





imental, and simple: Paint the gravel along Boca Chica Field's runways with an environmentally safe green paint that would encourage the terns to find a more suitable nesting site.

A contractor laid the paint the first year, in 2015, and Gonzales noticed the terns "were moving on." Since then, crews working for NAS paint the graveled runway edges in March before the birds' arrival in April. By the time nesting season is over and eggs have hatched, the paint has faded.

"The numbers have been noted. "Once their chicks hatch, reduced dramatically," she noted. "I have seen very few least terns this year." Gonzalez said. "It's good for the bird and the planes. Safety goes hand-in-hand."


