Barracks reaching completion

Infantry Marines will soon do away with the old and get into the new as they make the transition from their current unaccompanied personnel housing units to new, first-class home accom-

By the year 2000, most Marines from 3rd Marine Regiment as well as 1st Battalion, 12th Marine Regiment, are scheduled to occupy the new barracks aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, on Mokapu Road, across from Mokapu Elementary School. The first of the new barracks are scheduled to be occupied in late October.

The entire design of the new barracks, both exterior and interior, bring many different changes to the traditional back-to-back column of rooms with bunk beds.

"It's a big improvement in the quality of life for Marines," said Gunnery Sgt. Ewart Lucius, the facilities chief for 3rd Marine Regiment. "It's definitely more of an incentive to have a home like this to come to from the field."

There are eight new barracks; each has four sections that are squared off and have a courtyard in the center. Most rooms are iden-



Combined Federal Campaign to kick off

If a man asked a million of his friends for \$1, he would be a millionaire, yet none of his friends would probably have thought they made a difference for him.

Since 1961, federal employees have made a difference in the lives of others by contributing to the numerous charitable organizations consolidated by the

Combined Federal Campaign.

Today is the first day of the campaign for MCB Hawaii. It is scheduled to continue until early November.

"There's hardly anybody out there that hasn't received benefits from more than one of those organizations supported by CFC," said Lt. Col. Michael E. Kampsen, the assistant chief of staff, force inspector, at Marine Forces Pacific. "These particular charities impact everyone. When we support the CFC, we're really supporting each other."

Through the CFC, people can help contribute to more than 1,000 international, national, and local charities. Contributers may specify which charities to donate to, or donate to the campaign, which will distribute the funds to the various charities.

Donations can be given by either a lump sum (cash or check), or through payroll deductions that help people easily afford gracious contributions.

Each unit of the armed forces stationed aboard Hawaii and across the country conducts the yearly campaign at approximately the same time of the year.

To better explain the mission of CFC and the importance of the charitable contributions, servicemembers and federal employees are offered the opportunity to attend one of five CFC briefs at the base theater, said Jacque Freeland, the project officer for MCB Hawaii.

Former POW speaks at service

CAMP H.M. SMTH, Hawaii — The black flag set against an overcast sky helped set a somber mood as the notes of "Taps" washed over the assembled servicemembers at the Marine Forces Pacific/Joint Task Force Full Accounting POW/MIA Recognition Day ceremony held here Friday.

After the last notes ebbed, 76-year-old Albert Frumkin made his way up to the speaker's position. He was a man who knew only too well the trials a prisoner of

He was just 20 years old when he was captured during the Battle of the Bulge by the German army, in December, 1943.

The POW/MIA Recognition Day is of September. It commemorates the sacrifices of those who were held as prisoners of war, and those who remain listed as n't make it home. missing in action. Currently, more than 88,000 American servicemembers are

listed as missing in action from World War II, Korea, the Cold War, and Vietnam, according to the Defense Prisoner of War/Missing Personnel

Starved and abused, Frumkin would spend nearly four-and-a-half months in captivity before being liberated by the Soviets and making his way back to the States, 80 pounds lighter and significant-

Throughout, he never wavered in his drive to return home to his family and

"It never even entered my mind that I would die there," Frumkin said. "I hadn't fulfilled anything I wanted to do in life. I couldn't die."

Frumkin has spent a lifetime reflecttraditionally observed on the third Friday ing on those months of captivity, and what it was that kept him alive when so many of his fellow servicemembers did-

Defense spending bill focuses on retention

One of the biggest decisions a Marine can make is whether or not to continue being a Marine.

For 50 consecutive months, the Marine Corps has made its recruiting mission. Retaining those first-term Marines after their first four years, however, is some-

thing Marine Corps leaders would like to improve. Currently, 68 percent of the Marine Corps' population is first termers. Last year, nearly 23,000 first termers reached their respective end of active service. Only 5,400 of these Marine re-enlisted, said Staff Sgt. Aubrey Hall of Marine Corps Manpower Enlisted Assignments, Headquarters, Marine Corps, during a recent visit to MCB Hawaii Sept. 13-15.

"Our mission ... is to provide commanders with Marines, by grade and skill, to accomplish the mission," said Hall. "It's very important for a commander to have the Marines he needs to do that."

The Marine Corps needs to retain 26 percent of their

first-term population. That's one of every four Marines. In addition, 53 military occupational specialty fields need at least half of their population to re-enlist, Hall

The Marine Corps is working to try to keep these first termers in the ranks. Whenever a four-year corporal or sergeant leaves the Corps, it takes as much as four years to train another Marine to fill his or her shoes,

Not only does this cost the Marine Corps time, it takes leaders out of different fields, many of which are undermanned and in need of small unit leaders, such as experienced corporals and sergeants, Hall explained. Secondly, it costs the Marine Corps its two most valuable assets --- people and money.

Experienced corporals and sergeants are vital, especially in those fields where noncommissioned officers play a valuable role, said Cpl. Chad Lyman, a personnel clerk with Personnel Customer Service, MCB Hawaii.

"You're always getting new orders and rules, and

when you have somebody who has been there for three or four years, it isn't that hard for him to adapt," Lyman

More so, according to reports from the Marine Corps Times, due to the Military Retirement Reform Act of 1986, which took the luster from retirement benefits, and military salaries that aren't competitive with wages in the private sector, the Marine Corps has found it harder to recruit Marines and keep Marines past their first term of enlistment.

To combat this and other problems stemming from military pay, the Joint Chiefs of Staff addressed Congress about their concerns and needs. Congress has reacted with improvements even higher than the expectations of the Joint Chiefs.

All servicemembers can look forward to a 4.8 percent pay raise Jan. 1, and another pay raise July 1 of up to 5.5 percent. Congress also is increasing re-enlist-

Salute to new chiefs is appropriate

A very special group of men and women in Marine Forces Pacific entered a new and exciting phase of their careers in the United States Navy Friday.

I am, of course, talking about the dozens of petty officers first class of the Force who on that day traded in their dungarees and donned the khaki uniforms and anchors of chief petty officers in the United States

Navy. It is to those very special men and women I would like to speak to this week.

Now, you might be asking yourself why a Marine sergeant major writing a column in a Marine newspaper would be interested in the promotions of a sister service.

Well, I guess it might be because my own career has been so interwoven with the Navy that I feel a close bond with them and recognize that this Navy promotion is more special than any that came before or any that will come after it.

Or, perhaps, it is because I recognize that becoming a chief petty officer in the Navy is the pinnacle of one's career.

Being promoted to "chief" is the Navy's equivalent of a Marine becoming the "gunny." Both titles are synonymous with words such as leadership, professionalism, and patriotism.

Just as we in the Marine Corps say that the staff noncommissioned officers are the "backbone of the Marine Corps," the Navy's saying that, "the chiefs run the Navy" is equally true.

I remember, as a young lance corporal serving at the Subic Bay Naval Base in the Philippines, running into my very first chief petty officer in person outside the PX.

I remember seeing that khaki uniform coming toward me and looking at the Sailor's collar and seeing something shiny. Well, you know as well as I do what happened next. The old saying from boot camp came to mind for saluting officers: "When in doubt, whip it out."

I am here to tell you I saluted that chief

chief petry officers will tell you, they are used to Marines saluting them. And I'm sure the one I saluted had been saluted on more than one occasion, but instead of laughing at me or chewing me out he returned my salute and stopped to talk to me.

He told me he was a chief petty officer not a commissioned officer - and while he that which you know best. appreciated my salute, one was not required. He also went on to say if I wanted to be worth my salt as a Marine, I should brush up on my because he was pretty sure I would be running into more chief petty officers in the future.

He then asked me where I was from and how long I had been in the Marines, etc. All the while I was standing at attention. Why? Because while I didn't know who this guy was, I could tell just by his bearing he was someone important. His uniform was sharp, he had a chest full of ribbons and, most importantly, he spoke like a professional.

I have always remembered that first meeting and, to tell you the truth, if I had a nickel for every chief I have saluted since that day, I would be a millionaire. But you know what? No matter how many chiefs I have saluted or how many different responses I received for doing so, I always remembered the impression the first one had on me.

As'l have said in other articles, you only have one chance to make a first impression. The first chief petty officer I met made a lasting impression on me.

I, as the Force sergeant major, would like to congratulate each and every one of you, not only for what you have done up to this point to be promoted to chief petty officer, but what you will do for our Navy and Marine Corps in

To me, leadership is the same whether you are wearing the khaki of a chief petty officer or the two rockers of a Marine gunnery sergeant, if you're a third class petty officer or a corporal. So please allow me a few moments to pass along this small bit of advice as you don your khakis and anchors.

Never forget how you got where you are or

with my very best hand salute. Well, as most the Sailors that got you there. Be a role model not only for your Sailors, but your Marines as well. Remember that we in the Naval Service share the same core values of "Honor, Courage and Commitment," and try your very best to live those words both on and off duty.

Continue to make yourself available to your Sailors and Marines, to guide them and offer

Rededicate yourself to making the Navy even better than it is already.

Don't hide in the Chief's Mess, but get out Naval ranks as well as my Marine ones on the mess decks and continuously take the pulse of your Sailors.

> Forgive your Marines for getting lost on the ship and wandering where they should not be. If they look lost, show them the way. As a chief petty officer. Marines will always look to you to get them through a deployment or safely to the beach and back.

> And last, but not least, if a Marine salutes you don't make fun of him. Stop him and take the time to explain who you are and what you represent. Who knows? He may grow up to be a sergeant major and you will have had a hand in his development.

> In a John Wayne movie there is a scene on a submarine at sea with a young ensign mourning the loss of a chief petty officer who had earlier saved his life while under fire. Wayne is the executive officer and somehow or another he tells the young ensign that chiefs have been taking care of this man's Navy for many years. The chief had taken care of the skipper, he had taken care of him, and then he had taken care of the ensign. To me, that is the finest description of a Navy chief I have ever heard.

> You take care of your Navy, your Sailors and your officers. Finer words were never spoken. I could only add you also take care of



Young Marine establishes business

People may chase the plentiful rainbows of opportunity in Hawaii to find a pot of gold at the end, but for one Marine, it didn't take bright colors to lead him to his treasure.

Instead, it took a love for card games and comic books to lead Lance Cpl. Chevee Tyler Dodd, a warehouse clerk for Combat Service Support Group 3, into a potential pot of gold with his new business.

"I never dreamed I would end up here," said Dodd. "It's been a big learning experi-

At only 20 years of age, the 6-foot-2-inch native of Morgantown, West Virginia, took over "Pogo Stick" a Kailua game store of collectable card sets, role-playing games, comic books, and other games, along with a civilian business partner, Joshua Bassler, on Sept. 1.

"We both really want this to succeed," said Bassler. "It's been a lot of fun, but a lot of work."

One month after arriving on the island in 1998, Dodd found the shop to be a pleasant hangout; where he could play games with other gamers, from children to older adults. Instantly, he made a great friend in Bassler, who was also a devoted customer of the store.

As time passed and the previous owner decided to sell his game store, he encouraged Bassler and Dodd to buy the store from him and helped them get started in the business. This, along with the help from private investors, helped Dodd and Bassler make a smooth transition into the business world.

"The main reason I bought it is because I didn't want it to close," said Dodd.

And yet, Dodd hasn't neglected his duties as a Marine, as he continues to benefit the Marine Corps with his self-taught knowledge of computer programming — a tool he discovered to be quite essential at the warehouse and in his new business.

"Not only does he have his own business," said Sgt. Lejon T. Nall, the operations chief at the CSSG-3 warehouse, "but he's still dedicated to his Marine Corps mission."

Nall said Dodd was responsible for writing up a computer program that could have cost the Marine Corps anywhere from \$3,000 to



\$10,000, and is currently setting up another program as well.

"With his own resourcefulness," said Nall, "he's taken the initiative to step out where other Marines only dream about."

Together, Bassler and Dodd strive to help one another out to make their business a suc-

"Where I lack, he makes up for me, and where he lacks, I make up for him," said Bassler, the 24-year old partner that is credited with having the business managing skills, whereas Dodd provides his product managing

Dodd said having a civilian partner was essential in the event that he might get deployed and wouldn't be able to take care of the store. It's also been beneficial to keep the business open from noon til 8 p.m. Bassler works at the game store in the day and Dodd handles it in the evening.

Bassler and Dodd explained card games, such as Pokemon, have become a huge success and a great contributer to the success of their game center.

"This whole industry is about games hitting their high and low points," said Bassler. "Pokemon is the big one now. It's intellectually stimulating and entertaining.

Dodd said once he started trading cards, others came to the game place to trade cards after school and play the card games as well, which has helped the business thrive.

"It was an instant success after that. It's become a new form of social interaction," said Dodd. "You can play with new people and just have fun."

Bassler and Dodd said they're both making plans to help their game store continue to succeed, such as expansion into the internet. and catering to card collectors trying to find

And to think, it only took a love of games and a helpful business partner to help Dodd find his pot of gold — the world of business.

"All Marines don't have the ability to foster a new business or go to school," said Nall, "but Marines should be patient. When the opportunity does come, they must be prepared to seize it."

housing ment bonuses, allowances, special duty and incentive pay and restored military retirement benefits.

How does this effect first-term

A first-term corporal nearing his end of active service and teetering on re-enlistment can look forward to his base pay jumping from the current rate — \$1,326 as a three-year corporal — to \$1,520, as of July 1, as a fouryear corporal. And if he's promoted to sergeant by July 1 -\$1,640.40, according to the 2000 military pay charts.

First termers can also look forward to re-enlistment bonuses of up to \$30,000. Fields that are undermanned pull higher bonus priorities known as "multiples." The multiples can range from one to five.

If there's a multiple of four offered in a particular job field, for instance, the Marine's base pay is multiplied by four, then multiplied by the number of years he or she re-enlists for, said Hall.

The money is taxed, the Marine receives half of the money in a lump sum and the other half in increments over the rest of his or her second term, he

The Marine Corps is also seeking improvements concerning re-enlistment bonuses. In an article featured in the Sept. 20 issue of Marine Corps Times, it was reported the Marine Corps seeks a lump sum vice an incremented system of payment for

According to the article, officials said the large sum up-front upon re-enlistment would encourage first termers to ship

Many Marines are glad to see the improvements

"This shows how the government is starting to take care of you and give you more if you want to stay in." said Sgt. Mario Dominguez, an orders clerk with Personnel Customer Services. MCB Hawaii. "It will definitely make them (first termers) take a

second look at re-enlistment. "They look and ask, 'what do I have if I get out?' and then ask themselves, 'what do I get if I stay in?" said Dominguez.

More often than not, especially for a young family, benefits and bonuses in the military will be better than with a civilian job, he said. Now the pay can compete with the private sector, as

"I think it's overdue," said Lyman. "If you compare what a senior corporal or junior sergeant makes yearly to a civilian just out of college with a Bachelor's Degree, it shows we're grossly

underpaid. Now it's getting bet-

Both Lyman and Dominguez agree that reasons besides money, like pride, camaraderie, teamwork, and love for country and Corps, should be they reasons to stay in the service.

"If you get a bonus, that's outstanding," Lyman said. "But if that's the only reason you're reenlisting, you need to take long look at yourself and think about what you're doing it for."

Camp Smith barracks to get renovations

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii -Renovations to the Bachelor Enlisted Quarters here are scheduled to begin in November, affecting approximately 160 single Marines.

The renovations will include new furnishings for individual rooms, major upgrades in the electrical system, window replacement, new bathrooms, and a kitchen in the recreation center, according to a Sept. 2 memorandum from the commanding officer of Headquarters and Service Batallion. Marine Forces Pacific.

The rooms will be furnished as a part

of the commandant of the Marine Corps' "Whole Room Concept," with new drapes, area rugs, lamps, residential-style refrigerators, microwave ovens, wall lockers and new furniture.

Additionally, a newly-furnished common area lounge in each barracks will give Marines a place to relax outside their rooms.

According to the memorandum, the kitchen facility will be added to the nearby recreation center and will include five stoves and three large microwaves. As there is no dining facility at Camp Smith, this will provide single Marines greater flexibility in preparing meals.

The morale level among the barracks occupants has significantly increased since the announcement of the renovations, said Sgt Darryl W. Chambers, Avionics Logistics Division administrative clerk. "I am pleased with the continuous efforts being made to substantially improve our quality of life."

Integration Hub Help Desk technician, who has lived here for about four months, said he, too, is happy about the changes and is looking forward to progress in the barracks.

According to the memorandum, work will to take 12-18 months to complete.

Basic rooms are designed for only two individuals, no bunk beds and no wall

Each person gets his own bed, secretary, desk and chair, and a two squaremeter closet, said Rippel. Other amenities include a microwave, freezer/refrigerator, two lamps, private digital air temperature controls and a bathroom with

All rooms have doors opening toward the center courtyard and large windows, opposite the room, for natural light. To appreciate the tropical breezes of Hawaii, residents can also shut the air conditioning off and open small windows above the door and also the larger windows opposite the door to channel the air through the room.

Rippel said each barracks unit will have a laundry room, a recreational room, and a sun deck on the second floor to be used as a gathering place. And instead of everyone having to park personally owned vehicles in one specific lot, there will be parking spaces throughout the barracks area.

about 400 Navy personnel about July of next year, said Lt. Cmdr. Steve Fischer, the resident officer in charge of construction.

In addition, Fischer said the existing barracks across the street and to the right of the 3rd Marine Regiment building, including building 1028-1032, are scheduled to be demolished in December to give way to new barracks set to be built by January

Between the years 2001 and 2005, Murata said he anticipates a \$20 million project a year as older barracks get replaced throughout the base.

And from 2006-2008, Murata said there is a possibility of further barracks construction.

"Marines and Sailors deserve the best quality of life and the base works hard to provide it to them with the resources it has," said Murata. "We're not there yet, but we're working to get there."





K-Bay to shine on 'Base Pride Day'

arines and Sailors aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay. are scheduled to engage in a massive police call --- one massive enough to free the entire installation and its beaches of debris and

The base will participate in this quarter's "Base Pride Day," which is scheduled for Wednesday, with the aid of nearly every unit aboard K-Bay.

"It's all in the name - Base Pride Day," said Lance Cpl. Gina Logalbo, the in/out processing clerk with the MCB Hawaii Personnel Customer Services branch of Marine Corps Community Services. "If you clean up and take pride in the base you live on, you're less inclined to litter and will have more respect for base property."

The fact that most base units are stopping and taking a day to clean the installation is very beneficial, Logalbo said.

"It's something very important and people tend to overlook things like this due to their hectic work schedules." Logalbo added.

Velasquez said it is the duty of base personnel to ensure the base is kept clean and presentable.

"This is possibly the most beautiful base in the world," Velasquez said. "It is our duty to keep it clean, but we are challenged everyday by tradewinds and currents that continually bring trash on base.



He boiled down his experiences at Stalag 4-B into a code - one he said he hopes today's servicemembers take to heart if they ever face similar obstacles.

Frumkin's survival philosophy focuses on constant training and retraining, followed by still more

"The most important thing I can think of is that when you are training ... take advantage of every possibility to improve your skills," Frumkin said. "Don't take anything lightly because everything that is taught to you is taught for one purpose only, and that is to keep you alive. The little thing you forget is the one thing that you may need to remember in a serious situation.

Without physical fitness, however, no skill level is going to help, he said.

"If I had not been in shape, the chances are that I would not have survived. Something has to give, and that's your body. When it stops giving, you're dead."

To highlight this, Frumkin spoke of other POWs in his group who were unable to keep up with the rest of the column. Those who lagged behind were met with German bullets - gunshots that echoed through the frozen German countryside, Frumkin said.





Community teams up for beach clean up

Nearly 30 volunteers from MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, and its surrounding community joined forces to rid base beaches of environment-damaging garbage Saturday.

The event, sponsored by Ocean Concepts, offered participants a good, wholesome weekend outing that benefits the base as well, said Carl Vincenti, the president of Ocean Concepts.

"It's just a good outing for people on base to participate in and to clean the beaches at the same time," Vincenti said. "People getting together, that's what it's all about — you don't need to have an extravaganza to have a good

'More people, more companies and more bases should have these types of events that bring people from all walks of life together for a common purpose," Vincenti urged. "This was a worthwhile activity that resulted in us picking up lots of trash and having lots of fun
