U.S. will not cut troop levels in Saudi Arabia

JEDDAH, Saudi Arabia — U.S. troops will not reduce troop levels in the area, contrary to news reports.

The April 9 story quotes an anonymous U.S. military official saying that Defense Secretary William S. Cohen and Saudi Defense and Aviation Minister Prince Sultan agreed to reduce troop levels at Prince Sultan Air Base.

"The story is complete hogwash," said Pentagon spokesman Ken Bacon. "We have no plans to reduce the number of airmen or planes at Prince Sultan Air Base, and the topic of reducing airmen in Saudi Arabia was not discussed tonight between Secretary Cohen and Prince Sultan. In fact, Prince Sultan expressed a strong desire for a continued U.S. presence in Saudi Arabia at current levels."

U.S. Ambassador to Saudi Arabia Wyche Fowler said there "has

been no discussion whatsoever at any level about reduction of American soldiers." There are about 4,000 U.S. service members in Saudi Arabia.

During a news conference following meetings between the prince and Cohen, Sultan said the U.S. troops are in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia under the U.N. framework to conduct operations over Southern Iraq. "These troops are doing their duties to keep the peace only, not to be aggressors," Prince Sultan said. "Whatever is said more than that is not true."

Cohen and the prince said the discussions were fruitful. One part of the discussions centered on the Peninsula Shield forces of the six Gulf Cooperation Council — Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Bahrain, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates and Oman.

All six GCC countries contribute to the force, but it is more a paper force than a real one. The forces only exercise together about once

every two years. Prince Sultan suggested the United States join with Peninsula Shield forces to achieve more multilateral exercises.

The prince also commented on U.S.-Iranian relations. He said Saudi Arabia called for peace, and he hoped Iran would respond "with what is in its security interests. All steps taken by the United States toward this goal are welcome," he said.

Cohen and the prince also discussed the Cooperative Defense Initiative, which seeks to tie the gulf states, Egypt and Jordan into an early-warning network to track missile threats. He said the United States thinks the initiative is an important program for the gulf because of the threat of chemical and biological agents in the region.

"There is no particular sense of timing to this issue," Cohen said. "I have been talking about it for several years. We are talking about it because we have seen evidence that the spread of chemical and biological weapons continues."

Veteran, friend of MCB Hawaii remembered

Robert Nichols, a former Marine and active member of the Windward Military/Civilian Council died March 30 from a long bout with cancer. He was 73.

Nichols, a Kailua resident, served in such famous Marine battles as Iwo Jima and the Chosin Reservoir.

Born in Emmet, Idaho, on Nov. 1, 1926, Nichols attended Emmet High School, but dropped out to join the Marine Corps on his 17th birthday. His career took him to the sands of Iwo Jima with the 5th Joint Assault Signal Company during World War II.

After the war, Nichols transferred to the reserves, finished high school and worked for Pan-American Airlines as a flight instrument mechanic in Hawaii. He met his wife, Janice, during a layover in Australia. After three dates, they were married.

Shortly after his marriage, Nichols was called to active duty during the Korean War where he served with Marine Fighter Squadron 311. Nichols saw combat again during the Chosin Reservoir campaign and received a unit citation for distinguished action against enemy forces.

After the Korean War, he ended his career in the Marine Corps as a staff sergeant and returned to Hawaii to work with Pan-Am, where he eventually retired. He then committed his free time to community service.

"He did so much, I don't even know where to begin. It almost got to be too much sometimes, but that's just how dad was," said Shayne Nichols, his daughter. "He was always doing things for other people."

Nichols became an active member in the "Chosin Few"

Honoring fallen warriors means more than you know

I was reading a veterans magazine the other day, and I found a letter to the editor that reminded me of a story that happened right here in Marine Forces Pacific a few months ago. The letter dealt with the lack of proper respect being given to departed veterans and it spoke about us (not the Marine Corps specifically) on active duty doing the right thing in regards to final honors for our departed veterans. Because we in the Force are tasked with providing burial details from time to time, I thought it would be appropriate to share with you two very different stories concerning this issue. First is the letter to the editor.

Dear Editor,
I am appalled at the apathy of some people at Fort ***** regarding burial at the Fort ***** Cemetery. Have they forgotten or simply do not understand the word commitment? It means to bind, as a promise or a pledge. On military posts, units are committed to various training functions for students. They are committed to be at certain places at certain times, no excuses.

If Fort ***** is so short of personnel, why then are soldiers in the snack bars, PX, gyms driving on and off post during duty hours when the flag at the National Cemetery is at half mast, with only two soldiers trying to meet the commitment of a nation and an honorable and deserving veteran and his family?

Shame, shame! The family and the friends of honorable veterans deserve to have their heroes buried in proper military fashion.

As you can see from the tone of his letter, this gentleman was pretty upset.

Like a round that goes down range if you screw up a burial detail, there is no second chance to do it over again. Once it's over, like that round that is fired down range, you can never call it back. All the "I'm sorry — it will never happen again's" mean little to the family of the departed veteran who did not receive his or her proper honors at the graveside. Believe me when I tell you there are a few things in this life you only get one chance to do correctly. The honorable burial of our

nation's veterans is one of those things, and that is what I would like to speak to you about this week.

Now while the above story was not very good, the following story should make you as proud as it made me the day it occurred, and as I write it now. It occurred right here in the Force shortly after I was posted as the Force Sergeant Major in November 1998.

I was in my office one morning pushing some paper when one of my Marines stuck his head in the hatch and informed me that I had a call from a Mr. ***. Not knowing what it was about I picked up the phone and asked if I could help him. The gentleman on the other end of the line explained to me he was a former World War II soldier and was calling to thank me on behalf of his family for what the Marine Corps had done for him and his son. You see his son died unexpectedly on active duty and while the Father made funeral arrangements, he called his son's branch of service and asked that they provide a bugler at the cemetery to blow "Taps."

The father was told by some geek on the phone that they could not support his request because they did not have enough people. He told him if he really wanted some one to play "Taps" to call the local VFW or some other civilian agency and ask if they could help him out. To say the father was upset would be an understatement at this point. Now I will be honest with you: if I had not spoken to the father myself, I would have had a hard time believing someone in any Branch of Service could be so callous at a time like that but they were.

The father, in shock and in grief, could not think of who else to call or who to ask on such short notice or even where to get started to try to find a bugler, but all of a sudden it dawned on him. "Which is the most military of all the services? And who does things right?" Yep, you guessed it, he figured, "I'll call the Marines. ... they will know what to do. they will help me. ... they will help me. ..."

Well, he called a couple of numbers from the phone book to units at MCBH, Kaneohe Bay, and each time is greeted with a cheerful, "May I help you, sir?" by the Marine on the other end. Before long he was given the phone number of the Marine Forces Pacific band here in Hawaii and as he explained his dilemma to the Marine on the phone he gets something he did not expect when he called. Instead of getting yet another number to call, the Marine from the band he was speaking to told him not to worry. A U.S. Marine would be there to sound his son's final call.

He again identified himself as a former soldier and that his son was not a Marine, but the Marine from the band said, "Sir, it is all right. I will take care of it." Elated, the father began to cry.

The Marine he spoke to at the Band that day happened to be Staff Sgt. Grady May. Staff Sgt. May did what we expect of all our Marines to do under these circumstances. He did what he knew in his heart was the right thing to do. He took charge, made a decision and did the right

thing. He knew the son was not a Marine, but it did not make a difference to him. All he knew was that a father who had just lost his son needed help and, by God, he would help him. That's what Marines do.

After getting the information from the father, Staff Sgt. May told him not to worry — a U.S. Marine would be there at the gravesite as he laid his son to rest, and he was.

Even in the father's grief, he still took the time to call me to thank the Marine Corps, Staff Sgt. May, and the Marine Forces Pacific Band for being who we are and what we stand for.

I cannot tell you how proud I was to take that call that morning. After we hung up, I called Staff Sgt. May and personally passed on the "thank you" to him from the father and congratulate him on a job well done. I then called Chief Warrant Officer-4 Robert Farmer, the director of the band, and finally told the story to the commanding general at the time, Lt. Gen. Carlton Fulford, who was so proud of Staff Sgt. May he shared the story with the Commandant of the Marine Corps.

The point of these two very different stories is this. We as Marines must always do our very best to do the right thing. It is expected of us each and every time that someone "calls the Marines for help" in war or peace.

If any of the Marines had been anything but the professionals that they were when this gentleman called, this story might have turned out like the first one I told you, but it didn't.

Every Marine involved in this story, from the very first Marine the father spoke to, to Staff Sgt. May conducted him or herself with professionalism and the high standards that have made the Marine Corps so very famous. I was and still am very proud of each and every one of them who had a hand in making the request of a fallen warrior's parent come true.

When you answer the phone or are selected for a detail, you never know who is on the other end or who is watching you or the perception they are forming in their minds of you and of our Corps.

By always striving to do the right thing, you will ensure they always leave with a positive image of you and the Corps you so proudly serve. When we go to do a detail that honors our veterans or lays them to rest, it is more than just a detail that must be performed, it is our duty to do it right. Not because we have to, but because it is the right thing to do.

You and your shipmates across the Force represent more than just our Corps at those ceremonies; you represent all that our nation stands for. The Marines must always do it right.

Please remember that when you are called to assist in any ceremony you are tasked with to always conduct yourselves with all the bearing and poise you can muster. It means so very much to the family of the fallen warrior. Remember that you only get "one shot" at doing some things right in this lifetime. Make sure you are in the "X" ring. Semper Fi.

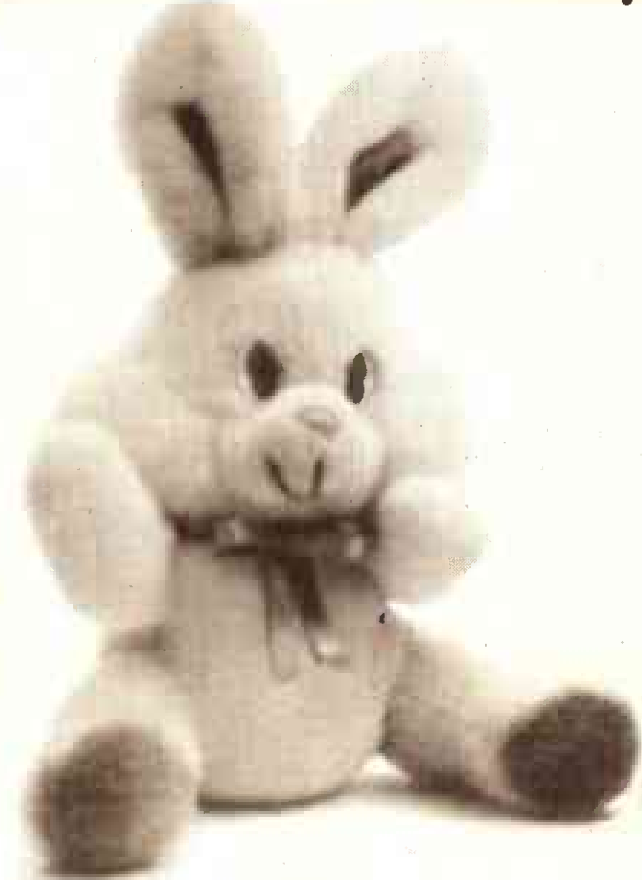

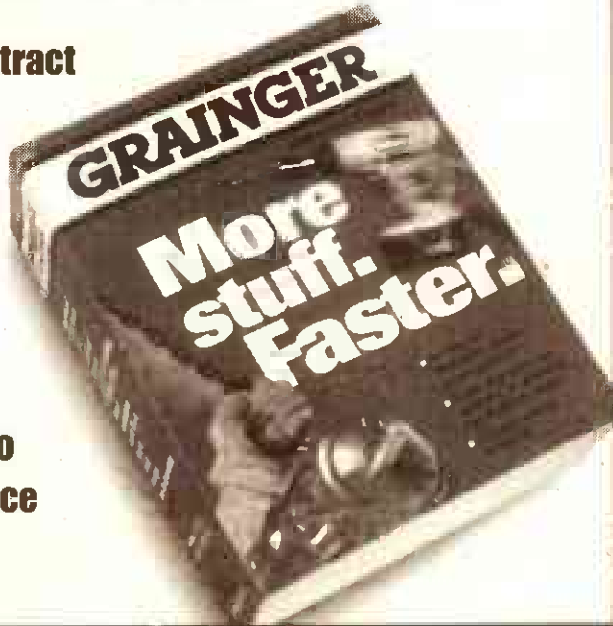

HAU'ULA, Oahu — Marines extended their spirit outside their Kaneohe Bay community to help out at the centennial celebration at

Hau'ula Elementary School here Friday.

Marines from the Single Marine and Sailor Program, along with the program's coordinator Dawn Williams, helped kick off the three-day school celebration with an afternoon full of athletic events.

Several prizes such as small toy planes were given to children who did well in their respective events, but the games were mainly intended to let the students have a day of fun while

recognizing the school's hundred-year history.

The Marines guided the children through a basketball shoot, a hand and knee crawl, and a climb across the monkey bars, among other things.

"I had a good time," said Cpl. Mike Wright, a Marine volunteer from 1st Radio Battalion who helped students cross the monkey bars. "Just seeing a little kid come up to the monkey bars, afraid to go across, and then making it across. I could tell how happy they were by their smiles and it made me feel good."

The students also cheered one another as they ran through a modified obstacle course. They had to carry a football between their thighs, touch their forehead to the top of a standing bat and rotate around for a "dizzy-izzy," hop and skip on top of hula hoops, and back crawl with their hands and feet.

The laughs and excitement continued on to a final event in which each child had one hit-or-miss opportunity to throw a water balloon at one of three Marines standing a dozen feet away.

In addition, volunteers offered to paint the children's faces — Marine style.

"It was funny watching them all run to get their faces painted," said Cpl. Savang Amphay, one of the Marine volunteers from 1st Radio Battalion who applied the "cammie" paint on the eager children.

The event was not only advantageous for the more than 300 children, but also the Marine volunteers.

"This is one good way to get Marines and Sailors out into the community to meet new people. Many of these volunteers will have children of their own some day," said Cpl. Jeremy Riglesberger, the president of the Single Marine and Sailor Program. "Working around 75 kids with smiles on their faces can really change your outlook on life."

Although it was the first time members of the Single Marine and Sailor Program were asked to help out Hau'ula Elementary, it wasn't the first community event for the organization.

The program continuously encourages

Kuwait families still await word of Gulf War POW's fate

KUWAIT CITY, Kuwait — As you walk into the Kuwait POW Committee Office here, you are surrounded by memories. Memories stolen by Saddam Hussein during the Gulf War and not returned since. Defense Secretary William S. Cohen and Kuwaiti Defense Minister Salim al-Sabah al-Salim Al Sabah visited the office Sunday to highlight the plight of Kuwaitis still waiting to learn the fate of their loved ones. During the occupation of Kuwait, Iraqi soldiers took thousands of prisoners. Following the coalition victory, the International Committee of the Red Cross repatriated 6,272 Kuwaitis while another

500 "repatriated themselves." But 605 people never returned. Of these, 570 were Kuwaitis and 35 were Indian, Bahraini, Omani, Lebanese, Syrian, Egyptian and Saudi residents of Kuwait. One display at the office contains individual pictures of these men and women. The pictures are behind a locked door and surmounted by razor wire. U.N. Security Council Resolution 686, passed at the end of the Gulf War, called for Iraq to release all prisoners. "This exhibit is a poignant reminder of the pain the families still feel and suffer and the dedication by all concerned for a full accounting of the POWs, something the United States feels very committed to."

Cohen told reporters He told reporters that during his recent visit to Vietnam, full accounting of missing Americans still has "a high-level of priority in dealing with Vietnam." He said the United States would continue to insist that Saddam Hussein fully comply with the Security Council resolution calling for the prisoners' return. "It is an outrage that he has not complied," Cohen said. Since the end of the war, Iraq submitted incomplete preliminary information on 126 of the 605 cases. They returned one set of remains to Kuwait, and one live missing person was found and returned. The Iraqis have not cooperated since Operation Desert Fox in November 1998.

Navy announces Virginia class submarine will bear Hawaii name

PEARL HARBOR, Hi -- Secretary of the Navy Richard Danzig announced recently that the third submarine of the Virginia class, SSN 776, will bear the name Hawaii in honor of the rich heritage of submarines in the Pacific, and to recognize the tremendous support the Navy has enjoyed from the people of the 50th state.

During a ceremony conducted this past Saturday, at the Bowfin Submarine Memorial Museum in Pearl Harbor, Danzig made the formal announcement.

Danzig said: "Submariners are one of our greatest assets; so also are the people who appreciate and support them. Naming this submarine Hawaii recognizes both groups — those brave men who have served here and the men and women who support them. A submarine is a lot like the state of Hawaii. Both are serene and beautiful, quiet and peaceful, yet they are both vitally important to U.S. national security. Like the people of Hawaii, a submarine is very much a part of its environment, is respectful of it, yet uses it to great advantage."

Today, more than 256,000 active duty personnel, family members, Defense Department civilians and veterans who work and live in Hawaii — more than 20 percent of the state's population. This will be the first commissioned ship to

bear the name Hawaii, and will undergo construction at General Dynamics Electric Boat Division in Groton, Conn. and Newport News Shipbuilding in Newport News, Va., joining the fleet in 2007.

This next-generation attack submarine, the Virginia class, will provide the Navy with the capabilities it requires to maintain the nation's undersea supremacy well into the 21st century. Hawaii will have improved stealth, sophisticated

surveillance capabilities and special warfare enhancements that will enable it to meet the Navy's multi-mission requirements.

Virginia class submarines are able to attack targets ashore with highly accurate Tomahawk cruise missiles and conduct covert long-term surveillance of land areas, littoral waters or other sea-based forces. Other missions include anti-

submarine and anti-ship warfare; special forces delivery and support; and mine delivery and minefield mapping. With enhanced communications connectivity, the submarine also will provide important battle group and joint task force support, with full integration into carrier battle group operations.

The boats of the Virginia class surpass the performance of any current or projected threat submarine, ensuring United States undersea dominance well into this century.

Spouses take over CSSG-3

Marines from Combat Service Support Group-3 looked a lot different Saturday when they stepped back to let their spouses fill their roles during the unit's Jane Wayne Day.

The day gave spouses a chance to wear Marine Corps uniforms, rappel, run through the obstacle course, drive high mobility multipurpose wheeled vehicles, compete with pugel sticks and fire the indoor simulated marksmanship trainer.

"An event like this gives the spouses a better appreciation of what their Marines do for a living," said 1st Lt. Gregory Allen, communications officer with CSSG-3.

The focus of the day was to help the spouses understand, in a fun way, how the Marine Corps functions and relieve some of the mystery behind what their Marines do when they leave home.

"It's helping me learn about the Marine Corps," said Audrey Palmer, a newlywed of a CSSG-3 Marine. I'm having fun. This is great."

Palmer said she's been married about a month and this is helping her to understand what goes on in the Marine Corps. Jane Wayne day also helped out the veteran spouses. Kathy Nixon has been married to her Marine for 19 years, but this is the first time she's had a chance to do something like this.

"I've always had a pretty strong appreciation for the Marine Corps," she said. "This has definitely given me insight into what they do."

Korean War group and the Military/Civilian Council here on Oahu. He also made guest appearances to MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, to talk about his combat experiences. On the civilian side, he taught scuba diving and winemaking, and passed on many of his life's lessons to anyone who would listen.

"He taught a lot of people a lot of things," she said. "Everyone learned something different from him: he was a teacher."

Even on vacation, Nichols would find himself a guiding light. He was heralded as a hero and credited with saving many lives on Aloha Airlines Flight 243 in April '88 because of his ability to remain calm under pressure. After the flight's fuselage was blown off in mid-flight, Nichols relied on his knowledge of aircraft to safely evacuate many of the passengers. He remained calm amidst stress and disorder, and was able to direct the passengers away from the fire and out the exits.

Nichols was buried at Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery April 7.

ment, "Evaluating new equipment and training for war, like war itself, puts life at risk. In peace and war, Marines accept that risk - it is a bond between us. In that spirit, we grieve today for our nineteen lost Marines and embrace their families."

The bodies will be taken to Davis-Monthan Air Force Base where they will be placed aboard a military aircraft and flown to Dover Air Force Base, Del. for identification and processing.

Once identification is complete each will travel with Marine escort to his place of interment with military honors.

The aircraft data recorder will be taken to its manufacturer, Smith Industries in Grand Rapids, Mich., where officials from the Naval Safety Center will translate and analyze the data using Smith Industries lab.

Officials are not sure how long this process will take.

Memorial services are being planned on Marine bases in Yuma, Ariz., Camp Pendleton, Calif., New River, N.C., and at the Naval Air Station, Patuxent River, Md., for those who died in the accident.

The MV-22 was conducting a training mission in support of Operational Evaluation (OPEVAL) when it went down near Marana, Ariz. During the mission, the crew and Marines conducted Non-combatant Evacuation Operations (NEO) exercises as part of the Weapons and Tactics Instructor Course, with Marines embarking and disembarking the aircraft.

The mission was conducted at night utilizing night vision goggles and forward-looking infrared radar to enhance night operational capability.

Operational Evaluation is a test phase to determine the operational suitability of the aircraft for the Marine Corps. It began in October 1999 and is scheduled to conclude in June 2000.

To date, the four Ospreys involved in Operational Evaluation have completed more than 800 flight hours. During March, the OPEVAL aircraft flew nearly 140 flight hours, an average of 35 hours per aircraft.

The mishap aircraft was part of the Multi-service Operational Test Team, based at Patuxent River, Md., but was temporarily attached to Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics Squadron-1 at Marine Corps Air Station Yuma, Ariz.

Marines learn basics in demolition class

More than 30 Marines targeted their knowledge on explosives April 3 during a demolition class at Range Training Facility, Kaneohe Bay, given by the base Explosive Ordnance Disposal Unit.

Marines from Combat Service Support Group 3, 1st Radio Battalion, and Headquarters Battalion, MCB Hawaii, attended both the basic demolition class and the practical exercise that took place afterward.



Although some Marines had experience with basic explosives, many never had the chance to deal with explosives and wanted to learn more about them.

"It's a good asset to learn," said Lance Cpl.

Mike Pelchat, a military policeman and class participant. "In basic training we only learned about grenades. It's good to see what else we have in our arsenal."

The class helped show Marines the different kinds of explosives used in the military and the capabilities of each, said Staff Sgt. Joel Carter, the class instructor and an explosive ordnance technician for CSSG-3.

The explosives included electric and non-electric blasting caps, detonating cord, TNT, C-4, and military dynamite, some of which was made as far back as 1969.

"That's one of the greatest criteria for military explosives," said Carter. "For us, it has to

have a long shelf life."

Except for its shelf life and variety of colors, Carter said civilian explosives are very similar to military explosives.

"This class gives Marines a basic idea of how we work," said Staff Sgt. Carl Holden, an explosive ordnance technician for Headquarters Battalion, MCB Hawaii, who deals with many different types of explosives.

During one of two exercises, Marines used crimpers to attach non-electric blasting caps to time fuses. They attached the fuses to a group of C-4 explosives down range for an explosive demonstration.

According to Holden, many Marines get the most satisfaction from putting explosives together, and then seeing the result of their efforts.

"I was looking forward to it," said Lance Cpl. Andrew Vickery, a landing support specialist with CSSG-3. "This stuff is exciting."

Although not every Marine may come across the use of explosives in their military careers, the class provided every participant with another aspect of Marine Corps knowledge and exposed them to another option in their career by possibly moving into the explosive ordnance disposal field.

Force Recon conducts close quarters training

CAMP PENDLETON, Calif. -- An explosion rocks the house. Wood chips and splinters spray the building. Recon Marines burst through the door and search the house until the objective is secure.

Third Platoon, 1st Force Reconnaissance Company learned how to take down houses and other buildings during the Close Quarters Battle Course recently conducted at Camp Pendleton's Military Operations in Urban Terrain Facility. They tested these skills during Training in an Urban Environment in Phoenix March 14-24, and during other direct action missions off the coast of California, March 25-30.

The CQB course was the last training package the platoon received before joining the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit.

Force Recon can also act as a hostage rescue force and a search and seizure force for buildings, ships and other structures as part of the MEU's Maritime Special Purpose Force.

The CQB course prepared them for these missions, and it was also their first chance to conduct a live-fire exercise in an urban environment during the predeployment training. The training began with two weeks of firing on a 50-yard combat shooting range. Their close quarters marksmanship was tested on this range with special CQB weaponry.

This was a very important step in the training evolution, as Marines trained side-by-side in the buildings, shooting live rounds. Even though most of the Marines in the platoon

have been through this specialized training before, they still had to brush up on their skills.

"You always have to be thinking," said Sgt. Jeff Schultz, a force reconnaissance Marine. "You have to make crucial, on the spot decisions. If you make a mistake, you can't cover it up most of the time. Shooting the wrong person can't be reversed."

After two weeks of live-fire training, the Marines went through two more weeks of clearing buildings. They also had to requalify on the range daily before being allowed to continue clearing techniques.

"If they don't shoot well enough in the mornings they aren't allowed to shoot in the house in the afternoon," said GySgt. Geoff Wilson, a 36-year-old reconnaissance Marine from Gulfport, Miss.

The Marines trained in two different buildings during the four-week course. They moved between a one-story house and a two-

level building. Each one gave them a different perspective on clearing buildings.

Each time the platoon went into the house, they were faced with a different configuration inside.

The moveable walls and cardboard "bad guy" targets scattered throughout the house allowed them to be faced with almost any situation imaginable.

"Before you go through the door, you don't know if it's just a closet or a big room," said SSgt. Mark Baglietto, Special Operations Training Group instructor. "All you see is the door and all you know is there is something on the other side of the door, but you don't know what. You have to be ready for anything."

Teamwork is also an important ingredient in CQB. They had to be able to work together.

"Someone either wants the shooting skills or they don't," Wilson said. "That is up to the individual person to perfect. Teamwork has to be worked on by the whole unit. The better our teamwork is, the more effective we are. We know where everyone is and what they are doing without necessarily looking at them."

"When we don't work as a team it makes our job more hazardous," he added. "We have to be aware of our teammates."

These teamwork skills also carry over into the next level of training when they will join the rest of the Maritime Special Purpose Force - which includes an infantry security team, scout-sniper platoon and a demolition team to continue training for their deployment.

3/3 Supply and logistics undergoes Logistics readiness inspection

The 3rd Marine Regiment inspection team left no file unopened in a Logistic Readiness Inspection for 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment March 20-24.

The supply and logistics department for 3/3 underwent the inspection to ensure that all their records are accurate, supplies are serviceable and the operational procedures are correct.

"(We do this inspection) to determine the logistical standpoint of the battalion," said Capt. Eric Livingston, the supply inspection officer for the supply management assistance team.

The inspection team was composed mainly of senior enlisted

Marines from bases in Okinawa, Japan, who remain updated on the latest advancements in their areas of expertise.

"These guys are the geniuses in their areas," said Capt. Travis Gaines, the supply and logistics department officer for 3/3.

The inspection team performed a thorough inspection, physically checking equipment and files which were more than a year old, Livingston said.

They went through all the paperwork here, said Cpl. Jimmy Thornton, a custodian in the armory for I Company. The team looked over so much paperwork he joked that they even checked paper in the trash.

Livingston said the purpose of

the inspection was not just to find mistakes in the units, but also to help them correct the errors. Instead of just "stirring up dirt," the inspection teams also teach and assist the units on how to properly remove it.

"We're not here to hurt," Livingston said. "We're here to help."

Gaines said there's a lack of professional schools for many of these job fields, and learning from this type of inspections is the only way for junior Marines to gain knowledge.

"These guys come in and teach our guys," he said. "The inspectors say, 'This is wrong, but here's how you can fix it.'"

The instruction is something

the motivated junior Marines in the battalion could use, said Lt. Col. Mark Bean, commanding officer for 3/3.

"They are very enthusiastic," he said. "They just don't have the experience."

How those junior Marines have combined their enthusiasm with the experience of senior Marines will show in the inspection results.

The most important part of the evaluation is not the results, Bean said, but how they handle the results.

"It's not the about the discrepancies you get. It's what you do with them," Bean said. "We'll roll our sleeves up and fix those discrepancies."

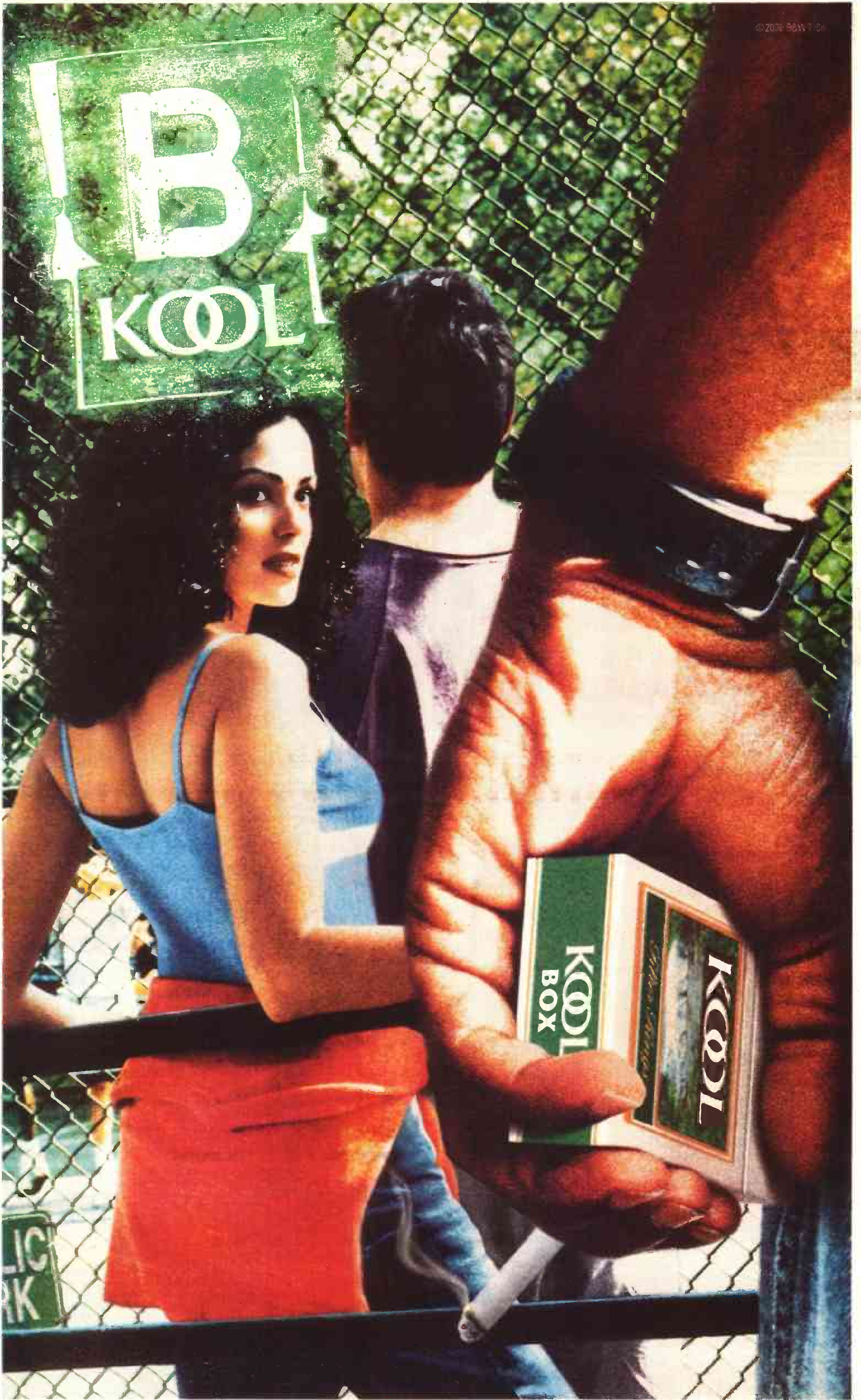

Marines refurbish USS Missouri

New cars need routine maintenance and so do ships, even if the ship has not moved in two years.

One ship in particular, the USS Missouri, also known as "Mighty Mo," which was commissioned in June 1944, received some maintenance with the help of more than 30 Marines recently.

The ship needed refurbishing because of the amount of people that visit the ship daily for tours. In addition, Disney is shooting a film about the attack on Pearl Harbor Naval Base, and the Mighty Mo is being used as a prop for the film.

Fox Company, 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, sent 3rd Platoon out to Pearl Harbor where the USS Missouri now rests, to assist the USS Missouri Association, Inc., in painting, fixing lights, mopping (swabbing) the deck and taking down netting along the sides of the ship.

Before the Marines headed out to the site, their platoon sergeant, Sgt. Amos Livingston, gave them all a brief history of the ship.

"Today you are all going to find out what it is like to be sailors aboard the ship," said Livingston. "This ship was one of the last in the Navy with a wooden deck and it was the site of the surrender of the Japanese, Sept. 2, 1945, at the end of World War II."

Nearly five months before that signing, a kamikaze plane hit the Missouri, causing a fire that was put out, but the scars from that crash remain on the rails.

Besides this "battle wound," there was a lot of work the Marines needed to do. The ship is now a memorial and tours are conducted daily. Along the tour route, Marines changed light bulbs on the darker lower decks of the ship and painted some of the rooms.

To keep the wooden deck looking like new, a group of Marines worked the back of the ship to the front, "swabbing" the deck to give it back its natural reddish color.

In addition to cleaning and making minor repairs, the Marines were given the opportunity to move a gun turret back to the position it was used during its battle days.

The gun was only fired by Marines attached to the ship for security and the last time it was moved was 1992 when the ship was decommissioned for the second and final time. This particular gun mount is sponsored by MCB Hawaii.

Slowly, with the Marines turning the hand crank, the gun with the eagle, globe and anchor in the middle began to turn to the 90 degrees outboard position.

The Marines' work was halted from time to time, due to occasional rebuilt Japanese Zero planes flying overhead for the movie. This allowed the Marines a chance to take a break and watch the same type of planes that bombed Pearl Harbor almost 60 years ago.

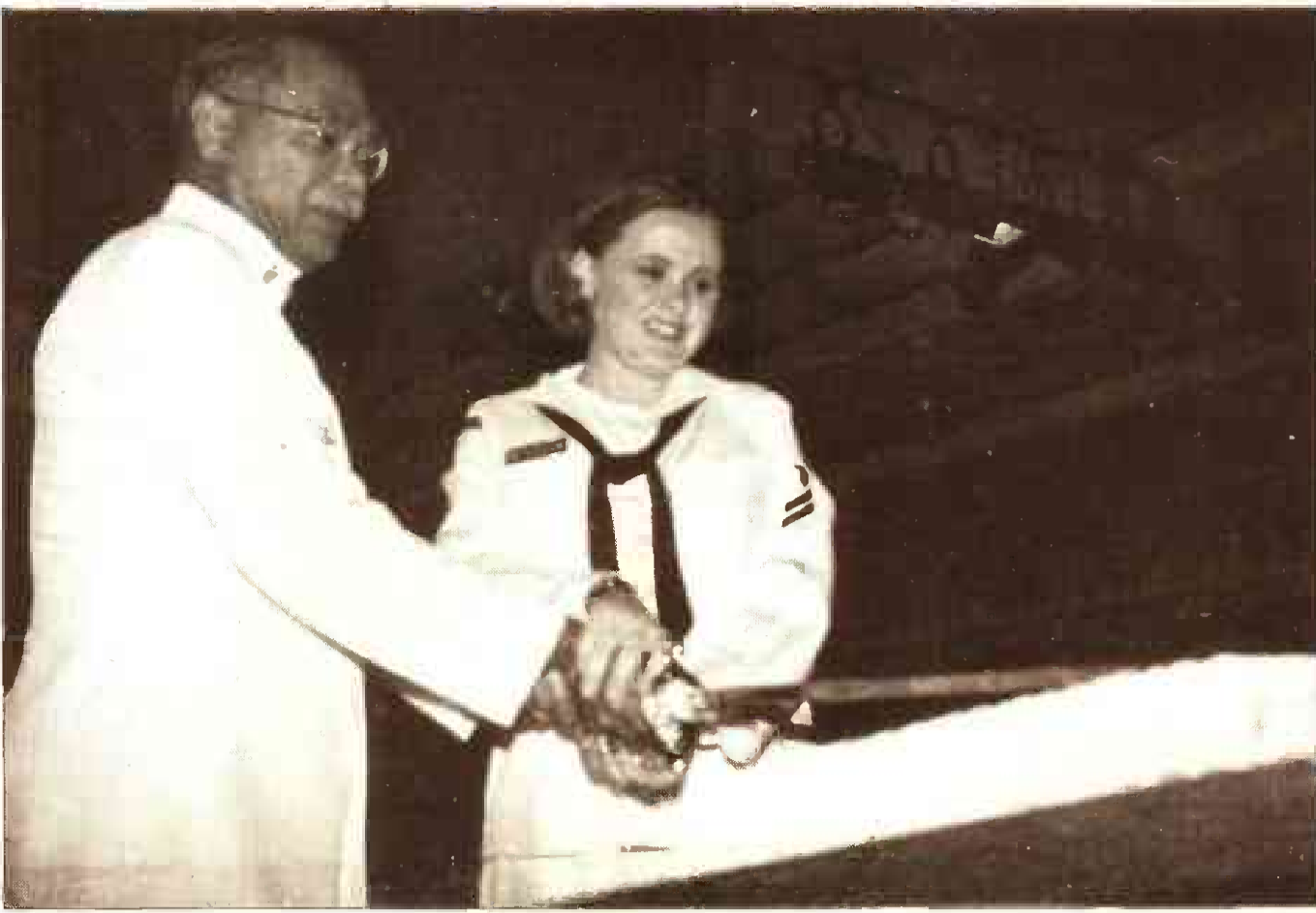



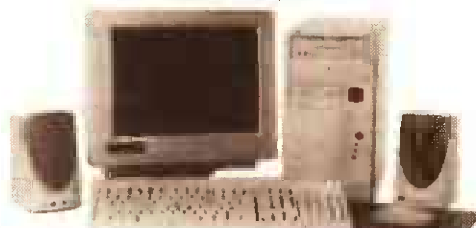

While more than 90 percent of cases are handled entirely over the phone, for those Red Cross clients who wish to speak to someone in person, staff at their local Red Cross office will be available to help. In the new arrangement, military members and their families can continue to expect the same personalized, high-touch service they have always received from the Red Cross. Clients are getting faster, more efficient services as a result

of these new systems.

It is the commitment of the Red Cross, Hawaii State Chapter and its Board of Directors to maintain a presence on the various installations, to include Tripler Army Medical Center, MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, Schofield Barracks, Hickam Air Force Base and Pearl Harbor. The staff at these offices will continue to provide support for the various Red Cross volunteer programs on the installation as well as provide health and safety services such as CPR, first aid, and water safety training. In

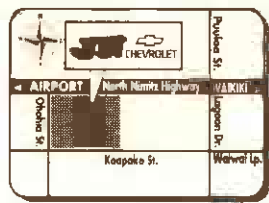


