# The city of Ath ready to celebrate Mr. and Mrs. Goliath

The ducasse dates back to the 15th century and takes place on the 4th weekend in August and stages the famous giants of Ath.

One of these giants is the renowned Gouyasse (Goliath), the king of the festival. After having taken his fiancée to the altar of St Julien's Church to get married, he fights the tiny David in the afternoon.

After the battle, it is time for tasting the traditional "mastelles" tart - also known as "Gouyasse" (macaroon and almond tart).

The following day the traditional procession will take place in Ath, featuring the town's seven traditional giants, along with floats and a multitude of groups.

The Giants from Ath were recognized as an Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO in 2005.

The schedule is as follows:

**Friday, Aug. 22**

- At 3 p.m.: the giant Tirant arrives
- At 4 p.m.: Mayor's archery contest
- At 7:30 p.m.: Concert by Lariguette
- At 10 p.m. the traditional burning of giant Goliath's pants on the Esplanade. It is a Belgian tradition that friends of a groom burn a pair of his pants and host a huge party before his wedding.

**Saturday, Aug. 23**

- At noon: the big bell of Saint-Julien Church announces the festivities

- At 3 p.m., celebration of the wedding of Ath's most famous couple, Mr. and Mrs. Goliath, at the Saint-Julien Church.

- At 5 p.m.: the fight between Goliath and David the shepherd in front of the city hall. After the battle, Ath citizens and friends taste the traditional "mastelles" tart..

- At 8 p.m., concert on the Grand'Place by a local band.

**Sunday, Aug. 24**

- At 9:45 a.m.: the procession with the seven giants departs from the train station and parades through the streets of Ath.

- At 3 p.m.: the procession starts at the Esplanade. The procession is based on religious traditions and was first held in gratefulness to God after he put an end to a plague that devastated Ath in 1215.

**Monday, Aug. 25:**

- In the morning: the giants parade through the streets
- At 2:30 p.m.: city archery contest
- At 6 p.m., hot-air balloon festival on the Esplanade and mini-giants

**All weekend:** fun fair on the Grand'Place

# Hell Hawks vets stop by Chièvres Air Base

Ralph Kling and Archie Maltbie, both World War II veterans of the 365th Fighter Group (the Hell Hawks), accompanied by family members of theirs and other 365th veterans visited Chièvres Air Base on Saturday, Aug. 9, 2014. The latter was stationed at Chièvres from October through December 1944 where he flew support missions for ground troops during the Battle of the Bulge.

As for Kling, he didn't set foot on Chièvres as he was shot down shortly before the Hell Hawks made it to Chièvres and he was taken as a prisoner of war. Each veteran was presented a U.S. flag by the 424th Air Base Squadron and so was the daughter of another veteran who was unable to attend the ceremony. Those flags were flown at the Squadron and above Belgium by Supreme Allied Commander Europe's helicopter detachment. Also attending the ceremony were members of Wings of Memory, an organization that has organized 26 salvages since 1997 of military aircrafts that crashed in Belgium during WWII. They exhibited parts of a 365th P-47 that crashed in Belgium. At the end of the ceremony, all attendees stood in line to get their poster signed by both veterans.

**Aug. 17** - Russia invades Germany, attacking into East Prussia, forcing the outnumbered Germans there to fall back. This marks the advent of the Eastern Front in Europe in which Russia will oppose Germany and Austria-Hungary.

**Aug. 20** - German troops occupy undefended Brussels. Following this, the main German armies continue westward and invade France according to their master strategy known as the Schlieffen Plan. It calls for a giant counter-clockwise movement of German armies wheeling into France, swallowing up Paris, and then attacking the rear of the French armies concentrated in the Alsace-Lorraine area. Under the overall command of Helmuth von Moltke, Chief of the German General Staff, the Germans seek to achieve victory over France within six weeks and then focus on defeating Russia in the East before Russia's six-million-man army, the world's largest, can fully mobilize.

**Aug. 23** - The Battle of Mons begins. It is the first major action of the British Expeditionary Force in the War. The British Army attempts to hold the line of the Mons-Condé Canal against the advancing German 1st Army. Although the British fight well and inflict disproportionate casualties on the numerically superior Germans, they were eventually forced to retreat due both to the greater strength of the Germans and the sudden retreat of the French Fifth Army, which expose the British right flank.

**1915**

**Aug. 19** - Two Americans die in the sinking of ship *Arabic*, off the Irish coast by a U-boat.

**Aug. 21** - The Battle of Scimitar Hill is the last offensive mounted by the British at Suvla during the Battle of Gallipoli. It is also the largest single-day attack ever mounted by the Allies at Gallipoli. The purpose of the attack is to remove the immediate Ottoman threat from the exposed Suvla landing and to link with the Anzac sectors to the south. Launched to coincide with the simultaneous attack on Hill 60, it is a costly failure, in which the Turks are forced to use all their reserves in "severe and bloody fighting" far into the night, with some Turkish trenches lost and retaken twice.

**1916**

**Aug. 18** - The Romanian government signs a secret treaty with the Allies; by its terms, in the event of an Allied victory Romania will acquire Transylvania, up to the River Theiss, the province of Bukovina to the River Pruth, and the entire Banat region, all territory under Austro-Hungarian control.

**1917**

**Aug. 18** - The Italian army launch their 11th battle against Austro-Hungarian troops on the Isonzo River, near Italy's border with Austria-Hungary.

**Aug. 20** - The Battle of Langemarck ends.

**1918**

**Aug. 21** - The British 3rd Army begins an attack along a 10-mile front south of Arras, while the adjacent 4th Army resumes its attack in the Somme.

**World War II****1940**

**Aug. 18** - The British evacuation of Berbera, British Somaliland is completed after troopships and hospital ship depart the port, destined for Aden. Australian cruiser HMAS Hobart is left behind to collect stragglers and destroy vehicles, fuel, and stores. Colonial troops of the Somaliland Camel Corps choose to remain; their British officers respect their decision and allow them to keep their weapons.

**1941**

**Aug. 21** - Adolf Hitler directs the transfer of units away from the Moscow area in order to bolster the siege on Leningrad and aiming to the link up with Finnish forces, as well as pulls forces from the battles in Ukraine to focus on the oil fields in the Caucasus region.

**1942**

**Aug. 17** - German submarine U-507 sinks Brazilian ship *Itagiba* off Brazil at 3:49 p.m. (36 are killed, 145 survive); later at 6:03p.m., as Brazilian ship *Arará* approaches to rescue survivors, U-507 sinks her as well (20 were killed, 16 survived).

**Aug. 20** - Henderson Field receives 31 U.S. Marine fighter aircraft (19 Wildcat fighters and 12 Dauntless dive bombers) from USS *Long Island*, allowing air supply and evacuation of wounded to begin between Espiritu Santo and Guadalcanal; the small air fleet is dubbed "Cactus Air Force".

**1943**

**Aug. 18** - Three waves of British bombers (227, 113, and 180 bombers, respectively) strike the German rocket research site at Peenemünde, dropping a total of 1,600 tons of high explosive bombs and 250 tons of incendiary bombs. Initially the damage appears to be extensive, but the site returns to operation within four to six weeks. Many buildings are left unrepaired and craters unfilled in order to trick the British into thinking that the site is abandoned after the raid.

**1944**

**Aug. 19** - Hauptmann Werner Schmidt of the German Kampfgeschwader 55 wing is awarded the Knight's Cross of the Iron Cross.

- Field Marshal Günther von Kluge commits suicide by taking cyanide near Metz, France after being relieved of his command and recalled to Berlin, Germany.

**1945**

**Aug. 22** - Japanese forces in the Manchuria region of northeastern China surrender. In the two-week campaign, the Japanese lost 80,000 killed and wounded and 54,000 taken prisoner, including 143 generals. The Soviets lost 8,200 dead and 22,000 wounded.

**Aug. 23** - The Soviet Union announces that all Japanese resistance in the Manchuria region of northeastern China has ceased. Meanwhile, Soviet troops receive the surrender of the Japanese garrison at Paramushiro, Kurile Islands.

# German general becomes USAREUR chief of staff

As announced by the German Federal Ministry of Defence, U.S. Army Europe's next chief of staff will be a general officer from the Bundeswehr, Brig. Gen. Markus Laubenthal. In this capacity, Laubenthal will synchronize the activities of the USAREUR staff in much the same manner as his American predecessors have done.

Laubenthal reported to duty full time on or about August 4.

"This is a bold and major step forward in USAREUR's commitment to operating in a multinational environment with our German allies. U.S. and German senior military leaders have been serving together in NATO's International Security Assistance Force in Afghanistan for years. Sustaining the shared capability from this experience will benefit both U.S. and German armies. As you know, actions speak louder than words, and this innovation carries a very strong message regarding our seriousness about a multinational team. I look forward to working with Brig. Gen. Laubenthal and seeing the tremendous impact his presence will have on the team," said Lt. Gen. Donald Campbell Jr., USAREUR commanding general.

Laubenthal is looking forward to his new assignment. "I view my new duties as chief of staff with interest and respect. As the commander of Panzerbrigade 12 (12th Armored Brigade) 'Oberpfalz', I have always valued the joint exercises

with our partnership unit, the 2nd Cavalry Regiment in Vilseck. I am therefore even more pleased to continue this close cooperation in a new and unique way in Wiesbaden. I am sure that I can use the experience I gained in the German Army supporting the training of ready army forces, in my new position with USAREUR."

Immediately prior to this assignment, Laubenthal served as the commander of the 12th Armored Brigade in Amberg and the chief of staff for ISAF Regional Command North in Afghanistan. Among several command and staff assignments in Germany, he also served as military assistant to the deputy commander of operations and assistant chief of staff for operations for the Kosovo Force.

## Freeze-dried plasma saves Soldier in combat

The Army Blood Program is currently involved in a pilot study to collect licensed fresh frozen plasma to be converted to freeze dried plasma.

The main goal of the Army Blood Program's freeze dried plasma initiative is to significantly increase the survival rate of soldiers on the battlefield. Freeze-dried plasma does not require dry ice or freezing, ships easier and can be easily reconstituted with water when needed.

These characteristics make the product a valuable tool for medics in the heart of battle.

The freeze-dried blood product is credited with helping to save the life of an Army Ranger critically wounded in combat.

The Army Blood Program is one of three Service Blood Program Offices of the ASBP, the official blood program of the United States military.

The ASBP is a tri-service organization representing all

three major services – Army, Navy and Air Force – and is tasked with providing safe, reliable blood and blood products to ill or injured service members, veterans and their families worldwide.

Since 1962, the Armed Services Blood Program has served as the sole provider of blood for the United States military. As a tri-service organization, the ASBP collects, processes, stores and distributes blood and blood products for Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines and their families worldwide.

As one of four national blood collection organizations trusted to ensure the nation has a safe, potent blood supply, the ASBP works closely with our civilian counterparts by sharing donors on military installations where there are no military blood collection centers and by sharing blood products in times of need to maximize availability of this national treasure. # SACEUR visits air defenders in Turkey

NATO's Supreme Allied Commander Europe visited Soldiers of U.S. Army Europe's 5th Battalion, 7th Air Defense Artillery Regiment, 10th Army Air and Missile Defense Command July 31.

Air Force Gen. Philip Breedlove toured the 5-7th's Patriot missile site and spoke to Soldiers and the media about the importance of the NATO mission to augment Turkish air defenses and guard against a possible missile strike from neighboring Syria. The U.S. battery, the second to serve a yearlong rotation, is taking part in the operation in concert with German and Dutch air defenders based respectively at Kahramanmaraş and Adana.

The U.S. participation in the mission began in January 2013 following a Turkish government request for NATO assistance to protect Turkish citizens from potential ballistic missile threats from Syria.

Breedlove said the air defenders' duty here is an embodiment of the principle of collective defense outlined in Article 5 of the NATO Treaty and at the core of NATO's mission.

"Our mission in Europe really hasn't changed," said Breedlove. "Americans are part of the NATO alliance, and where NATO needs us, that will certainly be where we are employed."

"Turkey is one of our most important and strongest allies," the general added.

"Turkey is in a very strategic spot in our alliance, and think of what Turkey is facing right now. To the south is instability in Syria, instability in western Iraq; to the north is the instability in the Black Sea, Crimea and Ukraine; and so this is key land, and defending Turkey is a big part of our NATO duties."

Breedlove said the U.S. needs to take a hard look at its force structure in Europe. He noted that since the Cold War the U.S. has reduced its forces in Europe by 80 percent, and cautioned that those forces should not be reduced further until the recent instability in the region is understood.

The general called the Patriot mission in Turkey a clear success and praised the Soldiers of the Kaiserslautern, Germany-based 5-7th for their vigilance, their support of their allies, and their demonstrated commitment to that core value of collective defense.

"If mission success for a missile defender is no missiles hit the ground, we have perfect success. I think the deterrent value of what these Soldiers have done here has meant safety to this big city you see in front of you," gesturing toward Gaziantep, a city of approximately 1.4 million people.

During his visit the general spent time speaking with

Soldiers and leaders of the 5-7th ADA about their mission and thanking them for their service, less than 75 miles from conflict zones in Syria.

"It's nice to have our leadership come and see operations that happen at Gaziantep at a personal level," said Spc. Kayla Echman, a Patriot fire control enhanced operator/maintainer assigned to 5-7th.

"I think this is a great opportunity to showcase our Soldiers and the mission that we are doing out here for NATO protecting the country of Turkey," said Lt. Col. Lisa Bartel, commander of the 5-7th.

Bartel said her unit is operational and on duty 24 hours a day, helping to serve as a deterrent. Breedlove added that the Patriot Soldiers are also fulfilling the equally important mission of building relationships with our Turkish allies.

The general said the U.S. Soldiers are getting to know the citizens of Gaziantep and used a sporting match as an example of how American and Turkish forces here are mingling and forming bonds through friendly competition that enhance and support the mission.

"It is very important that we have this bonding of our cultures," said Breedlove.

He noted that in that competition the Americans won at basketball, while the Turkish Soldiers triumphed in a soccer match.
