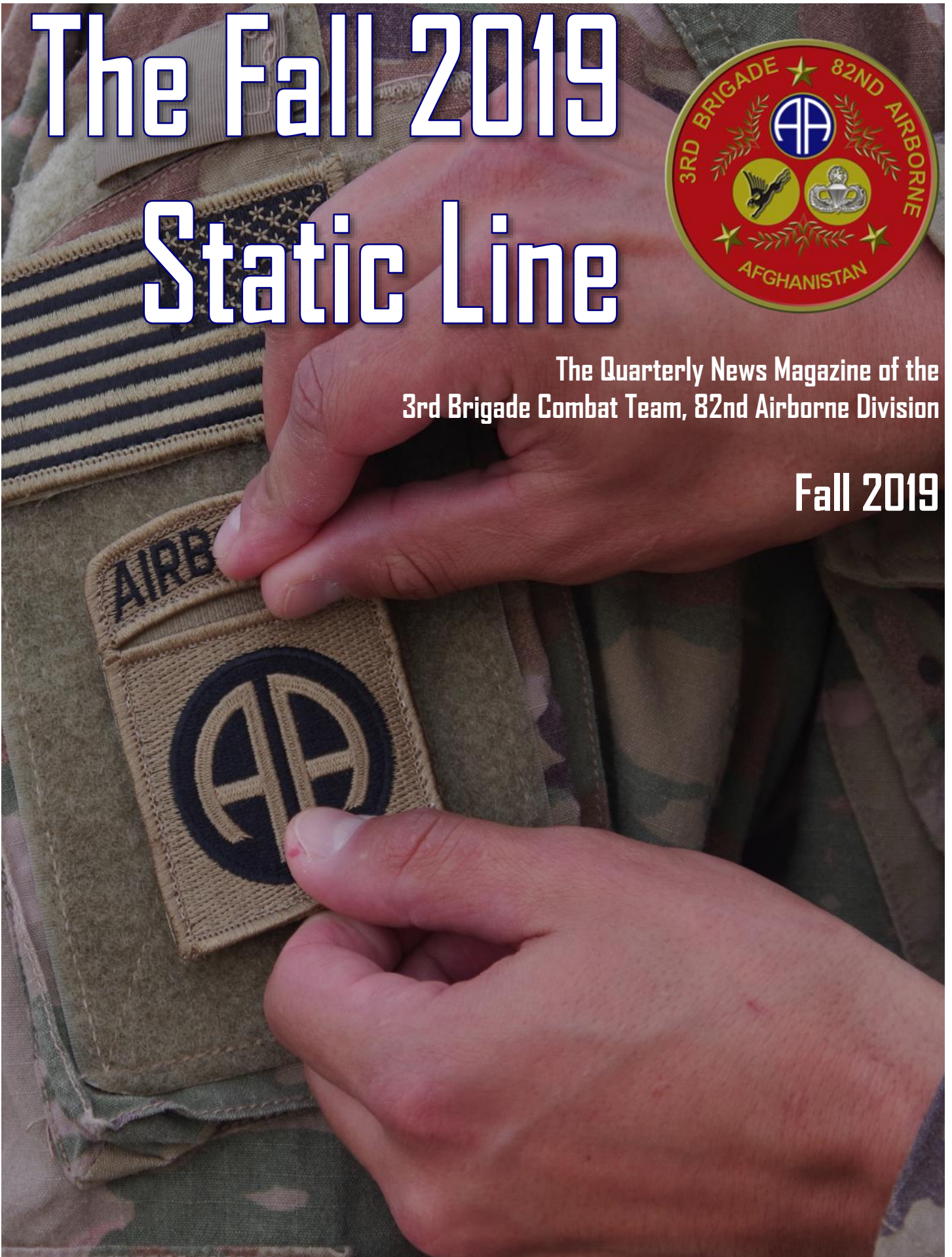

Your Panthers are scattered throughout Afghanistan, some on the bigger bases while others are at remote and austere outposts. Each Panther is in a unique situation, with differing schedules, daily duties, accommodations, and access to communications. We rely on our outstanding junior leaders to accomplish the mission and maintain our great Paratrooper traditions of discipline and excellence at each of these locations.

As many of you know, there are risks while we conduct our mission, and three of our beloved Panther Teammates paid the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our Great Nation.

Specialist Nance and Private First Class Kreischer, both assigned to B Company, 1-505 PIR, were killed in action while conducting combat operations near Kandahar, Afghanistan on 29 July 2019, while SFC Barreto, H Company, 82d BSB, in support of 2-505 PIR, was killed in action in Kabul, Afghanistan, on 5 September 2019. These were very, very tough losses for our TEAM to endure, and our hearts, thoughts, and prayers continue to be with their families and loved ones. We all remain committed to honoring their efforts and their memory by accomplishing our daily mission to the highest levels of success.

Please continue to volunteer and participate in your Paratrooper Family Readiness Group. This is a great opportunity to assist the loved ones and family members of SFC Barreto, SPC Nance, and PFC Kreischer. Additionally, building Teams among family members and keeping communications channels open within the PFRG is critical to building and maintaining resilience, and to helping each other when it counts.

CSM Teakell and I remain humbled and honored to lead the men and women of this brigade as we continue to write another chapter in the storied history of the Panthers.

conducting casualty assistance operations.

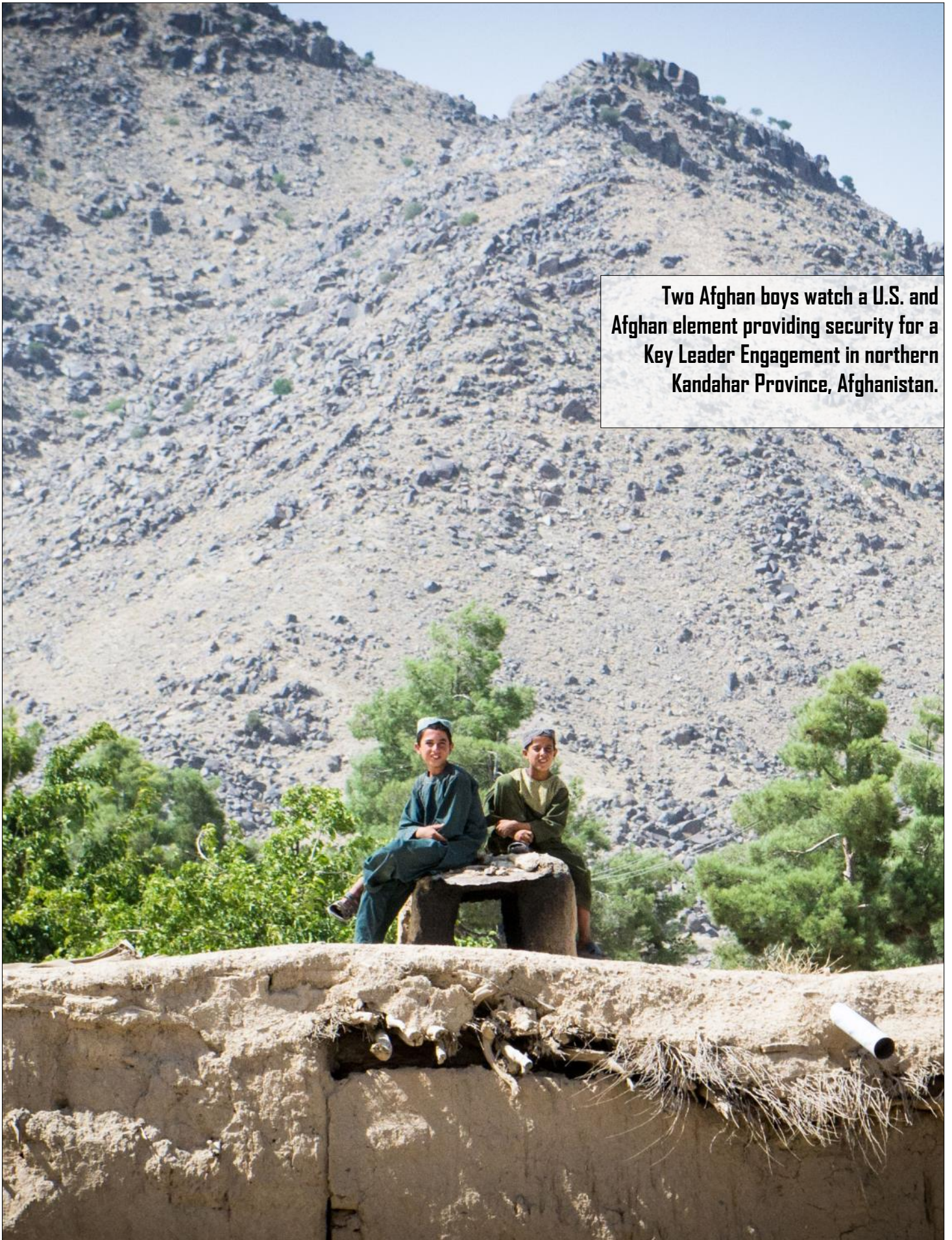
All of this, while maintaining day to day operations to include Airborne Operations and garrison support functions.

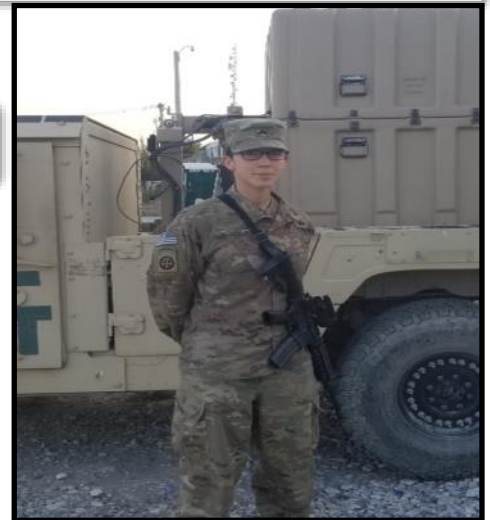
Loyalty Paratrooper to Recognize

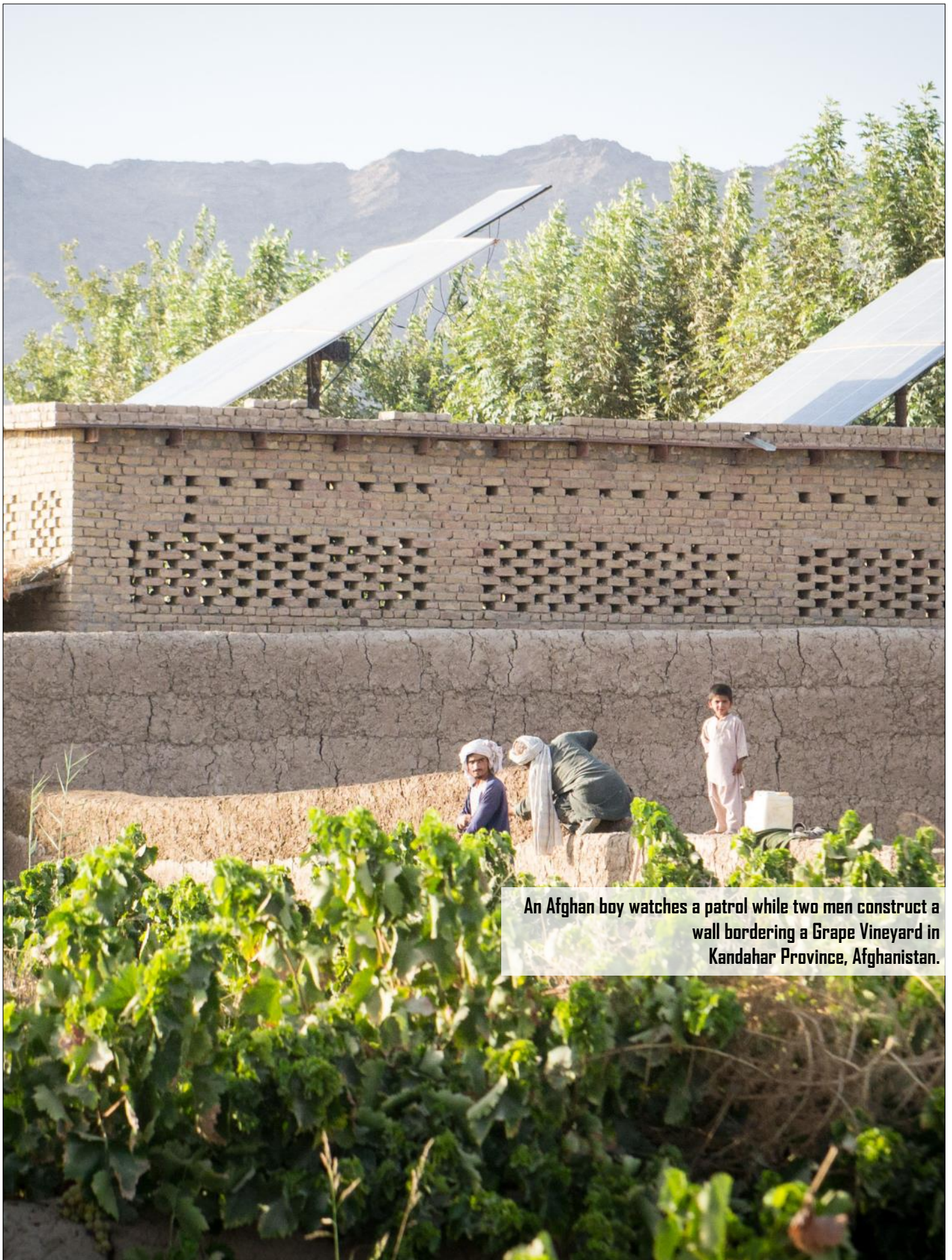
