ARMY CAC HOLDERS NEED TO ACTIVATE PIV AUTHENTICATION BY MARCH 31

Army Common Access Card (CAC) holders have until March 31, 2019, to activate their Personal Identity Verification (PIV) Authentication certificate to ensure uninterrupted access to military networks and data. Personnel should use Internet Explorer when updating their security certificates at this <u>website</u>.

DIESEL RESTRICTIONS IN BELGIUM AND THE NETHERLANDS, BANS IN GERMANY

Many capitals in Europe will probably ban diesel between 2024 and 2030. At the moment, there is no diesel ban in Belgium and The Netherlands, but there are some restrictions. In Belgium, Brussels has instituted a low emission zone, or LEZ, since Jan. 1, 2018. In The Netherlands, the reduction of air pollution has been a priority for years. Currently, Germany is the only country worldwide with diesel bans. The city of Stuttgart, for example, has already banned diesel cars with the emission standard 4/IV and lower. [READ MORE]

In August when the annual worldwide Army Youth Leadership Forum was held in Southbridge, Massachusetts, military youth narrowed down the top three concerns that they routinely face. The CYS professionals, who work for the U.S. Army Family and Morale, Wellness and Recreation department, developed a plan to improve food options and implement nutrition and cooking classes.
