3rd ID HQ deploys to provide support, assistance

With another deployment underway, Fort Stewart's top general made no bones about what his soldiers face in Afghanistan - even in an advisory capacity.

"It's a very dangerous place for all military members serving in Afghanistan," said Maj. Gen. Leopoldo Quintas, who is among 250 soldiers from 3rd ID headquarters headed to that country to "advise, assist and support"

Afghan security forces and U.S. troops.

That's been underscored since Quintas spoke to local media prior to Friday's ceremony marking the deployment, which is expected to last less than a year. You only have to use Google.

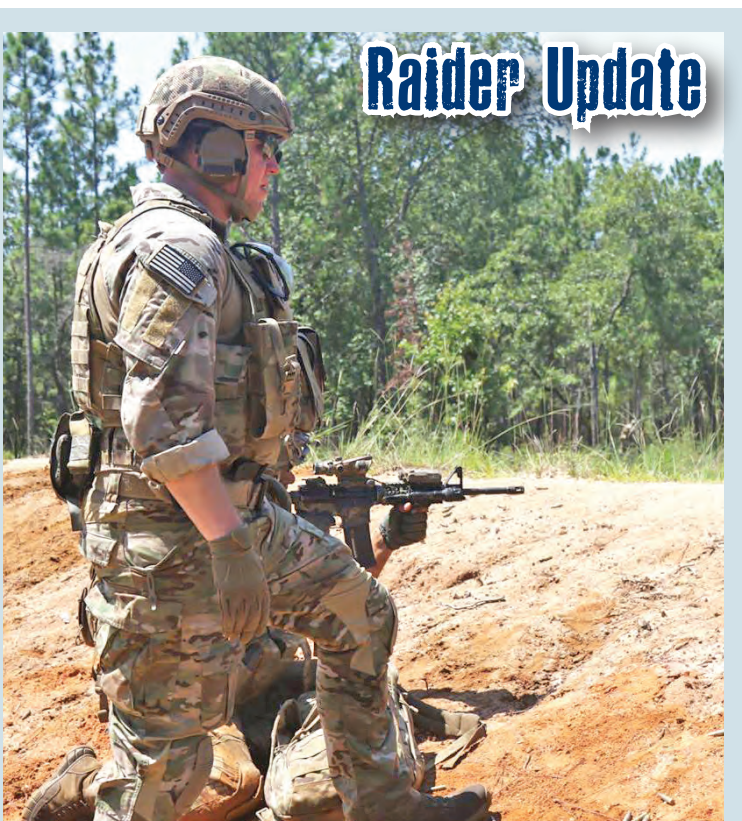
CNN and other news agencies reported late Monday the Russians could be arming the Taliban. There also were reports Monday that 23 Afghanistan government workers were killed in a suicide bombing in Kabul, and a Friday story by The Guardian claimed

U.S. friendly fire killed 12 Afghan policemen.

The Global War on Terror, now in its 16th year, grinds on and on.

The Taliban, which claimed responsibility for the Kabul bombing, is only one of a number of groups launching attacks against the U.S.-led NATO coalition and current Afghanistan government. There's also an ISIS branch to be wary of - "the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant-Khorasan Province" or ISIS-K, for short.

See something, say something

This August marks the eighth annual Antiterrorism Awareness Month and Fort Stewart is reminding its occupants and local community to be alert and report any suspicious activity.

The purpose of Antiterrorism Awareness Month is to educate the Army and civilian communities on the threat of violent extremism and provide information on how to prevent acts of terrorism.

"The importance of antiterrorism awareness lies in understanding past threats, recognizing current threats and mitigating force protection vulnerabilities by any measure," said 1st Lt. Samuel Oquendo, area security force protection operations officer in the 385th Military Police

Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division.

There are four components vital to antiterrorism awareness: recognizing and reporting unusual activity; staying up-to-date on annual training; fighting the insider threat and being aware of the potential dangers on social media.

These components make up the iWATCH program - "if you see something, say something" - and the iSALUTE program for counterintelligence reporting.

Army Family Members and the local community outside the gates play large roles in deterring enemy threats. To remain steps ahead of the threat, members in both communities need to educate themselves on antiterrorism, said Steve Bills, senior antiterrorism and force protection program officer for the garrison commander at Fort Stewart.

"Antiterrorism starts with the Soldier," Bills said. "The Soldier instructs their Family Members on how to maintain antiterrorism awareness, and we capitalize on that through training like the Antiterrorism Officer course conducted by a mobile training team from Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri."

The training received from the MTT certifies unit officers and non-commissioned officers to develop antiterrorism plans and training needed to maintain readiness. The certified personnel work together with the Division Provost Marshall in developing the training, reporting suspicious activity and creating effective antiterrorism measures, said Lt. Col. Martin Schmidt 3rd Infantry

Division Provost Marshall.

"As we prepare to kick off the annual Antiterrorism Awareness campaign in conjunction with upcoming deployments, it is a great time to re-evaluate personal protective measures and reinforce good operational security," Schmidt said. Protect the information you know and you will protect the people you love."

Being aware of the terrorist threat and understanding what can be done in the fight against terrorism are the cornerstones of the Army's defense, said Bills.

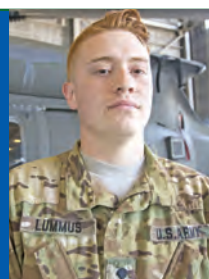

their achievement; to express appreciation for their efforts; and to wish them well in their future endeavors.

That group alone offers what Quintas called “a significant threat,” in Afghanistan. It’s better to face them there than at home, he said.

“There are 20 some odd terrorist groups that operate in Afghanistan,” Quintas said. “Part of what we’re doing is fighting the away game, taking the fight to them in Afghanistan so they are suppressed, so they don’t ever have the opportunity to come here.”

3rd ID’s mission

There are approximately 8,400 U.S. troops in Afghanistan, and the 3rd ID’s role is largely one of support. The division’s soldiers will be concentrated at Bagram Airfield, the largest U.S. military base in the country.

Quintas, as 3rd ID’s commander, will take over leadership of Bagram Airfield from the 1st Calvary Division.

“Bagram Airfield, that’s my first duty,” he said, noting he’ll be responsible for base operations, safety and protection.

Quintas also will serve as a deputy commander for support of Operation Inherent Resolve.

“We’ll be providing food, fuel, ammo, life support and equipment for the entire operation in Afghanistan for the NATO coalition,” he said.

The 3rd ID headquarters will also serve as a support element for U.S. troops in Afghanistan and as “contingency headquarters for any contingency operation that might occur in Afghanistan.”

Two of Quintas’ deputy commanders — Brigadier Gen. John Richardson and Brigadier Gen. David Hamilton — are also deploying and will serve as advisors with two Afghan National Army corps, the 201st and 203rd.

Another portion of the 3rd ID soldiers will be stationed in Kuwait and Qatar.

Some are already in place in Afghanistan, others will leave soon. Quintas said he expects the entire headquarters element to be in the region by the end of August.

Top enlisted Soldier

Among those deploying is Command Sgt. Maj. Daniel Hendrex, who recently returned from a tour in the country with Combined Security Transition Command—Afghanistan.

Hendrex has been at Fort Stewart for about a month. but that’s more time than he got earlier in his career, he said.

“About 23-24 years ago I arrived at Fort Stewart as a young sergeant and, quickly, in about a week, I was deploying to Mogadishu in Somalia,” Hendrex said. “So I’m thankful to Gen. Quintas and the 3rd ID, because this time I got

three or four weeks at home before deploying.”

This is Hendrex’s “fourth or fifth time,” in Afghanistan. He called the 3rd ID’s job “an interesting mission set. And I think we’re very well suited to this mission.”

The U.S. is working with the Afghan National Army, which numbers about 350,000 and includes its air force, police and other security forces.

Life goes on at home

Don’t expect life on Fort Stewart or in the surrounding community to change much with only about 250 of the 3rd ID’s more than 24,000 soldiers deploying, officials said.

Quintas said Task Force Marne, commanded by Col. Sean Bernabe and top enlisted advisor Command Sgt. Major John Johnson, will keep the division on the rails.

Bernabe said his priorities are those established by Quintas.

“First is readiness in all its factors,” Bernabe said. “No. 2 is that Fort Stewart remain the best installation in our Army. And third is to maintain, strengthen and enhance the already great relationships we have with the local communities around Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield.”

Among the upcoming missions for 3rd ID at home are training up the 1st Brigade Armored Combat Team for a trip to the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, Calif., in October; continuing the conversation of the 2nd Brigade Combat Team from infantry to armor; helping the 48th Brigade prepare for a trip to the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, La.; training the Army’s first Security Force Assistance Brigade at Fort Benning; and celebrating the 3rd ID’s 100th birthday in November.

Not all of the 250 soldiers on the deployment will stay throughout the mission and some could rotate home and others take their place. But both Quintas and Hendrex said the mission won’t impact local communities as some have in the past, most memorably Desert Storm. Then, as soldiers deployed, families went home.

“Now, for the most part when our soldiers go on a mission their families are here, they stay here, their children go to school, their spouses work and life goes on. And then the soldier goes back home and we start building readiness for our next rotational mission,” Quintas said, noting that local support is still important.

“Tell our local community we need them more than ever when our soldiers deploy. They’ve always been a

great assistance and great neighbors to our Families as we do our nation’s business.”

Hendrex, who is married, said the deployment might even be a boost to the local economy.

“I will tell you when I came back from deployment I found some very interesting things in my house that I don’t know we would have bought when I was here,” he said. “New furniture, new lamps. And it was great.”

DES CORNER: Learning about Storm Warnings

Do you know the difference between atropical storm watch and warning? Do you know where to get information to prepare for severe weather?

The Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield Hurricane and Severe Weather Guide, found on the Team Stewart website at www.stewart.army.mil (under the about column) has key terms, evacuation routes, checklist and more.

Some key terms and definitions associated with tropical cyclones, as given by the National Hurricane Center, are presented here.

Tropical Storm Watch: A tropical storm watch is issued when tropical storm conditions, including winds from 39 to 73 miles per hour (mph), pose a possible threat to a specified coastal area within 36 hours.

Tropical Storm Warning: A tropical storm warning is issued when tropical storm conditions, including winds from 39 to 73 mph, are expected in a specified coastal area within 24 hours or less.

Hurricane Watch: A hurricane watch is issued for a specified coastal area for which a hurricane or a hurricane-related hazard is a possible threat within 36 hours.

Hurricane Warning: A hurricane warning is issued when a hurricane with sustained winds of 74 mph or higher is expected in a specified coastal area in 24 hours or less. A hurricane warning can remain in effect when dangerously high water or a combination of dangerously high water and exceptionally high waves continues, even though the winds may have subsided below hurricane intensity.

Inland Tropical Storm Watch: Issued for interior counties when sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph associated with a tropical storm are possible within 36 hours.

Inland Tropical Storm Warning: Issued for interior counties when sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph associated with a tropical storm are expected within 24 hours.

Inland Hurricane Watch: Issued for interior counties when sustained winds of 74 mph or greater associated with a hurricane are possible within 36 hours.

Inland Hurricane Warning: Issued for interior counties that sustained winds of 74 mph or greater associated with a hurricane are expected within 24 hours.

Radio Channels:

Georgia's public radio station collaborates with Georgia Emergency Management Agency, and other agencies to provide real time information to people during a hurricane. Tune to these FM radio frequencies in the following areas for severe weather information:

- Dahlonega -89.5
- Athens -91.7/97.9
- Fort Gaines -90.9
- Augusta -90.7
- Macon -89.7
- Brunswick -88.9
- Rome -97.7
- Carrollton -90.7
- Savannah -91.1

- Columbus -88.1
- Valdosta -91.7
- Demorest -88.3
- Waycross -90.1

Evacuation Routes

Soldiers and Family Members residing off-post will follow the orders and directives of their respective local emergency management agency. Once the evacuation begins it is imperative for all personnel to pay particular attention to the hurricane evacuation route signage.

Additionally, the Georgia Emergency Management Agency in conjunction with the Georgia Department of Transportation will have portable electronic message boards along the routes containing updated directions and information. Some Coastal Georgia evacuation routes are:

Chatham County:

- State Road 21
- US Highway 80
- Interstate 16
- State Road 204 to US Highway 280

Bryan County:

- Highway 144 to US Highway 301 (Glennville)

Liberty County:

- US 84 to Highway 196 to Highway 301 (Glennville)

As part of the 3rd Infantry Division's Marne Pride Anti-Driving Under the Influence Campaign which began Sept. 1, 2011, the Frontline is keeping up with how Marne Soldiers at Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield are doing in the campaign by publishing this chart showing how units are faring and how much more attention leaders should give on the subject of DUIs. Following is a reminder of that pledge:

I will drive safely. I will operate the vehicle safely and follow all laws and safety rules. I will wear my seat belt at all times. I will not use a cell phone to talk or text message while driving.

I won't get in the car with an unsafe driver. I will not ride with someone who is impaired because of alcohol or drugs (legal or not), or with someone I know is aggressive behind the wheel. I know that I can call someone for a ride any time I feel that I need to get out of an unsafe situation.

I will respect your rules. I will drive within the boundaries we've discussed.

I will call you. If I need a ride home I can count on someone in my chain of command to either pick me up or make arrangements to have me picked up, no questions asked and without retribution.

I agree to live and abide by this pledge.
Commanders and Leaders:

I will be there for you. I/We will ensure, that if called upon, we will either arrange for transportation or personally provide you a safe ride home, even if you have broken every rule that we have agreed to follow, we will make sure you get home safely.

I will be a good role model and lead by example. I agree to live by the same safe driving rules we have set for you.

Additionally, all new Soldiers to the Marne Division will sign a similar pledge - keep your unit off the bottle by abiding by your pledge. **Don't drink and drive.**

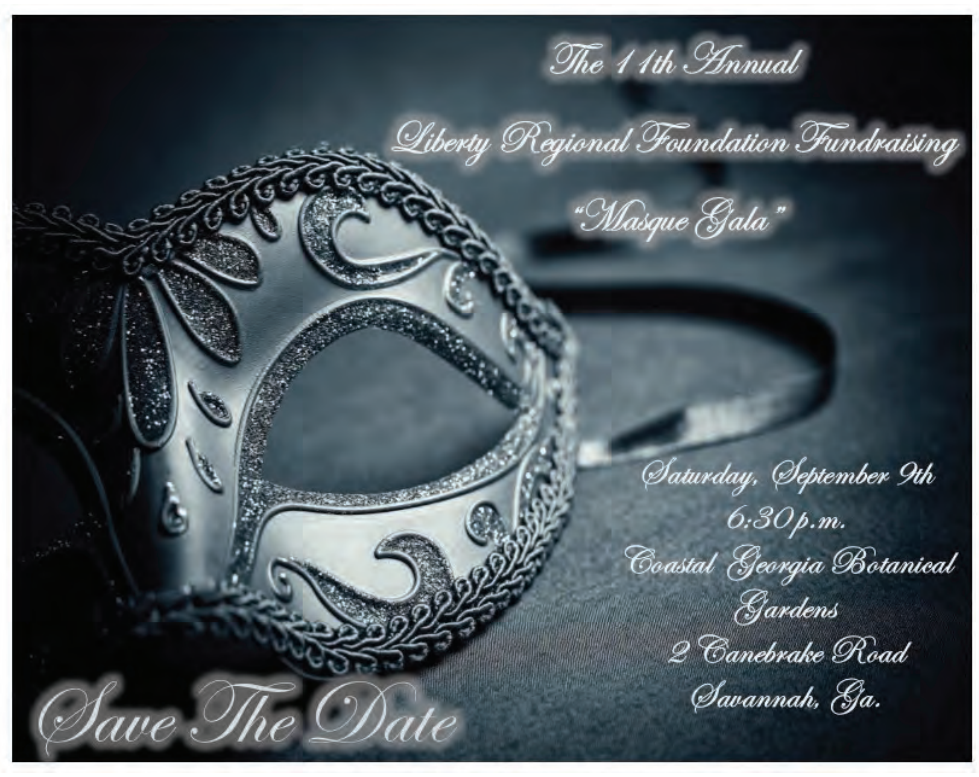

Marne chaplains celebrate their corps' 242nd birthday

Chaplains, chaplain assistants, dog-faced Soldiers and their Families gathered at the Corkan Family Recreation Center on Fort Stewart, to celebrate the U.S. Army Chaplain Corps' birthday, July 28.

The event included various activities such as bowling, roller skating, swimming and a cake-cutting. In typical chaplain fashion, they kicked it off with a benediction and a short speech delivered by Col. Gregory Walker, the 3rd Infantry Division chaplain.

"Second only to the Infantry, we're the oldest corps in the Army," said Gregory. "That's saying something about our importance right there."

On the heels of the Army's birthday, the Chaplain Corps was established as an integral part of the Continental Army on July 29, 1775.

"For even the most benevolent commander, a Soldier is a means to an end," said Maj. John D. Hubbs, chaplain, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division. "A commander's mission is to fight and win the nation's wars on land. Even for quality leaders, that's the nature of it across the board. But for the chaplain, the Soldier him or herself is our end-game. The well-being of that Soldier and their Family is our mission."

Since its inception, over 25,000 chaplains have joined the ranks as religious advisors. During garrison operations, peacetime mis-

sions and in combat, chaplains and chaplain assistants perform their unique – yet necessary – duties in one of the most religiously diverse organization in the world.

"There are certain heroes within the chaplain's corps that I admire," said Hubbs. "Most notably is Father Emil Kapaun, the most recent chaplain to be awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor (posthumously). And also in the Catholic Church he is being considered for sainthood. That's pretty hardcore right there."

Kapaun is one of seven Army chaplains who have been awarded the nation's highest medal of valor. From the revolutionary battles of Lexington and Concord to fire fights in the mountains of Afghanistan in the fight against terror, chaplains have served in all of America's major wars and combat engagements.

Ask any Soldier who has participated in a suicide prevention or sexual harassment/sexual assault response and prevention brief and they will answer with a resounding 'the chaplain', in regards to reporting outlets and resources – and with good reason.

"We offer that safety blanket of confidentiality," continued Hubbs. "Sometimes there are just people who just need to get something off of their chest or just feel listened to."

Hubbs wrapped up by reflecting on his career and noting the satisfaction he has garnered throughout his tenure.

"I'm very proud to be an Army chaplain," said Hubbs. "I feel it's a distinct calling. I wake up every day knowing I am serving in the role that God intended me to serve in. That gives me a great sense of service and confidence."

Beef & Bean Enchiladas

Ingredients

Enchilada Sauce

- 1 pound tomatillos (see tip), husks removed, quartered (Produce aisle)
- 1 large onion, coarsely chopped (Produce aisle)
- 2 cloves garlic, quartered (Produce aisle)
- 1 jalapeno, seeded (if desired) and quartered (Produce aisle)
- 1 10-ounce can Rotel diced tomatoes or one 14-ounce can Mexican-style diced tomatoes (Aisle 9)
- 1 cup reduced-sodium chicken broth (Aisle 9)

Filling

- 1 tablespoon canola oil (Aisle 9)
- 12 ounces lean (90% or leaner) ground beef (Meat aisle)
- 3 large Portobello mushrooms, gills removed, diced (Produce aisle)
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin (Aisle 10)
- 1/4 teaspoon salt (Aisle 10)
- 1 16-ounce can fat-free refried bean, preferably spicy (Aisle 9)
- 16 5-6 inch whole-wheat flour tortillas or corn tortillas (Aisle 9)
- 2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese (Aisle 14)

The Fort Stewart Community Health Promotion Council rolled out the Cooking Light initiative. The goal of the initiative is to encourage community members to eat healthier

by providing healthy recipes and nutrition tips. Weekly recipes will be featured in the commissary, the Frontline and the Marne Health website.

Community members are encouraged to submit their own healthy recipes to be considered for use in the Cooking Light initiative to MarneHealth@gmail.com.

Preparation: (45 minutes)

To prepare sauce: Place tomatillos, onion, garlic, and jalapeno in a food processor; pulse until coarsely pureed. Transfer to a large saucepan. Add tomatoes and broth to the pan and bring to a simmer over medium-high heat. Reduce heat to maintain a simmer and cook, stirring occasionally, for 15 minutes. Set aside.

- Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- To prepare filling: Meanwhile, heat oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium heat. Add ground beef, mushrooms, cumin, and salt; cook, stirring and breaking up the beef with a spoon, until the beef is no longer pink and most of the liquid from the mushrooms is gone, about 5 minutes. Add beans and stir to combine. Remove from heat.
- Spread 1/2 cup of the sauce in a 9x13 inch baking dish. Dip a tortilla in the remaining sauce to moisten it and place on a clean cutting board. Spread 1/4 cup of the filling down the middle of the tortilla and roll it into a cigar shape. Place seam-side down in the prepared baking dish. Repeat with the remaining tortillas and filling, placing the enchiladas snugly next to each other to make a single layer. Top the enchiladas with the remaining sauce and sprinkle with cheese.
- Bake until the enchiladas are hot and the cheese begins to brown, 15 to 20 minutes.

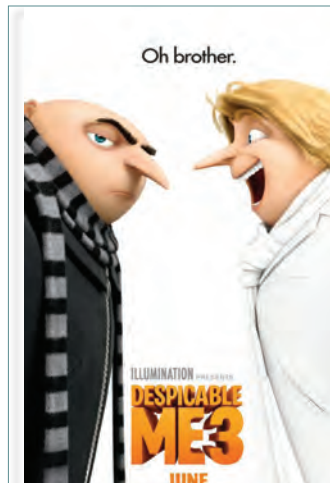

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Don't downplay emotions, don't quit

No foolin'. There I was, walking with my girlfriend, Jennifer, away from the classroom building at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, in Louisville, KY. It was two weeks before finals my last semester there.

"I've had it. I quit," I said!

I tell folks that after I picked myself up off the ground, she told me that I was not going to quit! She didn't punch me, but I suspect she felt as if I'd punched her. She did inform me that I was going to finish my degree! I did, and we were married several months later.

I owe my master's degree to the unbeatable team of God and my wife. In fact, I owe every good thing in my life and every good thing I've been able to do to that same team.

What do you do when you feel like quitting? We've all gotten to that point – some of us several times. There is absolutely nothing wrong with feeling frustrated and even hopeless. Those are natural and all-too-normal emotions.

There's much that is terribly wrong about wallowing in those emotions and staying in that low place. Jennifer is very wise and understands this. She let me release some steam, then helped keep me on course – and on schedule.

Two points become clear in this conversation. The first is that we must not downplay our emotions

when we're in a difficult place. If we put on a happy face and pretend everything's OK, we're only trying to fool ourselves. Usually, we don't succeed in fooling anybody.

Pain, disappointment, frustration and fear are real, and if we don't face them, they'll gang up on us and beat us down. No one wants to admit that they're not 100 percent in control of everything in their lives, but we all know we never are.

The Army's message for years has been that we must ask for help. There are times we absolutely need some assistance to get where we want to be and do what we need to do. It's like moving a generator. You may think you can pick it up and move it. Don't.

While Jennifer encouraged me, I still had to study and read and prepare for my finals. I still had to pass the classes. She couldn't do that for me. She could help protect me from my emotions.

The second message is that, even though someone is helping, you're still the one doing the work. When you're lifting free weights, your spotter is helping you, but it's your muscles doing "the heavy lifting."

There's an anonymous poem entitled, "Don't Quit."

*When things go wrong, as they sometimes will,
When the road you're trudging seems all uphill,
When the funds are low and the debts are high,
And you want to smile, but you have to sigh,
When care is pressing you down a bit
Rest if you must, but don't you quit.*

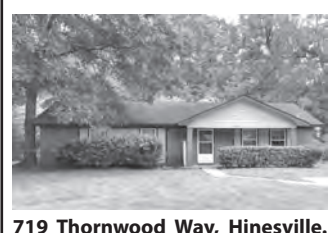

Prepping for the Army 10-Miler

'On your mark, get ready, go,' were the words used to start the Fort Stewart Army 10-miler qualifier. Contestants competed to represent Fort Stewart in the upcoming Army 10-miler Oct. 8, to represent Fort Stewart in the best team category.

As the racers take off, being dusted by the top competitors the underdog with much heart showed his lethal canines in the race.

Spc. Rodney Lloyd, a human resource specialist for Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 3rd Infantry Division Artillery, began to fulfill his dream with the qualifier race.

"The race started with me losing; I was not the top competitor," said Lloyd. "Seven miles into the race I caught up to the first place competitor."

Lloyd had only been in DIVARTY for seven months and during that time he had to overcome obstacles to pursue his dreams.

Warrant Officer Regina Crump, a human resources technician for DIVARTY, mentored Lloyd about his dreams.

"When I first met Lloyd he reminded me a lot of myself when I was a private first class," Crump said. "Lloyd is a great runner, so when I saw the flyer for the Army 10-miler, I immediately thought of him. He has a gift and I decided to help and support his goals."

After getting the green light to participate in the qualifier race, Lloyd only had one month to prepare conditioning his mind, body and spirit for the test.

"I split my training to two workout regimens," Lloyd said. "The first session worked on my sprints where I do one lap on the track

to make it under a minute taking a 30 second break to repeat the process to build up my lungs."

"The second workout is running five-miles with the goal to finish in 27 minutes to build the endurance in my legs," Lloyd said.

Not once did he falter in his workout because he was doing it not just to accomplish his goals but something more intimate, Lloyd said.

"The pain I felt while working out was nothing because in my mind I could hear my mother's voice saying 'You got this, baby,' and 'You can do it,'" Lloyd said. "All I could think about was the pain she endured while taking care of me growing up in Chicago. So, my biggest motivator is my mother and wife to hear them say I'm proud of you."

At the seven-mile mark, this dog-faced Soldier met up with the first place competitor and realized in the moment that he had the intestinal fortitude to go all the way to the finish line. Lloyd began open his stride even wider seeing the clock in the distance knowing he was going to blow past his competitor, Lloyd said.

"When I crossed the finish line it didn't register until five minutes after my runner's high came down," Lloyd said. "It wasn't until I took a knee, and couple of tears fell did I realize that I came in first and emotions washed over me like a sea."

As the qualifier came to a close, the top eight runners who made the team Stewart were announced. Though the preliminary round is over, the main event is two months away and the pressure is on to be the best team.

"People are always coming for you giving their all, so I respond by giving them my all," Lloyd said.

The emails contain a PDF file that once opened it will load MALWARE on your system and allow the attacker access to your system and the network (at work or at home). If you receive any email, phone call, or website claiming to be USAA you can send the information to USAA at abuse@usaa.com. As it goes with any suspicious email, do not open it or any attachments. Report it to your local information security officer. This threat is at work and home, so make sure your computers are patched with the latest updates and be wary of anything that does not appear legitimate.
