Regional COVID-19 Conditions Continue To Improve, RIA Returning To HPCON-Alpha

Those not fully vaccinated are to continue DoD mitigation measures

The senior commander at Rock Island Arsenal has authorized a change in the installation's operational status to Health Protection Condition - Alpha, effective July 6, 2021. Discussing the change, Col. Todd Allison, Garrison Commander, U.S. Army Garrison Rock Island Arsenal, said social distancing and venue capacity restrictions were reduced in mid-May in line with the Department of Defense memorandum, dated 13 May



2021. COVID case rates and hospitalizations have declined, and hospitals ability to treat have improved in the greater Quad-Cities region. In addition, a larger percentage of the region's population continues to get vaccinated. HPCON-Alpha also lifts the restrictions on gathering capacities – indoor locations such as RIA's Fitness Center will now be able to operate at full occupancy. Unvaccinated personnel, however, must continue wearing masks when moving between equipment or not actively exercising. The change allows the resumption of installation services that were offered before the onset of the pandemic more than a year ago. Family and MWR facilities can operate at full capacity; Child Development Centers can open additional spaces for youth; and guests will be allowed to attend ceremonies and events at full capacity. Army Community Service, the Lock & Dam Lounge, Auto Service Center, Leisure Travel Office, Outdoor Recreation, and events held in Heritage Hall (Building 60) will resume their pre-pandemic full occupancies. The move to HPCON-Alpha does not mean the pandemic is over. We are still under a national emergency and we will not let our guard down. Those with questions about fully returning to work should discuss it with their supervisor. All current protection measures, cleaning/sanitizing requirements, mask requirements for unvaccinated personnel, and physical distancing guidance will remain in place. Senior leadership and health personnel at the Rock Island Arsenal continue to highly encourage the Arsenal workforce and their families to get the first COVID-19 vaccine available to them from whatever resource they qualify to receive it. Army's Advanced Manufacturing Center of Excellence Transforms in 18 Months

From a warehouse lined in orange pallet racks sitting twenty-feet high, filled with equipment and materiel storage to a brightly lit and environmentally controlled additive manufacturing production facility, the Army's Advanced and Additive Manufacturing Center of Excellence has transformed physically and developmentally in just 18 months. In 2018, the Army designated Rock Island Arsenal – Joint Manufacturing and Technology Center the Army's Advanced and Additive Manufacturing Center of Excellence. In May 2019, the center reached initial operating capability. "Our first success story was achieving IOC by May 15," said Randl Besse, deputy project manager, AM CoE. "That was no easy task, but with a lot of help we were able to



get the construction done on the facility, equipment ordered, delivered and installed, held a rehearsal of concept drill and printed our first parts." After just over a year in production, the center has come a long way. They have printed more than 1,000 parts for Department of Defense and private industry partners, according to Harold (Edward) Flinn, director, Advanced Manufacturing. JMC's Spring into Wellness Campaign

Army Prepares To Start FY 2022 under Continuing Resolution

The Army expects to start fiscal year 2022 under a continuing resolution, as there is no indication that lawmakers will pass an appropriations bill before Oct. 1, the director for Army Budget said Thursday. The Army released its \$173 billion budget proposal for fiscal 2022 last month, prioritizing people, readiness and modernization efforts with a \$3.6 billion reduction from fiscal 2021's enacted budget, said Maj. Gen. Paul A. Chamberlain. "Most of that reduction is attributed to force structure changes in the [U.S. Central Command's area of responsibility]," Chamberlain said during an Association of the U.S. Army Noon Report.

Warp Speed's Perna Set to Retire, Kirby Discusses Afghan Transition

Army Gen. Gustave F. Perna, the COVID-19 vaccine and therapeutic czar, will retire at the end of the week, Pentagon Press Secretary John F. Kirby said today during a wide-ranging news conference. Retired Army Lt. Gen. Paul Ostrowski will return to his civilian job as he steps down from his position as the director of supply, production and distribution. Operation Warp Speed was subsumed by the White House COVID-19 Response Team in February. "Both leaders were selected due to their vast experience as experts in logistics and acquisitions, to lead an incredible team including the best of government, industry and academic professionals to develop,

DoD Extended Policy Guidance For Identification Card Operations During the Corona Virus Disease 2019 Pandemic

The Rock Island Arsenal DEERS/ID Card Office is operating at full capacity to serve our supported customers. We ask that customers continue to observe masking and social distancing to protect the many higher-risk personnel in the population we serve. For those customers unable or uncomfortable visiting the facility, the Department of Defense has extended the expiration dates of Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards. Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness: In view of the DoD's limited ability to return Identification (ID) Card facilities to normal operations while continuing to comply with local pandemic safety precautions, I am extending the temporary policy guidance at the reference for Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards that expired between Jan. 1, 2020 and July 31, 2021 only, through:

- Aug. 31, 2021: Foreign Affiliates and their dependents.
- Oct. 31, 2021: Dependents of Active Duty Uniformed Service members; Reserve and National Guard Uniformed Service Members and their dependents.
- Jan. 31, 2022: Retirees and their dependents; all other populations.

USID cards that expired before Jan. 1, 2020 or that expire after July 31, 2021 have not been extended and will not be accepted. Rock Island Arsenal DEERS/ID Card Facility (Building 56):

RIA Transportation Office "Moving During Peak Season"

Soldiers and Families preparing for a permanent change of station (PCS) move during July and August (potentially into September) should anticipate unexpected delays in scheduling of their household goods (HHG) move. COVID-19 related resource challenges (shortage of local packers, loaders, drivers, trucks, warehouses, wood containers) in the HHG industry for both DOD and non-DOD customers may cause up to 4-6 week delays in select areas for origin shipment pickups and destination deliveries. Army Senior Leaders are aware of these challenges and actively exploring mitigation actions for Soldier and Family relocation issues. Tools and Resources: All Soldiers can use their Government Travel Credit Card (GTCC) for PCS related travel and transportation expenses. Soldiers and Families who will conduct a personally procured move (PPM) should pursue an increase to GTCC limits up to the maximum authorized \$25,000 through their Organizational Defense Travel Administrator (ODTA), to preclude upfront out of pocket expenses. Soldiers and Families without a GTCC who will conduct a personally procured move (PPM) should process an advance through the transportation office to DFAS Rome. Soldiers and Families without a GTCC,

who receive an ACR memo, should process an advance through the transportation office to DFAS Rome. OCONUS PCS: Overseas Housing Allowance (OHA), Dislocation Allowance (DLA), Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) is authorized not more than 60 days. A period in addition to that 60 days may be authorized/approved when any of the following reasons exist and are beyond the member's/dependents' control (See par. 680406.A of the DoD FMR): Non-arrival of HHG; Delay in availability of/assignment to Government quarters due to Service requirements; CONUS PCS: Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH), DLA, and Temporary Lodging Expense (TLE) may be authorized up to 10 days, depending on the location of the new PDS. TLE reimbursement must not exceed \$290 per day. Soldiers and Families with a 30-day or less home sale or expiring lease and no DOD moving company assigned:

- Option: The Government picks up the household goods and places into an origin storage facility until a DOD moving company can move it forward to destination, with some delays expected.
- Option: Soldier conducts a personally procured move (PPM) from the residence to a local self-storage facility and receives actual cost reimbursement (ACR) until the Government can schedule a DOD moving company to move it to destination. An ACR allows reimbursement, which could be significantly higher than normal Government contracted rates.
- Option: Soldier conducts a full personally procured move (PPM) at 100% of what the Government would pay a moving company to move all of the household goods from origin to destination duty station. Not recommended for OCONUS moves.
- Option: Soldiers receive an ACR memorandum from the transportation office; to hire a commercial moving company with a minimum of 2 commercial invoice estimates.

Note: Soldiers and Families need to be wary of "fly-by-night companies" looking to profit from desperation moves with adjusting cost estimates by utilizing a commercial mover registered with the Federal Government at https://fmcsa.dot.gov/protect-your-move. Soldiers and Families with a short notice report date that cannot be extended and no DOD moving company assigned:

- Option: The Government picks up the household goods and places into an origin storage facility until a DOD moving company can move it forward to destination, with some delays expected.
- Option: Soldier conducts a personally procured move (PPM) from the residence to a local self-storage facility and receives actual cost reimbursement (ACR) until the Government can schedule a DOD moving company to move it to destination. An ACR allows reimbursement which could be significantly higher than normal Government contracted rates.
- Option: Soldier conducts a full personally procured move (PPM) at 100% of what the Government would pay a moving company to move all of the household goods from origin to destination duty station. Not recommended for OCONUS moves.
- Option: Soldiers receive an ACR memorandum from the transportation office; to hire a commercial moving company with a minimum of 2 commercial invoice estimates.

Note: Soldiers and Families need to be wary of "fly-by-night companies" looking to profit from desperation moves with adjusting cost estimates by utilizing a commercial mover registered with the Federal Government at https://fmcsa.dot.gov/protect-your-move. Soldiers and Families with a short notice DOD moving company cancellation or missed pack and pick up:

- Option: The Government picks up the household goods and places into an origin storage facility until a DOD moving company can move it forward to destination, with some delays expected.
- Option: Soldier conducts a personally procured move (PPM) from the residence to a local self-storage facility and receives actual cost reimbursement (ACR) until the Government can

- schedule a DOD moving company to move it to destination. An ACR allows reimbursement which could be significantly higher than normal Government contracted rates.
- Option: Soldier conducts a full personally procured move (PPM) at 100% of what the Government would pay a moving company to move all of the household goods from origin to destination duty station. Not recommended for OCONUS moves.
- Option: Soldiers receive an ACR memorandum from the transportation office; to hire a commercial moving company with a minimum of 2 commercial invoice estimates.
- Option: Pursue 30-45-60 day deferment of report dates from the Soldier chain of command to HRC or civilian gaining organization.

Note: Soldiers and Families need to be wary of "fly-by-night companies" looking to profit from desperation moves with adjusting cost estimates by utilizing a commercial mover registered with the Federal Government at https://fmcsa.dot.gov/protect-your-move. Soldiers and Families should maintain close communication with the local transportation office, as it is the first line of support to assist by providing all available options.

Change to Policy Allows Transgender Soldiers to Serve Openly

Transgender personnel and individuals with gender dysphoria who can meet the Army's standards for military service can now serve openly in their self-identified gender, according to a new policy approved this month by the Army secretary. Army directive 2021-22 changes the service's retention, separation, in-service transition, and medical care standards for transgender personnel and refines entry criteria for individuals with gender dysphoria, following Department of Defense guidance, said Maj. Gen. Douglas F. Stitt, military personnel management director. "People are the strength of our Army," Stitt said Tuesday. "Our ability to assess and retain qualified personnel provides a more diverse and stronger Army, enhancing readiness." (More: www.army.mil/article/247785)

Fireworks Safety Message

Holidays like the Fourth of July and other celebrations can be fun times with great memories. But make sure everyone knows about fireworks safety. What are the dangers of fireworks? If not handled properly, fireworks can cause burns and eye injuries in kids and adults. The best way to protect your family is not to use any fireworks at home, attend public fireworks displays and leave the lighting to the professionals. Lighting fireworks at home may be illegal where you live, so be sure you are aware of the state and local ordinances covering fireworks.

The State of Iowa allows all First-class consumer fireworks Fireworks Safety Tips

- Kids should never play with fireworks. Things like firecrackers and rockets are just too dangerous. If you give kids sparklers, make sure they keep them outside and away from the face, clothing, and hair. Sparklers can reach temperatures of 1,800°F
- Buy only legal fireworks and store them in a cool, dry place. Illegal fireworks usually go by the names M-80, M100, blockbuster, or quarter pounder. These explosives were banned in 1966, but still account for many fireworks injuries.
- Always use fireworks outside and have a bucket of water and a hose nearby in case of accidents.

- Steer clear of others setting off fireworks. They can backfire or shoot off in the wrong direction.
- Never throw or point fireworks at someone, even as a joke.
- Don't hold fireworks in your hand or have any part of your body over them while lighting.
- Point fireworks away from homes, and keep away from brush and leaves and flammable substances. The National Fire Protection Association estimates that local fire departments respond to more 50,000 fires caused by fireworks each year.
- Light one firework at a time (not in glass or metal containers), and never relight a dud.
- Don't allow kids to pick up pieces of fireworks after an event. Some may still be ignited and can explode at any time.
- Soak all fireworks in water before throwing them in the trash can.
- Think about your pet. Animals have sensitive ears and can be very frightened or stressed by the Fourth of July and other big celebrations. Keep pets indoors to reduce the risk that they'll run loose or get injured.

Please Dispose of Fireworks Debris

For those in geographic locations where fireworks are legal – please take time to sweep up firework debris to protect the environment. Perchlorate, a common fireworks ingredient, remains in water for a long time, has been found at high levels in U.S. ground water and can affect thyroid functioning in fish. Fireworks also contain lithium, barium, lead and mercury. Once ingested by fish and other animals, their bodies can't get rid of it. Sweep up debris after the celebration and dispose in the trash container for a clean neighborhood and safe water.

COVID-19 Pandemic Not Over, Concerns Over Delta Variant Growing

But that still leaves many service members vulnerable to the delta variant of the virus, health officials at the Pentagon said. Due to the effectiveness of the Defense Department's ongoing vaccination program, COVID-19 case counts across the department are dropping and installation commanders have been reducing local health protection conditions, or HPCON levels, Dr. Terry Adirim, the acting assistant secretary of defense for health affairs, said during a press briefing today at the Pentagon. "However, the delta variant poses a threat to that return to normal," Adirim said. "We are particularly concerned with the impact of the delta variant on our unvaccinated or partially vaccinated population, and its potential spread at installations that are located in parts of the country with low vaccination rates."
