## Take Action Now to Prepare for Emergencies, Disasters and Hurricanes

As Texas begins to recover from Hurricane Harvey, Naval Support Activity South Potomac (NSASP) reminds base employees and residents that September is a good time to review preparedness information for severe weather, including hurricanes, and other emergencies throughout the year. September is National Preparedness and government agencies, businesses, community groups, schools and families will be participating in events to help promote disaster preparedness.

"The devastating effects of Hurricane Harvey should remind us that we all need to be prepared for emergencies," said Russ Strickland, Executive Director of Maryland Emergency Management Agency. "Right now we are in the height of the hurricane season in the mid-Atlantic, but we also need to be ready for a variety of other threats. Now is the time to make sure you are prepared."

Making preparations when threats are not imminent can make communities more resilient. Hazards common to Maryland include flooding, high wind, severe thunderstorms and winter storms. We are also in the middle of the Atlantic hurricane season right now. Our local area has experienced effects of tropical storms in recent years, as well as Hurricane Isabel in 2003. # Dahlgren EMS Receive Lifesaving Awards

Like their fellow first responders at Naval Support Facility (NSF) Indian Head, members of the Naval District Washington (NDW) Fire and Emergency Services Dahlgren Company don't perform the life-saving and heroic duties they routinely do for the attention or accolades. Those events are just a part of their duty and they simply shrug it off as, "just doing their job." Nonetheless, their services in the line of duty mean that those individuals whose lives were saved will have another day with their

loved ones and for that and more, senior leadership at Naval Support Activity South Potomac (NSASP) recognized their services on Aug. 29.

Eight personnel of the NDW Fire and Emergency Services Dahlgren Company were instrumental in care for a patient in cardiac arrest and received the Navy Fire and Emergency Services Program Certificates of Life Saving for their efforts. NSASP Commanding Officer Capt. Michael O'Leary and Executive Officer Cmdr. Robert Lusk were on hand to present the awards at the NDW Dahlgren Company Fire Station and

to express their appreciation for the outstanding work.

O'Leary conveyed his admiration for the efforts of the Fire and Emergency Services Dahlgren Company and all EMS providers who willingly put their life on the line in times of crisis.

"You are the folks who are running into the burning building when everyone else is running out," O'Leary said. "I am impressed every day with what you do and I am grateful for your service here at Naval Support Activity South Potomac."

The awards that were presented in recognition of successful life-saving efforts — on the

part of Captain/EMT Dave Robey, Assistant Chief/EMT Jerry Schenemann, Firefighter/EMT Carl Newton, Firefighter/EMT Timothy Shifflett, Firefighter/EMT James Munzing, Firefighter/EMT James Dodd, Firefighter/Paramedic Ryan Minehan and Firefighter/Paramedic Robert Morris, Sr. — that took place on April 20, 2017. The awards stated, "... as part of a team you provided pre-hospital care to a patient in cardiac arrest. The exceptional care you provided contributed to saving the life of this patient."





Resident Ory Manchester regaled the Sailors with her time as a nurse with the Navy's

Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service (WAVES), sharing both the difficulty of losing patients as well as the M.A.S.H.-like shenanigans that went on during her time in the WAVES in the early 60's.

"I've seen some things," Manchester laughed.

Chief Operations Specialist Jose Saravia, who has coordinated a number of events throughout the past few years for the CPO Selects, shared how much they always enjoy their volunteer efforts at the veteran's facilities.

"It's always special for us to interact with them, to hear their stories," Saravia said. "But it's also important for them to know they are still our brothers and sisters in service."

Activities Assistant Angela Brewer appreciates the visits from service members because it means so much to the residents and she enjoys seeing the interactions and joy that they get from their time with their visitors.

"They enjoy it a great deal," Brewer said. "Especially when they [their visitors] come in with uniforms on. It's like they are still right there with them. It's really beautiful to see the connection between our residents and the Sailors. They just connect."

Chief Cryptological Technician (Technical) Select D'andre Jacobs spent quality time with Army veteran Bob Robinson and expressed his gratitude at having the opportunity. "It's a

real pleasure and honor to spend time and give back to them, to see them smiling."

Thirteen-year-old Brooke, who attended with her CPO stepmother, also enjoyed her time with the residents.

It was amazing," Brooke enthused. "I enjoyed meeting the residents and helping Mr. Percy with Bingo and I would do this again, no doubt about it."

# Public Notice: Naval Support Facility Indian Head

Do you have any information about the historical use or disposal of radiological material at Naval Support Facility Indian Head (NSFIH)?

The U.S. Navy is conducting an assessment at naval installations, including NSFIH and the Stump Neck Annex, regarding the historical use and disposal of general radioactive materials (G-RAM). Examples of G-RAM include radioluminescent

personnel markers, deck markers, electron tubes, thoriated welding rods, certain types of engine exciters, thorium lenses, radioisotopes used in laboratories, and depleted uranium counterweights. Individuals with information about the historical use or disposal of radiological material at NSFIH or the Stump Neck Annex are invited to provide input and share recollections. All information provided will be considered in the preparation of an assessment report for NSFIH. ## SMART Scholars Visit Potomac River Test Range

Jim Green, a Potomac River Test Range safety expert, briefs Science, Mathematics & Research for Transformation (SMART) Scholars about unique operations conducted on the Naval Surface Warfare Center Dahlgren Division (NSWCDD) main range that include high speed cameras and flight followers. "We are able to place them where needed to track projectiles from muzzle to impact," Green told the scholars. "In early 2000, the first two weapons systems integrated with fire control at Dahlgren were the 5"/54 and 5"/62 caliber naval guns. This gave us the capability to track and fire at moving targets on the range which set the stage for other automatic weapon systems." The college students also toured the NSWCDD Electromagnetic Railgun Launch Facility. The Missile Defense Agency sponsored the college students who are among those pursuing a degree in, or closely related to, science, technology, engineering, and mathematics disciplines through the Department of Defense SMART Scholar program. Students selected for SMART Scholarships are offered internships and a stepping stone to future civilian job opportunities in the federal government.

## K9 Training Aboard NSF Dahlgren

Dutch Malinois Dino and his partner, K9 handler Byron Clark (pictured above) of the Charles County Police Department took part in specialized K9 training at the Navy Police training facility aboard Naval Support Facility (NSF) Dahlgren. IrondogK9 provided the training, bringing in working law enforcement officers and military trainers with years of experience on the street who have been involved searching/finding/apprehending to finding and apprehending suspects after homicides, robberies and many other local and national security events.

"This is to reinforce the basic fundamentals so we don't have accidents and they [the dogs] know who to target," Byron said. "We can hurry up and get the dog on and off with minimal injury to the suspect."

The officers were a part of 15 teams of working dogs and trainers from Charles County Md., Prince William County Va., Manassas, Va., Fairfax County Va. and surrounding juris-

dictions who spent several days working on techniques for handling and release.

K9 Trainer, William "Billy" Cotton, one of the two trainers from IrondogK9 at the workshop explained that for the handlers to be able to train together and witness the correct and incorrect techniques is vital to the partnership between a handler and his K9.

"You always learn better by watching others," Cotton said. "Everyone out here is watching, watching the mistakes the other handlers make and how we critique."

"Our facilities provided training scenarios that created environmental challenges and exposures to help build up the drives and confidence in each K9 and their handler," NSASP Police Chief Robert Brooks said. "Many of these K9 teams support security for state, local and federal events. A tremendous amount of exposures were implemented during the training seminar. Multiple stressors were added on top of environmental during the three days of training and by the end of the seminar, the K9s performed without hesitation, responding to varieties of possible threats under very stressful situations."






