The new program increases parental leave and combines the current family leave policies into one. PROFILE OF **DEDICATION:** ROBERT **DAVIS**

PORTSMOUTH, VA.

As a retired United States Navy Medical Service Corps officer of 20 years, Robert Davis spent most of his active duty career in blood banking. On May 23, Davis achieved an incredible personal milestone: his 100th platelet donation, supporting the Armed Service Blood Program's mission of keeping a supply of blood products available to those in need.

Davis explained that his passion for frequently donating platelets was because he saw its critical need on a daily basis while on active duty. On his 100th donation, he related it back to his reason for giving with, "Simply because of need."

Platelets are the natural clotting factor in one's blood system and platelet donations are used for both adults and pre-natal infants in order to save their lives. However, platelets have a short shelf-life. They are only good for five days, and after their required testing to ensure safe usage for hospital patients, that shelf life decreases to less than four days. Consequentially, it is ever important that people donate platelets when


Davis received his Master's Degree in Blood Banking from Bowling Green University (now George Washington University) in Washington D.C. in 2000. He is currently employed at Naval Medical Center Portsmouth in the blood bank donor operations department for quality control and validations for the blood bank. He enjoys motorcycle riding, fencing and cowboy action firearms. He has two sons, Isaac, 24 and Sam, 21.

Davis said that he would encourage all platelet donors to accomplish donating milestones, to the best of their ability. He added that others should be supportive of these generous donors and should try donating blood or platelets, if they can.

"The need for platelet donations is always there," said Davis about the Armed Services Blood Program.

Since 1962, the Armed Services Blood Program has served as the sole provider of blood for the United States military. As a tri-service organization, the ASBP collects, processes, stores and distributes blood and blood products to soldiers, Sailors, airmen, Marines and their families worldwide. As one of four national blood collection organizations trusted to ensure the nation has a safe, potent blood supply, the ASBP works closely with our civilian counterparts by sharing donors on military installations where there are no military collection centers and by sharing blood products in times of need to maximize availability of this national treasure.

Naval Station (NAVSTA) Norfolk received the Hampton Roads Sanitation District (HRSD) Gold Award at the HRSD 25th Annual Awards Ceremony, June 14.

"NAVSTA Norfolk received its third consecutive Gold Achievement Award this year," said Mr. Dustin Wheeler, Naval Facilities Engineering Command Mid-Atlantic Region's Water Program Media Manager. "Three consecutive years of perfect permit compliance is a testimony to all the hard work from the installation, Public Works Department (PWD) staff, as well as the tenant commands."

Each year, HRSD honors businesses and industries for outstanding pollution prevention (P2) measures. P2 awards are presented for multi-media efforts that focus on reduction of waste at the source rather than traditional treatment, control, and disposal. HRSD also recognizes Pretreatment Excellence award winners for exemplary permit compliance.

To protect the environment and local facilities, HRSD issues permits and monitors wastewater discharged from businesses and industries. These businesses pretreat their industrial wastewater before discharging it to HRSD's system, protecting waterways and other natural resources. The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency recognized HRSD's pretreatment program as one of the Nation's best.

The Gold Achievement Award signifies perfect permit compliance throughout the year. The award categories are as follows: Gold- At least one-year perfect permit compliance, Platinum- Five to nine consecutive years of perfect permit compliance, Diamond-Ten or more consecutive years of perfect permit compliance

"This award is representative of those investing time, re-

sources and environmental concern, and going above and local laws. PWD staff work with the operators and tenant beyond what is expected," said Capt. Rich McDaniel, Naval Station Norfolk Commanding Officer. "We have an excellent partnership with HRSD and they have worked with us for many years to ensure that our mission improves the environment and quality of life onboard NAVSTA Norfolk. I am very proud of our Environmental team and all of the individuals who made this achievement possible."

NAVSTA Norfolk holds an industrial wastewater permit with HRSD and is considered a significant industrial user. The industrial wastewater permit authorizes discharges from industrial operations in accordance with federal, state, and

commands to ensure industrial operations and associated discharges are in compliance with the installation's permit and regulations. PWD staff, HRSD staff, and tenant commands work collaboratively throughout from properly designing a wastewater and pretreatment system to constructing and operating a system that meets the mission's needs. The installation staff also provides routine preventative maintenance as well as training for system operation and environmental

Spring has sprung, weather has begun

With warmer weather comes an increase in motorcyclists hitting the road, often catching drivers by surprise.

The American Motorcyclist Association (AMA), National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF), and the Naval Safety Center are encouraging all motorists to share the road and watch for motorcyclists.

Motorcycles are some of the smallest vehicles on our roads and are frequently hidden in a vehicle's blind spot or blending with traffic. Drivers can successfully interact with motorcyclists by being alert and taking extra time to look twice for motorcyclists. The majority of multi-vehicle motorcycle crashes are generally caused when other drivers don't see the

Service members should also be aware of the risks associated with riding a motorcycle. Always make yourself as visible as possible, stay out of blind spots, use DOT-compliant motorcycle helmets, and stay vigilant.

According to NHTSA data, in 2016 there were 5,286 motorcyclists killed in motor vehicle crashes in the United States, 12 of whom were Navy Sailors. While the national numbers have not been released for 2017, the Navy recorded that 21 Sailors died in motorcycle crashes during fiscal year

TIPS FOR SAFER ROADS

- Drivers should never try to share a lane with a motorcycle. Always give a motorcycle the full lane's width.
- Motorcyclists should practice operational risk management and never split or share a lane with a motor vehicle.
- Motorcyclists should avoid riding in poor weather, but sometimes it occurs unexpectedly. All motorists should take extra care and be more observant during periods of inclement
- Use your vehicle's rear-view and side-view mirrors properly to help eliminate blind spots where small vehicles





This will ultimately speed up production, maintenance and supply of parts by integrating AM throughout all phases of the acquisition cycle while also relieving an ongoing issue that supply planners are currently experiencing across the NAVSUP enterprise.

"AM could bring about revolutionary changes to naval supply support, with an associated paradigm shift from the current order and stocking system to implementation of just-intime inventory," said Capt. Armen Kurdian, NAVSUP WSS director of Engineering and Product Support, who has been

leading the working group to develop the guidebook. "It has the potential to evolve how we support the warfighter tremendously."

NAVSUP WSS is steaming ahead with the development of a comprehensive contracting guide by collaborating with other Department of Defense agencies that have started to develop additive manufactured parts, such as Naval Air Systems Command, Naval Sea Systems Command, Naval Facilities Engineering Command and the Office of Naval Research, plus Air Force, Army, General Services Administration, and Defense Logistics Agency to consolidate best practices and acquisition roles into one document.





Despite suffering serious injuries from an attack by a member of the Afghan security forces in 2014, Navy Master Chief Petty Officer Reina Hockenberry was determined to avoid a medical retirement and stay on active duty.

And not only is Hockenberry today serving on the guided missile cruiser USS Port Royal in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, the sailor just garnered eight gold medals from her participation early this month in the 2018 Department of Defense Warrior Games in Colorado, competing in rowing, powerlifting, swimming and cycling. In late October, she also will compete in those four events at the Invictus Games in Sydney.

Vice Chief of Naval Operations (VCNO) Adm. Bill Moran visited Naval Education and Training Command (NETC) to discuss developments with Ready, Relevant Learning (RRL),

RRL is a pillar of the Navy's Sailor 2025 initiative, with an overarching goal to provide Sailors the right training at the right time and in the right way. The new training model will eliminate the current practice of front-loading training at the very beginning of a Sailor's career by providing incremental training, or Block Learning, across a career-long learning continuum that delivers the training closer to when a Sailor is expected to perform the specific work.

"This isn't clicking through slides. With Ready Relevant Learning, our Sailors will learn the things they need to know in smaller, but effective and more frequent doses, and ultimately they will get that training right on the waterfront," Moran said. "We are already seeing success with this approach in our LCS training facilities and in some of our submarine training systems. Additionally, with modern training applications, training will be tailored to the strengths and weaknesses of each Sailor rather than having to repeat things they do well, while getting less time on things where they need practice."


Almost 5,400 fleet Sailors have completed Block 0, which is initial technical training, and now the first phase of their learning continuum. The first batch of Block Learning was delivered by Naval Technical Training Center in Meridian, Mississippi, to new-accession logistics specialists in April 2017. Almost 250 Sailors are within six months of their Block 1 window, where they will gain the next level of skillsets to prepare them for the next stage of their ca-

Emory thought he was visiting the site of where his beloved USS Honolulu (CL 48) was berthed Dec. 7, 1941. On his way down the pier toward the Honolulu's commemorative marker, Emory, riding in an open-air golf-cart-style vehicle, was treated to an honor cordon of 520 Sailors.

Sailors lined the rails on three nearby ships. USS O'Kane rendered three cheers, and chief petty officers shouted the "Navy Chief, Navy Pride" chant as Emory, followed by several family members and close friends, approached.







USS Nimitz (CVN 68) has completed 28 deployments, over a quarter of a million catapult launches and arrested landings, five homeport changes, and countless operations and missions successfully executed. These accolades are attributed to the oldest U.S. Navy aircraft carrier in active service.

The decorated history of Nimitz began 50 years ago this month, when the keel was laid on June 22, 1968.

This was a plan set in motion long ago when, after the successful implementation of the first nuclear powered aircraft carrier USS Enterprise (CVN 65), the Navy recognized the need to expand its projection and influence and create an en-

tire class of aircraft carriers powered by nuclear reactors.

Nimitz's story began when congress authorized the construction during fiscal year 1967, and negotiated a contract with Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Co., in Newport News, Virginia, to begin building the following year.

The ship was christened May 13, 1972, by the late Fleet Adm. Nimitz's daughter Catherine, and commissioned May 3, 1975, by President Gerald R. Ford at its first homeport at Naval Station Norfolk.

The namesake of the Nimitz-class, this state-of-the-art warship boasts a 100,000 ton displacement, is 1,092 feet long and has a compliment of 5,000 Sailors and Marines onboard. The ship is powered by two nuclear power plants providing steam powered propulsion to four engines with more than 250,000 horsepower. There are also four catapults and four arresting wires, the capability of serving 18,000 meals per day, and four distilling units making more than 400,000 gallons of fresh water daily.

Since being commissioned into active service, Nimitz has spent years out to sea and has been an instrumental part of the success and longevity of the Navy's mission. Its 28 deployments have been an essential aspect in supporting peace, security, and prosperity throughout the oceans of the world, with its latest deployment concluding December of 2017.

Throughout its time, tens of thousands of Sailors have spent formative years of their naval careers as Nimitz crewmembers, some having completed multiple tours onboard. Cmdr. Chuck Jones, from LaCenter, Washington, is currently on his third Nimitz tour. He served as a chief electricians mate and leading chief petty officer of a division in reactor department from 1995 to 1997. On his second tour, from 2010 until 2013, he was a lieutenant commander serving as the ship's maintenance manager. His current tour began in April 2017, and he serves as the ship's chief engineer.

He recognizes the importance of perpetuating the proud history and heritage of the ship the crew calls home.

"It's a big deal for a ship to reach close to 50 years and have people say she looks like she can do many more. We have done a very good job of taking care of her over the years," Jones said.

Another group of people with special ties to Nimitz are Sailors who were part of the first crew upon the ship's commissioning. These Sailors, known as "plankowners," have the distinction of being the first crew to take a newly commissioned ship out to sea. Scott Telecky, from Wenatchee, Washington, is one such Sailor. Telecky served as an electronics technician first class onboard Nimitz from 1975 until 1978, and he looks back on his time on Nimitz with much fondness.

"Being a plankowner creates a special bond with the ship. Watching the president of the United States actually commissioning the ship is a moment I'll always recall with great clarity," he said.

Telecky also warmly spoke about the long-standing friendships he made with his fellow Sailors.

"After 43 years, I still keep in touch with many of my shipmates. The comradery is still there whenever we start reminiscing about the old days. It's a bond we'll always have," he said.

With the coming implementation of the Gerald R. Fordclass of nuclear-powered aircraft carriers, and due to the active service life of a Nimitz-class carrier being 50 years, the legendary career of the USS Nimitz is projected to end in the coming years. However, the legacy of this renowned ship and its monumental achievements over its storied, decades-long career will never be forgotten, and the tradition of teamwork will continue to live on.

Nimitz is conducting a docking planned incremental availability at Puget Sound Naval Shipyard and Intermediate Maintenance Facility where the ship is receiving scheduled maintenance and upgrades.





SECNAV censures three naval officers

WASHINGTON

Secretary of the Navy Richard Spencer has issued Secretarial Letters of Censure to now-retired U.S. Navy Rear Adm. Richard Wren, now-retired U.S. Navy Capt. Timothy Conroy, and U.S. Navy Capt. Charles Johnson, based on findings regarding each of those officers' improper interactions with and acceptance of gifts from Glenn Defense Marine Asia (GDMA), a defense contractor and prohibited source.

Secretary Spencer determined that Rear Adm. (Ret.) Wren, between 2007 and 2010, repeatedly and improperly accepted gifts from Leonard Francis and GDMA, a prohibited source, while serving as Commander, Carrier Strike Group Five (CSG-5) and Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Japan, in the Seventh Fleet area of operations. Secretary Spencer also determined that in 2015, Rear Adm. (Ret.) Wren made a false official statement to mislead investigators about the nature of his relationship with Mr. Francis. Finally, in light of the nature and circumstances of those gifts and his interactions with GDMA/ Mr. Francis, Secretary Spencer also determined that Rear Adm. (Ret.) Wren's personal behavior constituted conduct unbecoming an officer. Rear Adm.(Ret.) Wren retired from the Navy in 2011.

Secretary Spencer determined that Capt. (Ret.) Conroy, over several Department of Justice months in 2008, repeatedly and improperly accepted gifts from GDMA/ his interactions with GDMA, Secretary Spencer also determined that Capt. (Ret.) Conroy's prosecution. personal behavior constituted conduct unbecoming an officer. Capt. (Ret.) Conroy retired from the Navy in 2010.

Secretary Spencer determined that Capt. Johnson, between 2004 and 2010, repeatedly and improperly accepted gifts from Leonard Francis and GDMA, a prohibited source, while serving in a number of leadership positions, in the Seventh Fleet area of operations. In light of the nature and circumstances of those gifts and his interactions with GDMA, Secretary Spencer also determined that Capt. Johnson's personal behavior constituted conduct unbecoming an officer. Finally, Secretary Spencer determined that in 2014, Capt. Johnson made false official statements by failing to disclose his relationship with Mr. Francis when required to do so. Capt. Johnson is currently serving in the Navy on active duty.

The foregoing officers' conduct was examined as part of the joint investigation led by the Department of Justice (DOJ) and reviewed by the Navy Consolidated Disposition Authority (CDA) for GDMA matters. In each case, Secretary Spencer has determined that the officer's conduct was contrary to the Standards of Ethical Conduct, the Joint Ethics Regula-

> tion, U.S. Navy Regulations and the Uniform Code of Military Justice. The laws and standards that these three officers violated represent the ethical rules that bind all federal employees, as well as long-established ethical standards of the naval service.

"It is incumbent that naval officers, particularly those placed in positions of great trust and responsibility, be held to the highest standards of both personal and professional behavior. Rear Adm. (Ret.) Wren, Capt. (Ret.) Conroy and Capt. Johnson, while serving in such positions, each disregarded those standards and engaged in conduct that reflected unethical and improper personal behavior and set poor standards of leadership. Each officer's conduct is an embarrassment to the thousands of officers, Sailors and civilians who do the right thing every day," said Spencer.

GDMA is the subject of an ongoing federal fraud and bribery investigation, which was initiated by the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS). In March 2014, the Secretary of the Navy directed the appointment of a CDA to act as an independent authority to review GDMA matters forwarded by the DOJ to the Department of the Navy after the DOJ has declined to press criminal charges in the federal judicial system. The purpose of the CDA is to review the GDMA-related conduct of Navy members and determine what, if any, disciplinary or administrative actions are warranted and available.

The GDMA investigation continues, led by DOJ and supported by NCIS and Mr. Francis, while serving as the Chief of Staff, Carrier Strike Group Seven (CSG-7), in the DCIS. The African nation officers and enlisted participants are in San Diego to attend the 31st annual Joint Women's Leadership Symposium, June 21-22. Their attendance was coordinated by USAFRICOM's command, control, communications and computer systems directorate. This year's engagement included 14 women military representatives from Angola, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Chad, Ghana, Morocco, Senegal, Sierra Leone and Nigeria.

"USAFRICOM is committed to building partner capacity on the continent of Africa. It is a strategic main effort of our campaign plan," said Army Brig. Gen. Christopher L. Eubank, USAFRICOM director of communication (J6). "USAFRICOM will work by, with and through our partners to create conditions that allow our partners to build capabilities to address the drivers of instability."

As the Navy's information warfare systems command, SPAWAR played a valuable role in the participants' military professional development experience in San Diego.

One of SPAWAR's fundamental efforts is to implement the information warfare platform across the Navy, which integrates individual command, control, communications, computers and intelligence (C4I) capabilities within the fleet. This strengthens combat capabilities by aggregating, fusing and exposing data and services across mission areas to provide actionable knowledge to the Navy and Marine Corps, as well as U.S. coalition partners.

"Our goal was to share with our African nation partners how the Navy trains communicators and delivers essential capability to warfighters," said SPAWAR Commander Rear Admiral Christian Becker. "We provided the attendees a U.S. Navy perspective on the significance of information warfare, with a broad view on the communications profession. It was an honor for SPAWAR to host these extraordinary military leaders from across the African continent."

A key element of the command's engagement with coalition partners is fulfilled by the International C4I Integration Program Office, PMW 740. The program office played the central

to succeed in their first two years aboard. What we have ongoing now is close coordination between their unit training officers and our training support centers to keep these Sailors on track to get the next block of training when they need it, anywhere from 12 to 24 months from their initial report date."

Moran leads the RRL Integration Board, a senior leader forum for the commanders involved in various RRL aspects, such as strategic direction, overseeing implementation, and resourcing requirements. Naval Air Systems Command and Naval Air Warfare Center Training Systems Division acquire the courses and the modernized software and hardware systems, and NETC delivers the training.

Cozad's team provided Moran with an overview of NETC's role in delivering con-

tration areas.

"Block Learning is a transition phase that supports a continuum of career-long learning," said Cozad. "This takes us to the next phase of what we are calling 'modern delivery,' which captures all the aspects of training, whether it's the content itself or the software or hardware component, and delivers that training with the latest, easier to access, ondemand content with the best resources and tools when and where our Sailors need it."

The long-term goal of RRL is to have the ability to reach back to training content and resources through a robust learning management system, while incorporating modern ing for the next generation of training systechnology-based solutions along with more traditional delivery methods, such as instructor-led and laboratory training.

A Navy gas turbine systems technician (electrical) is responsible for the operation, maintenance and repair of propulsion system electrical components on the assault craft. "What I like most about my job is the

Dulski credits success in the Navy to many of the lessons learned in his hometown of Virginia Beach.


Commissioned in 1948, just after World War II, NBG 2 trains and equips military forces for deployment overseas. Sailors with NBG 2 serve a vital role in the Navy our nation needs by ensuring that amphibious operations remain ready to defend and protect

ACU 4 operates landing craft, air cushion (LCAC) vehicles, which are specialized to transport personnel and equipment from surface ships to shore. The LCAC is a high-speed, over-thebeach craft capable of carrying a payload of more than 60 tons. The LCAC can be used to transport weapons systems, cargo and personnel of Marine assault units. Air cushion technology allows the vehicle to reach more than 70 percent of the world's coastline, while only 15 percent of that coastline is accessible by conventional landing craft, according to Navy officials.

The exercises and real-world operations that ACU 4 sailors participate in include evacuation of American citizens from a hostile territory, delivery of food and medical supplies after a natural disaster, and many other tasks that involve movement from ships offshore to the beach, according to Navy

"My favorite part of serving here is that you take ownership of everything, bad or good," said Dulski. "You can put your name on it."

Jobs are highly specialized and keep each part of the command running smoothly, according to Navy officials. The jobs range from operating boats to maintaining engines.

"ACU 4 sailors and craft are the connector and where the rubber meets the sand between the Amphibious Ready Group and the fight," said Capt. Erik Nilsson, ACU 4's commanding officer. While serving in the Navy presents many challenges, Dulski said he has found many great rewards, too.

"The most important lesson the Navy has taught me is that you don't have to be the last one with a secret," said Dulski. "Disseminate the information with your people."
