Cochran Housing comes down

Estimated \$11.8 million housing project will be 'best in DoD.'

An \$11.8 million project to rebuild the Cochran Housing Area has buildings crumbling to make way for 54 new units.

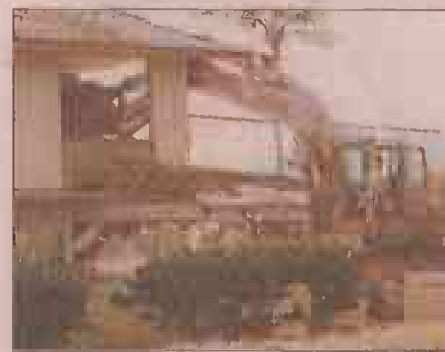
The new 11-acre neighborhood is scheduled to be completed by spring 1999.

"This is hopefully the first project of many to come to replace the older facilities here," said Navy LtCmdr. Rick Cook, the construction team leader at the Resident Officer In Charge of Construction office, here. Fletcher Pacific Construction, a Honolulu company which was awarded a design/build contract for the project, is already well into the project, carting the older units out

as piles of rubble.

"Another advantage with this housing is it will be designed to get away from straight rows like the barracks are laid out," said John A. Weick, a construction management engineer at ROICC. "They will be built in cul-de-sacs. It will seem more spacious and eliminate through-streets to heighten the safety aspect."

"In my opinion, these are going to be the nicest junior enlisted houses in the DoD," said Cook.

Cement trucks thicken traffic

Traffic here will become much thicker as cement trucks begin making as many as 200 or more trips per day to the flightline construction area for several days starting Monday.

Traffic is expected to be congested at the H-3 stop light and may be heavy in other areas as trucks travel a designated route at a rate of approximately one every three minutes, according to SSgt. James L. Daly, a military policeman with the Military Police Department, here.

"We just want the community to know how to avoid problems," said Daly. "There will be a lot of traffic coming through here and anyone who uses the main gate may see some congestion."

The trucks will travel from the front gate to the H-3 light, turn left on 3rd Street and move to E Street where they will make another left, according to Daly. They will travel down to 1st Street and continue to the flightline for dumping.

Upon finishing, the trucks will be cleaned and will exit by travelling down Mokapu Boulevard to make a right on G Street.

"Exiting shouldn't be a problem since they won't be on a time schedule," said Daly.

The first day of pouring is set for Monday, according to Stan W. Wagoner, the field supervisor for Kiewit Construction. Additional dates tentatively include Feb. 6, 11, 17, 23 and 26.

The concrete is being poured on a new apron which is part of several base realignment and closure projects under construction here. It will be used to park 20 P-3 Orion aircraft transferring from Naval Station Barbers Point.

Hot under the collar

They sit alone at the end of a seemingly endless, empty field of pavement, attentive to everything happening around them.

One perches atop a mighty machine while three others wait inside ready to react at a moment's notice. Their watchful presence could be the difference

between life and death. These Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting Marines spend hours on end on the vast airfield every day watching helicopters and planes land safely time after time. But many people wonder what exactly these Marines do during the long hours aircraft aren't in sight or landing.

Ask ARFF firefighters, and they'll tell you

their presence aboard the airfield is one of its most important functions — especially when lives are at stake, according to Marines like Cpl. Isaac A. Faircloth, an ARFF firefighter.

"We are responsible for watching the whole airfield," Faircloth said. "If something happens, we must be the first

Parents have new child care alternative

Armed Services YMCA will now offer hourly care for children.

Hourly child care which was once provided by the Child Development Center here will now be offered by the Armed Services YMCA.

The ASYMCA is the new resident in the old CDC in building 579 near the Officers' Club and will provide care for children ages six weeks to 5 years in the same classrooms previously used for full-day child care, said Susan Cleveland, the Early Childhood Education Programs director.

"We are delighted the ASYMCA has agreed to provide hourly child care," said Cleveland. "The CDC has recently been able to offer 37 spaces in full and part-day programs to families who have been on a waiting list."

The ASYMCA's hourly program opened spaces in an otherwise cluttered waiting list for child care, according to Cleveland.

"We would not have been able to offer these spaces without their new hourly care program," Cleveland added.

"We invite parents to come down and visit our classrooms to see how we operate," said Kelly Minges, the lead teacher at ASYMCA. "We encourage parents to watch our teachers work with the children and visit our new facility."

"The ASYMCA operates as a private organization and is required to comply with the same regulations as the CDC," Cleveland said. "The ECEP will also provide staff training and referral services for the ASYMCA hourly care."

Hourly care will be provided by reservation from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, and reservations can be made up to two weeks in advance, Cleveland said. Rates will remain the same — \$2.80 the first hour, \$2.60 each additional hour for a child in the same family. There is also a yearly registration fee of \$12 for hourly care service.

BAC discusses boat parking, recycling

Boat parking options and recycling were the main topics covered at the Base Action Committee meeting Tuesday night at Fairways All-Hands Club here.

MGySgt. Robert Flores, the base inspector, was present to answer questions and handle concerns over where to park boats in housing and spoke of the steps to

take to get authorization.

"To park a boat in base housing, submit a form with the housing office," said Flores. "Boats should only be parked in garages or driveways. Parking boats in yards is an environmental concern due to the oils and fuels which leak from their motors."

Boats can be parked at the Marina here if there is no room in housing areas to park them, said Flores.

"It's really a case-by-case evaluation," said BGen. David Bice, the base commanding general. "We may need mediation on our options."

The state of recycling programs and what to recycle here was presented by Karen Guntow, the recycling manager with Base Environmental Office.

Items such as aluminum cans and paper can be recycled here but items like tin

cans can't, according to Guntow.

"The recycling market fluctuates very much," Guntow said. "We try to recycle everything, but sometimes we can't."

Other topics of discussion included child care options, revision of the MWR advisory board and the progress of building a skate park here.

Next month's meeting, Feb. 24, will cover Base Realignment and Closure.

ones on the scene. We have to ensure quick rescue response and size up the situation to report to the section leader."

"They have about a two-minute response time," said GySgt. B. W. Peoples, a section leader with the ARFF. "They don't do a whole lot out there most of the time,

but they are very important."

"We do a lot more than meets the eye," said Faircloth. "I think there is an overall misconception we don't do anything at all. That's because people only see us sitting around. What most of them don't realize is we have more

stress and work in one call that lasts about one and half hours than most people have in a full day of work," he continued. "Our job requires us to do extra physical training and we have to continuously train to keep our skills up."

During the 12 to 14 hours a day spent sitting on the runway, Faircloth said the Marines study

procedures and aircraft structure and operation and hone every possible aspect of knowledge they may need for that one moment when someone's life will depend on it.

"A lot of times we discuss aircraft danger areas and how to approach them," Faircloth said. "We also share past experiences and training so we can each learn from them."

Most days spent on the hot spot aren't very hot, according to ARFF Marines. But the cool times are essential in expanding knowledge and training that will be vital when the heat hits.

Jack of all trades gets award for efforts

He's a jack of all trades who's been a staffer, planner, engineer and information manager. And he was recently awarded the first ever Copernicus Award for his contributions in information systems and technology here.

Gordon Mattis, of Glendale, Calif., serves as MarForPac's command, control, communications, computers and intelligence systems integrator. He was recognized Jan. 14 in San Diego for exceptional contributions in C4I technology during the Armed Forces Communications and Electronics Association/U.S. Naval Institute Western Conference and Exhibition.

Mattis, who arrived at MarForPac in November 1995, was credited for dramatically improving MarForPac's command and control support structure, said Maj. Steven L. Gaudreau, MarForPac's C4I systems officer. Mattis, who is a contracted employee here at the command's computer and communications division here from Pearl Harbor's Space War Systems Center, has worked with C4I systems for about five years.

"Mattis has been a catalyst for many positive changes in this command's efforts to harness the power of information technology to benefit the warfighter," said Col. Rodney J. Wijas, the assistant chief of staff with computer and communications division here.

Mattis developed a modular, deployable "flyaway" communications suite engineered specifically for MarForPac requirements. He created top level architecture for a satellite communications network for exercise and control over MarForPac. The network includes everything from phone systems to video teleconferencing systems, said Mattis.

He also authored a MarForPac command and control strategy. The strategy was used to leverage funds from various sources in support of MarForPac goals.

"I documented the needs and deficiencies with the old strategy and wrote a new one to cover the current deficiencies, which can be critical for a deployable headquarters, such as ours. We decided what we needed and how to get it," explained Mattis.

"I'm very grateful to be recognized by MarForPac," Mattis said. "And very pleased to know the innovations are making an impact on Marines."

Desert rats construct base camp

UDAIRI RANGE, KUWAIT — In three days, Marines and Sailors of the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit (Special Operations Capable) transformed a desolate area of the Kuwaiti Desert into a virtual city.

After three months aboard the ships of the Peleliu Amphibious Ready Group, the MEU got the opportunity to stretch its legs when it came ashore for Exercise Eager Mace 98-1.

Set against the backdrop of tensions between Iraq and the United Nations, the 13th MEU(SOC) moved ashore, aware that any moment the exercise could be overcome by real world operations.

Before the MEU could get situated for the month long exercise, a base camp had to be constructed to support the training which is being conducted more than 40 miles into the heart of the Kuwaiti Desert.

Located just 20 miles from the Iraqi border, the 13th MEU(SOC)'s base camp at Udairi Range had to be built to provide protection as well as a

focal point for sustaining a large force in a desert environment.

Construction of the camp began when an advance party from the MEU landed and began to make preparations for the main body's arrival. Marines and their equipment, all combat loaded and ready to fight, moved to the training area and immediately set into defensive positions while combat engineers went to work to construct the base camp.

While some of the combined arms force is positioned at Camp Doha and Ali Al Salem air field, more than half of the 2,100 Marines and Sailors of the MEU are at Udairi.

"We had to start from scratch," said Capt. Christopher U. Carr, the camp commandant and commanding officer of Headquarters and Support Company, BLT 1/1. "There were remnants of a camp so far gone that we had to destroy it all and start fresh."

The planning for the camp began weeks before and required much coordination between the camp commandant and the units preparing to occupy the camp.

"We laid out the camp so that people could live and do many different kinds of work in a safe and efficient environment," Carr said.

Combat engineer detachments from Battalion Landing Team 1/1 and MEU Service Support Group-13 began by leveling the remains of a

previous camp and constructing the berms that encompass and divide the camp into sections.

The first thing on the construction agenda was the construction of a berm surrounding the entire camp to provide force protection, an area encompassing more than 200 acres of land.

"It's hard to say how much dirt we moved. I'd say more than 50,000 cubic yards," said Gysgt. James McDonald, an engineer detachment chief with MSSG-13, from Beaumont, Miss.

Although the berm is not indestructible, it is a solid first line of defense against mechanized assault and provides the Marines on the interior with protection from small arms fire. Additional berms were then added, separating the camp into distinct areas, giving further protection as well as providing the camp with a practical layout.

The camp was ready for the bulk of the incoming force by Dec. 1.

"The set up went much smoother than any operation on Camp Pendleton. The Marines have been sitting on ship so long that everyone was eager to get back to work," said McDonald.

Convoys make the two-hour trip

between Camp Doha and the Udairi base camp daily and the ability to refuel in the middle of the desert is something the self-sustaining force has well in hand.

"We have a 9,000 gallon capacity to store diesel fuel, we're open 24 hours a day and ready to dispense fuel on request," said LCpl. Chris Wells, a bulk fuel specialist with MSSG-13. This "city" in the middle of the desert is also a man-made oasis with a considerable water supply.

"We get 18,000 gallons of water every two days from a Kuwaiti contractor. We process it into potable water at a rate of about 9,000 gallons every eight hours," said Cpl. Joel Cleary, a hygiene equipment operator with MSSG-13.

This vast amount of fresh water is produced with a Reverse Osmosis Water Purification Unit. Although the 13th MEU(SOC) has more than enough water at Udairi, the ROWPU is operating at only a fraction of its potential.

"Our maximum potable water producing capacity is 3,000 gallons an hour," Cleary said.

After all was said and done the camp at Udairi Range, Kuwait could be called home.

In Your Opinion

I have a family, I have a right

Concerning Sgt. Michael Wiener's opinion published in the Jan. 22 edition of the Hawaii Marine, I would like to speak from the perspective of being the wife of a 16-year Marine gunnery sergeant.

If it is truly your opinion we Marine spouses joined the Marine Corps by "marrying a jarhead," then how can you call this "your" base? If we spouses are truly now members of the Marine Corps, isn't it our base, too? Is this covered under the theory of guilt by association? Meaning, if I had married an accountant, then am I now an accountant? If I had married a murderer, then am I now a murderer?

You asked the question "Why is it all right to wake up Marines with early-morning motivation, but get within a quarter mile of housing and mum's the word?" I would like to answer that question with my own opinion.

It is my contention that when a Marine signs the dotted line, he is agreeing to having to get up at all hours of the night to run, hike, etc., and therefore gives up his right to complain if he doesn't get a full night of sleep.

Have you ever stopped to think about the reasons "family members" might not like to get woken up at 5:30 a.m.? What about the mom who

was up most of the night caring for her newborn infant because her husband was either sleeping or deployed? What about that newborn infant who might have just fallen asleep? What about school-age children who are facing a big test the next day? What about the spouse who works the night shift somewhere and just fell into bed after 12 hours on the job? Don't you think these are some legitimate reasons to not want to be woken up at 5:30 a.m. by a large group of chanting — and sometimes vulgar — Marines?

When I married my husband I signed a marriage certificate between him, myself and God. I did not sign a contract with the United States government, and certainly not the Marine Corps, and therefore I am not a Marine, and neither are my children. Yes, I married a Marine and I do have to contend with constant moving, irregular work hours and all the other things you mentioned, but you also forgot the "B" billets and six-month and one-year deployments; not only am I a single parent for that time, but my husband misses out on those years of his children's lives. So I feel asking Marines not

to yell cadence through housing so we may sleep is not a big thing, considering the overall picture.

You stated "I know when I'm running in formation and have to stop singing because of late-sleeping residents, my motivation falters." Well, to most of the rest of us, 5:30 a.m. is not "late," as a matter of fact, I consider it quite early.

Your opinion, Sgt. Wiener, upset me very much and I pray it is only your opinion and not that of the entire Marine Corps. I fell in love with a wonderful man and I married him because I wanted to spend the rest of my life with him.

It was unfortunate indeed he was in the Marine Corps at the time and chose to make it his career.

As the years have passed, I have discovered the Marine Corps is no place to raise a family and we have struggled with the "stay in/get out" question every time reenlistment has come up. It is because of opinions like yours I can now say, after 12 years as the wife of a Marine, I hate the United States Marine Corps and the things it does not stand for, mainly the family, which in my considered opinion, should always come first!

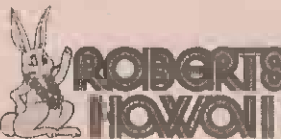

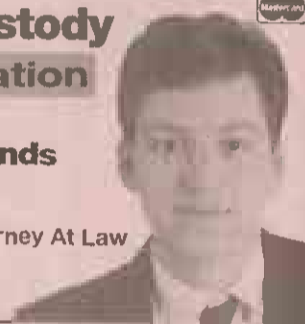

Ravings of a Madman

Elway, my man

While watching Denver's win against the Packers in the best Super Bowl since the Oakland Raiders won in 1984, I made it a point to watch John Elway's face.

The Denver quarterback, so used to having to make comebacks during his long career, had quite a calm look about himself throughout the entire game.

His only show of emotion during the game was after his awesome scramble to get the ball near the Green Bay goal line in the fourth quarter.

Elway hurled himself at three Packer defenders, and in doing so, made the point, "I'm going to do whatever it takes to win this game." I knew then the Broncos would win.

Since the Broncos defeated what many people consider the best team in football in Green Bay, Elway's place in history, already secured with such legendary moments as "The Drive" and "The Drive, Part II," is even more solidified. Think about it — is there any more classic a quarterback than Elway?

He's second only to Dan Marino in passing yards, which proves he can throw.

He can throw the ball nearly the length of the football field in the air. Most people can't even throw 30 yards.

He used to be the most dangerous passer outside of the pocket in football, a mantle recently taken over by Brett Favre.

Elway was also the most dangerous scrambler in football for a long time, a mantle which Kordell Stewart has also taken.

But neither Favre nor Stewart, nor Troy Aikman and Steve Young, for that matter, have engineered game-winning drives of the sheer drama and leadership Elway has produced. I don't have my handy-dandy sports information book in front of me, but I believe Elway has engineered 44 fourth-quarter drives which resulted in wins for the Broncos.

There will be a time, 20 years from now, when people will be talking about how Elway destroyed the Cleveland Browns in two playoff classics. I can't help but mention those games — they were two of the best I've seen and are indelibly stamped in my memory. Especially in the way Elway just looked like he was going to win, no matter what.

He had the same sort of game face Sunday, albeit a bit more serene. He's a grizzled war horse of a veteran, is John Elway, and I don't remember ever feeling as happy as I have for a guy who makes a barrelful of money playing a kid's sport.

Perhaps it's because I've always liked Elway, who didn't want to get sucked into the morass known as the Baltimore Colts back in 1983 (look where they are now, football-wise. Smart move, Elway). He went instead to Denver, where he has played his entire career. There's something to be said for his loyalty, as well, for what man can stay with the same team who was routed in three Super Bowls? I felt Elway was a quarterback in search of a supporting cast.

The team must feel great. They finally built a decent defense and got Elway the outstanding running back he's needed in Terrell Davis.

And — finally — he got the championship his legendary career so richly deserves. His story is the kind which makes sports so cool.

Youth Activities looking for new coaches

The YAC is also seeking volunteer coaches for the various age groups.

Becoming a youth baseball coach here requires filling out a resume and getting certified with National Youth Sports Coaches Association, said Bowen. First-year head coaches must attend a six-hour course covering things such as first aid and CPR to be certified.

"We want at least one certified assistant coach or parent who can take over in case the head coach deploys or for some reason can't be present at a game," said Bowen.

Cost for the classes is paid for by the athletics department, and second and third year recertification fees are also covered by YAC.

"Coaching is a whole lot of fun," said Bowen. "Even the 5- and 6-year-olds are intense. They really put on a good show. It's fun to watch but it's more fun to coach."

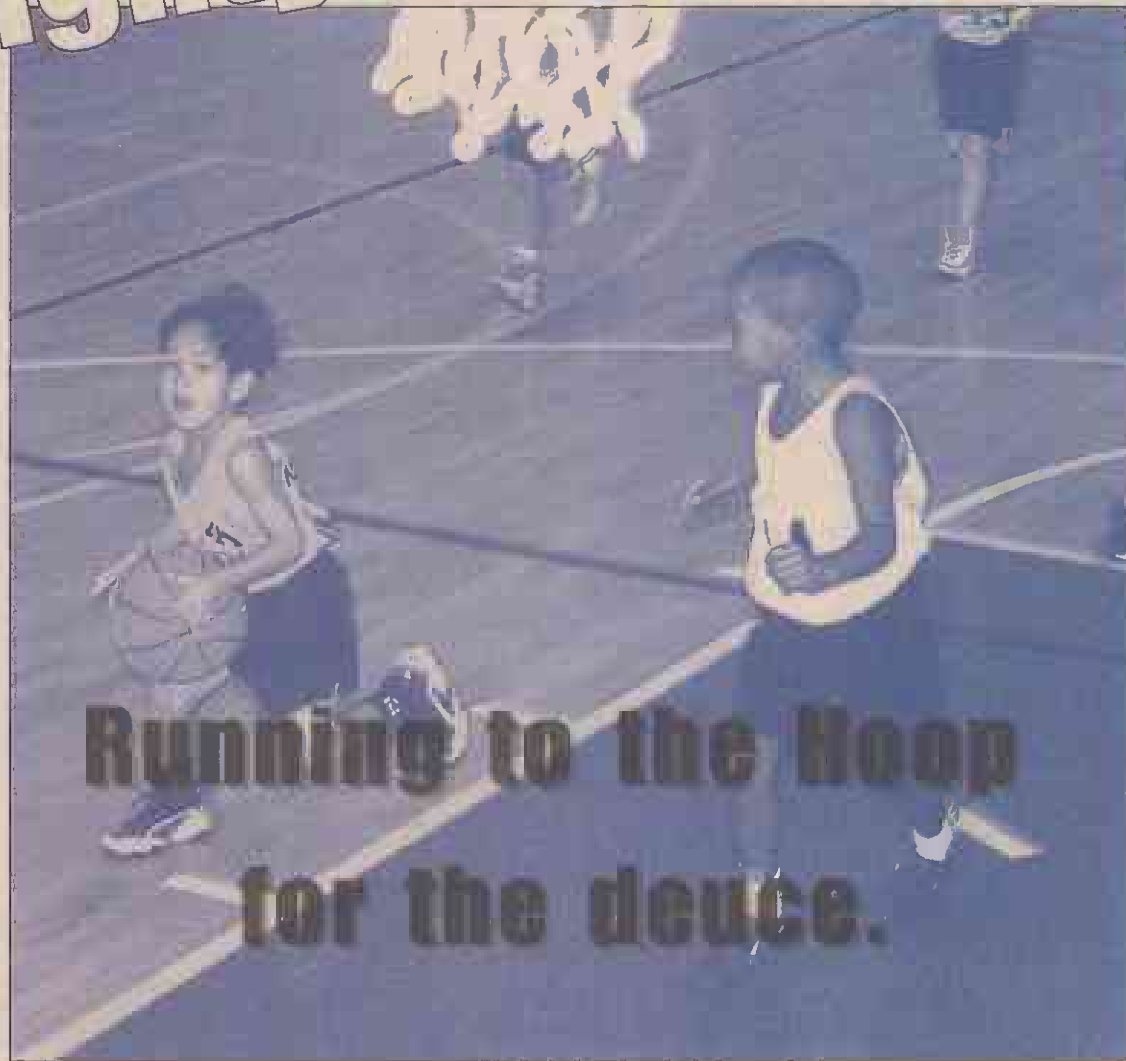
Bowen encourages parents who have time to volunteer to help coaches with practices, scorekeeping and coaching.

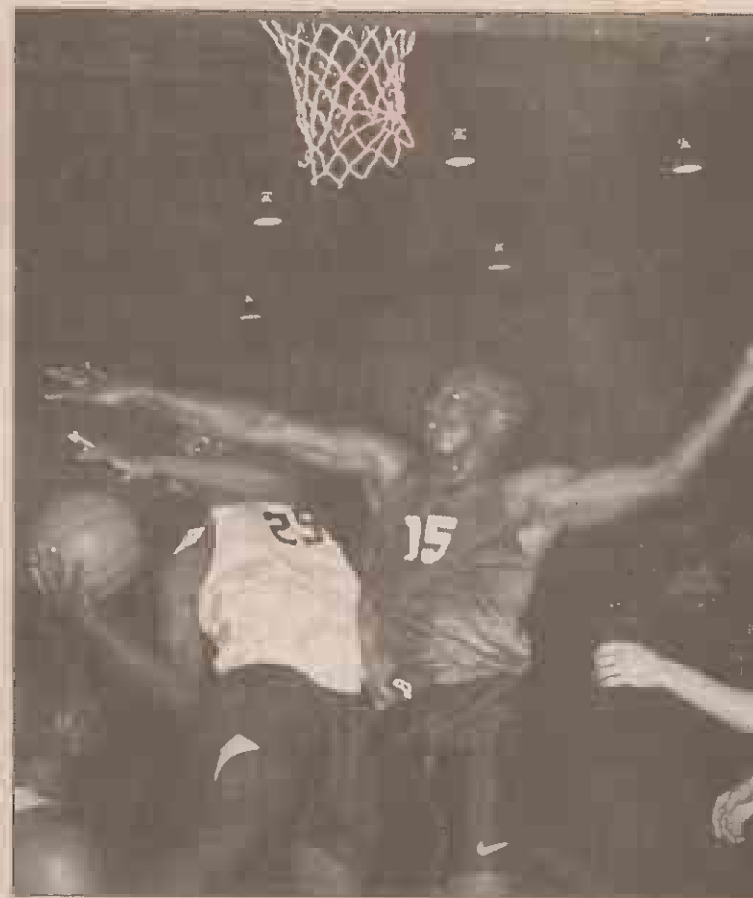
Griffin didn't help the Bulldog's cause, disputing every call against them in the second half and drawing technical fouls, leading to more easy buckets by the Big Dogs.

Movie Review

'Hard Rain' might run into hard luck

PEARL CITY — I saw the best example of how money can drive people plum nuts Saturday night as I viewed the latest water-filled, action-suspense film, "Hard Rain." Even though I found the movie somewhat entertaining, I was disappointed in the overall product. What seemed to be a slam-jam film with an all-star cast actually left something to be desired. First, there was Morgan Freeman, who recently played in "Kiss the Girls" and "Seven," both outstanding films, but "Hard Rain" was not a Freeman-type role. His performance was first-rate in this film, but the movie didn't suit him. I've seen him do a lot better. Then there was Randy Quaid, who was not playing a Randy Quaid "degenerate-cousin-hick-trailer park warrior"

role. The film didn't utilize Quaid's ability to make people laugh. The only character who fit his role was Christian Slater, who supplied most of the movie's comedy and was featured in most of the underwater action scenes. This led me to believe Slater has the lung capacity of a blue whale, because he spent half of the movie under water. What brings all these characters together is \$3 million nestled in an armored truck. The truck breaks down in a flooding Indiana town and four thieves, led by Freeman, try to hijack it. Slater, the truck's driver, flees with the money in the hopes of keeping it. The town sheriff, Quaid, also wants to get his hands on the money. Aside from everyone trying to kill each other to get the money, the flood waters take their toll on much of the cast. Not everyone has gills like Slater.

One of the more delightful points of the movie was the comedy. It was light enough to keep your attention on the action, but heavy enough to make the audience giggle. One of the funnier characters in the movie was Betty White of "Golden Girls" fame, who played an old coot who refused to evacuate the flooding town. What impressed me most, however, was the set in which the film was shot. The town was actually a replica of Huntingburg, Ind., built in a huge aircraft hanger in Palmdale, Calif. The town was placed in a tank two football fields long and one wide. The whole set was five foot deep in water, and it took more than 5 million gallons of water to fill the tank. "We knew the only way to do this picture was in a control situation, because water in its natural environment is completely uncontrollable," said "Hard Rain" producer Mark Gordon in "Paramount Pictures Handbook of Production Information." Despite the special effects, this wasn't a role for Freeman. Maybe Danny Glover or Ving Rhames, who played Don King in the HBO movie. Still, "Hard Rain" shows off some of the best water action scenes I've ever seen, but if you are a Morgan Freeman fan, you might be disappointed.
