

# Women's Equality Day observed August 26

Aug. 26, marks the ninety-eighth anniversary of the Women's Suffrage Movement's greatest victory – women achieving full voting rights following the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution.

"Achieving this milestone required a lengthy and difficult struggle; victory took decades of agitation and protest. Beginning in the mid-19th century, several generations of woman suffrage supporters lectured, wrote, marched, lobbied and practices civil disobedience to achieve what many Americans considered a radical change of the Constitution. Few early supporters lived to see final victory in 1920," according to the National Archives.

In 1971, at the request of Representative Bella Abzug, the U.S. Congress designated Aug. 26 as "Women's Equality Day." The date was selected to celebrate the Women's Suffrage Movement's greatest victory—women achieving full voting rights following the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in 1920.

•In 1961 President John Kennedy established the President's Commission on the Status of Women to explore women's issues.

•In 1963 Congress passed the Equal Pay Act, requiring employers to pay for all employees equally for equal work, regardless of their sex.

•In 1967 President Johnson signed Public Law 90-130, giving women in the Armed Forces equal promotion and retirement benefits, while retaining combat restrictions.

•In 1968 the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission issued guidelines on sex discrimination, making it clear that the widespread practice of publishing "help wanted" advertisements that used "male" and "female" column headings violated Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

•In 1975 the Department of Defense reversed policies and provided pregnant servicewomen with the option of leaving the military or remaining on active duty.

•In 1978 the United States Coast Guard opened all assignments to women.

•In 1980 the first women graduated from the service academies as a result of Public Law 94-106 signed by President Gerald Ford.

•In 1993 the Vietnam Women's Memorial was dedicated to honor over 265,000 women who served in the Vietnam War.

•In 2013 the ban on women serving in combat roles was lifted, overturning a 1993 Pentagon decision that explicitly prohibited women from serving in combat.

Fort Stewart held its Women's Equality Day ceremony Aug. 15 at Club Stewart. See details in next week's edition of The Frontline.

# HRC prepares for Global Response Force

Soldiers with the 90th Human Resources Company, Special Troops Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade conducted an Emergency Deployment Readiness Exercise, Aug. 7 to prepare themselves for an upcoming mission with the Global Response Force.

The company will join the GRF this October and must be ready to deploy at a moment's notice to respond to emergencies at home and abroad. In the event of an real-world disaster or emergency, they would have two days or less to be ready to depart. The trainisg was the company's validation to ensure they 're preapred to execute the mission in the alloted time.

"The purpose of the EDRE level III is to prepare Soldiers on what to expect, with our main goal to deploy within 18 hours of notification," said Staff Sgt. Tierra Hopkins, 90th HRC platoon sergeant. "They must go through Soldier readiness process-

ing and the loading exercise to head to any location."

The week-long exercise consisted of various training to prepare for a deployment with a culminating event of loading the vehicles on aircrafts to fly to wherever the unit is deployed to.

On Aug. 1, the company was alerted to start the process for the EDRE. The Soldiers were called to make sure they were ready for accountability with their necessary equipment for the exercise. Leaders began planning for the training that would take place for the next seven days.

"We're making sure we have everything we need to have this run successfully, we have to plan accordingly for the mission," said 2nd Lt. Nathan Royster, 90th HRC platoon leader. "It trains the Soldiers for what is expected if we ever do get activated. Gives them the mindset of 'this can actually happen so let me take notes."

Throughout the week, the Soldiers received their immunizations, went through a dummy draw for ammunition, and trained on weighing the trucks

before they took them to Hunter Army Airfield.

On the morning of the seventh, the company convoyed to Hunter to complete their exercise. The arrival/departure airfield control group from the 254th Movement Control Team, STB, 3rd IDSB, assisted the 90th HRC Soldiers with weighing the vehicles and inspecting them to make sure they were flight ready.

"Everybody is working together as a team to succeed," Royster said.

If the company was to ever activate, they would fly out the tactical vehicles they need to complete their mission. The loading exercise allowed the company to experience the process of getting the trucks weighed, inspected and loaded onto aircraft.

"We make it realistic as if the Soldiers get alerted to what is about to happen," Hopkins said.

"All Soldiers deploy to wherever across the United States, and I think it's good for our Soldiers to have training so they can fight in combat, but they should be able to fight on the homeland as well and provide any type of HR support."

# Surgeon helps children get a grip on life

In life few know what their future will look like or what type of career life may afford them, yet somehow U.S. Army Medical Department Activity, Division Artillery Surgeon, 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, Major Brian Mims,' life was set as a young child to make a difference in the world.

Mims did not join the Army as a medic, but started his career as an armor officer, then psychological operations officer before deciding to go the medical route. Mims said he joined to "see the world," but ended up finding

"It's probably one of the most rewarding jobs I've had in the military because I feel like I can actually make a difference in somebody's life," Mims said. "People come in here every day they're hurting ... and I can make a genuine impact in people's lives."

As a self-described "crafty" person, Mims said he has always had a hobby of tinkering with electronics and woodworking throughout his life. Yet, as he watched the 3D printing gain momentum in 2013, Mims said he kept his eye on the technology side of 3D printing. He decided after a deployment to the Ukraine in 2015 to purchase his first machine.

3D Printing in its simplest terms, is the process of taking a liquid and through the use of an ultraviolet light, and turn the liquid into a solid or better known as stereolithography.

The inventor of 3D Printing, Chuck Hull, in a 2014 interview with CNN, said he stumbled upon the invention in the mid-1980s, but he was surprised at the use of 3D printing in the medical field. However, Mims saw the need to create prosthesis for children, who may go through six growth spurts during childhood.

The average price for a partial prosthetic arm for a child ranges from \$3,500-5,000, which may cause a financial burden on families.

Mims works through a non-profit foundation www.enableingthefuture. org and took his skill and compassion for others and uses his 3D printer to create partial prosthesis for children he has never met.

Since 2014, Mims has created approximately 50 partial prosthetic hands through the foundation.

"Somebody somewhere in the world says, 'hey would like to be considered for one of these prosthetic devices'," Mims said. "They put their case files online and what we do is we log onto the website and if we think we can help them out we can volunteer to help them. If the recipient like us we kind of get matched together and they provide us with sizing photos. And then based upon those sizing photos then we start trying to craft."

Mims said he has created various partial prosthesis for children and superhero themes are most popular. The process is approximately a week long, between printing and assembly and costs Mims between \$25-50. As a part of the foundation the recipient is never charged.

Sarah, Mims spouse, supports his hobby.

"The first one was a little rough I remember," she said, "and it's just nice to see the little videos and pictures of the kids because not only do they get a hand, they get one that's cool. You know they get like Spiderman, and Captain America and sparkles and stuff, which medical companies don't make hot pink sparkly hands for little girls ... It's just kind of interesting to see him excited about something."

Mims smiled as he recalled the reaction of one his recipient's reactions to receiving their prosthesis.

"I had one little boy I worked with in Texas," Mims said. "I actually felt bad because his father emailed me and told me that kids at his school were making fun of him. We're calling him a monster just because of his limb deformity, and so what I did was I made him a little Superman hand **prosthesis for children.** 


and sent it to him. It was red and blue and had the Superman logo on it, and just the picture I got of him smiling was just heart melting."

# 385th MP earns President's Hundred

Capt. Heather Bilicki, 385th Military Police Battalion and Deputy Operations Officer at the Directorate of Emergency Services, recently earned the President's Hundred tab during the 2018 Civilian Marksmanship Program National Matches placing 68th out of 1073 competitors.

On April 20, she was also awarded the U.S. Army Excellence in Competition Badge in Bronze for accumulating 10 of 30 points towards the Distinguished Marksman Badge.

The President's Hundred Tab is awarded to Soldiers who qualify among the top 100 scoring competitors in the President's Hundred Match held annually at Camp Perry, Ohio.

The tab was approved for wear on the Army uniform March 3, 1958, in accordance with Army Regulation 670-1 and AR 350-66 (Small Arms Competitive Marksmanship Program). Soldiers are authorized to compete in approved matches to earn EIC points towards distinguished rating.

## Drive safe on the installation

Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield serve more than 21,000 Soldiers and almost 30,000 Family Members, with nearly 3,500 civilians, and National Guard Soldiers making for a couple of small but active cities.

There are also about 18,200 retirees within a 50-mile radius of the installations. So, there are people walking or driving around just like any city. Post employees may find themselves walking from building to building for their normal duties.

During physical training hours, 6:30 –8 a.m., many roads are blocked off and utilized by pedestrians/Soldiers. Because of those reasons, and to avoid injuries, post speed limits are lower than in most cities. That said, there are monetary fines or points assessed for both moving and non-moving violations to help mitigate the threat.

This article is to help you avoid being apprehended, receiving traffic points or monetary loss that may affect your – hopefully prosperous – assignment and keep you safe.

First, there are fines for traffic citations.

Now, this may be obvious to most, but many on-post citations have fines that can be paid online or mailed to the U.S. Magistrate. Those fines are determined by Georgia Traffic Codes and aren't fines determined by the officer issuing the United States District Court Violation Notice citation.

If you believe you were issued a citation wrongfully, our great country has a system in place that allows us to go to court and bring the issue before a judge.

On Fort Stewart, they cases are heard by the U.S. Magistrate on Fort Stewart. For Hunter Army Airfield, the case goes to the U.S. Magistrate in Garden City.

The DD Form 1408 is a citation that assesses points against your driving record on base. If you get too many points in any twelve month period your base driving privileges could be revoked, varying from six months until indefinitely -- depending on the offense(s).

If your citation is for talking on a cell phone, you will lose you driving privileges for 30 days for the first offense. Don't talk on your phone while driving (O.C.G.A. § 40-6-241(c)), unless you're talking on a hand's free device.

Lately, a growing trend has been for vehicle owners to tint their front windshield.

Georgia law allows vehicles to have their windshield tinted (certain colors) on the top six inches. Anything beyond that has a mandatory court appearance with a possible misdemeanor conviction (O.C.G.A. § 40-8-73.1).

If you're convicted of a misdemeanor and you have a security clearance; you will need to talk to your security manager to see if this will affect your employment or clearance.

Another trend is the wearing headphones while driving. While many people wear them while they're walking, Georgia considers wearing them while driving an impairment of your hearing (O.C.G.A. 40-6-250).

If you've never had a headlight burn out while you're driving, count yourself fortunate. But if it happens to you, don't drive with your high-beams on. Driving with your high-beams on will get you a ticket faster than driving with one headlight because you're potentially blinding other drivers (O.C.G.A. 40-8-31).

Seatbelts are mandatory for all vehicles and occupants on the installations. Failure to wear one may lead to a citation. Traffic accidents without seatbelts, can still be fatal, even on the installation.

Help us, help you, by driving carefully on Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield.

Please note, weapons are always a safety priority on any federal installation.

Army Regulation 90-11 and IMSH-ES Regulation 190-11 (dated July 10, 2012) are very clear that carrying concealed weapons. This includes prohibiting knives that are three inches or longer. If you are licensed to hunt on the installation using https://ftstewart.isportsman.net/default.aspx, you may bring your weapons for hunting under the guidelines you have agreed to follow.

# **Safety Spotlight Velvet ants in Georgia**

Velvet ants are not really ants at all, but are a species of wasp and the female is wingless.

The thick brightly colored hair is where the Velvet ant gets its name. They are brightly colored, with variations of red and black or yellow and brown.

This attractive coloring might make young children want to pick them up. But beware the do have a painful sting.

The sting may cause a severe allergic reaction; which could require immediate medical attention. Red velvet ants often invite themselves into wasp nest, since it is a food source for them.

They are non-aggressive and would rather run than fight, but if threaten they will bite. One thing you can do is walk around your yard occasionally and look for ant hills. Treat them will some type of poison from the local store or you can go on line and look up homemade treatment which most are made using natural ingredients, which are less dangerous for young children and pets.

# **ACS Behind the Scenes spotlights New Parent Support, Christa King**

Walking into Army Community Service, building 82, there is a feeling of being surrounded by warmth and cordial reception. At no point during your time in building 82, which hosts the Family Advocacy Program, will you feel anything less than welcomed. This is not a place where you will feel like a burden.

Christa King, the New Parent Support Program lead, is the type of person who creates a pleasant atmosphere. She has been a nurse for more than 18 years; has served in the military and supported her husband during his time in the military.

King understands the stressors of active service and being a military spouse. She is someone you will want to dialogue with. She can guide you and educate you about available resources.

The NPSP is dedicated to serving both expectant parents and parents with children up to 36-months-old. Single and teenage parents are welcomed as well. Fathers are encouraged to use the program if it applies to them and utilize all the offered resources.

The NPSP is filled with trained, licensed and experienced social workers and nurses who provide in-home visits and classes that aim to provide skills to

cope with any form of stress, isolation, post-deployment reunions and the daily challenges that all parents face.

King stresses the NPSP is meant to reduce stress and create confident parents. It provides a better understanding of children's actions. It helps improve communication skills between family members. NPSP can help create an environment to ease many aspects of parenting.

King said the program is not a social work program. She said enrolled in voluntary, noting parents can opt out when they desire -- prior to their child reaching the age limit.

She said conversations, which occur in the presence of nurses, are private.

The parent can determine scheduling and who is able to accompany the nurses' during in-home visits.

It is important to note, each of the members of New Parent Support are legally required to report any observed or suspected abuse.

King states that when she sees the parent using some of the knowledge taught to them, she finds it to be extremely rewarding.

To enroll in the NPSP, call 767-2882 or visit the Family Advocacy Program in building 82 and request for a New Parent Support home advisor. Referrals can be made with your Primary Care Manager or medical provider.

# Resiliency through art programs help youth

When words fail us, maybe another way of expressing ourselves works better, such as paint or clay.

Creative Expressions, a resiliency through art program for youth and adults, has been gradually implemented throughout the U.S. Army Installation Management Command's Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation division since 2015.

Michelle Sterkowicz, USAG Vicenza Arts and Crafts Center program manager, is training Child and Youth Services staff in a youth-focused resiliency through art program modeled after a similar program for adults.

"Art gives teens and adults a way to express themselves without talking," Sterkowicz said during the IMCOM G9 CYS World Wide Youth Leadership Forum held June 25-28 in Massachusetts.

During the YLF, Sterkowicz provided materials, such as canvases, paint, collage materials, masks, colored pencils, markers, sculpting clay and more. Youth and adults were free to drop in and work on a creation of their choosing using whatever materials they preferred.

"We're trying to use art as a prevention tool, to help people by offering them a healthy outlet for expressing themselves," Sterkowicz said. "Attempted suicides, depression, and anxiety affect people of all ages, and those issues involve the whole community. By using art as a healthy outlet, it serves as a coping mechanism, helping people to relax and refocus."

The Army operates 22 art centers worldwide, serving children through Child and Youth Services and adults through Community Recreation programs, she said. One of her goals is to create a consistent program of resiliency through art to help Soldiers and community members deal with everyday stress and the unique challenges of military life.

Her work at Vicenza was honored with the U.S. Army Surgeon General's Gold Level System for Health Award in 2017, the first time the award was presented to a non-clinical organization.

"We encourage participants to

lose any expectations; there is no end product -- you create for the sake of creativity. By removing expectations, we find people are more apt to dive in," Sterkowicz said.

Having resilient youth supports strong Soldiers, healthy Families and active communities. Soldiers have fewer concerns while performing their duties when they know their children are connected to positive youth development activities.



# **Housing the Force**

Installation Management Command's annual conference for housing professionals, termed Housing the Force, will be held on Fort Stewart on Aug. 27-30, at Club Stewart.

Approximately 300 military housing professionals will meet to network and learn about industry trends and best practices in the military family housing industry.

Training will cover a variety of subjects such as manpower mapping, budget management, compliance process and reporting and several other topics.

The four-day training event includes 36 classes, brown bag sessions and team building activities.

Housing representatives from all over the globe to include Europe and Asia are set to attend. Attendees will get the opportunity to share notes on experiences unique to their field, what to do, what not to do, what works and what doesn't.

"We are bringing in a little over 300 housing professionals from around the world," Doug Delzeith, Housing Service Office Supervisor said. "They will gather together to talk about new things that are happening in the housing world. Whether it be on post housing or off post housing, the housing service office or even company housing. So we bring these professions together basically to network, and share lessons learned within this group of professionals."

The conference was held on Fort Riley for the past two years. So when Delzeith and Andrew Williams, planners for this event, were told that the 2018 conference would be hosted by Fort Stewart, they got to work. The event planning process that began over a year ago started as ideas written on a whiteboard. Those ideas will come to fruition in just a week's time.

"So it (the conference) does rotate around the entire Military spectrum so everyone has the opportunity to show off their installation," said Delzeith. "This is our opportunity."

Delzeith and Williams also took this opportunity to ensure that Georgia stays on the minds of participants by scheduling tours to the historic Savannah area during their down time.

"We want to give them the ambiance of Coastal Georgia. So we have that flavor intertwined throughout activities the entire week," said Delzeith. "They're going to work all day in class but we want to make sure that they enjoy themselves. When they leave here they'll have a little bit of a recollection of what living in Coastal Georgia is all about. And of course, really to show them Fort Stewart."

# TRICARE Open Season

Do you want to make enrollment changes to your or your family member's TRICARE plan for 2019? Your chance is around the corner during TRICARE Open Season

Open season is an annual period when you can enroll in or change your health care coverage plan for the next year. TRICARE beneficiaries will experience Open Season for the first time Nov. 12–Dec 10, 2018. TRICARE Open Season will happen each year from the Monday of the second full week in November to the Monday of the second full week in December. Enrollment choices made during this period take effect on Jan. 1.

During TRICARE Open Season, you may enroll in or change your TRICARE Prime or TRICARE Select plan. Any changes you make take effect on Jan. 1, 2019. If you remain eligible and make no changes during TRICARE Open Season, you'll stay in the same plan for 2019. You may also change your type of enrollment, for example switching from individual to family enrollment.

Outside of the TRICARE Open Season period, you may still enroll in or change enrollment within 90 days after you or a family member experience a Qualifying Life Event (OLE).

Whether during TRICARE Open Season or following a QLE, you have three ways to make an enrollment choice:

  - •By phone: Call your regional contractor
- •By mail: Mail your enrollment form to your regional contractor



# CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

## Being incredible means being a fully integrated person

"The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity." Proverbs 11:3 NIV

Seeing Incredibles 2 earlier this summer left me pondering the idea of a private identity. I noticed Mister Incredible went to great lengths to protect his family member's true identities. It reflects the sentiment of his wife from the first movie when giving her kids their masks. "Put these on. Your identity is your most valuable possession. Protect it."

I imagine the benefits and struggles of having two lives. The benefits seems enticing at first: temporary freedom from hassle and responsibilities, as well as autonomy and independence. However, the chronic struggle of identity soon emerges. Are you the hero or are you a bystander? In the end each of us can only be one person.

This struggle of a split identity is common within the military community. In the work setting, many of us are a regular G.I. Joe. We follow orders, perform tasks with great care and focus, and adhere to the Army Values. We are confident and dependable; our coworkers think they know us and often count on us with their lives. When we are off duty, the uniform goes away and we are tempted to be Joe Civilian. This persona often tempts us to demonstrate less drive and reliability. By changing identities, we may even be tempted to treat others differently or ignore regulations we previously followed without question. Having the break from professional responsibilities lures many of us into a false sense of being completely divorced from our workplace persona. Such a split can leave us with two partial identities. We see this split in Mister Incredible.

Mister Incredible was full of energy, optimism, and succeeded with adaptive yet often reckless tactics. However, Bob Parr (Mister Incredible's alter ego) was a man introduced to audiences as defeated by boredom, routines, and family responsibilities. He longed for the thrill of being Mister Incredible, believing that was his true identity. However, he spent most of his life as Bob Parr, a family man who worked as an insurance adjuster. He only felt alive during the brief moments he was the hero, while he merely existed in misery the remaining 95 percent of his life. He seemed to me a broken man.

Mister Incredible's brokenness stems from a lack of integrity. Integrity is one of the seven Army Values. Along with a definition of moral uprightness, it also means wholeness. The opposite of integrity is duplicity that is deceiving, being inconsistent, having two opposing natures, or leading a double-life.

If Bob Parr brought the same zest, determination, or concern to his family, and if he found the same gratification in his family as he did from being Mister Incredible, then he would enjoy integration and greater satisfaction across his life. In the end he can only be one man, or else he will be no man at all.

The same is true for each of us. We can only be one person. We have a choice in being a person broken by multiple personas or being a whole person. I choose to be whole and believe that will make me the hero my family and my coworkers

"At our first duty station I had no friends and knew very little about the Army lifestyle," Turnbow said. "When my husband was deployed, I had to force myself to leave the house. I find that volunteering gets me out of the house and talking and helping other people."

Looking back, she discovered there were things she could have done to help make the transition better.

"I wish I had gotten involved earlier," she said. "Aked more questions, instead of pretending to know things. I wish the sponsorship program was better and we were told what to expect. Now, I just ask around."

Turnbow now help out at Fort Stewart's Army Community Service, working on their 'Behind the Scenes' articles to highlight people, services and programs. She has become an integral part of the community and now shares some of the knowledge and experience she gained, with other community members

"Without a doubt, I would encourage them (community members) to walk into the ACS building and volunteer," she said. She encourages others to volunteer, meet people, learn about all the services offered.

"Feeling like an outcast was only in my mind," Turnbow said. "Go to your FRG (Family Readiness Group) meetings and see what it's like. It's OK to open up and not be prim and proper. Talk with people about real life."

She said resources are available to newcomers and long-time residents too.

"Besides ACS, the newcomer briefing helped and I looked on Facebook pages for events," Turnbow said

She said people could gett information from Twitter, Facebook and Instagram.

She said she would enjoy seeing progress in five or so years.

"It would be great if FRG (Family Readiness Group) meetings mentioned the programs offered on post."

Some of those resources available include the Directorate of Morale, Welfare and Recreation's Rock Solid email distribution, which provides a list of upcoming events and programs. Community members can visit their Facebook at *Fort Stewart/Hunter FMWR* and select "Join My List."

Another resource is USO Coffee Connections, on Facebook at USO Fort Stewart/HAAF. Select events. Community members are encouraged to join them for dessert, coffee, great group discussions, new friends and welcoming connections. The offer USO Speed Networking, which is also on their Facebook page. The innovative USO program provides military spouses with an opportunity to make quality connections and develop their network through speed networking-style events. Military spouses are invited to come and make new social, professional and community connections in a welcoming environment.

The Community Leaders Information Forum is another opportunity to learn more. Visit the Team Stewart Webpage at *www.stewart.army.mil*, and select community under the menu item, then select CLIF slides. It provides a monthly briefing on upcoming events on the installation and in the local area.
