## NAS hurricane repairs reach \$36M

FROM NAVFAC SE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southeast recently awarded a nearly \$12.5 million increase to a previously awarded task order for the stabilization and repairs due to Hurricane Irma at Naval Air Station Key West.

This task order will be used for roof replacement, further stabilization of damaged facilities, mold remediation and other construction related tasks resulting from the hurricane, which hit NAS with Category 1 winds in the early

morning of Sept. 10.

"We continue to see improvements every day since Hurricane Irma," said NAS Key West Commanding Officer Capt. Bobby Baker. "The base took a hit, but with the help of NAVFAC, we are operational and continue to train warfighters, just six months after the storm."

URS Group, Inc. of Morrisville, North Carolina, was contracted last fall to make repairs to Navy and Marine Corps facilities that were damaged in Florida and Georgia

## Sea turtle nesting season begins soon

While Irma did her best to bust the end of the sea turtle nesting season in 2017, it's hard to tell what effect she'll have this year on the nesting cycle, which runs April 15 and runs through Oct. 31.

"My guess is that the extra sand and newly formed beaches throughout the Keys should provide more places for sea turtles to nest, but sea turtle nesting is cyclical, so those changes may not be realized until beyond this season,"

according to Naval Air Station Key West Natural Resources Manager Matthew Martin.

Martin and trained volunteers will monitor Truman Annex Beach and Boca Chica Beach for sea turtle activity. Last year, at least three nesting sites were identified.

Green sea turtle hatchlings emerged from a single nest in August and Martin found another nine active hatchlings trapped in the nest when he conducted a mandated inspection a few days after the initial emergence.

**T**here are times in our society when we need to show love to our neighbor. That time is every day.


It may not seem easy to do but with the help of God's example, I feel that we can succeed.



## Earth Day events scheduled

Naval Air Station Key West's Environmental Division will host a shoreline cleanup and an exhibit at the upcoming Ocean Fest to promote the Navy's 2018 theme for Earth Day, "Global Reach, Local Action."

This year's theme is a reminder to Sailors, Navy families and civilians that as a result of our Navy's global presence, we all have opportunities to make positive changes for the environment in our own communities, and across our regions and installations, not only on Earth Day, but throughout the year. NAS Key West, which is located in the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary, is the conservator for a number of endangered and protected species.

Those attending Mote's "Ocean Fest: A Community Celebration" can explore conservation and environmental exhibits, meet live animals and experience touch tanks, meet Mote scientists and researchers and see exhibits from other conservation and environmental groups, like NAS.

when Hurricane Irma made landfall in Florida Sept. 9 and 10. After award of this modification, the total cumulative task order value will be \$36 million.

Hurricane Irma left many building envelopes exposed by either a compromised roof or exterior closure. To date, the regional storm repair contract has addressed damage to over 120,000 square feet of roof, 232 windows, and 83 doors. "The first objective for

executing this contract was to ensure all building envelopes were secured prior to addressing interior spaces," said NAS Key West Public Works Officer Lt. Cmdr. Shawn Gorman. "To date, roofing and interior repairs averaged approximately two months and two weeks

respectively per facility."

Upcoming critical work includes shoring and concrete repairs at hangar A-936, constructing new receiver and transmitter facilities, and perimeter fence repairs.

Work is expected to be completed by September.

The two remaining identified nests disappeared as Hurricane Irma blew through Sept. 10.

"We have no way to know if last year's hatchlings survived Irma, but sea turtles have been adapting to tropical cyclones since dinosaurs were roaming the earth," Martin noted.

This season Martin expects to see nesting Loggerhead turtles, as they are the most common in Florida. He also expects to again see the less

common Green sea turtle.

"Their numbers across Florida are on the rise and it seems that a generation once hunted out of existence in the Lower Keys may have been finally replaced because of conservation efforts," said Martin.

Martin also suspected a Hawksbill sea turtle may have nested during the 2017 nest season.

"Unfortunately, Irma buried it before its due date, so we may never know," he noted. "That said, it's not outside the realm of possibility to get a Hawksbill sea turtle nest."

Anyone who observes a sea

turtle on shore, alive or dead, should contact Martin at 305-797-9576.

"We also collect data on sick, injured, or deceased sea turtles (called "strandings") on behalf of the state," he said.

People shouldn't approach, handle, disturb or harass a sea turtle as they are protected by Florida and federal law. Only those trained and with permits can handle sea turtles.

Dogs are not permitted on the beaches because of their tendency to dig holes. Active sea turtle nests produce odors detectable by dogs and the dogs present a hazard if they try to dig up the nest, which

needs to stay covered for eggs to properly develop.

Martin also urged those in neighboring homes to limit outdoor lighting as it can cause nesting females and/or hatchlings to become disoriented; the turtles' instinct is to follow light - like the moon - to guide them to the sea.

"And if folks do find themselves on one of the beaches at night, they should use red lighting - either red bulbs or a red filter - since that wavelength of light does not register with sea turtles," he added.
