# Paint experiment successful in protecting terns, jets

What began as an experiment in 2015 to deter the nesting along Naval Air Station Key West's runways has proved successful, protecting the bird - and pilots - from dangerous strikes.

In 2011, the installation recorded six bird strikes attributed to Least terns. In the past few years, the number has been zero.

"The Least terns prefer nesting on white gravelly or sandy substrates, but avoid dark substrates due to risk of a predator finding their eggs," said USDA Biologist Rosamaria Gonzales, who is in charge of NAS Key West's Bird Aircraft Strike Hazard program. "Their eggs are camouflaged so perfectly to light colored surroundings that you will miss it if not paying close attention."

The solution was exper-

# Delayed dependent travel revised for school-aged kids

## FROM CHIEF OF NAVAL PERSONNEL PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Effective immediately, to minimize the disruption to the education of school-aged children and increase family stability, Navy has revised the delayed dependent travel policy for Sailors who are undergoing a permanent change of station and have school-aged dependents.

In line with Joint Travel Regulations, when PCS orders have been issued, a Sailor's

dependents may perform PCS travel at a different time.

The Sailor may also be authorized a housing allowance based on the location at which the dependents maintained a permanent residence, at the previously approved designated place or the old permanent duty station.

Sailors with school-aged dependents frequently request delayed dependent travel. Under the old policy, approval for requests to delay dependent travel were normally limited to the end of the current school

term, which is usually the end of June or December (depending on the member's detach date).

The new policy allows Sailors with school-aged dependents to request delayed dependent travel until the end of the school year.

imental, and simple: Paint the gravel along Boca Chica Field's runways with an environmentally safe green paint that would encourage the terns to find a more suitable nesting site.

A contractor laid the paint the first year, in 2015, and Gonzales noticed the terns "were moving on." Since then, crews working for NAS paint the graveled runway edges in March before the birds' arrival in April. By the time nesting season is over and eggs have hatched, the paint has faded.

"The numbers have been reduced dramatically," she noted. "I have seen very few least terns this year," Gonzalez said. "It's good for the bird and the planes. Safety goes hand-in-hand."

She said she has seen photos of Least terns in other areas more hospitable to nesting - like Fort Jefferson, adding the deterrent program will continue even if the nesting numbers have dwindled.

"We're training them, basically, for future generations," Gonzales noted. "Once their chicks hatch, they will be imprinted with that nesting site and return there. I've got to keep on top of it."

The terns also are finding fewer nesting sites on other annexes - like Truman and Sigsbee - mainly because of continuing roof repairs from Hurricane Irma.

If nesting does occur residents are reminded to leave the nesting site alone.

The adult birds are extremely sensitive to prolonged or frequent disturbance, according to NAS Environmental Director Ed Barham.

It's imperative they stay with their nests because the eggs and chicks require parental protection from daytime heat. If disturbed, the young chicks may fall off the roofs or suffer heat exposure.

To protect the species, follow these policies:

Before accessing any flat roof

- or very shallow pitched roofs - between April and August contact Matt Martin, the installation's Natural Resources Manager at 305-797-9576. The manager will determine if terns are nesting on your roof.

If you see terns on or around your roof, call the NRM. If you find a tern chick that has fallen off a roof, contact the NRM. If the NRM is not available, call Wildlife Rescue of the Florida Keys at 305-292-1008.

ported by Fleet and Family Support Center.

In his proclamation, Reagan discussed why military spouses deserved special recognition:

"Since the early days of the Continental Army, the wives of our servicemen have made unselfish contributions to the spirit and well-being of their fighting men and the general welfare of their communities.

"Throughout the years, as the numbers of our married men and women in uniform have grown and as their military missions have become more complex and dispersed, their spouses have made countless personal sacrifices to support the Armed Forces.

"In many instances, they subordinated their personal and professional aspirations to the greater benefit of the service family. Responding to the call of duty, they frequently endured long periods of separation or left familiar surroundings and friends to re-establish their homes in distant places, where they became American ambassadors abroad.

"As volunteers, military spouses have provided exemplary service and leadership in educational, community, recreational, religious, social and cultural endeavors. And as parents and homemakers, they preserve the cornerstone of our Nation's strength - the American family."

Reagan said he signed the proclamation "in recognition of the profound

importance of spouse commitment to the readiness and well-being of service members on active duty and in the National Guard and Reserve, and to the security of our Nation."

America's military spouses are the backbone of the families who support service members during all phases of the military life-cycle. They are the silent heroes who are essential to

the strength of the nation.

Then Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Jonathan Greenert declared his recognition of the contributions and the Navy's dependency on spouses with the release of the Navy Family Framework in November 2017.

"Navy families are an integral part of our Navy team and a vital contributor to mission success," he noted.

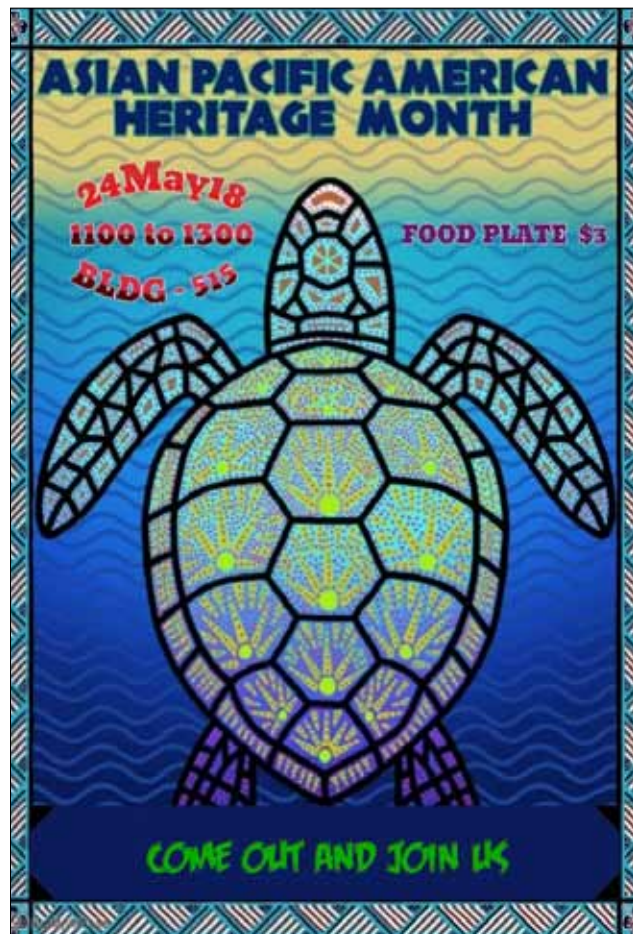
