Bowls.

SUPER BOWL VII — Miami 14, Washington 7

Highlights: Miami led 14-0 in the fourth quarter, when Washington's offense finally awakened with an impressive 79-yard drive. But when the Redskins went for the end zone, Miami defensive back Jake Scott intercepted a pass intended for Charley Taylor and returned it 55 yards.

The Dolphins then tried to put the game away with a field goal, but it was blocked and the Redskins turned it into a touchdown when Miami kicker Garo Yepremian tried to throw the ball and instead fumbled it. The Dolphins held on for the victory, though, to complete what remains the only unbeaten season in NFL history ... Yepremian becomes immortalized in "NFL Bloopers" for his ridiculous pass attempt.

SUPER BOWL VIII — Miami 24, Minnesota 7

Highlights: Larry Csonka's 2-yard touchdown plunge made the score 24-0 in the third quarter. Csonka rushes for 145 yards and was named the game's MVP as Miami's ground game dominates Minnesota's famed "Purple People Eater" defense ... Vikings become the first two-time loser of the Super Bowl ... Miami joins Green Bay as the only two-time Super Bowl winners.

SUPER BOWL IX — Pittsburgh 16, Minnesota 6

Highlights: Pittsburgh's "Steel Curtain" defense makes its Super Bowl debut, dominating the Vikings. Minnesota's "Purple People Eaters," meanwhile, has its hands full stopping Steelers running back Franco Harris, who sets two Super Bowl records by rushing for 158 yards on 34 carries and scoring one touchdown. In a game the Steelers won on the ground,

Harris pulled the load. In the second half alone, Harris carried 22 times for 97 yards as Pittsburgh chewed up yards and the clock to choke the Minnesota's "Eaters."

SUPER BOWL X — Pittsburgh 21, Dallas 17

Highlights: Dallas signal caller Roger Staubach, who made the "Hail Mary" pass part of football lore, heaved another one at the end of this game that almost won it for the Cowboys. This time, it went unanswered ... Steelers receiver Lynn Swann sets a new standard of grace with his diving catch of an overthrown pass from Terry Bradshaw. To make the 40-yard reception, Swann had to leap into the air, tip the ball over the hands of a defender and catch the ball on his way down to the turf. The catch has become the most famous in Super Bowl history. Swann, who suffered a concussion two weeks earlier in the AFC championship game, was named Most Valuable Player after catching four passes for 161 yards and one touchdown.

SUPER BOWL XI — Oakland 32, Minnesota 14

Highlights: Raiders quarterback Ken Stabler and receiver Fred Biletnikoff shred the Viking defense to pieces as Minnesota loses its fourth Super Bowl in eight years ... An AFC team wins the Super Bowl for the fifth straight year.

SUPER BOWL XII — Dallas 27, Denver 10

Highlights: The Cowboys' "Doomsday Defense" steals the show from Denver's "Orange Crush" in the first Super Bowl played indoors. Led by linemen Horvey Martin and Rony White, forces

seven Denver turnovers in the first half. By game's end, the Cowboys had intercepted four passes and recovered four fumbles, including one recovered by Martin. Together Martin and White put constant pressure on Broncos quarterback Craig Morton, limiting Denver to just 35 net yards passing. ... For the first time since its inception, Super Bowl winners (\$18,000) and losers (\$9,000) shares are increased.

SUPER BOWL XIII — Pittsburgh 35, Dallas 31

Highlights: Arguably the greatest Super Bowl ever played, the game matched the two dominant teams of the 1970s ... Trailing by 18 points in the second half, the Cowboys rally for two touchdowns but fall short. Dallas missed out on a third touchdown when seldom-used tight end Jackie Smith dropped a pass in the end zone, the most famous dropped pass in Super Bowl history.

SUPER BOWL XIV — Pittsburgh 31, Los Angeles Rams 19

Highlights: The Rams were overwhelming underdogs, but Los Angeles quarterback Vince Ferragamo "guaranteed" victory, stirring up memories of Joe Namath 11 years earlier ...

The Rams played surprisingly well early and led, 13-10, at halftime. Thoughts of an upset had 101,000 fans at the Rose Bowl and millions of television viewers on the edge of their seats. Pittsburgh finally took the lead on a 47-yard touchdown pass from Terry Bradshaw to Lynn Swann, but the Rams answered again to

take a 19-17 lead.

Pittsburgh then came up with big plays on offense and took the lead for good on a 73-yard touchdown pass from Bradshaw to John Stallworth. The "Steel Curtain" defense also rose to the occasion, and the Steelers became the first team ever to win a Super Bowl after trailing at halftime and the first to win four Super Bowls.

SUPER BOWL XV — Oakland 27, Philadelphia 10

Notes: The Raiders raced out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, and the Eagles never really made a game of it after that. Raiders quarterback Jim Plunkett (13 of 21 for 261 yards, three touchdowns) completes his comeback story, walking away with MVP honors ... In the second half, the only exciting thing to look forward to was commissioner Pete Rozelle's postgame presentation of the Lombardi Trophy to Raiders owner Al Davis. Davis and the NFL were in the middle of an ugly courtroom battle as Davis pushed forward on his plans to move the Raiders to L.A. Tensions rose as Rozelle presented Davis with the trophy, but the encounter was cordial.

SUPER BOWL XVI — San Francisco 26, Cincinnati 21

Highlights: The Pontiac Silverdome serves as the venue, the first time a Super Bowl is played in a northern city ... San Francisco quarterback Joe Montana wins the first of his three MVP awards.

SUPER BOWL XVII — Washington 27, Miami 17

Highlights: This game matched Washington's ground-oriented offense, led

by its huge offensive line (known as "The Hogs") and workhorse fullback John Riggins ("The Big Diesel") against Miami's defense, nicknamed "The Killer B's."

Ironically, it was Miami special teams player Fulton Walker who appeared to break the game open with his 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

But trailing 17-13 and facing a crucial fourth-and-1 late in the game, the Redskins gave the ball to Riggins. The Big Diesel burst through the line, broke a tackle on the outside and rambled 43 yards for a touchdown to put Washington up for good. Riggins bulled his way for a Super Bowl-record 166 yards behind The Hogs.

SUPER BOWL XVIII — Los Angeles Raiders 38, Washington 9

Highlights: Late in the first half, Washington trailed by only five, 14-9, and had a chance to settle for that and come back with a strong second half. Instead, Redskins quarterback Joe Theismann backed up near his own end zone and attempted a screen

pass in the left flat. Raiders linebacker Jack Squirek picked off the wounded duck and waltzed into the end zone to put L.A. up 21-9, and Washington was finished.

Two Raiders touchdowns in the third quarter made it 35-9, and what could have been a good game became the first

of many "yawners" that have become commonplace in the last decade ... The city of Los Angeles celebrates its first Super Bowl victory ... Raiders running back Marcus Allen busts loose for 191 yards. He capped his performance with a dazzling 74-yard touch-

dawn run, the longest in Super Bowl history ... The Raiders' victory gave the AFC a 12-6 lead in the Super Bowl series. An AFC team has not won a Super Bowl since.

SUPER BOWL XIX — San Francisco 38, Miami 16

Highlights: This was supposed to be a good matchup, and it would have been a good game if Miami remembered to bring its defense. The 49ers took a 28-16 lead in the first half and coasted to victory in the second. Montana had a field day against the Dolphin defense, or lack thereof, completing 24 of 35 passes for 331 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. He even ran for 59 yards, as the 49ers piled up 537 yards in total offense.

Montana's 331 yards broke a Super Bowl record. Forty-niners running back Roger Craig sets a record of his own by scoring three touchdowns (one rushing, two passing) ... The Dolphins' Tony Nathan catches 10 passes, one short of the Super Bowl record.

SUPER BOWL XX — Chicago

go 46, New England 10

Highlights: The Patriots take an early 3-0 lead, then surrender 46 unanswered points ... Chicago's 325-pound William "Refrigerator" Perry becomes the heaviest man ever to score a Super Bowl touchdown when he's given the ball on the Bears' final touchdown drive. Lost in the hype of Perry is running back Walter Payton. After a Hall-of-Fame career in which he became the NFL's all-time leading rusher, Payton left the game having never scored a Super Bowl touchdown ... The Bears' 36-point margin of victory sets a Super Bowl record.

SUPER BOWL XXI — New York Giants 39, Denver 20

Highlights: The Giants trailed, 10-9, at the half, then scorched the Broncos with 30 second-half points ... Setting a new standard for marksmanship, Giants quarterback Phil Simms entered the Super Bowl record book for consecutive completions (10) and completion percentage (88),

and he completed every pass he threw in the second half. He finished with 22 completions in 25 attempts, for 268 yards and three touchdowns, running away with MVP honors.

SUPER BOWL XXII — Washington 42, Denver 10

Highlights: When the Broncos raced out to a 10-0 lead in the first quarter and the Redskins fumbled on the ensuing kickoff, it appeared that another Super Bowl rout was at hand. It was, but it was the Redskins who delivered it. Washington recovered its own fumble, then proceeded to score 35 unanswered points in the second quarter to make this one a real yawner in the second half ... Washington running back Timmy Smith, never to be heard from again, set a Super Bowl record by rushing for 204 yards and scores two touchdowns ... Redskins quarterback Doug Williams left the game in the first quarter with a leg injury, but returned to throw for 340

yards and four touchdowns. Williams completed 9-of-11 passes for 228 yards in the second quarter alone.

SUPER BOWL XXIII — San Francisco 20, Cincinnati 16

Highlights: Basically uneventful for the first 45 minutes, this game exploded with excitement on the first play of the fourth quarter. Stanford Jennings ran a kickoff back 94 yards for a touchdown that tied the score at 13. Kicker Jim Breech gave

the Bengals a 16-13 lead with a late field goal.

Weaving his two-minute magic, San Francisco quarterback Joe Montana engineered a length-of-the-field touchdown drive with under two minutes left to win it for the Niners ... San Francisco receiver Jerry Rice ran wild in the Cincinnati secondary, catching 11 passes for 215 yards. Both those numbers represent Super Bowl records.

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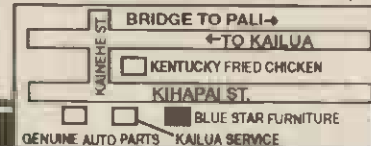

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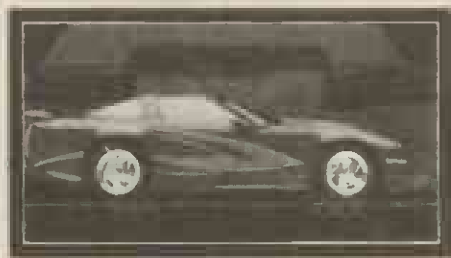

SUPER BOWL XXIV — San Francisco 55, Denver 10

Highlights: This was a great game in terms of watching Montana's brilliant performance (22-of-29 for 297 yards, five touchdowns). His touchdown passes cov-

ered 20, 7, 38, 28 and 35 yards. But as far as championship games go, this one has to rank near the bottom. It was 27-3 at halftime, and Montana took only two snaps in the fourth quarter before letting the backups play.

The 49ers scored two touchdowns in every quarter

and outgained the Broncos, 461 yards to 167. In time of possession, the Niners nearly doubled Denver, 39:31 to 20:29 ... The 49ers scored two touchdowns in every quarter and outgained the Broncos, 461 yards to 167 ... Montana becomes the first three-time Super Bowl MVP.

SUPER BOWL XXV — New York Giants 20, Buffalo Bills 19

Highlights: This was one of only two Super Bowls to be decided on the game's last play, the other being Super Bowl vs. Scott Norwood's 41-yard field goal attempt veered wide right of the uprights as time expired. The Giants' 17-play, 91-yard touchdown drive in the fourth quarter ate nine minutes off the clock and was one of the most memorable in Super Bowl history.

Although it was well-played and went down to the wire, this game somehow isn't as memorable as some other Super Bowls.

Part of the game's lack of mystique may be attributed to the fact that it took place just 12 days after the United States entered the Gulf War. Even during the Super Bowl, most people's minds were at least a little preoccupied.

SUPER BOWL XXVI —
Washington 37, Buffalo 24

Highlights: The Redskins jumped out to a 17-0 lead at the half, and began the third quarter with a quick touchdown set up by former Waianae athlete Kurt Gouveia's interception and return to the Buffalo two-yard line. That made the score 24-0, and by that time everybody watching started feeling the pangs of Super Bowl blowout nausea. It also rang up the NFC victory streak in the big game to eight straight, making people very bored of the AFC's futility.

SUPER BOWL XXVII —
Dallas 52, Buffalo 17

Highlights: Dallas quarterback Troy Aikman sparked a Cowboys offense

that lit up the scoreboard for 52 points as he completed 22 of 30 passes for 273 yards and four touchdowns. After Buffalo closed to within two touchdowns on the last play of the third quarter, Aikman put the Bills away with a 45-yard end zone strike to Alvin Harper, making the score 38-17 and clinching the victory for the Cowboys.

SUPER BOWL XXVIII —
Dallas 30, Buffalo 13

Highlights: The Bills took a 13-6 lead into halftime, but get outscored 24-0 in the second half as turnovers spell a record fourth straight Super Bowl defeat for Buffalo. The Bills had more first downs than Dallas (22-20) and had nearly as many total yards (314 to 341), but two Thurman Thomas fumbles and an interception thrown by Jim Kelly proved to be costly. Thomas was held to 37 yards on 16 carries while his counterpart, Emmitt Smith, carried 30 times for 132 yards and a touchdown.



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
