Two troopers from Task Force Thunder, 3rd Cav. Regt., Sgt. Thomas Perez and 1st Lt. Nicholas Lister, were two of the first service members to shake the president's hand.

"He said, 'Merry Christmas' to me and patted me on the shoulder," said Lister, a troop executive officer. "What an incredible experience!"

The President and his entourage made their way around the dining facility to greet everyone, and posed for group pictures.

"It's not every day you get to take a picture with a U.S. president and his wife," said Ketzer. "It was a storied moment."

After speaking with service members at the dining facility, the presidential party then made their way to a hangar where even more service members waited.
