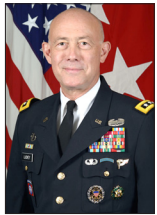

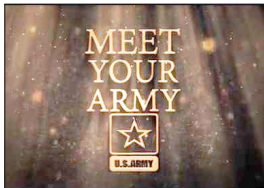

FORT BRAGG, N.C. - Nine career counselors representing units from across the U.S. Army Forces Command came to Fort Bragg, N.C., for the FORSCOM Career Counselor of the Year competition, Jan. 29-31.

The event tested each competitor's knowledge with board interviews, a written exam and an informative essay, as well as their physical fitness with an early morning Army Physical Fitness Test.

"I'm proud of what each and every one of you do every day," said Command Sgt. Maj. Michael Grinston, FORSCOM command sergeant major, as he spoke to the group at the awards ceremony at the end of the competition. "You have a hard mission. I truly believe the Army is the best place to be and that we have a lot of great things to offer. You have to understand what folks want

to do, and that's your job. It's not an easy one and I really appreciate what you do to help our Soldiers."

Sgt. 1st Class Justin Sweat, 82nd Airborne Division, who received the highest score on the essay and the board appearance, was recognized as the FORSCOM Active Component Career Counselor of the Year. Sgt. 1st Class Eric Ramos, XVIII Airborne Corps, had the highest score on the APFT and was named the FORSCOM Reserve Component Career Counselor of the Year.

Staff Sgt. Juan Sanchez, 32nd Army Air and Missile Defense Command, had the highest score on the written exam.

Sweat and Ramos will go on to represent FORSCOM at the U.S. Army Career Counselor competition later this year. They both said that is an honor to represent their units and the command at the next level.
