#### **CUSTOM TOOL SOCKET BRINGS INNOVATIVE FITTINGS** TO THE FAHY FRAME

#### **PORTSMOUTH**

In 2015, then-second year apprentice Adam Fahy teamed up with the Rapid Prototype Center (RPC) to create the Fahy Frame, a rotating breaker stand used to flip 540-pound breakers. This innovation provided an ergonomic solution to the workers who had to lift and work on the breakers, eliminating days off of the maintenance schedule.

The team came back together this year to tackle another innovation: a custom socket tool that is used to torque the staked bushing that holds the racking gear in place on all 2,000 style framed breakers. It would ensure the staked bushing that is installed with the framed breakers

"We noticed the bushing always arrive at a tenth their required torque. The bushing is used framed breakers we work with on a daily basis," said Fahy, who works in the Electrical Shop Norfolk Naval Shipyard, visit www.navy.mil/local/nnsy/.

(Shop 51). "The original tool we developed to alleviate this problem wasn't able to engage enough of the sidewall of the bushing and would wobble when used due to the lack of stability. We would also bang our knuckles on the breaker frame and we didn't have the confidence in the tool when torquing. It was inefficient and we needed a change."

Seeing the need for a new prototype, Fahy turned to the creative team at the RPC to help get the job done.

"We took that original idea and brainstormed some ways we could improve it," said John Tate, RPC Toolmaker. "We machined, welded, and heat treated a socket prototype with tabs that were made to have less chance of wear, and provide accuracy in its use. As this is a tool that is used regularly, we wanted to ensure the design was made to ensure there was no rework necessary and it fit the user's needs."

"The new socket engages twice the amount of depth the old tool did and with only a few thousandths of an inch clearance," said Fahy. "There is no possibility for wobbling or slipping, which lets the mechanic focus on proper torquing. It's a great addition to the tool belt and can assist in our day-to-day operations to ensure a safe and efficient workday. I'm thrilled for the assistance the RPC has provided me and my team yet again and I'm always looking for new ideas we could work on to help improve the shipyard."

with great meaning and history for the Navy — the live oak

With the Naval Act of 1794 on March 27, 1794, the United States Congress authorized the original six frigates of the United States Navy. These ships were built on the recommendation of designer Joshua Humphreys for a fleet of frigates powerful enough to engage any frigates of the French or British navies yet fast enough to evade any ship of the line.

Found primarily in the southeastern United States, from Virginia to Texas, live oak is one of the most durable hardwoods. Joshua Humphreys, the principal designer of the six frigates, specifically called for live oak in their frames and other important structural members as it was a strong, dense, and long-lasting wood. Although it cost five times more than white oak to harvest and ship to the yards, Humphreys convinced the War Department to spend the money on live oak with the argument that it would last five times longer than habitats where they are planted. white oak in the ships' hulls.

As part of the annual event and to further dedicate itself to the principles of natural resource conservation, NAS Oceana renewed its status as a member of the Tree City USA program. Since 1976, Tree City USA has been a nationwide movement that provides the framework necessary for communities to manage and expand their public trees.

"Today NAS Oceana is celebrating not only Arbor Day, but


The tree chosen to be planted for the celebration is one its 24th year as a Tree City USA, with Dam Neck celebrating its 18th year in the program," said O'Liddy. "This event really gives the children here a tie to the outdoors; they get to, as the years pass, see this tree grow, and that is something very unique and an opportunity for them to learn and grow with the tree."

> More than 3,400 communities have committed to becoming a Tree City. They have achieved Tree City USA status by meeting four core standards of sound urban forestry management: maintaining a tree board or department, having a community tree ordinance, spending at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry and celebrating Arbor Day.

> The Arbor Day Foundation says that trees provide multiple benefits to a community when properly planted and maintained. They also say that trees can improve the visual appeal of a neighborhood, increase property values, reduce home cooling costs, remove air pollutants and provide wildlife

# Lincoln departs for carrier qualifications, **CSSQT**

#### ATLANTIC OCEAN

The aircraft carrier USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN 72) departed on an underway, April 24, and is scheduled to conduct three major evolutions — carrier qualifications, Combat Systems Ship Qualification Trials (CSSQT) and student pilot carrier qualifications.

These evolutions and qualifications will play a massive role in sending qualified pilots to the Fleet and will test Abraham Lincoln's combat systems.

"I'm stoked for this underway," said Quartermaster Seaman Steven Pettit, a Sailor assigned to the Navigation Department aboard Abraham Lincoln. "There are a lot of exciting things going on while we are at sea, and it is going to be awesome being a part of it."

The first evolution Abraham Lincoln will conduct is carrier qualifications. Abraham Lincoln will host F/A-18 Super Hornet student pilots from the "Gladiators" of Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 106, as they qualify for landing aboard a carrier. They must complete at least 10 landings during the

day and six landings at night to qualify. The students must complete 150–200 flight hours in their respective aircraft to have the opportunity to land on the flight deck of a carrier.

"For a lot of the students this is their first time in this type of aircraft, so we have to work at our best level to make sure they land and take off safely," said Cmdr. David Burmeister, the air boss aboard Abraham Lincoln. "This is going to be my last underway with the ship. It is a bittersweet feeling, but I'm excited to see what the Air Department is going to be able to accomplish in this short period."

Following carrier qualifications, Abraham Lincoln's Combat Systems Department will conduct CSQQT, a major test of the ship's defense systems. Abraham Lincoln will fire two Rolling Airframe Missiles (RAM) and one NATO Sea Sparrow missile. This is the first time since Abraham Lincoln's mid-life Refueling and Complex Overhaul (RCOH) maintenance period that these systems will be operationally tested.

Combat Systems will load and fire the two missiles at a target, and in the event that the missiles miss, the Close-in Weapons System (CIWS) will shoot the target from close

"We shoot the CWIS almost every underway, but the Navy as a whole only shoots off a couple of NATO missiles every few years," said Fire Controlman 2nd Class Matthew Miller. "I am extremely excited to get to be a part of this evolution."

During the last stretch of the underway, student pilots from the "Eagles" of Advanced Jet Training Squadron (VT) 7, the "Tigers" of VT-9, the "Redhawks" of VT-21 and the "Golden Eagles" of VT-22 will fly aboard to finish their final flight qualifications. The qualifications require pilots to successfully complete 10 arrested landings and four touch-and-go landings on Abraham Lincoln's 1,092-foot flight deck.


"It is awesome knowing that when we are done the Fleet will have more qualified pilots to complete the mission of the Navy," said Burmeister.

Following these evolutions, Abraham Lincoln will be another step closer to full mission readiness. The next step for Abraham Lincoln will be Tailored Ships Training Availability (TSTA) and Final Evaluation Problem (FEP) as the ship further prepares for deployment in 2019.







# MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENTS ATTEND 2018 VIRGINIA INTERNATIONAL

#### **NORFOLK**

Nine Medal of Honor recipients attended the Virginia International Tattoo Festival, an annual performance exhibiting military bands and performers from around the world, as part of the Virginia Arts Festival at the Norfolk Scope Arena held Apr. 26 through Apr. 29.

The festival displayed themes of honor and patriotism as well as a moving salute to Medal of Honor recipients, the highest award for valor in action that can be bestowed upon an individual serving in the Armed Forces in the United States.

The origins of the International tattoos stem from a 17thcentury European tradition of military drummers alerting soldiers that it was time to their barracks for the evening. After hearing the call of the local regiments' fifes and drums, the Dutch Low County innkeepers would call "doe den tap toe!" — "turn off the taps!" The "tap too" evolved over time, and the world "tattoo" now refers to a ceremonial performance of military music by massed bands.

"I'm really enjoying myself here," said Mike Thornton, a Medal of Honor recipient and former member of SEAL Team ONE. "The great thing about all this is every country has their own music. If everyone could get together like this, there would be no problems. It is great to see everyone get together here and enjoy the music."

Roger H.C. Donlon, a Medal of Honor recipient and former member of the United States Army, also shared mutual sentiments on the event.

"My father served in World War I, my brother served in World War II, and I came along in the Vietnam War. Now my niece is serving," said Donlon. "That's a nice bookend for 100 years of service. That's what I'm celebrating. And here we have a celebration of NATO allies between the international language of music."

But service to one's country can cost the ultimate price, and the 3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment was there to pay respects. Nicknamed the "Old Guard," the regiment is the Army's official ceremonial unit and escort to the president of the United States.

"This is the first time we have done the changing of the guard outside of Arlington," said Maj. Rob Lodewick, the regiment's public affairs officer. "This isn't something we usually do, but we came honoring the Medal of Honor recipients and those who have passed."


Since its creation in 1861, more than 3,400 Medals of Honor have been awarded to America's most courageous troops. But due to the medal's nature, many of those brave men and women posthumously received the award.

"My medal I wear around my neck, I wear it for those who gave their utmost, who gave it their all," said Thornton. "They did it for our freedoms and so we can enjoy things like this. Their sacrifice makes this possible. Freedom is written in blood."





Seventeen-year-old Axel Medina Roca of Guatemala was born with a rare disorder known as neurofibromatosis (NF), a condition that causes normal nerves to grow into disorga-

NF is a challenging disorder even for those with access to healthcare, but without money or opportunity, Axel's mass heard about Continuing Promise 2018's visit to Puerto Barhas been left to grow untreated his whole life.

"I've taken him to several hospitals over the years had the ability to help us," said Axel's father, Edgar Medina. "About four years ago we took him to a pediatric hospital. They told us they could remove the mass, and we were hopeful. Ultimately, they weren't prepared for what they found and did nothing. They opened the mass and closed it, leaving him only with a small scar to show for it."

Edgar's face was tired, but pleasant, the face of a man who had done his best to help his son. He reserved eye contact only for the high points of each conversation, and even then, briefly. The rest of the time he studied the floor before him and indicated his understanding through exaggerated nods. He explained that over the years priests and missionaries would visit Guatemala and take an interest in Axel's situation and promise to secure him a visa to get surgery in the States. However, in each case, they would leave, and nothing would

is when there was some hope that something could be done about his condition. But each time he was told it wouldn't happen or it was impossible, he would fall farther into depression and despair. He would stop talking for weeks at a

Father Anton Grech of the GuateMalta Foundation, a charitable organization that operates in Guatemala and Malta, rios and immediately thought of Axel. The Medina Roca Family were thrilled by the news, but quickly realized the 7-hour trip and hotel stay required to see the doctors were much more than they could afford. The good people of their church also recognized this dilemma and quickly took up donations to buy them bus tickets. They also found a parishioner in Puerto Barrios who agreed to take the family in for the duration of their stay.

Meanwhile, aboard the Military Sealift Command's expeditionary fast transport vessel USNS Spearhead (T-EPF 1) en route to Guatemala, the doctors of Continuing Promise were first learning about Axel. Lt. Cmdr. Jason Souza, a plastic surgeon, stationed at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, was given a photo of Axel and studied it during the

"When we were on the ship, I was already thinking about his case," said Souza. "It was pretty obvious from the photo that it was a plexiform neurofibroma and I was optimistic that MC1 Mike DiMestico

we could help him. So when we got to Guatemala, we set out to find him."

It didn't take long for Axel and his family to find themselves sitting outside the expeditionary medical unit, a series of tents used by the Continuing Promise team as a mobile military surgical site. It was here that Dr. Souza had his first encounter with the boy who had unknowingly waited a lifetime to meet him. Dr. Souza was friendly and reassuring. He examined Axel thoroughly and with the quiet confidence of a man who truly appreciates the importance of his profession.

Dr. Chow and Dr. Lauren Richards, both Home Base psychologists, teach spouses to process grief by identifying and regulating their emotions, rationally examining their feelings of guilt, and learning to ask for help. The primary goal of the IOCP Skills Group is not to alleviate grief, but rather lift the obstacles to processing

# **USS Preble returns** home from Deployment

#### **PEARL HARBOR**

The guided-missile destroyer USS Preble (DDG 88) returns to its homeport, Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, April 27, after more than six months on a deployment to the U.S. 5th and 7th Fleet areas of operation.

While deployed, Preble conducted security, stability and freedom of navigation operations throughout the Arabian Sea, Indo-Pacific region, and surrounding waters.

The ship was underway for more than 173 days and conducted approximately 1,000 flight hours with the ship's embarked Helicopter Maritime Strike Squadron (HSM) 37, Det. 5

"I am extremely proud of the hard work and dedication Preble's Sailors have exhibited this deployment," said Cmdr. Allen Maxwell Jr., commanding officer of Preble. "We started this deployment ready to take on any mission that came our way, and we have done just that. This crew showed an incredible amount of resiliency and proved that we are dedicated to achieving mission success and greatness in everything we do."

Preble began training and operating with the Theodore Roosevelt Carrier Strike Group (TRSCSG) in April 2017 to improve mission readiness and cohesion as a strike group. Preble departed JBPHH Oct. 16.














# **KELLEY TALKS** UNMANNED SYSTEMS, **FUTURE** CAPABILITIES, TO CARDEROCK WORKFORCE

#### WEST BETHESDA, MD.

Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Navy (DASN) for Unmanned Systems (UxS) Frank Kelley visited Naval Surface Warfare Center, Carderock Division April 20 to hear about Carderock's contribution to unmanned systems, aeronautical expertise and legacy of innovation.

Kelley briefed a full room of more than 120 engineers about the roadmap for UxS, talking in more detail about the progress so far and what's to come.

"Our vision and our future with unmanned systems is limitless," Kelley said. "The Navy more than any other service has a legitimate right and claim to have unmanned systems in every single domain. But, with that, comes the responsibility of being able to employ them in every domain and doing what you folks do here, and that is coming up with systems that can operate in every domain, in between domains, across domains."

Kelley reviewed the National Defense Strategy, secretary of the Navy priorities and the Assistant Secretary of the Navy for Research, Development and Acquisition James Geurts' goals, repeating Geurts' intent: "Our focus remains on implementing the National Defense Strategy and that should be the lens through which you view your priorities and weight of effort — increasing lethality, increasing our partnerships and streamlining our processes."

Kelley said he fully recognized the importance of the Warfare Centers to UxS efforts and that he was impressed with not only what is going on at Carderock, but also the cooperation and willingness of Carderock's leadership to say Carderock is ready to satisfy the Navy's unmanned systems needs.

"The Warfare Centers each have their own culture, their own identities," Kelley said. "And

it all goes back to how they started. No other warfare center can do what Carderock does. And we need your unique capabilities. Together with the other warfare centers, the Department of the Navy can achieve our unmanned systems goals and execute our roadmap."

When DASN UxS was established in 2015, Kelley, recently retired as a Marine brigadier general, said one of their first tasks was to develop a comprehensive roadmap for unmanned systems for the Department of the Navy. Three primary steps served to inform the roadmap: first, establishing the 2030+ vision for unmanned systems, whether in the open ocean, littorals or in the Arctic; second, defining the

barriers to realizing the vision; and third, identifying specific action items to overcome those barriers. In all, approximately 250 action items were identified. From these inputs, DASN UxS developed the Navy's Strategic Roadmap for Unmanned Systems. "This is a different kind of roadmap — what are the future capabilities and things that are going to enable those future capabilities to take place," Kelley said. "There is a lot of work out

there. I want you to know, this is the future — there's no doubt in my mind. Great ideas and great combinations are going to come out of using new technology on platforms that we never envisioned before, with a new set of sensors, coupled with things like artificial intelligence. We are going to use them in new and unique ways that are not only going to make us a more effective Navy and Marine Corps, but are also going to help save lives."

Kelley said the engineers, scientists and researchers at the Warfare Centers need to remember they are doing this work for the fleet, and he encouraged more engagement with the Marines and Sailors ultimately responsible for the operational side of using unmanned systems.

"This is going to be the future and you guys have a critically important part of it," Kelley said. "Carderock's leadership is ready to go, and that's been a very clear message to us at DASN for Unmanned."

This was not Kelley's first time at Carderock. He said he has visited several times and has seen many of Carderock's facilities, but each time he sees something new. This time, he toured the subsonic wind tunnel, the largest in the Navy, and learned about Carderock's long history with aviation and aerodynamics.

# **NMCB 11 Seabees** give locals a means to sustain freshwater

#### **CARLSON, MARSHALL ISLANDS**

Fourteen Seabees assigned to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion (NMCB) 11 Construction Civic Action Detail (CCAD) Marshall Islands landed on Carlson Island to begin the construction of their second water catchment project April 17, 2018.

The structure consists of a 31 foot by 15 foot, 6-inch CMU foundation, corrugated roofing, and a PVC piping system that funnels water into eight fresh water storage tanks. The project is led by Construction Electrician 1st Class Marc Artache, who is responsible for the quality and safety during construction, and Builder 1st Class Joshua Vanblarcom, who oversees the project and overall construction operations.

The project began on April 17, 2018 with

the movement of project tools and materials from Kwajalein to the nearby island of Carlson on a Landing Craft Mechanized (LCM). LCM movements continued again two days later when all 14 members of the CCAD

offloaded the project's tools, materials and equipment. The Seabees moved over 19,000 pounds of CMU block, 10,000 pounds of wood framing, 1,300 pounds of sack concrete and various other supplies up the beach and through the island's thick vegetation all Force (NCF). They currently have personnel

"This is what Seabees are built to do," said Construction Electrician 2nd Class Joshua Zapien, the project's crew leader. The move- Defense. in on to the island demonstrates what makes the Seabees such a unique construction force.

With several days of beach landings complete, seven of the 14 Seabees assigned to CCAD MHL will remain on Carlson for two weeks to complete construction. When the project is completed the island will have more than 12,000 gallons of fresh water available — a substantial amount for a population of 50. The design of this project will not only have a permanent lasting impact on Carlson, but will also be used as a baseline for other communities throughout the Marshall Islands to use for fresh water storage.

"All of the hard work is worth it when you see the direct impact your work has on a community that doesn't have things we take

for granted," said Builder 3rd Class Briana Garcia Cuevas, a key team member in the construction of this project.

NMCB 11 is homeported in Gulfport, Mississippi, and is part of the Naval Construction assigned to more than 15 locations worldwide, performing a variety of missions in support of the Navy and the Department of

The NCF is a vital component of the U.S. Maritime Strategy and is comprised of deployable battalions capable of providing contingency construction, disaster preparation and recovery support, humanitarian assistance and combat operations support.

challenging," said Souza. "The problem is, this thing originates in normal nerve, but turns that nerve totally abnormal. Somewhere in that mass were connections that were still viable, allowing him to move his eye and mouth. This prevents you from being able to excise the mass entirely if you hope to preserve any facial function."

Axel sat on the examination table with his hands in his lap, listening intently to the doctors speak a language he didn't understand, studying their body language for any indicators of meaning. His eyes were glassy and he briefly turned his head to wipe them. When a corpsman asked if he was scared, his translator relayed his response, "No, he's just happy."

"He was so happy because Dr. Souza seemed so optimistic, and although he's heard it before, he was confident it would happen this time," said Edgar. "His mother and I, on the other hand, having endured so many disappointments, were telling him not to get his hopes up. We just didn't want him to be any further broken."

"In many ways, the most challenging parts of this case were the coordination and making sure that this was a case local doctors wanted to be a part of," explained Souza. "Once we knew they were interested and committed to his post-operative treatment, we decided we were in."

In order to limit costs to the hospital, the Continuing Promise team did all the preoperative workups, all the labs and the imaging. They decided to perform the case at the local hospital as opposed to the expeditionary medical unit to maximize their recovery capabilities and use their ICU if needed.

The Hospital de Puerto Barrios was small but busy. Throngs of people waited outside, sitting on curbs or lying wherever they could find a swatch of shade. The structure itself was blue, and if not for the great soft clouds, almost indistinguishable from the sky behind it. Axel was led into the operating room waiting room barefoot, wearing a thin, faded gown where he was met by Dr. Souza and the local surgeon who would perform the procedure alongside him.

Dr. Jonathan Maldonado, a boyishly handsome 27-year-old wunderkind surgeon who began medical school at the age of 15, entered the room and spoke a few words to Axel, extending a thumbs up. He's regarded as something of a celebrity at the hospital, stopping to chat with adoring hospital staff every few yards.

The operating room was a hive of activity. Corpsmen and Guatemalan nurses wheeled squeaky carts full of glistening tools into the space. Doctors flipped switches and pushed buttons on colorful displays. By the time Axel entered the room, the team was ready.

Working as a team, the U.S. Navy and Guatemalan anesthesiologists got to work. Since the mass presented a challenging airway, they had planned to perform a fiberoptic intubation, providing an opportunity to demonstrate a technique not otherwise available in Guatemala. The intubation was uncomplicated and the surgeons scrubbed in to get to work.

"The surgery was every bit as challenging as we anticipated," said Souza. "The depth and extent of the mass meant that we experienced bleeding that was expected but required all team members to be working cohesively. This is a challenge in an unfamiliar environment without a common language. This is where we really needed to lean on Hospital Corpsman 3rd Class Mark Jiminez, our scrub tech and interpreter, he kept us all on the same page.

The excision proved to be slow going, meticulous work. Hours into the procedure, Axel needed blood. Having prepared for this, the team administered the blood his parents had donated a day before.

Outside, Axel's parents paced the hallways, waiting patiently for word. They would snap out of their thoughtful silence each time a member of the medical team emerged from the operating room with an update.

Once the mass was removed, the process of reconstructing his face began. Dr. Souza painstakingly snipped and sewed and stapled flaps of skin in place until he was satisfied, checking and double-checking his work.

After eight grueling hours, the surgery was complete. Axel had a new face — his old face, the one not yet deformed by the mass. Dr. Souza snuck a few final looks at his work before snapping off his blood-stained gloves. The medical team began cleaning the room and accounting for their tools. There were fist pumps and handshakes.

"This was a combined effort," said Souza. "Dr. Maldonado did as much of that surgery as I did and that's exactly how it should go. Our entire mindset from the beginning was to expand the capabilities that already exist, rather than replace them. I think Axel's case is a great reflection of that because it was only through the coordination with the Guatemalan providers and the hospital that we were able to accomplish this surgery."

Dr. Souza walked into the breezeway and pulled down his mask. Through an interpreter, he described for Axel's parents the details of the procedure. Teary, Elsa threw her arms around him as Edgar nodded, smiling. They were shown the photo of their son's new face and stood in silence as they took it in.

"It's the only thing I've wanted for my child," said Edgar. "I have no money to pay for surgery or for a better life. I will be eternally grateful and will always remember what you did for our family and how you gave my son happiness. It's something that I can never repay. What we want most for him now is to catch up on all that he's missed out on and finally be able to enjoy his life."

Edgar and Elsa were led into the small ICU where Axel was recovering. His face was wrapped in gauze and he was still asleep. They shuffled to his bedside wearing yellow protective gowns. The medical staff casually backed away to give them a moment. They leaned over their son and whispered words of love and encouragement.

"I've found from doing this that there's a great support structure around him," said Souza. "One of the things that predicts whether or not a patient does well is what's called self-efficacy, basically what a patient thinks he or she can do. A lot of that is based on their support structure. In the absence of very involved parents and involved physicians and the support of this [non-governmental organization], we may very well have chosen not to do this case. That's how critical it is and Axel absolutely has that in his favor."

As planned, Dr. Maldonado and the host nation team will continue Axel's postoperative treatment after the departure of the Continuing Promise 2018 team. Given the tumor type and size of the mass, Dr. Souza explained it is likely that more surgeries will be needed. However, all involved have expressed a commitment to do what is needed to finish what has been started.

U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command/U.S. 4th Fleet has deployed a force to execute Continuing Promise to conduct civil-military operations including humanitarian assistance, training engagements, and medical, dental, and veterinary support in an effort to show U.S. support and commitment to Central and South America.

The United States, Mattis said, will continue to "fight and protect the innocent people."

#### **Strengthened Alliance**

Mattis said he spent at least an hour on the phone April 28 with South Korean Defense Minister Song Young-moo. He said the call was part of the broader collaboration and constant consultation between the United States and South Korea, as developments unfold on the Korean Peninsula.

Mattis said it is "pretty calm" on both the North and South Korean side, with no indicators or warnings of an increased military readiness in the North.

The U.S.-South Korea alliance remains strong, he said, noting recent developments have strengthened the alliance even further. In a statement April 28, chief Pentagon spokesperson Dana W. White said the leaders discussed the results of the inter-Korea summit. Both leaders, the statement said, expressed their "serious commitment to a diplomatic resolution that achieves complete, verifiable and irreversible denuclearization of North Korea."

#### WASHINGTON

To improve readiness and reduce turnover of forward deployed naval force (FDNF) sea duty units, the Navy announced May 1, that effective immediately, incoming firstterm enlisted Sailors assigned to sea duty billets in Japan, Guam and Spain will be assigned to longer tour lengths, in NAVADMIN 107/18.

Prescribed Sea Tours (PST) for first-term Sailors assigned to FDNF sea duty billets will be up to a maximum of 48 months accompanied by dependents and 48 months unaccompanied. If a Sailor's dependents are not given command sponsorship, a maximum of 24 months unaccompanied orders will be issued.

This change only applies to first-term Sailors on their located at www.npc.navy.mil. way to their first sea duty tour in Japan, Guam and Spain,

and does not apply to assignments listed in exhibit one of MILPERSMAN 1300-308.

First-term FDNF Sailors currently assigned to a sea duty tour in Japan, Guam, and Spain and Sailors on their second or subsequent FDNF sea duty tour are encouraged to take advantage of the incentives offered to extend their tours, as outlined in NAVADMIN 042/18.

First-term Sailors with orders issued on or after May 1, 2018 will not be eligible for incentives listed in NAV-ADMIN 042/18, but will have any remaining PST obligation from their first sea duty tour waived. Sailors will only become eligible for the overseas tour extension incentive program if they extend after completion of their assigned 48-month tour.

#### **VIRGINIA BEACH NATIVE SERVES AT SEA ABOARD NAVY'S NEWEST AND MOST-ADVANCED ATTACK** SUBMARINE

#### **PEARL HARBOR**

A Virginia Beach, Virginia, native and 1997 Princess Anne High School graduate is serving in the U.S. Navy aboard one of the Navy's newest attack submarines, USS Hawaii.

Chief Petty Officer Travis S. Reed works as an electronics technician (radio) serving aboard the Pearl Harbor-based submarine, one of 56 fast attack submarines in the U.S. Navy.

A Navy electronics technician (radio) is responsible for the maintenance and operation of all the ships external communications systems.

"I grew up in a Navy town," said Reed. "I grew up accepting people of different backgrounds. Coming into the Navy, it was not odd to me that people were so diverse. It helps you thing on the ship works and how to respond in emergencies to Chief Petty Officer Travis S. Reed work well with your shipmates."

Jobs are highly varied aboard the submarine, according to Navy officials. Approximately 130 men and women make up the submarine's crew, doing everything from handling weapons to maintaining nuclear reactors.

Navy officials explained that attack submarines are designed to hunt down and destroy enemy submarines and surface ships; strike targets ashore with cruise missiles; carry and deliver Navy SEALs; carry out intelligence, surveillance,

and reconnaissance missions; and engage in mine warfare. Their primary tactical advantage is stealth, operating undetected under the sea for long periods of time.

"Our submarine teams are small, elite, and rely heavily on extraordinary individual performance," said Rear Adm. Daryl L. Caudle, commander, Submarine Forces, U.S. Pacific Fleet. "It is no surprise that our sailors continue to set the standard for excellence, and the country continues to be well served by their service and sacrifice. I couldn't be more proud to lead this professional fighting force."

According to Navy officials, because of the demanding environment aboard submarines, personnel are accepted only after rigorous testing and observation. Submariners are some of the most highly trained and skilled people in the Navy. Regardless of their specialty, everyone has to learn how everybecome "qualified in submarines" and earn the right to wear the coveted gold or silver dolphins on their uniform.





"Most of our team members earned their wings in the military and we always pay tribute to the brave combat pilots who originally trained in our aircraft as well as those currently serving in the Armed Forces," says GEICO Skytypers Commanding Officer Larry Arken. Arken also is the team's flight leader. "It is a special privilege to fly these vintage WWII trainers on behalf of GEICO."

The GEICO Skytypers are based in Farmindale, NY, where the 75-year-old planes are maintained by a full-time staff of expert mechanics who travel with the pilots to every air

In addition to their air show performances, the SNJs are retrofitted to type giant messages in the sky. Flying wingtip-to-wingtip in a line-abreast formation, the lead plane sends computer signals to each of four other aircraft, synchronizing smoke releases to generate 1,000-foot-tall messages. Each letter is higher than the Empire State Building and can be formed in three to TheU.S. Air Force Thunderbirdswill serve as the air show headliners. In addition to the Thunfour seconds.

"People on the ground can see our messages from 15 miles away," saysSteve Kapur, the GEICO Skytypers marketing officer. "The messages appear in dot-matrix style, but on a monumental scale and 17 times faster than traditional skywriting."




