Punchbowl hosts Iwo Jima 55th anniversary

On a beautiful morning in the National Cemetery of the Pacific, only a small replica statue of the Battle of Iwo Jima gave any indication of what the veterans and gathered visitors were there to commemorate.

On March 16, about 200 Marines from MCB Hawaii joined their honored predecessors, the veterans of the World War II battle for Iwo Jima, during a morning ceremony commemorating the 55th anniversary of the battle.

Amidst the flourishing greenery of the cemetery and the display of numerous American flags, the ceremony brought together several different generations of Marines and unveiled a statue depicting the famous flag-raising atop Mt. Suribachi on Iwo Jima The statue is based on the Joe Rosenthal photograph of the flagraising atop Mount Suribachi.

The ceremony featured prominent guest speakers such as World War II combat veteran, retired Lt. Gen. Alpha L. Bowser, and commander of Marine Forces Pacific, Lt. Gen. Frank Libutti, as well as performances by the Marine Forces Pacific Band and a three-round volley by an honor detail.

More than 30 Iwo Jima survivors and their families attended the ceremony and watched as a wreath was laid before them to honor all the Marines and Sailors who fought the battle.

For many of the Iwo Jima veterans and their families, the ceremony was the final stop in their ten-day tour around the Pacific Ocean, including places like Guam, Saipan, Tinian and Iwo Jima.

"It's all been a sentimental journey for me," said retired Buck Sgt. Gerald Gwaltney, a veteran of the 4th Marine Division, who was accompanied by his wife Virgina at the ceremony. Virginia said her husband never even mentioned the war for

the first twenty years they were married. Now he not only talks about it, but he also showed her the exact place at Iwo Jima where he was wounded long ago. Every survivor could recount several stories of a time most

Marines can only read about, but no one can fully understand except for those who lived it and witnessed the actual raising of the flag atop Mount Suribachi.

"All you could see were these tiny figures up on top of the hill with the flag," said retired Col. Gerry Russell, the executive and

Base couple charged in daughter's death

One Marine was charged with murder Friday, while another Marine was charged with making a false official statement, conspiracy, and obstructing justice Tuesday, in connection with the death of their 18month-old daughter that occurred March 11.

Corporal James N. Bingham was charged with Article 118 (murder), of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. He was taken into custody March 14 for suspected involvement in his daughter's death

Corporal Tricia M. Bingham was charged with Article 81 (conspiracy), Article 107 (false official statement), and Article 134 (obstructing

justice), of the UCMJ. She was taken into custody Friday afternoon for suspected involvement in her daughter's death. Both Marines are at the Ford Island Correctional Facility.

J.ames N. Bingham is a 23-year-old native of Solon Springs, Wis. He is a small arms technician assigned to Maintenance Company, Combat Service Support Group 3, and has been stationed in Hawaii since November 1995

Tricia M. Bingham is a 22-year-old native of Las Vegas, Nev. She is a nuclear, biological and chemical defense technician assigned to Headquarters Battalion, CSSG-3, and has been stationed in Hawaii since October 1997.

Base students 'plant a vision'

Marines, volunteers, and students put a days worth of work into planting more than 1,000 native Hawaiian plants along a quarter acre of land by the stream that runs along side Lawrence Road at MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, March 14.

Nearly 200 students from Mokapu Elementary School, seven Marines from 3rd Marine Regiment and the Base Environmental Department all pitched in to keep the area behind the Youth Center from eroding.

"This is great, it gets kids involved with the environment at a young age," said Matthew Schirman, owner of Hui Ku Maoli Ola nursery in Waimanalo, who supplied the plants and helped plant them as well.

"Every time they pass by (the site), students can see the result of their efforts," said Gregory Koob, owner of Hawaii Horticulture Magazine and a volunteer for the project. Getting the children involved with the environment helps give them an "ownership feeling," he added. The project was not only being done to help the environment

along the stream, but it also serves as a demonstration site, said Dr. Diane Drigot, senior natural resources manager at Base She said that this project is part of a vision to have more peo-

ple on base put forth efforts to restore the natural stream that runs from the Nu'upia Ponds Wildlife Management Area to the Klipper Golf Course.

"We have planted the vision and now we will watch it grow," said Drigot. "Hopefully this site will draw more people into other similar projects."

Mokapu 6th grade science teacher Sharalyn Richards said she and other teachers at Mokapu gave their students lessons about the environment, but "they were never able to let their students apply what they learned."

"In environmental studies class, this (stream) was a problem the students had to solve," said Richards. "The students made a design of low growing shrubs to keep the ground from eroding."

After designing a plan, the children and volunteers began carrying it out by ordering plants, preparing the site with mulch and finally planting.

In addition to digging holes, planting ferms and other plants, and digging a trench around the site, the students also learned that the stream was the site where many of the Mokapu Elementary School's mascots, the Hawaiian Stilts, go to feed.

"It's good working together," said 6th graders Verna Agluguv. "This is also a good project for kids like us. We learn a lot about the environment." Base Environmental plans on putting a sign up at the site to

explain the site's purpose and give information on the types of plants that were placed at the site. "Being out in nature is important," said Richards. "These kids

move around a lot and hopefully they can take what they have learned and done here with them wherever they go."

Kaneohe Bay offices pass inspections, set new standards

Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, Marines were put to the test and excelled during the Marine Corps administrative analysis team inspection conducted March 6-10.

Personnel Support Center, Headquarters Battalion, MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, and MCB Hawaii Finance Office both scored above the Marine Corps average on their inspections.

Personnel Support Center scored a 99.47 percent on the inspection, while the finance office scored a 96.55

MCAF Marines to enter 'Electron Marathon'

Three Marines from Marine Corps Air Facility are "doing more with less" in the Year 2000 Hawaiian Electron Marathon go-kart race Saturday as they compete against teams from other armed services.

The race, in its fifth year, is geared towards high school students, but the military services have been allowed to participate in their own category since last year.

The Marine team spent the last three months piecemealing together a car they hope to rival those built by other services that started out with several advantages Marines did not have, said Staff Sgt. David John, a training chief for MCAF and head of the Marine team.

Each team entered in the race received a basic car kit, including an electric motor and a small box of parts. Teams used their imagination and knowledge in subjects such as aerodynamics and construction to go from there.

The Marine team easily received encouragement from its command, but lack of financial support put the team at a disadvantage from the rest of the competition, John said.

Because of delays in funding and coordination, the team had a late start compared to the other participants. Stephen Luckett, one of the race coordinators, helped the Marines get started by scrounging up an old prototype car for them.

"We'd like to win, of course, but we're operating with donated parts," said John. "We've got to do with what we got, and hope to drum up support this year."

John, Lance Cpl. Luke Telfordwood, and Lance Cpl. John Mangus took the prototype car, reached into their pockets, and began replacing parts and modifying the basic design.

The team said they envision this as a positive recruiting aid for the Marine Corps. The race helps show high school students throughout

the students a chance to interact with the

"You've got some pretty bright kids out there looking to do something with their lives," John said. "I think it would be a pretty decent recruiting tool.'

The team's goal this year is not only to spark some interest in the students, but also in other Marines. Telfordwood envisions involving Marines throughout the entire base for next year's event.

"We're electronics technicians, so that part 8 a.m.

Hawaii that Marines can have fun too, and gives basically suits us," said Telfordwood. With the addition of mechanics and welders, he said they could construct the car from the ground up, with left-over military equipment.

3/3 brings Mortar School to 3rd Marine Division

More than 60 mortarmen from 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, increased their proficiency on two mortar systems at the only mortar school in the 3rd Marine Division.

From classes at MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, to live firing at Schofield Barracks, the two-week school helped Marines become more familiar with the 60mm and 81mm mortar systems, as well as all the sections of a

"I heard one of my senior lance corporals say, 'I learned more about my job last week than I have in two and a half years," said Sgt. Larry Burch, a section leader with 81mm mortar platoon, Weapons Company, 3/3.

Marines from private to sergeant were allowed to work on the gun line, at the fire direction center and as forward observers, explained 1st Lt. Brian McLaughlin, the

81mm mortar plt. commander, Weapons Co.,

The training was a shorter version of the mortar schools with 1st Marine Division, Camp Pendleton, and 2nd Marine Division, Camp Lejeune. The 3/3 school was designed by Staff Sgt. Dennis Dodd, 81mm mortar platoon section leader, as a battalion-sized school.

Junior Marines also got the chance to see what senior Marines would normally see, explained Cpl. Cameron Clarke, squad leader

"This is pretty good. The junior Marines get to call for fire and learn about the computer plotting system," said Clarke, explaining that Marines learn about all the responsibilities for each job in a mortar unit. "I don't have to watch over them as much."

Marines who attended the school learned the aspects of each system, which allows the unit to be more self-sufficient.

After the Marines complete the school, McLaughlin said that they could function on their own with little to no supervision.

What made the training even better, explained Burch, was the fact that the senior Marines demonstrated with practical application, what was written in the text books.

During the firing week, the Marines were able to practice what they were taught.

"We have a chance to sit down with the Marines and teach them tricks of the trade," said Burch, who was a 60mm mortar section leader for four years prior to joining 3/3's

Later this year, 3/3 is scheduled to deploy to Okinawa and apply the skills they learned at the school.

McLaughlin and Dodd plan on developing the school to train all the mortarmen in the regiment by the time 3/3 returns from deploy-



SERGEANT MAJOR'S CORNER

Servicemembers must protect themselves

What is the response the Department Defense usually takes after a terrorist attack has

been launched against our forces any place in the world? Well, first of all, you know as well as I do that you see more identity checks at the gates, don't you? You also see an increase in

Holub security at the clubs, exchanges and at headquarters

For a time after an attack, everyone in the chain of command is motivated to increase security and make sure that all our bases, and their Marines, Sailors and family members, are protected.

Now having answered that question, let me ask you this: what do you think the chances are that terrorists, as cowardly as they are, would be so stupid to attack us again once our guard is up? Probably slim to none.

This week, I would like to talk to you about the need to remain vigilant against terrorist attacks rather than doing damage control by reacting to

Marines, I will be frank with you. We live in a very dangerous world. There are, unfortunately, a great many bad guys out there who are not very friendly toward the United States, our allies, or our way of life. Given the opportunity, they would like nothing better than to do us harm.

As your Force sergeant major, I would like to tell you that you and your families are completely safe and have absolutely nothing to worry about, but I cannot.

Doing so would be lying to you, and that is something I will not do.

Now, while there is no specific threat that has prompted me to write about this particular subject - and I certainly do not want to start a panic - I still feel compelled to raise this issue now so we can address the topic "before" something happens

rather than "after" an attack. What I would like to do is heighten your awareness of the threat, and your responsibilities for your own personal security, and that of your units and your families.

First of all, what is terrorism?

Terrorism is "the unlawful use or threatened use of force of violence against individuals or property to coerce or intimidate governments or societies, often to achieve political, religious, or ideological objectives."

That is the book definition.

SgtMaj. Holub's definition is much simpler terrorism is the cowardly act of violence against innocent men, women and children to achieve some goal. It can come in the form of foreign terrorism as in the bombings in Nairobi, Kenya, or the domestic type, as in the Oklahoma bombings carried out by disgruntled citizens.

In short, it is attempt by the bad guys to kill or maim as many of the good guys as they possibly can, and get away with it.

Some of you might think that these are random acts, but believe me, they are not. For days, and sometimes weeks, the target is observed while the would-be terrorists devise their plan.

You see, being the cowards they are, they look for an easy target — one that will be easy for them to attack and get away. An easy target is one that is oblivious to the threat and goes about a daily schedule without a thought to personal or professional security. An easy target believes an attack, when it happens, will always happen somewhere else and 'will never happen to me.'

What can you do to prevent these acts? Plenty. First and foremost, you must understand there is a very real threat to our nation and its servicemem-

bers by groups and/or individuals that are unfriendly toward the United States. Second, you can do an assessment of your per-

sonal security measures and make yourself and your unit a "hard target" for those individuals who would like to do us harm.

Third, you must remain vigilant to the threat. If you are in a leadership position, I would rec-

ommend monthly classes for your units and their families to go over security measures that are in place aboard your bases and stations designed to

I would also recommend basic classes for personal protection be given as part of the L.I.N.K.S., Key Volunteers, and all officer and enlisted spouse

Because the more you talk about terrorism, the more likely you are to be aware of it, thus making yourself or your unit a less attractive target to someone who is looking for a "soft target" to attack.

For the individual Marine and Sailor, I recommend you and your spouses get and read cover-tocover a copy of FMFRP 7-14A, "The Individual's Guide for Understanding and Surviving Terrorism," and JS Guide 5260 "The Service Member's Personal Protection Guide: a Self-Help Handbook to Combating Terrorism." It just might save your life or theirs.

The effectiveness of terrorism lies not in the act itself, but in the public's, or in our case, the government's reaction to it. If you make

yourself and your

Major unit a less attractive target, terrorists will have no other choice but to go looking else-

In effect, by remaining vigilant to the threat and understanding the threat is a very real possibility, and by taking active and passive measures to protect yourself and your fellow Marines and Sailors, you can effectively shut down any terrorist activity in your area.

where for a target that is easier for them to attack.

Will it ever go away completely? Unfortunately, I don't think so.

There are far too many terrorist groups in the world to ever get rid of them all. You know as well as I that since the United States is a world leader, we will always be targeted by those groups for our stand on issues that may be in conflict with theirs.

That is the burden our nation carries for being a

world leader.

By becoming more aware of the threat, you will be lessening your chances of becoming a victim. In short, you would make yourself a "hard target."

One simple thing you can do to make yourself less likely to be a soft target would be to be to make yourself inaccessible. Terrorists like their intended victims to be easy to approach, and tend to bypass those that are more are difficult to get to.

By keeping your quarters well lit, and in some cases by owning a dog, you can go a long way in insuring your safety. I don't mean for you to live in a fortress and buy a German Shepherd, but simply limit access by those who would think about doing

Also, you should be more unpredictable. What I mean by this is to go about your regular business but without any pattern or routine.

> conscious, and adhere to individual protective measures that your unit recommends.

> These are but a sample of the simple things you can do to protect yourself.

> Be aware of your sur-

roundings, be security-

I recommend that for more information about what you can do to protect your units, yourselves, and your families, contact

your S-2 sections. The bottom line is the more you know about

your enemy, the better chance you will have at protecting yourself and your loved ones. Terrorism is a tool in which the bad guys can take a swing at the good guys, and get away with a

sucker punch. But by being aware the threat exists and by taking some simple protective measures, you can ensure this does not happen to you or your

Remember you are very important to our country, our Corps and your families.

Take care of yourselves and each other, and don't allow yourselves to be sucker punched.

K-Bay Marine returns from symposium

Very few Marines get the chance to face the Commandant of the Marine Corps Gen. James L. Jones, but during the first-ever noncommissioned officers symposium, they did just that. Twenty sergeants from around the Corps recently expressed their comments and opinions to the Commandant at Headquarters Marine Corps.

Representing MCB Hawaii, Sgt. Scott Strum, the platoon sergeant for Base Communications and Information Systems Management Office, teamed up with nineteen other sergeants in Washington, D.C. during the week-long symposium.

"We've been hearing for years, 'empower the NCOs!' but no one has ever empowered the NCOs," said Strum. "Now we have a symposium to brief the Commandant."

After arriving in Washington, D.C. Feb. 28, Strum got together with the other sergeants and began a week of briefs, discussions and exercises that led up to the final presentation of cumulative issues to the comthere were young sergeants with no conduct

Altogether, the sergeants had a total of 84 different issues they brought with them from their commands, but at the end of the week they managed to narrow down the topics and briefed the commandant on 24 issues of con-

"A lot of my issues were incorporated into other things," said Strum, who brought forth about ten topics he gathered from Marines

Several of the topics brought up by the sergeants included issues on childcare, increased infantry training, active duty spouse entitlements, service uniforms, and appropriate civilian attire.

The sergeants discussed a great deal of the issues in front of computers in a "chat" format, where each person could instantly see anonymous comments by the other sergeants, much of which was observed by Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps Alford L. McMichael.

"I would say the biggest surprise was that

medals and there were sergeants coming up on 13 years of service," said Strum, who at times was a discussion leader during the symposium. "To lead 19 other high quality NCOs at times was a huge leadership challenge for me."

Other surprises for Strum included the open-discussion setting for all the sergeants. Strum said both Sgt. Maj. McMichael and Gen. Jones were easily approachable and wanted to listen to the concerns of all the NCOs in a relaxed atmosphere.

"They care about their Marines," said Strum. "They want to know what their Marines want. To see how much they cared up there — that amazed me.

Once the NCOs briefed the commandant on Friday and the symposium had reached its end, Strum said the sergeants were looking forward to the next NCO symposium.

"I had a great time, and I hope they have another symposium next year," said Strum, who added there is not another symposium scheduled yet. "It's probably the best thing that's happened in my entire career."





Resumix streamlines job search in Hawaii

The Department of the Navy recently streamlined the job-application process in Hawaii with adoption of a new automated electronic resume system, which benefits all prospective government employees, such as military veterans, servicemembers near their end of active service date, and their family members.

"It's lightning fast compared to the other (manual) system," said Larry Hilding, the director for the Human Resources Office aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay. "The new system will be the first choice in filling job positions."

In the past, anyone in Hawaii who sought a government job with the Department of the Navy had to wait for a vacancy before they could apply for that position. But with the

Referral System (STAIRS) and Resumix software, applicants can easily and instantly be matched with constantly updated job posi-

"We're getting to the point where we're going to look at (STAIRS) for the majority of the job vacancies we have now," said Hilding. "I'm particularly excited in seeing the resumes build up."

Applicants can instantly fill out their resumes via the Department of the Navy's On-line Resume Builder on the Navy's homepage.

The "applicant friendly" step-by-step process allows applicants to plug in their personal information, work experience. education, and other work-related information directly into the computer via the internet.

The finished resume not only matches

new Standard Automated Inventory and applicants with available jobs but also stores the resume in a "bank" of applications to continue matching qualified applicants with future job positions.

> More than 130 applicants filled out their resumes online since MCB Hawaii became the home of the first Human Resources Office in the Pacific to implement the new system Feb. 1, said Hilding.

"Employees need to get their resumes in as soon as possible so they don't miss out on any assignment opportunities," said Annette Watanabe, the personnel assistant at MCB Hawaii's HRO.

Applicants can also electronically mail their resumes as well as send it in the mail. For more information on filling out resumes or acquiring the online capabilities to fill out resumes, contact the MCB Hawaii, HRO at

conducted the first census in 1790, there were 7 million Americans and the largest states were Virginia and New York. He urged the students to tell their parents about Census 2000.



commanding officer of 2nd Battalion, 27th Marine Regiment. "Before that, we were really down on men and getting clobbered, and so, seeing the flag up there was an inspiration. It made us realize in our hearts that no matter what, we were going to win." he added. Before he knew it, Russell said he heard a growing sound of cheers, and as he looked behind him, he noticed about 80 ships near the shore and an evergrowing sound of whistles.


"That was one of the most inspiring moments I think any one of us can remember," said Russell.

26th MEU wraps up A.P. Hill deployment

FORT A. P. HILL, Va. — Not even a severe blizzard could stop the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) and parts of it's Major Subordinate Elements (MSE) from completing their first pre-deployment field training exercise here.

The surprise weather was just one of the many reasons A.P. Hill has left members of the 26th MEU optimistic about their July deployment to the Mediterranean Sea.

"This has been an excellent opportunity for [each element of the MEU]," said Capt. Tim A. Sheyda, Charlotte, N.C. native and forward air controller with Battalion Landing Team (BLT) 2/2. "A.P. Hill is the first opportunity for the entire MEU to operate together. It gives everyone a chance to see how things will integrate."

For the MEU's Command Element (CE), this was their first chance to see this integration first hand. In year's past, the CE has not attended the A.P. Hill exercise.

According to CWO-2 Nathaniel S. Cass, the Nuclear, Biological and Chemical officer with the 26th MEU, lessons learned in past operations, like 1999's Operation Joint Guardian, changed all that.

"[In operations like Kosovo,] we learned that having command and control ashore was a valuable asset," said the Anapolis, Brazil native. "So deploying to A.P. Hill gave us a chance to begin training with the other elements sooner than we normally would have."

According to Cass, when the Command Element arrived, they began setting up shop, to include establishing a forward command element, setting up internal communications and bringing the Joint Task Force (JTF) Enabler online.

This important piece of equipment provides lines of communication from anywhere

"Things are running smooth," said Combat Service Support Chief SSgt. Tim R. Weber, of Versailles, Ky. "But we're still pushing to be better and to be the best [MSSG].' If things go as Marine Medium Helicopter

Squadron-264 (Reinforced) safety officer Capt. Lloyd Phillips plans, the 26th MEU will have the best Air Combat Element.

"We had very little time to plan for this," said the Salisbury, N.C. native, "which I found out was difficult at first.

But it will be a great help down the road; being an expeditionary unit will become second nature."

The ACE provided helicopter lifts, inserts and extractions. They also participated in live-fire exercises by providing important aerial artillery for the MEU. According to Capt. Gerald Graham, ACE future operations officer and Miami, Fla. native, this exercise not only provided good training, but was an opportunity to establish a good relationship with the BLT, down to the small unit level.

"We have had superb support from the ACE," said LtCol. Larry D. Nicholson, BLT 2/2 commanding officer. "We've had over 14 company size (helicopter) lifts over the last two weeks, and we did that with snow and ice on the ground."

In addition to support from the ACE and other elements of the MEU, BLT Marines also found the geographical location useful.

"A.P. Hill gives us a wooded environment and terrain that are different from what we see every day at Lejeune," said 1st Lt... William B. Allen IV, Combined Anti-Armored Team platoon commander and Woodstock, Va. native.

"This location also has several ranges, meaning we took part in more live-fire exercises here than we probably will during any other throughout the work-up process."



Island organization offers freefalling lessons license-free

Jumping out of a perfectly good airplane at 13,500 feet above the ground is not a natural human act. It takes a person who possesses certain mental characteristics to perform that last step into a freefall of rushing air and impending doom.

For thrill seekers on Oahu who like to live life on the edge of danger, there is a place to receive that adrenalin rush a person gets while freefalling to the earth 160 feet per second.

Pacific International Skydiving Center at Dillingham Military Reservation, east of Wailua on the north shore of Oahu, is a place where a person can get that rush of excitement and fear.

"It's the closest thing to being like Superman there is," said Petty Officer 2nd Class Micheal R. Byrd, an eletrical technician at Pearl Harbor. Byrd is a beginning skydiver with 19 dives under his belt

is a beginning skydiver with 19 dives under his belt.

Dillingham Military Reservation, is the only 'drop zone' for skydiving enthusiasts in the state of

The center offers people who have never been skydiving, and are not certified by the United States Parachute Association to freefall alone, a chance to skydive in a form called tandem imming

skydive in a form called tandem jumping.

People who have not taken the required classes to freefall, as required by the USPA, can skydive and

freefall with a tandem master.

A tandem jump is when a beginning skydiver jumps out of a plane with an experienced and quali-

fied parachutist attached to their back.

The tandem master will assist the novice skydiver at maintaining proper freefalling form, monitoring the altimeter on his wrist and pulling the rip cord at the right time.

The tandem master is primarily responsible for

ensuring a safe dive.

At 13,500 feet the skydiver and tandem master have approxiamately 45 seconds of freefall before pulling the ripcord at roughly 7,000 feet and floating gently to the ground.

The total time of the jump (from the plane to the ground) is any where between five to seven minutes.

The staff at PISC is certified by USPA and takes great pride in having a clear record of any accidents.

Their attention to detail and the quality of their work means the difference between an exciting experience someone will remember for the rest of their lives and a sudden stop at the end of a two-and-a-half mile freefall.

Each Pacific Skydiving Center tandem master is a trained professional and must have at least 500

dives or six hours of freefall under their belt before even being considered for tandem master training.

People who want to take an accelerated freefall course, so they can skydive without a tandem master attached to their back, can do so at the Pacific Skydiving Center.

The course costs less than \$1,300 and can take from one to four weeks to complete depending on an individual's dedication, and of course, the weather.

It is recommended that each skydiving enthusiast perform a tandem jump before enrolling into the accelerated freefall course.

Some people like to have proof of their skydiving experience and Pacific Skydiving Center can accommodate them with photographs and even a music video of their dive.
