ASC Welcomes New Commanding General along Mississippi River

The U.S. Army Sustainment
Command welcomed Maj. Gen.
Chris Mohan as its new

under a warm and sunny summer sky with the mighty Mississippi River flowing in the background. Daly passed the ASC flag from Matthew Sannito, a member of the Senior Executive Service, to Mohan. Sannito is the deputy to the commanding general, and served briefly as executive director of ASC following the retirement of the previous ASC commanding general, Maj. Gen. Daniel Mitchell, last month. Though the ceremony was held outdoors, attendance was limited, social distancing was practiced, and the ceremony was streamed live via Facebook. In his remarks, Daly praised the work of ASC's 30,000 Soldiers and civilians stationed globally, saying that ASC's mission is critical to sustaining America's warfighters. JMC Commander Promoted to One-Star General

U.S. Army Col. Gavin Gardner, commander of Joint Munitions Command, was promoted to brigadier general during a promotion ceremony June 10. Gen. Gustave "Gus" Perna, chief operating officer for Operation Warp Speed, hosted the ceremony at historic Quarters One on Rock Island Arsenal amid a limited number of family members, friends and distinguished visitors due to COVID-19 restrictions. Perna, under whom Gardner served multiple times throughout their military careers, highlighted Gardner's leadership



abilities and the manner in which he treats his Army teammates. "People are ready to follow him anywhere," Perna said. "Why? Because they trust him. They believe in him. He cares for them. He takes responsibility for people, for his Soldiers, for their families. He knows how to lead an organization to solve problems, not symptoms." A member of a third-generation Army Family, Gardner commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Ordnance Corps in 1992. He attributed much of his success to his parents' support. Military Looks for Novel Ways to Employ 3D Printing

In April, the Army signed a contract for its "Jointless Hull Project," which has an ambitious goal of developing a 3D metal printer so large that it can create a military truck exterior in one giant piece. "The mission is to develop a large-scale tool capable of producing single, jointless combat vehicle hulls at a near net size of 30-foot-by-20-foot-by-12 foot in size," Larry "LJ" Holmes, principal investigator at ASTRO America, the nonprofit that is working with the Army to develop the massive 3D printer, said in a statement. *The Jointless Hull Project is one of the first initiatives aimed at



helping the Army take control of its own manufacturing. The service built its own 3D printing hub at **Rock Island Arsenal**, Illinois, where the project will kick off. The facility reached initial operating capability in 2019 and will be fully operational this year. Army Researchers Develop Game-Changing Cybersecurity Software Tool

Army researchers are creating technologies for decision makers to identify and execute the best-course-of-action cybersecurity defense in near-real-time and time-constrained situations. The team, including Dr. Jaime C. Acosta, U.S. Army Combat Capabilities Development Command, known as DEVCOM, Army Research Laboratory South site lead at the University of Texas at El Paso, DEVCOM ARL researcher Dr. Frederica Nelson, UTEP students Stephanie Medina and Luisana Clark, and UTEP professors Shahriar Hossain and Monika Akbar, developed a novel software tool called the repeatable experimentation



system, or RES. The system integrates virtualization, emulation, simulation and container technologies to allow analysts to characterize the benefits of particular algorithms in particular situations by running several parallel experiments at once, and then to package those scenarios and results for other researchers to repeat and build upon. DoD Extended Policy Guidance For Identification Card Operations During the Corona Virus Disease 2019 Pandemic, June 2

The Rock Island Arsenal DEERS/ID Card Office is operating at full capacity to serve our supported customers. We ask that customers continue to observe masking and social distancing to protect the many higher-risk personnel in the population we serve. For those customers unable or uncomfortable visiting the facility, the Department of Defense has extended the expiration dates of Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards. Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness: In view of the DoD's limited ability to return Identification (ID) Card facilities to normal operations while continuing to comply with local pandemic safety precautions, I am extending the temporary policy guidance at the reference for Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards that expired between Jan. 1, 2020 and July 31, 2021 only, through:

- Aug. 31, 2021: Foreign Affiliates and their dependents.
- Oct. 31, 2021: Dependents of Active Duty Uniformed Service members; Reserve and National Guard Uniformed Service Members and their dependents.
- Jan. 31, 2022: Retirees and their dependents; all other populations.

USID cards that expired before Jan. 1, 2020 or that expire after July 31, 2021 have not been extended and will not be accepted. Rock Island Arsenal DEERS/ID Card Facility (Building 56):

This maintenance project is part of the City of Rock Island's Flood Risk Management System (FRMS). Von Steuben's manual and the readiness it produced yielded a force capable of defeating some of the finest infantry in the world. The Deadly "Dog Days" of Summer

Hot dogs, apple pie and the 4thof July —there's no time of year that says "America" quite like summer. Unfortunately, July and August mean something different for the Army: They're the deadliest months for Soldier mishaps off duty, often for the very things that make summer such an eagerly anticipated season. "Soldiers and families are making permanent change of station moves and taking vacations, sometimes combining both, and getting together with friends or doing activities they otherwise can't the rest of the year," said Walt Beckman, a loss prevention program manager at the U.S. Army Combat Readiness Center. "The activities themselves aren't necessarily more risky than usual. It's more that greater exposure and the rush to get things done to maximize leisure time, like driving too fast or while too tired, can lead to fatal mistakes." Those Not Fully Vaccinated Are to Continue DoD Mitigation Measures on RIA

Per the <u>Deputy Secretary of Defense Memorandum</u>, dated 13 May 2021, <u>Updated Mask Guidelines for Vaccinated Persons</u> – in support of updated <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u>, subject to any applicable labor relations obligations, fully vaccinated DoD personnel (who are at least two weeks beyond their final dose) are no longer required to wear a mask indoors or outdoors at DoD facilities. The Arsenal Island workforce should continue to comply with CDC guidance regarding areas where masks should be worn, including within airports. **Personnel who are not fully vaccinated should continue to follow <u>applicable DoD mask guidance</u>, including continuing to wear indoors. The Department of Defense will review and revise all applicable Force Health Protection guidance to address the new CDC guidelines. Until this updated Force Health Protection guidance is issued, commanders and supervisors may make exceptions to this memorandum as necessary to ensure a safe workforce. Commanders and supervisors should not ask about an employee's vaccination status or use information about an employee's vaccination status to**

make decisions about how and when employees will report to a workplace instead of teleworking. All current protection measures, mask requirements for unvaccinated personnel, cleaning/sanitizing stations, and physical distancing guidance will remain in place. Don't Wait, Vaccinate! – Senior leadership and health personnel at the Rock Island Arsenal continue to highly encourage the Arsenal workforce and their families to get the first COVID-19 vaccine available to them from whatever resource they qualify to receive it, whether that's here at the Arsenal, a county vaccine clinic, the Veteran's Administration, their primary care provider, or a pharmacy. One resource for finding the vaccine outside of the installation is www.vaccinefinder.org. DoD is now at Phase 2 in its schema for COVID-19 vaccine eligibility. If a member of the Island workforce wants to receive the vaccine at the RIA Health Clinic they need to go through their command or organization or by calling the Clinic for times and availability.
