## Commander, Marine Forces Pacific nominated to serve as 31st Commandant of the Marine Corps

The President has forwarded to the Senate his nomination for LtGen. Charles C. Krulak to be promoted to general and become the 31st Commandant of the Marine Corps.

Following Senate confirmation later this spring, and the subsequent retirement of Gen. Carl E. Mundy Jr. on July 1, Gen. Krulak will assume his position as the senior Marine and member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Krulak is currently the Commander of Marine Forces Pacific/Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force Pacific, headquartered at MCB Hawaii, Camp H.M. Smith, Hawaii.

In his capacity as Commander,

Marine Forces Pacific, he is the Marine component commander for both the U.S. Pacific Command and the U.S. Central Command, and he is also commander of the United Nations Combined Marine Forces Command in Korea.

A 1964 engineering graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Krulak was commissioned a second lieutenant then attended and graduated from The Basic School, Quantico, Va. Since then, Krulak has served two tours in Vietnam, and has held a variety of command and staff positions. During Operation Desert Storm, Krulak, as commanding general, 2nd Force Service Support Group, Camp Lejeune, N.C., commanded the development of the largest Marine combat logistics base

and the Corps' largest ammunition supply point in the history of warfare.

Krulak's father, LtGen. Victor H. Krulak, a Marine Corps visionary and a 1934 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, directed all Marine forces as then commanding general, Fleet Marine Force Pacific — the position his son now holds — before he retired in 1968.

The Marines' next commandant began his tour as Commander, Marine Forces Pacific, in July 1994, after serving for two years as the Commanding General, Marine Corps Combat Development Command, Quantico, Va.

Krulak is married to the former Zandra Meyers of Annapolis, Md. They have two sons, David and Todd.

## New technology will help maintain healthy environment

Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay is taking a step in a new direction in the effort to clean up and protect the environment. Born from the effects of increased awareness and decreased funds, MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay has become one of the

test sights for a new technology in the clean up of contaminated sites.

The two-week Bio-Slurping pilot project, being conducted by Naval Facilities Engineering Service Center, Port Hueneme, Calif., is a test for an eventual larger project to clean up fuel which leaked from an above ground storage tank at the Kaneohe Bay fuel farm in the late 1980's. Bio-slurping is a unique technology which combines removing free product, (contaminants), from the soil/groundwater interface, and at the same time enhancing the natural decomposition and natural remediation.

Bio-slurping is a vacuum assisted free product recovery operation which also involves bioventing. The technology which is being developed jointly by the Air Force and Navy concentrates on three phases.

Inclusive in the first two phases are the physical removal of free fuel sitting on the water table, and bioventing, which is the natural clean-up of fuel contaminated soil above the water table. The last phase is treat-

ment of the groundwater through intrinsic bio-remediation which allows natural organisms to break down the waste through natural biodegradation.

The inexpensive system uses a two-inch diameter tube which is slotted. Within the slotted tube is another tube which is extended down to the point where the water table and fuel meet.

Once the well is drilled, the tubes are inserted and air is then sucked through the soil, collecting some of the spill, but it is the extra oxygen in the soil that allows the micro-organisms to help break down the material and speed up the process.

"You don't want to pump a lot of ground water," said Ron E. Hoepfel, the project manager from Naval Facilities Engineering Service Center, Port Hueneme, Calif. "It is expensive to pump out high levels of water if you are only getting small amounts of fuel."

Sites like this are cleaned up under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program," said James Abbott, the head of the Hazardous

Materials/Hazardous Waste Division for MCB Hawaii. "They prioritize clean up of the sites based on a risk analysis to human health and the environment."

Contaminated sites receive funding through this program and are cleaned up in order of priority.

"This site was classified as a priority two," said Abbott. "If we wait for funding it could be several years before DoD will fund level two sites."

The project is an alternative source of funds and an innovative method of trying to clean up a contaminated site. Because it is a research project, they are willing to fund it.

"A plus for the Base is the fact that we have involved the state of Hawaii, Department of Health Environmental people from the very beginning," commented Abbott. "They are very interested in this technology and wish to transfer this technology to the civilian sector as quickly as possible."

"The current project is a pilot to see what kind of results we would get out of it," said Abbott. "Eventually, there is going to be a nine-month to a year Navy funded project which will be much more extensive."

## Marines return from mission in Somalia

Approximately 150 Camp Pendleton Marines and sailors returned from Somalia to be reunited with friends and family in the wake of Operation United Shield, the operation to protect the final withdrawal of United Nations Forces.

The Marines sailed to Mombasa, Kenya where they began their flight home on a commercial 747. On their way back, the Marines stopped in Cairo, Egypt and London, England before arriving at March Air Force Base for further transportation to Camp Pendleton.

The primary support for Operation United Shield was provided by the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit and the Special Purpose Marine Air Ground Task Force from Okinawa. There were 2,700 Marines deployed on the five U.S. ships that comprised the U.S. offshore arsenal.

Bringing approximately 500 Camp Pendleton Marines in from Okinawa, Japan, was the USS Belleau Wood. Other facets of the U.S. fleet offshore included the amphibious ready group from Amphibious Squadron Five including the USS Essex, USS Ogden, USS Fort Fisher and USS Lake Erie.

Although the mission was not incident-free, no Marines' lives were

lost to hostile fire. There were isolated incidents where individuals acting on their own approached and threatened U.S. positions. At those times, appropriate action was taken to neutralize the danger, according to Lt.Gen. Anthony Zinni, commanding general, I Marine Expeditionary Force.

"Every minute we were out there was well spent. Once again, it's the lance corporals that make the generals look good," said Lt.Gen. Zinni. "I was proud to lead the people that made it work; certainly they deserve all the credit."

As the United States involvement in Somalia increased and declined, forces from nations around the globe

were there serving side by side in the humanitarian effort including Italy, France, Great Britain, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Malaysia.

The U.S. involvement in Somalia spanned four years and consisted of six operations to include the non-combat evacuation operation of the U.S. Embassy in January 1991; Operation Provide Relief, which airlifted food into Somalia starting in August 1992; the Marine Expeditionary Unit that provided cover for the introduction of 500 Pakistani peacekeepers; Operation Restore Hope from December 1992 to May 1993; the two MEUs that provided cover for the withdrawal of the U.S.

Forces in March 1994; and the just-concluded operation United Shield.

These six operations in Somalia represent the Marine Corps' inherent flexibility of employment in a variety of missions, according to Col. F.C. Peck, deputy director, Marine Corps Public Affairs, who served in Somalia for six months.

Although opinions vary on the success of the mission in Somalia, Peck is not disappointed at all: "We did the job President Bush sent us there to do, and thousands, perhaps hundreds of thousands of mostly innocent women and children are alive today because of what we did." (Cpl. Wade Fairbanks, MCB Camp Pendleton)

# PacDiv matches bring top marksmen in region together for competition

The Marine sights in on the target, his breath is controlled as he slowly squeezes the trigger and ... BANG!! The target goes down and the shooter awaits the marker. One shot - one kill means everything here.

Each year, commands throughout the Marine Corps send their best shooters to one of the four regional division matches. Shooters from the Pacific area participate in the Pacific Division Matches held at MCB Hawaii Training Facility, Pu'uloa Range. The other three regional division matches are the Far Eastern Matches at Camp Butler, Okinawa; the Western Matches at Camp Pendleton, Calif.; and the Eastern Matches at Camp Lejeune, N.C.

The participants in this year's Pacific Division Matches completed their required training and began firing the competition course Feb. 28. The competition ended March 3.

The competition was fierce as some of the best shooters in the Pacific area vied for the opportunity to participate in the Marine Corps Matches and possibly be chosen to become a part of the Marine Corps' Shooting Teams.

The Pacific Division Matches are one of the four division matches fired throughout the Marine Corps each year as part of the Competition-in-Arms Program.

"There are two phases to the Competition-in-Arms Program," explained CWO-5 Gary M. Matthews, the Headquarters Marine Corps representative for the Division Matches and the assistant team captain of the Marine Corps shooting teams.

"The first phase is the Division matches which are based on geographical location. They generally go for a three-week period during the February, March and April time frame of each year," he said.

These matches have been conducted since 1911 when the CIAP was first established, Matthews explained, and

have continued on with the only exceptions being during times of conflicts. The most recent being Desert Storm, which cancelled the 1991 competition.

The matches are open to Marines who qualify sharpshooter or higher with the M16-A2 service rifle, who have not been convicted in a court martial six months prior to the match and who remains on active duty through September 30 of the competition year.

Marines who qualify participate in the regional match closest to where they are stationed at that time. For example, Marines from Hawaii who are deployed to Okinawa during that time frame will participate in the Far Eastern Matches at Camp Butler.

For this competition the Marines not only fulfill their annual qualification requirements, they also receive extensive instruction from the Quantico Marksmanship Training Unit.

Each of the four instructors with this unit is a distinguished shooter on the rifle, pistol or both; and they are all small arms weapons instructors.

One instructor from the training unit that helped those participating in this year's Pacific Division Matches was MSgt. Donnie Heuman. He is the Interservice Champion and set a new record at the championship last year. The total number possible at the Interservice Championship is 1000 with a 100 X's. Heuman shot a 995 with 50 X's. He has won three Division Matches and holds the Far Eastern Division record. Heuman has been on the National Trophy Team four times and was also on the firing team that set the record for the Combat Infantry Trophy Match at the Interservice Championship.

The Division Matches award rifle and pistol competition badges to the highest 10 percent of non-distinguished shooters. There are three badges possible at each competition; gold - 10 points, silver - 8 points and bronze - 6 points. A shooter becomes distinguished after accumulating 30 credit points, 10 of which must be awarded by the Marine Corps. Upon receiving this status, the shooter is no

longer subjected to the annual requalification requirements.

Marines placing in the top 10 percent in the individual rifle and pistol matches will head to Camp Lejeune for the Marine Corps matches. These matches feature the Corps' most accomplished marksmen representing Marine Corps commands worldwide.

There are also awards for rifle and pistol teams who participate in the matches. In addition to the distinguished shooting badges the teams also compete for trophies. The top rifle team receives the Julian C. Smith trophy and the top pistol team receives the MGySgt. Mickey T. Finn Trophy.

The Finn Trophy was established in 1986 on behalf of MGySgt. Michael T. Finn. He was recognized as the first Marine promoted to the rank of master gunnery sergeant. Finn was a double distinguished shooter with the pistol in 1922 and rifle in 1930.

The Smith Trophy was established to honor BGen. Julian C. Smith, who, as a 1stLt. and the captain of the Marine Corps Team in 1928 took a virtually unknown squad to Wakefield and on to Camp Perry. At Perry, his team gave a sweeping performance by taking the four events of the National Board, the Rifle Team and Individual Matches and the same events with the pistol.

The trophies are what is known as perpetual trophies. This means that the winning unit holds the trophy at their headquarters for one year. The trophies are then returned to the Pu'uloa Range for the next competition.

The top 10 percent of team competitors also qualify to compete in the Marine Corps Matches at Camp Lejeune.

"The second phase of the Competition-in-Arms Program is the Marine Corps Matches," Matthews explained.

The Marine Corps Matches are run in very much the same manner as the Division Matches except the competition is more intense, the courses of fire more difficult and at longer ranges, and the type of weapon involved is dif-

ferent. At the Division Matches, the weapons fired are the M-16A2 rifle and the 9 mm pistol. For the Marine Corps Matches, the competitors use the M-14 National Match Rifle and the .45-caliber match pistol.

"At those matches, we're looking at the top 10 percent of the Marine Corps," he said. "The Marine Corps teams use the matches to select Marines to augment the teams in what we call the summer season. This season includes regional, state, interservice and national championships. The shooters who are picked up for the summer season will return to their units following the Interservice and National Championships."

This year, the Marine Corps teams intend to pick 25 rifle and 20 pistol shooters from the Marine Corps Matches to participate in these championships.

"The Marines who participate in the CIAP may gain personal awards, which is well and good," Matthews said. "However, our focus is on enhancing the combat marksmanship proficiency of the Marine Corps."

The CIAP's objective, he said, is to identify and train a nucleus of instructors who demonstrate exceptional interest and skill in competitive shooting sports.

"These Marines then return to their parent commands and form the basis for their commands marksmanship program," Matthews said. "The CIAP is therefore more training than a sport."

Matthews went on to explain that the CIAP is the avenue by which commanding officers can guarantee the continuance of excellence in Marine Corps marksmanship.

"It is important that commands at all levels support the CIAP as it bears on our future marksmanship instructors, coaches, and range operations personnel," Matthews explained. "That is how these competitions benefit the Marine Corps."

Since 1911, these competitions have helped to encourage and increase the Marine Corps' marksmanship abilities and with the support of the commands, the Marines will continue to hone their one shot - one kill skills.

# Marine's quick response saves families from fire

From the realm of his dreams, the tugging of a pungent burning odor awoke LCpl. Michael Sudia; Sudia had been asleep in his third floor apartment at Schrader's Windward Marine Resort when an adjacent building caught fire.

The Combat Engineer Platoon, Combat Assault Company Marine only half noticed the rancid smell at first, and tried to go back to sleep. The odor increasingly persisted, causing Sudia to fully awaken. When smoke began filling the room, Sudia woke his wife Chandra, and rushed her out the door and down the stairs to the safety of the parking lot. He then turned his attention to extinguishing the fire.

"I didn't want to see my things burn, so I tried to do what I could to stop the fire," said Sudia. "I knew that my wife would be alright downstairs in the parking lot, so I started looking for fire extinguishers."

Sudia immediately alerted his neighbor, a Honolulu Police Department, police officer, and they ran to the room that was on fire. In order to gain access to the fire extinguishers, Sudia was forced to smash out the glass casings, sustaining minor injuries to his right hand.

"We tried to put the fire out, but it was spreading too fast. There was nothing we could do to extinguish it," said Sudia.

Realizing lives were in danger, Sudia began banging on doors in the immediate vicinity and shouting, "Fire! Wake up, Fire!"

Sudia said that his experiences in the Marine Corps gave him the courage he needed to overcome his fear. He knew what the right thing to do was, and he acted rather than overthinking the situation. This enabled him to run up and down the stairways and balconies of the apartments to wake everyone up.

"I'm just glad that I smelled the smoke when I did," said Sudia.

According to the Honolulu

Advertiser, resident Clarita Mashino said, "If it weren't for him, we would still be in there sleeping...forever."

The fire was reported at 5 a.m. on March 8. The blaze destroyed a fourplex apartment building where six families were living and also heavily damaged neighboring buildings. According to Capt. Lloyd Rogers, the fire inspector investigating the fire in Kahaluu, even though the investigation is still pending, electrical appliances from the apartment where the fire originated are considered a possible cause.

Sudia's apartment was one of those that was badly damaged and is currently condemned. His furniture, although ruined by smoke and water damage, is currently in a storage facility. He and his wife are staying with friends while they recover from the incident and search for a new place to live.

Sudia was born in Roanoke, Va. and raised in Lutz, Fla. He arrived at MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, in October 1993.

## Operating a business in housing permitted with certain restrictions

When money gets tight some people look for a second job, some cut entertainment and extras out of their budget, and still others start looking at hobbies and skills as a means to earn extra income.

If you've ever thought of starting a business in family housing, but then brushed the idea aside because you thought it was against the rules, think again. Many Marines and their family members engage in commercial enterprises in base housing.

As with all businesses however, there are certain requirements that must be met prior to going into operation.

Prospective entrepreneurs must obtain a Hawaii state excise license. Then they must submit a letter to the base adjutant describing the business and requesting permission to conduct it in base housing. They should attach a copy of the excise license, along with business cards, brochures or other media that fur-

ther describe the business.

Each application is considered on a case-by-case basis, said Marine Corps Base Hawaii Adjutant 1stLt. Maureen Murphy.

"Anyone with the ways or means is welcome to operate a business, provided they meet certain basic guidelines," she said.

"The business must comply with all Marine Corps Orders, base regulations, and housing regulations," said GySgt. Eileen Osterhout of the base inspector's office. "Additionally, the business can't disturb neighbors, can't use excessive utilities, and must be safe."

For example, a request to operate a car wash would be turned down because it would disturb the neighborhood as well as use excessive amounts of water. An auto repair business would be turned down because it's against the rules to perform auto repairs in housing areas, and anything to do with firearms would be turned down for safe-

ty reasons, Murphy said.

On the other hand, a request to repair computers in base housing would probably be approved because the business is compact, quiet and uses few resources. Requests to sell Tupperware and cosmetics are routinely approved, Osterhout said.

There are also very specific rules for soliciting on base.

"It is a federal offense to place items in mailboxes, and the base order on soliciting forbids leaving literature at quarters unless it has been specifically requested by the resident," Osterhout said.

The base order forbids door-to-door solicitation and says that requests to distribute literature must be submitted to the Commanding General, in writing, at least 5 days prior to the proposed distribution date.

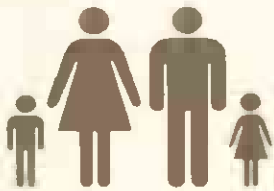
Occasionally, housing residents will ask for permission to modify their quarters for business purposes. The

adjutant forwards those requests to the Family Housing Department for a decision.

"There's a potential for excellent services to be provided in housing, given the creativity and talent of our family members," said Housing Director Becky Ray. "And we certainly don't want to discourage people from that, but we won't allow them to make a modification that wouldn't ordinarily be allowed."

If, for example, a resident wants to install an oversized shed to accommodate a business, the request would be denied, Ray said, because sheds must be built according to stringently-adhered-to specifications. But a request to install shelves in quarters or modify a closet would probably be approved for any resident, so it would be approved for a business, too, she explained.

# TAMP is multi-resource center for transition to civilian life

You're getting out of the military; life could not be better, no more field day, no more chow hall and best of all no more gunnies. You have it all planned out, a brand new condo, with a maid, and a cook and an executive job all lined up. Well, not exactly.

The Transition Assistance Management Program aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii can get you on your way. It can at least help you face the reality of being out of the military, and prepare you for what you will encounter as a civilian.

A TAMP workshop is offered to help

service members develop and implement an individual transition plan. Subsequently, monthly classes are offered dealing with some of the events and obstacles faced after leaving the military.

During the TAMP workshop, service members and their families will get a basic knowledge of their entitlements, benefits and opportunities.

"The program is designed to help military personnel regain a sense of security," said Jim Gardner, transition assistance specialist, MCB Hawaii.

This is accomplished through education and assistance by the individual agencies on what they have to offer. Each day of the workshop different

departmental speakers will pass information to the attendees about their agency.

However, if this general information is not sufficient, appointments can be set on an individual basis or for follow-up classes.

Additionally, TAMP has a wide variety of services useful for those in transition or who are relocating. Among those services are the Transition Bulletin Board and the American Job Bank, both of which offer a listing of jobs available in the area to which you will be relocating. Another service is the Defense Outplacement and Referral System, which allows individuals seeking employment to place their qualifications in a database where approximately

6000 employers have access. DORS has an 87 percent contact rate.

"We help develop a search strategy," Gardner said. "We provide help with your resume in a one-hour class and also one-on-one follow up counseling," said Gardner.

To get the most effectiveness from TAMP, service members should attend the TAMP workshop six months prior to leaving the military.

"We're not here to hold your hand but to help you face reality. You survived the military. You have talents, skills and knowledge. We will help you package them," said Gardner.

The TAMP was established after Public Law 101510 was passed in 1989 mandating military personnel must

receive a nine-point training program which encompasses the TAMP seminar. The other nine points covered by TAMP are individual transition plan, effects of a career change, employment assistance, relocation assistance, education and training, health and life insurance, finances, reserve affiliation and disabled veterans.

Any military personnel interested in any of the TAMP services can contact the TAMP office at 257-3135.

Leaving the military may seem like the road to freedom but it can turn into a catastrophe if you are not prepared. The peace of mind accomplished by being prepared can make a visit to TAMP well worth your while.

# Paraloft vital fabric of aviation

When pilots and their crew are flying at more than 10,000 feet, the last thing they need to worry about is whether or not their equipment is in proper working order.

Likewise, for the five personnel working at the Paraloft aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, the safety of the pilots and crew are very important to them. Even their Military Occupational Specialty of 6060, Aircrew Survival Equipmentman, has a motto that reflects that goal, "The last to let you down".

The MOS originated from the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War I. At that time aircraft airframes were made of wood and canvas. Personnel who maintained and repaired these airframes were accomplished in the skill of sewing various fabrics. Since a parachute is made of fabric material, they were also given the responsibility of caring for the pilot's parachute.

To help train these personnel in the proper care and preparation of the parachute, a parachute riggers school was opened in Lakehurst, N.J., in 1922.

Eventually, metal replaced the airframes of wood and canvas, and the job of maintaining both the airframe and the pilot's parachute was broken down into two different MOSs.

The present day Aircrew Survival Equipmentman is not only tasked with servicing the pilot's parachute, but also any other item of equipment that deals with the survival of the aircraft's pilot and crew, to include such items as: life rafts, life vests, signaling devices and auxiliary oxygen supplies. To learn how to maintain such a vari-

ety of equipment, students must spend 16 weeks at the Aircrew Survival Equipmentman "A" School which moved from Lakehurst, N.J., to Millington, Tenn., in 1990.

"Our base's Paraloft has some of the most knowledgeable individuals in the field. Each one is a highly dedicated professional who takes their job seriously. That's because they know it's that equipment they maintain that will be depended upon by a pilot in a crisis situation. They know there can be no room for error," said Cysgt. Paul Bruchman, aviation life support systems division chief.

Paraloft Marines keep a running computer inventory of what equipment is in storage, what is being serviced and what has been issued to each of the four squadrons presently aboard the base.

"Quality control is paramount and the computer helps to ensure that each piece of equipment is checked within a certain time period," explained Bruchman.

Though their career field is a small one, only 640 Marines strong, the Paraloft has a large responsibility. Every Marine Corps aviator relies on them to truly not let them down.

## Despite rain, SkateSafe Race rolls on

The race was on ... the race was off? The SkateSafe Race held aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii March 5, was plagued with intermittent bouts of gushing water that temporarily held up the competition and planned entertainment.

The weather had not been cooperative and had already caused the race to be moved from its original date of Feb. 26. However, even the weather couldn't douse the high spirits of those who had come to test their skills and share in the fun of the fastest growing craze in Hawaii, in-line skating.

In-line skating or rollerblading has become one of America's fastest-growing sports. It has even been recommended for runners who want to prevent "ground-pounding" injuries. "We wanted to give people the opportunity to get together and 'show off' their skills and have fun. At the same time, we took the opportunity to teach them about the safety equipment and why it is important for them to use it every-time they put on their skates."

The race was open to the public, and participants ranged from 4 years of age to one "young" man who was 70. The competitors raced in division race sprints. Awards were given to each of the age groups.

In addition to the division races, there was a two section endurance race. The racers in the youth group completed three-fourths of a mile in

their distance race. The adults had to complete a 5 mile distance in their competition.

The 4th person to cross the finish line for the endurance race was Dick Mulkern. Mulkern is 70 years-old and has been rollerblading for the past 10 years.

"I was a cross-country skier," Mulkern said. "My friends that I skied with introduced me to rollerblading when it first came out. I was very interested, and have been doing about 10 miles a day ever since."

Mulkern doesn't just limit himself to skating though. His goal for his 60th birthday was to compete in 60 races, he actually competed in close to 70 races that year.

"I was involved in almost every race they had," he said. "Canoeing, biking, skating, straight running to triathlons. I love the challenge. I was really glad to hear the Marine base was hosting an in-line skate race. It was a really good course and if another race is held here I would enjoy participating again."

Volunteers were a big help throughout the day. Safety was the number one concern and the MCB Hawaii Safety Office was on hand to enforce the wearing of protective gear — helmets (bicycle helmets were allowed), elbow, wrist and knee pads, which helped keep the injuries on a minor level.

In addition to the races there was a "safety" fair, static displays, games, food booths, and entertainment provided by the Team Five-O, a racing team sponsored by Rollerblade and PowerBar.

Despite the drizzly weather everyone had a good time, many happy young faces lifted a trophy in the air, and already the in-line skating enthusiasts are asking, "When is the next one?"

## It wasn't the Tour de France but it has potential

## Lent is a time to renew commitment

I thought of this when I recently was reflecting on the pre-marital counseling I do. I question that because I wonder what happens to the other 50 percent that isn't given over to the marriage. I know they are talking about the sharing of household duties, but I sometimes feel that is how they see 'all aspects of their relationship including meeting each other's needs. The counsel that I give them is that a marriage has to be 100-100. That each individual has to give 100 percent of themselves to the relationship especially as it relates to knowing, understanding and meeting each other's needs. In fact a relationship is ready to move to the marriage stage when each individual no longer

cares about their needs being met but meeting the needs of the other person. Of course then they ask, How will my needs be met? Well, if each person is meeting the other persons needs then there should be mutual satisfaction in the relationship. It is when people hold back for themselves that relationships get into trouble. Commitment is an integral part of the fabric of our community. It gives focus and meaning to our lives and bonds us together into a community that is nurturing and responsible. If everyone is only committed to themselves then community breaks down. The core of community is the family with its center being the marriage. It is essential that the marriage be responsible and nurturing. This happens when we go beyond how we feel at the moment and work from the basis of our commitment to another individual. 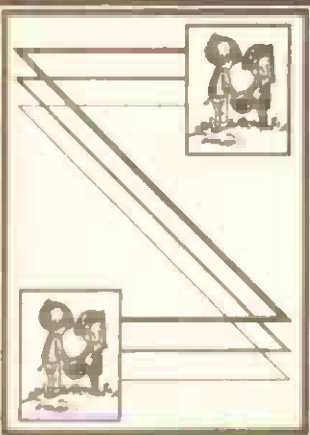

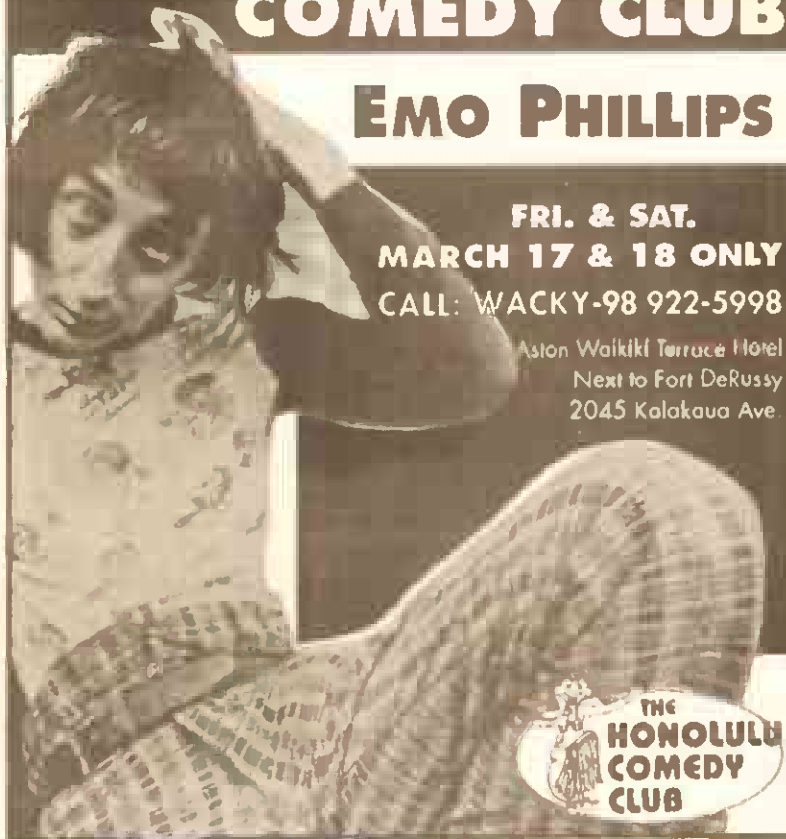

# Family Service Center

Once upon a time a child came into the world as a joyous, curious, and spontaneous creature, eager for adventure. This child was totally dependent upon others for his basic needs.

Although his parents wanted to provide everything possible, there were too many mouths to feed, too many bills to pay, and not enough time or energy for anything more than basic necessities.

The child quickly learned that survival required doing what he was told. He learned to blend in, to not ask for things.

When men or women are raised in this environment, can they feel good

about themselves? Can they learn to ask for what they need and avoid feeling ashamed for having these needs?

They may get married and expect a "magical cure," that their partner will know what they need and life will be wonderful! But life does not work this way. One person can not "fix" things for another. This can lead to even greater conflicts as each struggles to be happy in an unhappy situation. How can a person gain the power to have these needs met? By Empowerment.

"Empowerment" is a term which has been misunderstood by many people, especially when applied to counseling. Typically people turn to counseling as a last hope. They may have tried

everything, may feel helpless or hopeless, or think they have failed. So they seek counseling, thinking a professional may be able to "fix" the problem. However, to resolve conflicts for others is usually a mistake, and teaches what is already known: They are powerless. The problem could and should be handled by them. When they begin to understand this, they can help themselves.

When people are empowered, "hopeless helpless" thinking is replaced with the idea that they are capable and just need help to see better solutions. Often past solutions have failed because they thought to get what they

wanted, they had to win.

But to be a winner, someone has to be the loser. This approach will not be successful since both are determined to be "right."

In an empowered way of thinking, a plan is created to have a win-win solution. This can be quite a challenge when each is already feeling hurt and thinking if they give in on one issue it may require more giving and less getting in the future. It can be done.

Empowerment relies heavily on trust, the ability to accept people as they are, to believe change is possible, and to understand what can be accomplished. When people are empowered, they learn to accept

themselves, past and present, and to feel the fear and "do it anyway." Empowerment is a way for individuals to feel pride in who they are, regardless of their past experiences.

If you want to be empowered, there are many ways to begin. Counseling is available at the Family Service Center. There are self-help groups in both the military and civilian communities.

There are many books which cover this subject. One book you might want to read is "Principle-Centered Leadership" by Stephen R. Covey (1990, Fireside, Simon & Schuster). Perhaps the following quote offers the best summary of empowerment: "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach him how to fish and you feed him for a lifetime."
