3RD ID supports senior leader huddle

FORT BLISS, Texas -- An Army command post is the nucleus of a military operation. It must function seamlessly and commanders must know what's hap-

In today's evolving combat environment, command posts must evolve too. Leaders from across the Army met at Fort Bliss, Texas, Jan. 18, 2017, to discuss how today's Army will build the command post of the future.

"Lessons from ongoing conflicts around the world tell us it's

imperative that we increase the mobility and streamline the footprint of our command posts," said Gen. Robert "Abe" Abrams, commanding general, U.S. Forces Command. "We have to make our command posts more effective, mobile and survivable. Events like this command post huddle at Fort Bliss keep the Army ready to fight and win our nation's wars in a dynamic envi-

ronment." Leaders used examples of training exercises to show what was working and where capabilities need to be improved. Part of the huddle focused on solu-

tions able to be standardized

across the Army, creating commonalities in command posts.

They talked size, making scalable and redundant command posts to improve survivability from a brigade-sized element up to a corps. They discussed network capabilities and worked to define terms applicable across

"We have to continually adjust our thinking and our approach to combat. The rise of near-peer threats, coupled with an increasingly expeditionary mindset, dictate our need for command posts that are capable, yet more mobile and survivable at every echelon," said Lt. Gen. Sean MacFarland, commanding general, III Corps.

Full-scale examples of pareddown tactical operations centers were set up behind the Fort Bliss Mission Training Center and units from 2nd Brigade, 1st Armored Division, III Corps, 3rd Infantry Division, and 1st Armored Division headquarters to show leaders different examples of command post setups.

"We need two command posts. We need to be able to shut one down and move it while the other is still in the fight," said Maj. Gen. Pat White, 1st Armored Division and Fort Bliss commanding gen-

Army leaders met at Fort Bliss, Texas, Jan. 18 for a command post huddle. Commanders discussed how to make command posts smaller, more mobile and survivable.

HUDDLE

Some of the key discussions centered on how to make tactical operations centers more mobile, able to move rapidly from one location to the next, to what networking capabilities work best for these smaller footprints without losing essential functions.

"(Command post redesign) gives us a redundant capability for our mission command information systems so we can stay in the fight," said Maj. Gen. James "Jim" Rainey, commanding general, 3rd Infantry Division.

Army senior leaders who participated in the command post huddle included Gen. Robert

"Abe" Abrams, commanding general, U.S. Forces Command (via teleconference), Lt. Gen. Patrick Donahue II, deputy commanding general, U.S. Forces Command, Lt. Gen. Joseph Anderson, deputy chief of staff, U.S. Army, Lt. Gen. Sean MacFarland, commanding general, III Corps, Lt. Gen. Stephen M. Twitty, commanding general, First Army, Lt. Gen. Stephen Lanza, commanding general, I Corps, and Lt. Gen. Timothy Kadavy, director, Army National Guard. Division commanders and command team members from 1st Armored Division, 3rd Infantry Division, 4th Infantry Division, 10th Mountain Division, 82nd Airborne Division, 1st Cavalry Division, U.S. Army Reserve Command, U.S. Army Alaska, 7th Infantry Division, 25th Infantry Division and 1st Infantry Division provided input.

Leaders spoke about broad issues affecting units on the battlefield and also talked detailed equipment requirements and feasibilities. Discussion and ideas from this command post huddle will serve to address options and establish requirements as the Army develops the next generation of command posts.

"What do taxes buy us?" Squires asked attendees. "It is an investment that helps fund the building of hospitals and roads - things we normally wouldn't pay for ourselves. Services and programs that collectively improve the quality of life for all of us."

Squires said thanks to the installation's legal assistance office and the Marne Tax Center, tax assistance was available to Soldiers, retirees, and their

Capt. Elizabeth Strickland, Chief of Legal Assistance at Fort Stewart said last year the tax center saved the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield Community approximately \$2 million in tax preparation fees associated with filing taxes, helping return \$8 million in refunds.

The Marne Tax Center Officer in Charge, Capt. Justin Ervin said the tax center has twenty-one Soldiers acting as borrowed military manpower from the various tenant units on Fort Stewart, as well as another eight for Hunter Army Airfield to help provide service to community members at both locations. But Ervin also noted that two additional civilian paralegals were returning to help provide quality control – Bruce Anglin at Fort Stewart and Dorothy Andrews at Hunter.

Strickland notes the Soldiers were trained through the Volunteer Tax Assistance Program, VITA. This program trains tax preparers on the new tax software – Tax Slayer; Soldiers also received additional operational training to help facilitate service to the customer. But Anglin notes the new software provides a lot more detail and requires a little more time to fill out. Community members can help reduce wait times by bringing the proper paperwork, and maybe a little patience too.





The Soldier behind the art

He's a Soldier, a Marine, and an artist. And when he was injured during training, he found a way to channel all those passions together.

Assigned to Fort Stewart's Warrior Transition Battalion while recovering from his injuries, Spc. Axel Collazo found a way to help others and transition to civilian life. He wasn't always in the military though; starting life on a Caribbean island.

Collazo grew up in rural Puerto Rico. His hobbies were working on cars, jujitsu, and art. But he wanted to get out; to challenge himself – so he considered the Army, Marines, or maybe the National Guard. He eventually served all three – as an infantryman and as an artist.

"I wanted to join the Special Forces initially, but I thought the Marines would be good too," Collazo said. So, signing up in July 2000, he was stationed in Camp Lejeune and was part of the first Operation Iraqi Freedom. He deployed to numerous places around the world such as Africa, Afghanistan, Japan and Iraq. After he completed his tour, he made his home in Florida; where he joined the Florida National Guard, serving with Co. A, 2nd Battalion, 124th Inf. Regiment.

Unfortunately, he injured his knees during training at Camp Blanding, Florida. The injury changed his life – limiting his physical activities – but allowing him to dedicate more of his time to art.

He worked toward perfecting those artistic skills for

more than six years. Earning an Associate's Degree in Visual Communications and Graphic Design; working with Adobe programs such as Photoshop, Light room, Illustrator, After Effects and Premier.

Later, when he was assigned to the Fort Stewart

Warrior Transition Battalion, he discovered they had a program that allowed him to continue to serve while he recovered.

"The WTB allows Soldiers an opportunity to build


new skill sets, and improve others," Collazo said. "So, the WTB helped me intern with the 3rd Infantry Division Public Affairs at Fort Stewart."

Cobra Battery supports 1-75th Combined Live Fire Exercise

Changing your state of Residency

Q: Judge, I want to switch my state of residence ... maybe to one of those places without state income tax, like Texas or Florida. Can I just switch state residency whenever I want?

A: Sorry, but the answer is "no." Unfortunately, you can't just select a state at random, but there is a process to legally change your state of residence.

Q: Great! What do I have to do?

A: First, physically travel to that state. In order to change your state of residence, or domicile, you will need to abandon your old domicile and reside in the new state with the intent to make it your permanent home. You cannot arbitrarily pick a state in which you have never lived, regardless of how much you would like to move there at some point in the future.

Q: Well, I'm stationed here in Georgia, does that mean this is automatically my new domicile?

A: No, Soldiers are presumed not to change their domicile when they are physically residing in a state subject to PCS orders. On the other hand, if you want to establish domicile in the state that you are stationed in, you can do so. You will need to demonstrate your intent to abandon your old domicile by establishing some ties to the new state. Things like getting a driver's license, registering your vehicle, registering to vote, buying or leasing property, getting married, and establishing civic and social connections in the new state all evidence an intent to permanently reside there. No one factor, though, is determinative, so the more ties that you establish, the better.

Q: OK, so how do I determine my current domicile? Is it the same thing as my Home of Record? **A:** Not necessarily. You can find your currently declared state of residence by looking on your End of Month Leave and Earnings Statement. Your domicile, as mentioned above, can be changed by abandoning your old state and establishing ties and the intent to permanently reside in a new state. Your Home of Record, on the other hand, is established by the address that you were living at when you joined the military, and is used to compute travel allowances when you separate from the Army. Enlisted Soldiers can change their HOR to their new state when they reenlist. Officers cannot change their HOR, except to correct an error or after a break in service.

Scales of Justice

While your domicile and HOR might be the same state, they might be different as well. Let's say that you joined the Army from Kansas, thereby establishing Kansas as your HOR. You then move to Virginia pursuant to PCS orders, but you don't establish any ties in VA or renounce any ties to KS; your domicile is still Kansas. You can only have one domicile at a time, and you don't lose that domicile until you establish another one. If instead, you register to vote in VA, register your car, get a VA driver's license, purchase a home in VA, etc., you have likely established sufficient ties to VA to claim it as your new domicile.

Q: OK Judge, I've abandoned my old domicile and have established the necessary ties to my new state. What now?

A: You should submit a State of Legal Residence Certificate (DD Form 2058) to ensure that the correct amount of state income taxes (if any) are withheld from your military pay. Before submitting the DD Form 2058, you might want to consult a legal assistance attorney and discuss the steps that you've taken to change your domicile, just to be certain you've done it correctly.

As part of the 3rd Infantry Division's Marne Pride Anti-Driving Under the Influence Campaign which began Sept. 1, 2011, the Frontline is keeping up with how Marne Soldiers at Fort **Stewart-Hunter Army** Airfield are doing in the campaign by publishing this chart showing how units are faring and how much more attention leaders should give on the subject of DUIs. Following is a reminder of that pledge:

I will drive safely. I will operate the vehicle safely and follow all laws and safety rules. I will wear my seat belt at all times. I will not use a cell phone to talk or text message while driving. I won't drive if I am

impaired. I will not drive after drinking or using any chemical that would alter my ability to drive safely (including certain prescription drugs).

I won't get in the car with an unsafe driver. I will not ride with someone who is impaired because of alcohol or drugs (legal or not), or with someone I know is aggressive behind the wheel. I know that I can call someone for a ride any time I feel that I need to get out of an unsafe situation.

I will respect your rules. I will drive within the boundaries we've discussed.

I will call you. If I need a ride home I can count on someone in my chain of command to either pick me up or make arrangements to have me picked up, no questions asked and without retribution.

I agree to live and abide by this pledge.

Commanders and Leaders:

I will be there for you. I/ We will ensure, that if called upon, we will either arrange for transportation or personally provide you a safe ride home, even if you have broken every rule that we have agreed to follow, we will make sure you get home safely.

I will be a good role model and lead by example. I agree to live by the same safe driving rules we have set for you.

Additionally, all new Soldiers to the Marne Division will sign a similar pledge - keep your unit off the bottle by abiding by your pledge. Don't drink and drive.

The new hours will be 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Sunday.

The new operational hours for Commercial Vehicle access control points at Gate 1 on Stewart and Montgomery Gate at Hunter will be 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday thru Friday.

When the VCC is closed at Stewart and Hunter, all Visitors, (to include Commercial Visitors who have a valid pass or Common Access Card / Military ID to access Post unescorted) will be able to access Post as normal.

Visitors / Commercial Visitors who do not have a valid pass or Common Access Card / Military ID will not be granted unescorted access to the installation. Those individuals will be required to have a valid Common Access Card / Military ID card holder or authorized government agent (IAW AR 190-13), physically meet them at Gate 1 on Stewart or Montgomery Gate, on Hunter, for access. The valid ID card holder will be the Visitor's "Sponsor" while on the installation. Once the Sponsor meets their Guest at the Gate, they will be allowed to follow their Sponsor in their vehicle to their final destination. Before allowing the Visitor to proceed all Visitors will be logged onto Post once the Sponsor arrives at the Gate. The Sponsor will be responsible and held accountable to maintain positive control of those they escort on and off the installation. Sponsors are also respon-

sible for the personal conduct of their Visitors. Only valid Sponsors 18 and older will be allow to Sponsor Guests/ Effective March 5 the Visitor Control Visitors during this time period. Up this directive could lose the privilege of sponsoring future Guests or Visitors.

> The following is detailed guidance for After Hours Visitors:

> 1. All Visitor wait in the adjacent parking lot for their sponsor. FS parking is located to the right of the Gate. Hunter parking is located in the overflow lane to the right of Montgomery Gate (as you are coming in)

> 2. When the Sponsor (18 Years old or older) / Authorized Government agent (IAW AR 190-13) arrives, the access control representative will validate the sponsor's ID card and the Visitor's ID. If the identifications are valid then the sponsor will fill out the "After Hours Log." The information for the Access Control log includes: date and time; all visitors names; the destination address; the sponsor's name and a good phone number; and the purpose of visit (i.e. Birthday party at bowling alley.)

> 3. Once everything is completed Visitors may enter. The sponsor and visitor do not have to be in the same vehicle.

> The Garrison Command Team and **Directorate of Emergency Services** would like to make this transition a smooth process for the Fort Stewart community and all who visit the installation, they are here to assist in any way possible.




Thunder Soldiers established sys-





What does SFL-TAP do?

The Soldier For Life - Transition Assistance Program provides transitioning services to Soldiers who have completed at least 180 days of continuous active duty service. SFL-TAP consists of comprehensive three-day workshops at selected IMCOM installations worldwide. Professionally-trained facilitators from state employment service offices, military Family support services, the Department of Labor and Department of Veterans Affairs present the work-

Soldiers learn about job searches, career decision-making, current occupational and labor market conditions, resume and cover letter preparation, and interviewing techniques.

Participants are also provided with an evaluation of their employability relative to the job market and receive information on the most current Veterans' benefits.

SFL-TAP remains Commander's program that encourages the idea of going early and often to receive transition services in order to be more prepared for transition.

Soldiers are encouraged to start the program 18 months prior to their transition date or 24 months prior for retirees. The earlier a Soldier starts the program, the better prepared they are for transition from active duty to the civilian sec-

IMCOM'S Transition Assistance Program helps Army save \$900 million

Unemployment Compensation for Soldiers leaving the Army during fiscal year 2016 dropped to the lowest amount recorded in 13 years.

The Army ended the year at \$172.8 million, according to the Department of Labor's unemployment compensation report. Army expenditures had peaked in 2011, at \$515 million. This is the first time expenditures dropped below \$200 million since 2003.

In the last four years the Army has saved over \$900 million in cost avoidance for unemployment compensation expenditures through programs like the IMCOM Soldier for Life Transition Assistance Program, which prepares Soldiers for finding employment in the civilian sector when they leave active service.

"The significant reduction in the Army's bill for unemployment compensation, along with the reduction in the national Veteran unemployment rate, can be attributed to the diligence of the team of teams at IMCOM's SFL-TAP centers who are selfless, passionate and dedicated to this important mission," said IMCOM Cmd. Sgt. Major Melissa Judkins.

IMCOM executes SFL-TAP by providing resources, guidance and support to 73 centers world-wide. The command markets the program to Soldiers, provides direct funding and manpower, develops standardized training and monitors the execution of the program.

When Soldiers receive unemployment compensation from a state agency, the Department of Labor bills the Army for reimbursement. Reducing the number of Soldiers receiving compensation by assisting them in their transition to the civilian sector benefits both the Army and the Federal Government in cost avoidance savings.

In 2016 alone, over 117,000 Soldiers successfully transitioned into the civilian community using SFL-TAP ser-

"We are excited to see that more Army Veterans are finding careers after they transition off of active duty service, and fewer are having to file for unemployment compensation," said retired Col. Walter Herd, Director of the Soldier for Life – Transition Assistance Program, based out of the U.S. Army Human Resources Command at Fort Knox, Kentucky.

Although experience shows veterans generally enjoy a favorable employment rate in the nation's job market, many veterans initially find it difficult to compete successfully in the civilian labor market. SFL-TAP Centers help Soldiers alleviate many employment-related difficulties and prepare them for success.

IMCOM SFL-TAP Centers have partnered with the Department of Labor, DOD, the Small Business Administration, and Veterans Affairs to provide employment and training information to Soldiers and their eligible spouses within one year of their separation or two years of their retirement from the military.

"This is a positive step for our Soldiers and our Nation as we continue to support and provide the assistance Soldiers need as they transition off of active duty service," Judkins said.

"However, as we transition 90-thousand-plus Soldiers per year for the next 3-5 years, it's imperative for the Army to maintain the momentum to keep Veteran unemployment low and continue to reduce UCX for the Army," she concluded.




Near the tarmac on the grassy area in front

"I love working with the dogs and showing off their skills. Students are usually surprised that training dogs is a job with the military."

Social Media: Think before you post

Don't look stupid on social media. OK, now that I have your attention I'll return to the previous statement in a minute.

As a middle-aged man, I am amazed at the technological breakthroughs that have happened in my lifetime. When I was a boy, touch-dial phones replaced rotary-dial phones. When I was a teenager car-phones and stationary computers came out in the marketplace.

Fax machines, laptop computers, the Internet, email, and cellphones became available when I was a young adult in my 20s. Smartphones and social media became available when I was in my 30s. Now in my 40s, it is remarkable how social media has revolutionized how we personally and professionally communicate.

But there is a problem with social media: many people look stupid because of what they post on social media. The following are three suggestions on what not to post on social media.

1. Don't use social media to smear those closest to you. Any close relationship will have difficulties,

so be wise in discussing your relational issues on social media. Your relationships can mend, but nasty comments out in cyber-space makes mending extremely difficult.

2. Be wise in posting your political and religious views. Disclaimer: your views are your views, and I'm not suggesting that you censor your views. What I am suggesting is that it matters how you state your views. Present your views in a way that others want to listen, and not in a way where others quickly dismiss you as a "donkey" - (or rather the "A" version of a donkey).

3. Be smart in what pictures you post on social media. Ask yourself, "Is this picture acceptable for the mass public's view?" Also, avoid the excessive posting of "selfies." Posting too many selfies can send the message that you're self-absorb and pride-

If you strive to incorporate the previous three suggestions then you will not look stupid on social media. I have a lot of Facebook friends due to being a chaplain. I have unsubscribed to many of these friends' posts because their posts simply make them look really bad. I encourage you: don't be one of these people!



This threat is at work and home, so make sure your computers are patched with the latest updates and be wary of anything that does not appear legitimate.

Beware unauthorized urgent care facilities

Beneficiaries should be advised to not utilize urgent care facilities that require you to pay up front, and Do Not accept any health insurance. Most facilities have this information posted, as well as having staff advise you to pay all charges out of pocket. Their office staff will also encourage you to fill out documents, or claims forms for you to file with your insurance company later for reimbursement. Beneficiaries that utilize these facilities should expect to be responsible for total charges paid out-of-pocket for all services rendered. Charges may NOT be reimbursable by TRICARE, even with a referral. A few of these facilities have been identified as Urgent Care 24/7, Ready Care, and Primary Care 24/7. Please note, there may be several others. Contact TRICARE for guidance, and a list of urgent

care facilities that you would be authorized to use within your Area. TRICARE will also inform you if there are any medical treatment facility restrictions in your area. Remember you should always follow up with your Primary Care Physician after any Urgent Care or emergency room visit. Don't download new CAC scam

Currently there is an application available for download from Google Play called CAC Scan. It can scan and decipher the bar code from the front of your Military CAC. Doing this reveals the ID card holder's ID type, social security number, EDIPI number, first name, last name, middle initial, and rank. It is currently unknown what the App does with this data and is considered to be a risk to an individual's identity. Do not download this application! The Google Play Store has had illegitimate Apps available and is still widely used to spread Android specific malware. Be vigilant on any download or program installations on all of your devices and seek only reputable developers and sources. Keep your ID card with you at all times and secured in a safe location when you are not using it.
