Oakhanger GSU, UK military support AFSCN

Nestled in a rural English farm village, far from the mountains of Colorado, is a 23rd Space Operations Squadron detachment which serves as a testament to the 50th Space Wing's global reach.

The only Schriever Geographically Separated Unit and Air Force Satellite

Control Network site operated by non-U.S. personnel, 23 SOPS's representation at Royal Air Force Station Oakhanger may be small, but their mission is essential to upholding support to the AFSCN and the U.S. military space mission.

"Oakhanger supports virtually all DoD space vehicles," said Master Sgt. Eric Reagan, NCO in charge — one of only two active duty

Air Force personnel at Oakhanger. "We also support selected NASA and foreign allied nation's space vehicles."

The site has three antennas to be utilized for command, control and tracking of space vehicles by AFSCN users.

Under the call sign "LION," the site, on top

Schriever Airmen, teammates, earn AFVB gold

For only the second time in 10 years, the Air Force Volleyball Team took home gold during the 2017 Armed Forces Volleyball Tournament — highlighting a successful Air Force Volleyball Season helped in large part by the service of two Schriever Airmen.

It wasn't long before Capt. Stephen Welling, 50th Operations Support Squadron, and 1st Lieutenant Seth Miller, 1st Space Operations Squadron, were elected team captains for the AFVB team due to their leadership and sportsmanship abilities; guiding teammates toward victory.

"This is the first year I've seen where we had two Airmen from the same base who were handpicked by their teammates to be team captains," said Capt. Karl Grosselin, Space Systems Directorate, and AFVB head coach. "They did a fantastic job providing much needed leadership."

The team capped an undefeated record in armed forces play, beating out the other branches on their path to gold. Miller was selected for the All-Armed Forces Tournament team as the Armed Forces top outside hitter.

"The team meshed well, from our first scrimmage early in the month to the nationals," Welling said.

Composed of both officer and enlisted, before Airmen join the team they must first make it past the selection process and prove their ability in tryouts.

"We have a two day tryout, where we narrow down the number of Airmen to twelve, from there, we train for about a month," Grosselin said.

The training prepared Airmen for the high-level competition of the volleyball season.

Competition this year was fierce, Welling said — successfully making the team this

year after trying out for the second time. Airmen regularly battled it out against the Army and Navy teams in heated matches.

"We pushed our guys really hard to get in shape to be ready to play Army and Navy," he said. "We had a couple guys get hurt and play through some injuries. Staying healthy and prepared as a team was important."

Aside from representing the Air Force

during play, AFVB players helped extend positive outreach to local communities in the course of the season.

"I enjoyed representing the Air Force in a positive way; going out into the community, putting on youth camps down at Hulbert (Air Force Base)," Welling said. "We got to really put out a positive vibe for the Air Force to the community."

The hard work paid off both on and off the court with a successful AFVB season for the team and for Schriever.

"This is my fifth year in the program, and it is by far the best team I have ever seen," Grosselin said. "They (Miller and Welling) took everyone under their wing, focused their practice and it showed in the game scores and how we performed."

USAF to host 2018 DoD Warrior Games in Colorado Springs

CHICAGO, Ill. — Defense Department officials announced July 8, 2017 that the Air Force will host the 2018 DoD Warrior Games at the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado June 2018.

The announcement took place during the closing ceremony of the Navy-hosted 2017 DoD Warrior Games in Chicago. To mark the announcement, U.S. Navy Adm. Davidson, the commander of the U.S. Fleet Forces Command, passed the ceremonial torch to U.S. Air Force Lt. Gen. Gina M. Grosso, the deputy chief of staff for Manpower, Personnel and Services, before competition flames in the cauldron were extinguished.

“This year I witnessed the positive impact the competition had on our wounded warriors and all those involved,” said Secretary of the Air Force Heather Wilson. “It’s an honor for the Air Force to host these talented athletes at the Air Force Academy in 2018.”

The Warrior Games was created in 2010 as a way to enhance the recovery and rehabilitation of wounded warriors through participation in adaptive sports. This year’s DoD Warrior Games featured five U.S. teams representing the Army, Marine Corps, Navy/Coast Guard, Air Force and the United States Special Operations Command. During the

games, teams competed in eight sports, including archery, cycling, shooting, sitting volleyball, swimming, track, field and wheelchair basketball.

“The Air Force is excited to lead this effort on behalf of the DoD,” said Col. Gina Olive, the 2018 DoD Warrior Games director. “The Air Force Academy and the Colorado Springs community are excited to welcome the Warrior Games back to Colorado Springs, capitalizing on past experience when the U.S. Olympic Committee was responsible for the Warrior Games and hosted several events at the Academy. The world class facilities at the Air Force Academy and the outstanding hospitality of the Colorado Springs community will provide an outstanding venue for our athletes and their families as they celebrate their resiliency, determination and ability to overcome a variety of unexpected challenges.”

The July 8 closing ceremony concluded a week of intense competition. The athletes, who traveled to Chicago from locations around the world, have upper-body and/or lower-body injuries, spinal cord injuries, traumatic brain injuries, visual impairments, serious illnesses and/or post-traumatic stress.

Squadron Officer School expands to better align with CSAF focus areas

MAXWELL AIR FORCE BASE, Ala. — Air University's Squadron Officer School has redesigned its program to better align with the needs of the Air Force. The new course has increased from five to six-and-a-half weeks, commencing with Class 18A which starts July 31.

The redesign effort was necessary in order for SOS's parent organization, Squadron Officer College, to meet Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David Goldfein's direction to produce a better-equipped force as characterized in his three focus areas: revitalizing squadrons — the heartbeat of the Air Force; strengthening joint leaders and teams; and enhancing multi-domain command and control.

The result is a curriculum that favorably impacts squadrons by educating captains on becoming "bold and courageous" leaders ready to overcome today's and tomorrow's challenges. In order to accomplish this task, the course was designed around four primary areas: leadership, building highly effective teams, logical and ethical reasoning in decision making, and multi-domain joint warfare as Airmen.

The changes being made to the resident course solidify a foundation of education in all of the focus areas. However, the focus areas of revitalizing the squadron and building joint leaders are heavily emphasized in this course, said Col. Wayne Straw, SOS commandant.

"At its core, SOS is a leadership school

whose foundation is built upon joint warfare," said Straw. "As a leadership school, we help develop the effective behaviors necessary for Air Force captains. SOS's role in developing joint Airmen is to ensure all Airmen, regardless of Air Force specialty or function, can articulate how they integrate into the larger Air Force's mission throughout the range of military operations and the spectrum of joint warfare."

Within the four areas of the course, stu-

dents will engage in classroom and hands-on application events that will challenge their individual leadership awareness and thinking, provide effective methods for conflict resolution, learn how to solve problems and innovate collaboratively.

"SOS is primary developmental education for our captains, and we felt it was crucial to invest the time required to develop the competencies our students need for the operational Air Force," said Maj. Dwayne

Clark, SOC dean of academic affairs. "At this point in their careers, our students are tactical experts and understand what they do day-to-day. This in-residence program is an opportunity to ensure captains think deeply and critically about why they do it. As such, we will engage them in divergent, convergent and reflective thinking habits, which are cornerstones for leadership growth."

To implement such a substantive revision, SOC faculty and staff cancelled Class 17G (June 5 — July 7) to finalize curriculum and prepare staff for executing the new syllabus. The expanded course is set to resume July 31, with Class 18A. Airmen scheduled for the cancelled 17G class will have an opportunity to attend the enhanced in-residence program in future classes. SOC has requested that Air Force Personnel Center and training managers ensure all individuals meeting upcoming promotion boards have priority placement for classes 18A and 18B. In addition, HAF/AID provided a blanket waiver for any captain enrolled in class 17G that required a Total Active Federal Commissioned Service waiver (for AD officers) or a Total Years Commissioned Service waiver (for ARC officers), or an approved exception to policy waiver (e.g., physical fitness, medical profile, etc.) from SOC.

This change decreases the total number of annual classes from seven to six; however, SOC plans to increase the size of each class from 600 students to 700 students to maintain the same annual production requirements set by the Air Force.

of providing support to over 175 U.S. DoD, civilian, allied and U.S. national satellites and critical dual coverage for geosynchronous satellites near the Atlantic and Indian Oceans, carries the unique function of supporting the U.K.'s "Skynet" satellite constellation, said Maj. Nathaniel Markley, 23 SOPS Operations Officer.

"Skynet" is a family of communications satellites part of the U.K. Ministry of Defense which supports the three branches of the British Armed Forces.

This bond between U.S. and U.K. person-

nel ensures mission success for Oakhanger and the AFSCN.

"We have a very strong partnership," Reagan said. "We interact with our British contractors who operate the site and our local Ministry of Defense civilians on a daily basis. Our role here is to be the liaison between the Air Force and the Ministry of Defense."

While he is far away from home, Reagan added living in the area and working with locals has its perks.

"I've only been here for a year, but I definitely enjoy living here," he said. "The people are nice, there is so much history here; and the countryside is so green — it's beautiful."

While Reagan's, and other Oakhanger personnel's, duty time may be temporary, 23 SOPS's role at the facility will continue to endure and expand — in line with the U.S.

military's growing focus on the space frontier.

"The future of LION and its mission is planned well into the 2030s," Markley said. "While the mission will remain the same, our ability to accomplish the mission will be enhanced."

Reagan concurred.

"There has been a steady upward trend in satellite support over the past several years," he said. "It is very likely that this upward trend will continue."

The 23rd Space Operations Squadron maintains a small presence at Royal Air Force Station Oakhanger, upholding support for the Air Force Satellite Control Network and other entities. Oakhanger is the only Schriever Geographically Separated Unit and AFSCN site operated primarily by non-U.S. personnel.



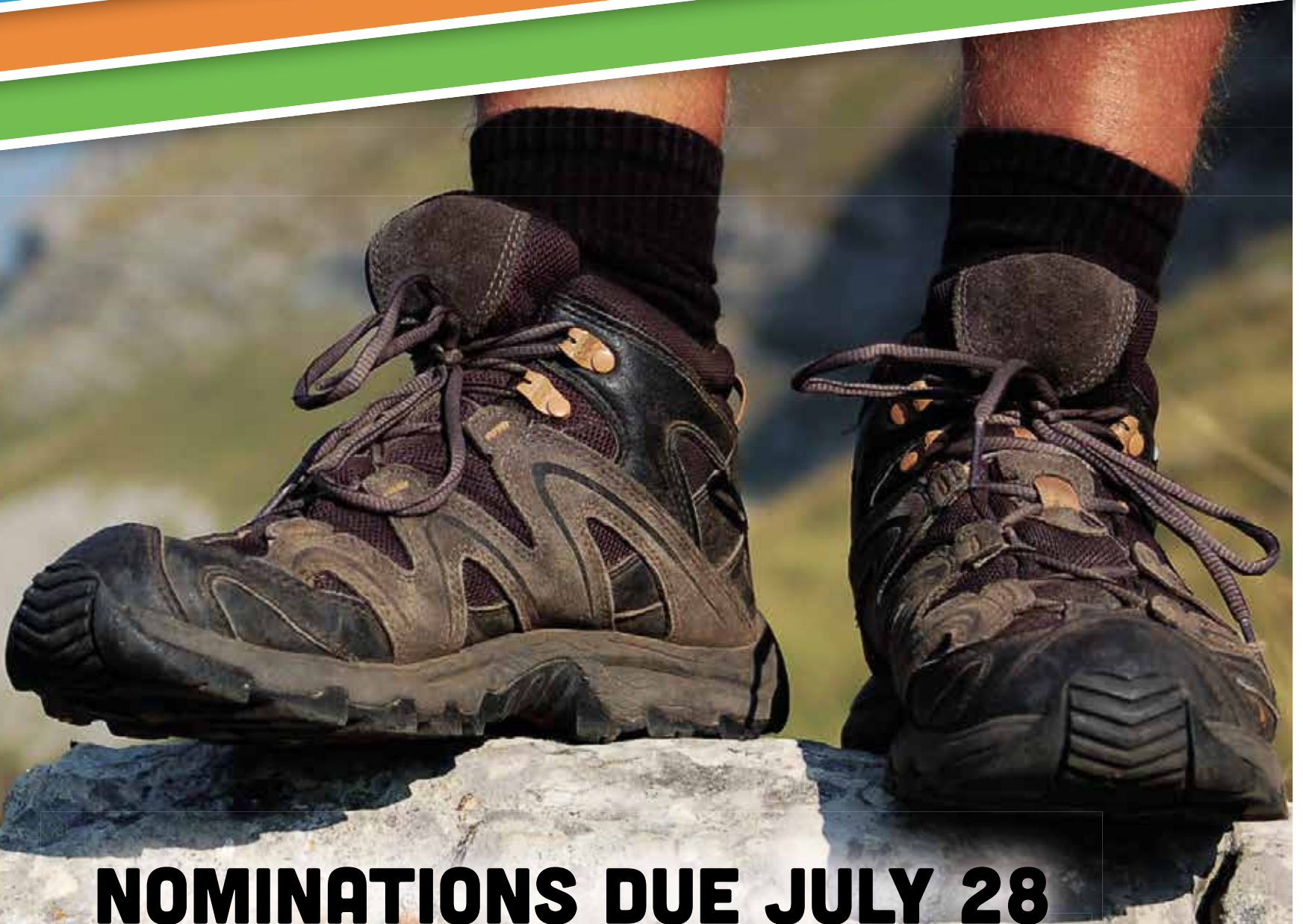

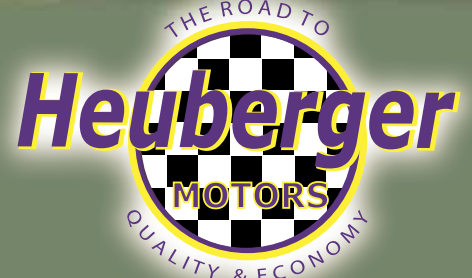
