Update to the Army's Combat Fitness Test - ACFT 3.0

ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – On March 22, 2021, Sgt. Maj of the Army Michael A. Grinston released an SMA Sends formally announcing the release of the Army Combat Fitness Test (ACFT) 3.0 to the Total Army. This adaptation of the ACFT (effective April 1) includes six events (3–Repetition Maximum Deadlift, Standing Power Throw, Hand–Release Push–Ups, Sprint–Drag–Carry, Leg Tuck or Plank, and 2–Mile Run), with one significant change that adds the Plank as a full 100–point alternative to the Leg Tuck for Soldiers' core strength test event.



The First Armed Forces Day - 71st Anniversary

ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – This year marks the 71st anniversary of the first Armed Forces Day celebration, held May 20, 1950. Prior to that, each of the branches of the military celebrated their own day. Since 1929, Army Day had been observed on April 6, to mark the country's entrance into World War I.
