President Trump lands at NAS

His visit was brief but historic. President of the United States Donald J. Trump's arrival at Naval Air Station Key West's Boca Chica Field Thursday came more than five decades after the last visit of a sitting president.

Photo archives show arrivals by President Harry Truman, President Dwight D. Eisenhower and President John F. Kennedy, who was the last to visit in November 1962.

After landing, he shook hands with service members and DOD civilians before being whisked by motorcade to Truman Annex for a briefing from Joint Interagency Task Force South, U.S. Northern Command and U.S. Southern Command.

The whirlwind visit ended with Air Force One off the ground and in the air by 2:30 p.m.

SAAPM 'Denim Day' Wednesday

DOD civilians are encouraged to show their support for Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month by wearing jeans and teal-colored clothing Wednesday, which is "Denim Day."

The "Denim Day" campaign is held on a Wednesday in April in

recognition of SAAPM.

The campaign was originally triggered by a ruling made by the Italian Supreme Court. Justices overturned a rape conviction because they believed the victim, who was wearing tight jeans, assisted her rapist by removing her jeans and thereby implied consent. The following day, the women

April 14

1969 - A North Korean aircraft shoots down an unarmed EC-121 propeller-driven Constellation, killing all 31 crewmembers on board.

April 15

1918 - First Marine Aviation Force, under the command of Capt. Alfred Cunningham, USMC, is formed at Marine Flying Field, Miami.

April 16

1947 - Congress passes Army-Navy Nurses Act, giving Navy Nurse Corps members commissioned rank.

April 17

1808 - Napoleon Bonaparte issues the Bayonne Decree, which authorizes the French seizure of all U.S. ships entering all ports of the Hanseatic League.

April 18

1958 - Lt. Cmdr. G.C. Watkins, flying a Grumman F11F-1F Tiger at Edwards Air Force Base, California, sets a world altitude record of 76,938 feet.

April 19

1960 - The Grumman A2F-1 Intruder makes its first flight. The Intruder receives the designation of A-6A in 1962, and upon entering service in 1963, becomes the principle all weather/night attack aircraft.
