But if you desire to defend it, if you desire to protect it, if you desire to keep it for civilization, you must do this on the ground the way the Roman legions did: by putting your young men [and women] in the mud."

From individual tasks mastered during Sergeant's Time Training to collective tasks and professional development our unit's continued to increase their knowledge through focused and well-planned training.










