## K-Bay Marine aids injured motorcyclist

An MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay Marine assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division here potentially saved a life Sept. 24 on the H-3.

Sgt. Kevin L. Hudson came to the rescue of another Marine who was involved in a motorcycle accident. Hudson was driving home from bible study at Trinity Baptist Church, near Pearl City, when he saw the motorcyclist in an end-over-end accident.

"I checked my side-view mirrors and saw the motorcycle rolling on the highway," Hudson said. Hudson quickly pulled over and raced to

the accident scene where he found that Seaman Christopher J. McKee, a Sailor stationed at Naval Air Station Barbers Point, and a civilian woman, Brandi N. Espinoza, had already come to the injured motorcyclist's aid.

Hudson said it was then that he noticed part of the motorcyclist's leg had been severed.

Immediately, Hudson removed his belt and instructed the woman to apply a tourniquet with it. Hudson then propped the motorcyclist's head up and covered him using clothing he found in his car, he said.

"I started talking to him, just to keep him conscious," Hudson said. "I remember him asking if his leg was cut badly. He didn't

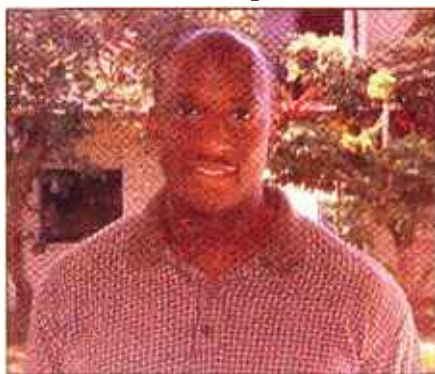

even know that his leg was gone at that point."

Hudson said he instructed McKee to

locate the victim's severed limb, thinking they might be able to save the injured motorcyclist's leg.

Hudson had to react quickly, as the accident victim was losing a lot of blood and was swaying in and out of consciousness.

"In predicaments like that, you don't have time to think. You simply revert back to your training," he said.

It was the combination of recruit, traffic accident and criminal investigation training that allowed him to work calmly when faced with the task of saving the Marine's life, Hudson said.

Hudson said that the others who came to the Marine's aid are to thank as well.

"It was a team effort. I couldn't have

done everything myself," Hudson said.

"Under general circumstances, a severed limb will bleed severely and it is probable that over a period of time, the loss of blood may lead to death in any case," said Lt. Cmdr. Mark Copenhagen, director of Branch Medical here. "The application of a tourniquet with heavy bleeding is a wise thing to do."

The humble Hudson insists, however, that he had very little to do with the victim's fate.

"I think God puts people in places for reasons," he said. "That was probably the worst moment in that Marine's life and it just so happened that God put people there who were willing and able to help him."

## Commanding general shares vision

*Editor's note: The following questions and answers are excerpts from an interview conducted by Sgt. Steven Williams of the Hawaii Marine with the commanding general of MCB Hawaii, BGen. Arnold Fields, Sept. 24. BGen. Fields assumed command here July 29.*

**Hawaii Marine:** "What is your vision for the base?"

**BGen. Fields:** "I would like a base that supports the mission. That is, the operational forces are ready and capable of carrying out their respective missions. I would like this to happen within the most peaceful environment that we could possibly produce here.

"I think it starts ... with the entrance to this base. And as a result of that, we need to present a very pleasant appearance when one enters and that should continue throughout the base. I want it to be a pleasant place to live, a pleasant place

to visit and a pleasant place overall within the military."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What do you look forward to most while stationed at MCB Hawaii?"

**BGen. Fields:** "We have a lot of initiatives in place to improve this facility. Frankly, there are a lot of improvements this base needs, both here on the K-Bay side as well as Camp Smith — and, I know the reasons for it are many: the fact that we were about to close this base and it was revived; the fact that we haven't had much money on the military construction side... and all the things we really wish to do to make this base completely pleasing to every Marine, Sailor and civilian who lives or works here.

"So, I want to see some progress. My predecessors have laid a lot of good ground work. Much of what I do here, I will be following in their footsteps.

"There are some other things I want to do myself to make this place better. I want to see some new unaccompa-

nied personnel housing come online. We have some plans to make that happen.

"Most of these plans will not happen on my watch. The ground might be broken, but troops will not move into the facilities until well after I'm gone.

"But, I want to see improvement. I want to see them live in unquestionably decent surroundings — where they live, where they work and where they play.

"If I am able to have any portion of that completed while I am here, I would say that would be a success in my mission here."

**Hawaii Marine:** "With several units moving here from Naval Air Station Barbers Point next year, can the base expect any changes in the way it does business?"

**BGen. Fields:** "I don't think we will make any drastic changes in the way we do business, but with that said, given

## October named Domestic Violence Prevention Month

Education and awareness highlight the goals of Domestic Violence Prevention Month, which runs today through Oct. 31.

A National Crime Survey revealed nearly 4 million spouses and intimate partners are physically abused by their partners and approximately 175,000 days of work are missed by victims of domestic violence every year, according to a proclamation by BGen. Fields.

"Domestic violence has a direct bearing on productivity, effectiveness, absenteeism and employee turnover in the workplace," the proclamation said.

The proclamation is only a portion of efforts initiated by the base to educate the base community in domestic violence prevention.

"It's important to get the message out," said Owen M. Norton, the family advocacy program manager for the Family Services Center here. "We need to heighten awareness."

During this month, military police from the Military Police Department will visit housing residents to ensure base family members know they're there to help, according to Norton.

"We will all be working toward three goals — victim safety, offender accountability and rehabilitation, and a climate where domestic violence is not tolerated."

The Coordinated Command

Response program, which includes units such as MPD, FSC and the Legal Department, is set up to achieve these goals.

"Each year, the Coordinated Command Response program gets a little more finely tuned," said Norton. "And every year it gets a little better."

## Marine rocket-men have blast with AT-4s

**SCHOFIELD BARRACKS,** — Infantrymen from 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment were awarded a rare live-fire opportunity at the K-R 8 range here Sept. 24.

The leathemocks fired the AT-4 anti-tank rocket as part of heavy weapons block training last week. The 1/3 Marines who were selected to fire the 15 one-shot rockets were chosen based on their high performance during training

drills.

"It's very important for Marines to get this live-fire training because there is no good way to simulate the AT-4, and it's not very often that we get to fire live rounds with this weapon," said Capt. Mark House, B Co. commanding officer.

"These Marines will fire these weapons in combat, so the more practice they have with them, the more proficient they'll be in real-life situations," said SSgt. Al Thomas, a platoon sergeant with B Co.

The excitement of firing the AT-4

was apparent on the devil dogs' faces, even through the dust and smoke from the successful missile hits.

"This has got to be the coolest thing I've done," said LCpl. Tony Prince, a team leader with B Co., 1/3. "I've heard the (Shoulder-Launched Multipurpose Assault Weapons) fire before, but I didn't expect the AT-4 to be this loud."

"Not very many Marines get the chance to fire the AT-4," said LCpl. John Shepherd, a team leader with C. Co., 1/3. "I feel very honored and lucky that I was one who got the opportunity."

## Internet center opens for Team K-Bay

A new internet center will put the world at the fingertips of the base community as the high-speed center opens for business Friday in building 1255 on Fifth Street here.

The center, called MCX Connections, will offer video email, a means to surf the internet and worldwide interactive gaming. It will open from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Friday and will be open seven days a week. Firm hours have not yet been set, but Deedee A. Ryan, manager of MCX Connections and the Marine Message Center at Mokapu Mall, said the center will most likely stay open until 9 p.m. each night.

"This really benefits Marines who don't

make a lot of money," said Ryan. Junior Marines may not be able to afford a \$3,000 computer. This allows them a reasonable way to do what they want to do with computers, and without spending a lot of money, she explained.

"It's cheaper than the price of a phone call," Ryan continued. "An hour on the internet costs less than a one-hour phone call."

Prices will range depending on the type of registration card members buy.

There is an hourly rate of \$5.95, but cards for five and 12 hours; one, three and six months; and one year will also be sold. A flyer with exact costs will be available at

**Sergeant Major's Column**

**Help instill unit pride in among Marines**

Having just been recently posted as the Marine Forces Pacific Sergeant Major. I thought it would be appropriate if you, the readers of the *Hawaii Marine*, got a feel for how I look at enlisted issues affecting the Marines and Sailors in the Pacific area.

So I have asked the *Hawaii Marine* if from time to time they would allow me to write a column for the newspaper to discuss issues I feel are important to the enlisted Marines and Sailors of the force — and to sort of pass the "word," if you will, directly from me to you.

What you will read from me in the months ahead is the same thing you will hear if you stop by my office or meet me on the street. I truly feel that we — the enlisted Marines and Sailors — have a major role to play in the future of our Corps, and that our noncommissioned officers and staff NCOs must take the lead in that role.

Having just arrived from the Recruit Depot at Parris Island and the Eastern Recruiting Region. I have seen first-hand and up-close the recruiting and making of our newest generation of Marines. I know what you are capable of and how you must be challenged. I intend to do just that, to challenge you to think and to act according to the high standards the Marine Corps sets.

The commanding general sets the direction of march. It is my responsibility to keep everyone in step. I intend to do just that. Having said all that, here goes:

When was the last time you overheard a couple of Marines talking about what unit they belong to? When

was the last time your unit held a PME on the history of your unit? How much do you personally know about your unit's warfighting history?

The heart and soul of any unit is its history and traditions. We as NCOs and staff NCOs have a responsibility as the "medicine men" of our units to ensure that that history is properly passed on to the next generation of Marines.

How many times have you watched the cake cutting ceremony at the Marine ball without really hearing the words being read as the cake is cut and given to the oldest Marine and then to the youngest? In those few moments it takes to pass the cake the narrator is telling everyone that the oldest Marine is passing along the wisdom, history and plain old Marine know-how of the Corps to the next generation of Marines.

If you were to do it properly and instill into your new Marines the history of your units, I think besides not wanting to let their shipmates down — they would not want to let the unit's honor down as well.

Having pride in your unit is imbedded into a Marine's heart from the time they hit the "yellow footprints" at the recruit depots, and it should be reinforced until the day they hang up their 782 gear to join the 1st Civ Div.

Marines will always remember with pride their boot camp platoon number. Wouldn't it be awesome if we could instill that same loyalty and devotion in them to their parent FMF unit?

You can if you do it properly, and use some common sense. By properly I mean without any superficial initiations — without any childish boola boola sorority-house stuff. Your Marines already have had their

right of passage; it's called boot camp. They have already joined the proud ranks of the United States Marine Corps by graduating the toughest recruit training in the nation.

You can, however, still initiate the new Marines by doing what NCOs and staff NCOs have always done — take the time to sit down and talk to your Marines, yep, that's what I said, just talk to them. Talk to them about why they should be proud of being a member of your unit. Get them involved by reading the lineage and honors of the command.

We have a reading program in the Corps but no real formal PME program for our privates, Pfc's and lance corporals — so make one up. Give them the name of a book to read about your unit, and then follow it up with a locker box discussion about it.

Take the time to explain to them they represent not only the American people and our Corps, but also those Marines who proudly have served in your units before them. Reinforce our Corps' values of honor, courage and commitment, and I think you will see a decline in discipline problems and suicides. And your Marines will be proud of the lash-up they belong to.

We have a great Corps, but we can always get better. All of us have a responsibility to ensure the next generation of Marines are as indoctrinated in love of Corps and country as the previous one.

You can do your part in sustaining the transformation and supporting cohesion by simply learning your unit's history and making sure it is a part of every Marine's daily life.

# Every Clime and Place Joint Medical Task Force gets back to basics in Haiti

**PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti** — The 58 Sailors, Soldiers, and Marines of the 2nd Medical Battalion Joint Medical Task Force have seen it all.

Although their main mission is to maintain the U.S. Support Group's field hospital and provide care to the hundreds of U.S. and U.N. personnel here, most of their work stems from helping the indigent population of Port-au-Prince.

The task force is made up of Sailors and Marines from 2nd Med. Bn., Camp Lejeune, N.C., and from Naval Hospitals Portsmouth, Va., and San Diego. Four U.S. Army soldiers from the 147th Medical Logistics Bn. and 248th Medical Detachment augment the team.

Since the task force's arrival in July, they have treated more than 6,000 Haitian patients. From simple cuts and broken bones, to gangrenous wounds and untreated third-degree burns — the task force servicemembers see it and treat it nearly every day.

During a recent visit to Brothers Missionaries of Charity, one of many sites the team visits on a weekly basis, about 35 Navy corpsmen, doctors, nurses, and medics treated a record 592 Haitian patients in only three hours. During that afternoon, hundreds of wounds were cleaned and bandaged, dozens of cysts were removed and abscesses drained, and more than 900 prescriptions were filled.

The pharmacy technicians distribute nearly \$1,500 of vitamins and medicine during each

visit. Hospitalman 2nd Class Donnie D. Pittman said, "The most needed items are the multivitamins and simple antibiotics."

Although the team has become somewhat accustomed to the medical surprises and disbelief they encounter when in town, there is no escaping the overall sadness of the situation.

"It's very depressing here," said Hospitalman 1st Class James M. Miller of Long Beach, Miss. "I never could have imagined the extent of their anguish and suffering."

Widespread poverty and few medical resources make seeking the simplest of treatments a nearly impossible task for the vast majority of people here. These site visits are the only means of reliable medical aid for the thousands of Haitians who live within the poorer sections of Port au Prince.

"It's unbelievable," said Pfc. Timothy Z. Click, a motor transport vehicle operator attached to the task force. "We were told what to expect, but there's nothing you can do to prepare for it."

In Haiti, every injury is potentially deadly. For the people who live in these filthy, disease-stricken slums, an everyday cut can quickly fester into a life- or limb-threatening condition.

Although conditions are dreary, the training value for the task force is invaluable.

"We are deployed for training," said Navy Cmdr. Steven R. Clarke, head of the medical task force. "The hands-on experience these men and women receive will refine their professional skills and make the unit, as a whole, more combat effective."

"We just don't see this stuff in the states," said Hospitalman 3rd Class Stacey L. Baker of Greenlake, Wis. "This is stuff you only read about in books."

Personal safety is a key concern for members of the task force. Conditions in Haiti require security measures somewhat comparable to a combat environment. Convoy and perimeter security is provided for each mission and a majority of the medical staff wear side arms and pepper spray as they treat patients in whatever shelter or shade they can find.

In the hot, tropical climate of Haiti, it's typical for a dentist to pull teeth beneath a tin shed or for a doctor to perform surgery under a tree.

When they're not in the city caring for the locals, task force members are either on duty in the field hospital or enjoying their one day off a week. Morale, Welfare and Recreation organizes a weekly, day-long trip to the beach, one

of the only opportunities to get away from the warehouse compound where the members live and work.

There are only a few restaurants approved for liberty visits. Under normal conditions, those wishing to get a little taste of Haiti need to travel in a group of at least three, and take appropriate security measures.

"For the most part, it's often just easier to stay on the compound," said Hospitalman 3rd Class Steve Hock of Burbank, Ill. "I spend a lot of my free time in the recreation room or at the gym."

"It's not bad, really," said Hospitalman 3rd Class Tyrone Allie, from Marlton, N.J. "We keep busy enough that it doesn't get too boring. The experience we gain here is worth any deployment-related hardships."

The task force is scheduled to return to the states in late January.

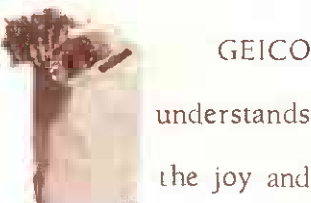

# CFC kicks off Oct. 8

The annual Combined Federal Campaign kicks off Oct. 8 and runs through Nov. 20.

The drive offers DoD employees an easy way to contribute to worthwhile charities.

Marines, Sailors and DoD civilians will all have the opportunity to give to one or more of the more than 1,200 charitable organizations that are a part of this year's CFC drive.

"We have two goals for the drive. The first is to explain CFC to everybody, since a lot of folks may not know what the CFC does," said Col. Keith Maxfield, the CFC project officer for the Marine Corps in Hawaii.

The second goal is to ask Marines, Sailors and DoD civilian employees to offer the equivalence of one hour of their base pay each month, the colonel added.

The CFC makes it easy to contribute to as many as five charities of choice, arranging for gifts to be paid through pay-

roll deductions or allotments.

People donating to the CFC can rest assured the organizations participating in the drive are screened by CFC to determine first their effectiveness and worthiness to the community, according to Maxfield.

"Sometimes we think of the contribution as a blank check that goes into the ether, with no one knowing just where the funds go," said Maxfield. "We bring Marines and Sailors together in large groups to give them information about the charities. Then we bring in speakers to give examples of people who have benefitted by organizations represented by the CFC, so there's a real, human face with the charities."

Another criterion for screening the organizations is to verify that at least 75 percent of their funds actually go toward helping people, and not for administrative costs, Maxfield added.

The CFC also makes sure the organizations have a record of efficient spending of funds, Maxfield said.

No one is required to donate anything, but organizers said they feel certain people will be eager to give whatever they can.

"I'm willing to bet that sometime in everyone's life they have been affected by one or more of these organizations," said Sgt. Kevin Hartnell, the key personnel representative for Headquarters Battalion here.

"Getting to hear stories of people who have benefitted from the charities really grabs your heart so you can't help but open up your billfold and help," said Maxfield.

# 1/3 learns jujitsu close combat skills

Marines from 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, threw a few tricks into their close combat training bag Sept. 22 as they trained with jujitsu techniques in the sands of Fort Hase Beach here.

Standard close combat training for all Marines includes "sweeping and stomping," punching, kicking and knowing human pressure points, but according to 1st Lt. Jay J. Zavaleta, a platoon commander with C Company, 1/3, the company's weekly jujitsu training could save lives if close combat gets too close.

"It gives them the advantage of leverage and technique to compensate for strength," said Zavaleta, who learned the basic techniques in the Infantry Officers Course in Quantico, Va.

Jujitsu is a Japanese martial art using holds, throws and stunning blows to disable or subdue an opponent. Marines of 1/3 were learning how to apply the techniques while wrestling enemies on the ground.

When you're on the ground, the punching and kicking from close combat training won't work most of the time, said Lance Cpl. Rogelio Soto, a fire team leader with C Co.

The jujitsu techniques give Marines another avenue of escape and conquer.

"You will still get hit and hurt, but you will walk away," said Zavaleta.

Though the jujitsu techniques being taught can cause serious injury or death if actually applied,

the 1/3 Marines ensure that they stay safe.

"There are a lot of safety rules," said Soto. Plus, the instructor is always watching with a whistle to break it up, he added.

"This type of training isn't something you can just play around with," said Zavaleta. "I make it clear that this isn't something you practice in the barracks

on a Saturday night. It's used in (combat situations) where it's either you or me — one of us is going to die.

"It's very powerful knowledge and it requires a lot of respect," he added. "just like any weapon."

Overall, Zavaleta said it teaches Marines their abilities and flexibility and "puts the advantage in our court."

that we will be accommodating the move of significant assets from Barbers Point, we may be doing more of what we have done.

"We will still continue to provide our service, and we will still try to do it within the confines of the often meager budget within which we are expected to operate. We will provide all that is expected of everyone who is a part of the base."

**Hawaii Marine:** "There are several projects associated with the Base Realignment and Closure Program construction. Can the base expect to see any other new facilities or busi-

nesses to support the large increase in the base population?"

**BGen. Fields:** "We can expect some. For example, a Navy (Bachelor Enlisted Quarters) is coming.

"Also, we will have to upgrade some of our facilities in order to accommodate some aspects of the Navy coming aboard."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What ways do you see MCB Hawaii advancing in technology and equipment over the next few years?"

**BGen. Fields:** "There are several ways.

"We have to interface with other organizations, bases, staffs and other areas of the world. In order to do that, we need to have no less than the power, the sophistication of equipment and the technology that is required to do that. We're making adjustments along those lines.

"We're certainly going to have to make the Y2K transition from 1999 to the year 2000. Most folks know this will cause some difficulties because computers were not programmed to deal with the figure for the year 2000... So, computer technicians in that community have had to make some adjustments and that process is coming about kind of slow. We will have to replace many of our systems in order to accommodate the Y2K problem.

"My G-6 tells me that on this base alone,

out of some 800 plus systems, approximately 400 of those are not Y2K compatible, which means that adjustments will have to be made. A chip that will make the corrections will have to be put into the machine or a whole new machine will have to be bought.

"In addition to that, we want to be as sophisticated as any other bases because we may not be as large as say Camp Pendleton, but we are expected to be able to do the same things or have the same capabilities as Camp Pendleton. I think the sophistication of this base as it grows over the near term will demand that we be up to date with technology."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What is your motto?"

**BGen. Fields:** "Do all the good you can, in all the ways you can, to all the people you can, in all the places you can, as long as you ever can."

**Hawaii Marine:** "That sounds like a poem — have you ever written poetry?"

**BGen. Fields:** "I have written some poetry, but I'm not published. Most of it was written within the past 10-15 years. Folks who know me well have referred to me often as a philosopher. I don't have the depth of knowledge in that field to be so identified. But, I find poetry as a convenient way to express my philosophy and make it a little more interesting than just stating it outright."

**Hawaii Marine:** "Why did you join the Marine Corps?"

**BGen. Fields:** "Because I received a letter from the draft board that said 'you have been selected by your friends and neighbors ...' So, I joined the military because I was drafted.

"I joined the Marine Corps because it was a convenient way to be allowed to finish teaching high school for that year, then go on active duty. The Army, as a result of the draft, wanted me much earlier. So, I entered the Marine Corps on the delayed entry program.

"So, you might ask, why did I stay? I found what the Marine Corps had to offer so much paralleled the things I had been taught at home. I enjoyed the leadership of my superiors. I wouldn't be here today, right now, if my battalion commander had not put his arms around me and asked me if I would like to augment. Here I am 29 years later and loving every minute of it."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What is the highlight of your military career?"

**BGen. Fields:** "It doesn't get any better than this right here. I think this tour will go down as the highlight of my career so far. That is not to say that I've not had very good tours before. I had a tour in Japan and Camp Fuji that was extraordinary. I also enjoyed my combat tour during Desert Storm.

"Certainly those tours compete with this one, but the jury is still out on this particular tour."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What do you hope to achieve before the end of your career?"

**BGen. Fields:** "I've never been one to really set career goals. But I think my goal is to do something positive for another person by the end of the day. "If I can end each day having done something positive for someone — and I need to feel that within myself, then that is really my goal."

"I have no true aspirations of personal greatness, but I do have aspirations of the greatness of others. If I can make someone

else great, that will make my day."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What is the best advice you've ever received?"

**BGen. Fields:** "Some advice that came to me while I was at The Basic School in Quantico, Va. — I wasn't doing as well as I wanted to at that point.

"One weekend I had this little Bible. I was looking for something of encouragement and I wasn't going to another person. I was going more with myself. Somehow, I was led to this one verse I had never read before in Philippians, the fourth chapter and 13th verse. It says 'I can do all things through Christ.'

"So, if there's one bit of advice that I have received that has been enduring, it was that bit of advice."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What do you enjoy the most about Hawaii?"

**BGen. Fields:** "First off, I enjoy the work. It's a pleasure to get up and come to work every morning. I'm highly motivated.

"I enjoy the climate. I came from a pleasant climate in Florida. So, there was no adjustment required in that regard except for the hills. We had no hills in Florida. It was all flatlands down there.

"I like the Marines, Sailors and civilians with whom I work. I like the job I have. I like this facility even though it needs considerable improvement. And, I like working with the people of Hawaii. They are very kind."

**Hawaii Marine:** "Rumor has it you're a singer. What kind of music do you sing and how serious are you about it?"

**BGen. Fields:** "I've been accused of being a singer, but I don't know if there's enough evidence to convict. But, I do love music. The Lord blessed me with the ability to at least take a stab at singing.

"I sing the full house. I sing a very little bit

of opera — very little. I've done quite a bit of classical music. I sang with the chorus with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. While with them, I made three appearances at Carnegie Hall."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What kind of hobbies do you have?"

**BGen. Fields:** "I like to stay in reasonably decent physical condition. That might be considered my hobby even though it's part of my regimen.

"And, I also pick at the guitar a little bit.

"Those are a couple of ways by which I relax."

**Hawaii Marine:** "Who is your hero?"

**BGen. Fields:** "My first hero is my mother. If I had to narrow it down to one person who's had the most influence on me, it's my mother. She has taught me all the basics I need to live.

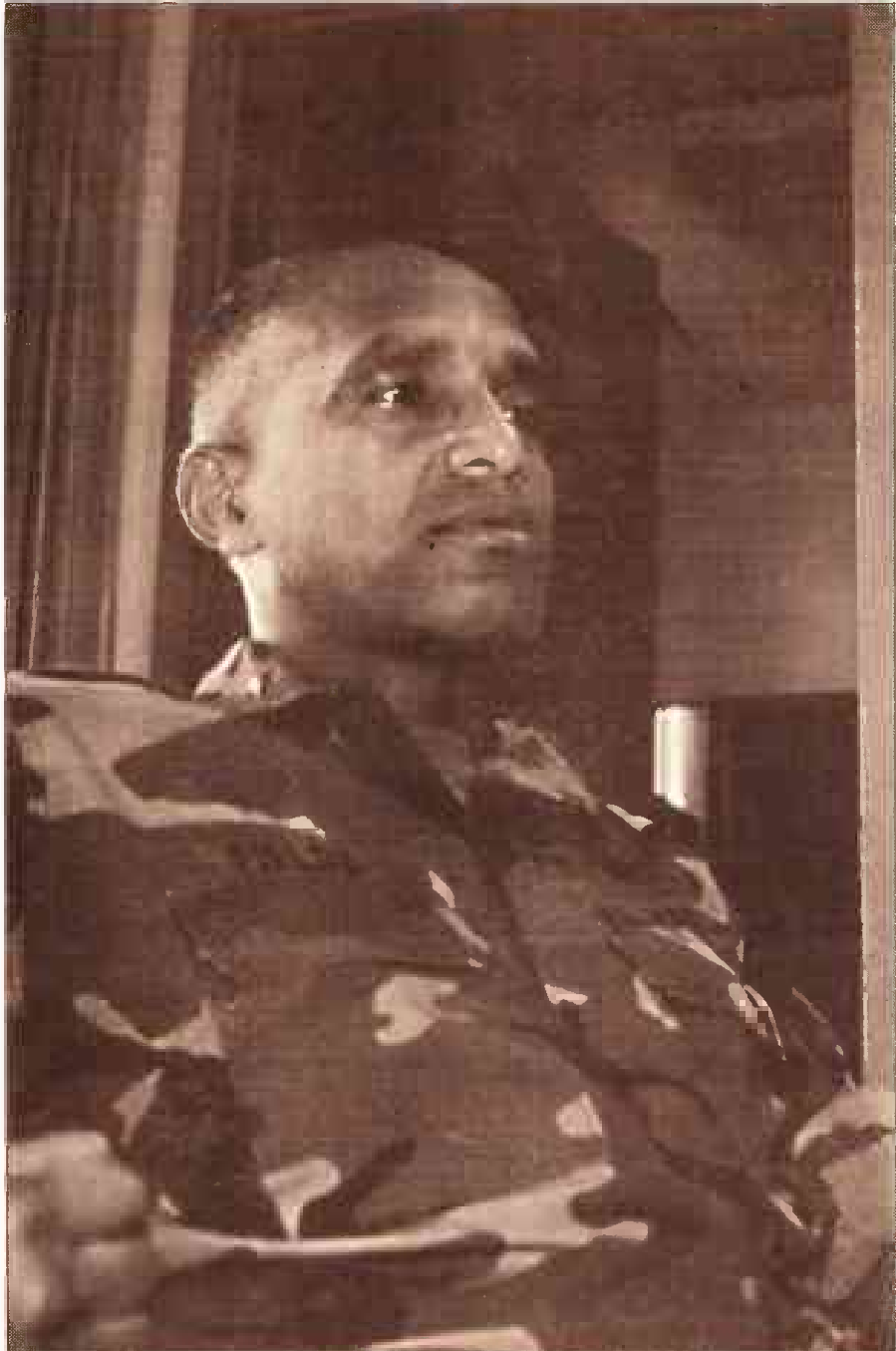
"My mother is not a highly educated person. I don't think she exceeded fourth, fifth or sixth grade in school. But she is one of the wisest, if not the wisest, person I know."

**Hawaii Marine:** "What advice would you give a young man or woman who's thinking of joining the Corps?"

**BGen. Fields:** "It's a great opportunity and a great way of life. It's a place where I was able to replicate all the things I learned at home — honor, courage and commitment."

## Mokapu played, plays major military role

*Editor's Note: This is the first of a three-part series featuring military activity on Mokapu Peninsula. Most of the information in this article was compiled from "Honolulu Advertiser" materials and historic files of the Public Affairs Office.*

From the days when King Kamehameha assembled his chiefs here, to today as the Marine Corps occupies the land, Mokapu Peninsula has played an important role in military history.

The 2,951-acre "sacred place" (Hawaiian meaning of Mokapu was home to the ali'i (Hawaiian royalty) and Oahu's primary productive agricultural area in the 13th Century. But perhaps its most important role through history has been its strategic location for several military organizations, according to Aaron Martin, base historian.

"It's believed that in the 18th Century, the King of Oahu, Pele'O'Iholani, held court on the peninsula," said Martin. "Later, King Kamehameha utilized it for recreation and assembling his chiefs."

King Kahekili, the king of Maui and Molokai, also used Mokapu by staging spies in its Ulupau Crater, located on the peninsula's east shore. Kamehameha was said to be Kahekili's unacknowledged son, according to information compiled in a 1988

"Honolulu Magazine" article called 'Mokapu,' by author Susan Morrison. Kahekili, whose body was half-covered with a black tattoo, built houses from the skulls of his enemies. He spent time on the peninsula while fighting Kamehameha for control of Oahu, according to Morrison's article.

He used Ulupau Crater as a strategic location for his spies because after they gathered information, they could use signal fires to relay it across the 34-mile Molokai Channel to the island of Molokai, Martin said. The high walls of the crater provided a shield, keeping signals hidden from the rest of the peninsula.

Morrison's information said Kahekili later committed suicide by jumping to his death from a 300-foot cliff on the crater. Now known as Kahekili's Leap, this cliff is the steepest on Oahu's coast.

King Kamehameha eventually took control of all the islands to become the King of Hawaii, according to Martin. Only a few other kings and queens ruled before Queen Lili'uokalani, Hawaii's last monarch, signed a statement of abdication and swore an oath to the Republic of Hawaii.

Though the United States military came to Hawaii in 1893, the first United States military installation on Mokapu Peninsula wasn't established until 1918 when Fort Kuwa'a'ohē Military Reservation, a 322-acre U.S. Army installation, began a trend that slowly expanded across the entire peninsula.

Part two of this series will cover the military expansion and events between 1918 and 1951.

## Hale Koa luau imbued with Polynesian flavor

**W**AIKIKI — A variety of Hawaii-unique foods, colorful outfits and a fire dancer spinning flaming sticks like batons, all highlighted the stage Sept. 24 as Polynesia came to life at the Hale Koa Hotel's luau.

The hotel, open to active-duty, reserve and retired military personnel and their families, brings the music and dancing of the islands of Polynesia to a luau garden full of people every Monday and Thursday.

"This is best entertainment I've seen since I got here," said John Thompson, an Oahu visitor from Austin, Texas. "I've been to a lot of the other expensive shows and nothing compares to it."

The luau audience is not only fed the imu pork, they are treated to several other Hawaii favorites such as mahi mahi, fresh pineapple and poi. Those

who don't know what poi is before they dig into the pudding-like substance get a big surprise when they scoop up a mouthful.

"I don't really regret at least trying it," said Salts. "but I don't ever want to do it again."

Perhaps the highlight of the evening is the unique talent of Danny Couch, a Hawaii Music Awards winning entertainer who hosts and performs in the luau. award-winning entertainer who hosts and performs in the luau. "He has a pretty good voice," said Jimmy Steiner, an Amarillo, Texas, native. "His music goes well with the Hawaii theme."

The rest is left up to the wiggling hula hips of the Hale Koa dancers. The young men and women bring to life dances from places such as Samoa, Tahiti, Tonga and New Zealand. Their bright outfits mirror the dance attire of the ancient Polynesians who created and performed the dances.

"I can't believe how talented those young people are," said Steiner. "I don't think I could move like that if I was hooked to a machine to do it for me."

"It's an outstanding show," said Salts. "It's exactly what I was looking for in Hawaii."

"There is a lot of interaction at the

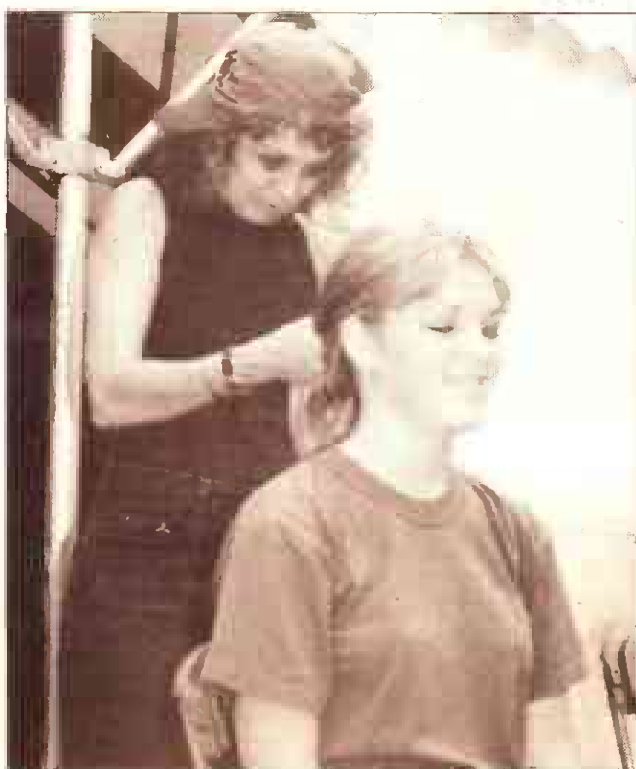

## Island fantasies come true

**K**UALOA RANCH, — The excitement of being on television is just a dream for some of us, but that "fantasy" came true for a few MCB Hawaii Marines.

Filming of the television series "Fantasy Island," which premiered Saturday at 8 p.m. on ABC, included female Marines, as well as more than a dozen women from the other military branches.

Casting. "We're very happy to get them to help out."

Doversola said the story featuring the Marines will appear as the fifth episode in the series, scheduled to air Oct. 31.

Decked out in dirty, drab green utilities, and with her head in bloody bandages, Lance Cpl. Heather Newell, a schedules clerk with MCB Hawaii training, looked very animated for someone who had just recently been carried away on a stretcher.

"Being involved with the filming was a lot of fun," Newell said. "Even though I knew everything was fake, the set seemed realistic."

"It still wasn't the same as really being in the Marines, though," added Newell. "You can't really substitute fake dirt for the feeling of being out in the field for a week."

Newell admitted she liked the television experience and wouldn't mind taking advantage of future on-screen opportunities, though she enthusiastically said she plans to make the Marine Corps her career.

"I think it would be fun to act part-time on the side, but I wouldn't ever want to rely on it as a career," said Newell. "Next time, though, I'd definitely like a speaking part."

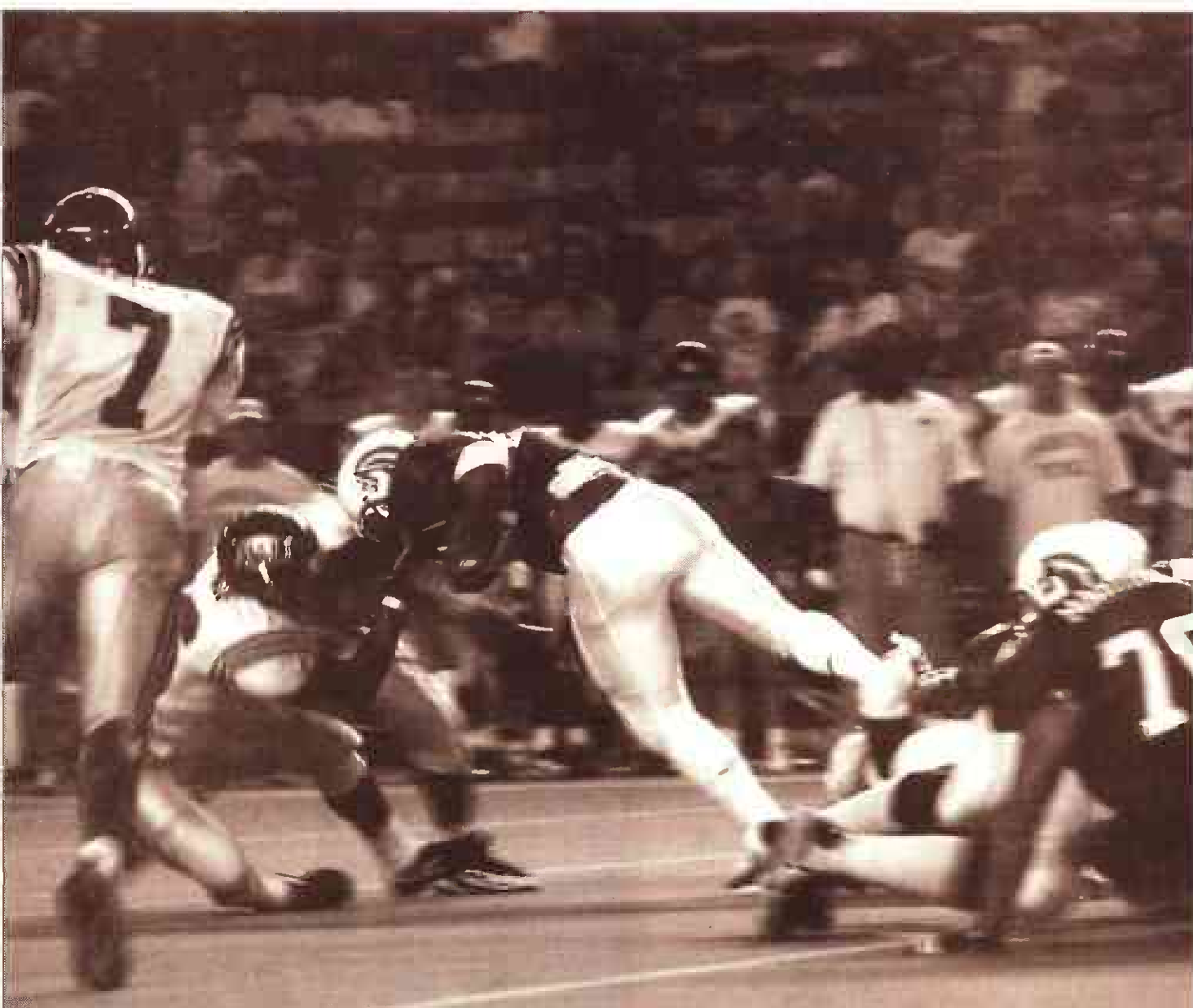

see everything that happens instead of just what the camera wants to show you."

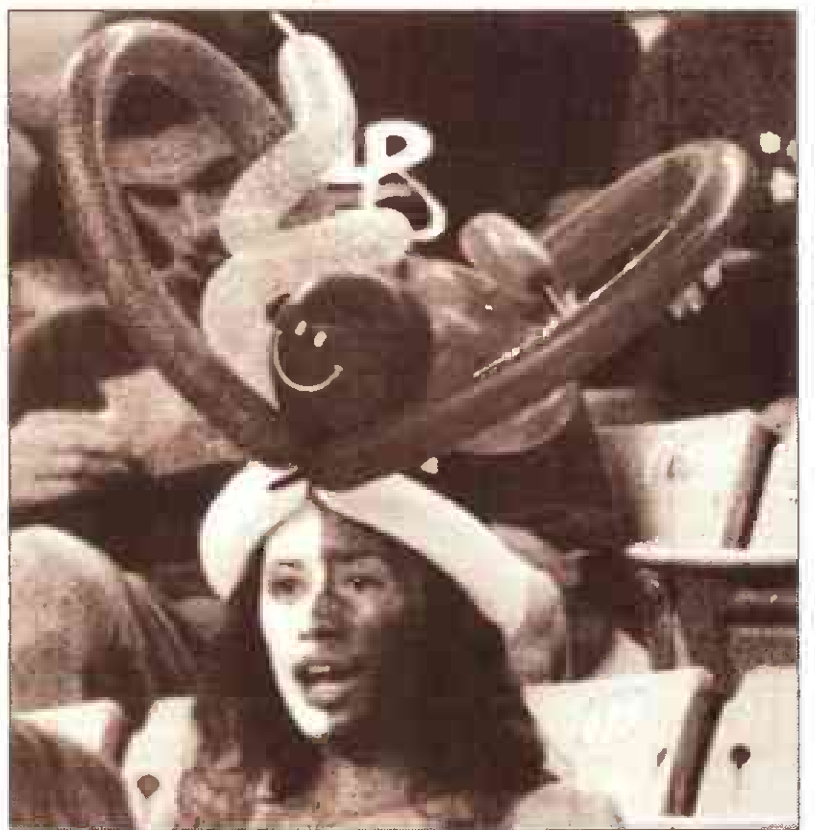
"You get the whole experience," said Williams. "You have the band in the background, all the people and the cheerleaders."

# The first environmentalist

For the past 30 years, people around the world have become concerned with the environment.

We worry about the ozone layer, the pollution of our air and water, the decrease in different animal and sea life species, and the depletion of our natural resources. In short, we are becoming aware of our dependence on and our solidarity with nature.

However, we are not the first ones to discover our solidarity with creation. More than 800 years ago a little Italian man from Assisi realized what we are just now learning. He had such a love and appreciation for creation that he referred to the different elements and creatures as his brothers and sisters.

In his "Cantic of the Sun," St. Francis praises Brother Sun and Sister Moon, he lauds Brother Wind and Sister Water, and he salutes Brother Fire and Mother Earth. Francis realized that like himself, all creation came from the Creator and therefore animals, plants and minerals deserve our respect.

On one occasion, he tamed a wild wolf that was killing and terrorizing the people of Gubbio. He met the snarling wolf on the road and just talked to him. The wolf became as gentle as a lamb and wound up as the town pet.

On another occasion, Francis came upon a field filled with birds. All the birds stayed motionless even though he walked among them, touching many of them with his robe. There they remained until he had finished preaching to them about how well God looked out and cared for them because he loved them.

When Francis finished, he blessed them with the sign of the cross, and they simultaneously took off singing. They separated in an orderly way, forming four groups flying to the north, the south, the east and the west.

But Francis' true greatness wasn't his ability to tame wolves and preach to the birds. It lay in his love of God, love of his fellow man, and simple lifestyle.

His love of God was revealed by frequent prayer and preaching in the countryside. He showed love of neighbor by turning the other cheek, giving away what he had, and finding numerous ways of serving.

So effective was Francis' living of the gospel that in 10 years he had several thousand friars. Today the Franciscans are the largest religious order of men in the world.

With education and effort, we may eventually solve our environmental problems. But if we fail to achieve solidarity with God through worship, prayer and obedience, and with our neighbors through service, charity and tolerance, what have we really gained?



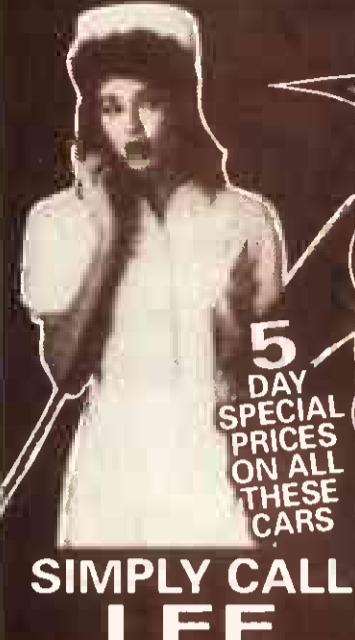
