## Cold weather tests level of morale

ST McCOY Wis. — Under the conditions morale can be the big factor in whether or not a mission is fulfilled. It's been said that any hardship is good training for Marines. For Camp Lejeune's Marines going through cold weather exercises, known as Alpine Warrior-88, the load was a beast of burden. But it was kept in check by those who maintain morale.

As a morale officer for Bulk Fuel Company, 8th Engineer Support Battalion, 2nd FSSG, resides in Sgt. John J. [Name] 1st platoon sergeant.

As the Marines begin to falter in the face of the cold, the morale officer's voice bellows out, encouraging the Marines to rise to the occasion, meet the

challenge head on and overcome.

The voice belongs to Costa, an eight-year Marine from New Bedford, Mass., fitting the bill of a Marine sergeant.

"I just think you shouldn't ever let a Marine quit on himself, because if he does, he quits on everyone," said Costa.

When one thinks of a Marine sergeant, visions of a gruff, mission-oriented, romper-stomper may come to mind. Costa, a large-framed man looking like a grizzly, has lived like a polar bear right beside his troops, but deep down might be compared to Gentle Ben.

"Some Marines grew up in the stuff and played in the snow as kids. Others may not have been prepared to deal with this kind of weather and need just a little more help," Costa said.

Making a hump without dropping out is a staple of the Corps, but these ALICE

packs are nearly twice the size of what even the saltier Marines are accustomed to.

When coupled with the unforgiving Wisconsin winter, the individual Marine finds himself in a whole new ball park. This is a little different out here. It's man vs. the elements.

Meeting adversity is a moral fiber of

Marines, but when funny looking tennis racquets are strapped to your feet and boots reminiscent of cement goolashes are on your dogs, the snow drifts can seem deeper and deeper as the force marches go on and on.

But these type of challenges are tackled.

# Taking care of our own should be priority

Something is wrong here.

A few weeks ago, the courts-martial section of the *GLOBE* included three cases in which Marines were found guilty of using cocaine. Yet, only one of the three cases included a punitive discharge as part of the sentence for this crime.

Granted, I don't know the specifics of any of the three cases, but I can't for the life of me understand how we can allow a convicted drug offender to remain involved in the defense of our Nation.

Possibly, you think I'm too harsh. But stop and think about it for a minute. Would you trust a Marine who had been convicted of drug use with your life in combat? Could you ever be absolutely sure his conviction stopped his habit?

And, isn't that what principles like the Band of

Brothers and Semper Parati are all about...trust and confidence in your fellow Marines?

I can even accept that there may be circumstances and environments in our country that might lead an individual down the path toward drug use. Areas that are economically poor, are overpopulated and have a high violent crime rate might be a starting point.

But the Marine Corps does not provide that type of environment. I firmly believe that Marines who do drugs do it for one reason...kicks.

The bottom line is that drug use is illegal, dangerous to the health and well being of the user, as well as the people around him in many cases, and, according to everything I've ever read, intolerable in the Marine Corps.

Yet there it was, in black and white on the back page of that *GLOBE*, publicized proof that it's tolerated under some circumstances.

I can't even think of an acceptable excuse someone could offer in their defense. What could one possibly

say in the presence of that military judge or jury they would decide not to award a punitive discharge. "I'm sorry sir, I want to be a good Marine. I know it won't happen again." If he was really intent on being a good Marine, it never would have opened to begin with. It's funny how sincere a Marine can get when he's looking at a few years behind his actions.

I'm sorry, but I just don't see the logic behind all this. Here we are, in the midst of Congressional mandated budget cuts which are forcing manpower reductions in our Corps and instead of encouraging good Marines to stay and putting the bad ones on the street, we're doing just the opposite.

It just seems to me that if we fought to keep good Marines and let the others go, we'd be in a better shape to do what we've always boasted...take care of our own.

## Corps builds confidence for Marine of the Quarter

**Cable TV prices increase**

Cencom Cable Television has announced an adjustment in basic rates due to "substantial increases in programming costs and an ongoing service improvement program," according to Dennis Horn, Cencom system manager. The new expanded basic rate for Camp Lejeune subscribers will be \$5.50. The basic rate will remain unchanged at \$7.50. The adjustment means the new monthly rate for standard and expanded service will be \$13. Horn added that Cencom will establish an automated billing system for Camp Lejeune subscribers later this year. The new system will replace the "coupon billing system" and will require the bill payment for subscribers and Cencom until we implement the automated system. Subscribers should continue to pay by coupon." Horn said that one of our most popular channels, ESPN,

the Weather Channel provides around-the-clock information.

In order for "basic-only" subscribers to receive the new 15-channel package, Cencom will distribute converters at no charge to customers later this year, he said. "Programming represents just one element of our total service picture," Horn said. "We realize that quality cable service begins and ends at the local level.

"This rate adjustment helps ensure that subscribers will continue to enjoy the best possible cable service and programming at the lowest possible price," Horn explained.

## Army arrives for annual Vulcan requal

Onslow Beach is the place for fun in the sun, unless the beach is occupied with "Vulcan" 20mm anti-aircraft weaponry.

Third Bn., 4th Air Defense Artillery, 82nd Airborne Div., from Fort Bragg, N.C. came to Onslow Beach for five days of training.

"The soldiers from the 82nd Airborne Div. are here for annual qualification firing," said Lt. Col. Richard Alley, commanding officer 3rd Bn.

"It would cost \$300,000 to go to Ft. Bliss, TX. to train," said Alley. "Training here only cost the Army \$12,000."

The gatling-type weapon used fires 20mm armor piercing, explosive, as well as tracer rounds, at a rate of 50 rounds per second.

"The anti-aircraft weapon is capable of firing 30, 50 and 100 round bursts. For qualifying the Vulcans, we were firing 30 round bursts of tracer ammo at the target," said Sgt. William D. Taylor, Charlie Btry.

The target is a mesh net with sensors. When struck by rounds, the sensor counts them. The target trails behind a MQM-107 Drone.

A Drone is a radar-controlled, twelve-foot aircraft which simulates enemy aircraft. The target is pulled behind the

Drone and when it passes overhead the Vulcan fires at the target to score points, according to a Beach Aerospace representative.

A three-man team operates the Vulcans and also ensures proper maintenance.

"The exercise here was super. Normally the Army average is about 2.3 rounds per 30 round burst. Today our average is about five rounds per burst," said Alley.

As the last rounds were quickly fired the five-day qualification was over and the unit returned to Ft. Bragg, leaving the beaches open once more for some fun in the sun.

## BLT 1/6: 'Sweats and shivers' at 29 Palms CAX

War is a difficult situation to duplicate in training. But, the Marines of 1st Battalion, 6th Marines "got the next best thing to being there" during Combined Arms Exercise 3-88 at the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center, 29 Palms, Calif.

Arriving at 29 Palms Jan. 16, the Leathernecks of 1/6 became Battalion Landing Team 1/6. BLT 1/6 was destined to spend the next 21 days sweating through intense daylight desert training only to shiver when the night temperatures dropped with the sun.

"The whole purpose of this CAX was to train and live-fire every organic weapon system available," said Lt. Col. J.W. Smythe, commanding officer of BLT 1/6. "We didn't do this with reduced safety constraints but, we were able to maneuver close to and sometimes under supporting arms that added more realism to the CAX."

As with all military training exercises, CAX 3-88 was broken down in phases. In phase one, the individual companies went out to various ranges and live-fired their particular weapons. They then re-

formed and did a company sized live-fire assault with all organic weapons.

With two weeks of planning and training, BLT 1/6 and all their supporting elements were ready for the final three day live-fire.

"This was the first of a new series of combined arms exercises called Frag Order CAX," explained Smythe. "Normally in a CAX you know what to expect over the next three day period. But, we only knew what to expect one day at a time which is more realistic training."

The frag order for the first day put BLT 1/6 on a deliberate attack that ended with them digging in for the night in the defensive. That night, the second frag order came down ordering them to relocate and make contact with the enemy. Filling that order took them through the next day and 44 kilometers of desert. Their final order was to conduct a delayed defense on their way back.

Over the three day period Smythe said his Marines received a rare opportunity to live-fire their weapons in every situation including day and night firing and battalion sized assaults which they couldn't have done in most cases anywhere else except war.

The live-firing consumed vast amounts of ammunition.

"We used as much ammo here in three days as we would have used in three months back at Camp Lejeune," said Capt. Michael Combs, S-4 officer.

But, the ammo did more than improve the Marines marksmanship abilities. It added realism to the training that most rifleman in the unit hadn't experienced.

"Being able to live-fire the SMAW while maneuvering on the assault with the line platoon gave the unit a sense of

the SMAW's back blast and lethality," said Cpl. Thomas Drayton, a SMAW Gunner from Charlie Company. "We can live-fire the SMAW at training but, firing it to support my unit during training seem more realistic."

"The training here gave me a sense of what real combat would be like. Everywhere I went I was loaded down with live mortar rounds," said Lance Cpl. Gary Lee, a mortarman with Charlie Company. "We would rush forward, stop and start firing. It felt real at times."

## Northern upbringing not a guarantee for survival in sub-zero temperatures

FORT McCOY, Wis.—I grew up in northern Illinois where the temperatures were below freezing most of the winter months. My brothers and I thought it was fun to go out and build little igloos in the snow, and when it became too cold we'd go inside where mom would have a cup of hot cocoa waiting for us. So when I was tasked to come here as a public affairs representative to undergo cold weather training I thought, no problem.

But I quickly learned that there would be no warm house to go inside during my training—only a ten-man tent and a yukon stove to replace a house with central heating.

All the other necessities I'd need for survival would be carried in my ALICE pack or on an ahkio sled I would share with eight other Marines.

By the time we reached our first bivouac site, I was warm from the exertion of carrying my pack. That warmth soon left me and the cold quickly seeped its way through my muscles and into my bones where it came to rest for the night. I then began to think of mom, our warm house and that hot cocoa she would have for me at times such as these. But not today.

As we began to set bivouac for the night, the cold made my hands want to refuse the signals my brain was sending, making the simple task of tying a slip knot into a small personal ordeal.

Once the tent was set up and the stove burning steadily, the cold became bearable.

I held the billet of 'stove man' which meant tending to our only source of heat until 11 p.m.; then for safety reasons it had to be turned off. By then though, my team members were tucked away in their sleeping bags fast asleep. The long day had exhausted everyone, including myself. And I soon slipped out for the night.

At 6 a.m. reveille sounded and the realization of my duties as 'stove man' hit home. I poked my head out of my sleeping bag and the bitter cold was there to greet me. I immediately covered my head, hoping this was a dream. I knew my tent team members were counting on me to light that stove. That was the motivation I needed to leave the semi-warmth of my sleeping bag.

It took all the willpower I had to drag my shivering body over to that stove and light it. And soon after it was lit, one by one my tent team members began to crawl out of hibernation.

After having breakfast, which consisted of MREs, granola bars and luke-warm cocoa, our tent team was ready to face another bone-chilling day of cold weather training. As I sat there with my tent team, sipping luke-warm cocoa, I realized it was the first time I had survived for more than 24 hours in temperatures below freezing without any help from mom.

"I did better than last year," said Lance

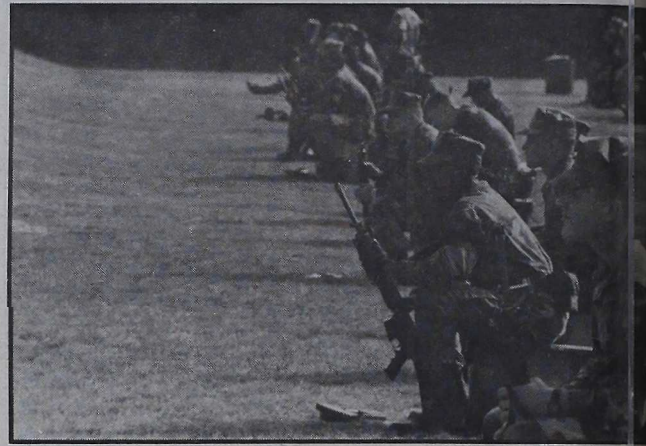
Cpl. John H. Pruitt, Kilo Co., 3/4, "being to shoot is just one facet in an infantry unit."

# Veteran bandsman returns to jam with band

After a 34 year leave of absence, a fine returned home.

His Marine wasn't UA for more than reer. He was retired. Master Sgt. George M. Dowdy who retired from the line Corps after 28 years of service to country and Corps made a return appearance with his former unit, the 2nd Div. Band, during their Annual Inter Concert.

If you stay in the Corps long enough, you'll run into all kinds of things," said Clarksdale, Miss. native.

In 1927, Dowdy went to basic training at Parris Island, S.C., and brought a trumpet.

He wanted Electronics School, but after everybody heard me play, I got sent to Band School," said Dowdy, who has played trumpet since age 16.

After graduation from boot camp, Dowdy reported to Band School and in 1931 was sent on the Marine expedition to Nicaragua until 1931.

Just as I was getting ready to come home, an earthquake hit," he said, "I had to wait."

After a month-long delay, Dowdy returned to the states, to play for field units across the country. In 1934 he was selected to the Marine Band and

was sent to the Chicago World's Fair for a year-long tour playing daily for the crowds.

According to Dowdy, in 1940 he was recognized as one of the best enlisted bandsmen in the Corps and was assigned the task of starting the Corps' first all-black band at Montford Point, where Camp Johnson now stands.

"It was a good experience," said Dowdy. "They were a great bunch of people." The Montford Point band played at the 'Point' and in parades. "We had a great band and an outstanding orchestra," Dowdy proudly said with a smile.

After getting the all-black band going strong and spending a year as Camp Lejeune's Bandmaster, Dowdy traded his trumpet for a rifle, when he was transferred to the 1st Marine Division for action

in the assault on Okinawa.

"I was surprised to find that the band wasn't doing 'bad things' there," he said. "We were given Browning rifles and put on patrol duty."

Not only was the fighting Bandmaster an expert with his trumpet, but with the rifle and pistol as well. Patrols were only temporary duty for the bandsmen, since they were tasked to carry stretchers until they attained forty percent casualties; then they were assigned to Command Post guard.

After the Army officers-in-charge of a transit station were killed during a bombing, Dowdy took charge with only two Army Pfc's under him.

"We got bombed almost every night," said Dowdy. "I was real lucky that I never got hurt."

At the war's end, Dowdy went with the 5th Regiment to Peiping, China for

a year, and then returned to the states to serve as the musical announcer and director of the MCRD San Diego radio show, 2nd MarDiv. Bandmaster at Camp Lejeune and 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing Bandmaster—a highly decorated combat and band veteran with a chestful of ribbons and medals, and various letters of commendation.

Dowdy said with a laugh, "It's been so long, the PX doesn't even carry most of the medals I rate anymore."

After duty in the Korean Conflict, Dowdy retired from the Marine Corps in 1953. Twenty years later, he retired from the Comptrollers Office, seeing improvements in Marine Corps bands along the way.

"The bands of today are of much better quality," he said. "They're much better than they used to be."

Today George Dowdy is still active in music as a Minister of Music with the First Baptist Church, an organization he's been active in for the last 18 years. He also plays first trumpet with the Jacksonville Community Band.

Although he has called Jacksonville home since his retirement, when Master Sgt. George Marion Dowdy took the stage as guest conductor of the 2nd MarDiv. Band, only then was he truly 'home again'.

Spanning the gap for tanks, am-traks and light armored vehicles is the job of Bridge Co., 8th Engineer Support Bn., 2nd FSSG.

After transporting all the pieces needed to make this double story link reinforcement bridge, the Marines go to work on it's assembly.

The bridge site is a bustle of activity resembling that of an ant colony. Each Marine has a certain job to do and has to do it in a timely manner in the proper order.

"Technical proficiency is one of the most important traits needed for bridge building," said Capt. Lee Batey-Bridge Co.'s commanding officer.

The methodical building of the bridge shows the efficiency of Bridge Co.'s Marines.

"One, two, three, pull" is a common sound to hear around the site. With parts of the bridge weighing up to 689 pounds, teamwork is essential.

"Without teamwork, building this bridge wouldn't be possible," said Lance Cpl. A. Ramos, Bridge Co., 8th EngSptBn.

Working together the Marines of Bridge Co. begin transforming dozens of

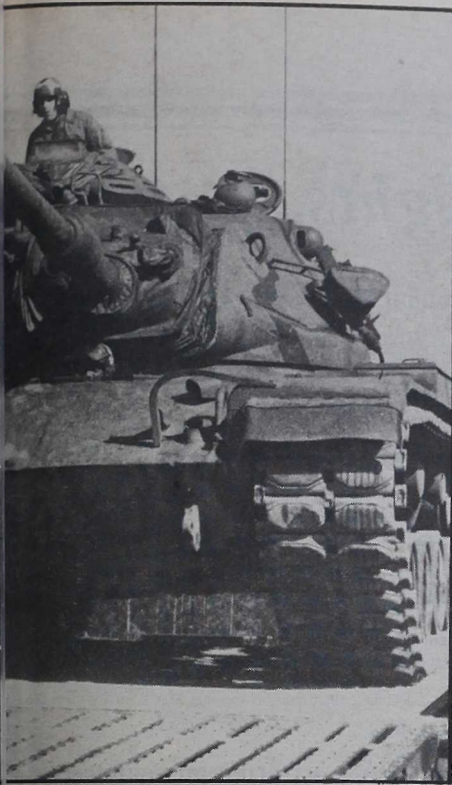

pieces of metal into a class 60. Once the initial stages of the bridge are complete it is ready to be launched to the other side of the ravine using a 10-ton truck.

With the bridge's launch

one on either side. The Marines have to walk across the bridge on narrow beams making sure that they don't pull one another off.

Having laid all the panels the bridge is complete and ready for the tanks of Alpha Co., 2nd Tank Bn. to cross the gap.

"We train all the time in all kinds of weather conditions," said Gunnery Sgt. Lee Dickson.

Bridge Co. is capable of building bridges up to 163 feet long and strong enough to carry 60 tons.

Eighth Engineer's Bridge Co. is one of the three active units in the Marine Corps and has possession of nine medium girder bridges, each of which costs approximately one million dollars.

It is Bridge Co.'s responsibility to transport and maintain all the bridges in their possession, according to Dickson.

Making it possible for vehicles up to 60 tons to get to places they normally couldn't, Bridge Co. is a very important asset to the Marine Corps.

## Some facts to remember about TAD travel orders

By Capt. Van Peursem

Before you go, look at your orders. Your reimbursement for expenses is determined by what they authorize or require.

"Proceed To" means you do not need reporting/detaching endorsements from the TAD command. These are non-reporting orders. Staff NCOs and officers are normally given non-reporting orders except in unusual situations.

"Report To" means you must get reporting and detaching endorsements. These are reporting orders.

"Government Transportation" or "Government Transportation Request Directed" means that if you travel by any other means than you will not be reimbursed. If required means of travel is not available, you must get an enforcement that states this.

"POV authorized subject to reimbursement" means that reimbursement for POV is allowed, but it is limited to no more than what a transportation request (TR) would have cost (whichever is the lesser). TR estimates are stated

on your orders. ("Authorized" always means it's allowed, but not required)

"POV authorized as advantageous to the government" means the TR maximum described previously does not apply here.

"Commercial Transportation authorized subject to cost of TR" means that you can buy your own ticket, but if it costs more than a TR would have cost, then you will be reimbursed the cost of the TR (whichever is lesser). Again check the TR estimate on your orders.

Your orders will tell you what your reporting and transportation requirements are. If these are not feasible considering your TAD, try to get a modification ahead of time or arrange for the modification to be done while you're gone. This will save a lot of time settling your claim when you get back and time is money.

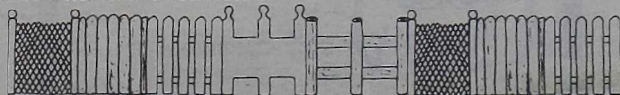

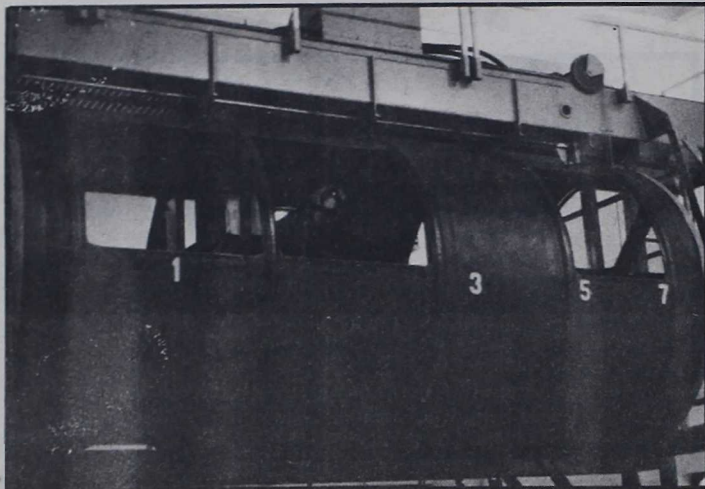

## 'Dunker' used to orient flyers before the need exists

All too often, we're all faced with having to either sink or swim. This couldn't be truer than at Cherry Point's water survival training center.

The "helo dunker," a training simulator, helps Marines help themselves by providing the passengers with a mock crash scenario. Realistic conditions acquaint students with what to look out for in the event an aircraft is "ditched" in the ocean.

Many Marines and Sailors have lost their lives when an aircraft crashes into a body of water. Passengers become statistics even in shallow water if an escape route fails.

Some never get free of their safety belts.

Statistics indicate that ones' chances for surviving such an accident are increased by about 50 percent after this training.

The course can't guarantee a Marine or Sailor of walking away from such a disaster, but making a passenger aware of proper immediate action once a crash

occurs can help save lives.

Helicopters are top heavy. They'll flip over after impact, leaving the crew and passengers sometimes disoriented. That's where the "dunker" comes into play.

At the speed of gravity, the "dunker" drops. When it hits the surface of the water, the training aid rolls over, and fills with water. With the majority of weight atop, choppers often quickly turn over, leaving her crew and passengers disoriented. Marines and Sailors learn from experience, but under safe conditions.

This training boasts supervision from both above and below the surface of the water, giving students a kind of safety net. But here, the fear of drowning, not falling, is the villain.

Students successful in the training leave with a better understanding of what to do when faced with having to "sink or swim." But even the students who aren't so successful walk away with a greater appreciation for what happens to a crew and passengers when an aircraft is "ditched" and seconds count.

# Slippery problem: discarded oil

ne tell ya' a story about a man  
 ed. A poor mountaineer, barely  
 Camp Ge... family fed. Then one day he was  
 French Cre... at some food, when up from the  
 Terrace Commu... ame a bubblin' crude-oil that is.  
 Courthouse B... d. Texas tea." is the theme from  
 Profess... series Beverly Hillbillies.  
 Profess... refined black gold is used for

many things, one of which is in our  
 vehicles... motor oil.

And this refined crude needs changing  
 every so often. So what do you do with  
 it once you've removed it from the car.

Look! A storm drain, what a conven-  
 ent spot. Just park over the top of it and  
 let the oil flow down into the storm drain.

Wrong answer! Storm drains filter rain  
 water from a parking lot or wherever the  
 drain may be located, not oil. This water

then runs back into the ground water  
 supply or river, according to Sammy D.  
 Gwynn, biology technician with the  
 Natural Resources Division

Some Marines are using these storm  
 drains to dispose of their oil or are just  
 pouring it onto the ground, according to  
 Gwynn.

Dumping motor oil down a storm  
 drain or on the ground is hazardous to  
 the water supply and area wild life, ac-  
 cording to Sammy Sharp of the Natural  
 Resources Division.

"In compliance with Enviromental  
 Protection Agency it is against Federal  
 law to dump any kind of waste material  
 on the ground. Once oil has been dumped  
 then it must be cleaned up and properly  
 disposed of. Cleaning up these waste  
 materials is an expensive process. Not  
 many people realize the cost involved,"  
 said Gwynn.

Storm drains are monitored on a  
 routine basis for pollutants. Samples are  
 taken to the lab of the Preventive  
 Medicine Clinic located in Bldg. 65 where  
 they are tested for contaminants.

The Natural Resources Division is here  
 to ensure such hazardous materials are  
 properly disposed of. Oil and waste  
 materials being dumped is a on going  
 problem, according to Gwynn.

"If the Marines and Sailors aboard base  
 would use the auto hobby shop instead  
 of dumping oil wherever, then this  
 problem would not exist," said Gwynn.

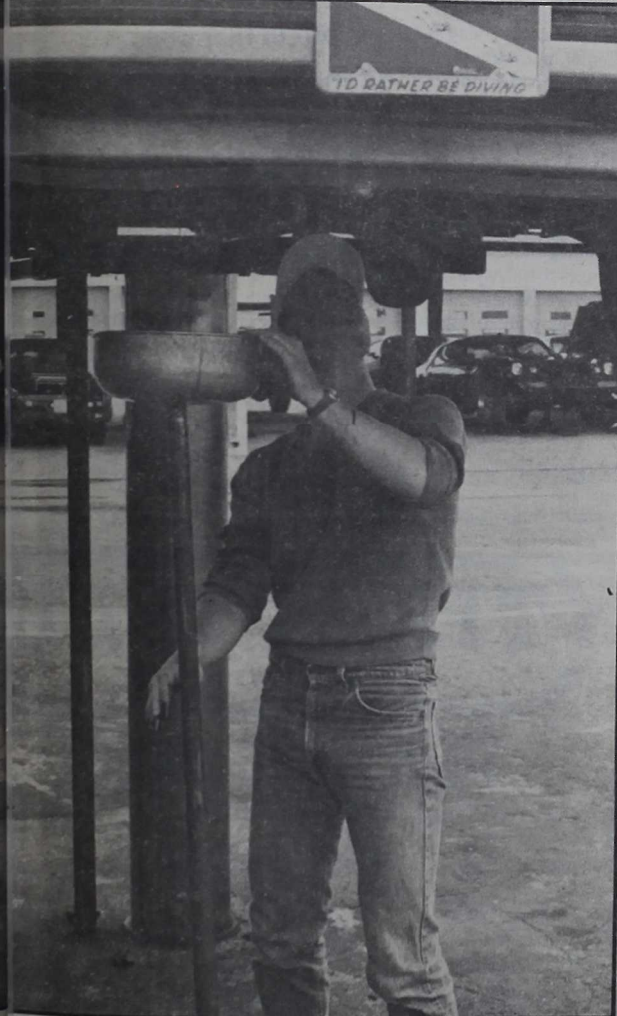
"The auto hobby shop on base has the  
 equipment to easily and inexpensively  
 change your oil in about 30 minutes,"  
 said Sgt. Jackie Boone, the Special Ser-  
 vices auto hobby shop assistant NCOIC.  
 The procedure involved in changing your  
 oil is simple.

"First you check in at the window and  
 let them know you would like to change  
 your oil. Then present your drivers  
 license and ID card. The person on duty  
 will then give you an oil can for your oil  
 and the necessary tools to assist you. The  
 cost is \$1.50 per half hour and a \$1.50  
 for tools," said Boone.

All there is to do now is put your car  
 on the rack and lift it up. With your car  
 suspended, the rest is simple, and the oil  
 drains into the can provided.

With oil can in hand you simply pour  
 it down an oil storage tank provided  
 especially for waste oil. After the atten-  
 dant checks your area to make sure all  
 the oil is cleaned up he will return your  
 license.

Changing your oil could otherwise cost  
 about \$20 or a lot more, depending on  
 where you decide to change it.

boost their undefeated record to 10-0 with a 70-34 victory.

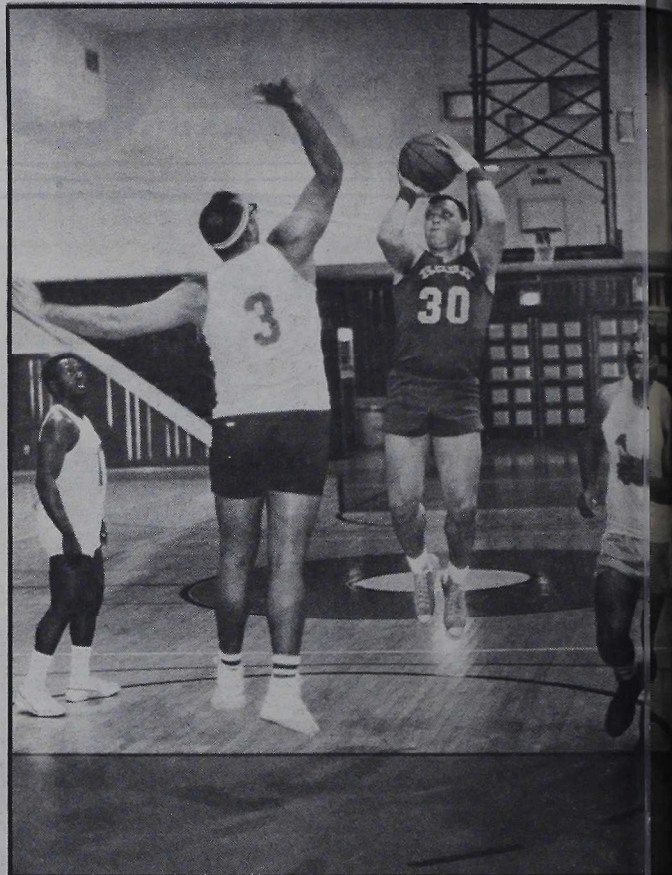
Overall this game was a little different as smiles and warm encouragement dominated play, despite the score and the aggressiveness of both teams.
