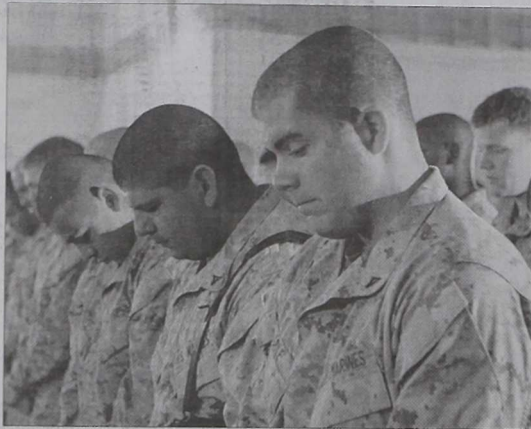


Iraq-deployed Marines remember Kansas, Oklahoma natives killed in action

HADITHA, Iraq — More than a hundred Marines gathered into a makeshift chapel at the forward operating base in the Haditha Dam recently, to honor two Marines who were killed in action May 14.

The Marines, Lance Cpl. Jose S. Marin-Dominguez Jr., 22, from Liberal, Kan., and Lance Cpl. Hatak Yuka Keyu M. Yearby, 21, from Lawton, Okla., were both assigned to the Hawaii-based 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

tags bearing their names, boots, a rifle and a Kevlar helmet — a military representation of the fallen.

Of the battalion's hundreds of Marines and sailors, Lance Cpl. Daniel Dougherty, also from Marietta, Okla., arguably felt Yearby's loss the hardest. The 22-year-old grew up with Yearby and attended elementary and high school

with him. He also encouraged him to join the Marine Corps and was present when he signed the enlistment papers.

"I have known Yearby for 14 years," said Dougherty. "I will never forget him and he is still with me. He will always be with me."

Dougherty said he was able to speak with Yearby's father and plans to visit his

mother and father upon return from Iraq in approximately four months.

"He was the most outgoing Marine I know," said Dougherty. "He was never in a bad mood no matter how bad the situation was and he always managed to cheer everyone up."

Lance Cpl. Antonio Garcia, 22, a native of El Monte, Calif., and one of the battalion's motor transportation operators, said Marin-Dominguez, who also served in Afghanistan during Operation Enduring Freedom, was always "there for the Marines when they needed a friend."

Garcia met Marin-Dominguez shortly after boot camp at Marine Corps Recruit Depot in San Diego. He said Marin-Dominguez had his whole life already planned out. He wanted to retire from the Marine Corps then open a mechanical repair shop in his hometown.

"It is hard to accept that Dominguez is gone," said Garcia. "We talk about him and all the funny things he would say and do. We are going to remember him for how he lived, not how he died."

Yearby's awards include the National Defense

Service medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal.

Marin-Dominguez's awards include the Combat Action Ribbon, the National Defense Service Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism

Service Medal and the Service Ribbon.

The Kaneohe Hawaii-based Marine Corps unit, which deploys to Afghanistan last year, arrived in March. The unit is to rotate back to States in the Fall.

How to prevent swimming, diving hazards

There are certain hazards associated with Swimming and Diving. Marines and sailors alike continue to experience these hazards due to improper risk management. Most recently, a sailor was lost at sea and presumed dead following a snorkeling mishap.

SWIMMING

What are the hazards?

- Sea life (i.e. sharks, jellyfish, water moccasins, etc.)
- Insufficient water depth for diving
- Over estimating your swimming ability

- Strong currents and riptides
- Alcohol
- Swimming alone

SCUBA DIVING

What are the hazards?

- Sea life (Don't zip the snakes!)
- Lack of experience, no certification
- Failure to monitor air supply
- Exceeding safe diving depths
- Not observing decompression procedures
- Faulty equipment, failure to display diving flag
- Diving alone

How can you avoid these hazards?

Operational Risk Management is a far better way of eliminating or reducing the risks than the old way of doing things (i.e. trial and error, sound familiar?) So before you go into the water, use your head and avoid the hazards.

As Marines and sailors, we live by our ethos. So think before you jeopardize the safety of yourself, your fellow Marines, Sailors, civilian employees or family members, and remember Semper Safe!

Capt. Edward Y. Blakiston, A Company's commander, spoke of Marines' reactions when they received the news of the four Marines' deaths. They were resolute, determined, focused and ready to carry out the necessary missions to recover their fellow Marines.

"On the morning of May 11, a giant hole was ripped through the soul of this company," said 33-year-old Blakiston, from Umatilla, Fla. "In one fell swoop, we lost four of our own. It was almost surreal, that morning, as everyone focused on the tasks at hand. As time moves on though, the loss slowly sweeps in. Little everyday events remind us of them and the fact that they are gone, show us how much of our lives they really were."

Blakiston described each Marine saying Vahaviolos and Gramessanchez were "both with the company the most" and "could be trusted to do their parts." Burnett, he said, was "one of the new guys" who was "mature for his age" and a "strong, smart and tough Marine."

LiCalzi, Blakiston said, was "full of life" and a "poster Marine."

"He was a good person, fine officer and great Marine," he added.

"I'm truly impressed with how well the company has pulled together and mended the hole that was created by this tragedy," Blakiston said. "But I know that the scar will always remain — and it is right that it should. It will serve as a constant reminder to us of our fallen brethren and the sacrifice that they have made."

LiCalzi, 24, was from Celebration, Fla., and graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 2004. He completed The Basic School at Quantico, Va., before

graduating as Class Honorman at the Armor Officer Basic Course at Fort Knox, Ky., in July 2005. He took command of 1st Platoon, Company A after joining 2nd Tank Battalion. He led his Marines through several company and battalion level exercises to prepare them for their deployment with RCT-5 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. While deployed to Iraq, he led his Marines on numerous independent operations.

LiCalzi's awards include the Iraq Campaign Medal, National Defense Service Medal and Global War on Terrorism Medal.

"I met Mike LiCalzi two years ago and since then, we've shared almost every experience together," said 2nd Lt. Jeffrey Potter, from Federalsburg, Md. "Mike was more than a peer. He was a friend. Mike enjoyed learning new things, no matter what the topic might be."

Potter said LiCalzi took up Italian cooking while stationed in Kentucky and was an avid reader of *National Geographic* magazine.

"He measured himself not on his tangible accomplishments, but of how well his men, his family and his friends were cared for by him," Potter explained. "We are all lucky to have had the chance to meet such a good man."

Cpl. Orasee Russell, from Apple Valley, Calif., said Vahaviolos, known to his friends as "Vaha," spent more than a year together as crewmen on the same tank and roommates in the barracks. He had a ceaseless sense of humor, poking fun until everyone laughed and then

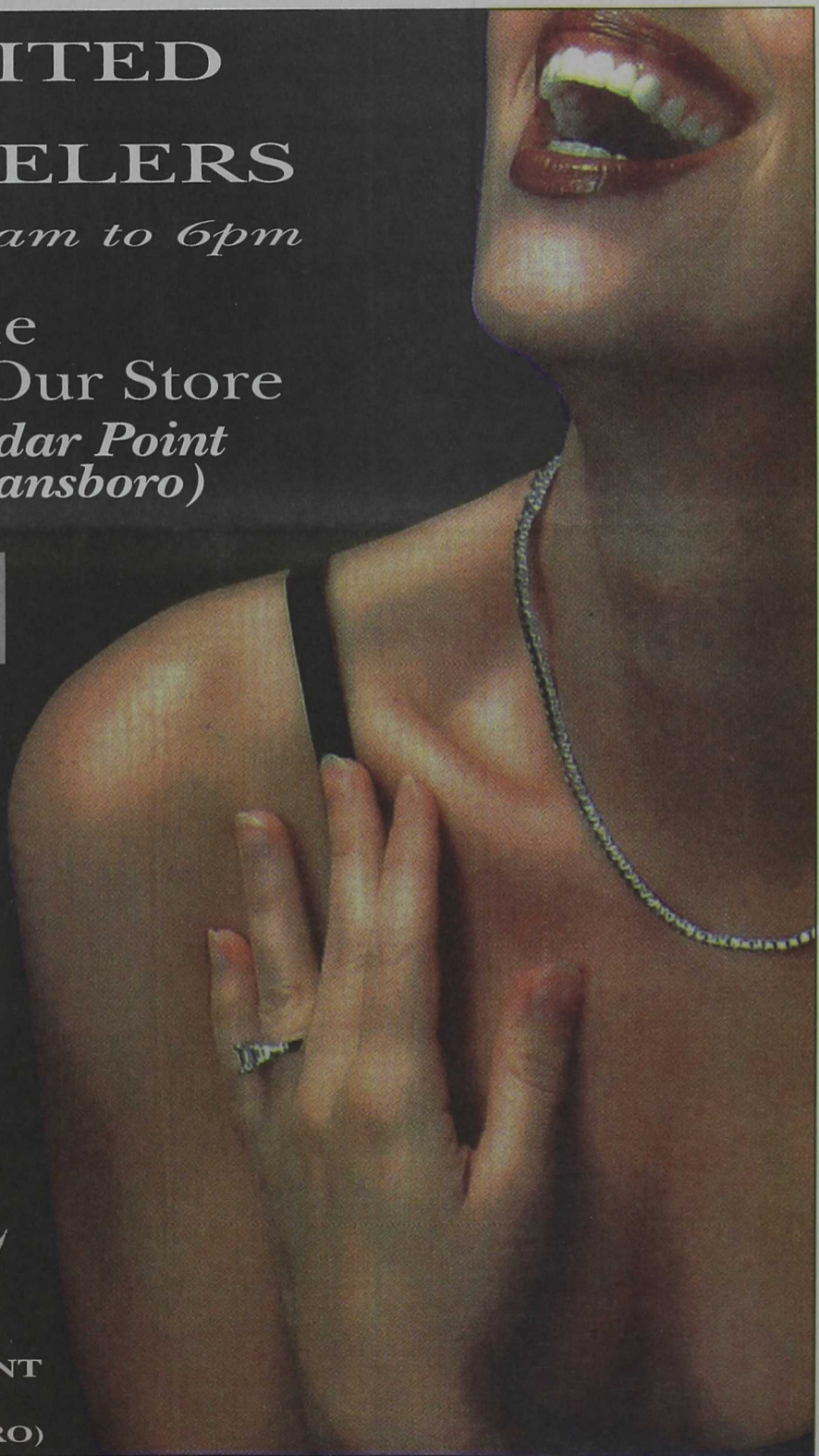

Salem, Ore., Marine injured in Iraq tells of IED aftermath

HADITHA, Iraq — When some Marines return from Iraq, they bring back memorabilia, such as tattered Iraqi flags or old photos of Saddam Hussein they found in cluttered streets.

Some, like 20-year-old Lance Cpl. Jeremy Russell of Salem, Ore., will bring back memories of actions on the battlefield and scars from being wounded in action.

Russell, an infantryman with Weapons Company of the Hawaii-based 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, was manning a machine gun turret in a humvee struck by an improvised explosive device, last month.

The battalion arrived in Iraq two months ago, and has since had to deal with numerous IEDs while patrolling the streets in the Haditha Triad region — an area of about 75,000 people along the Euphrates River in western Al Anbar province and renowned insurgent hotspot.

The blast left him with a piece of shrapnel embedded in his right hand and a severely bruised leg, and left three other Marines dead: Sgt. Lea Mills, 21, from Brooksville, Fla.; Sgt. Edward G. Davis, 31, from Antioch, Ill.; and Cpl. Brandon M. Hardy, 25, from Cochranville, Pa.

"I thought I was going to die," said Russell. The IED struck Russell's vehicle during a three-hour mission to recover another U.S. military vehicle.

With vehicle in tow, the Marine convoy was enroute to their base at the Haditha Dam. It was 2:30 a.m., and the night seemed quiet, said Russell.

"I could hear the Marines below me talking about their families while I was in the turret," said Russell. "I just kept my eyes on the road behind me to make sure there were

no vehicles approaching." Still, he kept alert to ensure no vehicles approached the U.S. convoy. Aside from IEDs, vehicle suicide bombers are also a threat in Al Anbar province, said Russell.

Russell said the Marines talking in the vehicle "died down a little" just seconds before an earth-shattering explosion, which was followed by two fireballs on either side of the vehicle. Russell tucked his chin and closed his eyes, hoping to avoid the majority of the blast. He did. The blast destroyed the rear left side of the humvee and flipped the vehicle 180 degrees onto its left side.

Russell was ejected from the vehicle onto the roadway and feared the vehicle would rollover on top of him.

"It felt like minutes had past and everything was in slow motion," recalled Russell. "But it really took only two seconds for the IED to detonate and throw the vehicle on its side."

As he laid in the street, disoriented from the blast, Russell, who is serving his first combat deployment since he joined the Marine Corps in 2004 to "see the world," remembers smelling fuel — a leak from the vehicle's gas tank.

He also saw the vehicle's three other passengers lying motionless in the street. Two of the Marines were killed on impact and another died a short time later, according to medical records. Russell climbed back into the humvee to notify the other Marines in the convoy of his situation, but the radio was broken.

Russell then notified Marines ahead of him in the convoy by using luminous flares he located in the vehicle. He also armed himself with his M-16 rifle, ready to fight off a secondary attack.

Believing he was the only Marine around, Russell saw Lance Cpl. Cheyenne Macintosh, an

'Moto' Mail keeps Iraq-deployed Marine connected with family

On his second deployment to Iraq, Lance Cpl. Jacob A. Lamb admits that communicating with friends and family back home is easier thanks to a relatively new program: Moto Mail.

'Moto' is short for 'motivation,' and it's what U.S. service members like Lamb use as a means to keep contact with his friends and family back home.

This roughly two-year-old program allows U.S. service members deployed overseas to receive letters via an electronic system. The letters are printed and enveloped at the military post office, and in the hands of the service member within 24 hours.

Since Marines such as Lamb don't always have access to the internet or phones, Moto Mail is a major advance over e-mail which still relies on the recipient having computer

access, said Lamb.

"I didn't even know the program existed last year," Lamb, 22, a motor operator with 2nd Engineer Battalion, currently supporting the 7th Marine Regiment here. "Now I get about seven Moto Mails a week."

Lamb is currently in a combat engineer role with the battalion and

wrestling when it was all over for good measure.

After all was done, he'd share a pizza, Russell said of his fellow noncommissioned officer. He'd listen for hours to another's concerns. He dreamed of buying a BMW M3 when the deployment was over.

"To me, he was not just a friend, but one of my best friends," Russell explained. "As an NCO, he was a great leader. As a troop, he was always a hard worker and as a Marine, he was a brother to all of us and best friend to me."

Vahaviolos, 21, from Airmont, N.Y., joined the Marine Corps July 21, 2003 and attended recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C. He completed Marine Combat Training at the School of Infantry before becoming a tank crewman after graduating from the U.S. Army Armor Center in Fort Knox, Ky. He was assigned to Company A and deployed for Operation Iraqi Freedom and fought in Fallujah during Operation Al Fajr.

His awards include the Combat Action Ribbon, Iraqi Campaign Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal and Sea Service Deployment Ribbon.

Cpl. Kareem Cox, of Philadelphia, said Gramessanches, or "Grams" was a tough wrestling opponent with a sense of humor that had perfect timing to lighten a mood. Grams was a fan of *Dawson's Creek* and tried to keep it a secret from his fellow Marines. Grams dreamed of becoming a firefighter after his enlistment. He left behind a wife and child.

He would always be there for you," Cox explained. "We would just laugh at the ridiculous things Grams would say or do and I know we'll all miss that. He was a straightforward man, Marine, husband, father and son. Most of all to us — a brother."

Gramessanches, 22, from Fort Wayne, Ind., enlisted in the Marine Corps March 12, 2003 and completed recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego. He attended Marine Combat Training at the School of Infantry and learned to be

a tank crewman at the U.S. Army Armor Center at Fort Knox, Ky., graduating June 23, 2004. He deployed in 2004 for Operation Iraqi Freedom and fought through Fallujah in Operation Al Fajr.

His awards include the Combat Action Ribbon, Iraqi Campaign Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal and Sea Service Deployment Ribbon.

Lance Cpl. Brandon Roberts, of King, N.C., said Burnett enjoyed tinkering on his truck and four-wheeled off-road vehicles. He craved Mexican fast food and spoke often of his girlfriend.

"Lance Cpl. Burnett was without a doubt, one of the best Marines I've ever met," Roberts said. "He was a great friend. Burnett loved life and lived each day to its fullest potential. He loved his family and he loved his friends. He loved being a Marine and he was very proud to wear his uniform."

Burnett, 20, from St. Cloud, Fla., enlisted in the Marine Corps Oct. 13, 2004 and completed recruit training at Marine Corps

Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C. He completed Marine Combat Training at the School of Infantry before attending school at Pensacola study avionics. In Sept. 2005, he was assigned to the U.S. Army Armor Center at Fort Knox, Ky., for training as a tank crewman there Dec 16, 2005. He was assigned to Company A.

Burnett's awards include the Iraqi Campaign Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal and Sea Service Deployment Ribbon.

"The sacrifices of our brothers will forever be remembered as one of the most important of our generation," Nicholson said. "They will forever be a part of the timeless courage of the Fighting 5th Marines, the most decorated combat regiment in our Corps." ■

week-long outing, Lamb found a stack of Moto Mails on his bed and discovered that he had become the one-millionth Moto Mail recipient.
The notice meant little to Lamb although it was a major milestone for the program which is quickly gaining a reputation as a quick mode of communication for Marines and sailors serving in the Al Qa'im region of western Iraq.
"This is very significant for Marines serving in an area of operations such as Al Qa'im," said Chief Warrant Officer Cecilia E. Salter, a postal officer from 1st

Marine Logistics Group. "It's a major morale booster for Marines, especially those now in Iraq."
The 33-year-old from Rahway, N.J., presented Lamb with a gift certificate for \$250, a \$50 Superletter certificate (a correspondence program used to send letters home from Iraq) and a care package filled with snacks and personal hygiene items.
Lamb, a graduate of Oakland High School in Murfreesboro, Tenn., uses the program because of its relative ease and accessibility, he said.
"Every post office in Iraq has a

Moto Mail printer," said Salter.
Other Marines here, such as Cpl. Joffre Castillo, a 22-year-old administrative clerk, say Moto Mail is a good method to get immediate news from home.
"My wife has contacted me several times during the deployment about vital matters at home like medical issues and health updates," said the Twentynine Palms, Calif., native who has kept as much communication as possible with his loved ones back home.
Lamb, who enrolled in the Marine Corps more than two

years ago, says that without Moto Mail he would probably not find out about "everyday regular things" that go on back home.
"It feels good to know what's going on and I can choose to respond the same day I get the letters," said Lamb.
Although he can't use Moto Mail to communicate back to the states - Moto Mail is used only for receiving letters from the states - Lamb admits it's a major improvement for communication over his last deployment in August of 2004 to Fallujah, where he had to rely on mailing letters home.

Lamb had no access to the internet and said he rarely had the opportunity to call home because his unit was always on the move.
Now more than halfway through his second deployment (his unit arrived in February), Lamb is simply looking forward to getting back home to Camp Lejeune, and hanging out with his friends and driving his brand new truck.
"I can't wait to get home and meet my new nephew," said Lamb. "As long as I stay busy and keep doing my job out here, time will go by that much faster." ■

his injuries on the helicopter, he said. Shrapnel was lodged in his hand, his right leg throbbled in pain after he was tossed around inside the turret, and eventually ejected onto the ground, he said.
Russell, who is now fully recovered and back to daily patrols with his unit, says the incident has not deterred him from patrolling daily. Given the chance, he'll deploy again to Iraq after his battalion returns to the U.S. in the fall, he said.
"I never imagined I would be in a life-or-death situation," said Russell. "When I joined the Marine Corps, the only thing I knew about combat was what I saw on TV shows like M.A.S.H."

sales, incentive programs for whistleblowers, and detection and disposal training and equipment.
"I think the symposium has been beneficial and informative for us, for the coalition forces and for the Afghans," said Pakistan Brig. Azeem Bajwa Amir. "I still think there are areas where we can talk more, share more and benefit more from each other. We are making progress. We are moving in the right direction."

The key to the successful neutralization of the IED threat is teamwork, Amir said.
"We must increase each other's capabilities to tackle this threat," he said. "All three nations must make a unified effort to defeat IEDs."
Now it's a matter of putting the knowledge to practical use, said Amir.
"We have deliberated on the methodology of sharing information," Amir said. "We have been sharing whatever we know and we will continue doing that. We just have to work out the procedures - how to share, at what levels, etc."

Paiman agreed with Amir's assessment.
"Though the Counter IED Symposium was successful, we should also have some practical exercises," he said.
There are three steps essential to defeating IEDs, Paiman said. They are educating the people on the threat, developing a training course for soldiers and police, and acquiring the proper tools to detect and neutralize IEDs.
"If we can achieve these three parts of the mission, we will be successful and destroy the threat of IEDs," he said.
In the near future, Paiman

said he hopes cooperation from neighbors and coalition forces will lead to the development of a fully-trained, operational explosive ordnance disposal unit within the Afghan National Army that is capable of detecting and eradicating the threat of IEDs.
Though it will take time, Paiman said the Afghan government is confident they will neutralize the improvised explosive devices threat.
"We will fight this threat. We will defeat it," he said. "It is vital to the stability of Afghanistan." ■

value why a sacrifice was made."
The President also paid tribute to Army Lt. Col. Joseph Fenty Jr., who died with nine other soldiers earlier this month in a helicopter crash in Afghanistan.
"Some day," Bush said about Fenty's newborn daughter, "she will learn about her dad from the men with whom he served."

And one of them said this about her father: "We all wanted to be more like Joe Fenty. We were all in awe of him."
"Well," Bush added. "I am in awe of the men and women who sacrifice for the freedom of the United States of America."
"In this place where valor sleeps," the President continued, "we are reminded why America has always gone to war reluctantly: because we know the cost of war. We have seen those costs in the war on terror we fight today."

However, he observed, "our nation is free because of brave Americans like these who volunteered to confront our adversaries abroad so we do not have to face them here at home. Our nation mourns the loss of our men and women in uniform. We will honor them by completing the mission for which they gave their lives, by defeating the terrorists, by advancing the cause of liberty, and by laying the foundation of peace for a generation of young Americans." ■

Editor's note: The following is an open letter to the members of the Celebrity Players Tour from Tom Dreesen, comedian and CPT vice-president, in regards to his impressions of the recently completed 3rd Annual Marine Corps Celebrity Invitational Golf Tournament and the brave Marines he met while he was aboard Camp Lejeune.

Dear fellow Celebrity Tour Players,
We returned late last night from Camp Lejeune, where we spent six days meeting and greeting Marines and their families — 16,000 have returned home from Iraq in the last four weeks.
We played golf with a group called "Wounded Warriors" for a couple of days. Many are men who were severely wounded. Some lost limbs some lost sight in either one eye or both.
One young man lost both legs and one arm and he played golf with us and kept our spirits up. The last thing he wanted was sympathy from any of us.
That night we did a show in one of the hangars on the aviation side and the lieutenant colonel in charge of these men, who was also wounded, came up on stage to introduce eight of these "Wounded Warriors."
When they were all properly introduced, the audience stood and welcomed them home. The lieutenant colonel then said he spoke for the men when he said "If some of you are asking why we risk our lives in this War on Terrorism, it's very simple, it's because of you Americans. We believe you're worth fighting for and we believe you're worth being wounded for and yes, we believe your worth dying for."
The lieutenant colonel then marched off the stage, needless to say, to a standing ovation.

The last day I did a show along with Steve and Rudy Gatlin and Alfonso Ribeiro for all the troops and their families.
All of the guys came up on stage at the end to sing chorus to "America the Beautiful" and "God Bless America."
We signed autographs in a booth, before the show, for the troops and their families. Some of them came up to me and said we met when I performed in Iraq and almost always I'd say I'm glad you're home safe and they would say things like "I'll be going back again, we've got to finish the job we started." — some saying this to me while they were holding a baby in their arms and a young wife at their side.
I kept shaking my head and thinking "where do they come from?"
Then I couldn't sleep this morning so I got up and a friend had sent me an e-mail

about the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.
It made me think of a road trip I was on several years ago and I was at the airport in Portland, Ore., getting ready to board a flight when they made an announcement would we mind stepping aside while they pre-boarded 36 young German students visiting America. No one minded as we all stepped aside for these nice young teenagers.

Standing next to me was an old World War II vet who said to me "Do you suppose if we had lost WWII that today 36 young American teenagers would be boarding in Berlin?" I said what do you think sir? He said, "We'd all be in concentration camps son and please don't ever forget that."
He's right you know, if it wasn't for the men and women of the armed forces at that time there would be no New York Yankees, Chicago Cubs, Los Angeles Lakers or Super Bowls or Celebrity Players Tour.
We would have never known the greatness of Michael Jordan or been able to cheer for and buy records of Elvis or the Beatles.
When I look back over my life one of the things I'm most proud of is my four years in the service. More than anything it makes me respect deeply those who are willing to serve today. Not only are they willing, but they weren't drafted, they all volunteered.

Makes you wonder why? Maybe it's like the lieutenant colonel said — that they believe that Americans are worth dying for.
If that's so I wonder how the wounded and the maimed for life felt when they watched the Academy Awards that was broadcast to billions both here and around the world and not one word in three hours was mentioned about the men and women of our armed forces in huzzas way.
Not one actor thanked them. It may not bother you and that's okay but it did me and even more so after this week.

To all the guys on the tour that were there I can't say enough about you. Down deep I think we all feel that this is really what we should be doing more of. To those who missed it, I hope you try and make it next year. This is not a "call to action letter" I hate those. You do whatever you want. All I can do is every time I see someone in uniform is go up and thank them personally.

Long Memorial Day has come and gone, and anglers hope for the start of continued long summer.

Whether you're headed in search of kingfish, cobia and bonito inside the inlets and rivers for speckled drum and flounder, the bite is really on for red drum.

Powell of New River reported that many boats leaving the dock for the long weekend were in the Swansboro Memorial Day Kingfish Tournament. As is the case in late May, the game in southern Bay. Every year a experienced crews [and

some lucky ones too] find some bigger fish and end up taking most of the purse. This year was no exception, with a big 43-pound smoker king earning its captors a cool \$25,000 first place prize. Not bad for a day of fishing.

Powell said king mackerel fishermen also caught a mixed bag of other "green water" gamefish, including Spanish mackerel and cobia.

Closer to shore, the bite is really on for red drum. Powell reported catching 20 in one day last week when he fished around shallow water structures like submerged trees and docks. Many of the fish hit chartreuse spinnerbaits with gold-plated spinner blades.

The lower New River and the marshes behind Topsail Island are also producing good catches of speckled trout, black drum and flounder.

To target the highly-sought-after flounder, bait up a Carolina rig with live finger mullet or peanut bunker [menhaden/shad] and fish around dock pilings and other underwater structure.

Pier and surf fishermen are having a field day with small bluefish and Spanish mackerel along with a few spots and croaker being caught on the bottom.

Further east along Bogue Banks, Dr. Richard Ehrenkauser, a.k.a. Dr. Bogus, reported a similar cast of characters for saltwater anglers.

The Spanish mackerel run has slowed a bit, but there are still some fish being caught by trollers that concentrate their efforts over the artificial reefs and rock ledges. Don't be surprised to run into small king mackerel and large "Hatteras" bluefish if you go.

Pier fishing at Bogue Inlet Pier in Emerald Isle

has turned up a mix of sand perch, sea mullet, spots and croakers, with the occasional speckled or gray trout finding their way into the cooler.

Around Swansboro, the red drum continue to bite, especially in Banks Channel, the bays and marshes around the high rise bridge and up in the White Oak River and Queens Creek.

Keeper flounder are starting to show in the same places redfish are found. The best fishing is around docks in the Intracoastal Waterway.

One of the soundest bits of advice you will ever get from a fellow fisherman is to use the freshest bait available. That often means catching your own — which can be just as fun as catching the fish.

Armed with a small cast net, you can supply yourself with lively minnows and shrimp, guaranteed to out-fish the frozen stuff available in the bait shop.

Take a small rake and a pail with you on your next excursion and dig your own mole crabs, clams and sea worms and see if you don't start catching more fish.

If Lady Luck is with you and you start catching them as fast as you can reel them in, be a good steward of the resource and keep only what you can reasonably eat in a few days. Let the rest go to fight another day. ■

Ring replica auction benefits old NFLers

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Former Green Bay Packers star Jerry Kramer understands why some people would find it hard to believe there are needy retired NFL players.

With today's multimillion dollar salaries, many current players will never need help financially. But Kramer, who played for Vince Lombardi's Packers from 1958 to 1968, said that's not the case for a number of those who played in his era.

Kramer, 70, who lives in Boise, Idaho, said he earned \$8,000 in his first year in the league and got a \$300 raise in the second year before his salary jumped to \$9,000 annually when he was All-Pro in his third year. He eventually earned \$27,000 to \$28,000 a year before retiring.

Many players from his era began drawing pensions at age 45, he said, only to see them drop dramatically when they turned 62 and could start drawing Social Security. And a number are without private medical insurance, he said.

With that in mind, he put up for auction this week a replica of his ring from the first Super Bowl to raise money to help older former players. He had the ring made after the original disappeared 25 years ago — only to resurface recently on an Internet auction.

"I have always felt great concern and frustration regarding the condition of some of the retired players who helped build the league," Kramer said when he announced he was putting the ring up for auction.

After the auction closed Friday night, Kramer said the final bid was \$22,634, and the ring goes to a Green Bay man whose name wasn't immediately released.

"I'm pretty pleased with everything. It's been an amazing series of events for me, from the ring returning," he said.

NFL spokesman Greg Aiello said last week that those who played prior to 1959 were not originally in the NFL pension plan, although they were added years ago. The league spends \$5 million a month on retirement and disability benefits for more than 2,500 players, he said.

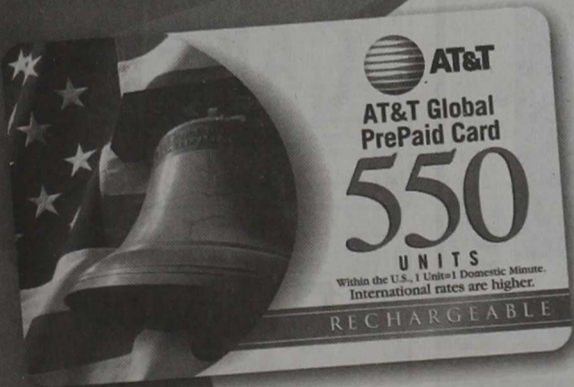
Kramer said his pension dropped from \$454 a month to \$158 when he turned 62. He said the NFL also adds \$200 per month for the single year he played prior to 1959.

Kramer said a charitable trust will be created to hand out the money raised to needy players. ■

"Even before the credits started to roll, I knew that's what I wanted to do with my life," said Kimbrough. "Being a Marine meant you were hardcore."

During his 30 years of service in a logistics military occupational specialty, Kimbrough was stationed all over the world, including places like: Okinawa, Japan, the Philippines, Hawaii, Camp Lejeune and two tours in Vietnam.

Like those who have deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan, Kimbrough's experience in combat situations gave him a first-hand look at why Memorial Day is no ordinary holiday.

"Everyone lost a close friend or family member in Vietnam; that's just the way it was," said Kimbrough. "In the bush, every day was Memorial Day."

Nowadays, he, the VFW and other local veterans' military organizations work hard to ensure the memories of those who gave their lives for this country are never forgotten.

"In this area especially, people should know this holiday is more than just another excuse to stay home from work," said Kimbrough. "On May 29, we ask members of both the military and civilian communities to stop and take a moment to remember the men and women in uniform who died to protect our freedom." ■

Command of the grill

A salute to steak

Capt. Eric Dominijanni cooks up his best to benefit Marine charities

Eric "Disco" Dominijanni of the 2nd Assault Amphibian Battalion at Camp Lejeune got to have his steak and eat it too when he traveled to his home state of New York for the Command of the Grill competition May 25 to face off against nine other barbecue champions from Marine bases around the country. "It was absolutely phenomenal," Dominijanni said shortly after competing with the other cooks on *Good Morning America*. "It was a better experience for me than the average person, because my friends and family were there."

Of his Italian heritage, Dominijanni describes himself as "genetically predisposed to cooking." He began cooking at a young age out of necessity. "My mom could make five dishes real well, but that was pretty much it," he said, laughing. "It was either eat really bad food or learn how to cook."

Dominijanni chose the latter. At the age of seven, he made his first meal for his mom — pork chops with fried-egg breading, rice and potatoes. "I made it every day for a week until she said, 'okay this is great, but you have to stop,'" said Dominijanni.

Dominijanni had a passion for cooking ever since and over the years Dominijanni has become very versatile in the kitchen. He loves to make Italian food and his specialties include curried lamb soup and minestrone. "I also make awesome sangria," he said.

Dominijanni is a self-proclaimed city boy at heart, having grown up in Forest Hills, Queens. "I lucked out that the competition was in New York," he said.

The steak-cooking contest was sponsored by Weber-Stephens Products, makers of gas and charcoal grills. The event served as a fundraiser for an 80-page cookbook *Command of the Grill: A Salute to Steak*. All proceeds from the \$10 book are donated to four charities benefiting wounded Marines and their families: the Injured Marine Semper Parvum Fund, the Wounded Warrior Project, the Marine House and the Marine Corps-Law Enforcement Foundation.

"It's nothing better than doing what you love and having the money go to a great cause," said Dominijanni.

Dominijanni's personal recipe, "Disco's Hot and Tangy New York Strip Steak," is made with a marinade of cola, soy sauce and garlic teriyaki mixed together with fresh ginger, orange zest, habanero chili pepper and lemon juice before grilling. "I wanted to do something completely different, so I started by adding cola. Not many people adds cola to their steak recipe," said Dominijanni. "I also wanted it sweet, so I added the ginger and orange. Then I thought, well, it's not enough, I need something spicy too, but a sort of dry kind of spice. So I added habanero and some lemon juice to bring out the flavor."

Dominijanni was pretty pleased with the outcome. "I honestly don't think I could have made a better steak," he said. "I guess the judges thought it was a little too spicy."

The winner of the contest was Col. Stewart Navarre of Camp Pendleton, Calif. with his Corps-inspired "Colorado Steak," made with New York strips topped with sautéed Portobello mushrooms and crumbled feta and blue cheeses.

"Disco" Dominijanni couldn't have enjoyed the day more. "It was a beautiful day and I got to eat steak at 8 o'clock in the morning," he said. "What more could I ask for?"

Dominijanni will return to Camp Lejeune on Monday, June 10 — until then, he's enjoying his time in his home state. "I'm so glad to be back!" he said. ■



Disco's Hot and Tangy New York Strip Steaks by Captain Eric "Disco" Dominijanni

- Marinade:**
1 can (12 ounces) cola
1/2 cup soy sauce
1/2 cup garlic teriyaki sauce
1 habanero chile pepper, finely chopped with seeds
1 tablespoon grated orange zest
1 tablespoon freshly ground ginger
1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
3/4 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
1/8 teaspoon kosher salt

- Essentials:**
Four 3/4 inch thick New York strip steaks, about eight ounces each
Extra virgin olive oil

1. In a medium bowl mix the marinade ingredients. Place the steaks in a large, resealable plastic bag and pour in the marinade. Press out the air, seal the bag and turn several times to coat the meat. Place the bag in a bowl and refrigerate four to six hours, turning the bag occasionally.

2. Let the steaks stand at room temperature for 20 to 30 minutes before grilling. Remove the steaks from the bag and reserve the marinade. Pour the marinade into a small saucepan, bring to a boil, and boil for about 10 seconds. Set aside about half of the marinade for basting the steaks. For the remaining marinade in the saucepan, reduce the heat to a simmer and cook until it has reduced to the consistency of a dipping sauce, 5 to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Set aside.

3. Pat the steaks dry with paper towels. Lightly coat the steaks with oil.

4. With the lid closed, grill the steaks over direct high heat (500°F to 550°F) until cooked to desired doneness, 5 to 7 minutes for medium-rare, turning once and basting with a little of the boiled marinade. (If flare-ups occur, move the steaks temporarily over indirect high heat.) Remove from the grill and let rest for 2 to 3 minutes. Serve warm with the dipping sauce on the side.

Makes 4 servings.

The Da Vinci Code proves a worthwhile theological thriller

AMERICAN DREAMZ (PG-13)

American Dreamz is a comedy drama and darkly humorous satire.

The movie is a parody of the *American Idol* show and President Bush's foreign policy.

Hugh Grant (*Bridget Jones' Diary*, *Love Actually*, *Notting Hill*) stars as Martin Tweed, the self-loathing host and producer of a popular TV show called *American Dreamz*. The movie viewer immediately will make a reference to Simon Cowell of *American Idol*.

Mandy Moore (*Racing Stripes*, *A Walk To Remember*) is Sally Kendoo, a small town girl, starry-eyed contestant and soon-to-be-pop star, who is more than willing to exploit her private life for winning the competition.

Dennis Quaid (*In Good Company*, *The Day After Tomorrow*, *The Alamo*) stars as President Joe Staton, appearing as a guest judge to boost his popularity.

Willem Dafoe (*Inside Man*, *XXX: State of the Union*), made to look like Dick Cheney, plays the very controlling chief of staff who urges the president to be a guest judge on the hit TV talent show.

Marcia Gay Harden (*Welcome to Mooseport*, *The Bad News Bears*) portrays the clever first lady Staton who is trying to help the president regain his political control.

Newcomer Sam Golzari appears as Omer Obeidi, a recent immigrant and show-tune loving contestant (reminiscent of former *Idol* contestant William Hung), a reluctant terrorist who is supposed to blow up the president on TV during his appearance on the reality show.

The talented cast also includes Chris Klein (*Rollerball*) as William, Sally's dopey boyfriend; Jennifer Coolidge (*Legally Blonde*) as Martha Kendoo, the obsessed-with-fame-manager mom; and Oscar nominee Shorey Aghdaschloo (*The House of Sand and Fog*) as Omer's aunt.

American Dreamz is written and directed by Paul Weitz (*In Good Company*, *American Pie*, *About a Boy*). The cynical take on today's politics is combined with the pursuit of chasing dreams in our pop culture society.

A poster for the film states: "Imagine a country where the president never reads the newspaper, where the government goes to war for all the wrong reasons and more people vote for a pop idol than their next president."

American Dreamz is little more than a silly spoof at our pop culture and American politics, in

the simple comedy style of *Saturday Night Live*, it is mindless entertainment and a distraction from the more important issues facing us everyday.

THE SENTINEL (R)

The Sentinel is a thriller about secret service agents who discover that there is a mole among them who plans to assassinate the president.

Michael Douglas (*Don't Say a Word*, *Traffic*, *A Perfect Murder*) stars as Agent Pete Garrison, the most decorated agent in the history of the secret service, which is the president's last line of defense.

Now he is a suspected Secret Service mole, who claims he is being framed. When a White House agent is murdered, Garrison is framed and blackmailed over an affair with the first lady.

Garrison is relieved of his duties, but will not stop in trying to prove his innocence and save the life of the president.

Garrison, wrongly suspected of targeting the president for assassination, has become the Service's worst nightmare. As he uses his formidable skills to try and prove his innocence and find the real assassin, Garrison is tracked by his equally adept former protégée, agent Breckinridge.

Kiefer Sutherland (TV's *24*, *Taking Lives*, *Phone Booth*) costars as Agent Breckinridge who believes Garrison is guilty and goes after him.

Eva Longoria (TV's *Desperate Housewives*) plays Agent Jill Marin, Breckinridge's new partner.

Kim Basinger (*Cellular*, *8 Mile*) portrays the first lady Sarah Ballentine, who Garrison supposedly has been having an affair with.

Also appearing are Paul Calderon (*The Last Castle*, *21 Grams*) as Deputy Dr. Cortes; Conrad Coates (Saw 2) as Agent Hauser; Martin Donovan (*Insomnia*) as Agent William Montrose; Chuck Shamata (*Cinderella Man*) as Director Overbrook; and David Rasche (*The Big Tease*) as the President.

Action veteran Clark Johnson (*S.W.A.T.*, *Homicide*, *Blood Brothers*, *Colors*) directs this predictable but stylish thriller.

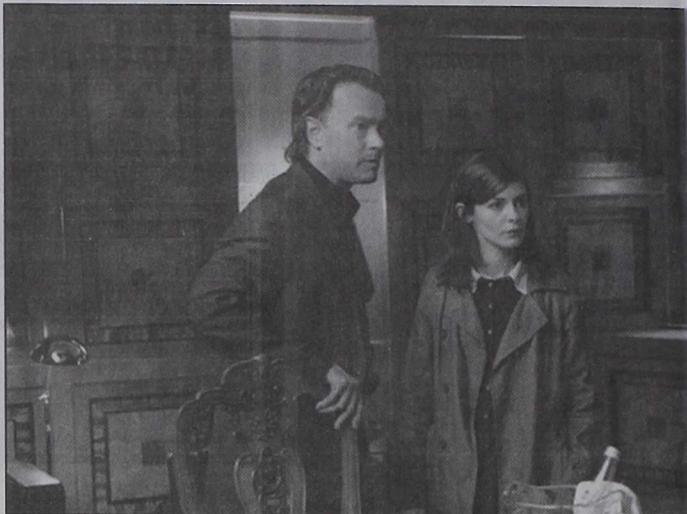
The Sentinel is an entertaining film but with a very improbable plot. It probably will fare better with the audience in its video release.

THE DA VINCI CODE (PG-13)

The Da Vinci Code is a murder mystery that involves the origins of Christianity. The theological thriller is based on the immensely popular 2003 mystery novel by Dan Brown.

The story begins with a spectacular murder in the Louvre Museum. All clues point to a covert religious organization that will stop at nothing to

protect a secret that threatens to overturn 2,000 years of accepted dogma.

The bizarre murder of a curator at the Louvre reveals a sinister plot to uncover a secret that has been protected since the days of Christ. Only the victim's granddaughter and a famed symbologist can untangle the clues he left behind. The duo becomes both suspects and detectives searching for not only the murderer, but also the stunning secret of the ages he was charged to protect.

Tom Hanks (*The Terminal*, *Cast Away*, *Saving Private Ryan*) stars as Dr. Robert Langdon, a Harvard symbologist, who uncovers church secrets.

Audrey Tautou (*Amelie*, *A Very Long Engagement*) costars as Sophie Neveu, a French cryptologist who helps him unravel the mystery.

Together they investigate what one character calls the biggest cover-up in human history. To solve the murder, they journey to Paris, London and Edinburgh and uncover a religious conspiracy.

They discover a secret society that is at odds with the Vatican and a cover-up about the nature of Mary Magdalene's relationship to Jesus.

Paul Bettany (*Firewall*, *A Beautiful Mind*) plays Silas, the villainous monk. The creepy albino assassin is pursuing our heroes. He is a member of Opus Dei whose devotional practices include flagellation and wearing a spiked chain to irritate his skin.

Among the international cast is Jean Reno (*The Pink Panther*) as police captain Bezu Fache; Ian

The Da Vinci Code is the most talked about movie of the year and Howard, the director, does not disappoint. But he promises a while and concentrate on the underlying mystery.

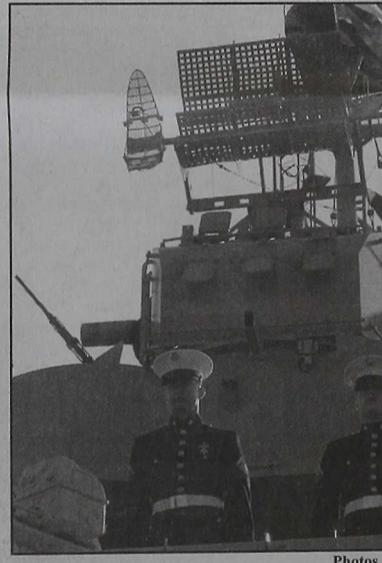
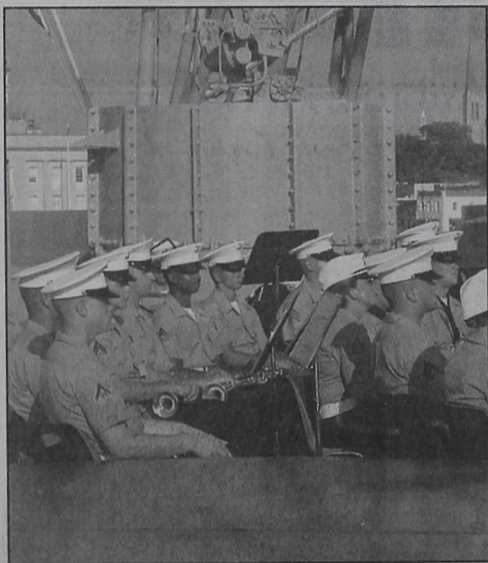
Amidst all the controversy surrounding the film, do not forget that this is, after all, a religious mystery.
