If you live in base housing here, Lyou can not light decorations adorning your yard or the exterior of your home until Dec. 15.

From Dec. 15 to Jan. 4. base housing residents may light outdoor decorations from 6:30 - 10 p.m. each evening, with the exceptions of Christmas and New Year's, when decorations can be left on until 1

Residents are only allowed to put lights on the front of their homes.

Lights are not allowed on trees, shrubs, or lawns, and for safety purposes, no lights are allowed on

Decorative lights must be removed by Jan. 4, or inspectors will issue citations for lights left up past that

These holiday lighting policies apply to families who live in Section 802 housing as well. Marine Corps families residing in other housing areas, including Camp H.M. Smith and Manana housing area should follow the policies announced for those areas.

GSA contract will increase readiness

In a measure expected to increase operational readiness and cost-effectiveness, the Base Motor Pool will take a new contract which will replace an aging fleet of Marine Corps vehicles with leased vehicles from the General Service Administration.

GySgt. Scott H. Trott, roadmaster for the motor pool here, said with the current contract, vehicles are repaired by the civilian employees who comprise the Motor Pool's repair center.

"There are only three mechanics, and they're so short-handed it isn't funny," Trott said.

State Rep seeks pet quarantine change

Military personnel who own pets, listen up: State Rep. Eve Anderson wants you to know she's taking on Animal Quarantine and the bureaucracy that runs it.

Her intent is to change the law regarding companion animal quarantine which requires all dogs and cats arriving from the mainland to be housed in a kennel for four months, sometimes in poor conditions. These animals, of which from 40 to 60 percent belong to military families, Anderson said, are quarantined because Hawaii doesn't want rabies, has never had rabies, and the state doesn't intend to get rabies.

Anderson understands this. What

state's requirement, for quarantine is so strict, when it doesn't have to be.

"I think 90 percent of the animals in quarantine don't have to be there," she said. "It's been shown companion animals who have had their shots don't come down with rabies. But we keep having to deal with myths and with the inertia of the system."

And systems such as animal quarantine, which has been in place 85 years, are slow-moving when it comes to change, and changing animal quarantine is tough to force even for a state representative such as Anderson. It is clear, merely from glancing around her office, she loves animals. Four elephant sculptures and a photo of elephants sits on her desk, and on her credenza are a photo of another elephant, a teddy bear cartoon, and a she doesn't understand is why the bumper sticker which reads "Let our

turtles live."

Her objective with animal quarantine, however, is to make the current system die. Anderson wants Hawaii to eventually go to the same system Japan has for animals brought to the country: if the animal has been proven to be inoculated and immune to rabies, an acute viral disease of the nervous system of warm-blooded animals, the pet can come in - no delay, no quar-

"We want to be able to test animals, and have them quarantined until the results come back from the test. If the animal is proven to be inoculated and immune to rabies, it should be free to go with its owner.

"Of course, with younger animals, especially dogs," she continued, "you don't know their immunity, so a young animal would have to be inoculated

and proven immune before it could go to its owner, and that could take more time. But not four months.

Anderson believes keeping rabies out of Hawaii is a great idea, and one she fully supports. But she wants to go even further; she asks in the remote possibility rabies happens to make it here through some other carrier, shouldn't companion animals here be

"Hawaii doesn't have a protected animal population," she said. "But there are some animals who can carry rabies that don't have to be quarantined, like horses and cattle. If one dies, the farmer might just burn it, but how can we be sure wild dogs or mongoose don't eat them? It's ridiculous to think that by quarantining companion animals, we'll keep rabies out of Hawaii

Marine Mail:

Direct mail to commandant provides answers concerning questions on housing for junior enlisted Marines and issue of 782 gear

Received from SSgt. Richard F. Rogina, Weapons Field Training Battalion, Camp Pendleton, Calif.:

One of the commandant's Planning Guidance questions about what we aren't doing that we should be doing? I think, and this would be a long-term project, we should make it a policy to have all sergeants and below moved into base housing. This would help in two ways:

•It would save the Marine Corps money on variable housing allowance that could be used to build new housing to accomodate all Marines.

• It would prevent a lot of financial burden sergeants and below incurred by moving off-base with the cost of living in certain parts of the country. Also, it would afford them the opportunity to save money for their future.

I know this idea would take some time, weighing pros and cons, but in the long haul, we would be taking care of our own. Answered by LtGen. J. A. Brabham, Deputy Chief of Staff for Installations and Logistics:

I am writing in response to your Marine Mail on the subject of family have suggested moving all sergeants and below into base housing to save bachelor allowance for quarters and VHA and ease the financial burden on junior enlisted Marines. Your concern for junior enlisted housing is on the mark. The Marine Corps Family Housing Campaign Plan, signed by Gen. Mundy in June 1994, dedicates most of our family housing resources to the junior enlisted population.

Most of our current emphasis on family housing is on revitalization or replacement of existing deteriorated housing. More than 85 percent of our revitalization and improvement effort is targeted to junior enlisted housing. Nearly all new housing construction for the next five years is also targeted to the junior enlisted population.

Department of Defense policy requires we rely on the local community as the principal source of family housing, That means many Marines of all ranks will continue to live in the local community. Also, moving all sergeants and below into our existing family housing

housing for junior enlisted Marines. You would displace other Marines who would then be entitled to BAQ/VHA payments. If this increased our housing costs, we would have less money available for new construction and housing revitalization.

> We continue to be concerned about the shortage of available and affordable family housing for junior enlisted Marines, particularly in high cost areas like California and Hawaii. For the forseeable future, the Marine Corps will continue to apply most of its family housing budget to the repair and construction of junior enlisted housing. Thank you for writing on this very important topic.

Received from Maj. B. A. Whitehouse Military Information Systems, HQMC. Whitehouse presented several suggestions to Marine Mail, and the following is a excerpt from the overall letter:

Individual issue of 782 gear.

There is absolutely no good reason why an individual Marine cannot. be permanently responsible for a major portion of his individual equipment. Equipment could be surveyed and reissued when unserviceable. When a Marine separates from our Corps his issue of equipment might go to a second-hand store for sale or to a reserve center to be used in time of mobilization, dependent on the condition of the gear. Gear which is resold would have to meet minimum standards to preclude certain cases of fraud. Or it might be less expensive, in the long run, to provide a routine allowance with which the Marine can maintain his equipment. I believe there is a study under way,

managed by the Studies and Analysis Division at Quantico, addressing this issue.

Answered by LtGen. J. A. Brabham, Deputy Chief of Staff for Installations and Logistics:

Thank you for your inquiry through Marine Mail concerning issuing 782 gear to individual Marines. The Installations and Logistics Department is currently working on a plan to issue individual equipment (782 gear) to every Marine. I&L has solicited comments from the fleet on a rough plan of action and milestones. The comments received will be invaluable in forming a proactive and successful plan. Using reference data, input from users, and the work produced by I&L's Campaign Plan working groups, we believe a fundamentally sound methodology for issuing individual 782 gear to Marines will be implemented.

Again, thank you for your interest and relevant comments in this important matter.

HRST swings through class

Gradually the six-man team is lifted into the air, suspended by nothing more than a single rope. In less than a minute, the field they took off from is now a small patch green below them. With the help of a CH-53D helicopter, they know what it feels like to

Suspended personnel insertion extraction is just one of the benefits of attending the helicopter rope suspension training course here.

"SPIE rigging is used for insertion and extraction of small units in areas where helicopters can't land," explained Sgt. Michael Lawson, chief instructor, Special Training Section, Combat Assault Company, here.

The two-week course, taught six times a year, teaches students the proper methods and procedures for safely rigging aircraft for the insertion and extraction of personnel, according to Lawson.

Each class, 20 servicemembers from other branches of service attend the

"Individuals who attend the class are usually attached to the Joint Task Force Full Accounting — a unit that searches for and retrieves the remains of unaccounted for servicemembers at Camp Smith," said Lawson.

The students are required to complete two phases of training - Static Tower Phase and the Helicopter Phase, said Lawson.

During the training the students will set up and make more than 100 rope descents from a tower or helicopter by either rappelling or fast roping.

This gives the students the opportunity to set up and use various insertion methods, and gives them confidence in their own abilities, according to Lawson.

"Fast roping (similar to sliding down a pole) is used for inserting a squad to platoon-sized unit depending on the size of the helicopter. The fast rope method is the fastest means of insertion," explained Sgt. Howard Lyons, HRST instructor, STS, CAC, here.

"Rappelling is slower but the individual is securely fastened to a rope via a

To complete the course, students are required to tie 10 primary knots blindfolded within 30 seconds, must master at least three people off a helicopter and score a minimum of 80 percent on a 50-question test.


"Because the students will be responsible for someone else's life in the future, those who can't meet the minimum requirements are dropped from the course," said Lawson.

When the five instructors are not teaching the HRST course every other month, they are kept busy cleaning and maintaining equipment and literally miles of rope.

Becoming a pilot can take a long time, but just learning to fly can only take a few short hours with the right equipment and a little instruction from a HRST master.

ROK Marine commander visits

Smith, Hawaii — Regarding a wide range of security-related issues, LtGen. Lee, Sang-Moo, commandant of the Republic of Korea Marine Corps, consulted with LtGen. J. D. Howell Jr., commander, Marine Forces Pacific. Topics included contingency planning for the defense of the ROK if deterrence fails on the Korean peninsula, and procedures regarding operations of the Combined Marine Forces Command.

The establishment of CMFC in 1992 gave both the ROK and U.S. Marine Corps a greatly expanded role in defense of South Korea as a "component" headquarters under the United Nations Command. If hostilities commence again on the Korean

MARINE FORCES PACIFIC, Camp H. M. Peninsula, the ROK Marine Corps and Marine Forces Pacific would combine to fully stand up CMFC, which would be augmented by units from other services as well.

In hostilities, CMFC would be commanded by the Commander of Marine Forces Pacific. During peacetime - called "armistice" conditions in Korea, since no peace treaty was signed following the 1950-53 Korean War - the CMFC commander is the commandant of the ROK Marine Corps.

LtGen. Lee fought with the ROK Marines along with U.S. forces in Vietnam. He has commanded both of the ROK Marine Corps divisions (1st and 2d), as well as the independent 6th Marine Brigade.





check-in and check-out of their BAS or BMC.

"Active duty Marines and Sailors are automatically enrolled in TRICARE Prime," said Navy Lt. Steve Tate, assistant clinic director at Kaneohe Bay. The check-in brief will inform service members why they have been enrolled, and why they should enroll their families in TRICARE Prime. The check-out brief will ensure they are disenrolled to avoid any disruption of medical claims at their next duty station, or once separated or retired from active duty.

"The biggest benefit I can think of to join TRI-CARE Prime is that if you get sick your costs will be almost nothing," Tate explained, "compared to TRICARE Standard or TRICARE Extra.

Under TRICARE Prime, each service and family member is assigned a primary care manager (PCM) who is akin to a personal physician who manages their wellness and preventive health care needs.

"[The military's benefit is that | this physician helps keep readiness levels at 100 percent for your unit's commanding officer," Tate added. Your PCM will ensure you've been cared for and are well.

Headquarters Battalion and the Marine Corps Air Facility have as their primary care managers a physician at the Branch Medical Clinic. III

Expeditionary Forces Leathernecks and Sailors have PCMs at their battalion aid stations.

"As an active duty service member [under TRI-CARE Prime], you have the right to seek care anywhere you want," Tate explained, "however, your unit must give permission." This benefit now allows Marines and Sailors who may live closer to clinics at other bases to be serviced by those clinics, instead of the BAS or BMC at Kaneohe Bay.

Still other changes inaugurated in October modify the existing TRICARE contract in other ways. Called the Uniform Benefits Package, it affects TRICARE Prime coverage in several ways. Among them, it 1) changes the enrollment process; 2) adds an enrollment fee for retirees, their families and survivors; 3) increases copayments to civilian providers; and 4) adds a Point of Service feature.

Previously, beneficiaries choosing TRICARE Prime were enrolled the day they signed up. Now there is a short waiting period. Enrollments received by the 20th of the month are effective the first day of the following month; enrollments received by the 21st or after become effective the first day of the second month following enrollment. Also, attendance at a TRICARE brief is mandatory, prior to enrolling in TRICARE Prime to ensure full understanding of the program.

Retirees and their families who choose TRICARE Prime now must pay an annual enrollment fee of

Hawaii \$460 for family coverage and \$230 for single cov- Hawaii Medical Service Association which adminerage, whether they choose a military or civilian health care provider. Installment plans or partial payment options are available to meet the annual

enrollment fee. Generally, TRICARE Prime enrollees can choose between a military or civilian provider, after the first four months of coverage. Yet, costs for outpatient care provided by civilian doctors have increased. Families in pay grades E-4 and below now pay a \$6 copayment for most outpatient visits; all others, retirees, their families, and survivors, pay a \$12 copayment per visit.

"I always try to encourage anyone on Prime to use the military treatment facility," said HM3 Cheryl Chavez, managed care coordinator at Kaneohe Bay's BMC. Outpatient care is provided at no cost at all military treatment facilities, she added. Copayments are only required when using civilian medical providers or during inpatient MTF treatment.

TRICARE's Uniform Benefits Package Point of Service feature will give TRICARE Prime enrollees the option to seek care from network or non-network doctors without an authorization. However, with the new benefit, substantial costs will be incurred when not seeking an authorized referral from the PCM and TRICARE health care finder.

The TRICARE Program complements the military's drawdown, according to Karl Kiyokawa, marketing and beneficiary service manager for the isters the Hawaii TRICARE contract. It is designed to create efficiencies and cost savings. Therefore, enrollment of active duty service members and other users into the TRICARE network will be the mechanism the DoD uses to staff and supply military treatment facilities.

As a whole, all the new changes - CMIP, the Uniform Benefits Package and the new check-in and check-out stops - may add more to an already lengthy list of procedures. Yet, as they concern health care, they only make the system better.

forever. Isn't it better we have a protected population?"

No matter; every animal is quarantined, regardless of its health record. Anderson's plan would eliminate the quarantine, and go to a system where pets get a microchip inserted in their necks by veterinarians. The microchips would include information about the pet's inoculations, and vets would be able to determine immediately the status of the animal's immunity. It would also eliminate any possibility of a tag switch.

Despite Anderson's "common sense" approach to the quarantine, the inertia of the system seems glacier-like to her. Anderson, however, feels she is about to melt the glacier.

want to hold my breath, but I think we'll see change within a year. This isn't just a problem of the way animal quarantine treats pets, it's also economic. Hawaii has lost high-level military people who won't come here because of the quarantine, and there are professional people, executives and chief executive officers who refuse to relocate here, just because of the quarantine. It's ridiculous."

Economics are affected not only in the money Hawaii doesn't get from people who refuse to come here, but in the cir-"The heat is on," she said. "I don't cle of money animal quarantine has become. Anderson said animal quarantine hasn't been audited in 17 years, so who knows what's going on?

"You have a lot of people trying to protect their turf," she said. "You have the animal quarantine people themselves, you have veterinarians who get business from animal quarantine, and you have 'sponsors,' who are people you can hire to take care of your pet while it's quarantined."

To take care of an animal at quarantine costs \$600, Anderson said. The sign-up charge for veterinarians can be up to \$75. Sponsors can charge whatever the market is willing to bear.

"Everyone has to be educated about the way the system works," Anderson said. "We have to be able to answer questions and counter rumors with facts. And the fact is, rabies is a prob-

lem that afflicts only wild animals and third-world countries.'

People with complaints about the quality of care at animal quarantine, where Anderson says handlers "aren't getting the leadership and training they should," should be sent to her in writing, or sent to the office of Governor Ben Cayetano. The issue of animal quarantine needs to stay hot,





"We just needed to settle down," said HQ coach Cedric Payton. "We didn't deal with their zone the way we should have."

"We were just playing a basic twothree zone," Ean Dervin, 1/3's coach, said. "We played the passing lanes and got a few turnovers, but the key was converting on the offensive end."

Besides playing the passing lanes, 1/3 also had a guard releasing on every shot, particularly

1/3 settled down, with Jones, who played the entire game, hitting a three and making a Scottie Pippenlike slam off a steal, stopping the



Fitness center has self-investment plan

Investment planning is everywhere. Among us are mutual funds, CDs and 401K plans.

The most beneficial investment one can make, however, is self-investment. Making the time to incorportate exercise into one's daily schedule largely increases the long-term goal for a healthy, strong body and clear, positive mental attitude.

Marine Corps Base Hawaii's fitness center, in building 1583, has the means to assist anyone interested in making a self-investment. The center is equipped with free weights, bench presses, Nordic-Tracks, treadmills, and the latest Nautilus machines.

Irving Williams, one of the four staff members, said the center recently received renovations.

"We just put in new stereo speakers, received more pins for the weight machines, and now.there are more instructional signs posted," he said. "After all, safety is paramount."

Scott Marlett and Paul Creighton, both with 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marines, work out five nights a week.

"This fitness center is great," said Creighton. "You never have to wait too long for a machine or free weights and the equipment always works."

Quick fixes will not maintain a better body or mind; a trip to the gym once a week won't make the grade. An individual must make up his or her mind that health and fitness are high priorities. Once that virtue is implemented, a fitness buff said, exercise is a sense of gratification.

"I have to keep a routine of three times a week," said Navy spouse Laura Slaughter. "If I skip a week, it's just that much harder to start back up. Besides, working out clears my thoughts, and physically, I feel great." Jered Mikol, Headquarters, 3d Marines, works out routinely for reasons beyond physical and mental release.

"About nine months ago, I ruptured three discs in my back at work. Coming to the gym enables me to slowly increase my strength."

The fitness center accommodates those with busy schedules. The hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. Weekend and holi-

day hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

MCB Hawaii is predominately male,
and inside the fitness center is no
exception. Some women may feel
intimidated with weight lifting or
working out in a room full of men, but
the atmosphere at the fitness center is
focused on one element: fitness. And
while men do outnumber the women,
neither party pays a mind.

"Less people are watching than you think," Slaughter said. "People here are serious about working out."

"I think it's great to see women here," Creighton said. "Anyway, this is the only place I can be near a woman and sweat and stink, and not be embarrassed!"

Any servicemember, family member, Department of Defense civilians, and Morale, Welfare and Recreation employee may use the fitness center. Anyone under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Williams said the busiest hours are between 4:30 and 9 p.m., and slowest hours are from 1 to 3 p.m. During the slow times, staff members quickly reorganize and disinfect the facility.

There is no membership fee to use the facility. The only investment you have to make is your time.

Marine varsity lose match up against Golden Eagles, 115-83

The Marines coach felt this was partially due to the man-to-man defense utilized in the first half of the game.



Hiking can be fun, safe; be prepared

Safety while hiking or camping cannot be overstressed. Each year, inexperienced or solo hikers get themselves into trouble and require assistance because they didn't plan ahead.

What a person carries in their head is the most important factor regarding safety. The Sierra Club says hiking safety can be summed up in two words: "preparation" and "prevention." It's brochure, entitled No Fear??? Hiker Safety is an excellent source of information on safety. The club also recommends getting a hiker's guide book. These are a great reference on specific trails and what to bring with you. Several books are available on the subject and can be purchased at any book store.

If you're not used to exercising on a routine basis, it is best to consult a physician before venturing out. Much of Oahu is rugged and mountainous. Expect it to be so, unless you know the route. Check the current weather and forecast for the time you will be out. Generally, the wettest part of the year is between October and April. Leave an activity/route plan with family or friends and even a note on the dashboard of your car. Include time of departure and estimated time of return.

Staying on established trails is very important. Many hikers who stray off trails become lost or disoriented. If this happens, try to retrace your steps, keep your wits about you and don't panic. Your best bet is to know where you are at all times.

Hawaii has no poison ivy or poison oak. However, some types of plants can be irritating and anything unfamiliar should not be ingested, rubbed into skin or used as a skewer.

Bringing proper clothing and equipment is part of good preparation. A backpack or waistpack must include

certain essential items. Adequate water is important. The Sierra Club recommends one liter; and two liters for "strenuous" hikes. If the weather is hot and especially humid you will be glad you took extra water, and chagrined if you didn't.

Exercise and fresh air are going to make you hungry. Include a sensible lunch such as a sandwich, fresh or dried fruit, fresh vegetables, energy bar or even candy. Sunscreen, insect repellent, toilet paper, whistle and signal mirror are nice to have when you need them, so take the time to consider these items.

Weather here can change dramatically from one area to the next but is generally stable all year in any particular place. If the hike you're going on involves going uphill, you'll become hot very quickly and won't be comfortable if you're over-dressed for the occasion. During the rainy season now, as a matter of fact — rain gear can be included. Materials such as wool, nylon, and polypropylene will generally tend to provide a degree of warmth, even when wet. Exposure to the elements has been a complication in many rescues. Don't delude yourself into thinking the temperature can't turn chilly at any time of the year because this is Hawaii, especially at higher elevations.

Good footwear is paramount. Particular type is up to your own discretion, but there are many good types of hiking boots available. Don't overlook military jungle boots, with their breathable fabric upper, drain holes, availability in just about any size, and open-lug sole as many trails can be wet and muddy.

There is a whole other world out there on all the Hawaiian islands just waiting for you to explore. If you think you've "done" Hawaii and only seen Waikiki, think again.

Marine competes in duathlon in Mexico

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Major Dave miles." Tierney recently returned home from Cancun, Mexico, where he competed in the World Duathlon Championships Nov. 5. Tierney completed the event in 2 hours, 1 minute and 50 seconds, placing 13th in the 40 to 44 age group of world competitors.

The Duathlon Championship, which out the world. attracted more than 1,000 competitors, consisted of a 6.2-mile run, a 25-mile bike race, and a 3.1-mile run. Although the race took place early in the morning, temperatures hovered around 90 degrees. Humidity of 90 percent and a strong wind forced many competitors to either drop out or experience heat-related muscle cramps due to dehydration. Tierney stated his last run was extremely difficult due to the heat.

"I had to walk twice during the last two miles because my legs were cramping so bad. I was in ninth place going into the last Marine Corps aide to the Chief of Naval run but lost four places in the last two

Tierney, who trained for this race since making the U.S. National Team in June, described the event as "overwhelming."

"This was my first international competition and it was great meeting other athletes from the United States and through-

"The support from the host nation was truly superb," he added. "The Mexicans would shout 'Go USA' and clap loudly as you went by. The level of competition was so competitive that any athlete could not help but be motivated by the event."

Tierney's goals for future competitions include placing in the top five in the 1996 World Duathlon Championships and within the top three at the Nationals.

Tierney is a Harrier pilot currently stationed at the Pentagon, where he is the Operations.

The Hale Koa Story

ort DeRussy was established in 1906 on a 72acre parcel of land in Waikiki that was considered very undesirable. Most of it was swamp land, duck farms, and taro patches. At that time, the Moana Hotel was the only hotel in Waikiki so there was not much activity in the area. Battery Randolph at the east end of Fort DeRussy (now an Army Museum) was completed in 1911. This extremely solid structure with walls 20-feet thick anchored 20-feet below ground level proved to be a very important factor in the construction of the Hale Koa Hotel many years later.

Although Fort DeRussy served as an important camp during World War I, it experienced anonymity in the years following. Most of the activity in Waikiki in the late 1920's centered around the brandnew Royal Hawaiian Hotel, and nobody paid attention to that Army post at the end of the beach on that undesirable piece of land.

World War II changed all this. During this war, Fort DeRussy served as a staging area for troops going in and out of the Pacific area. The Army headquartered at Fort DeRussy, while the Navy took over the Royal Hawaiian Hotel and other properties for troop deployments. Hundreds of thousands of men traveling between the Pacific areas became acquainted with Hawaii and Fort DeRussy. Housing was erected and the grounds became a beehive of activity. Quonset huts and temporary billeting

facilities were built as were exchanges. officers clubs, enlisted clubs, NCO clubs, and beach activity centers. However, even with all of this usage, Fort DeRussy still was not "desirable" enough for the grand military balls and official functions. These were reserved for the more refined facilities at Fort Shafter. Fort DeRussy remained as a "back room" to the Army.

Tremendous amounts of traffic continued through Fort DeRussy in the days of the Korean and Vietnam conflicts. Literally hundreds of thousands of servicemen and women passed through Hawaii on R & R. There was not enough room for everyone at Fort DeRussy, and facilities that existed were in marginal shape, but reunited loved ones still enjoyed their seven days of R & R in Hawaii. Vacationing military families comprised 25% of Hawaii's visitors at this time, so those unable to stay at Fort DeRussy were accommodated elsewhere in Waikiki.

In 1967 newspapers heralded a \$12 million recreation complex for Fort DeRussy. Plans called for a 12-story hotel with 416 double rooms. This facility was to have transient billeting, service clubs, an enlisted men's mess, an NCO mess, an officers' open mess, and an enlisted men's bath house. It would also boast a bowling alley, chapel, exchange, and theater. The article cited that this recreation center was badly needed, especially during the peak travel seasons. There were approximately 158 servicemen arriving in Hawaii every day for their week of R & R.

In reaction to this article, the city and county planning director stated no objection to the facility, and the hotel received endorsements from the Hotel Association, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Hawaii Visitors Bureau.

Plans were prepared, but it was still undecided how this project would be funded. Meanwhile profits from the Army and Air Force **Exchange Service** were accumulating from recreation activities in Vietnam. These "non-appropriated funds" were earmarked for use as welfare and recreation funds, not in Vietnam, but in other areas of "need" and "high usage." In March 1969, Secretary of Defense, Melvin Laird, notified Congress of the intention to finance and refurbish Fort DeRussy with this non-appropriated fund money. In other words, no tax money or appropriated funds were to be used to develop this recreation complex.

Bids for the construction of this brand-new facility on Fort DeRussy were solicited. The original site for the hotel was where the Battery Randolph still stands. Because of Battery Randolph's sturdy construction, it could not be destroyed without causing structural damage to the neighboring buildings. So, it was back to the drawing boards for redesign and relocation to the hotel's present site. The hotel's building contract was finally awarded in March 1973. It was then that the dramatic



change to Fort DeRussy occurred. Older buildings were demolished. About seventy truckloads of coral were brought in as landfill, and the beach was widened. What is now the sidewalk along the beach was once the waterline. Housing units were replaced with lawn and a tropical garden with varieties of banyan, different palms, fern, and flowering plants. Fort DeRussy quickly became an oasis among the evergrowing numbers of Waikiki hotels.

The Hale Koa celebrated its grand opening on Saturday, October 25, 1975. The Army's Outstanding Soldiers of the Year were flown in from all over the world to be among the first guests. A traditional Hawaiian blessing complete with a royal procession officially opened the hotel. Festivities on opening night included an elaborate cocktail reception and banquet with many island dignitaries in attendance.

Entertainment was provided by the best of Hawaii's performers. A public open house was held.

From this royal beginning, the Hale Koa has achieved above and beyond what was expected of it. By the time its doors opened, the concept of separate dining and sleeping areas for enlisted and officers had long vanished. The Hale Koa opened as it remains today, an all rank, all services hotel bent on providing first class services without regard to an individual's status. Its mission remains unchanged, "To provide a first class hotel and recreation facility at affordable prices for military members and their families."

Today the Hale Koa Hotel, which is actually owned by the Department of the Army, is managed by John L. Jefferis and comes under the jurisdiction of the Community and Family Support Center, commanded by Brigadier General

A hotel expansion project started in 1991 included the development of 66 acres of Fort DeRussy, a new swimming pool complex, two snack bars, a beverage bar, and luau garden. Kalia Road, fronting the Hale Koa Hotel, was also realigned and improved. In September of 1995, the new Maile Tower was completed, doubling the number of guest rooms from 419

Hale Koa translation: House of the Warrior

he name, submitted by Mrs. William E.
Deeds, was one of 80 entries in a 1975 contest to name the hotel.

Hale Koa is a combination of Hawai-

ian words — hale, meaning house, and koa, meaning warrior. Thus, freely translated, House of the Warrior.

In submitting the winning entry, Mrs. Deeds believed the

name should be Hawaiian, easy to pronounce and have meaning in terms of the hotel's purpose.

Mrs. Deed's husband was a colonel in the U.S. Marine Corps in 1975.

Finding romance in Hale Koa's lobby


I will always have the Hale Koa hotel to thank for our being in the right place at the right time to make this happen. The "magic of the islands" and their romantic allure truly

Ancient tree has seen it all

50-year-old Banyan stands witness to Waikiki changes

It is estimated that over 1 million military personnel and their dependents use the Hale Koa hotel and its many facilities every year.

They come and go, hurrying along to whatever activity awaits them. They pass through the Hale Koa courtyard on their way to visit the post exchange, the swimming pool, barber shop, or to the new restaurant, "Bibas."

Some pause to sit and rest on benches, under the shade, taking a break from the sun, sand and excitement of being in Hawaii. They see the shade comes from a tree and that the tree is very big and pretty. What most don't stop to think about is all that the tree has seen in his 50 odd years of Waikiki residency.

Gus, a Fichus
Benghalensis, is an
Indian Banyan tree
that belongs to the
fig family Moraceae.
He was rooted many
years before the
Hale Koa was built
and is rumored to
have provided shade
for men signing up
at Fort DeRussy for
the 100th Battalion.

Since Banyans are known as "strangler figs," trees that use their aerial roots to strangle the host tree they sprouted in, the gardeners at Hale Koa cut Gus' aerial roots to prevent them from taking over the whole area. But despite Gus's natural dominating tendencies, the workers at the hotel describe the tree as "defenseless." A plaque in front of him reads. "I am a defenseless Banyan Tree who has been quietly observing the explosive transformation of Waikiki during these last 50 odd years."

In recent years, Gus has witnessed many changes in the Hale Koa hotel structure.


When renovations started three years ago, he was sitting at the outside entrance to the hotel, next to the post exchange.

During the renovation period he accumulated quite a bit of dust on his leaves and required a bath to improve his appearance. Construction workers had to use a fire hose directed from the roof of the hotel to wash him off.

Today, Gus holds center stage in the new grand courtyard of the hotel. The sidewalk area that used to be beside him has given way to a whole new tower, housing an additional 396 rooms, a world class fitness center, new activities desk area and a new restaurent

The post exchange has been expanded and a barber shop/beauty salon have been added beside it.


But Gus remains the same, thankfully unaffected by all these changes, quietly awaiting whatever changes the next 50 years have to

Historic Battery Randolph and the U.S. Army Museum of Hawaii

Battery Randolph was a former coastal artillery fortification, and chronicles the achievements and sacrifices made by the people of Hawaii in the defense of their islands and their country.

Battery Randolph was built in 1909 as a coastal artillery battery, a key part of the "Ring of Steel" which encircles the island of Oahu to defend against attack by sea. Its solid concrete walls could withstand a direct hit from a 2,000 pound artillery shell. Its primary mission was the defense of Pearl Harbor from attacking battleships. But at the end of World War II, the giant guns were cut up and sold for scrap, never having fired a shot in anger.

Following deactivation after World War II, the Battery was used as a warehouse, and later abandoned. It repeatedly defied destruction and was eventually turned into a museum in 1976. Today, the museum preserves the architecture and the story of historic Battery Randolph.

The museum spans over 13,500 square feet, and contains over 2,000 artifacts and 1,900 pho-

tographs. Over 130,000 visitors tour Battery Randolph and the museum each year, making it the most frequently visited U.S. Army Museum in the world.

Battery Randolph is located at the intersection of Kalia Road and Saratoga Road next to the Hale Koa Hotel, and is open Tuesday through Sunday, 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The museum is airconditioned, and admission is free although donations are requested for museum development. The Museum Gift Shop features interesting and educational items which relate to the museum displays. Validated parking is available in Fort DeRussy's Saratoga parking lot. Allow 60 to 90 minutes for a complete tour of the museum. Handicapped facilities and elevators are available.

The Hawaii Army Museum Society, through membership support, corporate grants and private donations, has provided over \$500,000 to enable the development of new exhibits, educational programs, and community programs which benefit the museum and the people of Hawaii. The Society is a charitable, non-profit, corporation.








Maile & 'Ilima

The maile and 'ilima are both native Hawaiian plants. The fragrant tendrilling maile vine, found in the rainforests of Hawai'i, is one of the oldest and most favorite of lei materials. 


