Red Lions fly mishap-free

The Red Lions of Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 363 reached 10,000 hours of mishap-free operation here Friday, keeping their CH-53D helicopters and personnel flying safely for more than four years.

The 10,000 hours span since March 1994 and pertain to class "A" mishaps, said Capt. David Kirk, Naval aviation training operation procedures officer at HMH-

363. A class "A" mishap entails the loss of life or loss of an air-

"It's a fairly big deal," said Maj. Raymond L'Heureux, the executive officer at HMH-363. "With only seven aircraft on-hand here, it takes a lot more to achieve this."

"This isn't something that happens all the time," said GySgt. Fred Stammer, the current maintenance chief with 363. "It's outstanding for a helicopter unit. With our manpower shortages and the fact that these are old aircraft.

Not only did the Red Lions reach 10,000 hours this week, but they also started the new fiscal year Thursday as the Aviation Support Element's top squadron in flight hours for FY 1998, according to L'Heureux.

"It's fitting that we surpassed this mark on the first day of the new fiscal year," said L'Heureux. "These Marines here work hard and these 10,000 hours can be

Groups focus on equal rights

CMC's intent to sustain transformation

Marines of different ranks and gender met here Sept. 23-30 to discuss equal opportunity issues as part of the Marine Corps commandant's focus group plan.


The commandant's intent was to concentrate on "sustaining the transformation" for Marines by appointing various Marine Corps installations to hold focus groups every six months, according to a commandant of the Marine Corps memorandum. The groups supply a continuing assessment of the equal opportunity climate throughout the Marine Corps.

"These groups are good because they give the commandant a snapshot of equal opportunity issues at a base level," said Master Sgt. Helen Josypenko, the MCB Hawaii equal opportunity advisor.

The groups provide a pro-active approach to handling problems that might be present within the ranks of the Marine Corps, according to Josypenko. The groups were broken down to three different classes consisting of privates to lance corporals, corporals and sergeants and staff non commissioned officers and above, and results of the discussions will be sent to Headquarters, Marine Corps for assess-

The different ranks were represented by males and females, Josypenko said. The groups discussed for two hours issues like sexual harassment, discrimination and the Marine Corps' discipline system.

"The results of the discussions were useful and all groups were very professional during their discussions," Josypenko said. "There was a lot of discussing and not





mortars here Sept. 28 and 29.

The Marines fired more than 900 mortar rounds during two days of livefiring to sharpen their skills.

"The importance of the training is to get the speed and proficiency of these Marines up," said 1stLt. Tom Noel, a platoon commander with B Co. who served as range officer for the live-fire "In combat situations, they'll be able to quickly have rounds on target when having to move with

The live-fire training was also ben-

to the high ground to give the platoons eagle-eyed assistance. The FOs called down targeting data to the fire direction center for plotting target trajecto-

"The forward observers are getting a lot of good practice in as well, with all of the rounds we've been able to fire these two days," Noel said.

The Marines' experience with the firing process of the 60mm guns ranged from novice to salty, but every-

one had something to learn. A mortarman with A Co., Lance Cpl. Andres Ramirez, said he recently came to the mortar platoon from being

a rifleman in a platoon. "This is my second time doing livefire training." Ramirez said. "I've learned everything about the 60mm

eficial for forward observers who took mortar in classes, but I just need the practice and I'll get better."

> "I've done it all on the mortar, but this is the first time I've been the gunner in a live-fire exercise," said Lance Cpl. Cody Nelson, a mortarman with C Co. "You have to make sure you have the correct data on the gun (for targeting). Everything has to be perfect each time you fire."

"The most challenging thing is for everyone to work together to get the rounds on target without visual," said Lance Cpl. Mike Iverson, a fire direction controller with A Co. "Since the FDC is the brains of the mortar section, if the rounds are off target the mistake comes back to us.

The forward observers, fire direction center and gunners were all able to get a lot of practice, according to Noel.

C Battery tunes up

SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, Oahu-Explosions from C Battery, 1st Battalion, 12th Marine Regiment's live-fire exercise echoed off the mountains at range firing point 306 here Oct. 1.

The battery was participating in a tune-up for training at the Pohakuloa Training Area on the island of Hawaii in January, and their seven-month deployment in March to

"The battery is fairly new, with a new commanding officer, executive officer, assistant XO and fire direction officer in the past two months," said 1stLt. Brad Pennella. the C Battery executive officer. "We're coming together really well. The progress has been quick."

The battery trained to fine-tune the teamwork that goes into a successful artillery

"A lot of the new Marines in the battery went through the Crucible together in boot camp, and through training at Marine Combat Training and at Fort Sill (artillery school)," Pennella said. "While they learned to work well together as a team, they need to apply what they learned on the gun-line in action in order to be proficient.'

The battery's gunners positioned their M198 155mm Howitzers in line to provide the most efficient firing configuration.

"Getting the gun set-up is both physically and mentally strenuous," said Lance Cpl. Joshua Harper, a gunner with C Battery. "It may be difficult to learn at first, but once you get the hang of it it's pretty easy."

The gun-line is just one component of the battery's whole unit. Forward observers, communications and the fire direction center all work together to complete the mission.

"One of the hardest things about being a forward observer is judging distance, because the terrain and sunlight distorts the observed distance," said Lance Cpl. Adam Lopez, a forward observer with C Battery.

"The benefit is that we can see the results and the success we have when the rounds hit their targets, which the gunline normally can't see," Lopez said.

Communications is the lifeline to the artillery battery, without which the battery could not fire, according to Staff Sgt. Elias Perez, the communications chief with C Battery.

"We have to make sure the nets are up so we can keep in constant communication with range safety, the forward observers. FDC and gunline," Perez said.

The battery will participate in two more live-fires between now and December, Pennella said.



Observe motorcycle safety precautions

An MCB Hawaii Marine was recently involved in a serious motorcycle accident --- once again reminding us why proper motorcycle training is important.

Over the last five years, motorcycle accidents involving Kaneohe Bay Marines have resulted in six deaths and 14 serious injuries. Almost all of these have been the result of unlicensed and untrained operators.

Operators of government or privately owned motocycles, mopeds. motor scooters or All Terrain Vehicles must successfully complete a Motorcycle Safety Course prior to operation on Department of Defense installations.

Oftentimes trained motorcycle owners loan or sell their bikes and leave the base DoD sticker affixed to the motorcycle. This leaves the poten-

The Corps averages about 34 motorcycle accident deaths annually. We can turn this fact around.

Motorcyclists not only need to

complete the Motorcycle Safety Course, but need to wear DoDrequired safety gear.

The following personal protective equipment is mandatory for all DoD personnel operating or riding on a motorcycle on and off DoD installa-

(1) A properly fastened (under the chin) protective helmet that meets the standards of the Snell Memorial Foundation, the American National Standards Institute, or the Department

of Transportation. (2) Impact or shatter resistant goggles or full face shield attached to the helmet. A windshield, eye glasses or fairing alone is not considered proper

eye protection. (3) A mesh/fabric vest or other upper torso garment worn as the outer garment. The garment must not be covered or concealed. The garment will be bright yellow, international orange or lime green and will have 1 1/2" to 2" wide vertical or horizontal retro-reflective strips front and back.

(4) Hard-soled shoes with heels. The use of leather boots or over the ankle shoes is encouraged.

(5) Properly-worn short or long sleeve shirt or jacket, long-legged trousers and full-fingered gloves.

802 responsibility changes hands

The Hana Like 802 housing area here was officially handed over to the Marine Corps from the Ft. Shafter Housing Office Sept. 16.

With the housing office located on this base, instead of across the island, the move will give more consistency to the residents of 802. The Marine Corps can now serve residents more conveniently, according to Mari Lynn Di Lullo, the new Hana Like housing manager here.

The new 802 office is located in building 460, across from the Family Housing Office here off Lawrence Street, near the Seven-Day store.

"Since the disbanding of the Oahu

Consolidated Family Housing Office in 1994, the Marine Corps has been working with the Army on transferring the operation and management responsibility to the Marine Corps," said Di Lullo. "Our goal is to have a smooth transfer — basically unnoticeable to the current tenants."

Some improvements the new housing management plans to focus on include tree trimming, street sign repair, unit address plaque-painting and renovation to the various playgrounds located within the community.

Residing in 802 is much like living "out in town," but on base. Hana Like residents pay a monthly rental fee to the housing office for quarters, most or all of which is covered by Basic Housing

Allowance.

The 802 housing project includes 276 Hana Like units, located between the golf course and Marine Corps Exchange, and the commissary complex here, according to Di Lullo

The new office, here to assist residents with allotments, accounting and other housing concerns, is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Patricia Samson, the fiscal accounting assistant, can be reached at 257-3472.

All routine maintenance calls will now go through the building maintenance inspector. John Padeken, also at 257-3472. All after hours emergency calls can be handled by the base duty officer at 257-1824.

Neglected playgrounds need care

The newly-implemented. Adopt-a-Playground program is currently looking for units and other organizations to volunteer to renovate and maintain base playgrounds.

The program was thought up by Petty Officer 1st Class Jenni Osborne, a preventive medicine technician at the Branch Medical Clinic here.

Osborne said she came up with the idea after noticing the condition of the playgrounds on base.

"I have two children who like to go to the playground where I live at base hous-

ing," Osborne said. "Most of the playgrounds on base are really dirty and rusty, and I'm afraid to let them play on them."

Osborne said the program will help renovate and maintain the playgrounds, similar to the way the Adopt-a-Highway Program helps maintains highways.

"I went through base legal, housing and safety departments as well as the First Class Petty Officer's Association to ask what they thought of it and all agreed that it was a good idea." Osborne said. "Eventually, it got to the commanding general and sergeant major who also liked it."

The Adopt-a-Playground program calls for volunteers to renovate their

choice of a base playground and be responsible for its upkeep, said Osborne.

Volunteers can landscape, sand and paint their adoptive playgrounds in ways that would make them presentable, she said

Since the plan for the Adopt-a-Playground Program has been approved, all that is needed are people to volunteer for it, said Osborne.

"Anyone who lives on base can volunteer for the program." she said.

The program will host a "kick-off" ceremony in late October. Servicemembers, civilians and dependents are welcome to join. For more information, call Osborne at 257-3428.

Corporals' Course enhances leadership in Corps' NCOs

Many young Marines earn the title of "noncommissioned officer" and are handed leadership responsibilities without any formal leadership training — the Corporals' Course here prepares these Marines to handle those responsibilities.

About 540 corporals attend the course here every year. They spend 13 days in an intense learning environment attaining, applying and testing knowledge every corporal must have.

"When these corporals earn their rank, there is a lot of responsibility placed on them and they need to learn to be effective." said Master Sgt. Edwin Acosta, director of Corporals' Course. "We hold these Marines' feet to the fire because they are NCOs. They are the backbone of the

Before the course picks up, the corporals are screened to ensure they meet height and weight standards, according to Sgt. Ernest Cardenas, course chief instructor. They also take a physical fitness test at the beginning of the course, Cardenas explained.

Once the corporals have established that they meet Marine Corps standards, they begin studying sword manual. This is important because Marine NCOs are expected to know sword manual in order to lead formations during traditional Marine Corps ceremonies.



They also spend time learning how to lead other Marines in close order drill. By the time they graduate, the corporals are trained to take charge of platoon-sized for-

In addition to drilling, Marines also learn how to properly manage physical training, according to Cardenas.

"I learned time management and different PT styles so you could do more than just running all the time." said Cpl. Chiquita Cade, a course graduate.

The NCOs also become proficient in uniform inspections during the course. They stand four uniform inspections both inspecting and being inspected by their

"We teach them how to conduct a per-

sonnel inspection in every uniform," Acosta

"We're providing the commands a means to have their non commissioned officers get the knowledge they need to be good NCOs." said Sgt. Jasen Cunningham, squad advisor at the Corporals' Course here.

"To wait until sergeant to teach these Marines would lessen their effectiveness as corporals and eventually demean the rank." Cunningham said.

Although much of the teachings of the course can be found in non-resident Marine Corps Institute courses, sitting in the classroom is still a better way to learn, according

"The MCI courses are non-resident away from a classroom environment." Acosta said. "You can't ask your books questions you don't understand. Not everything you learn in the classroom you'll get from the MCIs, like learning how to properly counsel Marines, or (hands-on) sword manual.

Beginning professional military instruction in the classroom early in a Marine's career is important because not every Marine automatically has the knowledge NCOs need, according to Cunningham.

"This gives a good overview of how to be a good NCO and how to be fair to Marines," said Cpl. Alan Albrecht, a graduate of the Corporals' Course.

"Every corporal should come here." said Cpl. Angela Mahala, also a graduate of Corporals Course.



Ever had a dog or cat that ran away from home?

Some pet owners might have felt the anguish that accompanies the unexpected absence of their dog or cat.

Fortunately. modern technology has created a solution to ease the worry connected with losing a pet. A small, rice-sized pellet is the key to knowing whereabouts of a pet even when it is

missing. The pellet is actually a microchip that contains the information normally found on identification tags.

When the pet is found by animal control, whether on base or out in town, it's taken to a stray facility and scanned for a microchip. If the animal has one, the game warden on base can call the Honolulu Humane Society to contact the owner. If it's found off base, the animal goes directly to the Humane Society.

The Animal Care Clinic here and at Ft.

Shafter, Hickam Air Force Base and Schofield Barracks have the microchip available for purchase. The price is \$15, plus a \$7.50 fee to register with the manufacturer. No fee is needed to register the chip with the Humane Society.


The chip comes prepackaged in a syringe. A veterinarian injects the chip under the animal's

skin near its shoulder blades. The procedure is mostly painless and the animal generally doesn't notice when or where the microchip placed.

Pets with the chip usually make it back to their own-

ers, but pets without usually don't. Only 30 percent of dogs and 20 percent of cats make it back to their original families.

One might ask. "Why do I need a microchip when my pet wears a collar?" The fact is, collars are great, but they can be removed, broken or misplaced. Chips, however, will always be there. And the information on the chip, such as the pet owner's address and telephone number, can be updated. It's the best way to get a pet back if it's lost.



In turn, Murray has gotten other people into woodworking. Petty Officer 3rd Class Sam Wildt, a corpsman with Medical Company, Combat Service Support Group 3. picked up woodworking from her.



"She was doing it (woodworking) but she needed help, so I got into it to help get her business rolling," said Wildt, who teams with Murray to run JBell, the name of their homemade woodcrafting business. "We can build a quality product at a good price and we do it to help the military community here.

"I started my own business because I wanted to feel what they (her father and brother) felt when the job was well done - the feeling of ripping apart a jagged. misshaped piece of wood into something someone would want to display and be proud of." Murray said.

One of the places Murray and Wildt make sales is at the Marine Corps Clothing Sales Store here. Their shadow and display boxes are featured there for sale starting at \$20, depending on the kind of box the servicemember is seeking and the type

"I refer all people who want a custommade shadow box or any other kind of wood crafts to Jill." said Michelle Jenkins, the manager at the MCCS. "She usually comes in daily and she usually sells about five boxes a week here.

For Murray, it will always be the love for what she does that will continue her business, not the money that she makes.

"This is something I will always do." Murray said, "even if I don't make any money doing it. Woodworking has become a passion and I know the future will be rewarding."

Gen. Shelton warns Congress of readiness problem

WASHINGTON — The members of the Joint Chiefs of Staff told Congress Sept. 29 the U.S. military could return to the "hollow force" of the 1970s unless readiness and modernization concerns are addressed.

"Our forces are showing increasing signs of serious wear," Army Gen. Henry Shelton, chairman of the Joint Chief's of Staff, told the Senate Armed Services Committee. He assured the senators the U.S. military can still execute the national military strategy of fighting two nearsimultaneous major regional conflicts. Front-line forces are ready, but at the expense of the rest of the force, he said.

Shelton said anecdotal evidence initially alerted the chiefs to readiness problems. Now, he said, measurable evidence backs up the contention "that our readiness is fraying and that the long-term health of the total force is in jeopardy."

Several unanticipated factors, he said, have hurt readiness:

- The U.S. military has been busier than was anticipated 18 months ago in the Quadrennial Defense Review.
- · Higher operational tempo has meant more wear and tear on equipment.

· DoD officials planned personnel and base reductions that could not be carried

- · Congress changed priorities and money in the defense budget.
- . The good U.S. economy has meant shortfalls in military recruiting and reten-

"If these trends and constraints continue into 1999 - and some undoubtedly will - we will certainly face some difficult decisions again in balancing current readiness against modernization, against the maintenance of our operational infrastructure and against taking care of our people." Shelton said.

The chairman said that if he had to choose the area causing him the greatest concern, it would be taking care of servicemembers. "The best tanks, the best planes, the best ships in the world are not what makes our military the superb force that it is today," Shelton said. "The most critical factors for both current and future readiness (are the) men and women that we are privileged to have serving in uniform today.

Shelton recommended Congress apply more money to fixing the military retirement system established in 1986. He recommended Congress approve a retirement system that provides 50 percent of

average basic pay upon completion of 20 years of service.

The chairman also recommended more money to close a "substantial gap" in pay between comparably experienced and skilled military members and civilian workers.

"We must act soon," he said, "to send a clear signal to the backbone of our military - our mid-grade commissioned and noncommissioned officers - that their leadership and this Congress recognize the value of their service and their sacrifices and that we have not lost sight of our commitment to the success of the all-vol-

San Francisco to host final phase of Urban Warrior experiment

MARINE CORPS WARFIGHTING LABORA-TORY, Quantico, Va. — The Marine Corps has announced that the final phase of its Urban Warrior project will take place in San Francisco and other Bay Area locations March 15-21, 1999.

More than 3,000 Marines and Sailors will take part in a four-day tactical experiment, followed by a three-day exposition. They are the capstone events of Urhan

Warrior, which is a two-year examination of future military operations in urban environments. The project is the second phase of a five-year experimentation plan designed to prepare Marines for the 21st century.

The tactical experiment will be a low-impact exercise focused on future, international urban battlespaces. It will be an open exercise with public viewing areas established at each site.

A "Forward from the Sea" exposition will follow the experiment. It will feature military and technology displays, AV-8B Harrier demonstrations, and performances by the Marine Corps Drum and Bugle Corps. Three ships from the U.S. Navy's Third Fleet USS Bonhomme Richard, USS Coronado and USS Pearl Harbor will be open for public tours. Ships from Australia, the United Kingdom and the Netherlands have also been invited to

The event has been made possible through the support of the Mayor's Office and the City of San Francisco. "This experiment is critical to our future, both as a Navy-Marine Corps team and as a nation," said Brig. Gen. Timothy E. Donovan, commander of the Marine Corps Warfighting

Laboratory. "On behalf of the Marine Corps, the Navy, and the American people, I want to publicly thank the Mayor and the City for their support of this important event.

"Having previously served in the Bay Area, I knew San Francisco would be supportive of any effort designed to save lives and preserve peace," Donovan added.

The Marine Corps Warfighting Laboratory also acknowledges the Golden Gate National Recreation Area, the Port of San Francisco, Pier 35, the United States Coast Guard Detachment in San Francisco, and the Presidio Trust for their support of the experiment.



Mokapu draws more military

Editor's note: This is the second part of a three-part series on Mokapu Peninsula's military history. The peninsula, a small jut of land attached to Oahu's Windward shore,

is home to MCB Hawaii. Part one of this series covered from the 18th Century when king of Hawaii King Kamehameha mustered his chiefs here, to 1918 when the U.S. Army set up an 322-acre installation called Kuwa'a'ohe Military Reservation. This portion of the series will cover the military metamorphosis the peninsula hosted and a

devastating event the world never forgot. Kuwa'a'ohe, established under the direction of President Woodrow Wilson, was set up as a coastal defense location occupied by the Windward Coastal Artillery Command.

The Navy built its own base on Mokapu in 1939, according to Aaron Martin, base historian. The peninsula, with Kaneohe Bay, was an ideal place to build a sea plane facility, according to MCB Hawaii Public Affairs' files.

By February 1941, two PBY Catalina sea plane hangars were built and Kaneohe Bay was dredged for sea-plane landing to bring the 464-acre Naval Air Station, Kaneohe into operation.

This was the same year Kuwa'a'ohe was renamed Camp Ulupau. A year later, it was renamed Fort Hase after Army Maj. Gen.

Despite new up-and-coming facilities and modifications to the installations, one event overshadowed everything that happened in the 1940s and would be perhaps the most significant event Mokapu would ever be part of - World War II.

Japanese bombers attacked NAS Kaneohe Dec. 7, 1941, just a few minutes before they bombed Pearl Harbor. Strafing runs by the bombers destroyed 27 of 33 PBYs on the ground, according information in MCB Hawaii's historic tour and guide pamphlet. Only three planes, which were in the air at the time, escaped unharmed.

Also during this day, the highest ranking Japanese Imperial officer taking part in the bombing, Lieutenant Fusata Iida, crashed near Puu Hawaii Loa, also known as Kansas Tower. A monument down the hill from the MCB Hawaii's officer club marks the spot today.

Another World War II landmark today is Hangar 101. Bullet holes from the Japanese strafing are still scattered across its wall. According to Martin, the hangar survived two waves of Japanese bombing attack. A fire burned in the hangar all day and destroyed several portions of the building and four PBYs.

The building was named a National Historic Landmark in 1987.

On the other end of the peninsula stands Battery Pennsylvania, a seven-story concrete structure built in Ulupau Crater. It was constructed between 1943 and 1945, according to the pamphlet. Two 14-inch gun turrets taken from the USS Arizona, a ship sunk in Pearl Harbor during the Dec. 7, 1941 attack, were housed in the battery.

The guns were only fired once to mark the surrender of the Japanese in September 1945. They were later dismantled.

Four years after the war, NAS Kaneohe was closed down as the PBYs and other Navy units moved to Naval Air Station Barbers Point on the opposite side of the

But Mokapu wasn't through with the military yet. The Marine Corps moved in 1952 and Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe was born. Over the next few decades, Marine units came and went putting activity on Mokapu through one of its biggest metamorphosis in history

The last part of this series will cover what happened between 1952 and pre-

Marines officiate youth sports

AILUA, — Life's not always fair, but a few Marines from MCB Hawaii are at least making sure the play of youth football in Pop Warner leagues here stays fair.

The Marine officials take the field each Saturday during autumn months for more than six hours a day, calling three games in a row. Each weekend, boys eight to 16-years-old fight it out in Jr. Peewee, Peewee and Midget-class games, and the referees see to it that the games are fair.

We have got to be on our toes at all times on the field," said Lance Cpl. Christopher Malloy, the line judge of the four-man officiating crew, that also consists of a referee, umpire and head linesman. "We can't be slack out there when we have three games a day featuring gradually better and better players."

Like referees in higher levels of competition, the Marine crew watches

closely to make sure rules of the sport are upheld during play. A large emphasis is placed on safety in youth sports, though, so the officials are especially diligent in their enforcement of league rules.

"The rules for youth football are a little more strict to make sure none of the boys get hurt." said Master Sgt. Mario Lopez. the crew's referee. "The main emphasis in the rules is on safety. It's the officials' decision whether or not to allow a boy to play the rest of the game if he's been injured

Even with the enhanced safety rules, Lopez said the games are not difficult to

"When we do these Pop Warner games in town, it's not hard for us because the youth teams are coached very well," Lopez said. "We're able to let the game run smoothly, and make the game fair."

Fairness is something attracting the community to the idea of having Marines as referees for the youth games.

"Windward Oahu teams like using Marines because we have no family ties in the community, so we call what we see with no bias." said Lopez.

Lopez said the people in the community really appreciate the job the referees do, a sentiment echoed by Pop Warner coaches, who shower the referees with

"They do a very good job," said Kailua Mustang Jr. Peewee coach Darrell Poole. "They're more consistent than other referees in other towns."

I like these refs because they let the kids play without slowing the game down with a lot of penalties, but at the same time they think about safety," said Jeff Piimauna, another coach with the

Mustangs' Jr. Peewees. While the community gets a good service from the Marine officials, the leathernecks can take something from the experience, as well.

"It really makes you know the game better, and that makes you play better." said Malloy.




Regardless of how they placed in the competition, the competitors seemed to appreciate spending their time on the archery range here.


