to become disoriented: the turtles' instinct is to follow light - like the moon - to guide them to the sea.

People should not approach, handle, disturb or harass a sea turtle as they are protected by Florida and federal law. Only those trained and with permits can handle sea turtles. Dogs are not permitted on beaches because of their tendency to dig holes.

NAS Key West is unique because it is enclaved within the Florida Kevs National Marine Sanctuary and is located within two of the four regions of the state designated as an "Area of Critical State Concern" - Key West and Monroe County.
