K-Bay K-9s bring competition to heel

Kaneohe Bay's Military Police Department Working Dog Section swept the 13th Annual aboard MCB Hawaii, K-Bay.

It was the 12th time K-Bay's Working Dogs won top kennel with top K-9 honors going to Sgt. Kirt John and his dog Roeska, who beat out 28 other contestants.

The event, held Aug. 25-28, also included kennels from Schofield Barracks, Hickam AFB, Pearl Harbor, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Honolulu Police and Sheriff's Departments. The competition was open to the public Saturday.

The teams competed in explosives and narcotics detection, scouting, obedience, and controlled aggression.

The Marines' K-9 training shined throughout the week, which was evident by their standing at the competition's end. The victories themselves continue to be a major triumph especially because K-Bay's working dog section is severely undermanned, said Sgt. Jon Jerome, the kennel master for the working dog

"We're only able to put seven dogs in the

competition," Jerome explained. "Our handlers are training two dogs at the same time so they have to split their training."

He further explained by saying even though Hawaiian Islands K-9 Competition Saturday. only one of the handler's two dogs was to enter the competition, the remaining dog couldn't be neglected, so the dog handlers couldn't spend their full time just preparing for the competition.

Despite having a crew half the size of the one that competed last year, Kaneohe Bay's working dogs still came out above everyone else's. "What gives us the edge year after year is teamwork. It doesn't matter who takes home the trophies because we all work for the good of the team," Jerome said. "If one handler has a better way of training his dog he won't keep it from the other guys. We're all brothers here."

Even though the event was a competition, pitting K-9 teams against each other was a learning experience, as well as a gauge to measure individual kennels by, said Army Sgi. Scott Anderson, narcotics dog handler with the Military Police Working Dog Section, Schofield Barracks.

"This gives you the chance to see how your dogs compare to other agencies," explained Anderson. "It allows you to see how your training compares to everyone else's. So if

you're getting smoked out there, then maybe you should reevaluate your training."

Allowing the public to watch the dogs in action Saturday was a benefit that increased public knowledge.

"It's good for the community to see us," said Kevin Metcalfe, chief judge for the competition, who's also kennel master for the Federal Aviation Administration. "There are always questions about how we train the dogs. When they come here and see us they get a better understanding for what we do."

For some of the spectators, seeing the dogs live showed they weren't ravenous monsters; anxious to attack, as some would believe. "It's good for people to see that," said Army Sgt. 1st Class Mark Sanders, the operations sergeant with the Military Police Department, Ft. Shafter.

"This shows the dogs can be controlled and that they can be aggressive as well as playful," said Cpl. Patrick Townsend, who enjoyed the show from the sideline with his own puppy.

Although the MCB Hawaii's Working Dog Section Marines have a new notch to wear on their belt, they aren't ones to rest on their laurels until next year.



Pham finished the haircut, and Williams prepared to pay her. As he was pulling out his cash, Pham refused payment. She told him his haircut was free, and she shook his hand and gave him some money the barbers in the shop had collected. They wanted to make sure Williams would have some money to buy his father flowers for the funeral.


Symposium is forum for Corps' concerns

I attended the 1999 Sergeants Major Symposium held in Washington. D.C., a few weeks ago and I wanted to give you all a report

on what transpired. For those of you who do not know what the symposium is all about, let me briefly explain.

Each year, the sergeant major of the Marine Corps takes to Headquarters Marine Corps about 50 or so sergeants major who represent all the major commands



of the Corps. While we were in our nation's capital, we were brought up to speed on the latest developments and the state of the Corps. We also had an opportunity to present and discuss agenda items from our respective commands to be discussed for possible submission to the commandant for action.

Some topics discussed dealt with uniform regulations, pay, and leave and liberty; while others dealt with how to improve the quality of life for our Marines. The symposium is — for sergeants major — the top level of education and a real honor to attend.

I have been attending these symposiums for the last four years, and believe me, each and every time I go. I learn something new about our Marine Corps and how it operates.

This year was pretty special because the symposium began with a welcome from our new sergeant major of the Marine Corps, Sgt. Maj. Alford L. McMichael.

Sergeant Maj. McMichael gave us an overview of what would be happening over the next several days and also some insight as to the direction he saw the Marine Corps going in the next four years. After his welcome, he introduced the 32nd commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. James Jones.

General Jones spoke to us about where he wanted to take the Marine Corps during the next four years. He spoke to us for about an hour and a half about the Commandant's Guidance and answered questions so that we all understood clearly what his intent was. If there was one thing I took away from that meeting, it was the commandant wanted the word "trust" to be included in every Marine's vocabulary.

After the commandant set the tone for the conference, we returned to the classroom and began in earnest what would be a very long, but productive, week.

The briefings began with Maj. Gen. Gary Parks from the Marine Corps Recruiting Command informing us on the state of the

recruiting efforts past, present, and future; and general and his staff. The afternoon was spent what we, the Fleet Marine Forces, could do to assist our Marines in the recruiting service.

The Recruiting Command was followed by Sgt. Maj. Jim Brown from Headquarters. Marine Corps, who gave us a brief on how the new fitness report was coming along in the Corps. He told us that while there were some "bumps" in the new report, by and large, the word from the fleet was that it was generally well-received, and aside from some small tweaks here and there, it was being implemented with no major problems.

On the second day, the sergeant major of the Marine Corps spoke to us about some specific concerns he had about the Corps and threw out some topics he wanted us to discuss while we were in Washington. He also asked us to provide him with some feedback at the conclusion of the symposium for him to discuss with the commandant.

As I said, these were special topics that Sgt. Maj. McMichael had us discuss, but they were not to be confused with the vast majority of the agenda items we brought with us from Marines and Sailors just like you who submitted your ideas and suggestions up the sergeant major chain until they reached Headquarters, Marine

Once your ideas reached headquarters, all agenda items were discussed with all the sergeants major in attendance. Some of those having significant merit for the Corps were forwarded to the commandant for consideration. Some agenda items were sent directly to the branch at Headquarters that has direct control over the topic being discussed. They, in turn, responded to the question/suggestion directly back to the sergeant major of the Marine Corps. All agenda topics that were submitted to the symposium were discussed.

The remainder of the second day was spent receiving briefings by Lt. Gen. Jack W. Klimp and his Marines from Manpower. No matter how many times I get this brief from Manpower at HQMC, I always learn something new. Those Marines who juggle the manpower numbers there at Headquarters earn their pay each and every day. The brief was broken down into several parts that included status of the force, first term alignment plan overview, promotion boards, reserve affairs overview and unit cohesion. We also received a brief on a fleet assistance program reapplication.

Thursday, we went to the Naval Annex and received a welcome by Lt. Gen. Raymond Ayres from Plans, Policies and Operations, then spent the rest of the morning receiving an Operations and Intelligence briefing from the

with Lt. Gen. Michael Williams and Brig. Gen. Harold Mashburn, getting a budget overview and then an Installation and Logistics brief.

Friday started with a brief on Aviation from Lt. Gen. Fred McCorkle. followed by a Public Affairs brief from Brig. Gen. William Whitlow. That evening all the sergeants major and our wives were guests of the sergeant major of the Marine Corps at the evening parade at the Marine Barracks, 8th & 1, Washington. D.C.

Attending the parade was particularly special for Sgt. Maj. Joseph L. Houle, Marine Forces Atlantic, and me, because Sgt. Maj. McMichael asked us to be the reviewing officers for the parade and represent all the Marines who make up the combat power of the Marine Corps. The MarForLant sergeant major and I may not have looked like 8th & 1 Marines; our medals were not anodized and we were not wearing white trousers, but between us, we have close to 60 years of service to our Corps, two wars and several shooting contests that we and our Marines have participated in. To stand together and represent you, the Marines and Sailors of the FMF, and receive the review was an honor we won't soon forget.

Saturday, we all attended the annual sergeants major picnic held at Quantico, Va.. where many of the true legends of our Corps who are no longer on active duty came to meet with us and pass along some wisdom and a few sea stories over a beer or two.

Monday, it was back to work where we received a brief from Sgt. Maj. Stanley Hillery, of the 1st Force Service Support Group, concerning a initiative to enhance sustainment in the Marine Corps. The day finished with briefings by the Marine Corps Institute. the Warfighting Lab and the chaplain of the Marine

The final day of the symposium dealt with the agenda items that were submitted from the fleet. Because we only made recommendations. I am not going to discuss those topics until the sergeant major of the Marine Corps gives us the green light to do so. When he does, I will be writing about them in a future column. All in all, the eight days I spent in Washington were very productive, and I think when the agenda items that we submitted to the commandant for consideration are cleared, you will be pleased with our work. After all, there was not one Marine in that room who only represented himself. Together we were representing 174,000 Marines who make up our beloved Corps. We took our work very seriously.

Marines answer '911 calls' around the world

USS KEARSARGE, Mediterranean Sea — They strike with tremendous force, leaving a path of destruction in their wake. Their victims are helpless, frequently caught off guard with little or no defenses. These modern day juggernauts are more powerful than any army, capable of rearranging the landscape and threatening the lives of thousands of people, they are nature's disasters.

When earthquakes, hurricanes, typhoons, or other like disasters occur, the impact on the local populace is intense and survivability measured in how fast emergency assistance arrives on

More and more in recent years, Marines have been there to help.

"As a 911 force you must be prepared to execute when our nation calls, no matter what the mission," said Col. Kenneth Glueck, the Commanding Officer of the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit (Special Operations Capable).

For the 26th MEU (SOC) the current mission is work with the Turkish government to coordinate U.S. relief assistance and determine what is needed. Currently, the Marines are providing helicopter support to move supplies and will help construct tent cities for those recovering from this disaster.

"Our rapid response capability enables us to arrive quickly at a disaster

site with more capabilities and sustainment, organize and execute faster than anyone else," said Glueck, a native of Palatine, Ill.

Still, the Marine Corps is not just experienced in responding to earthquakes, they have also been focal in other natural disaster assistance. For example, in 1990s Marines came to aid of the Bangladesh flood victims. hurricane Andrew and hurricane Mitch victims in both Florida and Central America, and victims of

Western United States.

Expeditionary Brigade, returning home from Operation Desert Storm, was diverted to Bangladesh after a cyclone hit the country, killing 140,000 people.

wildfires that spread throughout the Termed Operation Sea Angel, Marines, operating in a Joint Task Force, were In May 1991, the 5th Marine immediately able to deliver food and medical supplies to the coastal towns and villages hit hardest by the storm. Using the air assets of the MEB, helicopters were dispatched to carry relief further inland or cut off, due to heavy flooding. Within just three weeks, the situation had stabilized.

In August 1992, Hurricane Andrew caused massive damage to the South Florida. The Il Marine Expeditionary Force, based at Camp Lejeune, N.C., provided assistance by distributing relief supplies. restoring power, and building a tent city for the thousands of civilians left homeless due to the hurricane's

wake. Six years later, Marines from II MEF were called once more to assist hurricane victims. This time they deployed to Central America after Hurricane Mitch left citizens of Honduras. El Salvador and neighboring countries without the infrastructure and supplies needed to November 1998 and over the course of six months restored power, provided supplies and medical assistance, and rebuilt bridges and schools. Again Marines demonstrated their capabilities, only this time fighting a battle against the destructive force of "Mother Nature."

In 1952 Congress established, that the United States Marine Corps stand as "the nations' force in readiness ... for whatever tasks the President deems nec-

According to Glueck, with the flexibility and capabilities of Marine Corps units forward deployed and at home. these tasks can, and have, ranged from conventional combat operations, to peacekeeping, to humanitarian assistance: like those currently being conducted in Turkey.

"The unique Marine Air/Ground Task Force concept enables us to task-organize rapidly and adapt to whatever the mission requires," said Glueck. "We provide our nation the effective and efficient force it deserves."

Extensive training, planning and rapid response capabilities for any contingency, have made the Marine Corps able to live up to the mandate Congress made some 47 years ago. Units such as the 26th MEU (SOC) stand ready to answer the call as not just "America's 911 Force," but the world's.

3/3 Marines practice for non-combatant evacuation

A company of Marine infantrymen kept security around a radar compound Aug. 25, to protect it not only from hostile enemy armies, but also guard it against non-combatant civilians.

That was the scenario at a site across the flightline aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, when K Co., 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment trained in a non-combatant evacuation operations exercise.

"The training gets the Marines to understand difficulties in urban environments," said 2nd Lt. Jabarr Bean, a platoon commander with K Co. "There's a

lot to take into account to prepare to fight, regardless of setting. The big thing is to prepare as much as possible for the uncertainties."

The company trained with two platoons providing security while one platoon role-played as non-combatants. The platoons rotated their roles in the training so each Marine could experience both sides of the operation.

"Doing NEO training gives us an idea of what to expect," said Cpl. Autie Robbins, a team leader with the compa-"Marines will do a lot more to you than what normal people would, so it's

good to have Marines role-playing." "Basically, we just react to what (the role-players) do," said Lance Cpl. Daniel Russo, a rifleman with K Co. "If they're aggressive, then we react with similar force.

"You can use this training for any mission," said 1st Lt. Michael Bennett, Weapons platoon commander. "Marines can be called for disaster relief, peacekeeping and non-combatant operations. Every Marine can use this training."

While there were wrinkles in the execution of the training that needed to be ironed out, the Marines of K Co. practiced their skills in non-combatant training to be as prepared as possible for anything they may face, in war or in



Navy-Marine team centralizes hazmat

Kaneohe Bay's green sea of Marines has turned a shade of blue from the increase in Sailors from Naval Air Station Barbers Point, and now they're working together to prepare for the next millenni-

Sailors from the Navy-Marine Corps team at Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element, Kaneohe, initiated a time-effective and cost-reducing method of handling hazardous materials Aug. 9 by combining all the MALSEK hazardous materials sections as the Consolidated Hazardous Resource Information Management Program.

Hazardous materials included are items such as sealants, cleaning supplies, paint, hydraulic fluid, engine cleaning agents and corrosion prevention compounds, said Smith

Petty Officer 1st Class Perla Smith, the assistant manager for MALSEK's hazardous materials and waste, said she and Petty Officer 2nd Class James Ashcraft, the MALSEK Hazardous Materials and Waste manager, set up a program similar to the one they had at Barbers Point to manage and control the use of hazardous materials.

"It's going to make it easier to control hazardous materials and save money in the long run," said 2nd Lt. Anthony Frost, the Air Frames Division officer for MALSEK.

Instead of having each division in MALSEK collect, turn in, and take inventory on all their hazardous materials, there is now one place where

they all have their hazardous materials necessities taken care of.

Oftentimes, one section had hazardous materials that another section needed, and another section had materials they never used; the new centralized work section, however, eliminates this

"We're constantly tracking the incoming and outgoing hazardous materials," confirmed Smith. "Having 'hazmat' consolidated into one central site will minimize the amount of money being spent on supplies (that are not being used) and maximize efficiency for production.

"It's been an ongoing effort to get this started." said Smith. "Consolidating everything to one point will save MALSEK money and work hours."

As a result of the Consolidated Hazardous Resource Information Management Program, each division of the support element — avionics, air frames and hydraulics, support equipment, power plant, cryogenics. and flight equipment - can get a daily issue of hazardous material from the con-

And with possible Environmental Protection Agency reduction policies for hazardous materials in the upcoming year, this program will help to reduce hazardous materials and waste, said Smith.

"The work centers won't have to be concentrating on the inventory of hazardous materials." explained Smith. "Instead, they can concentrate on production efforts to meet the mission of the







Fuel tank gets face lift

For the second time in less than six months, Fletcher Pacific Construction Company raised an 84-ton fuel tank, helping MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, lead the way in innovative and money-saving fuel tank repairs.

The tank raising, which took place Aug. 18 at the intersection of C and 6th streets, used the Watson Air Lift Method to elevate the tank to a height of seven feet, enabling a 100 percent inspection of the structure surface.

The Watson Air Lift Method has been used in New Zealand since 1983 and employs kevlar bags, which are 36 inches square. to lift the empty tank six inches at a time while bracing the structure on cross-hatched timber until elevated to a height of seven feet.

The pressure required to hoist the tank is more or less the same as

that of a truck tire, about 60 pounds per square inch, said Alan Watson, the founder of the method and president of A.R. Watson Corporation.


"Traditionally, repairing fuel tank corrosion involved adding another lloor within the tank; above the old corroded floor," said Dave Robbins, construction management engineer with K-Bay's Resident Officer-In-Charge of Construction.

The older method actually reduced the amount of internal storage space and could trap moisture between the old and new floors, causing accelerated corrosion of the new tank bottom and potentially speeding up the process by four times, Robbins said.

"Essentially, the old way was just a temporary fix — a band-aid really," he said. But with the method currently being used, workers can repair only what needs to be repaired and subsequently save money, because the tank, which stores up to 1.2 million gallons of JP-5 jet fuel, is actually above ground.

"Why repair the whole tank when you may only have a small leak or very little corrosion," Watson said. "That's the benefit of lifting the tanks."


In some cases, Watson explained, cleaning a tank out just so it's safe for workers to enter, and adding a floor above the existing, corroded one could easily amount to a million dollars nearly as much as the total cost of the current project with the tanks. Originally, the Watson method wasn't an option for the government, but when Fletcher Pacific won the contract, they exercised an option to change it and offered the Watson method, which was subcontracted to A.R. Watson for a total savings of \$116,000.

Paralegal course offered at K-Bay


The Legal Assistant/Paralegal Degree program is scheduled to start classes aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, Sept. 11 for the 1999 fall semester for active duty servicemembers, family members and civilians.

The program, which counts for 30 semester hours, can be completed in 18 months and is taught by Coastline Community College faculty via sattelite.

Developed at Headquarters,

Marine Corps Legal Department, the program is geared toward increasing the skills of servicemembers in the legal field, said Loretta Huff, director of the Joint Education Center.

For 18 months, Headquarters, Marine Corps, has been looking for a program that is approved by the American Bar Association and will benefit Marines when they leave the Marine Corps, explained Gunnery Sgt. Salvador Tinajero, military justice chief with K-Bay Legal Services.



Classes are scheduled for Friday afternoons and Saturday evenings, for four hours each. The reason for this, explained Huff, is because the class is not only broadcast to K-Bay, but also to military bases in Japan.

Marine bases will offer the course and anyone can register for the class, said Huff. Priority is given to Marines in legal, then extra seats are filled by anyone else that is interested.

The course costs \$561, but all active duty

members can apply for tuition assistance or use the Montgomery G.I. Bill. Tuition assistance will bring the cost down to \$140.25.

After taking the course, chances of employment increase tremendously, said Huff.

"Whether you are in the infantry or an administrative clerk, without the proper credentials, the civilian world won't recognize you," said Tinajero. "Now, with the paralegal degree, not only can we call ourselves paralegalists, but we will also be recognized in the civilian world."

Mentors (instructors) and law libraries will also be made available to the students. The first two classes scheduled are Introduction to Legal Assistance and Legal Analysis and Briefing





Criterium a hit with hard core pedalers

The Marine Corps Air Facility must have been charmed when they selected Saturday as the day for the MCAF Criterium bike race because weather and road conditions were ideal for the high-

More than 30 participants each put pedal to pavement on a circuit that covered nearly a mile circumference in front of Dewey Square aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay.

Racers were separated into groups categorized by experience and ability levels, pitting the cyclists against similar competitors. Most military members competed in the two military-only races, for mountain and road bikes, but a few put their skills to the test riding in the more competitive levels.

"This was one of the best races I've seen on the island," said John Boyd, an Air Force captain stationed at Hickam Air Force Base, "The course was well-pre-pared, and it was really fun to compete."

The criterium, as opposed to a road race, is run on a short track and stresses speed, drafting and strategy for success. The racers pedal hard for 40 minutes; then, at the sound of a bell, they have one lap to see who crosses the finish line

"The race was really, really fast," said Michele Smith, who placed second in the closely contested women's seniors division race. She and her teammate, thirdplace finisher Patricia Choo, had competed in the Hickam Triathlon earlier Saturday morning, so they were already primed for the MCAF race, though perhaps a little winded.

"A lot of criterium courses tend to be flat, but this one had a lot of good turns. It was a really exciting course," Smith

"I prefer this type of race," said Boyd,

who placed fourth in the senior men's category five race, after suffering a spill and a skinned knee in the second-to-last turn on the course. "I consider myself a better sprinter than climber or road racer, so the criterium suits my strengths."

"This course has good size and location," said Jerry Ford, chief referee of the races and member of United States Cycling Federation, the official sanctioning body behind the criterium. "It's important to make sure the course is safe, that it's closed to traffic and relatively

Ford said that even though there were buildings which obscured the sight of part of the track from the finish line, parts of the "back stretches" could still be seen from that vantage point, which made the course ideal for spectators.

As this was the first year for the criterium, race organizers from MCAF were excited about offering a new competition.

"We wanted to bring something new to the base, and to get more interaction with the community," said Sgt. Bradley

Adams, a crash crewman with MCAF Aircraft, Rescue and Firefighting, and unit representative and organizer for the criterium.

Many of the competitors belong to Pacific Velo, a local bicycle racing club and team, and a co-sponsor of the criterium with MCAF and Marine Corps Community Services athletic department.

"This was a great learning experience and went well with the assistance of the USCF. All things considered we had a pretty good showing," said Maj.
Christopher Edwards, a logistics officer
with 1st Radio Battalion, technical advisor for the race and member of Pacific Velo. Edwards is an avid cyclist who placed second in the senior men category 1-4 race and first in the military road

Members of all the parties involved said they were pleased with the outcome and saw the race as being a good opportunity for fitness and camaraderie between Marines and the community in years to come.





His feet were pounding to the rhythm of his heart as he soared above cloud nine. Fueled by an adrenaline and endorphin induced high, he raced past runner after runner. What his fellow Marines didn't know was that his performance on the last leg of the physical fitness test was the result of a special little pill.

But no matter, his eyes were set on getting through the finish line first ... that was the last thing he remembered after waking up in a hospital bed.

That scenario could happen aboard MCB Hawaii if the wrong Marine and the wrong dosage of ephedra mix as he attempts to reach a personal pinnacle of physical excel-

Derived from an herb, ephedra, or ephedrine, is a common ingredient found in various sports supplements and can induce a feeling of euphoria, coupled with excitedness and boosted levels of energy, according to Petty Officer 3rd Class Terry Lubio, general duty corpsman for the Aviation Support Element, Kaneohe.

Also known as ma huang, ephedra isn't really a drug at all, said Navy Lt. Michelle Willoby, department head for military medicine at Kaneohe Bay's Branch Medical Clinic. "It's (derived from) an herb and therefore classified as a food." This makes taking supplements containing ephedra a potential haz-

Supplements that are considered herbal are not regulated under federal drug laws; safety and effectiveness do not have to be demonstrated before these products are marketed, according to an article published in the American Family Physician, a publication released by the American Academy of Family Physicians. Many consumers may believe herbal products are inherently safe — simply because they're natural. In fact, however, they can

cause adverse effects on the body.

Some of the documented problems include kidney stones, insomnia, nervousness, seizures, heart attacks, and in some cases death, reported the American Family Physician.

The common dosage for these sports supplement

plements, which can often even be found in military exchanges, instruct a user that proper intake includes no more than two pills per day; two days on and one day off. That's actually 48 milligrams in one day — twice what the FDA recommends.

pills is 300 milligrams of ma huang, which is broken down

ephedra. However, consumers

may find themselves confused

if they aren't aware ma huang is another name for ephedra.

Although the FDA can't reg-

ulate these products, they can

For some of the stronger

Some Marines have ignored the caution labels and have been known to abuse such ephedra-containing supplements. At higher doses, the ephedra can affect the body in a way similar to the way amphetamines do.

I had two Marines drop out of formation when I was with (a Marine Expeditionary Unit)," said Sgt. Michael Lyons, watch commander with MCB Hawaii's Military Police Department. After a battery of tests. Lyons said he was told the Marines were ill from the supplements and one of them had a heart in bad shape as a result of excessive use of

Some Marines tend to use the pills before a run, "but most people don't realize that they're horrible for aerobic exercises," said Lubio, who has been a certified trainer at a nationwide gym chain for three years. "You already speed up your heart when you do those types of exercises, and ephedra will speed it up too; putting additional strain on your heart."

Ultimately, the option to use sports supplements is the choice of the individual. There aren't any long term studies devoted to ephedra-containing products, according to The American Family Physician, so these products should be used with




