U.S. citizens overseas should take action now in order to vote

2016 is a presidential election year and as such some preparation is required to ensure that you can utilize your right to vote while living abroad.

Most states require you to complete an absentee ballot application to start the absentee voting process even if you've previously registered. FVAP encourages the use of the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) to start the absentee voting process as it is standardized for use across all states and will extend your eligibility to receive a ballot for all Federal elections in which you are eligible.

The FPCA acts as both a registration and absentee ballot request form. FVAP encourages our military voters to submit a new FPCA every year and when they move.

It only takes a few quick steps to make sure your vote is counted no matter where you are in the world. The FPCA can be easily completed by using the FPCA online assistant at <http://www.fvap.gov/military-voter/registration-ballots> or picking up a hardcopy version from your unit voting assistance officer.

1. Complete and sign the FPCA using your state's instructions. You can find your state's instructions at <http://www.fvap.gov/military-voter/registration-ballots>.

2. Fold and seal your FPCA. If using the online FPCA, print, sign and put it in an envelope. You qualify for free postage if you use the approved envelope template found at <http://www.fvap.gov/eo/overview/materials/forms>.

3. Address and mail the FPCA to your local election official. Be sure to include your return address, and affix postage if using a foreign postal service. The CMR does not require postage if you use the template provided.

Take a moment to register to vote early enough to allow for the time spent in the mail system and be able to fix any problem that you might encounter. For more information, contact the USAG Benelux Installation Voting Assistance Officer at DSN 361-5973 or civilian 068-275973.

Don't miss the opportunity to (re)experience this fun-filled local tradition. Crossage takes place on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 10, starting at noon in the streets of Chièvres and surrounding villages.

The city of Chièvres will be closed to all traffic, and no parking will be allowed.

Crossage is a sport that could be described as a cross between golf and croquet. Teams compete against one another as they try to hit the kegs with the wooden, oblong "ball" (chôlette) and the wooden mallet (rabort) in as few hits as possible. The entire course covers about 30 kegs.

Cost is €32 for a rabot (€28) and a chôlette (4€), and €4 for insurance if you preregister or €5 if you register the day. The payment and registration deadline is Feb. 5.

Located in the heart of Europe, the Benelux gives you the opportunity to travel and experience the diverse cultures and history of your host country and its neighboring nations. Living in the Benelux also gives you the opportunity to sample the special foods enjoyed where you are and to make new host-nation friends.

Army Community Service offers Host Nation Orientation to newly arrived military and civilian employees and their families in USAG Benelux to teach them how to get the most out of their tour. The program provides information that will help newcomers become familiar with their new environment and will make the process of settling in smoother. Registration is required.

The orientation can familiarize you and your family with host-nation culture as well as teach you how to use public transportation and how to shop on the economy. Join the group at ACS Host Nation Orientation, and you and your family will get the information to help you integrate into your new community, aided by cultural awareness and some understanding of the language.

In the Brussels community, Host Nation Orientation can be either a two-day event or a four-day event. Travel the Benelux

Eclectic collection awaits at museum in Mariemont

Located in the middle of a 110 acre park, the 'Musée Royal de Mariemont' houses the collection of one of the richest industrialist of Wallonia, Raoul Warocqué, who donated his collection to the nation of Belgium in 1917.

Enclosed by walls, the park has a quiet, peaceful feel with large, open green spaces mixed with ponds, statues and forested areas throughout the park. Visitors can see trees from around the world. Serpentine paths loop through the park with something new to discover around every corner. The ruins of the castle of Charles of Lorraine, a very large Amida Buddha brought back by Warocqué from his travels in the Far East, and a couple of giant Sequoia Redwood trees

from California can all be found along the trails in the park.

The highlight of a walk in the park may be the "Les Bourgeois de Calais," ("The Burghers of Calais in English") a statue by Auguste Rodin, the French sculptor renowned around the world for his works "The Thinker" and "The Kiss." One of only 12 castings, it depicts the leaders of Calais, France, who offered themselves to the English in exchange for the lives of the townspeople of Calais during the Hundred Years' War. The varied emotions on the faces of the men - fear, anguish, and resignation - perfectly capture this poignant moment.

The museum reflects Warocqué's eclectic tastes. He devoted most of his for-

tune to his collection of art objects. Greek and Roman statues, jade objects from China and Egyptian antiquities were just some of his interests. A monumental bust of Cleopatra, weighing 5 tons and acquired by Warocqué on a trip to Egypt, is one of the most spectacular items in the museum.

Warocqué's interests also included regional archaeology and Tournai porcelain. Both are well represented in the museum. You can get an idea of the daily life of long ago in the region from the display of the regional artifacts. Almost 2,000 pieces of Tournai porcelain, many rare like the famous peacock plate, are on display.

Located in the museum building, the library has

130,000 volumes, mostly about art, archaeology and art history. The library also holds the archives of the Warocqué family and 5,000 handwritten letters and documents by famous men and women: royals, politicians, writers and philosophers.

Belgian invented first plastic: Bakelite

In the opening scene of the classic 1967 movie, "The Graduate," Dustin Hoffman, playing new college graduate Benjamin Braddock at a party thrown by his parents in his honor, gets advice from a family friend: "I just want to say one word to you. Just one word: plastics."

Plastics are so ubiquitous, that we don't give them a second thought. It's everywhere; the toys we play with, holding the liquids we drink and in many of the products we buy. The first plastic was invented by Leo Baekeland – a Belgian chemist living in New York.

Baekeland was born in

Ghent, Belgium, Nov. 14, 1863. He graduated first in his class from high school at 16, earning a scholarship to the University of Ghent. He received his doctorate degree with highest honors at 21. While on a scholastic fellowship trip to the United States, he decided to settle there and moved to New York in 1889.

His first big success was Velox, a photographic paper. He sold the rights to Velox to George Eastman, founder and owner of Kodak, for one million dollars in 1899. With this fortune he built a home and laboratory in Yonkers, New York.

While working on a syn-

thetic substitute for the shellac (made from beetle excretions at the time) used in electronic insulation, he came up with Bakelite, which he named after himself. The strength and mold-ability of the substance, combined with the low cost of producing the material made the product an instant success when introduced in 1909. Bakelite

was called the material of a thousand uses.

Bakelite was used to manufacture a vast array of things: telephones, jewelry, car parts, radios, and of course electric insulators. It ushered in the age of plastics and Baekeland became known as the Father of Plastic.
