

RUKLA, Lithuania – Just over a century since they first stepped foot in Europe, members of the All American Division once again traversed the Atlantic Ocean to demonstrate their unique capabilities that few other units in the United States military can emulate.

Traveling aboard a C-17 Globemaster aircraft, elements of the 82nd Airborne Division conducted a non-stop flight from their home at Fort Bragg, North Carolina to Lithuania and Latvia where they parachuted into their respective tree-lined drop zones during the early morning hours on June 9.

"We flew over seven-thousand kilometers from our location in North Carolina, performed one aerial refuel and then dropped in here [Lithuania] with enough combat power and communi-

cations to reach back to our home station and partner nations," said U.S. Army Lt. Col. Scott Pence, the commander in charge of the jump near Rukla, Lithuania.

Pence and other members of the 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division, jumped as part of the annual Swift Response training exercise.

Swift Response 18 featured airborne forces from nine nations, including Israel, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Portugal, Spain, the United Kingdom and the United States.

"By working with our NATO allies and partner nations, we are able to maintain and strengthen our interoperability," said Pence. "Everytime we do an exercises like this and work with the Lithuanians, the Polish or Latvians, we are able to test our communication systems, our signals and also our battle tactics, techniques and procedures."


