Sailors from Waterfront Operations and Marines from Marine Helicopter Training Squadron-301 here rescued five scuba divers from the ocean when their boat capsized off the coast of Kekepa Island near Kaneohe Bay the afternoon of Oct. 26.

"We received a call from the coast guard stating that a 17-foot boat was being swamped by waves," explained Navy CWO3 Richard E. McDonald, commanding officer, Waterfront Operations. "We dispatched three of our boats to go out there and find it."

A cellular phone call, placed by a crew member of the despaired vessel, misdirected rescuers from their actual location; prompting a helicopter from HMT-301 to assist in locating the boat's crew. "We were flying a training mission in a local pattern, when we received a call from the tower that a boat was in distress," said LtCol. George J. Whitlock, pilot of the helicopter. "The boat had capsized, and they were out in the water. We located them, and were preparing to deploy a safety raft when the boats from Waterfront Operations arrived."

Navy Petty Officer Second Class Kenneth S. Wasserman explained a civilian boat helped by picking up three members of the crew while the remaining two members were loaded onto one of rescue boats.

Rescue crew members Petty Officers Third Class James R. Larson, Scott A.

Chavez and Rodney Sortor worked to tie a towline to the capsized boat. Once secured, the team began towing the capsized vessel to shore, but their efforts were cut short when the towline was caught in the motor. With a damaged engine, the rescue boat had to be towed in by one of the others, and

the capsized vessel was abandoned. "The seas were three to five feet easy, and we couldn't afford to damage another boat," said McDonald. "What I'm looking at is getting the lives back."

After the crew had been safely returned to shore, Waterfront

Operations received another call from the Coast Guard, who expressed their concern about the oil and gasoline aboard the capsized vehicle. In an effort to safeguard the environment, Waterfront Operations returned the following day, righted the craft, and towed it to shore.

## Marines return to Guadalcanal to honor Marine WWII pilot

United States Marines landed at Henderson Field on Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands once again Oct. 24, exactly 53 years to the day from the last major Japanese offensive to re-capture this strategically vital landing strip.

This time, there was no hail of bullets that so often greeted Marine infantry and aircraft at Henderson Field 53 years ago. Instead, the Marines were greeted by senior ministers of the government of the Solomon Islands, a Police Honor Guard, and rousing music from the Solomon Islands Police Band.

The Marines came to join the family of Maj. Lofton Henderson and Solomon Islanders in honoring the man for whom Henderson Field is named. And they came to remember the longest and possibly most important battle of the Pacific Campaign of World War II.

Led by the Marine Corps' deputy chief of staff for Aviation, LtGen. Harold W. Blot, the 11 Marines supported the dedication of an USMC Historical Division-constructed display and a bronze plaque honoring Maj. Lofton Henderson. Medal of Honor recipient and Marine ace Col. Jefferson DeBlanc and Maj. Bill Fisher, a raider with the famed 2nd Raider Battalion during the battle for Guadalcanal, were also on hand to witness the dedication.

As commanding officer of Marine Dive Bomber Squadron (VMSB)-241 at the Battle of Midway in early June 1942, Maj. Henderson was killed leading his squadron against overwhelming odds to halt the Japanese advance to Hawaii.

Also in June 1942, American intelligence detected Japanese construction of an airfield on the lush north-central plain of Guadalcanal in the Solomon Island chain. The airfield would allow the Japanese to control the South Pacific and threaten sealanes to Australia and New Zealand.

The 1st Marine Division landed on Guadalcanal Aug. 7, 1942, to capture the airfield for the Allies. This was the first American offensive operation of the war. On Aug. 20, the first Marine aircraft landed at the field. In honor of Maj. Henderson, Leatherneck aviators dubbed it "Henderson Field". The battle would last six months, with the outcome in doubt until late November.

On Oct. 26 at the airfield, more than 100 Solomon Islanders joined the Henderson family, the Marines, Guadalcanal veterans, Australians, New Zealanders, and even some Japanese veterans at the display and plaque dedication for Maj. Henderson. Against a backdrop of mist-enshrouded mountains, the Marine Forces Pacific Band Brass Quintet joined the Solomon Island Police Band to play the national anthems and martial medleys, while the MarForPac Color Guard

## S. Korea president visits Hawaii, meets with Pacific Command

A 21-gun salute echoed through Halawa Heights in tribute of South Korean President Kim Young Sam's visit to the headquarters of U.S. Pacific Command at Camp Smith Oct. 26.

Kim visited the command during a two-day visit to Hawaii aimed at strengthening military ties between the Republic of South Korea and the United States.

Kim, escorted by Adm. Richard

Macke, commander-in-chief, Pacific Forces, arrived at Bordelon Field where they each addressed various VIPs, members of the local and foreign media and a joint component formation of more than 450 military personnel.

Adm. Macke, speaking through an interpreter, praised the relationship of the two countries.

"Your visit is symbolic of the vibrant security relationship that our countries share, and a strong bond between our magnificent armed forces," said Adm. Macke. "These bonds forged in

combat 45 years ago now represent the essence of true partnership. Our common values and interests form the bedrock for that solid relationship."

The comments were noted by Kim with a nod of agreement as Adm. Macke finished his address by thanking Kim for his resolute support for the United States presence in East Asia and to the people of the Republic of Korea for being gracious hosts to American military forces in South Korea.

# Every Clime and Place Marines, Bulgarian forces train together

VARNA, Bulgaria — U.S. Marines would have been an unwelcome sight in this Black Sea port city five years ago.

In late September, however, Marines were not only able to be America's ambassadors to a nation which has never before trained with the U.S. military, but through the Partnership for Peace program, they were able to show the Bulgarian forces why they are known as America's 911 Force in Readiness.

Marines of the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit (Special Operations Capable) conducted an open exchange of information about noncombatant evacuation operations with several Black Sea nations, including the host nation of Bulgaria. Fox Company, Battalion Landing Team 2/6 and MEU Service Support Group 26 were able to be America's forward-deployed teachers.

The exercise was set up to show Bulgarian forces how Marines overcome obstacles often encountered in peacekeeping operations, as well as display the MEU's ability to evacuate per-

sonnel. Marines had to work through a language barrier as they processed evacuees to search for hidden contraband, injured personnel and lack of identification.

The language barrier was one thing which couldn't be artificially injected into prior exercises, said Sgt. Jimmy Simmons, Evacuations Control Center chief.

"Getting people to understand what you needed them to do was tough," Simmons explained. "We didn't have any regular interpreters so a lot of what we had to do was communicated through hand and arm signals. In our testing phases, the controllers threw that scenario at us, but it's hard to simulate. In Varna, we knew they couldn't understand us."

Marines gave their counterparts a close look at their NEO capabilities by using about 50 Bulgarian soldiers as evacuees. The close-up view put the Marines under a microscope more so than they had experienced in any of the testing phases during their work-up training.

"There was a lot of mental stress involved with the exercise that I don't think many Marines counted on," said Cpl. Frank Long, Shore Party Platoon, MSSG-26. "We were all trying to do our best to further the impact of what Marines do. We were careful about making sure we were thorough with searches and followed our standard operating procedures to the letter."

Many Marines found their new allies' reaction to them to be much different than anticipated, Long added.

"It was uneasy at first not knowing what to expect from them and what they might expect from us," he said. "Once we got past the initial culture shock of working alongside people who used to be our enemies, the operation went just the way we've trained. It was good to be familiarized with a force we've never worked with before."

The Partnership for Peace exercise evoked a professionalism which came through the realization which the Marines were considered the duty experts on the matter, Simmons said.

"I didn't really consider how countries

like Bulgaria view us as the experts," he said. "By being professionals, the Marines lived up to that image. They were constantly watching our every

move, how we executed every portion of the operation. It really hit home about what a good reputation Marines carry." (Sgt. Mark D. Oliva, 26th MEU(SOC))

The suspects have been indicted by Japanese officials and remain in their custody. A trial has been scheduled for Nov. 7. (CPAO, Okinawa)

# Helping hands for victims of domestic violence

For many, home is a refuge from the obstacles and pressures of the outside world, a safe haven — but for an estimated 3 to 4 million women in America, home is a prison where the peace is shattered and the walls hide the violence which lies within.

"Those walls, coupled with threats and abuse can make a person feel isolated," said Debbie Hauhio, victim advocate, Family Service Center. "What I do is reach out and open the door. I let them know what their options are and that I'm there to support any decision they make."

The victim advocate position was established in 1993 as part of the Coordinated Community Response here. The CCR was established as a means to successfully intervene and prevent domestic violence.

"I am the voice for the victim," Hauhio said. "But it's a partnership, not 'I know the best answer' because each case is different. Too often, the system can reduce the victim to what's been done to them. This is wrong. The victim is also a mother, a father, a daughter, a son, a worker — a whole person. I try to learn everything I can about the whole person. It's a new case, a new victim, with new concerns."

"In a crisis it's hard to see what options there are," she continued. "I provide them with the information they need to make a choice. I let them know their rights and legal options as well as other courses of action. I also make sure they understand any ramifications there might be. It is always difficult to make a decision. 'Should I stay, should I leave, should I seek legal action, what will happen?' they ask. I can't make that choice for them, they have to do it on their own. I just make sure they understand the choices and I support their

decision — whatever it may be."

For many people, one of the biggest questions is "Why do they stay?" Hauhio said. "Unless a person has personal experience of victimization it's difficult for them to fully understand the painful reality and consequences that victims of domestic violence face."

Hauhio explained how the abuser uses emotional, social, and economic situations to control the victim. "And then there's the physical threat. Whether it's toward them or the threat to hurt others."

In Hawaii during 1994, there were 24 deaths related to domestic violence, she said. In many of the cases, the victim had left or was trying to leave.

"It's the most dangerous time for the victim," Hauhio continued. "That's why it's so important the victim make the decision — they're the ones who are taking the risk."

"Because of the high risk, one of the first

things I do is work with them on a safety plan," she said. "It's like preparing for a hurricane. You don't want one to occur but you need to know what to do if it does. I also provide them with information and referrals to agencies that can help. I don't give advice — I just assist by helping them explore their options and informing them of any ramifications."

The meetings can take place in the victim's home, or in a neutral area. "Anywhere they feel comfortable," she said. She also explained she gives information over the phone. "Sometimes people call and won't give a name — and that's fine. At least I can give them some information that will help them know the options that are out there. Sometimes they just need to know someone really cares."

An EOA's primary function is to advise and assist commands and commanders on all matters relative to equal opportunity and sexual harassment.

The EOA program was established two years ago and was initially designed to provide commands/commanders with a useful tool in further developing sound and effective command equal opportunity programs. Since then, the EOA program has been expanded to cover all aspects of equal opportunity and sexual harassment training and education at every level of command.

The selection of qualified staff NCOs to become EOAs requires a careful review and consideration of each application for the program. Upon selection as an EOA and prior to assignment, the selectee attends a 16-week course at the Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute at Patrick Air Force Base, Fla. The course utilizes intense training methods which ensure that EOAs will be

prepared to advise and assist in all aspects of equal opportunity by creating an environment which promotes harmonious relations within the command.

The functions and responsibilities associated with the EOA program offers staff NCOs a unique opportunity to demonstrate their skills and knowledge in a challenge-filled environment. Currently, HQMC is soliciting applicants to serve three-year tours as EOAs. Applicants must be gunnery sergeant and above, although in some cases staff sergeants will be considered. Selected applicants will attend the equal opportunity advisor course at DEOMI and, upon completion, will be assigned to a major installation.

Macke for his positive support of the countries' relations, Kim responded in his own address, translated by an interpreter.

"I'm extremely happy today to be able to visit the headquarters of the Pacific Command which has played a main role in numerous great victories," said Kim. "I'm also happy to meet the men and women of the Pacific Command who had not hesitated to serve and make sacrifices for peace and security of the Korean Peninsula for the past 40 years, including your service in the Korean War," he continued.

"You are our comrades in arms. We'll never forget that you have shed blood and sweat with the Korean people," said Kim, who in July along with U.S. President Bill Clinton dedicated the Korean War Memorial in Washington, D.C.

More than 36,000 U.S. military per-

sonnel serve in Korea under the Pacific Command, helping provide peace and security for the Asian Pacific region.

"The active and generous support of the American people and dedication exemplifies the American officers and military personnel largely responsible in turning South Korea into what it is today. Particularly the Pacific Command has played a decisive role in maintaining the peace in the Korean Peninsula," said Kim. "I would like to take this opportunity to express to you the heartfelt gratitude of the South Korean people," he concluded.

After his address, Kim received applause for his comments and departed via motorized caravan complete with police escort to a private office call with Adm. Macke and a tour of Pearl Harbor.

Prior to his address at Camp Smith, Kim laid a wreath at the dedicatory stone at Punch Bowl National Cemetery. The cemetery is the final resting place for more than 1,200 veterans of the Korean War.

# Kilo Co. 3/3 strikes from the air in Okinawa

## GAIT is part of staying prepared for deployed Marines

Marines from Kilo Company, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, used air support to insert into a landing zone and destroy enemy electronic warfare equipment recently during a Ground-Air Integrated Training exercise at the Northern Training Area.

The destruction raid exercise joined groundpounders with air elements from Marine Corps Air Station Futenma.

AH-1J Cobra gunships from Marine Light Helicopter Attack Squadron 169 began the evolution by clearing the landing zone, said Capt. Patrick Kline, commanding officer, Kilo Co. Following close behind, CH-46 Sea Knight transport helicopters from Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 262 dropped Marines into the zone via fast-rope procedures.

There, raid force commanders linked up with a Surveillance Target Acquisition team, who informed them the initial jungle route was treacherous and time-consuming.

Opting for a back road, Marines humped three kilometers to secure an extract zone and insert a mortar section.

The company then traveled another three kilometers to the objective rally point, and after recon of the enemy communications site, converged on the objective and executed a successful assault.

The evolution ended when CH-53 Sea Stallions from Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 465 and Sea Knights from HMM-262 picked the

Marines up at the extraction site.

Kline said the training gave his Marines an outstanding education.

"We need to continue putting emphasis on this GAIT package," said Kline. "The Marines learn the standard operating procedures around helicopters and they get to see and experience all the assets that support them."

LCpl. Jason Ziegler, a team leader for 2d platoon, K Co., agreed. "This is the first time I've done a raid where we've had Cobra gunships flying air support," Ziegler said. "Fast-roping in and setting up the LZ added to the realism."

The destruction raid was one of four raids conducted by the company during the week-long GAIT package. The company also seized an airfield on Ie Shima island, raided a "combat town," and executed a Tactical Recovery of Aircraft and Personnel mission.

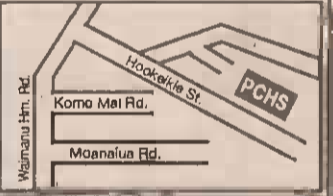

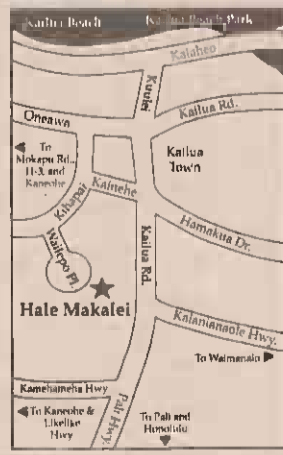

 posted colors alongside a Solomon Islands Police Color Guard.  
 "The name 'Henderson Field' became increasingly famous around the world as opposing forces struggled to keep and control the vital airstrip," said the Solomon Islands Minister of Home Affairs, Nathaniel Supa, who led a long list of speakers. "This site should be preserved and commemorated as an important part of our past."  
 U.S. Ambassador Richard Teare read from a speech delivered that day on the floor of the U.S. Senate by Senator John H. Chaffee (R-R.I.) "... it is fitting that this airfield, which stood as a beacon on this island, as a watchtower of freedom for which so many brave men fought and died, be dedicated to the memo-

ry of one brave Marine who gave his life so that we all might enjoy the fruits of democracy — Lofton Henderson."  
 "The name 'Henderson Field' is precious to the U.S. Marine Corps," said LtGen. Blot. "It's a vital part of our history, and we are honored to part of this important commemoration."  
 "The battle was the turning point of the war," said retired Marine BGen. Fred Henderson, brother of Maj. Henderson and a Guadalcanal veteran with the 2d Marine Division, at the dedication ceremony. "It started as a minor action and became a deciding factor in the victory of the war."  
 BGen. Henderson and his three sons — Lofton, Bill, and Paul — concluded the ceremony by unveiling the display and plaque which will be permanently placed in the terminal of Henderson International Airport

upon its completion in 1997.  
 The crowd which had gathered to watch eagerly accepted nearly 1,200 Historical Division books on the Guadalcanal campaign handed out by the Marines. Many attendees were satisfied simply to shake hands and pose for pictures with the Marines.  
 The ceremony was part of a three-day program for the Marines from Hawaii. Between rehearsals and historic battle site tours, the brass quintet played three concerts to Solomon Island crowds of up to 400. In one concert at the capital city of Honiara, the dust at the usually bustling market place settled as hundreds of shoppers left the stalls to listen to the quintet.  
 "Most of us have never seen an American band," said Leonard Iro, a merchant in the Honiara market. "The Marines honor us by traveling

so far to visit our country."  
 For the Marines, the visit was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to walk hallowed ground on one of the most famous battle sites in Marine Corps history.  
 "It's an overpowering feeling to stand on the same ground that so many Marines fought and died for," said Sgt. Raymond Archibeque, non-commissioned officer in charge of the color guard. "The memory of having the privilege to visit this place will remain with me the rest of my life."  
 Nearly 1,200 Marines were killed in the Guadalcanal campaign. By the end of the campaign, 23 Marine squadrons, 16 Navy squadrons, and five Army squadrons were operating from Henderson Field as part of the famous "Cactus Air Force." The field would be used by U.S. and Allied air forces through the end of World War II.

# First female pilot soars to tactical squadron

Notch up another first in Marine Corps history Sept. 26, when 1stLt. Sarah Deal completed her 53rd and final flight hour here as the first female Fleet Replacement Air Squadron combat pilot with Marine Helicopter Training Squadron 302.

Some swore it couldn't be done, while others waited and observed with much skepticism, but the 26-year old Pemberville, Ohio native will fly the Corps' premier troop carrier — the CH-53E Super Stallion helicopter.

She is assigned to her first tactical squadron, Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 466.

"I feel great about going to a tactical squadron. I hope it goes as it went at HMT-302," she said. "As with any new job, I wonder what it's going to be like. But I'll be going over there with three to six of the pilots and friends I've trained with, which should help. I love flying the CH-53s. I'm enjoying what I'm doing."

"Ever since I was about eight or nine years old, I used to ride my bike down to the air field in my neighborhood to watch remote-control aircraft land and take off — I always wanted to fly," Deal continued. "I started my venture in aviation by joining the young explorers while a high school junior, and worked in an airport for about five years."

"I thought it was a unique experience to train a female pilot," said Capt. Ronald S. Kimbrough, quality assurance officer and CH-53 instructor pilot, HMT-302. "Deal was a normal student who did what any

student would do. She made the same types of mistakes any CH-53 student pilot would make. There is one standard the Marine Corps has set for all CH-53 pilots, to adequately handle and fly the helo and troops/equipment safely and proficiently. She has come up to the standards set by the Marine Corps."

Sgt. Charles L. Venegoni, CH-53E crew chief, HMT-302, explained his feelings about flying with a female pilot. "I slipped up a couple of times and called her 'sir,' but other than that, it's the same as flying with a male pilot. Training new pilots, whether they're male or female, doesn't make a difference."

"The biggest thing I want people to know is that I'm a Marine and am going to be doing the same things as any Marine," Deal pointed out. "My philosophy to everyone is treat me like they treat any fellow Marine. I've flown with numerous pilots, including the squadron commanding officer, and felt comfortable with all of them. Everyone has different techniques and standards I've learned from."

Other HMT-302 permanent personnel and students voiced their feelings about how Deal fit in.

"She was treated like any other student pilot and performed as well as, if not better than, her contemporaries throughout her training," said Navy Lt. Mark A. Joynt, unit information officer and Human Affairs officer, HMT-302.

"I think she's going to have many challenges ahead of her," said LtCol. Gerald L. Yanello, commanding officer, HMT-302. "First, as a Marine pilot in general, and secondly, all pioneers haven't had it easy,

especially with her being the Corps' first female aviator.

"The CH-53 is the toughest helo anyone can fly, and she's handling it well," Yanello continued. "To me, a Marine is a Marine. I don't care what gender they are when assigned to work with me or for me."

"We just look at her as being another Marine pilot here to do her job," said 1stLt. Dan E. Simpson, fleet replacement CH-53 pilot, HMT-302.

Despite her apprehension, Deal's new commanding officer wants her to leave her fears behind.

"I look forward to having her assigned to my squadron," said LtCol. Robert G. Garrison, commanding officer, HMH-466. "I see her as a Marine officer who has earned her wings as any other pilot has. I've flown with a lot of female naval aviators before, and they did just as well as their male counterparts. The spirit of competition Deal brings to this male-dominated flying club is something we look forward to, and we welcome her aboard."

Deal is the daughter of Richard and Marjorie Deal. Deal's father, who served as a Marine military policeman during the 1950s, commented on his daughter becoming the first female Marine pilot.

"No one gave her any hand-outs. She did it herself," he said. "She just happened to be at the right place at the right time."

Although both parents said the prospect of their daughter flying in combat scares them, they stand squarely by her decisions.

"If this is what makes her happy, then it makes us happy. This is what she loves," Marjorie Deal said.

It looks like Chris Webber, the Washington Bullets forward, former NBA Rookie of the Year, and pretty darned good hoopster, might just be a big flop as a pro. It has happened time and time again in professional sports that an incredibly talented athlete, with all of the promise in the world, just can't make it in the big show. What makes me pick on Webber? He's hurt again. "So what," you say, "plenty of players get hurt." That's true but...

I can't even remember anything he did in the pros, but then again I might have blinked and missed his whole career.

I shouldn't really blame these guys for all of their problems. They are performers in a big business and other people have invested huge sums of money in their athletic abilities. And when the investment doesn't reap any benefits, everyone involved gets extremely worried, angry, and frustrated. As you can imagine there is a lot of outside pressure on these guys. Add to the mix their own pride as a great athlete, and some very poor decisions can be made.

## Guadalcanal revisited by Hawaii Marines during commemoration

Twelve Marines recently got the chance to visit the battle sites of a campaign fought long ago.

The construction of a Japanese airstrip on Guadalcanal in the Solomon Islands during the summer of 1942 was the catalyst that plunged the Marine Corps into one of the most famous campaigns of World War II.

The U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff feared allowing Japan to complete the airstrip would threaten Australia and could cut vital supply and communication lines from the United States. It was decided at least a division was needed to secure the island. The code-name for the operation was Watchtower and the 1st Marine Division, led by MGen. Alexander Vandegrift, was selected to land on Guadalcanal.

The landing occurred at 6:41 a.m. Aug. 7, and no Japanese appeared to repel the Marines. Marines began patrolling, and it would not be long before the Japanese began attacking. The Marines completed the airfield's runway with captured Japanese gear, and on Aug. 12, the first American plane landed on what became known as Henderson Field.

By the end of the campaign, nearly 1,200 Marines had been killed and 3,000 wounded in combat. Malaria also claimed a heavy toll. By November 1942, approximately one-third of the 1st MarDiv was unfit for duty due to malaria and malnutrition. Despite the casualties, the Marines were successful in keeping Henderson Field, and the victory became a turning point in the war.

Recently, 12 Marines from Marine Forces Pacific traveled to Guadalcanal to participate in a ceremony at Henderson Field. The four-day visit provided an opportunity to visit battle sites that have become legendary in Marine Corps history. LtCol. Joseph Mueller (USMCR), an author and noted Guadalcanal historian, along with John Innes, an Australian businessman working on Guadalcanal, guided the visiting Marines to the various battle sites. The Solomon Island Ministry of Tourism also provided guides and vehicles for the trek.

Humidity and stifling heat added to the almost surreal setting of some of the fiercest fighting in the Pacific. The fighting never stopped because of weather, but the tour was delayed by a day due to a record-breaking 4 inches of rain. Swollen rivers dyed the coastal waters and fresh water supply brown, and it quickly became apparent a key to enjoying Guadalcanal is knowing where to purchase fresh water. The stores in the larger hotels in the town of Honiara (the capitol) sell bottled water, but heavy rain during the trip closed the store for a day. The clouds parted the next day and revealed the

ridgelines, dense jungle and deep gorges which were so viciously contested 53 years ago.

The first stop was skyline, a huge memorial of marble and concrete which offers an unobstructed view of many of the battle sites. From there, the Marines headed to the Gifu and Hill 27. This was the last stand for Japanese forces prior to their withdrawal. The Army's 2nd Battalion, 35th Infantry fought Japanese who were committed to holding on to the end.

Upon arrival at the Gifu, the visiting Marines were greeted by local villagers eager to lead the Marines up an overgrown trail that led to the top of Hill 27. The villagers took the Marines to a spot recently uncovered by heavy rains. Skeletal remains, along with a mortar round and bits of rusted equipment were found.

Photos were taken and turned over to officials with Casualty Identification Laboratory at Camp H.M. Smith.

Throughout the battle site tours, fox holes, ammunition casings, helmets, and parts of weapons could

be seen lying about or proudly displayed in local villages. When the Marines left Hill 27, villagers had fresh coconuts waiting to pass out to the thirsty leathernecks.

Bloody Ridge, also known as Edson's Ridge, was the next stop on the historical tour. Bloody Ridge overlooks Henderson Field and in September 1942, the Japanese mounted an offensive to take this crucial ridgeline. If the Japanese succeeded in controlling bloody ridge it would have given them a great advantage in advancing on to Henderson Field.

LtCol. Merrit Edson's Raiders succeeded in defeating MajGen. Kawaguchi's forces. By the end of the battle, 31 Marines had been killed. The Japanese lost 600 soldiers. Coincidentally, the Marines met Kawaguchi's daughter, Akiko, during their tour. She was on the island with a group of

visiting Japanese war veterans. The day-long tour concluded at the site of the battle of the Tenaru. The snaking brown Alligator Creek, mistakenly labeled Tenaru on maps, spills into the ocean through a mangrove forest. Some of the fiercest fighting of the campaign occurred at Alligator Creek. The Marines suffered 34 dead, while the Japanese, using human waves in an attempt to overrun Marine positions, lost 800.

The following day, Marines had the opportunity to see Japanese troop transports that had run aground on the beaches of the island. The Marines were also taken to an outdoor war museum at the village of Vilu. The museum is primarily an airplane graveyard. The rusting airframes of Corsairs and Wildcats dot the well-manicured lawns.

"Marines are trained to fight in rough conditions, but visiting these sites has given me renewed respect for the Marines who battled on Guadalcanal," said Sgt. Jason Edmonds, Marine Forces Pacific Band. "It was a moving experience for me to walk on the same land so many Marines fought and died on."

Also included on the tour from the Marine Forces Pacific Band was SSgt. James Mann, Cpl. Bradley Niblock, Cpl. John Peacock and Cpl. Philip Cady. The MarForPac Color Guard included Sgt. Raymond Archibeque, Sgt. William Thomas, LCpl. Andrew Ratajczak and LCpl. Gordon Ladds.

These sites are all open to the public and visitors are encouraged to go. Getting to Guadalcanal, however, is expensive and flights from Hawaii must connect from Australia or Auckland, New Zealand. Those who are willing to venture to the remote Islands will find that the people are friendly and proud of the place they occupy in World War II history.

# 4th annual biathlon hits the mark

Company C, 1st Battalion, 3rd Marines dominated the fourth Hawaii Military Summer Biathlon here Friday.

The company fielded five teams, which placed first through third and eighth and tenth. Team two had a corrected time of 26:46, Team three was second in 27:28, and Team one came in at 27:45.

"This was rough," said Team one's Troy Lenhardt, who finished 13th overall in a field of 60 competitors. "I pushed myself to get a good result."

The biathlon consists of a one-mile run, shooting 10 rounds at a target from the kneeling position at the 200-yard line, another one-mile run, 10 more rounds shot from the standing position, and another one-mile run, all consecutively.

Arrayed in teams of four, participants had to wear camouflage utilities, boots, web belt with two canteens, and a maga-

zine pouch. They were also required to carry an M-16A2 rifle, giving the competition the aura of training, said Miles Okamura, athletic director, Morale, Welfare and Recreation.

"We modified the biathlon so it would take on a military tone," he said. The rules equalized competition; slow runners could make up seconds with accurate shooting, and poor shooters could rely on hard running to stay competitive. Hits on the black on the targets were each worth three second deductions from the kneeling position, and five seconds from the standing.

In keeping with the "ask no quarter, give no quarter" spirit of the competition, there were no weapons alibis, no ammunition alibis, and no excuses, especially not for Marines and Sailors used to grueling, physically-challenging training.

"This is about the same as the physical readiness test," said James Roberts, of Weapons Co., 1st Battalion, 3d Marines.

"Except the PRT is with the helmet and is three miles straight."

The course for the biathletes ran from the 200-yard line at the rifle range in the Ulupa'a crater and downhill to a point just before the landfill's fence, where competitors made their turnaround.

After the turnaround, competitors faced the daunting uphill portion, where the strong were separated from the meek, and sometimes, even the strong felt like the meek.

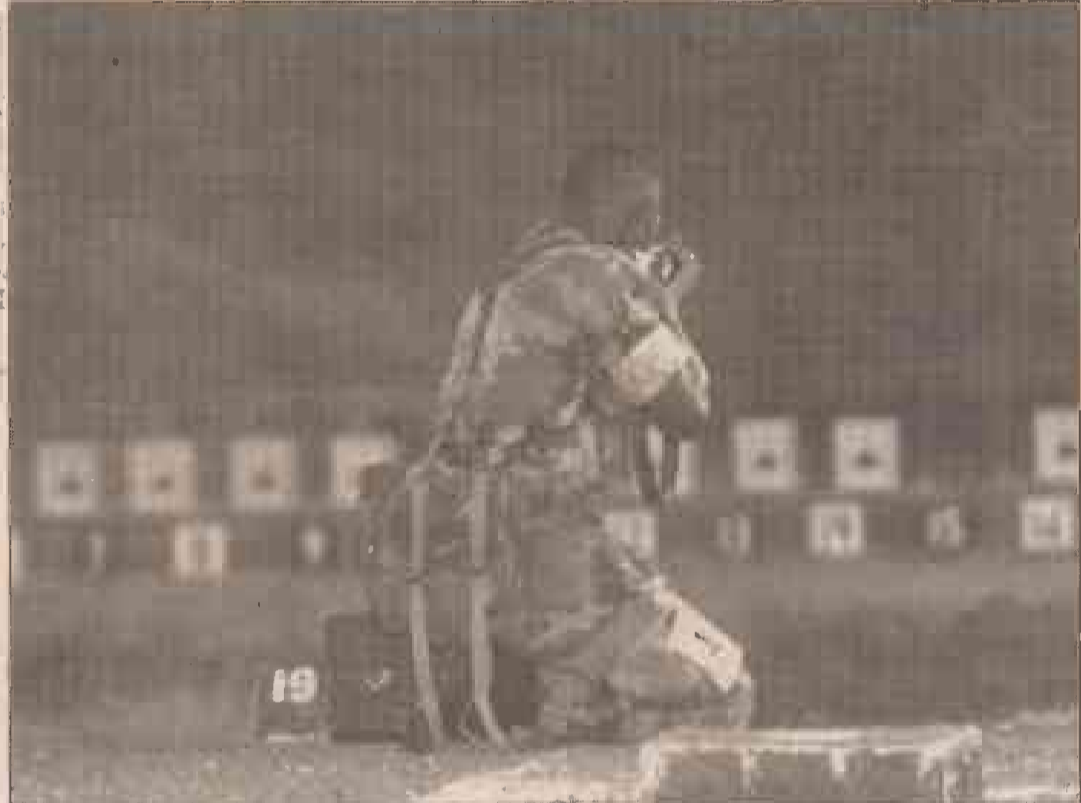
"That course was a butt-kicker," Roberts said. "I ran the Honolulu Marathon in 3 hours, 13 minutes, and put out more effort here than I did there."

Timing was a critical factor, however. Competitors in the first two heats, such as Disbursing's Paul Gulbrandsen, didn't have to contend with the sun.

"The run wasn't the hard part," he said. "It was the shooting."

More appropriately, it was breathing while shooting. Brian Lancioni, Disbursing, wondered about his accuracy. "I can't say how I did during the shooting," he said. "I was breathing very hard while I was on the firing line."

David Boyd, of Team two, was the first finisher overall, with an aggregate time of 29:15. Karen Goodman of Disbursing was the first and only woman finisher, with an adjusted time of 36:29.

# In-line skating — who's at risk from it?

The evolution of skating has given us one of the hottest and fastest-growing sports since skateboarding. It's called in-line skating, or "rollerblading." The fun is limitless, as long as the skater takes proper safety precautions, including wearing proper safety equipment.

It's estimated up to 83,000 people have taken a trip to the emergency room, because they didn't take proper safety measures. Protective gear is essential if one wants to avoid a trip to the doctor. A big mistake people make is not using their head as well as not protecting it. Always wear a helmet and make sure it meets ANSI standard Z90.4-1984. Most skaters tend to fall forward, so doctors see a lot of shoulder separations, fractured collarbones, broken arms and wrists, as well as a lot of road rash and asphalt burn.

Because of this and the fact one can attain speeds of up to 25 mph or more, skaters should wear elbow pads, knee pads, and wrist guards. Wear bright clothing so drivers as well as others see you.

Don't get bit by the "cool bug" and not wear protective gear. It's a lot better and less hassle to wear protective gear than a cast or brace.

Another important factor is skate selection. Check out your brakes. They should measure about an inch by two and half inches and be made of

solid rubber. Remember, as far as safety is concerned, stopping is just as important as going.

Next, take a look at the frame. It's the part that attaches the wheels to the boot. Make sure the frame is strong and rigid. Test the wheels and bearings. Make sure they spin smoothly and quietly. Soft wheels are better for outside use.

Avoid five-wheeled skates, three- or four-wheeled skates are recommended for recreational use. The fit of the boot is also important. The boot should be comfortable and have good ankle support. When trying on skates, make sure you're wearing the same type of socks you'll be wearing while skating.

Like all other sports, know your limits! Too many accidents are caused by skaters showing off or trying things outside their skill level. If you're a beginner, take some lessons or have an experienced skater help you before you skate on your own. One of the hardest things to learn is how to stop. It's better to learn the proper way — slowly — than to learn by using the "falling" or "running into something" method.

Be smart about where you skate and how you skate. If you're a beginner, skate on smooth, flat surfaces. Leave the hills and bumps to more experienced skaters. Avoid obstacles such as pot holes, slick or wet spots, grates, and other objects that will bring you to an unwanted stop. Make sure you have plenty of room to

skate. Stay out of the way of vehicles and pedestrian traffic, and use the bike lane where available. Tennis and handball courts are off-limits to in-line skaters. There is a skatepark available next to the tennis courts near the base theater.

Skating at night is prohibited and should be avoided off-base as well. Be alert and don't do or wear things that may impair your vision or hearing. Never use headphones while skating. If you're ever in a situation you feel uncomfortable about, take the skates off and walk. Better safe than sorry — or hurt.

After you get the basics, you can move on to more advanced variations of the sport, such as roller hockey. This sport is as fun as it is exciting. Playing safely is the only way to ensure the fun won't end. Follow the rules and always wear protective gear.

This includes a hockey helmet with face protection, mouth guard, elbow pads, hockey gloves, wrist guards, knee and shin guards, and the ever-so-important jock strap and cup. These items are required for league play and should be used when playing a friendly game with your pals.

Using your head and protective gear will keep you out of the hospital and on your skates, which is where all the fun is. If anyone has any questions about base regulations concerning in-line skating or safety precautions, please call me at 257-1830/1831.
