75th Anniversary of D-Day

D-Day, June 6, 1944, was the largest multi-national amphibious attack and operational military airdrop in history. This day is considered the beginning of the end of WWII in



Europe. On D-Day, more than 160,000 allied troops landed along a 50-mile stretch of heavily fortified French coastline. The attack involved more than 5,000 ships and 13,000 aircraft, and more than 9,000 allied Soldiers were killed or wounded in the initial attack. The 75th anniversary of D-Day offers an opportunity to honor the past, and secure the future by reflecting on the selfless service of those who fought on D-Day.


