

Installation CFC awards announced

2016 marked the 54th anniversary of the Combined Federal Campaign. The CFC was established in 1961 by an Executive Order to provide a single unified annual charitable campaign that was effective and could be accomplished through payroll deductions.

Except for service relief drives Army Emergency Relief and emergency disaster appeals, the CFC is the only authorized on-the-job solicitation of federal Civilian and military employees at their workplace. The goal, which was met, was to contact 100 percent of personnel assigned to Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield.

The 3rd Infantry Division Commander Maj. Gen. Jim Rainey was on-hand to present the awards at the community leader's information briefs, Jan. 24 at Club Stewart, and Jan. 25 at Hunter Club.

The categories for receiving donor incentive awards included:

Highest donation contributed from a Brigade with a population of 1,000 and above. The winner was 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade. The 3rd CAB commander Command Team, Col. Jeffrey Becker and Command Sgt. Maj. Terri Clavon accepted the award.

The second award was for highest donation contributed from a Garrison directorate or equivalent level. The winner was the Directorate of Resource management. Michelle Glenn accepted the award.

The third category was for highest donation contributed from a battalion with a population of 150 – 1000. The winner was 87th Combat Service Support Battalion. Maj. Octavia Davis accepted the award.

Another group that was recognized was the loan associates to the Georgia Combined Federal Campaign; who provided the support necessary for federal agency key workers and coordinators to conduct successful campaigns. Highlighted for their effort in 2016 were Staff Sgt. Orlando Vazquez, Co. D, 2-3 General Support Aviation Battalion, and Staff Sgt. Donovan Ulmet - 603rd Aviation Support Battalion.

"However, there are times when the department must make difficult decisions that impact our civilians, and in doing so, it is imperative these decisions result in our continued ability to seamlessly execute our national security mission. When circumstances necessitate a RIF, the department must ensure we are retaining our highest performing employees."

Changes Apply to All

The changes will apply to almost all of DoD's 750,000 civilian employees. This change in the RIF process only applies to DoD. The government wide provisions that rank four retention factors by tenure of employment; veterans' preference; length of service; and performance remain in place for other federal agencies.

Under the new system, if an agency is forced to employ a RIF, employees will be placed on a retention register based on periods of assessed performance of 12 months or more or less than 12 months. The idea is to give an equitable comparison for employees whose performance has been assessed over a comparable period of time.

The first retention factor is rating of record. The rating of record is the average drawn from the two most recent performance appraisals received by the employee within the four-year period preceding the cutoff date for the RIF.

The second factor is tenure group. There are three tenure groups, with group III being temporary or term employees, these employees will be ranked at the bottom of the retention register below groups I and II.

Tenure group I and II employees are those serving on permanent appointments. Tenure group I includes employees who are not on probation and whose appointments are not career-conditional.

Tenure group II employees are those hired into permanent appointments in a career-conditional or probationary status. In general, tenure group II employees must have three years of creditable service and meet

all other stated conditions of their probationary period in order to attain Tenure group I status. Tenure group I will be ranked above employees in tenure group II within each rating of record group.

Third Factor

The third factor is an employee's average score. In general, an employee's average score for one performance appraisal is derived by dividing the sum of the employee's performance element ratings by the number of performance elements. For purposes of RIF, average score is the average of the average scores drawn from the two most recent performance appraisals received by the employee within the four year period preceding the "cutoff date" for the RIF.

Veterans' preference is the fourth factor. "Veterans are a key part of the civilian workforce, representing a highly skilled, extremely well-qualified cadre of employees," Blanks said. "The department firmly believes that highly performing veterans in the civilian workforce will not be disadvantaged by the new RIF policy."

The final factor is the DoD service computation date-RIF, with those serving the longest having the edge.

DoD officials stress that a RIF is always the last resort for the department. They will do everything they can to mitigate the size of reductions, including the use of voluntary early retirement authority or voluntary separation incentive payments. Agencies will also use hiring freezes, termination of temporary appointments, and any other pre-RIF placement options.

The new DoD RIF policy and procedures are consistent with the implementation of the DoD Performance Management and Appraisal Program. This program standardizes the civilian performance appraisal system throughout the department.

CASA members get view of Army life

Ben Kimbrough, a Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army, who has been one of the Tennessee representatives for the last 28 years, thanked Spc. Hunter Pippin, 603rd Aviation Support Battalion, another Tennessee native, for sharing his lunch hour with him in the Hunter DFAC, Jan. 31. The twosome talked about life in the Army, and their personal histories during his visit to Hunter with 16 other CASAs attending the Southeast Regional CASA Conference in Savannah Jan. 30-Feb. 2.

Known as CASAs, the elite group of volunteers, are appointed by the Secretary of the Army to promote understanding between the Army and civilian communities and to present some of the issues of Army life in all 50 states to the Secretary of the Army. They serve as the Secretary of the Army's eyes and ears for the Army, the Army Reserve and for Army National Guard matters in their respective regions.

Normally, CASAs serve a two-year term but their service can be extended to 10 years or more as a senior CASA. They are civilians business and community leaders who are accustomed to speaking out on issues and influencing their peers. They are selected for the position by a review panel and the Secretary of the Army, who reviews their biography, their letter of intent and their letters of recommendation.

The Army formally recognized the program in 1922. Interaction with the Army was broad; with specific duties left to each aide's own discretion. Then, as now, aides serve without pay or compensation but are considered to be a three-star equivalent. Currently, there are more than 300 CASAs

among the 50 states.

Maj. Gen. Jim Rainey, commander, 3rd Infantry Division, expressed his gratitude to the group for their support to Soldiers, especially the support of Dr. Bill Cathcart, one of four CASAs who represent Georgia and lives in Savannah.

Rainey spent about an hour sharing his strategic view on national issues that are critical to the U.S. He said that three major Army initiatives include readiness, leadership development of young Soldiers and proficiency in fundamentals competencies. He answered several questions from CASA members who asked how they can help

promote the quality of life for Soldiers and their Families.

After lunch, the group received a desktop brief from Lt. Col. Todd Brown, commander, 1st Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, before walking on the Hunter tarmac by Saber Hall to see military aircraft. Next, the group visited the 3rd Battalion 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment hanger to learn about the unit's mission and get an up-close view of a MH-47 Chinook and a MH-60 Black Hawk, and a demonstration of how the special operations aviators use night vision goggles.

Major Rob Harless, 3rd Battalion, 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment executive officer, said he appreciates the advocacy that the CASAs provide on behalf of the Army.

"We are honored to showcase our assets," he said. "It is probably nice for them to actually see some of our assets and give context to what they do as CASAs."

The tour also included a visit to a tenant unit on Hunter, the U.S. Coast Guard, Air Station Savannah, to see an MH-65D Dolphin helicopters used for rescues, and the new Savannah VA Clinic, positioned just outside Rio Gate.

"This has been very informative," said Bill Harpel, an East Tennessee CASA. "I had no idea of the diversity here. It's also been nice to talk with individuals to get their perspectives. When we get the opportunity to see our duties through a different colored lens, it gives us a greater grasp of what we do."

Get TA up to 60 days prior to class

GoArmyEd allows Soldiers to request tuition assistance up to 60 calendar days prior to the class start date. In accordance with DOD policy, all TAs must be requested and approved prior to the start date of a class. To allow time for processing, review and approval, Soldiers should submit TA requests to **GoArmyEd** not later than five business days prior to the class start date for which TA is being requested. This policy applies to all schools in **GoArmyEd**.

What is the Yellow Ribbon Program?

The Yellow Ribbon Program allows colleges, universities and other degree granting schools to voluntarily work with VA to fund tuition and fee expenses that exceed the tuition and fee amounts payable under the Post-9/11 GI Bill. The institution can contribute a specified dollar amount of those expenses, and VA will match the contribution, not to exceed 50 percent of the difference. To receive Yellow Ribbon Program benefits you must be enrolled in an approved program offered by an institution of higher learning that participates in the Yellow Ribbon Program. You may qualify for the Yellow Ribbon Program benefit if you served an aggregate period of active duty after Sept. 10, 2011 of at least 36 months and were honorably discharged; were discharged from active duty for a service-connected disability and you served 30 continuous days after Sept. 10, 2001; or a dependent who received benefits transferred from an eligible Service Member. You can search for Yellow Ribbon Program schools on the Department of Veterans Affairs GI Bill website at www.gibill.va.gov.



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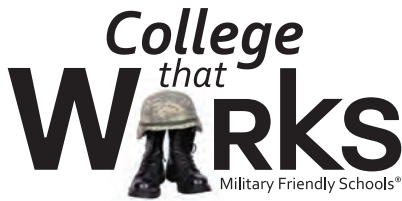

In addition to these basic qualifications, Servicemembers will also be required to meet the OPM hiring guidelines for a GS-7 position. These include, but are not limited to one year of specialized experience equivalent to at least the next lower grade (GS-5), or one full year of graduate-level education, or a bachelor's degree with Superior Academic Achievement (SAA). SAA is based on a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale. It is also possible to qualify with a combination of specialized experience and graduate education.

If you are not sure as to whether you meet the OPM

hiring criterion for the position, then plan to attend the VA information session in Feb. 7 and 8. You will need a copy of your resume in the federal resume format at this session. You may also need access to an electronic version of your resume in this format. The SFL-TAP classroom, Suite 215C, building 621 is where the session will be held has computer workstations available for attendees.

The VA announced intentions in FY2016 to hire 500 graduates of the training program in FY2017. The 24 completers from WARTAC, Fiscal Year 2016, at Fort

Stewart were all offered positions as VSR's with the VBA resulting in a 100 percent placement rate.

SJA talks immigration, naturalization

Q: Judge, I have some questions about my spouse's immigration status. Where can I get some legal advice?

A: There are two resources available to you. First, you may schedule an appointment with a Legal Assistance Attorney at the Fort Stewart Legal Assistance Office by calling 912-767-8809 or 767-8819 or by visiting the Office in person at 1791 Gulick Avenue, Building 709 (next to Popeyes). Second, the Legal Assistance Office will have its annual Legal Assistance Immigration Fair starting today and through Friday.

Q: What is this Fair?

A: Immigration Attorneys who specialize in Immigration and Naturalization Law graciously come to Fort Stewart every year and participate in the Fair. They meet with Soldiers, retirees and Family Members who have questions about immigration and naturalization or who may need assistance with immigration and naturalization cases or applications. The fair will be open 1 to 4 p.m. today and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Friday.

Q: Why does Legal Assistance bring in attorneys who are immigration experts?

A: The Federal Courts have said that the three most difficult areas of American law are Immigration, Patent and Tax law. Having these attorneys with specific immigration expertise to help us hold the Fair is of great benefit.

Q: Where will the Fair be held?

A: It will be held in the Fort Stewart Legal Assistance Office located at 1791 Gulick Avenue, building 709 (next to Popeyes).

Q: Do I need an appointment?

A: It is always better to schedule an appointment by calling 912-767-8809 or

767-8819 or by visiting the office. Depending on availability, there will be a limited number of walk-in appointments.

Q: What does this cost?

A: Nothing. Like all services offered by the Legal Assistance Office there is no charge for legal assistance with immigration and naturalization issues.

Q: I want to marry my fiancée who is in Germany, can I get help at the Fair?

A: Yes. Attorneys will advise you about your options, the process, forms you must complete and file and approximate processing times. Other questions, including how to obtain United States Citizenship, may also be addressed.

Q: If my spouse came into the country as a child without a visa will I be able to discuss this with the attorneys at the Fair?

A: Yes. There are certain things that may be done in this case to gain legal status for your spouse.

Q: Will the authorities or my chain of command be told about my spouse's situation?

A: No. All communications with the attorneys are protected by the attorney-client privilege which means nothing you say can be repeated to a third party such as a member of the chain of command without your expressed prior consent.

Scald injuries more common among children, elderly.

Scalding injuries are caused when someone is burnt by a hot liquid such as water. You may think this is easy to prevent, but each year many children and the elderly are scalded, along with others” but with children and the elderly, its more common because their skin is thinner and they might not know how hot something is before it's too late. Whatever the cause, there are simple steps that can be taken to prevent accidents from happening. Scald injuries are painful and need longtime treatment even with treatment they can result in scarring. Elimination of the hazard is the most preferred action versus treatment of the injuries. Below are a few steps you can take in your home to prevent a loved one being scalded and possibly scarred for life.

- When bathing a small child or the elderly, always check the water first and never leave them unsuper-

vised.

- Your hot water heater is set so water is no more than 120 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Avoid flushing the toilet when someone is showering which could cause a gush of hot water in the shower.
- When cooking never leave the kitchen unattended especially when children are present.
- When using the stove top, use the back burners and always turn pot handles away from the front of the stove. This way they cannot be grabbed or bumped.
- When giving a hot drink such as coffee or hot chocolate, test it yourself first. This also works with soups, stews and gravy.
- Place hot dishes in the center of the table, more out of the reach of little hands.

This is by no means a full list of safety tips but perhaps it will make you think of others for use in your home. More can always be found on the Internet.

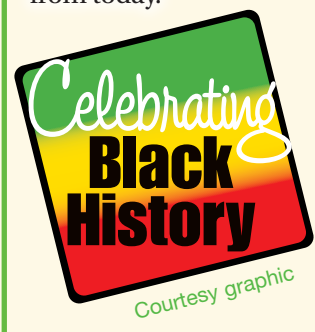

Let's get REAL: Operation READY

For more than 15 years, Operation READY (Resources for Educating about Deployment and You) has been the standard across the Army for Family Readiness Group trainings. The trainings certified FRG volunteers; however it needed to be revamped due to the changing face of FRGs.

Fort Stewart's ACS sent their Mobilization, Deployment Program Manager, Tonya Imus to by part of IMCOM Headquarters' special working group, who was charged with revamping and energizing the training curriculum, Jan. 23, in San Antonio, Texas.

Other Installations also sent representatives. The action officers bonded, rolled up their sleeves and got to work. Imus was in charge of the working group that created the new Readiness Essentials for Army Leaders FRG Smartbook.

"During our working groups, we reviewed over 5000 documents from Installations, world-wide, and selected the best examples to be placed in the Smartbook; so commanders and FRG volunteers would have easy access to the best products in order to build their FRG Systems.

It was a collaborative effort between active duty, National Guard and Army Reserve Family Programs, Imus said.

The new training, called Family Readiness Group: REAL, will be the new standard in training. The training, is designed for specific positions with the FRG with six different modules.

Module 1: Foundations, was designed to be a foundational course

providing basic information for FRG volunteers and Command Teams.

Module 2: Command Team, is focused on Company Commander and First Sergeant Teams; but informative for Battalion and Brigade Commanders.

Module 3: Family Readiness Liaison, is designed to prepare Soldiers appointed as FRLs in units.

Module 4: FRG Leader, is designed for FRG Volunteers to identify the FRGs role in the Family Readiness Team and how to execute the FRG Leader role.

Module 5: Key Contact, is designed for FRG Volunteers who want to execute the Key Contact mission and understand the regulatory guidance to govern FRG Operations.

Module 6: Informal Funds Custodian, is designed for FRG Volunteers who want to perform the role of the unit FRG Informal Funds Custodian and the responsibilities that come with this role. This module will also place great emphasis on the authorized use of the FRG Informal Funds.

These modules are designed with adult learning in mind and will have a series of facilitated discussions, small group activates and exercises.

"It was lot of hard work and the team provided great effort in revamping this training that was overdue and much needed," Imus said regarding the project. "The collaborative effort was geared to all Army components receiving the same curriculum. We are currently under a six month pilot program and participant feedback will be vital in finalizing the product".

Every minute in the United States, someone's wife, mother, daughter, or sister dies from heart disease, stroke or other form of cardiovascular disease. According to the National Institute of Health, one in every four women will die from heart disease. Heart disease is the number one killer of women age 25 and older, and stroke is the number four killer of women, and accounts for 61 percent of all stroke deaths annually.

The American Heart Association Go Red for Women movement is about turning around these statistics. It's a nationwide movement focused on providing resources, information and hope.

On tomorrow, the American Heart Association's 15th Annual National Wear Red Day asks men and women to show their support for the fight against heart disease and stroke in women by wearing red. It's an easy, powerful way to speak up and show support for Go Red for Women, the American Heart Association's solution to save women's lives from their No. 1 health threat, cardiovascular disease.

The good news is that you can control many coronary heart disease risk factors. CHD risk factors are conditions or habits that raise your risk for CHD and heart attack. These risk factors also can increase the chance that existing CHD will worsen.

Know the symptoms:

- Unexplained or unusual fatigue
- Light-headedness or sudden dizziness
- Nausea
- Shortness of breath with or without chest pain
- Breaking out in a cold sweat
- Pain in the chest, upper back, shoulders, neck or jaw (often times a late sign or unnoticed in women)

Top Interventions:

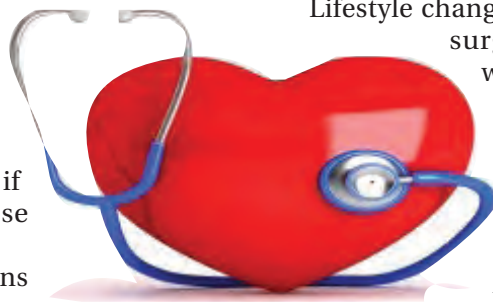
- Immediately Call 911 if you experience any of these symptoms
- Have yearly health screens for blood pressure and cholesterol checks

terol checks

- Increase fruit and vegetable intake and decrease fried, fatty meats and empty calories from simple sugars
- Exercise for 30-60 minutes every day
- Quit smoking: just in one year after quitting you have cut your risk for CVD by 50 percent.
- Know your numbers: Keep your body mass index less than 25, waist circumference less than 35 inches for women and less than 40 inches for men, cholesterol less than 200mg/dl, LDL less than 130mg/dl, HDL greater than 50mg/dl, Triglycerides less than 150mg/dl, Blood Pressure less than 120/80, Blood Sugar 60 – 110 mg/dl.

Lifestyle changes, medicines, and medical or surgical procedures can help women lower their risk for CHD. Thus, early and ongoing CHD prevention is important.

Winn Army Community Hospital urges women to take charge of their cardiovascular health, make it a top priority and live a stronger, longer life.

Winn ACH positions for growth, patient care

In the ever-changing landscape of healthcare, many hospitals are undergoing modifications to position themselves for the future. These modifications are no different here at Winn Army Community Hospital, which has just undergone structural and organizational changes to improve the patient and staff experience while also preparing for growth of the facility.

For years, Winn has staffed and operated two separate inpatient units to take care of Fort Stewart Soldiers, Family Members, and Soldiers for Life. However, in mid-January, the Progressive Care Unit

and the Family Care Unit merged into one unified ward, in a move which aims to improve staffing efficiency and to boost morale, while also improving patient satisfaction. By joining the inpatient medical staff into one cohesive team, Winn leadership is showing a commitment to providing the best care to its valued Soldiers and their beneficiaries. "This is an exciting time for the Winn staff," said Intermediate Care Ward Clinical Nurse officer-in-charge, Maj. Kimberly Sugg. "The merge has brought us closer together as a team, and that can only be a positive for our patients."

The new unit, known as the ICW, has the same capabilities for patient care as the two previous units and offers an envi-

ronment where all patient needs can be met. The patient rooms on the ICW offer more privacy and a private bathroom, which allows patients the opportunity to get well in a more comfortable environment.

In addition to improvement of the patient and staff experience, the merge aligns Winn with a plan for future growth. Col. Christopher Warner, U.S. Army Medical Department Activity Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield hospital commander, has made it a priority to increase the number and complexity of patients who are seen at Winn. His goal is to offer as many services as possible to the beneficiaries.

"This postures the hospital to not only

increase our complexity but also increase our bed capacity as needed to support our community," Warner said. "Increasing the number and type of services at Winn will subsequently prevent many lengthy journeys to other local healthcare facilities or hospitals for their healthcare."

This merge is the first step in a phased plan, which will update and expand Winn's inpatient capabilities. There are plans in place to renovate the ICW to more than double the amount of patients who can be admitted. With the merge completed, Winn will now turn its focus toward continuing to position itself to better take care of Fort Stewart's Soldiers, Family Members, and Soldiers for Life.
