First, I would like to say *thank you* for your support over the last year as we have made a substantial difference in improving the Leader to Led ratio within the Initial Entry Training Environment. Your hard work in preparing Drill Sergeant Candidates (DSCs) truly paid off and resulted in 1,745 Drill Sergeant (DS) graduates to date.

As we usher out FY19 and welcome in FY20, there will be a number of changes which will affect the Academy. Starting October 1st 2019, the DSA will no longer administer the Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT); DSCs will be required to report with a DA Form 705 dated within 6 months of their class date demonstrating that they meet Army Standards. We will administer an Initial Army Combat Fitness Test (ACFT) as well as an End of Course ACFT. Each candidate will be required to attempt all six events and complete the ACFT. The goal is for each candidate to achieve the Gray standard. Over the next 10-12 months we will utilize this data to determine the scoring standard for Drill Sergeants.

Once approved by the Infantry School and TRADOC, we are also postured to implement the new Basic Rifle Marksmanship (BRM) program and qualification standards. Currently we have working groups figuring out the X's and O's so that DSC's are prepared to execute the Enhanced Basic Combat Training Program of Instruction upon arrival to training centers.

Currently we are in the trial phase of our Drill Sergeant Academy Sexual Harassment and Assault Response Prevention online training program. This program will present DSs and DSCs with a realistic situational training experience that they may encounter in the BCT environment. It will be presented on ALMS (CAC enabled) and each DSC will be required to complete the training while attending the DSA; upon completion participants will receive a training certificate.

As I stated before, there are a number of changes being implemented at the DSA as we remain relevant and synchronized with the Enhanced Basic Combat Training Program of Instruction. One of the highest honors for a Non-Commissioned officer is a spot in Drill Sergeant Academy. Only the most qualified NCOs are chosen to instruct and support the DSA; continue to take pride in yourselves and the Army you serve. Be safe and GOD speed!
