TEAM OCEANA **WORKS TO INVOLVE ALL SAILORS, CIVILIANS IN THE** PREVENTION AND **AWARENESS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT**

This April marks the 14th annual Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAA-PM), recognized and observed across the country by civilian and military communities. The month, which spotlights the work of the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program, is an opportunity to highlight robust efforts to care for victims and innovative ways commands and Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (SARCs) are working to spread awareness across the Navy.

NAS Oceana and its SARCs have worked to provide its Sailors and Civilians with a mulsigning of the 2018 SAAPM proclamation, a moment of silence for survivors of sexual assault, a silhouette display and clothesline project, a two-mile obstacle course race called 'The intervention is vital to stopping unsafe behavior, to include any form of retaliation. Awareness Challenge' was held at Dam Neck Annex, an interactive performance known as pure praxis, for civilian employees wishing to do their part in spreading awareness they were encouraged to wear teal on Tuesdays throughout the month, and starting at the NAS Oceana Officers' Club, a Denim Day Walk was held April 25, acting as the capstone event for the

"This year we are holding our seventh annual Denim Day Walk, which is both a stand against victim blaming and a strong visual sign of support," said Shannon Moyer, NAS Oceana SARC. "Personnel and visitors drive down and pass us on the road, we walk past the places where people work, and everyone can see all the people that took time out of their day to show that they support survivors and are taking a stand against sexual assault."

Since 2012, the annual reports on sexual assault in the military have shown regular declines in the prevalence rates of sexual assault among service members. Together, we can work to further reduce, with the goal to eliminate, sexual assault from the armed forces.

"The importance of today and this month is to raise awareness on the issue of sexual assault, which is a problem that we need to eradicate from the Navy in order for all of our Sailors to live and work in a safe environment," said Lt. Edgar Fredricks, SAPR program manager, Navy Munitions Command (NMC) Atlantic. "That is why I am here today, not only to speak to Sailors, but to help promote awareness and get Sailors involved in the prevention of sexual assault."

The 2018 SAAPM theme is "Protecting Our People Protects Our Mission."

This year's theme places emphasis on the critical role everyone plays in preventing sexual assault and offers opportunities to deliver messages which relate to how we care for each other while ensuring we are ready to accomplish our mission.


> "Many people know that you can get help, but not everyone knows what that help looks like," said Moyer. "That's why, as you attend our events, you'll see many individuals wearing shirts identifying themselves as an advocate. We encourage the advocates to get out, talk to Sailors and inform everyone on what it means to be an advocate, and what assistance they can provide."

> "Protects our mission ..." In addition to the devastating impact on an individual, sexual assault can severely impact a unit's readiness to perform its mission. We can protect our mission by ensuring everyone within the DOD is committed to advancing an environment where sexist behaviors, sexual harassment, hazing, bullying and sexual assault are not tolerated, condoned or ignored.

> Lt. Fredricks said the more Sailors that participate in SAPR awareness events; the more knowledge is spread throughout the command and those willing to help when needed.

> "The more involvement and participation we see from everyone lets us know that there are that many more people able to recognize a problem when they see it," said Fredricks. "Not only are they going to take it upon themselves to do something, but also let their shipmates know the proper way to conduct themselves to eliminate issues such as sexual assault, drunk driving, and any other type of destructive behaviors."

> "This is our full-time job. We are SARCs, but that doesn't mean our passion can't be matched by service members, and you see that passion here, at events like this," said Moyer. "The most important thing that we are saying today and throughout this month is 'you are not alone'."



When physical fitness meets deployment

Sailors aboard USS Harry S. Truman (CVN 75) kicked off the first physical fitness assessment (PFA) cycle of its kind earlier this month.

Last year the Navy announced changes to its physical readiness program in NAVADMIN 141/17. In cycle 17-2, Sailors who were within the Navy age-graduated body fat standards, and scored an overall "excellent low" or better on the physical readiness test (PRT) with no single event lower than a "good low," are exempt from participating in this cycle's PRT.

"I think it's a great thing the Navy is doing by rewarding Sailors who perform well on the PRT," said Chief Electrician's Mate Marco Sifuentes, Truman's command fitness leader (CFL). "It provides Sailors with the incentive to push themselves just a little bit harder to get the scores they need to get an excellent."

All Sailors are still required to participate in the semi-annual body composition assessment (BCA), even if they are exempt from performing the PRT.

"I was close to scoring an excellent last cycle, but didn't have to get it done." quite get there," said Damage Controlman 3rd Class Michael Olsonkilcullen. "Being in the Navy for over five years now and completing more than 10 PRTs, I definitely would like to score an excellent so I can sit one out."

Also unique to this PRT will be the challenge of completing the cycle while being deployed.

"It's a tall task any time you have more than 3,000 Sailors who need to complete both the BCA and the PRT," said Machinist Mate 1st Class Marco Lott, Truman's assistant command fitness leader (ACFL). "It can be especially difficult when you are deployed and your main focus is the primary mission. Either way, between all of the command fitness leaders on board, we will come together and work with what we 31st.



NWIRP Bethpage was a 109-acre government-owned, contractor-operated facility under the jurisdiction of Naval Air Systems Command and its predecessor commands. It was op-

Corporation from 1942 until manufacturing operations ceased in 1996.

"The primary mission of NWIRP Bethpage was to research, design, build and test military aircraft in support of our national defense," Fly said. "Historic storage and/or disposal practices at NWIRP Bethpage resulted in groundwater contamination in the local area."

By February 2008, the U.S. Navy transferred most of the property to Nassau County, New York for economic redevelopment but retained a nine-acre portion to complete environmen-

tal investigation and cleanup activities under the Navy Environmental Restoration Program

The Navy ERP conducts its environmental cleanup work under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act and the Defense Environmental Restoration Program.

"The Navy is the lead agency for the CERCLA cleanup," Fly said. Why not join your FRG?

- 1. If you're a complainer. I get it, it sucks. However, complaining and focusing on the crap won't help you and will bring everyone else down around you. If that is all you are going to do, do us a favor and stay home. Or, put on your big girl panties and your best behavior and join us.

US, International partners interdict half ton of cocaine, rescue four suspects

ALAMEDA, CALIF.

Crews from the U.S. Coast Guard, Customs and Border Protection Air and Marine Operations (AMO), the U.S. Navy's coastal patrol ship USS Zephyr (PC 8) and the Colombian navy ship ARC "07 de Agosto" intercepted a low-profile go-fast vessel (LPGFV) and seized more than 1,000 pounds of cocaine in the Eastern Pacific Ocean, April 7.

During a routine counter-narcotics patrol, an AMO P-3 aircraft detected an LPGFV, which is a custom made ocean-going, high-speed motor boat built by drug traffickers to smuggle large quantities of illegal drugs. The boats are primarily made of fiberglass and they travel barely above the surface making them difficult to see or detect by radar.

The AMO P-3 crew reported the LPGFV to the Joint Interagency Task Force-South, which vectored the Zephyr to make the interdiction.

As the Zephyr changed its course to intercept the vessel, the suspected smugglers allegedly began jettisoning their cargo and jumped into the water as their boat caught on fire.

A Coast Guard law-enforcement team in an interceptor boat launched from the Zephyr interdicted the LPGFV, rescued four suspected smugglers and transferred them to the Zephyr. The Coast Guard and Zephyr crews extinguished the fire aboard the LPGFV after fighting it for approximately 90 minutes

"There was no doubt in our minds what needed to be done to salvage the evidence needed for a successful prosecution even if it meant laying Zephyr alongside a burning hull, with the intense heat and acrid smoke hindering our 90-minute firefight," said Lt. Cmdr. Grant Greenwell, the commanding officer of the Zephyr.

After the fire was extinguished, a Coast Guard law-enforcement team with members from both Maritime Safety and Security Team 91112 based in New Orleans, and the Pacific Tactical Law Enforcement Team based in San Diego, recovered approximately 1,080 pounds of suspected cocaine from the LPGFV. During the recovery, the "07 de Agosto" arrived on scene to work with the Coast Guard law enforcement team to document the case. This case marks the first drug interdiction for MSST New Orleans after becoming a pursuit-designated unit in July 2017.

"This was an incredible team effort, between our MSST, the law enforcement detachment and USS Zephyr crews to save four lives, put out the fire and recover half a ton of cocaine," said Lt. Cmdr. Mike McGrail, the commanding of-

ficer of MSST 91112. "This case truly highlights the dange and unpredictability our crews face every day interdicting narcotics smugglers on the open ocean."

The LPGFV was severely damaged by the fire and was subsequently sunk as a hazard to navigation.

"This interdiction serves as an example of how interagency collaboration can lead to the successful disruption of transnational criminal organizations," said William Durham, the director of AMO's National Air Security Operations Center-Corpus Christi. "Continuing to keep our country safe from these criminal networks requires unity of effort during all phases of interdiction."

In addition to Coast Guard crews, numerous U.S. agencies from the Departments of Homeland Security, Defense and Justice along with allied and international partner agencies, such as the Colombian navy, are involved in the effort to combat transnational criminal organizations. Counter-drug operations in the Eastern Pacific require unity of effort in all phases from detection, monitoring and interdictions, to prosecutions by the Department of Justice and partner nations.

As part of its Western Hemisphere Strategy, the Coast Guard has increased its presence in the Eastern Pacific Ocean and Caribbean Basin, which are known drug-transit zones off of Central and South America. During at-sea interdictions in

international waters, a suspect vessel is initially located and tracked by the U.S. and allied, military or law enforcement personnel. The interdictions, including the actual boardings, are conducted by Coast Guard members.

U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command and U.S. 4th Fleet support joint and combined military operations by employing maritime forces in cooperative maritime security operations to maintain access, enhance interoperability and build enduring partnerships to enhance regional security and promote peace, stability and prosperity in the Caribbean, Central and South American regions. Zephyr is homeported in Mayport, Florida.

GET READY: 10 TIPS FOR SAILORS' SUMMER MOVES

Sailors moving this summer should start preparing now, said Naval Supply Systems Command (NAVSUP) Household Goods (HHG) Director John E. Hilaman. "A good move doesn't just happen, it takes planning."

Hilaman recommends Sailors prepare for a smooth move by keeping these 10 tips in

1. START EARLY — HHG peak season runs from the beginning of May through August. Start early by going online at https:// www.navsup.navy.mil/household to review your entitlements and responsibilities. To begin your move process, go to: www.move.

2. PLAN ALTERNATE MOVE DATES, or delivery, select alternate dates in addition to your preferred dates. During busy times, it could be difficult to get the first date you request. By establishing alternate dates that work for you, inconvenient pickups and deliveries can be avoided.

3. TELL UTILITIES, LANDLORDS — Be sure you have a confirmed date for your pack out and pickup before you inform your landlords or turn off your utilities.

4. MINIMIZE CHANGES — After the pickup date has been confirmed, only request changes in an emergency. Date changes can lead to delays, additional cost to the member, or the need to convert the shipment to a Personally Procured Move (PPM).

5. BE REACHABLE — Moves go smoother when you are easy to contact. Provide your personal phone numbers, cell phone numbers and personal e-mail to the personal property offices at origin and destination. Include intransit contact information, as well.

6. TIME MOVES AHEAD OF VACATE DATE — Do not schedule a pickup for the day you are to close on the sale or purchase and last-minute changes.

7. SORT — Start sorting through household goods now and set aside items you have decided to put up for sale or donation. Service members must keep all shipments within their weight allowance or pay to ship the

8. GET READY FOR PRE-MOVE SUR-VEY — Once the service member initiates the move online, the shipment contract has been awarded and the transportation service provider (TSP aka moving company) assigned, the TSP will contact the service member to schedule and perform the premove survey. Be aware the TSP will conduct a pre-move survey no later than three business days prior to the first scheduled pack

The pre-move survey allows the TSP to establish a more realistic weight estimate, determine how many crew members to assign, determine the number of packing days needed, and determine what packing materials are needed and whether any special equipment

All dates for packing, pickup and delivery are finalized between the service member and the assigned TSP.

excess weight. Authorized weight allowance mum transit times for moves are determined by the Defense Travel Regulation. For example, on domestic shipments moving companies are given a minimum of 14-20 days to drive from the East Coast to the West Coast, depending on the weight of the shipment and the start and end locations. International transit times can be anywhere from 30-90 days, depending on the start and end locations.

Of note, you should schedule separate days for each separate move. If multiple carriers are scheduled for the same day, there can be confusion on what items go with which shipment and you could be charged for an attempted pickup or waiting time as the carrier waits for the previous carrier to depart.

'REALM OF THE POSSIBLE' REVEALED BY MULTI-MISSION UNMANNED SURFACE VEHICLE

An unmanned surface vehicle suddenly appeared on the Potomac River Test Range, and much like the ospreys that inhabit the area, it was on a mission to traverse the river — au-

Nearby, an osprey watched the unusual sight from its nest as an array of autonomous guns and missile systems were lined up on

Distinguished visitors gathered on the pier to watch — a demonstration of Textron Systems' Common Unmanned Surface Vehicle (CUSV). They listened intently as Navy and corporate leaders discussed their collaboration to weaponize a CUSV capable of multiple missions.

"The reason we collaborate is because we as a nation find ourselves in a situation where we can no longer take time to deliver capability to our warfighters," John Fiore, Naval Surface Warfare Center Dahlgren Division (NSWCDD) technical director, told government, defense contractors and military personnel at the March 28 event. "We as a warfare center and you as industry are tasked to make sure our Sailors and Marines can deploy, execute their mission and come home safely to their families and loved ones."

NSWCDD engineers explained how the

weapon technologies they developed will be evaluated for integration with Textron Systems' CUSV to create a new modular autonomous weapon system to impact the Fleet's maritime operations. There is currently no program or acquisition in place to implement these efforts, as they are in the early develop- USV with both direct and indirect fire capament stages without funding or planning to bility could expand the USV mission portfoimplement into the Fleet.

"Our first project is what we are calling a Surface and Expeditionary Warfare Mission Module which will consist of our engagement technology paired with our Battle Management System (BMS) controlling a Longbow Hellfire Missile," said Chris Nerney, NSWCDD technical program manager for Unmanned Systems. "The idea is a mission package that could slide into the CUSV modular mission bay and provide a direct and indirect fire capability."

The Navy and Textron Systems plan to prove the developmental concept that combines direct and indirect fire capability with a gunfire demonstration later this year, followed by a live missile shoot in 2019.

"We are creating a modular surface and expeditionary warfare payload with a gun and a missile weapon system to be evaluated for integration onto the common unmanned surface vehicle," said Kevin Green, NSWCDD technical lead for Ship-to-Shore Precision Engagement Integration and Prototype. "This payload could enable warfighters to counter fast attack craft and fast inshore attack craft and it could provide ship-to-shore fire support for expeditionary and special operations forces. It also gives us a baseline development effort to operate and perform further research and development."

Meanwhile, Nerney, Green and their Textron Systems collaborators are envisioning how new payloads in the CUSV mission bay could benefit warfighters in various missions from maritime interdiction and special operations to surface warfare encounters that include engaging fast attack craft and fast inshore attack craft as well as other threats.

"We're demonstrating the realm of the possible, proof of concept, and leveraging a Textron developmental craft and proven weapon systems with the Hellfire, BMS, and other capabilities," said Wayne Prender, Textron Systems vice president of Control & Surface Systems. "Now, we're bringing those technologies together and implementing them in an autonomous way that's unique and new."

For surface and expeditionary warfare missions, warfighters could use a modular, plug and play unit designed to fit the CUSV mission bay. This mission module includes sensors for targeting, a weapon station with a gun and a launcher system for missiles. It could provide capabilities to enable a myriad of missions outlined in the Unmanned Surface Vehicle Master Plan.

NSWCDD engineers are creating the payload in response to guidance outlined in the Navy's recent USV Strategic Roadmap and the Marine Corps Operating Concept. Moreover, they determined that weaponizing a lio to include surface warfare, maritime se-

Specifically, Sailors and Marines could be able to use the Battle Management System to fire missiles and precision guided munitions from the CUSV. They would use the autonomous system for detection, tracking, and direct fire engagement.

CUSV with a variety of payloads, it could be deployed from nearly any large ship and could be deployed in significant numbers from a U.S. Navy ship or a Joint High Speed Vessel type platform to perform a variety of roles," said Nerney. "We are focused on the Mine Countermeasures Unmanned Surface Vehicle today because it's the Navy's only program of record unmanned surface vehicle platform. Between now and the live fire test, NSWCDD and Textron Systems will work together to rapidly develop and integrate as proofs of concept a variety of surface and expeditionary warfare payloads for the CUSV to include operations with unmanned air and subsurface vehicles.

Navy accepts delivery of future **USS Michael Monsoor**

The Navy accepted hull, mechanical and electrical (HM&E) delivery of the future USS Michael Monsoor (DDG 1001) from shipbuilder General Dynamics Bath Iron Works (BIW),

Delivery of DDG 1001 follows extensive tests, trials and demonstrations of the ship's HM&E systems, including the boat handling, anchor and mooring systems as well as major demonstrations of the damage control, ballasting, navigation and communications systems.

"Delivery of DDG 1001 marks the culmination of years of dedication and hard work from our Navy and industry team," said Capt. Kevin Smith, DDG 1000 program manager, Program Executive Office, Ships. "We have incorporated many lessons learned from DDG 1000 and are proud of the end result. DDG 1001 will be a tremendous asset to the Navy."

The 610-foot, wave-piercing tumblehome ship design provides a wide array of advancements. The shape of the superstructure and the arrangement of its antennas significantly reduce radar cross section, making the ship less visible to enemy radars.

Like the first ship of the class, USS Zumwalt (DDG 1000), DDG 1001 employs an innovative and highly survivable integrated power system (IPS), distributing 1,000 volts of direct current across the ship. The IPS's unique architectural capabilities include the ability to allocate all 78 megawatts of installed power to propulsion, ship's service and combat system loads from the same gas turbine prime movers based on operational requirements.

DDG 1000-class ships are delivered through a two-phase approach in which combat sys-



tems are installed and activated subsequent to HM&E delivery. Following HM&E delivery, Michael Monsoor will transit to its homeport in San Diego, California, for commissioning in January 2019 and to begin combat systems activation, testing and trials.

DDG 1001 is the second ship of the Zumwalt class. The third and final ship of the class, the future USS Lyndon B. Johnson (DDG 1002), is currently in construction at BIW's shipyard along with Arleigh Burke-class destroyers Daniel Inouye (DDG 118), Carl M. Levin (DDG 120) and John Basilone (DDG 122).

USS Michael Monsoor was named for a U.S. Navy SEAL killed in Ramadi, Iraq during Operation Iraqi Freedom and posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor.



Virginia Tech becomes a top producer of Navy SEAL candidates

Of the 18 ROTC students chosen to train as U.S. Navy SEALs this year, four are from the Virginia Tech Corps of Cadets and the university's Naval ROTC. Another six Hokies are among the 53 men and women nationwide to begin the rigorous SEAL selection process.

In fact, in the past two years, no ROTC program in the country has had more students selected for SEAL training than Virginia Tech. A seventh student was accepted as a candidate for the Navy's specialized Explosive Ordinance Disposal program. Successful technicians are trained to disarm improvised explosive devices, neutralize chemical threats, and render safe nuclear weapons.

The students' success is a testament to their character and dedication to training and to a program that is growing stronger every year, said Capt. Michael Fisher, commanding officer of Virginia Tech's Naval ROTC.

SEALs (Sea, Air, and Land teams) are the Navy's most elite special operations force. Candidates come from the Navy's Officer Candidate School, the U.S. Naval Academy, the Navy's ROTC programs at 166 colleges and universities across the country, and from applicants already serving with naval units.

Between 40 and 50 ROTC applicants are selected for SEAL Officer Assessment Selection each summer. From those candidates, only half will continue to the next year's Basic SEAL. Phillips graduated from Virginia Tech and the Corps of Cadets in 1989 with a degree Underwater Demolition School — 21 weeks of basic SEAL training followed by 26 weeks in history. of qualification training.

The 11 Virginia Tech cadets selected for training are members of the Naval Special Preparatory Team, a small specialty group within the corps and the Naval ROTC. They volunteer for 12-plus hours of extra training a week, including 10-mile runs, 22-mile marches carrying a 55-pound backpack, 90-minute pool sessions, and circuits on the Corps of Cadets Obstacle Course.

This year, the Naval Special Preparatory Team has found additional support from Capt. Peter Phillips, the new deputy commandant for the corps' 1st Battalion and a retired Navy of cadets. Virginia Tech is one of two such programs at a large, public research university.



Phillips reached out to the SEAL community and connected the team's juniors and seniors with active-duty mentors. He designs their training to make it even more realistic.

"I do a lot of mentoring and coaching on the mental aspects" of the Basic Underwater Demolition School, Phillips said. "Most people quit because of the mental side. That's what we're working on."

Virginia Tech is one of the nation's six senior military colleges, a Congressional designation for a college that combines higher education with military instruction through a corps

One in four deaths in the U.S. is caused by heart disease. More than 610,000 people die of heart disease in the U.S. every year, making it the leading cause of death for both men and women, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. It's no surprise heart health is a priority for many people.

You know you need to eat a nutritious diet, exercise and avoid smoking. However, there's a lot more you need to know to protect yourself and your family. Consider these five jaw or upper stomach. surprising facts about heart disease.

1. Heart disease can be caused by a genetic disorder

You may not have heard of familial hypercholesterolemia (FH), a common, but inherited genetic disorder that causes heart disease. FH affects approximately one in 250 people worldwide, but 90 percent of people born with this genetic condition are not diagnosed. Individuals with FH have a high amount of low density lipoprotein (LDL) or "bad" cholesterol in their blood from birth. This lifelong burden of cholesterol is a reason FH leads to early and severe heart disease. The good news is that FH is manageable if detected and treated early in life. If high cholesterol and early heart disease run in your family, learn more at thefhfoundation.org.

2. Many heart attacks occur outside the hospital

About 47 percent of sudden cardiac deaths occur outside a hospital, according to the CDC. This suggests that many people with heart disease don't recognize or act on early

Heart attacks have several major warning signs and symp-

- Chest pain or discomfort.
- Upper body pain or discomfort in the arms, back, neck,
- Shortness of breath.
- Nausea, lightheadedness or cold sweats.

Know the signs. Trust yourself. If you have any of these symptoms or sense something is just not right, call 911.

3. Heart disease affects young people

Many people think heart disease occurs in old age, but it can affect people of all ages. Even if you or your family members are 30 years old or younger, you could be affected, especially if you have risk factors like high cholesterol or a family history of heart disease. Keep in mind, each child with a family member with FH has a 50 percent chance of inheriting the disorder, which is present at birth. Untreated individuals with FH have up to a 20 times increased lifetime risk of early heart disease, yet 90 percent of people with FH your heart health plan.

are undiagnosed, according to the FH Foundation.

4. Children (even infants) can have high cholesterol

Many adults are regularly screened for high cholesterol, but it's not as common for children to be screened, although the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that all children between the ages of 9 and 11 be screened for high cholesterol. These guidelines also recommend screening for FH as early as age 2 if there is a family history of high cholesterol, early heart disease or known FH. Talk to your children's doctor about screening. FH is characterized by an LDL-C level of over 190 mg/dL in adults, or over 160 mg/ dL in children. FH may also be confirmed with a genetic test, although this is not necessary for diagnosis.

5. You can maintain a healthy heart at any age

Being diagnosed with high cholesterol, heart disease or even FH is not a death sentence. Every person's health considerations are unique, but by working with your doctor, you can come up with a plan to help manage your health and maintain the strongest heart possible. This could include lifestyle changes and medications to manage the LDL cholesterol level in the blood. The key is to keep asking questions, learn about your specific health needs and stay dedicated to




