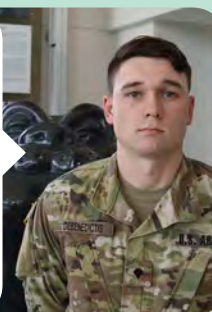

Legion wins intramural softball championship

This year's softball season ended Aug. 29, with the Division Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division, intramural softball team claiming the championship title on Fort Stewart.

Eleven teams competed in a seven-week regular season, followed by a playoff series.

The 3ID DHHB team, called Legion, charged into the championship after posting a 5-1 record during the regular season.

The championship pitted Legion against the 1st Battalion, 41st Field Artillery Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, called the Charlie Dogs.

Legion claimed the trophy after defeating the Charlie Dogs, 17-8.

"Our strategy was just hit the ball where they weren't and play solid defense. Go out and play fundamental ball," said Legion coach, Sgt. Bradley Sobek. "It's pretty cool for us to win. We had a pretty great group of individuals that included a diverse group of players from different platoons and it's great to bring them all together and see them work as a team."

The game went on for over 60 minutes, logging the final out on a contested 3rd base play.

"My favorite moment was the last out when we threw them out at 3rd. I'm a defense guy so it was pretty cool," said Staff Sgt. Vince Dillard the Legion centerfielder.

The season featured 32 games played with approximately 180 participants, all active duty Soldiers. The final day of the season would come with a gut check Soldiers are accustomed to.

"There was a seven-week regular season with two games a week. We had two and a half weeks of rain outs, so the season was affected pretty bad by the rain," said Jacob Miller, the Fort Stewart Intramural Sports Director. "The tournament ended up pretty good though, it ended up being a really clear day. We were able to hold the two semi-final games and the championship on the same night."

While Legion hoisted the championship trophy to end softball season, intramural flag football kicks off in September.

"We have volleyball right now, and flag football starts September 10, which is a seven week long season with a tournament," said Miller.

Education benefits transferability change

All actively serving members of the armed forces who have 16 or more years of service will no longer be able to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to their dependents. This new restriction was put in place per change 1 to DoDI 1341.13, Post-9/11 GI Bill, dated Friday. As a result of this change, Army National Guard Soldiers are highly encouraged to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits as soon as they become eligible (not flagged, have six or more years of service, and at least one eligible dependent in DEERS) to avoid missing out on this extremely generous family benefit. The Office of the Undersecretary of Defense has issued an extension to the deadline date on the limits of transferability of education benefits for Service members with greater than 16 years of service. Soldier for Life - Transition Assistance Program policies change in 2020

“You’ve done it before and you can do it now. See the positive possibilities. Redirect the substantial energy of your frustration and turn it into positive, effective, unstoppable determination.” -Ralph Marston

Does the quote sound familiar, or have any application to where you are today? It seems like just yesterday Veteran’s Opportunity to Work Act, 2011 and career readiness standards were the major transition efforts of our military services. In the next 90 days, the Federal Government will be implementing Section 552 of the National Defense Authorization Act of 2019. Specifically, NDAA 19 changes the sequencing of transition service delivery making the self-assessment and individualized initial counseling the first TAP events instead of pre-separation counseling. Here’s what you need to know about the major changes.

- **Self-assessment.** A database created by Office of Economic and Manpower Analysis recommends the level of counseling a Soldier needs based on 13 demographic factors. Tier 1 is for Soldiers needing the least amount of support to achieve their transition goals. Tier 3 is for Soldiers needing the most support.

- **Individualized Initial Counseling.** Private meeting between a counselor and a Soldier during which the

following tasks are completed: self-assessment review, tier assignment and introduction to the individual transition plan.

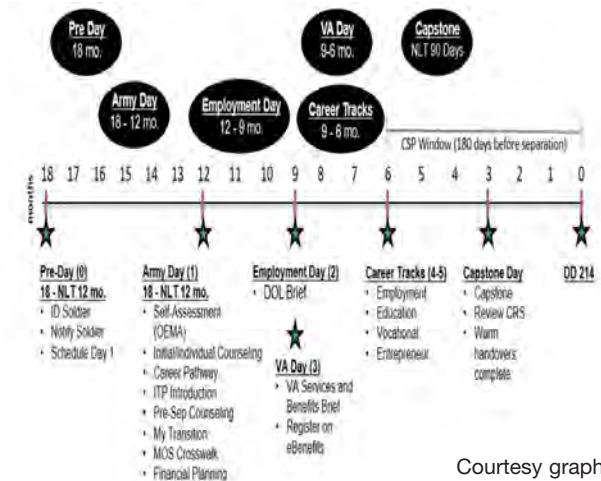
- **Pre-separation counseling.** A new automated pre-separation script will be released. All other classes follow pre-separation counseling, distributed throughout the rest of the transition phase.

The NDAA of 2019 will positively change the Soldier for Life – Transition Assistance Program beginning in October. The “one-size fits all” approach will be replaced with individualized counseling sessions tailored to meet the needs of each Soldier. Soldiers will complete a guided individual assessment and initial counseling prior to pre-separation briefing. The assessment and counseling will assist Soldiers in determining a career pathway to pursue. Some Soldiers will require less help with meeting their individual transition requirements.

The distributive model will be modified slightly to encourage class attendance at the appropriate time in the Soldier’s transition time line. Veterans Affairs and the Department of Labor will each have an entire day dedicated to their respective mandatory courses. The VA-day will cover VA benefits and services and DOL-day will provide an overview of employment and job search. Army services will include a self-assessment, initial counseling, pre-separation briefing, and Army contractor delivered courses such as MOC and financial planning. Soldiers will have the opportunity to participate in one

of four career tracks. The employment track, education track, vocational training track and entrepreneurship track are two-day training sessions designed to help Soldiers meet their post-transition goals. Stay tuned for more information on improved transition support for service members, spouses, retirees, and veterans. My team is committed to supporting and facilitating transition success for departing Service members by assessing and reducing transition challenges.

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Army personnel help evacuate, prepare for recovery ops

WASHINGTON -- As Hurricane Dorian approached the Georgia coast Sept. 4, Hunter Army Airfield began the evacuation of aircraft and civilians along with the movement of about 4,600 Soldiers in accordance with updated Joint Travel Regulations posted Sept. 1.

The rest of 3rd Infantry Division, located several miles farther inland on Fort Stewart, was ordered to shelter in place by the division commander Maj. Gen. Antonio A. Aguto Jr.

It's not enough that local officials order the evacuation of an area such as Savannah, a military commander must order the movement of Army personnel and evacuation of their Families, said Angie Rodriguez-Torres, military travel and transportation analyst for the Army's G-1 at the Pentagon.

The reason: only a military commander can authorize temporary duty and per diem, Rodriguez-Torres explained.

HOW IT WORKS

Army civilian employees ordered to evacuate are authorized full per diem for meals and expenses for up to 30 days, said Gary Buck at Army G-1. Standard mileage rates are reimbursed for private vehicles, he said.

Family members age 12 and older are eligible to receive full per diem for the first 30 days. If required to stay at a safe haven longer, they can receive up to 60 percent of the local per diem rate for up to 180 days, Rodriguez-Torres said.

Children under 12 years old can receive up to 50 percent of the local per diem rate for up to 30 days and then 30 percent up to 180 days, if necessary, she said.

Chapter 6 of the JTR covers evacuation allowances and procedures and did not change substantially with this month's update, Rodriguez-Torres said. Most changes were in the format, she explained.

"We tried to simplify it," she said.

Both military and civilians who evacuate receive orders on a Department of Defense Form 1610, said Larry Lock, chief of military compensation at G-1. Evacuation travel claims are filed manually and sent to the Defense Finance and Accounting Service Travel Office at Rome, New York, for processing and reimbursement, he said, since the Defense Travel System website does not support evacuation transactions at this time.

However, no one needs to wait around for copies of paperwork when an evacuation order is issued, Lock said. A verbal order by a commander has the power of authority and everyone needs to move out quickly, he said.

Air crews need to get helicopters to a safe haven (such as Fort Benning, Georgia, in this case.) Everyone else should get on the road immediately to avoid the storm, Lock said. Orders can be received upon return when travel vouchers are filed, he added.

FLORIDA AND NORTH

About 680 Army personnel at Patrick Air Force Base and other installations on the east coast of Florida were ordered to evacuate Saturday when Hurricane Dorian was predicted to make a direct hit there.

Since then, the hurricane has swung up along the Georgia coast headed for the Carolinas. More than 5,500 National Guard members in four states were ready to assist with recovery operations, according to Air Force Gen. Joseph Lengyel, chief of the National Guard Bureau.

The Florida National Guard had more than 4,500 Soldiers and Airmen mobilized for response efforts. Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina National Guard positioned Soldiers and Airmen ahead of the hurricane as it proceeded north, Lengyel said.

Subsequently, Carolina and Virginia National Guard members were prepared to assist with coastal evacuations, officials said.

Dorian evacuation terminated, assistance centers opened

More than 4,600 Soldiers, Army Civilians and Family members returned home to Hunter Army Airfield following the Sept. 6 termination of evacuation orders issued due to Hurricane Dorian.

Fort Stewart Soldiers and Families were ordered to shelter in place by 3rd Infantry Division commander Maj. Gen. Antonio A. Aguto Jr.

Hurricane Dorian skirted the Georgia coastline, hitting the area with tropical storm winds and storm surge. A few power outages occurred, and public works cleared roads of debris quickly.

The installation's Army Community Service, in conjunction with other installation services, established two emergency family assistance centers to help those who evacuated due to the storm. The EFACs' primary function is to help personnel file travel vouchers as well as receive support with other issues the storm may have caused.

The EFACs are located at Fort Stewart's Main Post Chapel and Hunter Army Airfield's Army Community Service Center, building 1286, for married Soldiers, and the Hunter Education Center for single Soldiers.

Personnel will file their vouchers based on unit assignment. Check home.army.mil/stewart to learn more about what time you should report to the EFACs to file your vouchers. The website also provides information about what documents to bring with you to file your travel vouchers.

The assistance centers will be open at both sites Sept. 11-14 and Sept. 16-21. The centers include representatives from legal assistance, military family life counselors, Balfour Beatty Community Homes, Army Emergency Relief, medical appointment rescheduling, and ID cards available to support Soldiers, Army Civilians and Families.

The establishment of two separate and fully staffed EFACs augmented by travel voucher processing is a first in Army history. Having the services come together at two locations to assist families is a team effort of monumental proportions said Army Community Service Mobilization, Deployment and Support Stability Operations program manager Beau Bradley.

"To our knowledge, this is the first time ACS has stood up and supported two fully functioning EFACs," Bradley said. "We want to send a positive message that regardless of what Soldiers and families are experiencing, ACS cares."

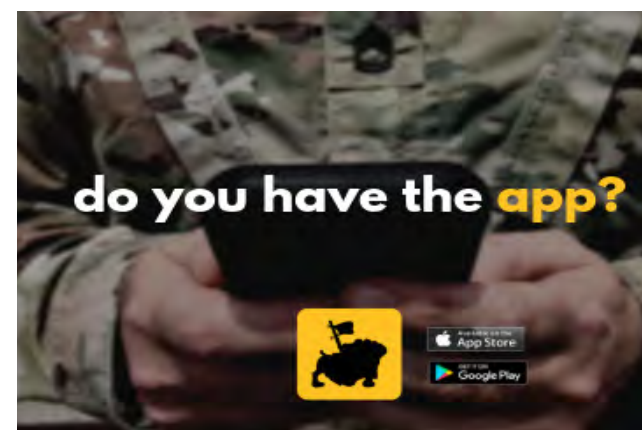

10 BEB Soldier excels in tasks, gunnery skills

Pfc. Coy Hunt from Company A, 10th Engineer Battalion, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division continues to show excellent skill and promise as a future expert during gunnery in May and August 2019 on Fort Stewart.

His unit conducted Gunnery Qualification Tables III through VI in mid-May, and then again in early August to ensure full unit qualification for the unit's upcoming rotation through the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, California in the spring. Gunnery is a crucial training event as it verified the lethality and effectiveness of a unit's M2A3 Bradley Fighting Vehicle crews.

Gunnery is scored out of 1000 points. A score of 900 points and above earns the Distinguished Qualification. Scoring above 800 points earns the Superior Qualification, and anything above 700 points is a qualified crew.

Crews can be qualified Q-1, as a first time go, or Q-2 as second time go. Additionally, a unit can earn the Lethality streamer if all of their crews qualify Q-1, as it is a training goal for Bradley crews.

Hunt, a 19 year old from Texas, joined the Army in July of 2019, and has already shown much potential for a bright and successful career. Hunt started as a Bradley driver for Staff Sgt. Jefry Mills, the Bradley commander, and Spc. Kody Keppler, his gunner in May. The Bradley crew earned the Distinguished Qualification title during gunnery in May, shooting a score of 967. Hunt was then selected to fill the role of Gunner.

"Hunt is one of about five gunners in the entire brigade that is a private first class, it is a more advanced position," said 1st Sgt. Levon Sains, the senior enlisted leader for Co. A.

"We thought he was responsible and saw a lot of potential in him" Mills said. Mills said.

As the Gunner for his Bradley crew, during the gunnery training in August, Hunt qualified with a Q1, earning 716 points. Although not as prestigious as the Distinguished Qualification, Hunt's ability to perform at that level, where he qualified first time go, during his first qualification as a gunner, shows his skills and

potential for future success.

"Hunt wants to go to the Ranger Assessment Selection Program and has a lot of potential, he's a great soldier," said Staff Sgt. Edwin Davis, Hunt's current squad leader. "Usually gunners for a Bradley have to be a specialist or higher, Hunt is one of approximately five privates first class that are gunners in the whole brigade."

Hunt has many aspirations for his future in the Army, but is looking forward to more shooting in the future, at larger training events.

"The change happened because both Mills and Keppler were leaving and they wanted to create a crew that had longevity in order to prepare and shoot through NTC, and future deployments," said Hunt "I really enjoy being the gunner on a Bradley fighting vehicle, and look forward to the opportunities to shoot more in the future."

Hunt won 10BEB's July Soldier of the Month board and continues to show great potential. The Soldiers and leaders of Co. A hope that Hunt's example of "not letting rank define what you are capable of," will inspire other soldiers in the company.

Hunt's unit is also currently preparing for brigade-level training in October when he can once again show is tactical skills and assist maneuver battalions in the field.
