Marne community brightens installation

# Wreath laying to go on, no ceremony slated

Wreaths for Warriors Walk will host the 14th annual wreath laying on Dec. 19 beginning at noon at Cottrell Field on Fort Stewart.

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, this year's event will not feature a formal ceremony and will instead, be a wreath laying event only.

"This will be a wreath laying event only so that we can honor the 469 Soldiers who paid the ultimate sacrifice," said Bruce Muncher, co-founder of Wreaths for Warriors Walk. "Those who wish to participate are welcome to help lay a wreath at the base of one of the white crepe myrtle trees on Warriors Walk in remembrance of the sacrifice these heroes made."

Several Family members of fallen Soldiers will be in attendance to place a wreath on their Soldier's tree. Their loved ones tree will be clearly marked so that a wreath is not placed by someone other than the Family member. Participants are asked to please check the tree before placing a wreath.

Those in attendance are required to wear a mask and adhere to social distancing protocols. Hand sanitizer will be available and disposable masks will be provided.

Motorcycle groups who wish to attend will meet at the Gate 1 visitor center off of General Screven Way at 11 a.m. Motorcycles will then be given an Military Police escort

# STEWART GUARDIAN PUTS GARRISON TO TEST

Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield trusted agents and first responders teamed up with local law enforcement agencies last week as part of an ongoing effort to ensure that the installation is prepared in the event of a crisis.

Stewart Guardian, an annual readiness exercise that takes place on both Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield, allows the installation to test their readiness through various real-world scenarios that involve multiple levels of emergency response and communication.

The scenarios - an active shooter on Fort Stewart and a minor aircraft crash involving a fuel spill on Hunter Army Airfield - were designed to test the memorandums of agreement that have been put in place with off-post agencies who support Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield, such as local law enforcement, fire and SWAT.

"Today we had an active-shooter exercise that took place across the installation," said Lt. Col. Craig Giancaterino, Directorate of Emergency Services and battalion commander for the 385th Military Police Battalion. "These exercises help us test our systems not only in the Directorate of Emergency Services,

but across the garrison. It allows us to involve our local law enforcement partners outside of our community to make sure we have the proper responses in place."

While Stewart Guardian only took place over the span of a couple days, the exercise is part of a larger, ongoing operation to ensure the safety and wellbeing of those who work, live and train on Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield.

"These exercises allow us to verify that our standard operating procedures and plans are in place, ensuring they actually work," said Randall "Mack" McPherson, Installation Security Manager for the Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization and Security. "They also allow us to determine if there are any gaps or holes in those plans and SOPs. If so, we go back to the drawing board and develop procedures and processes to fill them. From there, we test and train the task again to see if the implemented changes worked."

In addition to the Directorate of Emergency Services, on-post directorates identified subject-matter experts from within their agencies to help shape the exercises. These experts were also on hand during the events to evaluate the processes and actions taken during the simulations.

"To accomplish installation valida-





tion, exercises must have a certain level of rigor with triggers for specific tasks leading to expected actions of the players," said Beau Bradley, DPTMS, Plans and Operations division. "This was accomplished through the dedication and commitment of our installation trusted agents. Moving forward, we plan to continue and strengthen these relationships."

The conclusion of the simulation brought to light areas of improvement as well as elements to sustain in the event of a future crisis with the overarching theme being the successful teamwork brought forth by both on- and offpost agencies.

"I want to thank the exercise team and off-post agencies for making these such realistic scenarios," Giancaterino said. "The more realism we add to these scenarios the better we are trained. The more exercises we do, the better trained we get in order to ensure that Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield remain safes places to live, work and train while we protect the Rock of the Marne."

## Range installs support systems to facilitate new marksmanship qualification

The small arms range on Hunter Army Airfield has been fully equipped to facilitate the new Army marksmanship qualification requirements, with 4th Battalion, 3rd Aviation Regiment, 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, having been the first unit to use it Nov. 30 on the installation.

"The new support systems installed on this range are vital to further the Army's initiative to make better marksmen out of our Soldiers," said 1st Lt. Austin Evans, Company D, 4-3 AR executive officer. "For a good majority of our Soldiers, this is the first time they've utilized the support system."

The support system is a simple wooden barricade that can simulate environmental structures, providing a more realistic training experience.

"There is still a learning curve but our

Soldiers are adapting pretty well and they feel like it's very practical and going to enhance their ability to fight in a real world scenario," Evans said.

While providing a more realistic feel to qualifying with a weapon, it is also a functional necessity as the qualification standards now require Soldiers to shoot in the standing, kneeling and prone positions - both supported and unsupported.

"It definitely takes a little more muscle memory to properly transition the magazines in a timely manner and I feel like it's a lot more realistic for us to be shooting standing up," said Sgt. Spencer Moyers, a UH-60 Black Hawk repairer with 4-3 AR. "In real life, you're probably going to be standing pushed up against a wall, so this is definitely beneficial from my perspective."

With 4-3 AR being an aviation unit, the opportunity for Soldiers to spend time with their weapons may not be as frequent as a combat arms unit.

"It's good to utilize the range any time you can because with a lack of practice, it might take you a few extra times to really get it down," Moyer said. "Our main focus daily is maintaining the helicopters and making sure they fly, so being able to walk through the motions, practice proper positioning, trigger squeeze and simply familiarizing yourself with the weapon is important."

While the modernization of the Army is important according to Evans, he says the fundamentals should never be forgotten.

"The main thing with training is the focus on doing things correctly and repeatedly, so we want to make sure our Soldiers have as many opportunities as possible to train and qualify," Evans said.

The requirement may have changed but the score requirements have remained the same in each category.

Soldiers must hit 23 targets out of 40 to qualify with their individual weapon.
