

As the Rafale Marine launched into the distant skyline, becoming the last French aircraft to depart from aircraft carrier USS George H.W. Bush (CVN 77), Sailors on the deck celebrated a successful training operation and a job well done, concluding the historic combined exercise Chesapeake 2018.

Chesapeake 2018 began in April at Naval Air Station Oceana and continued at sea, resulting in full integration of the French navy air wing into a single, unified carrier air wing. The at-sea training lasted from May 7-18 and included the French Carrier Air Wing, Carrier Air Wing Eight (CVW) 8, and embarked staff from Carrier Strike Group (CSG) 2.

"The French sailors acclimated very well to the U.S. carrier and the environment because of their experience operating off the Charles De Gaulle," said the Commanding Officer of USS George H. W. Bush, Capt. Sean R. Bailey. "Furthermore, our Sailors were very welcoming and supportive of the French sailors coming onboard. Having the opportunity to live, interact and work together created strong





### **NAVFAC Mid-Atlantic** kicks off emerging leader program for fiscal year 2018

Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Mid-Atlantic kicked off its Emerging Leader Program (ELP) for fiscal year 2018, before the start of Classroom Session I, with welcoming remarks from the command's acting Business Director Brian Crowder, April 30.

With a full classroom of 30 General Schedule and Federal Wage System pay plan participants from across the NAVAC Mid-Atlantic area of responsibility, Crowder spoke of ELP and its importance to not just the program participants individually, but to the command as a whole.

"ELP is an illustration of our commitment to our personnel and then leveraging that commitment to make a better organization," he said. "It's what we said we would do; it's what we said we are about."

ELP is a NAVFAC Mid-Atlantic Leadership Development Program designed to develop future leaders. Those selected for the program complete valuable self-assessments, experiential learning activities, and a personalized leadership development plan. This six-month program focuses on developing the leadership skills of the class participants through training and developmental experiences. Other key aspects of the program in-

- Self-assessment instruments (i.e., Myers-Briggs, Leadership)
- · Three one-week residential classroom
- Personalized leadership development ac-
- Learning teams and team projects • Experiential learning activities
- Management readings/interaction
- Feedback and coaching.

"We are hopeful you will find the information and techniques introduced in the program beneficial as you work to sharpen your leadership ability and skills," he said. "The program is designed to give you greater awareness of the things that drive and motivate yourself and others."

ELP began at NAVFAC Mid-Atlantic in 2010 and was designed to help motivated employees take the next step in their careers. The three one-week, 40-hour sessions are held in a classroom setting onboard Naval Station Norfolk, with the students performing various assignments on their own to complete the rest of the program.

"It has been said, 'if it doesn't challenge you, it doesn't change you," Crowder added. "I encourage you all to make the most of this opportunity to learn about yourself and about leadership."

Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Mid-Atlantic launched a new, enhanced Customer Service Center (CSC) responding to facilities-related issues with a ribbon cutting marking its ceremonial opening May 1.

NAVFAC Mid-Atlantic Commanding Officer Capt. Dean VanderLey was joined by NAVFAC Mid-Atlantic Public Works Director Jean Dumlao in cutting the ribbon outside the center, as did CSC manager Timothy Walton and Jessica Sartorius, CSC program analyst leader.

It is to their emergency quickly. part of an intensive three-year customer service initiative to improve products and services, a drive lauded by VanderLey.

"As we stood this up, we really tried to look at how this is done in industry, what the best practices were and how we could really set ourselves up as a world-class customer service organization," said VanderLey who went on to emphasize that the CSC is well-positioned to take the pulse of what the Fleet needs and where to improve. "The goal is to have a good feedback loop. The lessons the CSC is learning every day on the phones as we talk to the different customers is something we can feedback into the organization and make NAVFAC even better."

While NAVFAC has long hosted a call line — the number remains 757-341-1700 — it is the depth and breadth of the service that is changing. In the past, customers could report emergency issues during normal working hours, but with a smaller staff, after-hours calls were routed as the auxiliary duty of 24-hour utility repair desks. Wanting to do more for its customers, NAV-FAC Mid-Atlantic took cues from industry, working to create a system that better manages the way it interacts with customers. That meant increasing staff and developing a new one-stopshopping site.

The CSC site, until recently, was the back side of a shops building that fell into disrepair. Public Works Department Norfolk's in-house project team, completely renovated the space, creating independent agent areas, premier communication connections and training rooms, shaping a facility similar to commercial call centers.

Agents now take calls without shifting calls to an alternative group or directing callers to another point of contact to call. The focus is on efficiency and better customer experience. As a more

robust and fully independent entity, the CSC coordinates every-The CSC serves as the focal point between the 13 NAVFAC thing behind the scenes for facility emergencies. It's seamless to

To ensure success, the CSC has also put a premium on standardized training, emphasizing customer service and fostering agent independence to deliver consistent and beneficial interactions. Better tools were likewise developed to help the agents address the unique missions and concerns of the wide-ranging customers NAVFAC support across the region. These tools will ensure the agents work as integrated liaisons between callers and their local supporting Public Works Department.

The new CSC is equipped with a system to allow for calls to be recorded and monitored for training purposes and to collect metrics on wait times, call throughput and agent professionalism, just like industry giant Amazon. The intent is to use these capabilities to continue to identify and work towards even more

"Part of our process was to study successful businesses and how they keep customers happy. We set out to borrow from their example, apply what we could, and work to simply do a better job supporting the Fleet," said VanderLey. "This is exactly how NAVFAC has embraced the CNO's focus on high-velocity learning: We saw a problem in real time, solved it using scientific methods, taught our professional crew how to keep addressing service and now we transition into encouraging others to follow our lead. We will be relentless in our drive to reach 100%

It's important to note that the CSC is used principally for those requests deemed facility emergencies — situations that require immediate action to prevent loss or damage to government property, restore essential services that have been disrupted, eliminate hazard to personnel, and restore essential mission operational capability. While the CSC is always available to

respond to facility emergencies, locally required processes for ISIC reporting and funding authorization must still be observed.

# NAVY CHIEF, NAVY PRIDE: HAMPTON ROADS CHIEFS MESS HONORS LOCAL VETERAN

Forty eight Chiefs from the Hampton Roads area visited 91-year-old retired Chief Signalman Clifford Wolff at the Westminster Canterbury Senior Community May 3. The event was designed to honor Wolff's service to his country, to let him know he is not forgotten by the military community, and to allow him to relive the pride that comes with being a Navy Chief.

"As part of our participation in the 'We Honor Veterans' program, our goal is to identify and serve all of our patients who are veterans and veteran spouses and help them connect with one another," said support services coordinator, Sarah McBride. "Today is a wonderful show of support for the Navy Chief community in Hampton Roads and just shows what can happen when people connect and take the time to get to know one another."

Westminster Canterbury and its staff provide valuable services through their program known as "memorable moments", where they give seniors something to look forward to as they enter later chapters of their life.

Originally, Wolff's family had thought about taking a trip to see USS Wisconsin, but because of his advanced age they decided it was best to hold something at Westminster Canterbury.

"We spoke to our Chaplain and the staff here and we thought of the possibility of one of the local Navy Chief organizations paying him a visit. We really thought it would be just a few," said Wolff's daughter, Susan Beachum. "To see that there are over forty Chiefs from all over Hampton Roads here today to see my father, it is hard to put into words what I'm feeling. A

simple thank you cannot properly express my appreciation for everyone."


"When we learned Mr. Wolff's wish was to hang out with some Navy Chiefs, I knew I was very fortunate to know Chief Thompson. Our sons play soccer together, I went to practice one day and asked for his help, and it was he who organized the Chiefs to come here for this event," said McBride. "When I asked for help, I really only expected a few to come by and see Mr. Wolff. To see how many have come here today to support us and honor the service of a retired Sailor is extraordinary."


Wolff's career was extensive and varied. He served in World War II , the Korean War , and the Vietnam War . Serving twice in the Navy, first from 1944-1946. He re-enlisted in the Navy in 1952 and continued his career until 1970, retiring as a Chief Petty Officer. Wolff's career highlight was volunteering to serve aboard the USS Arneb (AKA-56), an Andromeda-class attack cargo ship, serving under Adm. Richard Byrd, during Operation Deep Freeze.

In 1929, Admiral Richard E. Byrd established naval outposts on the Antarctic coast and began conducting photographic and geologic mapping operations around the continent, cementing the Navy's presence in the Antarctic. On Nov. 14, 1955 Arneb got underway as flagship of the U.S. Navy's Operation Deep Freeze 1 (1955-56) to prepare logistics and basing support in advance of the scientific work. The operation allowed the USS Arneb to claim the distinction of crossing both the Arctic and Antarctic Circles in the course of one year, completing a circumnavigation of the globe upon her arrival at Norfolk on May 5, 1956. Forty nations collaborated to advance world knowledge in a myriad of scientific disciplines during the 18-month operation, eventually leading to the creation of the Antarctic Treaty.

"Being able to honor a veteran and retired Chief is amazing; this is why I joined the Navy. The Naval heritage and traditions that come with service, this is what this events all about," said Senior Chief Electronics Technician, Shay Thompson. "I am overwhelmed right now at the support from my brothers and sister that have reached out to help make today special. It goes back to how Chiefs are always ready to act when called to action; I got that call and was proud to answer it."

"I spent my entire childhood and young adult life with my dad in the Navy, I grew up a Navy brat, and I know the hardship of having a parent that must go out to sea to serve our

### NAVAL SAFETY CENTER LAUNCHES HFACS APP

The Naval Safety Center launched a new Department of Defense Human Factors Analysis and Classification System (DoD HFACS) app via both the Apple and Android app stores.

DoD HFACS codes are used when entering safety mishaps into the Web-Enabled Safety System (WESS), and they help analysts understand the human element behind roughly 80 percent of all mishaps.

"Ultimately, the app will be used as an enhanced version of the existing HFACS flipbook," said Lt. Andrew Miranda, an aerospace experimental psychologist at the Naval Safety Center.

The app currently takes up about 24.5 MB of space on a user's phone, and including documents and data, increases to about 100 MB. Users will be able to bookmark certain places in the app and it has a "resume" feature that will enable them to go back to the place where they left off. Users will also be able to review the app and provide suggestions via the app for improvements.

Along with being an electronic safety guide, Miranda said the app is a more interactive version of the original Quick Series flipbook. Users will be able to enter search terms to find specific information about nanocodes and definitions to find more detailed information.

There is also additional information and resources outside of the DoD HFACS area that is specific to the Naval Safety Center in general, such as a mishap investigation guide, contact information for reporting a mishap and even stories from Approach magazine with links to other media sources.

Miranda said the app is expected to be updated quarterly or when immediately necessary based on user feedback.

"We will be continuing efforts to query users for feedback on suggestions for improvements," said Miranda.


Like most apps, the Naval Safety Center's app addresses a need for a particular target audience — Sailors, Marines and DoD employees — who were asking for an electronic version of the information provided by the Naval Safety Center. However, the app is specifically tailored for safety officers who have a need to quickly access the guides.

"We receive weekly requests from safety officers and professionals asking for copies of the HFACS flipbook," said Miranda. "We wanted to provide a more convenient method for users to get the information, while providing them with a user-friendly application."

Miranda said one day the app may replace the flipbook, but in the near-term, it would be used as a supplemental source of information for safety officers to reference, as well as providing access to other timely safety messages.

sonnel are accounted for and assistance is provided when needed," Warren said. "The visibility it provides up and down the Navy chain of command helps in so many ways."

One example Warren recalled was from a disaster that occurred when a petty officer on a ship had family members in an affected area that was devastated by the weather. But, because NFAAS was updated with the correct information, the family members were able to be reached thousands of miles around the world and assistance was provided by the Navy and Marine Corps Relief Society and the Red Cross.

"NFAAS is important because it allows us to help during a disaster. We are a Navy family and we need to ensure our active duty, reserves, civilians and family member are equally accounted for and provided assistance. This tool helps us do just that," Warren commented on why NFAAS is important.

NFAAS is easy to use and there are a few of ways to use it.

- You can go to the website https://navyfamily.navy.mil and click on "Navy Military, Civilians, Outside Contiguous United State (OCONUS), Contractors and their Families." The site will then give you the option to select logging in by Command Access Card (CAC), username and password or by personal information (SSN, date of birth and last name).
- Download the NFAAS mobile app.
- Provide updated information to your command's NFAAS representative and they can update the system for you.

A misconception is that the only time NFAAS is used is during hurricanes or during hurricane exercises.

Some other examples of NFAAS being used include Super Typhoon Haiyan

in the Pacific, tornados in the Midwest and assessments were conducted in NFAAS for tornados and flooding in Florida, Alabama, Oklahoma, Kansas, Arkansas, Mississippi and Tennessee.

When an event occurs (real or exercise), the first action is for the member to muster with their dependents. The command can then enter the information into NFAAS for the member which will prevent overloading NFAAS. During times when the service member is unable to update their NFAAS due to no internet connection or evacuation following a disaster, the service member can contact their command with their family information and his command NFAAS representative has the ability to update the information for them.

If a member is unable to reach their command for any reason, they can muster in NFAAS or they can muster by calling the Navy Personnel Command (NPC) help desk at 877-414-5358. Note that during non-emergency events, this is the NPC customer service desk.

Each command's hurricane preparedness and evacuation officer can provide additional information for the service member to take home and share with his family.

"Unfortunately one of the most common challenges we have, whether it's during an exercise or during a real-world event, is accurate contact information in NFAAS," said Warren. "When disaster strike we want to assist our Navy families as quickly as possible. By ensuring your personal and family information is up to date and having contact numbers for your command, NFAAS and NPC we can make a difficult situation a little better."



### CYCLONE

A cyclone is a closed, rotating wind. Cyclones rotate counterclockwise in the Northern Hemisphere and clockwise in the Southern Hemisphere.

### EYE

Hurricane winds blow in a spiral around the calm, roughly circular center called the eye. In the eye, which is about 20 - 30 miles wide, it is relatively calm and there is little or no rain. The eye is the warmest part of the storm.

### EYEWALL

Also called the wall cloud. Surrounding the eye is the eyewall, a band of thunder clouds. The eyewall has the most rain and the strongest winds of the storm, gusting up to 225 mph (360 km/h). The smaller the eye, the stronger the winds.

### HURRICANE

A hurricane is a powerful, rotating storm that forms over warm oceans near the equator in the Atlantic Ocean, the Caribbean Sea, or the eastern Pacific Ocean. Hurricanes have strong, counterclockwise winds (at least 74 miles per hour or 119 kph), a huge amount of rain, low air pressure, thunder and lightning.

### HURRICANE CLASSIFICATION

Hurricanes are classified into five categories, based on wind speed (using the Saffir-Simpson scale).

Category 1 -- Winds 74-95 mph

Category 2 -- Winds 96-110 mph

Category 3 -- Winds 111-130 mph Category 4 -- Winds 131-155 mph

Category 5 -- Winds over 155 mph.

### STORM SURGE

A storm surge is a rise in the ocean as the result of strong winds from a hurricane or other intense storm. A storm surge can cause dangerous flooding, especially when a storm surge coincides with a high tide. The height of the storm surge waters is the difference between the level of the ocean and the level that would have occurred normally. A storm surge is usually estimated by subtracting the regular high tide level from the observed storm tide - it can be 15 feet tall or more.

### STORM TIDE

A storm tide is the observed level of sea water. It is a result of the normal tide plus the storm surge.

### WATERSPOUT

A waterspout is a tornado that passes over water. It is a funnel-shaped formation of wind, water and ocean spray.





#### ATLANTIC OCEAN

The Freedom-variant littoral combat ship USS Milwaukee (LCS 5) conducted a live-fire missile exercise off the coast of Virginia May 11.

The Milwaukee fired four longbow hellfire missiles that successfully struck fast inshore attack craft targets.

During the evolution, the ship's crew executed a scenario simulating a complex warfighting environment, utilized radar and other systems to track small surface targets, simulated engagements and then fired missiles against the surface targets.

"The crew of the USS Milwaukee executed superbly and the test team ran the event seamlessly, both were critical in making this event successful," said Capt. Ted Zobel, LCS Mission Modules program manager.


This marks the completion of the first phase of the Surfaceto-Surface Missile Module (SSMM) Developmental Testing (DT) for the LCS Mission Modules (MM) program. This was the first integrated firing of the SSMM from an LCS. Additionally, this was the second at-sea launch of SSMM missiles from an LCS. SSMM leverages the U.S. Army's Longbow

Hellfire Missile in a vertical launch capability to counter small boat threats. Initial operational capability (IOC) and fielding of the SSMM is expected in 2019.

The Milwaukee, homeported at Naval Station Mayport, is a fast, agile, mission-focused platform designed for operation in near-shore environments yet capable of open-ocean operation. It is designed to defeat asymmetric "anti-access" threats such as mines, quiet diesel submarines and fast surface craft.

"The east coast littoral combat team continues to grow and mature with two Freedom-variant LCS arriving annually in Mayport. We look forward to conducting the next phase of SSMM testing onboard USS Detroit (LCS 7)," said Littoral Combat Ship Squadron Two Capt. Shawn Johnston.

The ship is a modular, reconfigurable ship, designed to meet validated fleet requirements for surface warfare, antisubmarine warfare and mine countermeasures missions in the littoral region. An interchangeable mission package is embarked on each LCS and provides the primary mission systems in one of these warfare areas. Using an open architecture design, modular weapons, sensor systems and a variety of manned and unmanned vehicles to gain, sustain, and exploit littoral maritime supremacy, LCS provides U.S. joint force access to critical areas in multiple theaters.

### Get ready: 10 tips for Sailors' Summer moves

From Naval Supply Systems Command Public Affairs

Sailors moving this summer should start preparing now, said Naval Supply Systems Command (NAVSUP) Household Goods (HHG) Director John E. Hilaman. "A good move doesn't just happen," he says, "it takes planning."

by keeping these 10 tips in mind:

1) START EARLY – HHG peak season runs from the beginning of May through August. Start early by going online at https://www.navsup.navy.mil/household to review your entitlements and responsibilities. To begin your move process go to: www.move.mil

2) PLAN ALTERNATE MOVE DATES, JUST IN **CASE** — When scheduling pickup or delivery, select alternate dates in addition to your preferred dates. During busy times, it could be difficult to get the first date you request. By establishing alternate dates that work for you, inconvenient pickups and deliveries can be avoided.

3) TELL UTILITIES, LANDLORDS — Be sure you have a confirmed date for your pack out and pickup before you inform your landlords or turn off your utilities.

4) MINIMIZE CHANGES — After the pickup date has been confirmed, only request changes in an emergency. Date changes can lead to delays, additional cost to the member, or the need to convert the shipment to a Personally Procured

5) BE REACHABLE — Moves go smoother when you

are easy to contact. Provide your personal phone numbers, cell phone numbers, and personal e-mail to the personal property offices at origin and destination. Include in-transit contact information, as well.

**6) TIME MOVES AHEAD OF VACATE DATE** — Do Hilaman recommends Sailors prepare for a smooth move on the schedule a pickup for the day you are to close on the sale or purchase of a home or on the day you must vacate a rental. Allow time for unforeseen problems and last-minute

> 7) **SORT** — Start sorting through household goods now and set aside items you have decided to put up for sale or donation. Service members must keep all shipments within their weight allowance or pay to ship the excess weight. Authorized weight allowance chart located at: https://www. navsup.navy.mil/public/navsup/hhg/quick\_links/weight\_al-

> 8) GET READY FOR PRE-MOVE SURVEY — Once the service member initiates the move online, the shipment contract has been awarded, and the transportation service provider (TSP aka moving company) assigned, the TSP will contact the service member to schedule and perform the premove survey. Be aware the TSP will conduct a pre-move survey no later than three business days prior to the first sched-

> The pre-move survey allows the TSP to establish a more realistic weight estimate, determine how many crew members to assign, determine the number of packing days needed, and determine what packing materials are needed and whether any special equipment is needed.

All dates for packing, pickup and delivery are finalized be-

tween the service member and the assigned TSP.


9) KEEP RECORDS — Keep all hard copy and electronic records of your move details. The more information you keep, the better. Consider taking pictures of documents with your phone as a back-up reference. Email yourself reminders and notes regarding specifics to help you remember things down the road.

10) UNDERSTAND – Know that minimum transit times for moves are determined by the Defense Travel Regulation. For example, on domestic shipments moving companies are given a minimum of 14-20 days to drive from the East Coast to the West Coast, depending on the weight of the shipment and the start and end locations. International transit times can be anywhere from 30-90 days, depending on the start and end

Of note, you should schedule separate days for each separate move. If multiple carriers are scheduled for the same day, there can be confusion on what items go with which shipment and you could be charged for an attempted pickup or waiting time as the carrier waits for the previous carrier to depart

### **NAVY APPROVES MORE TUITION ASSISTANCE** SEMESTER HOURS AND RAISES FUNDING CAP

#### WASHINGTON

The Navy announced changes to Tuition Assistance (TA) program May 21 in NAVADMIN 127/18, lifting the fiscal year limit of 16 semester hours (or equivalent) and allowing Sailors to use TA up to the Department of Defense's (DOD) fiscal year funding cap of \$4,500, effective June 1, 2018.

These changes are designed to expand Sailors' professional development opportunities, enhance degree completion and support Sailor 2025 initiatives to retain the best and brightest Level Exam Program (CLEP) and DSST® exams offered through the Defense Activity for

TA will continue to be paid up to the current DOD limits of \$250 per semester hour, \$166.67 per quarter hour, or \$16.67 per clock hour. Tuition exceeding these limits, in addition to fees, books, and instructional materials, will continue to be the Sailor's responsibility.

Education counselors at the Navy College Virtual Education Center (NCVEC) and overseas Navy College Offices are available to discuss Sailors' goals and to help maximize their TA benefits.

The requirement that Sailors attain a "C" or better for undergraduate courses and a "B" or better for graduate courses remains in effect. Reimbursement will be required from those not attaining these grades.

Sailors who have already reached the former fiscal year limit and have paid for courses using other benefits or their own funds are not eligible for any type of refund or retroactive payment. They may, however, have additional courses funded up to new funding cap.

Sailors are encouraged to review their education plans to take full advantage of this expanded TA authority as well as other opportunities to earn college credit, such as College Non-Traditional Education Services (DANTES), which can further stretch their TA dollars.

bonds and friendships between the U.S. and French sailors, which consequently, was an essential component for such success during this underway."

Chesapeake 2018 provided invaluable training between the U.S. and French carrier strike groups as 301 French sailors embarked onboard USS George H. W. Bush to maintain naval aviation proficiency and develop their expertise for real-world multi-national opera-

The exercise presented multiple combat scenarios including cyclic flight operations and combat search-and-rescues. During the exercise participants completed 458 sorties and 752 traps, resulting in 724.5 flight hours.

One of the highlights during the event was the arrival of the highest-ranking officers from each navy, Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Adm. John Richardson and the Chief of Staff of the French navy Adm. Christophe French navy's engagement stranded Corn-Prazuck.

"The relationships being built during this exercise will matter when it comes time to operate together in combat conditions," said Richardson.

During the exercise, more than 180 training evolutions and missions were accomplished onboard the ship, demonstrating the cooperation and interoperability of both navies.

Exercises like Chesapeake 2018 allow participants to develop their expertise and demonstrate current capabilities for real-world multi-national operations with NATO partners to achieve success in carrier strike group operations. Last month, both navies conducted air strikes on Syrian chemical weapons infrastructures, and in June 2016, Adm. Richardson presented the Charles De Gaulle (R-91) with a U.S. Meritorious Unit Commendation for their success of being the only non-U.S Navy entity to take command of U.S. Naval Forces Central Command's Task Force 50 during Operation Inherent Resolve.

Chesapeake 2018 is named for the historic battle of Chesapeake during the Revolutionary War during which French naval ships cut off British supply lines to General Charles Cornwallis' army in Yorktown, Virginia. The wallis' army, and less than eight weeks later

Based on the strict operational rotation, the age of the fleet and the need for Tridents to operate for long periods of time without outside support, their maintenance requirements in-

crease and the time they spend at NRMD-KB becomes even more important.

"Currently we are cycling through extended availabilities that will continue for the next few years and it is extremely important that the ships get out on time to support their mission,"

To ensure the work is done on time, on budget, and with first time quality, NRMD-KB is hiring skilled instructors, test mechanics, physical science technicians, marine machinery mechanics, pipefitters, painters, and nuclear engineers.

"The ships could come in at a moment's notice and we have to be ready to support because our core group of mechanics is small and they require more qualifications than the standard mechanic at NNSY," said Stanton. "These positions are critical to support the fleet all day, every day, and we don't have time to wait for subject matter experts to travel all the way down from

All 133 of U.S. Cyber Command's cyber mission force teams achieved full operational capability, Cyber Command officials announced today.

Having Cyber Command achieve full operational capability early is a testament to the commitment of the military services toward ensuring the nation's cyber force is fully trained and equipped to defend the nation in cyberspace.

To reach full operational capability, teams met a rigorous set of criteria, including an approved concept of operation and a high percentage of trained, qualified and certified personnel. As part of the certification process, teams had to show they could perform their mission under stress in simulated, realworld conditions as part of specialized training

"I'm proud of these service men and women for their commitment to developing the skills and capabilities necessary to defend our networks and deliver cyberspace operational capabilities to the nation," said Army Gen. Paul M. Nakasone, Cyber Command's commander.

Cyber Command's leaders emphasize that while this is an important milestone, more work remains. Now, the focus will shift toward readiness to perform the mission and deliver optimized mission outcomes, continuously.

"As the build of the cyber mission force wraps up, we're quickly shifting gears from force generation to sustainable readiness," Nakasone said. "We must ensure we have the platforms, capabilities and authorities ready and available to generate cyberspace outcomes when needed."

The cyber mission force has been building capability and capacity since 2013, when the force structure was developed and the services began to field and train the force of over 6,200 Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines and civilians.

### **AUTONOMOUS HELICOPTER TECHNOLOGY WINS ANOTHER MAJOR AWARD**

Yesterday, a revolutionary advance in autonomous flight capability was recognized with one of the nation's top innovation awards.

The Howard Hughes Award-given by the American Helicopter Societywas presented to the Office of Naval Research (ONR) and Aurora Flight Sciences for their joint work on the Autonomous Aerial Cargo Utility System, or AACUS. AACUS allows any rotary-wing aircraft to fly completely autonomously and enables mission success even in austere environments.

"The team is honored to be recognized for our work," said Dr. Knox Millsaps, head of ONR's Naval Air Warfare and Weapons Department. "But we'll know if our work has been a real success if it can keep even one more warfighter safe and out of harm's way during a resupply mission-that's our true measure of success."

AACUS is a package of sensors and software that can be integrated into rotary-wing aircraft to provide safe, reliable and rapid delivery of cargo to Marines in the field using autonomous capabilities. These capabilities include flight, route planning, obstacle avoidance, landing selection-even on unprepared fields-and takeoffs.

Designed for simple use, AACUS employs an intuitive handheld tablet that allows a Marine in the field to call up needed supplies very quickly and

That capability was on display in December 2017 when AACUS successfully completed its final demonstration at the Urban Training Center at Marine Corps Base Quantico, Virginia. A highlight of the demonstration included a Marine requesting an autonomous resupply after only 15 minutes

"The AACUS technology provides a revolutionary way to re-supply our forces in the field," said Millsaps. "It could simplify the logistics train for supplying critical warfighting cargo to forward-deployed troops, and do this in a more economical manner without placing human pilots at risk in highthreat environments."

AACUS has won and been nominated for other high-profile awards as well. In addition to receiving the Howard Hughes Award, the technology was a finalist for the recent National Aeronautic Association's 2017 Robert J. Collier Trophy.

Earlier this month, the program received the XCELLENCE Award in the category of "Detect and Avoid" from the Association for Unmanned Vehicles Systems International.

AACUS was developed under an ONR Innovative Naval Prototype program in partnership with technology company Aurora Flight Sciences. The program is now with the Marine Corps for further experimentation and de-

### **NAVSEA** leadership says high-velocity learning key to expanding advantage

#### WASHINGTON

The two top leaders of Naval Sea Systems Command (NAVSEA) bookended the first high-velocity learning (HVL) summit to show their commitment to HVL, one of the pillars of the NAVSEA Campaign Plan to Expand the Advantage.

Jim Smerchansky, executive director for NAVSEA, opened the HVL summit at Naval Surface Warfare Center (NSWC), Carderock Division in west Bethesda, Maryland, May 15-16. NAVSEA Commander, Vice Adm. Thomas Moore, closed the event which brought representatives of NAVSEA commands together to discuss HVL tools, successes and opportunities.

With similar messages about the importance of high-velocity learning, both men described the need to increase the United States' capabilities over its adversaries. The country is in an era of great power competition, namely with Russia and China, and according to both Smerchansky and Moore, NAV-SEA's vision to "expand the advantage" means contributing to the overall effort of the secretary of defense's National Defense Strategy to broaden that capability gap.

"High-velocity learning is about mission accomplishment," Smerchansky said. "Our obligation, our mission to the Navy and the nation is to deliver and provide warfighting systems and ships to the men and women of the country to never allow them to be in a fair fight. Our obligation to our workforce is to provide meaningful work and the right tools they need to

Each of the speakers took questions from the audience, many of which concerned the loss of knowledge expected as more experienced employees retire.


In response to one such question, Smerchansky said instead of thinking of it as a transfer of knowledge to the next generation, people should consider a transfer of experience, meaning the more senior employees need to start turning their work over to the junior employees, allowing them to gain the experience necessary to work through problems.

"High-velocity learning can go right to the heart of that," Smerchansky said. "This is the generation coming up that has to be able to look right; they have to count on the 75,000 people [within NAVSEA] to be part of their network to help them be successful."

The idea of high-velocity learning originated from the book, "The High-Velocity Edge," by Steven Spear. Chief of Naval Operations, Adm. John Richardson, adopted HVL as something every level of the organization should be achieving, as laid out in his "Design for Maintaining Maritime Su-

High-velocity learning can be explained with the four "S's": see, swarm/solve, share and sustain. "swarm." NAVSEA's PMS 391 (Team Subs) identified three working on this; it has to become second nature." challenges they have, specifically in modernization, acquisition and maintenance.

"We use these philosophies in hopes of becoming a true learning organization," said Jana Patterson, a senior acquisition product engineer for Team Subs. "We are trying to figure out how to not only increase the throughput of modernization, but to improve upon our maintenance situation, the processes already in place."

Patterson said the knowledge is at the waterfront with the people actually turning wrenches or ordering parts, and the people in service support, like her, need to hear from them.

"We are looking for ideas on how to empower that level of personnel out at the shipyards, whether they be private or government, to identify issues," Patterson said.

The attendees split into three groups and spent about 45 minutes brainstorming the issues presented by Team Subs, working towards possible solutions, which is precisely what "swarming" is. They then came back together to share their results. Even though most of the people in the groups did not work in the submarine world, it was their own experiences that led to the possible solutions.

Patterson came away with several ideas, which she said she will take back to her work environment and see if there are opportunities to incorporate some of the possible solutions.

The idea of HVL is not only improving processes by seeing the problems and swarming them for solutions, but it's also about sharing across the enterprise so the workforce is working smarter and continuing to expand the advantage.

"If you can't spend a little bit of time doing strategic planning, high-velocity planning on what the future workforce needs to look like, then we are kind of doomed to do what we've been doing over and over again," said Don McCormack, executive director for NSWC and Naval Undersea

One of the common themes at the summit was communica-

knowledging that sharing is going to naturally be the hardest part about HVL. "But if we really want to be a high-velocity learning organization, we have to be able to communicate and get it down to where it's culturally important for us to be



Moore challenged the summit attendees to take the principles of high-velocity learning to the next level and find a way to get them ingrained into the culture, so that everybody is thinking about HVL.

"The high-velocity learning piece is probably the most key element to eventually getting to the vision to expanding the advantage," Moore said.



### **PACIFIC** PARTNERSHIP 2018 KICKS-OFF IN THAILAND FOR **FIRST TIME**

#### PATTAYA, THAILAND

Pacific Partnership 2018, the largest annual multilateral humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HA/DR) preparedness mission, kicked off aboard the expeditionary fast transport ship USNS Brunswick (T-EPF-6) in Pattaya, Thailand, May 20.

This will be the first time Thailand hosts Pacific Partnership since the exercise series' first iteration in 2006. Over 130 military personnel from the U.S., United Kingdom and Australia will conduct medical, dental and veterinary subject matter expert exchanges at the Queen Sirikit Naval Hospital while working side-by-side with local professionals and non-governmental organizations on HA/DR readiness.

The medical team will share knowledge and experiences on topics ranging from obstetric trauma emergencies, rheumatology and pediatric trauma to nursing care and veterinary education. The civil affairs team from the U.S. Army 83rd Civil Affairs Battalion will be conducting a joint symposium and tabletop exercise with Royal Thai Armed Forces counterparts to practice disaster response and preparedness.

"We are here because, like our U.S. colleagues, we are committed to increasing multilateral cooperation and partnership across the region," said Royal Navy Capt. Peter Olive, Deputy Mission Commander of Pacific Partnership 2018. "Working together with you, our gracious hosts, we therefore hope to build mutual understanding of how better to respond to natural disasters in the future."

Thailand is considered U.S.' oldest regional ally as both U.S. and Royal Thai Armed Forces continue to conduct increasingly sophisticated annual engagements including the Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training (CARAT) exercise which began in 1995, Southeast Asia Cooperation and Training (SEACAT) involving more than a dozen nations and Cobra Gold, Asia-Pacific's largest multinational exercise.

tsunami that devastated parts of Southeast Asia. By building on the region's shared goal to strengthen national capacities and preparedness for disaster response, 22 partner nations around the globe in 18 host nations in the region have participated since 2006.

Brunswick has visited Yap, Palau, Malaysia and Singapore as part of the Pacific Partnership 2018 mission to develop sustainable projects on a range of topics that enable critical infrastructure development across the region. So far, the crew have conducted over 100 medical engagements and subject matter expert exchanges, and nearly 20 engineering projects and 100 community relations and band performances.

"Pacific Partnership 2018 will enhance interoperability for quick response of unexpected disasters," said Suthon. "This exercise will be long lasting in our memories."

to civilian life," Harris said. "We want to install a housing group to capture the very early stages of a Sailors career, because they will be a veteran at some point. For example, if you are an aircraft mechanic and you want to get an Airframe and Power plant license a Sailor would have to have all their hours logged during their time in the Navy so that they can use that time in earning a license."

Harris began the day meeting with TSC's command leadership followed by a tour of the student indoctrination's Life Skills training. Sailors arriving from boot camp attend the training before any rate-specific courses. Subjects taught in the course cover sexual assault intervention, military pay and entitlements, healthy relationships, navigating stress, operations security, banking and financial management service, and responsible alcohol use.

"During today's visit to TSC by Mr. Harris, we wanted to demonstrate how we conduct training and develop today's Sailors," said Capt. Mark Meskimen, commanding officer of TSC Great Lakes. "Visits like this one today are crucial to the Navy's overall mission. They provide us the opportunity to showcase the premier training that we provide to these Sailors, preparing them personally and professionally for their next assignment at sea, and throughout their career both in and outside of the Navy."

At Surface Warfare Officers School Unit (SWOSU) Great Lakes, command leadership led a tour of the training facilities of Basic Engineering Common Core (BECC).

BECC is a 13-day course where students learn engineering principals and theory. It balances Computer Based Training (CBT) with hands-on labs and instructor-led classroom training. They also visited the Shift, Inspect, Clean, Lube oil Strainers Lab, Purifier Lab and LPD 17 Maintainer Course, where students gain knowledge and skills to maintain engineering control systems in the fleet.

The tour also included a stop at the Center for Surface Combat Systems Unit (CSCSU) Great Lakes, where Harris observed the Fire Arms Training Simulator, Electronics Technician/Fire Controlman 'A' school T1 RADAR partial task trainer, and Boatswain's

Mate 'A' School.

"What I saw today was really neat," Harris said. "Everything on the tour today is very useful in giving us better understanding and ideas in continuing our project at the Office of the Secretary of Defense. I was impressed with the virtual reality CBTs used to teach engineman prior to actually touching the engine. This gives Sailors better training and confidence in what they do moving forward."

Event featured on Travel Channel's Expedition Unknown and Named One of the Top Five Pirate Festivals in North America by USA Today Travel celebrates demise of most daunting colonial pirate in three-day event; Prepare to Walk the Plank!

### From Hampton CVB

Hampton, VA- Pillage and plunder your way through the coastal seaport city of Hampton, Virginia this June 1-3 when the 19th annual Hampton Blackbeard Pirate Festival returns for another year of swashbuckling excitement! Featured on the October 21, 2015 episode of the Travel Channel's Expedition Unknown entitled Blackbeard's Hidden Gold and named one of the Top Five Pirate Festivals in North America by USA Today Travel, the festival celebrates Hampton's rich maritime heritage by commemorating the 300th AN-NIVERSARY of the demise of our most infamous visitor. Captain Edward Teach, a.k.a. Blackbeard the Pirate.

During the later part of the 1600's and early 1700's, pirates roamed the coastal waters of Virginia and North Carolina in search of ships laden with tobacco and other goods. The marauders terrorized waterways and unsuspecting cargo ships, capturing goods, sailors and ships. Captain Edward Teach, better known as Blackbeard the Pirate, was the most daunting of these menacing outlaws.

After years of wreaking havoc on Virginia's shores and

economy, Blackbeard's life was finally taken in a violent sea battle with Lieutenant Robert Maynard in 1718. His severed head was impaled upon a pole near the mouth of Hampton Creek, now known as Blackbeard's Point, to serve as an unyielding reminder that piracy would not be tolerated in Virginia.

Three-hundred years later, beginning June 2, roughly 50,000 seafaring attendees, as well as Blackbeard and his crew, will once again invade downtown Hampton during Blackbeard (personified by first-person interpreter Ben sure chest. Cherry) and more than 300 other authentically costumed pirate re-enactors as they run rampant on the streets of America's oldest continuous English-speaking settlement.

The festivities kick off Friday night, June 1, 7:30 p.m. – 10:30 p.m., at the Historic Post Office in downtown Hampton with the 19thannual Grand Pirates Bash (creative black tie, period attire or Pirate fantasy). The celebration, a recreation of Blackbeard's Party at Okracoke, will feature a bounty of food, adult beverages, live music Rusty Cutlass

(one of the world's most notorious pirate bands), and more. Saturday's activities include a swarm of extemporized street skirmishes between pirates and militia (costumed interpreters), a replica of Blackbeard's pirate camp, complete with living history interpreters teaching the skills of the sailor circa 1700, and the trial and escape of William Howard, one of Blackbeard's fellow pirates with ties to Hampton. Don't miss the exhilarating re-enactment of the classic sea battle between Lt. Maynard and Blackbeard, featuring two full — scale replica vessels in the Hampton Harbor. At the conclusion of the sea battle a presentation ceremony takes place in which Blackbeard's severed head will be bestowed upon Virginia Governor Alexander Spotswood (1710-1722). Visitors can participate in the festivities when they join Blackbeard's funeral procession, Hampton's own the 19th annual Blackbeard Pirate Festival! Interact with version of Mardi Gras, and share in the booty from the trea-

This year, the Hampton Blackbeard Pirate Festival welcomes three tall ships to the downtown docks: MEKA II, Macnab, and Tall Ship Adventure. Based in Beaufort, NC MEKA II has an overall length of 54' and is a 2/3 — scale replica of an 17th Century, two masted pirate brigantine armed with 8 cannons. Her homeport is Beaufort, North Carolina where locals and tourist take pride in her ongoing

### **WWE SUPERSTARS TO** PERFORM IN HAMPTON **DURING MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND**

The Superstars of the World Wrestling Entertainment's (WWE) Monday Night Raw brand will make a stop at the Hampton Coliseum on Sunday, May 27. The non-televised event will feature WWE Intercontinental Champion Seth Rollins, Braun Strowman, WWE Women's Champion Nia Jax, and other Superstars that you can watch on the USA Network every Monday night. The past couple of months have been filled with historic events for WWE. Only a few weeks removed from WrestleMania 34 taking over the city of New Orleans, WWE presented The Greatest Royal Rumble in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. 

Brand new this year is Tall Ship Adventure, Hampton's very own character vessel! 



# THE BENEFITS OF CHILD'S PLAY EXTEND BEYOND EXERCISE

When you think about the most important part of a child's school day, what comes to mind? Is it reading? Science? Math or history? What about recess?

Children will likely mention recess as their favorite part of the day, and new research shows that this free time is actually a fundamental component to their future development and host

Yet, if there are such benefits for children in recess and unstructured play, why are school districts everywhere reducing it?

More than just exercise

to numerous educational opportunities.

Researchers for years have hypothesized about the link between the reduction in free play and the rise of childhood obesity, but new research also indicates a link between children's ability to engage in free play and their overall development.

A recent meta-study by the University of Minnesota's Institute of Child Development, commissioned by Landscape Structures Inc., finds that "children's early experiences and the settings they inhabit play a powerful role in shaping the adults they will become." The metastudy also finds that unstructured play provides children the opportunity to practice key social, cognitive and physical skills.

The research draws from a wide body of social scientific analyses, case studies and examinations of play and playground behavior. Educators, child psychologists, playground designers and the American Academy of Pediatrics all contributed to the report.

The findings show that when left in unstructured play, children spend roughly 80 percent of their time on the playground engaging in important activities such as social, physical and pretend play. Any or all of these activities have been shown to further a child's future devel-

Well-designed playgrounds have proven to be a uniquely flexible play setting with equipment Landscape Structures' research findings show children actively learn while in play and that that supports social and imaginative play while also supporting children with diverse needs the skills they learn here cater to their continual development. stairs while older children will set their sights on the taller portions of the structure.

However, at the same time that the benefits of unstructured play are being expounded, the research shows the time spent in open play is under attack.

Threats to play come from myriad sources, including restrictive school and work schedules, safety concerns, organized after-school activities and the rise of passive entertainment options including television and video games. These factors combined are seen as the key reasons children's unstructured play has dropped by 25 percent since 1981.

Pushing back for play

While the importance of classroom lesson plans can never be discounted in a child's edu-The manner in which playtime is spent is nearly as important as the amount of time spent. cational path, the opportunity for recess and open play should not be seen only as a break.



### 4 COMMON **MISTAKES KEEPING** YOU FROM A GOOD **NIGHT'S SLEEP**

Do you wake up in the morning feeling tired, even if you went to bed early? Do you struggle to feel well rested? Is it difficult to fall asleep or stay asleep all night? You're not

Healthy adults generally need 7 to 9 hours of sleep each night, although sleep quality is just as important as sleep quantity. If your sleep is frequently interrupted, you're not getting quality sleep. This can have a tremendous effect on your mental and physical health.

To get a good night's rest, there are many things that often get overlooked. Mayo Clinic health experts weigh in on four of the most common mistakes that keep people from a good

#### night's rest. 1. Ignoring sleep hygiene

Sleep hygiene refers to your sleep lifestyle and the choices you make that either facilitate or restrict quality rest. Common lifestyle mistakes that often inhibit sleep include eating heavy meals before bed or drinking caffeine too late in the day. Additionally, establishing a sleep routine is essential for telling your mind and body it's time to rest. This includes going to bed at the same time each night and minimizing exposure to light at bedtime, especially the glow coming off your favorite technology. Turn off media 30 minutes to an hour before bed so you can wind down and settle in.

### 2. Causes of insomnia

Insomnia is defined as having problems getting to sleep or staying asleep three nights a week or more for at least three months. Some insomnia is due to medical issues, such as restless leg syndrome and sleep apnea. Once medical causes are ruled out, it's important to look at habits that might be facilitating insomnia. One common mistake is people spend too much time doing things other than sleep in the bedroom. If you get into bed and don't fall asleep within 20 minutes, get up and go to another room. When your eyes get heavy and

your head starts to bob, get back into bed. This trains your noon nap. Chance are, you don't sleep well again and do the brain to associate bed with sleep.

### 3. Overusing sleep aids

Many people reach for sleep aids to get a good night's rest, but doing so regularly is not recommended. Most over-thecounter sleep aids contain antihistamines, and people often build a tolerance to them. That means they lose their effectiveness the longer you take them. What's more, OTC sleep aids often leave you feeling groggy in the morning as your body attempts to wake from the sleep hangover. They do not provide the feeling of restorative sleep that most people want

### 4. Taking naps

If you don't sleep well, you may decide to take an after-

same thing the next day. It can be an endless cycle. Long daytime naps can interfere with nighttime sleep. If you choose to nap, limit yourself to up to 30 minutes and avoid doing so late in the day (try right after lunch, for example). Instead of napping, do some physical activity. It can help energize your body and will tire you for later in the day. The only consideration is to avoid exercising too late in the day as it can wake your body and make it difficult to fall asleep.


