Admiral Honors Navy Scientist for Leadership Impacting U.S. Fleet Ballistic Missile Program

A Navy scientist impacting the Fleet Ballistic Missile (FBM) Program since 1978 was honored with the Navy Strategic Systems Programs (SSP) Director's Award, Navy officials announced today.

SSP Director Vice Adm. Terry Benedict presented the award to Kim Payne, a senior Strategic Systems Division manager, before her civilian Navy colleagues and leadership at the SSP Steering Task Group meeting held in the Washington Navy Yard.

"I was pleasantly surprised when I received the phone call from Vice Admiral Benedict, SSP Director, informing me that I was one of two recipients of the 2016 SSP Director's Award," said Payne, who is based at the Naval Surface Warfare Center Dahlgren Division (NSWCDD). "Any recognition I am fortunate to receive is a direct reflection of many others — the team that supports me at Dahlgren and throughout Strategic Systems Programs."

The NSWCDD Strategic Systems Analysis & Assurance Division Head and her team's efforts directly support the United States sea-based strategic deterrent.

In the award citation, Benedict recognized Payne's achievements as "fundamental to providing credible and affordable sea-based strategic missile systems."

As a co-op student in 1978, Payne began supporting the FBM Program. Now, she leads and directs an organization of 125 scientists and engineers engaged in software and system engineering for the TRIDENT II Fleet Ballistic Missile Program.

"These efforts have directly contributed to the FBM Program and successful SSGN (Ohio-class guided-missile submarine) conversion software initiatives," said Benedict in the citation summarizing Payne's accomplishments.

SSP develops and deploys the nation's Sea-Based Strategic Weapons Systems. The program directs the end-to-end effort of

NSWC IHEODTD Employee Honored by Colleagues and County

Naval Surface Warfare Center Indian Head Explosive Ordnance Department Technology Division (NSWC IHEODTD) Corporate Communications Director Rebecca D'Ambrosio was recently honored for her superior performance of duties and leadership, both inside and outside the fence line at Naval Support Facility (NSF) Indian Head.

Within her department, D'Ambrosio was recently awarded the prestigious Robert B. Dashiell Award for Excellence. The award — given in honor of Robert B. Dashiell, the first commanding officer of Naval Proving Ground from 1890 to 1893 — is given to recognize an employee who within the past year has made a significant contribution to the mission or operation of the activity. Her supervisor at the time, Lisa Griffith, nominated her for the award.

"I am truly honored to receive this award. I work in the headquarters building and walk past the award plaques every day," D'Ambrosio shared. "It is an honor to know that my name now appears with the many talented people who have made a significant impact on this command."

D'Ambrosio is quick to share credit for the award with her staff in the Corporate Communications office.

"There were a lot of big events last year and my team and I really worked hard to improve communications at the Command," D'Ambrosio said. "The NSWC IHEODTD Corporate Communications staff juggles a very large workload and they always make sure that every detail is taken care of."

One of the primary reasons that D'Ambrosio was nominated for the Dashiell award was her role in establishing an employee notification system.

D'Ambrosio explained that confusion over the difference between the base host command, Naval Support Activity South Potomac (NSASP), and NSWC IHEODTD as a tenant command caused issue during times when the base itself would be open but the tenant command closed. The communication system was able to reduce the confusion and also ensures that employees are notified of command status during inclement weather, as well as during emergencies on the base.

"The system that we procured allows us to make notifications from any device with internet and even when NMCI is down, so it is very reliable," D'Ambrosio explained.

The second honor bestowed on D'Ambrosio came from outside the base. Her colleague Matt Kenschak nominated her for the Trailblazer Award, presented by the Charles County Commission for Women (CCCW).

Kenschak offered high praise for his colleague and was happy to be able to recognize her personal and professional efforts.

"I have worked with her for a few years now," Kenschak said. "Her dedication to her profession and the effort she puts into both her professional and personal life only inspires others to achieve higher goals in their professional and personal lives. She is one of my most trusted and reliable peers."

D'Ambrosio has only lived in Charles County for about five years, but from her first year she was involved in volunteer outreach in her new community through her church and at McDonough High School.

Through the school, D'Ambrosio assists seniors in a mock interview process. Students present a portfolio that highlights their high school accomplishments to prepare them for future job or college interviews.

"I love participating in this event

each year because it allows me to use my skills as a communications professional to help these young people communicate better, so that they can succeed in the future," D'Ambrosio shared.

D'Ambrosio also works to recruit volunteers on NSF Indian Head to participate in various Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) related activities.

Her outstanding efforts are clearly making an impact not only at NSWC IHEODTD, but in her community as well.

Other areas of advocacy that inspire D'Ambrosio to give back are the issues of homelessness and food insecurity in Charles County.

"I know that homelessness and the need for food donation services like the food bank are big issues in the area," D'Ambrosio shared. "As a mom of two young girls, woman and children issues are very close to my heart."

the Navy's Strategic Weapons Systems to include training, systems, equipment, facilities and personnel; and fulfills the terms of the U.S.-UK Polaris sales agreement.

In the citation, Benedict states that Payne was awarded, "in appreciation of your contribution to the U.S. Navy Fleet Ballistic Missile Program, including your expertise in fire control software and targeting models as well as your quality assurance methodology enhancements to improve FBM deployed software product effectiveness and efficiency."

The SSP Director recognizes personal contributions — extraordinary in value to the success of the FBM Strategic Weapons System, of no more than two awardees annually. The nominees can be military or government employees who have not had the opportunity to serve in high visibility positions. Their work must be considered significant and important to the FBM Program.

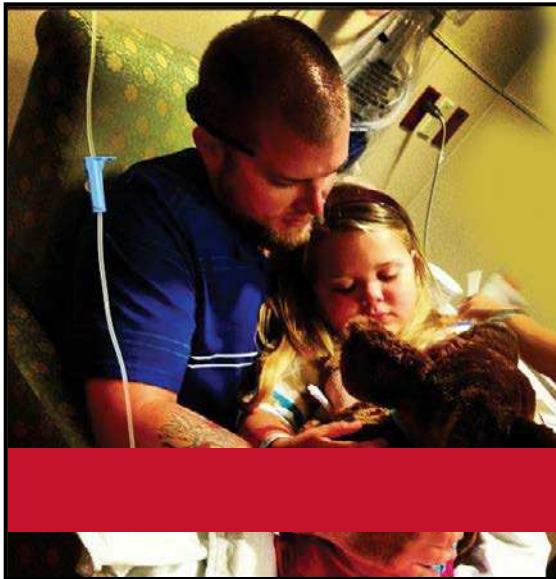

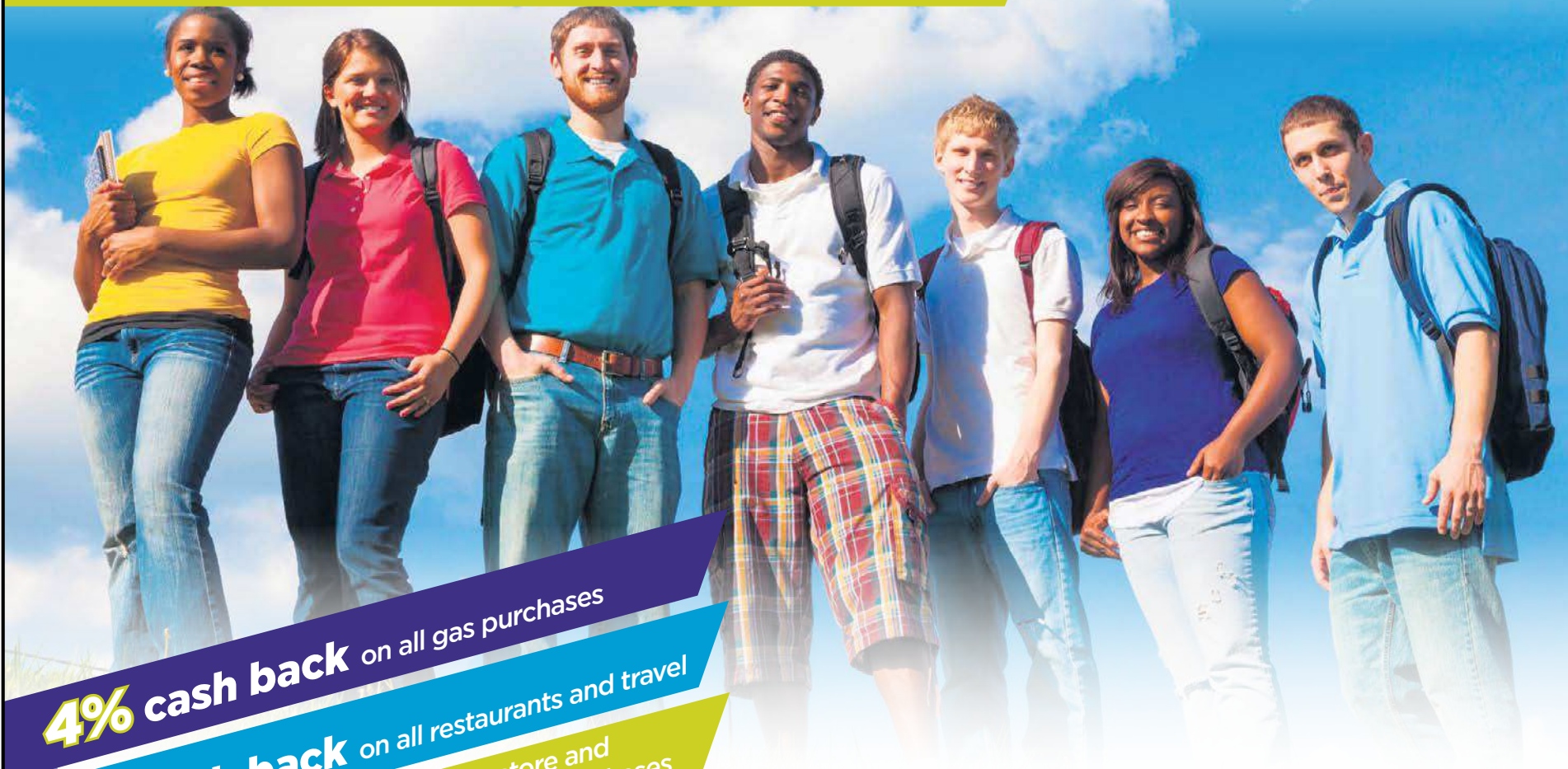
